### SETTING THE STAGE

- Navy and BYU will meet for the third time on the gridiron and for the first time since 1989 when they square off on Labor Day night (8:00 pm) at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium (34,000). The game is presented by Navy Mutual.
- Per current rules in the state of Maryland, there will be no fans at the game. There is currently a Secretary's Order from the Maryland Department of Health outlining what is and is not permissible in terms of social gatherings and sporting events.
- Navy is 11-1 (.917) in home openers under head coach Ken Niumatalolo with its only loss a 31-24 decision against Rutgers in 2014. The Mids own wins over Towson, LA Tech, Georgia Southern, Delaware (twice), VMI, Colgate, Fordham, Tulane, Memphis and Holy Cross.
- Navy is 7-5 (.583) in season openers under Niumatalolo (home or away) with wins over Towson, Delaware, at Indiana, Colgate, Fordham, at Florida Atlantic and Holy Cross. Navy's losses in season openers have all come either on the road or at neutral sites - Ohio State (twice), Maryland, Notre Dame and Hawaii.
- This will be just the sixth time in Niumatalolo's 13 years that Navy has opened at home. The Mids are 5-0 in those games with wins over Towson, Delaware, Colgate, Fordham and Holy Cross. Navy outscored their foes by a combined score of 226-53.
- Monday's game will mark the first night game played at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium since 2005, when Navy lost to Stanford, 40-38. It will be Navy's first appearance on ESPN at home since the 2017 Military Bowl, a game the Mids won 49-7 over Virginia.

### BROADCAST COVERAGE

- ESPN will televise the BYU game nationally with Rece Davis, Kirk Herbstreit and Allison Williams on the call.
- WBAL Radio will air a Navy Football Preview Special on Sunday at 11:00 am, which will be hosted by Navy football radio analyst Joe Miller.
- The Navy Football Tailgate Show on WNAV Radio 1430 AM / 99.9 FM will air at 6:00 pm with Wylie Baker and Bill Lusby.
- The Navy Football Pregame Show with Pete Medhurst, Joe Miller, Keith Mills and Scott Wykoff will get underway at 7:00 pm on the Navy Radio Network, followed by game action beginning at 8:00 pm with Medhurst, Miller and Mills on the call.
- Following the contest, Medhurst, Miller, Mills and Wykoff will recap the day's events in a 30-minute postgame show.

## NAVY VS. BYU // LAST MEETING

Sept. 16, 1989 // Annapolis, Md.

- Navy battled Brigham Young's potent passing attack and its mammoth offensive line even for nearly three quarters before losing, 31-10, to the eventual Western Athletic Conference Champions
- It was the season opener for the Mids, who were quite impressive in taking their opening drive 77 yards for a score with sophomore halfback Rodney Purifoy going over from the one.
- But BYU halfback Matt Bellini scored two-straight touchdowns, one on a 17-yard pass from NCAA total offense leader Ty Detmer and another on a 3-yard run following a lost fumble by the Mids to put the Cougars up, 14-7.
- A Frank Schenk field goal of 22 yards left the Mids trailing 14-10 at halftime.
- The Cougars added a field goal in the third period and Detmer hit Bellini for a 20-yard touchdown early in the fourth period.
- For the game, Detmer connected on 26 of his 35 pass attempts from 353 yards, the most passing yardage at that time by a visiting quarterback at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.

### NAVY IN SEASON OPENERS

- Navy is 7-5 in season openers under head coach Ken Niumatalolo, including a 5-0 mark when opening the year at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium.
- All five of the Mids' opening-game losses under Niumatalolo have either played on the road or at a neutral site - Ohio State twice (once in Columbus and once in Baltimore), Maryland (Baltimore), Notre Dame (Ireland) and Hawai'i (Honolulu).

### NAVY-BYU CONNECTIONS

- Navy head coach Ken Niumatalolo and BYU head coach Kalani Sitake hail from the same hometown on the north shore on the island of Oahu, La'ie (population 6,138 over 2.1 square miles).
- Niumatalolo's son, Va'a, is a 2018 graduate of BYU where he was a four-year member of the football team, appearing in 18 games. Va'a Niumatalolo played two years for Bronco Mendenhall and two for Sitake. He is currently the assistant to the director of football operations at Navy.
- Va'a Niumatalolo's brother-in-law, Fisher Jackson, is a freshman defensive lineman for BYU.
- BYU linebacker Pepe Tanuvasa is a transfer from Navy, playing in 13 games for the Mids in 2018.
- Navy slot backs coach Joe DuPaix was the recruiting coordinator and running backs coach at BYU from 2011-12.

### REMEMBERING DAVID FORNEY

- Navy will honor former Navy football player David Forney this season by wearing a sticker on the back of its helmets. The sticker pictures Forney running out of the tunnel at the 2019 Army-Navy game carrying the American flag with the word Brotherhood underneath. Navy will also not issue the #68 this year.
- Forney, a senior offensive lineman, died passed away on Feb. 20 after being found unresponsive in Bancroft Hall. He was 22-years old.
- Forney was a three-year letter winner for the Mids and played in 39-consecutive games over his final three years.
- In 2019, he started all 13 games at guard for the Mids and was the anchor of an offensive line that set a school record and led the nation in rushing, averaging 360.5 yards per game. Forney was extremely proud of being part of a senior class that authored the second-greatest turnaround in the history of FBS football as the Mids won a school-record tying 11 games, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, shared the American Athletic Conference West Division title and won the Liberty Bowl. Forney was named First-Team American Athletic Conference and First-Team All-East.
- A native of Walkersville, Maryland and a 2015 graduate of Georgetown Prep, Forney is survived by his parents, Rick and Erika Forney, younger brothers, Chris and Erik, and sister, Rebekah.
- Forney, who was a member of the ninth company at the Naval Academy and a political science major, would have graduated on May 22. He was due to serve as a cryptologic warfare officer.

