## #11/11 WASHINGTON vs. #20/NR BYU Dawgs' Non-Conference Schedule Wraps Up Vs. Cougars

**THE GAME:** The Washington football team (2-0 Pac-12, 3-1 overall) closes out its non-conference schedule Saturday as BYU (3-1) pays a visit to Husky Stadium. Kickoff is 5:30 p.m. and the game will air live on FOX television. The Huskies enter the game ranked No. 11 in both the Associated Press Top 25 and the USA Today coaches' poll. BYU is 20th in the AP, but one spot out of the coaches' Top 25. Following this Saturday's game, the Huskies head out on the road to face UCLA and Oregon.

**QUICK HITTERS:** Sept. 1 vs. Auburn, Myles Gaskin became the UW's all-time leading rusher, moving past Napoleon Kaufman, who had held the record since 1994 ... Gaskin enters the ASU game with 4,412 yards, 6th-most in Pac-12 history ... Gaskin scored his 51th career touchdown against Utah, extending his school record ... his 47 career rushing TDs (he has four receiving TDs) rank 8th in Pac-12 history ... with 85 career touchdown passes, Jake Browning is tied for 8th in Pac-12 history ... Browning's 10,070 career passing yards currently rank No. 2 in UW history and No. 17 in the Pac-12 ... for the first time since 1995, UW did not have a true freshman play in its season opener ... against North Dakota, however, four true freshmen saw action: DL Tuli Letuligasenoa, LB Jackson Sirmon, LB MJ Tafisi, OLB Zion Tupuola-Fetui ... only five players (none of them true freshmen) made their UW playing debut against Auburn in Atlanta: OL Henry Bainivalu, PK Peyton Henry, OL Jaxson Kirkland (started at RG), OLB Ariel Ngata and TE Cade Otton ... 12 more Huskies saw their first action against North Dakota: the aforementioned true freshmen, plus TB Malik Braxton, DL Josiah Bronson, WR Terrell Bynum, WR Alex Cook, TE Michael Neal, OL Cole Norgaard, OLB Joe Tryon, PK Sebastian Valerio ... Washington enters the week No. 4 in scoring defense (12.8 ppg) ... Taylor Rapp leads the nation with three fumble recoveries ... against ASU, Ben Burr-Kirven notched 20 tackles, most by a Husky since 1996 ... Burr-Kirven is 5th in the nation in total tackles (53) and ninth in forced fumbles (2) ... Byron Murphy is 7th in the nation in passes defended (8).

**TELEVISION:** The Washington-BYU game will air live to a national audience on FOX with Joe Davis (play-by-play), Brady Quinn (analyst) and Bruce Feldman (sidelines) providing the commentary. The broadcast can also be found on FOXSportsGo.com and the FOXSports app.

**RADIO:** The Washington IMG College Network, with its flagship station KOMO AM-1000 and FM-97.7, will carry the live broadcast of every football game on 17 Northwest radio stations. First-year play-by-play man Tony Castricone and color analyst Damon Huard are joined by sideline reporter Elise Woodward. The UW broadcast of the game will also air on Sirius (83) and XM (83) satellite radio, and is also available via TuneIn.com and the TuneIn app.

