BYU STORYLINES

- 20 YEARS OF BYU SOFTBALL. The start of the 2020 season marks the 20th anniversary of the start of BYU softball. February 4, 2000, the Cougars defeated Sacramento State 3-2 in San Jose to start the program off with a win. In the 20 years, BYU has captured 14 conference titles and made 16 appearances in the NCAA tournament. Head coach Gordon Eakin has been part of the BYU softball program since its inception and took over the head coaching duties in 2002.
- HEADING SOUTH. This will be the first weekend that the BYU softball team will be heading South as they travel to Tuscaloosa, Alabama. Last season, the Cougars made two trips to the South for games at Tennessee, Texas A&M and UTEP
- FRESHMAN POWER. Freshman Huntyr Ava has quickly become a power hitter for the BYU softball team. Following her performance at the Judi Garman Classic, including five homers and 10 RBI she was nationally ranked as No. 4 in RBI per game (1.42), No. 7 in homers (8) and RBI (27) and No. 16 in home runs per game (0.42).
- NFCA NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK. Rylee Jensen-McFarland earned her third career NFCA National Player of the Week. The senior outfielder finished the weekend batting .643 with eight RBI and seven runs scored. Jensen-McFarland, who doubled, tripled and launched three home runs, slugged 1.500 and registered a .684 onbase percentage (four walks).
- WCC PLAYER OF THE WEEK. Rylee Jensen-McFarland earned WCC Player of the Week in back-to-back weeks after her performance at the Judi Garman Classic. It was her 10th career Player of the Week award.

5-5 On the first day of the Judi Garman Classic, Rylee Jensen-McFarland went a perfect 5-5 with four runs, four RBI, a double, a triple and a homer with two walks.

After blasting five homers over the weekend, freshman Huntyr Ava was ranked No. 7 nationally in homers and No. 16 in home runs per game. The first baseman has totaled eight homers this season.

At the Judi Garman Classic, the BYU softball team recorded 12 homers in five games. Huntyr Ava and Rylee Jensen-McFarland both smashed homers in three-straight games. Ava finished the weekend with five total homers and Jensen-McFarland had three.

Against California, Autumn Moffat recorded her 200th career strikeout. In the win, the right-handed pitcher struck out six batters with no walks.

BYU TEAM NOTABLES

Strength of schedule

BYU will match up against three 2019 World Series teams including the runner-up Oklahoma, who also won the title in 2017 and 2016. The Cougars will face Oklahoma in the first tournament of the season and will take on Arizona and Alabama, the other two World Series teams, later in the season. Ten of the teams that BYU will play advanced to the NCAA Regionals, with four making it to the Super Regionals. The 57-game schedule includes teams from all of the Power Five conferences including five from the Pac-12, three from the Big 12, two from both the Big Ten and SEC as well as one from the ACC.

WCC: Year seven

BYU enters the seventh season in the West Coast Conference after jumping around following its departure from the Mountain West. The Cougars played in the Western Athletic Conference in 2012 and the Pacific Coast Softball Conference in 2013 before softball was added in the WCC beginning in the 2014 season. Spanning the four conferences. BYU has won 11 conference titles in a row.

Postseason consistency

For the past 15 seasons, BYU has advanced to the NCAA regionals. The Cougars have gone to 16 NCAA regionals overall, advancing to super regionals in 2010.

Along with receiving honors in conference play 2019, Arissa Paulson and Rylee Jensen received NFCA Division I All-Pacific Region First Team accolades with Lexi Tarrow making the third team.

Student athletes

On and off the field, BYU softball players are making their mark. Rylee Jensen was named to the 2019 WCC All-Academic Team after earning at least a 3.20 cumulative GPA while also being significant contributors to the team. Also, Tayeli Williams made it on the WCC Commissioners Gold Honor Roll for having at least a 3.75 GPA.

Sisters in softball

The 2020 BYU softball team has two sets of sisters on the team, Emilee and Kaylee Erickson as well as Arissa and Aubrielle Paulson. They are third and fourth set of sisters to play together on a BYU softball team, respectively. In the inaugural softball season (2000), twins Jamie and Bryn Kreipl were on the roster. Sisters Anna and Alexandra Hudson played together from 2012-13. Emilee is a senior third baseman while Kaylee is a freshman catcher. Arissa is a redshirt junior pitcher and Aubrielle is a sophomore outfielder. The Paulson's older sister Arianna was a pitcher on the team until 2018.