### AMERICA'S TEAM

- Navy's roster represents players from 27 different states.
- Maryland and California lead the way with 16, while Alabama and Texas have produced 15 each and Georgia has delivered 11.

### THIS DATE IN NAVY FOOTBALL HISTORY

- This will be the seventh time Navy has played on Sept. 7 and the first time since 2013 when it traveled to Bloomington and knocked off Indiana 41-35 behind quarterback Keenan Reynolds.
- Another big win on Sept. 7 came in 1996 when Navy won at Rutgers, 10-6, in the season-opener. That team went on to post a 9-3 record and defeat Steve Mariucci and the Cal Golden Bears 42-38 in the Aloha Bowl. It was Navy's first bowl appearance in 15 years and the first bowl win in 18 years.

### NAVY FINISHES HISTORIC SEASON WITH AUTOZONE LIBERTY BOWL WIN

- Navy's thrilling 20-17 AutoZone Liberty Bowl win over Kansas State on Dec. 31 gave the Mids a school-record tying 11 wins against just two losses. Only the 2015 team matched the 11-win total in the program's 139-year history.
- The Mids finished the 2019 campaign as American Athletic Conference West Division Co-Champions, Commander-In-Chief's Trophy Champions and Liberty Bowl Champions.
- Navy was ranked 20th in both the *Associated Press* and *USA Today* Coaches Polls. It was just the second time in the last 56 years that Navy finished in the AP Top 20 (Mids were 18th in 2015). Navy did finish 17th in the now defunct *UPI* Poll in 1978, but was unranked in the AP Poll (only top 20 at the time). Navy also finished 24th in 2004.
- The 2019 season marked the fourth time in the last five years Navy cracked the top 25 at least once (2015, 2016, 2017, 2019), which also coincides with the Mids joining the American Athletic Conference. Navy has been ranked for a total of 17 weeks over the last five years. Prior to that, Navy was ranked for ONE week (at the end of the 2004 season) the previous 35 years.
- The AutoZone Liberty Bowl marked Navy's 24th bowl appearance and the 15th in the last 17 years.
- Navy has won five of its last six bowl games and Ken Niumatalolo's six bowl wins are the most in school history.
- The 2019 season marked just the fifth time in school history, and the third time under Niumatalolo, Navy has won 10 or more games in a season. It also won 10 in 1905, 2004 and 2009, while earning 11 wins in 2015 and 2019.
- Navy improved by 8.0 games in 2019 compared to 2018. The Mids were 3-10 in 2018 and finished 11-2 in 2019. The 8.0 improvement was the biggest turnaround in the country and tied for the second biggest in FBS history.
- Senior quarterback Malcolm Perry rushed for 2,017 yards and 21 touchdowns in 2019, breaking the FBS record for single-season rushing yards by a quarterback, while becoming the only quarterback in FBS history to rush for more than 2,000 yards. He was the 24th-leading single-season rusher among all positions in FBS history. Perry's 155.2 rushing yards per game also set an FBS record for a quarterback.
- Navy led the nation in rushing a year ago, averaging a school-record 360.5 yards per game.
- Navy set school records in total rushing yards (4,687), rushing yards per attempt (6.1), rushing yards per game (360.5), total offense yards per game (455.8) and tied the record for total offensive yards per attempt (6.8) in the 2019 season.

### NAVY'S TRENDS UNDER NIUMATALOLO

- Ken Niumatalolo is entering his 13th year as head coach at Navy. He is the longest-tenured coach in school history and in the American Athletic Conference.
- With 98-career wins, Niumatalolo is the winningest coach in school history and with his nine wins against Army, he is the winningest coach in the history of the Army-Navy Game.
- Navy is 63-13 (.829) under Niumatalolo when scoring first, including 7-1 (.875) in 2019.
- Navy is 82-5 (.943) under Niumatalolo when entering the fourth quarter with the lead, including 10-0 in 2019.
- The Mids are 69-16 (.812) under Niumatalolo when scoring 30 or more points in a game, including 10-0 in 2019.
- Navy is 84-20 (.808) when holding the opposition to under 30 points, including 9-0 in 2019.
- The Mids are 53-13 (.803) at home under Niumatalolo, including 6-0 in 2019. Over the last five years, Navy is 25-4 (.862) at home. In years that Navy has gone to a bowl game, the Mids are 48-8 at home (.857) under Niumatalolo.
- Navy is 60-19 (.759) under Niumatalolo when scoring on its first possession (regardless of who had the ball first), including 6-1 (.857) in 2019, and 37-41 (.474) when it doesn't score on its first possession, including 5-1 in 2019.
- When Navy scores a touchdown on its first possession of the game (regardless of who had the ball first) in the Niumatalolo era, its record improves to 51-12 (.810), including 5-1 in 2019.
- When Navy starts the game with the ball in the Niumatalolo era and scores, the Mids are an impressive 18-5 (.783), including 2-1 in 2019. When the Mids start the game with the ball and go down and score a touchdown, the record is even better at 13-2 (.867), including 2-1 in 2019. The only losses came at Toledo in 2013, 45-44 in triple overtime, and in 2019 against Memphis 35-23.
- When the opposition starts the game with the ball and scores a TD, Navy is 16-21 (.432) in the Niumatalolo era. If the Mids hold them to a field goal, Navy is 5-5 (.500). If the opposition starts the game with the ball and Navy holds them off the scoreboard, the Mids are 46-16 (.742).
- Under Niumatalolo, Navy is 31-22 (.585) with more than one week to prepare for an opponent, including 5-2 (.714) in 2019.