**THE HEAD COACH:** When Chris Petersen was hired after the 2013 season, no one knew for sure how long it might take to return the Husky program to the top levels of the college football world. It turns out, it took about three years. In 2016, the Huskies had their best season since 2000 and one of their best ever, winning the Pac-12 Championship, earning a spot in the College Football Playoff and finishing ranked No. 4 in the final polls. They did it with high-achieving, young players across the starting lineup while also succeeding in the classroom at an unprecedented and sustained rate. That success continued in 2017, as the UW posted back-to-back, 10-win seasons for the first time since 1990-91 and earned a spot in a New Years Six bowl game while going 10-3 overall and 7-2 in Pac-12 play. In the meantime, during the fall academic quarter, the Huskies posted a team GPA of 3.16, shattering the program's record, set the previous fall. Petersen, who built a reputation as an offensive innovator who carried the Boise State football program to its highest highs and had been courted by innumerable programs, was swayed to take on a new challenge when he agreed to become head coach of the Huskies in December of 2013. Petersen's "Built for Life" philosophy, on which the program is based, achieved its highest level of fruition to date with the successes of the team in 2016. Along with those on-field victories, the team continued to achieve at never-before-seen levels academically as the team achieved a 3.09 grade point average during the fall academic quarter. The UW led the Pac-12 in 17 different team statistical categories. Following the 2016 season, in May of 2017, Petersen was honored with the Stallings Award, awarded annually to a college head football coach who is both a humanitarian and an exceptional coach, and named after former Alabama and Texas A&M head coach Gene Stallings. In 2015, Petersen's Huskies, featuring one of the nation's youngest squads and a schedule ranked by many as the nation's toughest, rallied for the Dawgs' sixth consecutive bowl berth, which resulted in a victory over Southern Miss in the Heart of Dallas Bowl. A stout Husky defense (first in the Pac-12 in scoring and total defense) led the way as a freshman-laden offense showed steady growth en route to a 7-6 season record. Off the field, Petersen's impact on the program's academic success was clear as well. During the season (fall academic quarter, 2015), the football team posted a team GPA of 3.12, highest in team history, breaking the old record, set the previous spring. In his first season at UW, Petersen led the Huskies to an 8-6 record and a berth in the TicketCity Cactus Bowl. He became the fastest active FBS coach to reach 100 career victories – doing so in 117 games – and tied with Knute Rockne for fifth fastest all-time. In 2014, UW produced three first-team and seven honorable mention All-Pac-12 players, and five players earned first or second team Academic All-Pac-12 recognition, including Danny Shelton who was named First-Team Academic All-American – a first for the UW since 1991. Petersen, the only two-time winner of the Paul "Bear" Bryant Award (2006 and 2009), compiled an exceptional 92-12 record in his eight seasons as Boise State head coach (2006-2013), including two unbeaten seasons (13-0 in 2006 and 14-0 in 2009) and two BCS bowl berths. He won five conference titles and posted a 57-6 record in conference play. Petersen, who also won the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award in 2010, led the Broncos to 10 or more wins in seven of his eight seasons and to 12 or more in four straight (2008-11). In 2006, Petersen's first season in charge in Boise, he led the Broncos to their first undefeated season since 1958, when the school was a junior college. The 2006 season was capped by a 43-42 overtime win over Oklahoma in the Fiesta Bowl, a game remembered by many as one of the greatest in bowl-game history. That Boise team ended the year ranked No. 5 in the final Associated Press top 25 poll. The following season, the Broncos went 10-3 and finished out of the polls for what would be the only time in Petersen's first seven seasons. The 2008 squad went 12-1 and ranked No. 11 in the final top 25, finishing the regular season undefeated. In 2009, Petersen led the Broncos to their second undefeated campaign and another Fiesta Bowl berth. Boise State beat TCU, 17-10, in Arizona, becoming the first team from a non-BCS conference ever to win two BCS bowl games. The '09 Broncos checked in at No. 4 in the final AP poll. The 2010 season ended with a 12-1 record, a No. 9 final ranking and a win in the Las Vegas Bowl, the first of three straight trips to Vegas for Boise State. In 2011, BSU once again went 12-1, finishing with a No. 8 final ranking. Last season, Petersen's team went 11-2 and beat Washington in the Las Vegas Bowl, good for a No. 18 final ranking. In 2013, Boise State, which faced Washington in the first game at the newly renovated Husky Stadium, finished the regular season with an 8-4 record (Petersen came to the UW prior to the Broncos' bowl game). Throughout his teams' unmatched on-field success, Petersen also saw his Broncos succeed in the classroom. In 2011, Boise State was the only school to finish in the top 10 in both major polls and also receive a Public Recognition Award from the NCAA for finishing in the top 10 percent of the Academic Progress Rate (APR), the second of three straight such awards for the program. Boise State's APR was second in the nation in 2011 and 2012 and Petersen was recognized in 2012 for having the best APR for the two previous years among all FBS coaches. Known for his work with quarterbacks, Petersen tutored Ryan Dinwiddie, Jared Zabransky and Kellen Moore at Boise State. Moore set an NCAA record with 50 career wins as a starting QB while winning three conference player of the year awards. Moore was the only player ever to record four 3,000-yard seasons in both passing and total offense. His 142 passing touchdowns were second-most in NCAA history

