

OPENINGTIP

- As part of its five-game road swing to start the year, Utah Valley will make the trek down University Parkway into Provo Tuesday to face BYU in the UCCU Crosstown Clash at 11 a.m., inside the Marriott Center.
- UVU suffered a 98-41 defeat at the hands of No. 18 Oregon State inside the Gill Coliseum on Nov. 15. Senior guard Taylor Christensen finished with a team-high 15 points and helped the Wolverines (0-3) put together the highest-scoring quarter by an OSU opponent this season with 18 points in the opening frame.
- The Wolverines' backcourt trio of seniors Taylor Chrisensen and Mariah Seals, and sophomore Gabrielle Leos sits among the top-20 on the WAC scoring leaderboard. Christensen (14.7 PPG) ranks sixth in the WAC in scoring, while Seals (10.0 PPG) is 14th and Leos (9.0 PPG) rounds out that list in 20th.
- UVU's floor general, Seals begins the week ranking eighth in the WAC in assists with 2.3 helpers per game.At Oregon State, Seals pushed her streak of consecutive games with an assist to ten games.
- Junior guard Britta Spencer enters the week ranking ninth in the WAC in three-pointers per game and three-point field goal percentage (33.3 percent). Spencer brings a streak of six straight regular season games with at least one made three-pointer into this week's contests.
- November will see the Wolverines accumulate 3, 336.4 miles of traveling to open the 2017-18 prior to their home opener on Nov. 28 versus Dixie State.

About the Cougars

BYU owns a 2-1 record coming into the week after picking up a 73-79 road victory on Friday over Eastern Washington. The Cougar win over the Eagles helped salvage a two-game roadtrip to the Evergreen State, as they also dropped a contest to Washington last week. Senior guard Cassie Devashrayee finished with team highs of 25 points and six steals for the Cougars in their win at EWU. Joining Devashrayee in double figures in that contest, sophomore guard Brenna Chase followed with 17 points.

- Entering the week, Devashrayee leads the West Coast Conference in scoring with 24.0 points per contest. The 5-9 guard has recorded a 20-point effort in each of BYU's outings.
- The Cougars are led on the glass by WCC rebound leader in sophomore forward Shalae Salmon, who averages 14.3 boards per game.

No. 18 Oregon State storms past UVU

- Despite a strong first-quarter effort and 15 points from senior guard Taylor Christensen, Utah Valley women's basketball suffered a 98-41 defeat at the hands of No. 18 Oregon State Wednesday night inside the Gill Coliseum.
- Christensen, who scored nine points in the first quarter, helped the Wolverines (0-3) put together the highest-scoring quarter by an OSU opponent this season with 18 points in the opening frame.

During their big 18-point quarter, the Wolverines matched their highest shooting percentage in a period on the year with a 57.1-percent clip.

Backcourt in Front

Utah Valley's backcourt trio of seniors Taylor Chrisensen and Mariah Seals, and sophomore Gabrielle Leos sits among the top-20 on the WAC scoring leaderboard. Christensen (14.7 PPG) ranks sixth in the WAC in scoring, while Seals (10.0 PPG) is 14th and Leos (9.0 PPG) rounds out that list in 20th. In addition, junior guard Britta Spencer enters the week averaging 42.4 points per game to give the squad the seocond highest scoring quartet of guards in the WAC in the early part of the season. The group of Wolverine starting guards has combined for 42.4 points per contest in the squad's first three outings. The Wolverines return their top-two scorers from 2016-17 in senior guards Taylor Christensen and Mariah Seals. Each ranked among the top 10 in the WAC in scoring during 2016-17, as Gordon was fifth with 13.7 points per game and Seals eighth (13.1 ppg) in their respective junior campaigns. Together Gordon and Seals formed the second highest-scoring backcourt duo in the WAC last season, averaging a combined 26.7 points per contest. The dual-threat tandem of Christensen and Seals teamed for 29-plus points in four WAC contests last year.

Series History vs. BYU

- Tuesday morning's contest will mark the eighth all-time meeting between the Wolverines and Cougars. BYU holds a 7-0 record in the all-time matchup against Utah Valley.
- The last UCCU Crosstown Clash resulted in BYU earning a 68-50 win over UVU in the season opener at home for the Wolverines at the start of the 2016-17 season on Nov. 11, 2016. Utah Valley guard Britta Hall scored a team-high 18 points and drained five threepointers in the loss.
- Utah Valley last visited the Marriott Center on Nov. 13, 2015, when it fell to the Cougars, 78-62, as the two squads met on the hardword for the first time since the 2010-11 season.
- The Wolverines seek their first-ever road win against BYU, as they also enter the week 0-5 in the all-time series matchup.

UVU senior duo tabbed Preseason All-WAC in WAC preseason polls

- Utah Valley women's basketball seniors Mariah Seals and Taylor Christensen received Western Athletic Conference (WAC) Preseason All-Conference selections, as announced in the WAC preseason polls released at WAC Preview and Media Day.
- Seals and Christensen were selected to the Preseason All-WAC first team by the league's eight coaches.
- In the media poll, the senior duo of Christensen and Seals was selected to the Preseason All-WAC second team.
- Joining Seals and Christensen on the first team in the coaches poll were GCU's Brie Mobley, NMSU's Brook Salas and Seattle U's Alexis Montgomery.