### NIUMATALOLO SPELLS SUCCESS

- Ken Niumatalolo has been on the Mids' sideline as either an assistant (1995-98, 2002-07) or head coach (2008-current) for 23 of the last 26 years.
- Over those 23 years, Navy has compiled a 167-110 record (.603), won 11 Commander-In-Chief's Trophies, gone to 16 bowl games, won nine bowl games and either shared or won outright the American Athletic Conference West Division in three of its five years in the league.
- Navy is 29-15 (.659) in Service Academy games with Niumatalolo on the coaching staff and has won 27 of the last 35 Service Academy games (.771).
- In the 117 seasons without Niumatalolo, Navy has posted a 555-460-57 (.549) record, won five Commander-In-Chief's Trophies (in 26 yrs), gone to eight bowl games and won three of them. Navy is 54-64-7 (.460) in Service Academy games without Niumatalolo.

### FAGOT EARNS PRESEASON ATTENTION

- Junior linebacker **Diego Fagot** has been named a 2020 Preseason Third-Team All-American by Phil Steele and is also on the Watch Lists for both the Nagurski and Bednarik Awards.
- Fagot is coming off a dominant sophomore campaign that saw him lead the team in tackles with 100 (52s-48a) and was second on the team in tackles for a loss (12) and sacks (5.5). Over the course of the season, he forced 2 fumbles, broke up 2 passes and had an interception that he returned for a touchdown. Fagot earned First-Team All-AAC recognition last fall and was named the Liberty Bowl Defensive Player of the Game for Navy.

### ASSISTANT COACH ROBERT GREEN TO LEAD NAVY FOOTBALL'S DIVERSITY COUNCIL

- Navy head coach **Ken Niumatalolo** has tabbed assistant coach **Robert Green** as Navy Football's Director of Racial Equality. Green is believed to be the only active coach in the FBS to hold such a title.
- Some of the program goals include 100 percent registered voters in the program and build relationships with the local community.
- Nine players make up the council, three each from the sophomore, junior and senior classes. Members of the council include seniors **Myles Fells**, **Jackson Perkins** and **Ian Blake**; juniors **Chance Warren**, **Diego Fagot** and **Ben Fee** and sophomores **Jacobi Rice**, **Perry Olsen** and **Tama Tuitele**.
- Green is in his eighth season at the Naval Academy and his sixth as a coach on the field. Green assists defensive coordinator Brian Newberry and James Adams with the defensive backs.
- Green spent his first two years as the Director of Player Development assisting Coach Niumatalolo and the officer representatives with professional development and molding of Navy football players to assume future positions of leadership in the Navy and Marine Corps.
- Green is a 1998 graduate of the Naval Academy where he was a four-year letterwinner and three-year starter on the football team as a defensive back. During the 1996 campaign Navy fashioned its best record since 1978 at 9-3 and registered a 42-38 victory over California in the Aloha Bowl. Consequently, Green was named to the Blue-Gray All-Star Football Classic and was an All-Independent selection.
- Green was born and raised in Atlanta, Ga., where he attended Booker T. Washington High School. After graduation, Green attended the Naval Academy Prep School in Newport, R.I. before arriving at the Naval Academy a year later. He was commissioned a Second Lieutenant in the Marine Corps in May of 1998 after completing his undergraduate education at the Naval Academy.
- As a Marine, the former Lieutenant Colonel's personal decorations include the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (2nd award), Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (2nd award), Meritorious Service Medal (2nd Award), Defense Meritorious Service Medal and Legion of Merit.

### PRESIDENT KINLEY ON THE WUERFFEL TROPHY WATCH LIST

- Senior cornerback **Cameron Kinley**, who serves as the Class of 2021 Naval Academy Class President, has been named to the 2020 Wuerffel Trophy Watch List.
- The Wuerffel Trophy, named after former Florida quarterback and 1996 Heisman Trophy winner Danny Wuerffel, exists to honor college football players who serve others, celebrate their positive impact on society and inspire greater service in the world.
- Kinley, who started all 13 games at corner last fall, contributed 38 tackles, 5 pass breakups, 2.5 tackles for a loss and a sack for a Navy team that posted an 11-2 record, won the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, shared the American Athletic Conference West Division title and won the Liberty Bowl.
- Off the field, Kinley carries a 3.32 grade-point average while majoring in political science.
- Both Kinley and senior slot back **Myles Fells** have political aspirations and plan on running for President and Vice President, respectively, in 2040. The pair currently uses the hashtag #KinleyFells2040.

## IN THE CLASSROOM

- The rigors a student-athlete faces at a Service Academy are unlike those a typical student-athlete might encounter on a day-to-day basis. Whether it's the added military training, mandatory room or uniform inspections or the academic schedule, Service Academy student-athletes are in a league of their own.
- The Naval Academy's academic day is divided into six 50-minute class periods beginning at 7:55 am and concluding at 3:20 pm. Unique to the Academies, all 4,400 Midshipmen reside on the Yard in Bancroft Hall and dine together in King Hall.