while his 14,667 career passing yards were fifth-most. Before taking over as head coach at Boise State, Petersen served as the Broncos' offensive coordinator from 2001-05. Petersen began his coaching career in 1987 as freshman coach at his alma mater, UC Davis. In 1989, he became the Aggies' varsity wide receivers coach. In 1992, Petersen moved to Pittsburgh, where he was quarterbacks coach. In 1993, Petersen moved back west to take over a QBs coach at Portland State, helping the Vikings to Division II playoff berths in each of his two seasons. In 1995, he took a job at Oregon as the receivers coach under Mike Bellotti, a position he held before moving to Boise as offensive coordinator in 2001. Born in Yuba City, Calif., on Oct. 13, 1964, Petersen graduated from Yuba City High in 1983 and went on to play quarterback at Sacramento City College. From there, he transferred to UC Davis, earning a bachelor's degree in psychology in 1988. He later earned a master's in educational psychology from Davis. At Davis, he set numerous school records, including the season standards for passing efficiency, completions, completion percentage, TD passes and total offense as well as the career mark for completion percentage. He still remains in the top 10 in Aggies history in numerous season and career categories and his season and career completion percentage records still stand. In 1986, Petersen was named the Northern California Athletic Conference Player of the Year and earned UC Davis' Colby E. Slater Award as the school's Male Athlete of the Year. He was also a captain and won the team's Jerry Norris Award (Most Valuable and Inspirational) and was inducted into the Cal Aggie Athletic Hall of Fame in 1997. Petersen and his wife, Barbara, have two sons, Jack and Sam.

**100 WINS:** With the 2014 victory over Washington State in the Apple Cup, UW head coach Chris Petersen reached his 100th career victory. At the time, it put his record at 100-17, meaning that it took him 117 career games to reach his 100th victory. Only four coaches in major college history did it faster:

- Gil Dobie (North Dakota State, UW, Navy, Cornell): 108 games
- George Woodruff (Penn): 109 games
- Bud Wilkinson (Oklahoma): 111 games
- Fielding Yost (Neb., Kansas, Stanford, San Jose St., Michigan): 114 games
- Chris Petersen (Boise State, Washington): 117 games
- Knute Rockne (Notre Dame): 117 games

Additionally, Petersen's 117 games were fewer than any ACTIVE FBS coach required to make it to 100 victories. Here were the top five, at the time:

- Chris Petersen: 117 games
- Urban Meyer: 118 games
- Bob Stoops: 122 games
- Gary Patterson: 128 games
- Steve Spurrier: 129 games

**PETERSEN SECOND ON LIST:** The 2018 NCAA record book lists the top active FBS coaches in terms of winning percentage (minimum five years at FBS) and the Huskies' own Chris Petersen is No. 2 on this list. Here are the top 10 FBS coaches by career winning pct. (FBS only), as of Sept. 23, 2018:

**PETERSEN'S FIRST FIVE:** The NCAA Record Book also notes that Petersen won more games in his first season as a head coach (13-0 in 2006) than any coach in history and that his record over his first five seasons as a head coach (61-5) was fifth-best in history, ahead of the likes of Knute Rockne and Bud Wilkinson and behind coaching legends like Gil Dobie and Walter Camp. Here are the 10-best coaching performances over the first five years of a career:

**COACHING STAFF:** Washington welcomes back eight of nine full-time assistant coaches from last year's staff, with two new additions (including the newly legislated 10th assistant). Five of the 10 assistants are in their fifth season at UW under Petersen (one of which was a holdover from the prior staff). Of the 10 full-time coaches on the 2017 staff, four came to the UW from Boise State along with Petersen after 2013. Co-defensive coordinator Pete Kwiatkowski was on Petersen's staff in Boise in all eight seasons as head coach, including the last four as defensive coordinator. Kwiatkowski, a BSU Hall-of-Fame defensive lineman, also worked at his alma mater from 1988 to 1996. Running backs coach and recruiting coordinator Keith Bhonapha was also on Petersen's Broncos staff during Petersen's entire eight seasons, though he started as director of operations. He coached running backs his last five years at BSU. Assistant head coach, special teams coordinator and linebackers coach Bob Gregory came to Washington having spent the previous four seasons at Boise State. He was the defensive coordinator at California from 2002 to 2009 and, along with also having coached at Boise State in 2001, has also worked in the conference at Oregon. Defensive backs coach and defensive coordinator Jimmy Lake, who spent the 2004 season in the same position at Washington under head coach Keith Gilbertson, was Petersen's DBs coach in Boise the last two years there, having spent five seasons in the NFL before that. Tight ends coach Jordan Paopao is entering his sixth season in that position, having worked as a Husky GA the previous two. UW alum Ikaika Malloe, who lettered as a Husky from 1993 to 1996 and once worked as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, is back for his third season as UW's defensive line coach. He joined the staff after last season, coming to Seattle from Utah State. Second-year UW wide receivers coach and co-offensive coordinator Matt Lubick joins the Husky staff last season, having spent the previous four years at Oregon, including the 2016 season as offensive coordinator. Second-year offensive line coach and run game coordinator Scott Huff spent the previous 11 seasons at Boise State, his alma mater, where he played under Coach Petersen (when Petersen was an assistant) and coached for him for all eight years Petersen was head coach. New UW offensive coordinator Bush Hamdan, who worked as a quality control assistant (2015) and wide receivers coach (2016) under Petersen, is back in Seattle, having spent the 2017 season as the Atlanta Falcons' QBs coach. Washington also welcomes Will Harris to the staff. A former safety at USC, Harris is UW's assistant secondary coach. Two of four UW graduate assistant coaches are returners to their position. Former Montana State linebacker Jody Owens and Tyler Osborne, who worked as a student coach at Oregon, are both back for a second season. Newcomer GAs Robert Kugler (former OL at Pitt) and Jabriel Washington (former CB at Alabama) join the staff for 2018.