Gail Miller Field

BYU's field is part of Miller Park, a unique, combined baseball-softball facility. Baseball plays on Larry H. Miller field, while softball calls Gail Miller Field, a back-to-back mirror image of the pre-existing baseball field, home. It was the first combined facility of its kind when it opened in April 2001. BYU has a home record of 233-51 (.820) at the field. Gail Miller Field has 2,100 chair seats all in the lower bowl, making it the fourth-largest on-campus NCAA softball facility at the time of it's creation. The field dimensions are 210 feet down the left-and right-field lines and 220 in center field.

Softball to take on two ranked opponents in Tuscaloosa

PROVO, Utah – For the first time this season, the BYU softball team will head to the South for the T-Town Showdown hosted by Alabama to take on the No. 10 Crimson Tide, Bryant and No. 3 Texas.

The tournament will be BYU's first-ever trip to Rhoads Stadium in Tuscaloosa.

The Cougars kick off the tournament on Thursday night against the host Alabama at 6 p.m. ET. The game will be broadcast on the SEC Network with radio coverage on Praise 93.3. On Friday, March 13, BYU will play its first game against Bryant at 1 p.m. The Cougars will take on Bryant again Saturday, March 14 at 11 a.m. immediately followed by a match-up against Texas at 1:30 p.m.

This will be the first tournament in 2020 where BYU will face two top-25 teams. The Cougars faced Texas last season in Tennessee, falling in two games.

BYU head coach Gordon Eakin enters his 18th season as the Cougars' head coach and his 21st season at BYU overall for the 2020 season

Eakin was named head coach in July 2002 after working as an assistant coach since the softball program's inception in 2000. Since that time he has led the Cougars to six West Coast Conference titles, six Mountain West Conference championships, one Western Athletic Conference tournament championship and 15 NCAA tournament appearances.

He was named the MWC Coach of the Year in three-straight years (2009, 2010, 2011), PCSC Coach of the Year (2013) and WCC Coach of the Year for four-straight years (2014, 2015, 2016, 2017).

Eakin has coached 22 All-Americans, 14 Players of the Year including seven MWC, one WAC, one PCSC, nine Freshman of the Year including three MCW and one PCSC and seven Pitchers of the Year including two MWC during his tenure. Since joining the WCC, he has coached five Players of the Year, five Pitchers of the Year, three Freshman of the Year and three Defensive Players of the Year.

He led BYU to one of its most successful seasons in 2017, reaching 46 wins, tied for the most in program history. The Cougars were ranked for 12 weeks of the season and had a program-best 22-game win streak.

In 2010, Eakin guided the Cougars to 46 wins, the most in school history at the time, as BYU advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time ever with wins over East Carolina and host Texas before ending its season at national runner-up Arizona. The Cougars finish second in the country in batting average, seventh in scoring and ninth in slugging percentage as a team last season.

Known as one of the best hitting coaches in the country, Eakin has helped BYU finish in the top-ten nationally six times in slugging percentage, six times in home runs per game, four times in batting average and four times in scoring.

In addition to his duties at BYU, Eakin has also been an assistant coach and the hitting coach for the USA National Team since 2009. In the summer of 2010, Eakin helped guide the National Team to a 17-2 record as USA won the World Championship in Venezuela, the World Cup in Oklahoma and the Japan Cup championship in Sendai, Japan.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Eakin was a successful baseball and softball player. After playing collegiate baseball at the University of Utah, Eakin signed with the Oakland Athletics organization where he played for three years.

Eakin went on to join the United States All-Star team, playing in three U.S. Olympic sports festivals in 1986, 1993 and 1994, winning bronze, silver and gold, respectively. While on the team, Eakin was honored on the ISC All-World First Team and was an ASA All-American. He would later go on to play shortstop on the internationally ranked Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch team, eventually earning induction into the Utah Fast Pitch Hall of Fame in 1998.

Eakin is a native of Holladay, Utah, and graduated from Granite High. He currently resides in Sandy, Utah, and is married to Barbi. They are the parents of three children (Alicia, Ryan and Parker) and have seven grandsons and one granddaughter.
