CAL HEADS TO BYU FOR FIRST ROAD GAME OF 2018 ON SATURDAY

- California hits the road for this first time in 2018 to face BYU Saturday night for the fifth all-time meeting between the Golden Bears and the Cougars. The teams have played only once previously in Provo in 1999.
- Cal forced four turnovers (all interceptions) and committed none for a +4 turnover margin that paved the way for the Bears' 24-17 victory over North Carolina in its season-opener last Saturday in Berkeley. The four interceptions were the most since the Bears recorded five against Washington State last year, which was also the last time Cal did not commit a turnover.
- The four interceptions rank tied second in the country, while Jaylinn Hawkins is tied for first in the nation individually with two picks. Cal also ranks tied for fourth in turnover margin and tied for fifth in turnovers gained.
- Cal recorded 14 points off of turnovers with Patrick Laird's three-yard rushing TD after Hawkins' first pick and Cameron Goode returning his interception for a score.
- Cal scored on all three of its trips to the red zone last Saturday (2 TD, 1 FG).
- Cal is 6-0 against nonconference Power 5 opponents since 2014 and 3-0 under Justin Wilcox.
- Laird scored both a rushing and receiving touchdown for the first time in his career against North Carolina.
- Cal used three quarterbacks in a game against North Carolina for the first time since a 2014 contest against Sacramento State. Ross Bowers got the start against North Carolina, while Chase Garbers and Brandon McIlwain made their Cal debuts.

Patrick Laird's Summer Reading Program – Senior running back Patrick Laird, an avid reader, gained a reputation last season for mimicking opening a book when he reached the end zone. The touchdown celebration originated as an inside joke amongst his teammates, but Laird took that celebration much further this year. To help combat learning loss over the summer, Laird created the Patrick Laird Summer Reading Challenge for students enrolled in grades 1-6. "Summer reading accounts for a significant amount of a student's academic success and neglecting to read over the summer can have a profoundly negative effect," Laird said. Participants who completed the challenge received up to four complimentary tickets for Cal's opener against North Carolina, as well as an opportunity to meet Laird in person after the game. To help promote his initiative, Laird recorded video interviews on reading with head coach Justin Wilcox, Director of Athletics Jim Knowlton, Chancellor Carol Christ and best-selling author Michael Lewis (of *The Blind Side* fame). Laird also visited over 26 schools and camps, had over 3,600 kids signed up for the challenge and 3,000 redeem tickets for the North Carolina game. Earn It – Head coach Justin Wilcox encourages the student-athletes in his program to be ambitious in other areas of campus outside of football obligations. Wilcox instills Cal Athletics' motto for the 2018-19 season, "Earn It," in everything the program does. He wants his student-athletes to grow as players, as students and as well-rounded and educated adults by taking advantage of all the great opportunities Cal has to offer, being smart and tough on the football field and making decisions with a purpose. Wilcox promotes that all decisions made are made for what is best for the team, taking a systematic approach every time. During the spring, Wilcox had his student-athletes read a book called *The Traveler's Gift*, which is a book about lessons in life that Wilcox wants them to incorporate on the football field and their everyday lives.

Tailgate Town Pregame Concerts – Three of the more notable additions to the gameday experience at Cal football games in 2018 are free pregame concerts for the North Carolina, Oregon and Washington State games. Tainted Love, which bills itself as San Francisco's Original '80's tribute band, kicked things off Sept. 1 with a pre-game concert prior to the season-opening North Carolina contest. For the Oregon game on Sept. 29, Petty Theft will offer up songs from Rock and Roll Hall of Fame band Tom Petty and the Heartbreakers. The series concludes when Washington visits on Oct. 27 with Foreverland, which pays tribute to Michael Jackson from the Jackson 5 era all the way through the end of his career. Life After Ball – Cal football strives to prepare its student-athletes for a prosperous career when their days of playing football come to an end through a program known as LAB – Life After Ball. Former Cal football student-athletes Ron Coccimiglio (1976-80) and Tarik Glenn (1993-96) both currently work with the program helping current football student-athletes with life skills and career development. When his playing days ended, Coccimiglio enjoyed a fruitful business career and wanted to help future Bears achieve the same post-football success, and to help them avoid the financial pitfalls that can happen if they aren't prepared. Carolina Panthers head coach Ron Rivera is among the guests Cal football has brought in to discuss skills needed beyond the football field.