## NIUMATALOLO WINS STALLINGS AWARD; FINALIST FOR THE BEAR BRYANT AWARD

- Navy's Ken Niumatalolo was named the 2019 winner of the Stallings Award, presented annually to a college football head coach who is both a humanitarian and an exceptional coach. The award is named in honor of Gene Stallings to pay tribute to his son, Johnny, and those who triumph no matter their circumstances.
- Niumatalolo, who was named the 2019 American Athletic Conference Coach of the Year for the third time in five years and the 2019 ECAC Coach of the Year (best coach in the East), led Navy to a school-record tying 11 wins against two losses, the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, a share of the AAC West Division title and a victory over Kansas State in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl. He also became the winningest coach in the history of the Army-Navy Game with Navy's 31-7 destruction of Army.
- A unique aspect of the Stallings Award is that each winner is selected by past recipients, who understand what it takes to simultaneously build a winning football program, build young men and to make a positive impact on their community.
- Niumatalolo was also named one of 10 finalists for the 2019 Paul "Bear" Bryant Award, which recognizes the country's top college football coaches for their contributions both on and off the field. The award is voted on by the National Sports Media Association and is the only college coaching honor selected after all bowl games are concluded.
- Niumatalolo was joined by Ryan Day of Ohio State, Sonny Dykes of SMU, P.J. Fleck of Minnesota, James Franklin of Penn State, Mike Norvell of Memphis (now Florida State), Ed Orgeron of LSU, Matt Rhule of Baylor (now Carolina Panthers), Dabo Swinney of Clemson and Kyle Whittingham of Utah. Orgeron was the recipient of the 2019 award.

## POWER 6

- Four teams in the American Athletic Conference finished the 2019 season ranked in the *Associated Press* Top 25 Poll: #17 Memphis, #20 Navy, #21 Cincinnati and #24 UCF.
- The four top-25 teams ranked third among all conferences with only the Big Ten (6) and SEC (5) having more and proving once again the AAC is part of the Power 6.

## MOST IMPROVED TEAM IN THE COUNTRY

- Navy improved by 8.0 games in 2019 compared to 2018. The Mids were 3-10 in 2018 and finished 11-2 in 2019.
- The 8.0-game improvement was the biggest turnaround in the country a year ago and tied for the second-biggest improvement in FBS history.

## THE JASPER ERA

- Ivin Jasper is entering his 21st year at the Naval Academy, including his 19th as the quarterbacks coach and his 13th as the offensive coordinator.
- Jasper is the second-longest tenured active coordinator (offense or defense // same school) in the country. He has been an integral part of a staff that has brought the Midshipmen back into the national spotlight with a 141-79 (.641) record over the last 17 years and includes 15 bowl game appearances, 11 Commander-In-Chief's Trophies and a 14-3 mark against Army.
- Navy has won at least nine games eight times in the last 17 years. Before the current streak, Navy had won 9 or more games just five times in the previous 77 seasons.
- In 2019, Navy had one of the greatest seasons in school history, winning a school-record tying 11 games against just two losses, winning the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy, sharing the American Athletic Conference West Division title with Memphis and winning the prestigious Liberty Bowl. The Mids' turnaround of 8.0 games from 2018 was the second-biggest improvement in FBS history.

## NEWBERRY NAMED BROYLES AWARD SEMIFINALIST

- Navy defensive coordinator and safeties coach Brian Newberry was one of 15 semifinalists for the 2019 Broyles Award.
- The Broyles Award is an annual award given to honor the best assistant coach in college football. First awarded in 1996, it was named after former University of Arkansas men's athletic director Frank Broyles.
- Newberry was selected from approximately 1,500 assistant coaches who represented 130 FBS programs across the country.
- Under the direction of Newberry, the Navy defense made a stunning transformation in a short period of time, improving in every major statistical category by a significant margin.
- Joining Newberry as semifinalists were Auburn defensive coordinator Kevin Steele, Baylor defensive coordinator Phil Snow, Clemson co-offensive coordinator Jeff Scott, Georgia defensive coordinator Dan Lanning, Indiana offensive coordinator Kalen DeBoer, LSU passing game coordinator Joe Brady, Michigan defensive coordinator Don Brown, Minnesota offensive coordinator Kirk Ciarrocca, Ohio State co-defensive coordinator Jeff Hafley, Oklahoma defensive coordinator Alex Grinch, Oregon defensive coordinator Andy Avalos, SMU offensive coordinator Rhett Lashlee, Wisconsin defensive coordinator Jim Leonhard and Utah defensive coordinator Morgan Scalley.

## SUCCESS WITH FIRST-YEAR SENIOR STARTERS AT QUARTERBACK

- Navy enters the 2020 campaign with senior **Dalen Morris** as a first-year starter at quarterback. This is nothing new, however, as the Mids have experienced some very successful seasons under this same scenario during the triple option era.
- In 2004, senior Aaron Polanco led Navy to what was then a school-record 10 wins as the Mids finished 10-2, defeated Air Force and Army to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy and defeated New Mexico in the Emerald Bowl.
- In 2005, Lamar Owens led Navy to an 8-4 record, wins over Air Force and Army to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy and defeated Colorado State in the Poinsettia Bowl.
- In 2006, Brian Hampton led Navy to a 5-1 start, including a win over Air Force, before sustaining a season-ending knee injury. Navy finished that year 9-4, which included a win over Army and a one-point loss to a Matt Ryan-led Boston College team in the Meineke Car Care Bowl.
- In 2016, Tago Smith and Will Worth both fit the profile. Smith went down with a career-ending knee injury in the opener and Worth came on to lead Navy to a 9-5 record, wins over No. 6 Houston and Notre Dame and a berth in the American Athletic Conference Championship Game.

## NO RETURNING STARTS AT QUARTERBACK

- With the graduation of starting quarterback Malcolm Perry, Navy is one of just 18 schools in the country that enters the 2020 season with no career starts at quarterback.
- In addition to Navy, the other schools entering the 2020 campaign without a quarterback who has started a game are Air Force, Bowling Green, Colorado, Duke, Fresno State, Georgia State, Iowa, Louisiana Monroe, LSU, Marshall, Michigan, New Mexico State, North Texas, Oklahoma, Troy, UTEP and Washington State.
- Perry Olsen**, who enters Monday's game listed third on the depth chart, has the most experience having played in eight games last year as a freshman.