**THE YOUNG AND THE OLD:** Washington has been a notably and demonstrably young team the last several years and, while the Huskies have gotten distinctly more experienced across the board, the roster still skews slightly towards youth. The 2018 roster includes 43 freshmen and 21 sophomores, compared to 21 seniors and 28 juniors, meaning just under 57 percent of the players have three or more years of eligibility left. At the same time, Washington has 54 returning lettermen and, not counting specialists, 29 different Huskies have started at least one game during their career.

**THE DEFENSE:** Over the last three years, Washington's defense has been, statistically, the best in the Pac-12 and one of the top units in the nation. The Huskies have led the Pac-12 in total defense for three years in a row, climbing the national rankings each year, capped by a No. 8 national finish last season. The UW has also paced the Pac-12 in scoring defense the last three seasons, finishing fifth in the FBS last season. Last year, the Huskies were also fourth in the nation in rushing defense and fifth in the country in turnover margin.

TEAM NOTES

**ONE-TWO PUNCH ON OFFENSE:** In seniors Jake Browning and Myles Gaskin, the Huskies return the most prolific quarterback-running back tandem in the nation, in terms of career statistics, at the start of the 2018 season. Gaskin's 4,055 career rushing yards entering the year were most in the nation among returning FBS players, nearly 900 yards ahead of the next-closest (Appalachian State's Jalin Moore, 3,170 yards). Gaskin's 45 career rushing touchdowns were also most in the nation among FBS returners. Gaskin entered his senior season ranked 9th in Pac-12 history in rushing TDs and 11th in rushing yards. He's seeking to become the 10th FBS player ever (and first in Pac-12 history) to rush for 1,000 or more yards in four seasons. Meanwhile, Browning's 9,104 career passing yards entering the year were second-most among all FBS returners, while his 78 career TD passes (already a UW record) were tops in the country. Browning's entered the season ranked No. 12 in Pac-12 history in career TD passes (and only 11 from making the top four), while his yards total ranked No. 27 (about 1,700 yards away from the top 10).

**1,000-YARDERS:** Prior to the 2007 season, Washington running backs had compiled 11 1,000-yard seasons in the school's long history. Since then, Washington has had a back reach 1,000 yards nine out of the last 11 years, and eight in a row. If Myles Gaskin can continue this streak this season, he'll become only the 10th FBS player in history to rush for 1,000 yards in four straight seasons since freshman eligibility began in 1972. Here's a look at those nine recent 1,000-yard seasons:

**HUSKIES vs. COUGARS HISTORY:** Washington and BYU will be meeting for the 10th time ever this Saturday. Their last meeting was in the 2013 Fight Hunger Bowl in San Francisco, where a 100-yard kickoff return by John Ross was the highlight of Washington's 31-16 win. That game came during the transition between former head coach Steve Sarkisian and Chris Petersen. Prior to that, UW and BYU most recently squared off in the 2010 season opener in Provo. In that game, BYU overcame a 17-13 halftime deficit, scoring 10 points in the third quarter. The Cougars blanked the Huskies for the entire second half to win, 23-17. Jake Locker passed for 266 yards on 20-for-37 passing while BYU QBs Jake Heaps and Riley Nelson each passed for 131 yards to lead their team. The most recent meeting in Seattle came in 2008, when 15th-ranked BYU escaped with a 28-27 victory thanks to a blocked PAT attempt with two seconds left. Locker threw for 204 yards and one TD and also rushed for 62 yards and two scores in the loss. The UW-BYU series began in 1985, the year after the Cougars won the National Championship ahead of No. 2 Washington. In that first game (Sept. 14, 1985), the unranked Huskies fell to No. 16 BYU 31-3 in a game played in Provo. The following year, the Huskies returned the favor at Husky Stadium. In that game (Sept. 20, 1986), the Dawgs, ranked No. 7, handed the 11th-ranked Cougars a 52-21 loss. The Huskies re-opened the series with the Cougars on Sept. 14, 1996, when Rashaan Shehee rushed for 131 yards and two touchdowns in a 29-17 win over the 14th-ranked Cougars, who finished that season 14-1. The following season in Provo, No. 4 UW opened the schedule with a 42-20 win over No. 19 BYU. In 1998 at Husky Stadium, the No. 9-ranked Dawgs ran their win streak over BYU to four games with a 20-10 win over the unranked Cougars. In the first game of the 1999 season, Cougars QB Kevin Feterik led the way in a 35-28 Brigham Young win. Feterik completed 39 of his 59 pass attempts for 500 yards and three touchdowns. The Huskies were led by sophomore quarterback Marques Tuiasosopo, who threw for 237 yards on 22-of-36 passing while also running for two scores.

**HOME vs. NON-CONFERENCE:** UW has been very tough to beat in home, non-conference games over the last several decades. Going back to 1981, the Huskies have posted a 68-13 record against non-Pac-10/Pac-12 foes in Husky Stadium. Those 13 losses have come to Nebraska (2010), LSU (2009), BYU (2008), Oklahoma (2008), Ohio State (2007), Notre Dame (2005), Fresno State (2004), Nevada (2003), Air Force (1999), Nebraska (1997), Notre Dame (1995), Colorado (1989) and Oklahoma State (1985). Notable wins during that stretch include victories over No. 19 Boise State in 2013, No. 22 Boise State in 2007, No. 11 Michigan in 2001, No. 4 Miami in 2000, and No. 12 Nebraska in 1992. The UW has won 17 straight home, non-conference games in a row.

**THE PAC-12:** Prior to the 2011 season, the Pac-10 Conference added Utah and Colorado to expand to the Pac-12. Washington, which along with California is one of two schools who have been in the conference since its founding in 1915, plays in the Pac-12 North, along with the other three Northwest schools (Oregon, OSU, WSU) and Stanford and Cal. Under current plans, each school will play all five division rivals, plus four of six teams in the other division each season. The first two seasons, the Huskies did not face UCLA or Arizona State. In 2013 and 14, the Huskies didn't face Utah or USC. In 2015 in 2016, neither UCLA nor Colorado were on the UW schedule, while the Huskies don't face USC and Arizona in 2017 or 2018.

**THE 100-YARD FACTOR:** Since the 1947 season, Washington is 213-66-3 (.760) when a Husky player rushes for 100 yards in a game. The Huskies were 8-0 in such games in 2016, were 5-1 in 2017 and are 1-0 this year.

**HISTORY LESSON:** Successfully rushing the football and winning go hand-in-hand for the Huskies. Since 1990, UW has rushed for 200 yards in a game 114 times. The Huskies' record stands at 97-16-1 (.856) in those contests. Since 1995, UW is 72-13-1 (.843) when rushing for 200 yards.

**HUSKY STADIUM RENOVATION:** Husky Stadium underwent a major renovation over from Nov., 2011, through Aug., 2013, as the entire lower bowl and south upper deck were demolished and replaced. The new facility features a new, state-of-the-art football operations center (weight room, training room, locker room, meeting rooms, coaches' offices) in the west end, much more premium seating options and a new playing surface. Husky Stadium had featured a track up until 2011, so seats that were once far from the field, particularly in the west end, are much closer to the action. UW is 30-8 at home since the re-opening of Husky Stadium.

**ALASKA AIRLINES FIELD AT HUSKY STADIUM:** The Oregon game on Nov. 5, 2011, marked the final game in Husky Stadium prior to major renovations that were completed in summer, 2013. The Huskies re-opened their home field with a 38-6 win over then-No. 19 Boise State on Aug. 31, 2013. The 2018 season marks the 99th season of play in Husky Stadium. Original construction on the facility was completed in 1920 when Washington played one game in the new campus facility. UW's all-time record in Husky Stadium stands at 386-177-21 (.679).