Catapult GPS Wearable Technology Units – Cal football uses wearable technology GPS units by Catapult, the high-tech methodology that several Golden Bear teams use to improve their performance and reduce risk of injury during practices and games. The system is used by sport coaches, strength & conditioning coaches and athletic trainers to monitor student-athletes in games, practices and training. The concept is to allow the student-athletes to work smarter, not necessarily harder. Cal players often will ask the strength & conditioning staff how their numbers read while doing certain drills during practice to get a gauge on parameters like explosive efforts, velocity yards and max velocity. "A lot of the student-athletes today, they're more well-informed than ever, Justin Wilcox said. "They want to know the 'why.' Learning how to train properly, there's the physical part of it, but there are certain things you can't measure in terms of the mental part. We have to make sure we're doing what's best for them to get them to do their best when it matters most." Link for more info: calbea.rs/2o7HR5R

Family Matters To Bowers – Ross Bowers' parents, John and Joanne, both moved to the Bay Area last year to be closer to Ross. John is currently the Dean of Discipline and an assistant football coach at Clayton Valley Charter High School after spending three seasons on the football coaching staff at his alma mater James Madison helping lead the Dukes to a 2016 FCS national championship in his final season at the school while serving as outside linebackers coach and special teams coordinator. Joanne, was recently named head women's gymnastics coach at San Jose State. Previously, she spent 10 seasons from 2006-16 as the head women's gymnastics coach at Washington. Last season, Bowers scored a rushing touchdown with a highlight-reel flip into the end zone that made Sportscenter's Top 10 that day. His mother trained him how to jump on a trampoline when he was a child.

Steps Of Love – Jordan Kunaszyk and several other Cal student-athletes recently went to the impoverished Mexican town of Puerto Peñasco and worked with a non-profit organization called "Steps of Love." The group spent six days helping build a garden, renovate a nursery in a church and paint the outside of the church and a family's home. They painted a house and the outside of a church building, and they helped a family put up dry wall in their kitchen. Cal softball student-athlete Kobie Pettis said the experience was definitely eye-opening. "I can't even imagine living the way they do," she said. "They hardly have running water. These kids wanted to help themselves as much as we were helping them. It was so humbling. I was in awe. It made me crave to give more." Link for more info: calbea.rs/2M03zKh

Sports Business Group – Collin Moore and Michael Saffell are members of the on-campus group called The Sports Business Group, which has worked with Cal Athletics with fan experience at football games, and is currently helping the Oakland Athletics and San Jose Earthquakes in the same area. They work with the organization on increasing attendance by improving the fan experience, as well as assisting the Oakland Athletics with best practices if the team moves to a new ballpark in Oakland. One of the reasons Saffell chose to attend Cal is because of all the wide array of hands-on experience in the business realm. "The benefits of attending Cal are the connections you're able to make, the great minds you're around and the network you can build," Saffell said. "Having such a prestigious school backing you, a group like this is a perfect example of how diving into the academic opportunities at Cal is so beneficial when you're getting recruited by Cal." DEFENSE PROVIDES SPARK IN SEASON-OPENING WIN

- Cal's defense recorded four interceptions and limited visiting North Carolina to 17 points to begin Justin Wilcox's second season with a 24-17 victory over the Tar Heels last Saturday in Berkeley. North Carolina struggled to gain positive yardage at all in the first half, failing to pick up single first down in the first quarter and without a drive of more than three plays in the first half. UNC scored 14 points in the fourth quarter, but Cal recovered an onside kick with 1:08 remaining and ran out the clock.
- Cal improved to 4-0 in nonconference games including a pair of Power 5 wins over North Carolina in the Wilcox era.

NATIONAL HONORS CANDIDATE PATRICK LAIRD SCORES TWICE VS. UNC

- National honors candidate Patrick Laird picked up where he left off after his breakout 2017 campaign last Saturday against North Carolina, rushing 29 times for 95 yards and pacing Cal in receiving with four catches for 14 yards. In addition, Laird scored a rushing touchdown and a receiving touchdown for the first time in his career. Laird also led all players in receptions last Saturday with four (14 yards).
- Laird is tied for 19th nationally with two total touchdowns and tied for 23rd nationally in scoring with 12 points.
- Laird is a national honors candidate and on the preseason watch list for numerous awards including those that honor the nation's top player, running back and student-athlete, as well as those that recognize community service. Laird had a breakout 2017 junior season when he rushed 191 times for 1127 yards and eight touchdowns to become the 16th 1,000-yard rusher in Cal history and the first since Daniel Lasco in 2014 while recording the 19th 1,000-yard rushing season in school history. Laird has an opportunity to become only the third two-time 1,000-yard rusher in Cal history with the others Russell White (3) and Marshawn Lynch (2).