## TEAM OFFENSIVE RECORDS FALL

- In 2019, Navy set school records in total rushing yards (4,687), rushing yards per attempt (6.1), rushing yards per game (360.5) and total offense yards per game (455.8), while tying the record for total offensive yards per attempt (6.8).

## MIDS' O-LINE RECOGNIZED

- The Navy offensive line was an honorable mention selection for the 2019 Joe Moore Award. Despite leading the nation in rushing, the Mids were not among the 10 semifinalists.

### MIDS AMONG NATION'S TOP RUSHING TEAMS

- Over the last 18 years, Navy has consistently been one of the top rushing teams in the country, never finishing lower than sixth.
- The Mids kicked off the trend in 2002 when they finished third in the country in rushing, averaging 270.8 yds/gm.
- In 2003, Navy led the nation averaging a then school-record 323.2 yds/gm.
- In 2005, Navy led the country in rushing for the second time in three years, averaging 318.7 yds/gm.
- Navy finished the 2006 campaign averaging a nation's-best and then school-record 327.0 yds/gm.
- The Mids rushed for a then school-record 348.8 yds/gm in 2007, becoming the first team in NCAA history to lead the nation in rushing three-consecutive years.
- In 2008, Navy led the country in rushing for a fourth-straight year, averaging 292.4 yds/gm.
- The Mids finished No. 2 in the country in 2013, averaging 325.4 yds/gm.
- Navy finished No. 2 in the country in 2014, rushing for 338.1 yds/gm. It was the Mids' best rushing effort since 2007 when they set the school record.
- In 2015, Navy finished No. 2 in the country, averaging 326.7 yds/gm. Coached by current Tulane head coach Willie Fritz, Georgia Southern led the country with its whopping 363.0 yds/gm.
- The Mids finished 2016 ranked No. 4, rushing for 310.9 yds/gm.
- Navy averaged a then school-record 351.4 yds/gm in 2017, which was the second most in the country.
- In 2018, the Mids averaged just 276.1 rushing yds/gm, the fifth-best rushing average in the country and Navy's lowest output since 2002 when it averaged 270.8 yds/gm.
- In 2019, Navy once again led the nation in rushing with its school-record 360.5 yds/gm. The Mids outrushed second-place Air Force by 62 yds/gm.
- Navy also averaged 6.06 yards per carry, which was the nation's fourth-best mark.

- The 2016 Kentucky Gatorade Player of the Year and Kentucky's Mr. Football his senior year started the year on the JV team and played against Jireh Prep in the junior varsity opener.
- He saw his first real varsity action on Oct. 12 against Tulsa (played a few plays at the end of the Holy Cross game, but did not get a carry) and all he did over the last nine games was rush for 734 yards and 14 touchdowns on 111 carries (6.6 yds/carry) and catch four passes for 105 yards and two touchdowns (26.3 yds/catch).
- Carothers averaged a touchdown every 7.2 touches and finished the year tied for 16th in the country in rushing touchdowns despite getting real playing time in just nine games.
- Carothers averaged 6.6 yards per carry, which was the seventh-best rushing average in the FBS in 2019.

- Navy dominates the NCAA record book when it comes to single-season rushing touchdowns by a quarterback.
- Keenan Reynolds ran for 31 touchdowns in 2013, which is the most by a quarterback and tied for the fourth most among all players. He is also the NCAA record holder for career rushing touchdowns (by any player) with 88.

- Navy defensive coordinator Brian Newberry challenges his defense to "Get 6" every game.
- What does Get 6 mean? It's a combined total of six three-and-outs, fourth down stops and turnovers.
- If that turnover is returned for a score, it counts as an extra point towards the goal of six.
- Newberry believes that if his defense can accomplish the challenge, the Mids will have a great chance to win.
- Navy was 8-0 when it successfully reached its "Get 6" goal in 2019 and 3-2 when it didn't.

## GET 6 CHAIN

- Navy's defensive players introduced the Get 6 chain during the 2019 East Carolina game.
- It started when linebackers coach P.J. Volker talked about "locking up" the ECU offense in his position meetings and used a chain to symbolize it.
- Linebacker **Austin Talbert-Loving** took that to heart and found a chain to bring onto the sidelines for the ECU game. The chain was given to the player that came up with a Get 6 play (third down stop on a three-and-out, fourth down stop or turnover) and that player wore it on the bench until the defense took the field again.

## CREATING TURNOVERS

- Navy forced 22 turnovers in its 13 games in 2019 (10 fumble recoveries and 12 interceptions) with two of those turnovers resulting in touchdowns (Tony Brown fumble return vs. Air Force and **Diego Fagot** interception return against Tulane).
- Navy came up with at least one turnover in every game except two (Tulsa, Notre Dame) and recorded 8 turnovers in the last three games: Holy Cross, East Carolina (2), Memphis, Air Force (3), USF, Tulane, Connecticut (3), SMU, Houston (5), Army (2) and Kansas State.

