MEET PREVIEW

PROVO, Utah — No. 24 BYU heads north to Logan, Utah, to take on conference rival Utah State on Friday night in the Aggies' annual Breast Cancer Awareness Pink Meet before traveling to Corvallis, Oregon, to face No. 8 Oregon State on Monday.

"This is a longer weekend for us, so we've been preparing all week," head coach Guard Young said. "We get to have a great, aggressive start with our bar lineup, and we end on beam, so we've got to be able to focus and stay mindful of where we're at and what we're doing."

The Cougars will again wear the pink leotards at USU after they debuted them last week in their home Pink Meet against Boise State. In that meet last Friday night, BYU took down the Broncos, 196.225 to 196.175, with three BYU gymnasts earning Mountain Rim Gymnastics Conference Specialists of the Week honors. Angel Zhong matched her career-high on vault with a 9.850. Shannon Hortman Evans and Kyleigh Greenlief both set new career records that night; Evans with a 9.900 on bars and Greenlief with the highest score of the night, a 9.950 on floor.

Utah State recorded a season-high road score of 195.325 last Friday against Denver, Michigan and Bowling Green. Freshman Mikaela Meyer was named one of the MRGC Vault Specialists of the Week after earning a 9.850 on the event. Another Aggie freshman, Autumn DeHarde, placed first on floor at the meet after matching her career-high 9.925.

Oregon State posted a second season-high road score against UCLA on Sunday, 196.525, as the Beavers exceeded the 49-point mark on all four events. Sophomore Isis Lowery and freshman Kaitlyn Yanish both earned a 9.900 on floor, confirming Oregon State's sixth-place national ranking on the event.

The Cougars will host a fireside while in Oregon on Sunday night. The fireside will be held at 7 p.m. at a LDS Church building in Albany, Oregon. Attendance will be open to the public.

"These firesides are an awesome experience for the girls to give a message to the youth in the area," Young said. "I find it so rewarding to hear the stories of these girls and their trials and everything they struggle with. It really puts things into perspective and reminds me why we're doing all of this."

The national rankings switched to regional qualifying scores (RQS) this weekend, ranking teams by the top six scores instead of overall season average. The top six scores are determined by the three highest away and home scores, putting the Cougars at a No. 24 national ranking.

The meet on Friday starts at 7 p.m. in the Dee Glenn Smith Spectrum in Logan, Utah. Live streaming will be available. The Oregon State meet will be held on Monday, March 5 at 7 p.m. PT/8 p.m. MST, at Gill Coliseum. Live streaming and live stats will be available.

**WEEK EIGHT RECAP:
BYU BEATS BOISE STATE**

PROVO, Utah – Senior Kyleigh Greenlief received a career-high 9.950 on floor while Shannon Hortman Evans posted a career-high 9.900 on bars, edging No. 18 BYU ahead of No. 13 Boise State 196.225 to 196.175 on Friday night in the Smith Fieldhouse.

“I’m super proud of this team,” head coach Guard Young said. “Tonight we were honoring those who battled cancer, so our team’s word tonight was ‘fight’ and that’s exactly what they did. Boise State is a great team that we match up well with, so I can’t wait to see them in a couple weeks at conference.”

Angel Zhong matched two of her career-highs on vault and bars at 9.850 and 9.775, respectively. Evans broke her personal record on bars with a score of 9.900 while Abbey Miner posted a new career-high 9.800 on vault. Floor specialist and senior Greenlief’s 9.950 on floor gave the Cougars the final edge over the Broncos.

“Honestly, I’m a little bit speechless,” Greenlief said. “I’ve been working really hard every day, so to have it pay off was so exciting.”

To begin the meet, Zhong led the Cougars on vault, matching her career high score of 9.850. Freshman Abbey Miner also posted a new career high on vault of 9.800, and, to finish, Avery Bennet added a 9.800. At the conclusion of the first rotation, the Cougars were just behind the Broncos, 49.100 to 49.000.

Evans led BYU in the second rotation on bars with a new career-high of 9.900. Brittni Hawes followed with a 9.875, while Haley Pitou added a 9.850. Zhong also matched her career high of 9.775. The Cougars took the lead at the end of the rotation with a 49.150 on bars, putting BYU ahead 98.150 to 98.025.

In the third rotation, BYU posted a 48.700 on beam. Jill van Mierlo led the team with a 9.875, and Natasha Trejo Marsh and Evans both added a 9.825 to the team’s score. However, at the end of the rotation, Boise State once again took the lead, 147.225 to 146.850.

The Cougars recorded their highest score of the night with a 49.325 on floor, led by a new career-high from Greenlief of 9.950. Evans and Briana Pearson also contributed with a 9.875 and a 9.850, respectively. With 9.800 scores or higher from every BYU gymnast on floor, the Cougars edged out the Broncos 196.225 to 196.175.

“Kyleigh’s 9.950 on floor has been a long time coming,” Young said. “I don’t even have to watch her this year. I just know that she’s going to hit her routine.”

The Cougars travel next weekend to Logan, Utah, to compete against Utah State University on Friday, March 2. The meet will begin at 7:00 p.m. MST at the Dee Glen Smith Spectrum.

Guard YOUNG

BYU Head Coach
2015-Present

A former BYU national champion gymnast and Olympic silver medal winner, Young enters his third year at the helm of the BYU gymnastics program.

A member of the BYU Athletic Hall of Fame, he returned to his alma mater in May of 2015.

Young came to BYU from the University of Oklahoma, where he was an assistant men's gymnastics coach from 2000-05 and 2011-15. In nine seasons at OU, Young was part of four NCAA championship teams (2002, 2003, 2005, 2015) and five NCAA runner-up teams (2001, 2004, 2012, 2013, 2014).

Young's passion for gymnastics is equaled by his love for BYU. From 1996 to 2000, he was a member of the BYU men's gymnastics team, winning six All-America awards and two NCAA National Championships on the vault (1999, 2000). As a senior, Young was also the runner-up for the individual all-around at the 2000 NCAA Championships. He was inducted into the BYU Athletic Hall of Fame in 2010.

From 2000 to 2004, Young was a member of the USA Senior National Gymnastics Team, winning a team silver medal at the 2001 World Championships in Ghent, Belgium, and a team silver medal the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece.

As a junior gymnast, he trained under OU coach Mark Williams at the Bart Conner Gymnastics Academy in Norman, Oklahoma. Young earned the 1996 junior national champion title and three junior national team berths.

Young graduated from BYU in 2001 with a Bachelor of Arts in communications with an emphasis in broadcast journalism. He and his wife, Alisha, have two boys and one daughter (Tyler, Jaxson and Hadley).

His father, Wayne Young, was a BYU gymnast from 1970-1975 and captained the 1976 USA Olympic team. Wayne later became the Cougars men's gymnastics coach from 1979-87 and was inducted into the BYU Athletic Hall of Fame in 1986. In addition, Guard's sister, Jessica Young Wycherly, was a gymnast at BYU from 1995-98.