FOUR PICKS VS. TAR HEELS

- Cal collected three first-half interceptions and finished with a total four last Saturday against North Carolina. Jaylinn Hawkins came up with his second and third career interceptions in the second and fourth quarters for his first career multi-interception game. Hawkins ranks tied for first in the nation in interceptions. The last time a Cal player intercepted two passes in a game was Camryn Bynum against Washington State in 2017.
- Cameron Goode had an interception and returned it for a career-long 38-yard touchdown. It was his second career interception, both returned for touchdowns (32 yards, Ole Miss in 2017). Goode ranks tied for first in the nation in interceptions returned for a touchdown.
- Ashtyn Davis recorded Cal's third interception of the day in the second quarter. It was the second of his career (Arizona, 2017). He also notched his fourth career pass breakup in the third quarter.

OTHER DEFENSIVE NOTES AND RANKINGS

- The Cal defense prevented North Carolina from earning a first down on its first seven drives. Five of those drives were three-and-outs and two ended with turnovers. The Tar Heels earned their first first down on their eighth drive, but threw their third interception of the game on the next play.
- Evan Weaver set a new career high with his game-high 13 tackles. He leads the nation with 13 solo tackles and is tied for 11th with 13 total tackles.
- Camryn Bynum registered a career-high and game-high four pass breakups. He is tied for second in the nation in passes defended.
- Cal led at halftime, 17-0. The previous biggest halftime lead in the Justin Wilcox era was 17-3 vs. Washington State in 2017. This was also the first halftime shutout in the Wilcox era.
- Cal ranks eighth nationally in pass efficiency defense (62.31).

PLUS-FOUR TURNOVER MARGIN

- Cal scored 14 points off of turnovers and finished with a plus-four turnover margin (4-0) all on interceptions against North Carolina last Saturday. The turnover margin, takeaways, turnovers gained, interceptions and turnovers allowed were all Cal's best since a plus-seven turnover margin (7-0) against Washington State in 2017 that included five interceptions.
- Cal ranks tied for second nationally in interceptions (4), tied for fourth in turnover margin (+4), tied for fifth in turnovers gained (four).
- After not surrendering a turnover last Saturday, Cal is tied for first nationally in turnovers lost, interceptions allowed and fumbles lost.

BEARS PLAY THREE QBs VS. UNC

- Cal used three quarterbacks last Saturday against North Carolina. The last time the Bears played three QBs in a game was against Sacramento State in 2014 (Jared Goff, Luke Rubenzer, Austin Hinder). Ross Bowers got the start while Chase Garbers and Brandon McIlwain made their Cal debuts.
- Garbers threw his first career touchdown pass on a four-yarder to Patrick Laird in the third quarter.

TOP RECEIVING DUO LEADS WR DEPTH

- Vic Wharton III (67-871, 5 TD) and Kanawai Noa (56-788, 4 TD) combined for 123 receptions in 2017 to rank third among all returning FBS duos heading into 2018 while their 1659 yards receiving was seventh. Wharton's 67 receptions in 2017 rank ninth in Cal's single-season history. Wharton and Noa were both named to the preseason watch list for the Biletnikoff Award given annually to college football's outstanding receiver at any position.
- Wharton, Noa and Jordan Duncan each had three catches last Saturday against North Carolina to pace the Cal wide receivers behind running back Patrick Laird's game-high four. Duncan's 34 yards receiving led Cal while the longest reception of the day was a 23-yarder by Moe Ways, a senior graduate transfer from Michigan making his Cal debut.

FAMILIAR FACES ON O-LINE

- Cal returns all of its offensive line starts from a 2017 group that helped the Golden Bears boast a 3,000-yard passer and 1,000-yard rusher in the same season for only the third time in school history in 2017. Kamryn Bennett, Addison Ooms and Jake Curhan each started all 12 games a year ago, while Patrick Mekari (10), Valentino Daltoso (9), Ryan Gibson (3) and Michael Saffell (2) also made starts in 2017.
- The starting offensive linemen in last Saturday's season opener against North Carolina were Mekari, Daltoso, Ooms, Saffell and Curhan.
- Ooms is the only Cal offensive player to start the past 25 games dating back to 2016. He's the first Bear to do so since Jared Goff (2013-15).