## NICHOLS ON THE MARK

- **Bijan Nichols**, Navy's first freshman starter at kicker since Nick Sloan in 2012, had a terrific debut in Navy's season-opening 45-7 win over Holy Cross.
- Nichols went 6-6 on extra points and booted a 44-yard field goal in his only attempt.
- Nichols was 6-6 on extra points again in Navy's 42-10 win over East Carolina.
- Nichols was 2-3 on extra points against Memphis and 1-2 on field goals. He missed a 46-yard field goal, but nailed a career-long 49-yarder. It was the longest field goal by a Navy kicker since Jon Teague kicked a school-record 54-yarder against Delaware on Sept. 3, 2011.
- Against Air Force, Nichols made all four of his extra-point attempts, but missed a 41-yard field goal.
- Against Tulsa, Nichols made a 37-yard field goal and was 6-6 on extra-points.
- Against USF, Nichols was 5-5 on extra-points.
- Against Tulane, Nichols kicked a 48-yard field goal as time expired to give Navy a 41-38 win. It is believed to be the longest field goal by a Navy player in the final 1:00 of regulation or overtime to win a game in school history. The previous long was 46 yards by Joey Bullen against Air Force with one second left to give Navy the 27-24 win.
- Against UConn, Nichols went 8-8 on extra-points in Navy's 56-10 win.
- Against Notre Dame, Nichols made field goals of 27 and 38 yards and made both of his extra-points.
- Against SMU, Nichols was 2-3 on field goals and made all three of his extra-point attempts.
- Nichols made all eight of his extra-point attempts in Navy's 56-41 win over Houston.
- Against Army, Nichols was 4-4 on extra-points and 1-2 on field goals (29-yard field goal blocked, good from 37).
- Nichols kicked his second game-winning field goal of the year in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl, booting a 23-yard field goal with two seconds left to give Navy a 20-17 victory over Kansas State.
- Nichols finished the year 12-17 on field goals and 61-62 on extra points. His 61 extra points are the second most in school history for a single season. His 48-consecutive extra points are tied for the fourth most in school history.
- Nichols was one of 12 true freshmen kickers in the country a year ago that kicked both PATs and field goals.

## **NIUMATALOLO NAMED TO AMERICAN ATHLETIC CONFERENCE RACIAL EQUALITY ACTION GROUP**

- Over the summer, American Athletic Conference Commissioner Mike Aresco announced the creation of a Racial Equality Action Group consisting of administrators, head coaches and student-athletes from The American's member institutions along with select ex officio members of the conference staff.
- The group is chaired by Dr. Derrick Gragg, Vice President and Director of Athletics at Tulsa, and its goal is to translate words into conference-wide actions regarding the effort to eliminate racial inequality and injustice. Supporting this goal, the conference will launch a campaign to address racial inequality and injustice in all their manifestations, and to foster education and understanding among the various constituencies of its member institutions that will translate into outreach to their respective communities.
- "We are at a pivotal moment in our nation's history in terms of racial justice and equality, underscored by the tragic and heartbreaking events of recent weeks, and we have an obligation to our universities and students to enact real change," said American Athletic Conference commissioner Mike Aresco. "Words are important, but words are not enough. Action is required."
- "The Racial Equality Action Group's work and the accompanying campaign will be catalysts for debate and education that can lead to understanding and healing and will enable our students and all those connected to our universities to engage their communities. We will devote significant resources to this effort. There is no better person than Derrick Gragg to lead this initiative, which is as important as anything that we will be doing. These problems are deeply rooted, but we can make an impact and effect change."
- Among other things, the campaign will develop messaging through public service announcements, hashtags enabling relevant experiences, stories and uplifting relationships to be shared and through utilization of other platforms. The campaign will sponsor town halls and workshops, and will seek to create a dialogue with campus police and police departments in the communities of The American's member institutions. The conference will also support the national efforts of coaches and other constituencies in combatting racism and racial inequality.
- The American's Academic Consortium will play a central role in the campaign by commissioning and supporting research into the root causes of racism and ways in which race relations can be improved.
- The conference's Student-Athlete Advisory Committee will also have a leadership role in identifying and implementing various educational initiatives that will be a critical component of the overall campaign.

- Pete Medhurst, the Voice of Navy Athletics, is one of just six college football play-by-play announcers that also calls major league baseball. Medhurst is the part-time voice of the Washington Nationals on the radio.
- Others on the list include Kevin Eschenfelder (Houston and Houston Astros TV), Ted Leitner (San Diego State and San Diego Padres Radio), Matt Lepay (Wisconsin and Milwaukee Brewers TV), Josh Lewin (UCLA and Boston Red Sox Radio) and Matt Shepard (Eastern Michigan and Detroit Tigers TV).

## **HONORING A LEGEND, JOE BELLINO**

- In August of 2019, Naval Academy Director of Athletics Chet Gladchuk announced that Joe Bellino's #27 will be placed on the turf at the 27-yard line at both ends of Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium facing Navy's sideline as a tribute and in memory of the 1960 Heisman Trophy winner, who passed away on March 27.
- Additionally, Navy wore a helmet sticker in Bellino's memory during the 2019 season.
- Bellino was the first Navy player to win the Heisman Trophy and the first to have his number retired.
- Bellino, a native of Winchester, Mass., was known as the player who was never caught from behind. In just three seasons, he scored 31 touchdowns, rushed for 1,664 yards on 330 carries, returned 37 kicks for 833 yards and set 15 school records.
- Bellino was a unanimous All-America selection at halfback in 1960 and was also the winner of the Maxwell Award. His end zone interception preserved Navy's 17-12 win over Army that season. The Midshipmen were ranked as a high as fourth in the country and went on to play in the Orange Bowl on Jan. 1, 1961.
- Bellino was also an outstanding catcher and outfielder on the Navy baseball team. He hit .428 in 22 games in 1959 and led the Eastern Intercollegiate League in stolen bases. He had a .320 average in 1960 and was the baseball team captain in 1961.
- Army partisans can hardly forget the 1959-60 academic year for what Bellino did to the Cadets. In addition to his three-touchdown performance in the 1959 Army-Navy football game, he was equally sensational in the Army-Navy baseball game in 1960. Bellino went 4-for-4 at the plate, drove in three runs, stole two bases and threw out two Army runners attempting to steal as Navy carved out a 9-1 win.
- Bellino capped off his senior year (1960-61) by winning the school's top two athletic awards, the Thompson Trophy and the Naval Academy Athletic Association Sword. It marked the first time in 41 years that one midshipman received both of these awards.
- Bellino's #27 football jersey was retired after the 1960 season. He had a three-year stint with the Boston Patriots after he had completed his four-year service obligation. He stayed in the Navy Reserves for 24 more years and reached the rank of Captain.
- Bellino was a 1977 inductee into the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame. In 2009, he was named to the Navy-Marine Corps Memorial All-Stadium Team. During its annual season-ending football banquet, Navy presents the Joe Bellino Award to the varsity football player whose inspiring on-field performance made a significant impact on the team and contributed to its overall success during the season.
- Bellino is survived by his wife of 57 years, Ann; his son, John, a 1989 graduate of the Naval Academy; and his daughter, Therese, as well as his daughter-in-law, Annette, and three grandsons, Ian, Evan and Eric; and his son-in-law, Cary.