RED ZONE

- Cal was 3-for-3 in the red zone last Saturday vs. North Carolina. The Bears scored two touchdowns (Laird, 3-yd run and Laird 4-yd pass) and Greg Thomas made a 35-yard field goal for the three red zone scores.
- The 100.0 percentage in the red zone ranks tied for first in the nation.
- Last season, in 49 red zone attempts, Cal scored 40 times (27 touchdowns, 13 field goals) for a percentage of .816 that ranked 87th in the nation.

THOMAS MAKES FIRST CAREER FIELD GOAL AT CAL

- Junior Greg Thomas was good on his first career field goal attempt at Cal last Saturday against North Carolina from 35 yards out. He finished 1-for-2 on the day, missing his second try from 47 yards. He was good on all three of his extra-point attempts.
- Thomas transferred to Cal from City College of San Francisco where he spent the 2017 season after spending the first two seasons of his collegiate career at Arizona State from 2015-16.

COUTTS PUNTS EIGHT TIMES VS. NORTH CAROLINA

- After punting only five times in 2017, Steven Coutts recorded a Cal career eight punts last Saturday against North Carolina. His longest went for 54 yards, and he pinned the Tar Heels inside their 20-yard line five times.

DAVIS RETURNS AFTER SHOWING KICK RETURN PROWESS

- Ashtyn Davis, who joined the Cal football program in the spring of 2015 after a walk-on tryout, has become an integral piece of Cal's special teams and defensive units as a kick returner and safety. Davis shared the nation's lead in kick returns a year ago with 39 while ranking ninth in kick return yards (826) and 14th in combined kick return yards (826). His total kick returns and kick return yards in 2017 both rank third in Cal's single-season history.
- Davis returned one kickoff for 21 yards vs. North Carolina last Saturday. Defensively, Davis garnered one of Cal's four interceptions along with two tackles and one pass breakup.
- Davis was named to the watch list for the Paul Hornung Award, honoring the most versatile player in college football.
- Davis also competed on the track & field team through the end of his collegiate eligibility in the sport in the spring of 2018, earning four All-American honors while winning the Pac-12 title in the 110 meter hurdles as a 2017 junior and back-to-back MPSF Championships in the 60 meter hurdles as a 2016 sophomore and a junior.

STARTING STRONG

- After last Saturday's 24-17 victory over North Carolina, the Bears have won their last five season openers.
- Cal is 78-42-2 all-time in season openers and has a 12-3 mark since 2004.
- Cal also improved its all-time record against ACC teams to 5-2-1, two of which were bowl victories (vs. Clemson in 1992 Citrus Bowl and Miami in 2008 Emerald Bowl).

CAL IN ROAD OPENERS

- This week's trip to Provo will be Cal's first road trip of 2018. Since 2002, Cal is 10-6 in true road openers, including the last three in a row. Also included during that span is Cal's 2016 season-opening win over Hawaii in Sydney, Australia.

LAST TIME VS. BYU

- Cal and BYU last met in the 2014 season finale in Berkeley. Cal would have become bowl eligible with a win, but the Cougars defeated the Bears, 42-35. Jared Goff passed for 393 yards and four touchdown passes, a school-record-tying three of which were caught by Kenny Lawler. Daniel Lasco carried the ball 26 times for 130 yards.
- After the Bears tied the game in the fourth quarter on a 23-yard touchdown pass from Goff to Trevor Davis, BYU took the lead for good with 2:39 remaining on a 38-yard touchdown pass from Christian Stewart to Jordan Leslie.
- Cal is 1-3 all-time against BYU with the lone win at the 2005 Las Vegas Bowl. This week will be the second time Cal has played in Provo. The first meeting in the series took place in Provo in 1999, a 38-28 Cougar win.

GAME CAPTAINS

- Patrick Laird and Jordan Kunaszyk were selected as team captains for the 2018 season. In addition to the two season captains, Cal will select two players to be game captains each week. The game captains for the BYU contest have yet to be selected.

2018 SCHEDULE

- Cal plays seven home games including five Pac-12 conference contests at California Memorial Stadium in 2018 with Idaho State (Sept. 15), Oregon (Sept. 29), UCLA (Oct. 13), Washington (Oct. 27), Stanford (Nov. 17) and Colorado (Nov. 24) each still remaining. Each of the team's 12 regular-season games will be played on Saturdays for the first time since 2013.

ACADEMIC PROWESS

- Cal registered its best-ever four-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score of 978 in May of 2017, which accounted for football student-athletes on rosters between the 2012-13 and 2015-16 academic years. Cal's one-year APR score of 991 for the 2015-16 academic year was the second-highest in the Pac-12. Cal followed that up at the end of the 2016-17 academic year with a four-year score of 976 that is two points shy of its all-time high.

- Jim Knowlton, who spent the past three seasons leading the athletic department at the United States Air Force Academy is in his first season as the Director of Athletics at Cal. A past recipient of the National Association of Collegiate Directors of Athletics (NACDA) and an Athletic Director of the Year award winner, Knowlton has a well-deserved reputation as an accomplished administrator and dynamic leader. Throughout his career, Knowlton has focused on and successfully fostering programs that place a premium on leadership and character development among student-athletes, coaches and staff. He has demonstrated an unflinching commitment to high achievement, both in academics and athletics, has a proven track record as a fundraiser, and has shown a consistent ability to take on complex challenges and develop strategic solutions to meet them.

IN THE BOOTH

- Joe Starkey, the legendary voice of the Golden Bears, is in his 44th season with the Cal football radio broadcast team and has been on the air for 497 of the team's 504 contests since beginning his tenure at Cal in 1975. In 2010, Starkey received the Chris Schenkel Award from the National Football Foundation for his distinguished career broadcasting college football. In 2016, the Cal radio broadcast booth was named The Joe Starkey Broadcast Booth. He will formally become a member of the Cal Athletic Hall of Fame when the Class of 2018 is inducted on Friday, Oct. 26.
- Starkey is joined in the booth by analyst and former Cal quarterback Mike Pawlawski, who is in his seventh season and second stint as part of the Cal football broadcast team in 2018. Pawlawski led Cal to back-to-back bowl victories as the Bears' starting quarterback in 1990 and 1991, and was the Pac-10's Co-Offensive Player of the Year as a 1991 senior.
- In his 14th season on the broadcast team in 2018 is sideline reporter Todd McKim, who also serves as host of the Cal Athletics' Bear In Mind weekly podcast and is the play-by-play voice for the Cal men's basketball radio broadcasts.

PRO BEARS

- Cal has 31 affiliates associated with the National Football League as of Sept. 4, 2018, including 22 players on active rosters, three on injured reserved lists, two on practice squads and and four members of coaching staffs. The Golden Bears’ total number of players on NFL rosters ranked second among Pac-12 schools and tied for 13th in the nation at the beginning of the 2017 season with new numbers slated to be released on the opening day of the 2018 regular season.
- Cal has had at least one former player on a Super Bowl roster in 17 of the last 18 NFL seasons.
- Cal has had 27 first-round NFL Draft picks including two No. 1 overall selections in quarterbacks Jared Goff (Los Angeles Rams, 2016) and Steve Bartkowski (Atlanta Falcons, 1975), among 237 selections overall since the draft began in 1936.
- Cal has had at least one player selected in the NFL Draft in 31 of the last 32 years including two in the 2018 draft in Devante Downs (Minnesota Vikings, seventh round, No. 225 overall) and James Looney (Green Bay Packers, seventh round, No. 232 overall).
- Cal has had six quarterbacks taken in the first round of the NFL Draft to tie for the third-most by any college football program in the nation behind only Notre Dame (9) and USC (8) while equaling Stanford (6). Cal’s list includes Craig Morton (1965 – No. 6, Dallas Cowboys), Bartkowski, Rich Campbell (1981 – No. 6, Green Bay Packers), Kyle Boller (2003 – No. 19, Baltimore Ravens), Aaron Rodgers (2005 – No. 24, Green Bay Packers) and Goff.