## **NAVY SPORTS INFORMATION HONORED FOR A SECOND-CONSECUTIVE YEAR AND FOR THE THIRD TIME IN THE LAST FOUR YEARS**

- Five first-time recipients were included in the 11th Annual Super 11 Awards, which the Football Writers Association of America gives out annually to the best performing sports information departments in the Football Bowl Subdivision.
- The 2019 award winners included Clemson and Colorado who each won for a seventh time. It was Clemson's fifth-straight award and Colorado's sixth award in seven seasons. Navy won for the third time in the last four years and for a fourth time overall, Mississippi State a third time and Kansas State and San Diego State each for a second time.
- The five first-time recipients in the award series, which dates back to the 2009 season, included Appalachian State, California, Iowa, Memphis and NC State.
- The 2019 winners were deemed by FWAA observers to have had good accessibility during the week of the game and after the game – with a program's players, coaches and assistant coaches – along with the other listed criteria.
- "That was a special point of emphasis for 2018 and 2019," FWAA Executive Director Steve Richardson said. "Our membership wanted access to players after games, of course, but also for human interest and analytical stories during the week. It is encouraging that SIDs were being allowed to do their jobs by coaches at these schools. Obviously, as we move into uncertain times in college football, there may be developing standards and protocols which become prominent."
- FWAA members who covered college football during the 2019 season provided input in the awards survey.
- In January 2009, the FWAA formed the first Super 11 Committee. The concept has been supported and endorsed by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA), many of whom are members of the FWAA. The FWAA has awarded Super 11 to 70 different schools in this program over the years.
- The Football Writers Association of America, a non-profit organization founded in 1941, consists of more than 1,300 men and women across North America who cover college football for a living. The membership includes journalists, broadcasters and publicists, as well as key executives in all the areas that involve the game. The FWAA works to govern areas that include game-day operations, major awards, a national poll and its annual All-America teams.

# NAVY HEAD COACH KEN NIUMATALOLO

23RD SEASON AT NAVY | 13TH SEASON AS HEAD COACH | WINNINGEST COACH IN NAVY HISTORY

## COACHING HIGHLIGHTS

- 13th-year head coach **Ken Niumatalolo** has led the Midshipmen to an 98-60 (.620) record and is the program's all-time winningest coach.
- He is the fastest in school history to reach 50 wins, earning his 50th victory in 2013 against Temple in what was his 81st career game.
- He is one of eight active coaches that are the all-time winningest coach at their respective schools.
- He is the 10th-longest tenured head coach in the FBS taking over the head job at Navy on Dec. 8, 2007.
- Member of the Navy coaching staff that directed Navy to 11 Commander-In-Chief's Trophies over the last 16 years and 15 bowl games over the last 17 years
- His six bowl wins are the most in school history and he is the only coach at Navy to win three consecutive bowl games.
- In Navy's first two years as a member of the American Athletic Conference, he led the Mids to a share of the AAC West Division title (2015) and won the AAC West title outright in year two (2016). Navy tied for the AAC West Division title again in 2019.
- Has led Navy to five Top 25 wins in his tenure, which is the second-most in school history. Eddie Erdelatz beat 10 Top 25 teams from 1950-58.
- Navy was ranked in the *Associated Press* poll for three-straight years (2015-17) for the first time since 1958-60.
- First coach to lead Navy to a bowl game in his inaugural season as a head coach.
- First coach to lead Navy to a bowl game in each of his first three seasons as a head coach.
- First Service Academy coach to win the Commander-In-Chief's Trophy in each of his first two years as a head coach.
- Led Navy to an 8-5 record in 2008, the most wins by a first-year coach at Navy since 1934.
- Guided Navy to a 24-17 win over No. 16 Wake Forest in 2008, the Mids' first win over a team ranked in the *Associated Press* top 25 since 1985.
- Won a school-record 11 games in 2015 and again in 2019.
- Led Navy to a 23-21 win over No. 19 Notre Dame in South Bend on Nov. 7, 2009. It was the first time since 1936 that an unranked Navy team defeated a ranked Notre Dame squad.
- Led Navy to a 45-20 victory over #15 Memphis in 2015, the Mids first win over a Top 15 opponent since 1984 and the Mids first win over a Top 15 opponent on the road since 1974.
- Led Navy to a 46-40 victory over #6 Houston, Navy's first win over a Top 10 opponent since 1984.
- Is the first coach to lead Navy to wins against a Top 15 opponent in back-to-back years since Eddie Erdelatz in 1956-57.
- Joins Eddie Erdelatz (1956-57) and Hall of Fame coach Wayne Hardin (1960-61) as the only coaches in school history to beat Notre Dame in back-to-back years.
- Tied with Hardin for most wins against Notre Dame (three).
- The only coach in the history of the Army-Navy game to start his career 8-0 against the rival Service Academy.
- He is 9-3 (.750) all-time against Navy's biggest rival, Army West Point, and is the first head coach in the history of the Army-Navy game to win his first eight games against the rival service academy.
- His nine wins against the Black Knights are the most in Army-Navy history for either school.
- Member of the Navy coaching staff that directed the Mids to 15 straight wins over rivals Air Force and Army from 2002-09.

## SIGNIFICANT STADIUM MOMENTS DURING THE NIUMATALOLO ERA

**Aug. 30, 2008** – Shun White rushed for a school-record 348 yards and three touchdowns on just 19 carries to lead Navy to a season-opening 41-13 victory over Towson.

**Nov. 1, 2008** – Clint Sovie's 42-yard fumble return for a touchdown with 37 seconds left in regulation capped a 20-point rally in the final 9:16 to send the game into overtime. Quarterback Ricky Dobbs' one-yard run in OT gave Navy a miraculous 33-27 victory over Temple.

**Oct. 3, 2009** – Navy shut down the nation's top rushing offense, while Joe Buckley drilled three field goals, including a 38-yarder in overtime, to lead Navy to a 16-13 victory over Air Force in front of a sellout crowd of 37,820.

**Oct. 20, 2012** – Navy scored 10 points in the final 5:30 to come from behind and shock Indiana, 31-30, on Homecoming. Keenan Reynolds hit Matt Aiken with a touchdown pass with 2:02 remaining to give Navy the lead and a Parrish Gaines interception clinched the Mids' first win over a BIG TEN opponent at home since 1926.

**Oct. 26, 2013** – One week after missing an extra-point against Toledo in the second overtime, Nick Sloan booted a 30-yard field goal against Pitt as time expired to give Navy a thrilling 24-21 come-from-behind victory.

**Nov. 15, 2014** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for a career-high 277 yards and a stadium-record six touchdowns to lead Navy to a 52-19 victory over Georgia Southern.

**Sept. 19, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds ran for five touchdowns and 142 yards as the Midshipmen dominated East Carolina in their American Athletic Conference debut, 45-21.

**Oct. 3, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds rushed for 183 yards to lead Navy to a 33-11 rout of Air Force. It was Navy's largest margin of victory in the series since 1978.

**Nov. 14, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds shattered the FBS career rushing touchdown record scoring four rushing touchdowns against SMU in Navy's 55-14 rout of SMU. The four rushing touchdowns gave Reynolds 81 in his career, surpassing Montee Ball's record of 77.

**Dec. 28, 2015** – Keenan Reynolds wrapped up his record-setting career by rushing for three scores and passing for another to lead Navy to a 44-28 win over Pitt in the Military Bowl. Reynolds' final touchdown clinched the win and gave him 88 total touchdowns for his career, breaking the tie with La. Tech's Kenneth Dixon for most touchdowns in FBS history. The win was the 11th on the year for Navy, setting a school record.

**Oct. 8, 2016** – Will Worth ran for a touchdown and threw for two more, while Josiah Powell picked off a pass and returned it 34-yards for a touchdown to lead Navy to a 46-40 upset of #6 Houston. It was Navy's first win over a top 10 opponent since beat #2 South Carolina in 1984.

**Oct. 7, 2017** – Zach Abey fired a 16-yard touchdown pass to Tyler Carmona with 15 seconds remaining to give Navy a thrilling 48-45 victory over Air Force in front of a stadium-record crowd of 38,792. It was the highest scoring game in the history of the Navy-Air Force series.

**Nov. 11, 2017** – Malcolm Perry, making his first career start at quarterback, rushed for 282 yards and four touchdowns on 33 carries to lead Navy to a 43-40 victory over SMU and make the Mids bowl eligible for the 14th time in the last 15 years. Perry had a stadium-record 92-yard touchdown run in the game.

**Oct. 5, 2019** – Malcolm Perry scored on a three-yard touchdown run with 23 seconds left to give Navy a 28-25 lead, and Tony Brown recovered an Air Force fumble on the ensuing possession and ran eight yards for a touchdown to give Navy a stunning 34-25 victory over Air Force.

**Oct. 26, 2019** – Freshman Bijan Nichols kicked a 48-yard field goal as time expired to give Navy a 41-38 victory over Tulane and make Navy bowl eligible for the 15th time in the last 17 years. The Nichols field goal is believed to be the longest to win a game in Navy history (final 1:00 of regulation or overtime).

**Nov. 23, 2019** – Senior quarterback Malcolm Perry rushed for 195 yards and two touchdowns on 38 carries, while completing nine of his 15 pass attempts for 162 yards and a touchdown as Nav upset No. 21 SMU, 35-28. Perry's 70-yard touchdown run on third-and-10 with 6:11 left put Navy up for good.

## ASSOCIATED PRESS TOP 10 TEAMS TO PLAY AT NAVY-MARINE CORPS MEMORIAL STADIUM

- In 2016, Houston was the ninth Associated Press top 10 team to play at Navy-Marine Corps Memorial Stadium and the highest ranked team since 1984 when the Mids upset No. 2 South Carolina, 38-21.
- With the 46-40 upset over No. 6 Houston, the Mids are 3-6 all-time against AP top 10 teams at home.