STORYLINES

- Justin Wilcox's father, Dave Wilcox, is a Pro Football Hall of Fame linebacker who played for the San Francisco 49ers from 1964-74. Justin's uncle, John (Philadelphia Eagles, 1960), and brother, Josh (New Orleans Saints, 1998-99), also played in the NFL.
- Beau Baldwin was a player/coach in a semi-pro football league in Sweden before beginning his full-time coaching career.
- Tim DeRuyter served seven years of active duty with the Air Force after his graduation from the academy in 1985.
- Burl Toler III's family has a long legacy at Cal. His father, Burl Toler Jr., was a four-year letterwinner as a linebacker for the Bears from 1974-77. His mother, Susan, is a Cal graduate, as are his brother, Cameron, and sisters, Pita and Laureina. Cameron, was a member of the Cal football program from 2004-07, while Pita and Laureina were on the Cal track and field team. Pita currently works as a member of the Cal Athletic Development staff. In addition, his grandfather, the late Burl Toler Sr., played on the legendary 1951 San Francisco team and later became the first African-American official in the NFL before spending 25 seasons in the role from 1965-89.
- Ross Bowers' father, John, was an assistant head coach/recruiting coordinator/outside linebackers coach at James Madison, while his mother, Joanne, was the head women's gymnastics coach at Washington. Both left their positions to move to the Bay Area to be closer to Ross.
- Former Cal football student-athletes Ron Coccimiglio (1976-80) and Tarik Glenn (1993-96) both currently work with the program helping current football student-athletes with life skills and career development. Coccimiglio serves as the director of career development, while Glenn is a student-athlete development advisor.
- Jordan Kunaszyk and other Cal student-athletes recently went to the impoverished Mexican town of Puerto Peñasco and worked with a non-profit organization called "Steps of Love" to put up a foundation for a wall that would surround a garden for kids so they would have fresh produce. They painted a house and the outside of a church building, and they helped a family put up dry wall in their kitchen.
- Malik McMorris is a dual-sport athlete, also competing on Cal's track & field team. McMorris found his source of inspiration to succeed athletically and academically in his mother who passed away from breast cancer when he was in high school.
- Kanawai Noa and Semisi Uluave are natives of Hawaii and attended Punahou High School in Honolulu. The two have played football together and been close friends since the seventh grade. Uluave also hopes to become a pilot.
- Collin Moore and Michael Saffell are members of the on-campus group called The Sports Business Group, which has worked with Cal Athletics with fan experience at football games, and is currently helping the Oakland Athletics and San Jose Earthquakes in the same area.
- Jaylinn Hawkins spent the summer serving as a peer advisor, helping the newest Cal student-athletes get adjusted to their new lives as Golden Bears.
- Biaggio Ali Walsh's grandfather is boxing legend Muhammad Ali. The two were very close.
- Six Cal players list international hometowns – Steven Coutts (Brisbane, Australia), Hiroaki Endo (Tokyo, Japan), Jasper Friis (Starnberg, Germany), Siulagisipai Fuimaono (Okinawa, Japan), Gabe Siemieniec (Caledon, Ontario, Canada) and Lone Toailoa (Auckland, New Zealand).
- Hiroaki Endo first came to Cal as a student video assistant until an opportunity to join the roster opened up.
- Football operations assistant Bud "Dog" Turner celebrates his 49th season involved with Cal football in 2018 and likes to say that he is "halfway through his career."
- Patrick Mekari's parents fled from the Middle East in the 1970s. His mother's side of the family left Iran during the country's revolution, while his father, his mother and four siblings left during the country's civil war and arrived as immigrants in Foster City, Calif., before moving to Southern California.
- Defensive backs coach Gerald Alexander (@GAlexander21) has tweeted over 103,000 times.
- Brandon McIlwain is a multi-sport student-athlete, also competing on the Cal baseball team
- Moe Ways and Ian Bunting are two graduate transfers who came to Cal from Michigan
- A bobble head commemorating The Play, showing Kevin Moen scoring the winning touchdown, will be distributed to the first 10,000 fans who attend the Nov. 17 matchup between Cal and Stanford in California Memorial Stadium.

HEAD COACH JUSTIN WILCOX



Justin Wilcox is in his second season as the head football coach at Cal in 2018. After leading some of the top defenses in the nation as an FBS defensive coordinator for 11 seasons prior to his arrival at Cal in January of 2017, Wilcox posted a 5-7 overall mark in his first campaign at the helm of the Golden Bears.

Wilcox improved to 6-7 overall after a 24-17 victory over North Carolina in the 2018 season-opener last Saturday in Berkeley, marking two straight season-opening wins for Wilcox as head coach at Cal. In the Wilcox era, the Bears are 4-0 in nonconference games.

The highlights of his first season as the head coach in Berkeley in 2017 included a 3-0 start that featured non-conference wins over Power 5 programs North Carolina and Ole Miss, as well as a 37-3 victory over then No. 8/9 Washington State in an ESPN nationally-televised Friday night home game. The victory against the Cougars snapped Cal's 17-game losing streak to top-10 teams, was the Bears' first victory against a top-10 team since 2003 and only its second top-10 win since 1977.

Cal also had a Pac-12 victory over Oregon State and took three conference squads down to the final moments before falling by a combined total of seven points to Arizona, and on the road in its final two games of the season at UCLA and Stanford.

Wilcox will look to build upon his first season at Cal with a 2018 team that is slated to include 31 players that combined last season to make 208 starts on offense (17 players, 118 starts) and defense (13 players, 86 starts).

The returning group on offense includes quarterback Ross Bowers, who is the leading returner in the Pac-12 in passing yards per game (253.2) after throwing for 3039 yards in 2017 to rank sixth on the Bears' all-time single-season list. The team's leading rusher Patrick Laird (1127 yards, 8 TD) and its top three receivers in Vic Wharton III (67-871, 5 TD), Kanawai Noa (56-788, 4 TD) and Laird (45-322, 1 TD) are also slated to return.

Laird was one of 10 national semifinalists for the Burlsworth Trophy awarded annually to the nation's most outstanding football player who began his career as a walk-on in 2017. He also earned honorable mention All-Pac-12 honors and was a first-team Pac-12 All-Academic pick in addition to finding a spot on the CoSIDA Academic All-District® 8 squad. He ranks 12th among the nation's leading returning rushers with his 102.5 rushing yards per game while his 1127 total rushing yards check in at 19th.

The combined 123 catches by Wharton III (67-871, 5 TD) and Noa (56-788, 4 TD) rank third among all returning FBS duos while their 1659 yards receiving are seventh. Wharton's 67 receptions in 2017 were ninth in school history.

Wilcox will also have 10 of the top 14 tacklers from 2017 scheduled to return in 2018 including last year's team leaders in tackles (Jordan Kunaszyk, 74), tackles for loss (Alex Funches, 10.5) and pass breakups (Camryn Bynum 8), as well as those that shared the team lead in interceptions (Bynum/Kunaszyk, 2) and forced fumbles (Elijah Hicks, 2).

The most dramatic statistical improvements in 2017 came on defense, where the Bears allowed 14.2 points fewer per contest than the previous season, giving up only 28.4 points per game allowing 42.6 the season before his arrival in 2016. Much of the 2017 team's success came from its big-play ability on defense. Cal ranked among the nation's best for much of the season in nearly every defensive category related to turnovers before finishing tied for 21st in defensive touchdowns (4), tied for 27th in fumbles recovered (10), tied for 29th in turnovers

gained (24) and tied for 32nd in passes intercepted (14). Cal's seven takeaways in a 37-3 win over then No. 8/9 Washington State equaled the second-most by an FBS team in 2017 with the Bears' 9.0 sacks in the contest the most by a Cal team since 2005. The 2017 Cal defense had better total numbers and rankings than the 2016 squad in 14 of the primary 15 team defensive statistics tracked by the NCAA. Even more impressive was the Bears' average improvement in the national rankings of just under 40 spots per category in those 15 defensive statistics.

Prior to becoming Cal's head coach, Wilcox most recently spent the 2016 campaign as the defensive coordinator for Cotton Bowl champion Wisconsin following previous stops in the same role at Boise State (2006-09), Tennessee (2010-11), Washington (2012-13) and USC (2014-15). Over his first 16 seasons in collegiate coaching as an assistant, Wilcox was a member of staffs that coached teams to 14 bowl games, five conference or division championships and compiled an all-time record of 150-58.

Wilcox also spent three seasons as the Bears' linebackers coach from 2003-05 in his first position as a full-time coach

A 1999 graduate of Oregon with a bachelor's degree in anthropology, Wilcox is the son of Dave Wilcox, a Pro Football Hall of Fame linebacker who played for the San Francisco 49ers from 1964-74.

As a collegiate student-athlete, Wilcox was a safety and cornerback at Oregon (1996-99), helping the Ducks to three bowl games.

- **Beau Baldwin (Offensive Coordinator/Assistant Head Coach):** Baldwin's first offense at Cal in 2017 was led by nearly all first-year starters that return in 2018 including Ross Bowers, who started all 12 games and is the Pac-12's top returning passer with his 253.2 yards per game average. Cal returns 16 offensive players that started a combined total of 117 contests in 2017 while losing only five that made 17 starts a year ago.
- **Tim DeRuyter (Defensive Coordinator/Outside Linebackers):** DeRuyter orchestrated a dramatic improvement on the defensive side of the ball in his first campaign at Cal in 2017 when the Golden Bears gave up 14.2 points less per contest than the year before his arrival in 2016, allowing only 28.4 points per contest. Cal ranked among the nation's best for much of the season in nearly every defensive category related to turnovers before finishing tied for 21st in defensive touchdowns (4), tied for 27th in fumbles recovered (10), tied for 29th in turnovers gained (24) and tied for 32nd in passes intercepted (14).
- **Gerald Alexander (Defensive Backs):** Alexander helped Camryn Bynum earn the team's Bob Tessier Award as its Most Valuable Freshman after leading all defensive backs and ranking fifth on the team with 58 tackles in his first season of action as a redshirt freshman. Bynum was also the team's leader with eight pass breakups and 10 passes defended, while co-leading the squad with a pair of interceptions.
- **Nicholas Edwards (Wide Receivers):** Edwards guided the emergence of Vic Wharton III and Kanawai Noa in 2017. The combined 123 catches in 2017 by Wharton III (67-871, 5 TD) and Noa (56-788, 4 TD) rank third among all returning FBS duos while their 1659 yards receiving are seventh. Wharton's 67 receptions were ninth in Cal's single-season school history.
- **Steve Greatwood (Offensive Line):** Greatwood's veteran group of returnees in his unit in 2018 consist of seven players who made all 60 starts on the offensive line in 2017. Cal also has five freshman offensive linemen who ranked in the top 100 nationally in the 2018 recruiting class.
- **Charlie Ragle (Special Teams Coordinator/Tight Ends):** Ragle's charges in 2017 included Matt Anderson and Ashtyn Davis. Anderson finished his collegiate career as Cal's all-time leader in points (316) and field goals (60), while Davis ranked tied for first nationally in kick returns (39), tied for ninth in kick return yards (826) and 14th in combined kick return yards (826). Ragle also helped Cal sign Slater Zellers, the nation's No. 1 long snapper in the 2018 recruiting class.
- **Peter Sirmon (Associate Head Coach Defense/Inside Linebackers):** Sirmon is in his first season at Cal after serving as the defensive coordinator at Mississippi State (2016) and Louisville (2017) the last two campaigns. He previously coached on staffs with Cal head coach Justin Wilcox for six seasons at Tennessee (2010-11), Washington (2012-13) and USC (2014-15).
- **Burl Toler III (Running Backs):** Toler in his first season at his alma mater as Cal's running backs coach. He was a four-year letterwinner at Cal and began his journey to a coaching career with three seasons in quality control on Cal's football staff (2013-15) following his professional playing career. He was also the wide receivers coach at Fresno State in 2016 and UC Davis in 2017.
- **Marques Tuiasosopo (Passing Game Coordinator/Quarterbacks/Recruiting Coordinator):** Tuiasosopo has all four quarterbacks from Cal's 2017 roster returning including Ross Bowers, who started all 12 games for Cal a year ago and is the Pac-12's top returning passer with his 253.2 yards per game average after throwing for a total 3039 yards in 2017 to rank fourth in the conference in passing yards per game and fifth in total passing yards, while his total passing yards were sixth in Cal history.
- **Tony Tuioti (Defensive Line):** Tuioti has become Cal's defensive line coach in his second season in 2018 after working with the outside linebackers in 2017. He helped the Bears finish tied for 41st nationally in sacks (up 66 spots from its 2016 national ranking) with an average of 2.33 sacks per game in his first season at Cal with the team's outside linebackers responsible for 11.0 of Cal's 28.0 sacks.
- **Torre Becton (Head Strength and Conditioning):** Becton is his second season at Cal in 2018, He spent the six campaigns prior to his arrival at Cal in the Pac-12 on the strength and conditioning staffs at Washington (2011-15) and USC (2016), helping the programs to bowl games each season.

California Memorial Stadium is located on Piedmont Avenue in Berkeley between Bancroft Way and Hearst Avenue, adjacent to the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance at 2227 Piedmont Avenue.

MEDIA PARKING

Parking at Cal is always at a premium and visitors are encouraged to use public transportation. The Downtown Berkeley BART station is located about a mile west of Memorial Stadium, in close proximity to Haas Pavilion, Edwards Stadium/Goldman Field, the Hellman Tennis Courts and Spieker Aquatics Complex. Hourly guest parking on non-football gamedays is available in the Recreation Sports Facility garage along Bancroft Way adjacent to Haas Pavilion and at the Underhill Garage.

Underhill also serves as the football gameday parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about three blocks from Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to Media Will Call at Gate 5 in Memorial Stadium) or use a media-only shuttle that begins running two hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available postgame from the pregame dropoff point along Warring Street to the Underhill Garage.

Parking passes cannot be left at will call on gamedays and must be picked up or mailed in advance.

Television crews should order parking passes for their crews by sending in the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the university's website (pt.berkeley.edu) in advance. Request the Underhill Garage for football games. Note that the campus parking office does not accept credit cards - only cash or check.