Wolverines picked to finish fourth, fifth in WAC preseason polls

- The Wolverines were voted to finish fourth in the WAC in the coaches poll, ahead of Grand Canyon, UT Rio Grande Valley, UMKC and Chicago State. In the media poll, Utah Valley was picked fifth, edging UTRGV, UMKC and Chicago State.
- Utah Valley was picked fifth in the media team poll, edging UTRGV, UMKC and Chicago State.
- In the media and coaches polls, reigning backto-back WAC champion New Mexico State received seven first-place votes from media and six top votes from the coaches.
- Seattle U and CSU Bakersfield finished behind the Aggies in the voting, as the Redhawks and Roadrunners traded spots for second and third, respectively, in the media and coaches polls.

Older and Wiser

- After returning only one starter a year ago, UVU welcomes back four starters from last season's squad that gave the program a WAC Tournament semifinal appearance for the second straight year.
- Seven players on the Wolverines' 2017-18 roster saw playing time last year, accounting for more than half of the full roster of 13 players. In 2016-17, Utah Valley returned only four active players who earned minutes the season prior.
- Guards Mariah Seals and Taylor Christensen give the Wolverines their first senior class and duo since the 2015-16 season, in which the squad posted its best record since joining the WAC.
- The Wolverines also welcome a pair of sophomore transfers, including guard Alexis Cortez (East Carolina) and forward Va'e Malufau (Northern Arizona)

Mariah's Helping Hands

- UVU's floor general, senior Mariah Seals has pushed her streak of consecutive games with an assist to ten games dating back to last season. In addition, she has racked up multiple assists in nine of those contests, including a season-high four dimes in the Wolverines' season opener at Weber State.
- Seals begins the week ranking eighth in the WAC in assists with 2.3 helpers per game. Her 144 assists last year marked a new career high, topping her previous high of 82 as a sophomore.
- The Wolverines' 5-3 point guard, Seals has recorded a team high in assists in two games. Seals led or tied for the team lead in assists 23 times last season. Among the program's all-time assists
- leaders, Seals is third on UVU's all-time career assist chart (319) to begin 2017-18.

Road Warriors

- The Wolverines kick off their seasonopening with a five-game road swing that includes 3, 336.4 miles of traveling in November to open 2017-18.
- UVU heads to Oregon for its first pair of out-of-state contests at WCC-foe Portland and nationally-ranked No. 19 Oregon State from the PAC-12 on back-to-back nights Nov. 14-15.
- UVU's first road trip of the year continues in Utah with the trek down University Parkway to Provo for a contest at BYU in the UCCU Crosstown Clash on Nov. 21.
- The season-opening road trip concudes at Eastern Washington with a post-Black Friday contest on Nov. 25.

Wolverine Gladiators

UVU guards Gabrielle Leos, Taylor Christensen, Mariah Seals, and Britta Spencer each average 31-plus minutes per game entering the week.

- Christensen leads UVU with 34.3 minutes per game to rank seventh in the WAC. Meanwhile, Leos joins Christensen among the top-10 minutes averaged leaders sit at ninth in the WAC with 33.7 minutes per contest. Seals (32.7 MPG) is third and Spencer (31.0 MPG) is fourth among all Wolverines.
- Seals and Christensen spent 1,000-plus minutes on the court during 2016-17, finishing top-10 in the WAC in minutes per game.
- Seals led the WAC in minutes per game with 36.7 and total minutes played with 1,001 during her junior campaign.
- Christensen joined her Wolverine gladiator counterpart in the 1,000-minute club with 1,036 minutes, while ranking eighth in the league in minutes per game with 33.4.
- In three years as Utah Valley's floor general, Seals has amassed 94 starts to rank third all-time in program history entering her final season.

Taylor-Made Glass

- UVU senior guard Taylor Christensen leads the squad on the glass in the early season, grabbing 4.7 boards per contest in three games.
- Christensen left her mark on the glass in her junior season, ranking second among guards in the WAC with 6.4 rebounds per game. The 5-8 guard also sat in third on the conference's defensive rebounds list, grabbing 4.8 boards per contest last year.
- In UVU's 2016-17 season opener, Christensen pulled down a career-high 12 rebounds versus BYU. She also added 11 points to complete a double-double performance in that contest.

Get That Dirt off Your Shoulder

- After nailing a pair of shots from downtown at Oregon State, Utah Valley junior guard Britta Spencer brings a streak of six straight regular season games with at least one made threepointer into this week's contests.
- Spencer enters the week ranking ninth in the WAC in three-pointers per game and three-point field goal percentage with a 33.3 percent mark. She sits second on the team in three-point percentage behind teammate Mariah Seals, who is fourth in the WAC with a 40-percent mark from deep.
- Despite missing two seasons after serving an 18-month LDS mission in Chile prior to 2016-17, Spencer erupted for 18 points and five three-pointers against the Cougars in last year's season opener at home inside the UCCU Center. She ranked second among UVU players in three-pointers made with 35 last season.

Stealing the Show

Last year's WAC steals leader, Christensen ranks second in the conference with 2.7 steals per game. Christensen has recorded a steal in each of UVU's contests this season, including a seasonhigh four on the road at Portland.





UVU cuts down the nets to open NUVI Basketball Center Utah Valley University cut down the nets on Wednesday to officially open the NUVI Basketball Center, a new practice and conditioning facility to house its men's and women's basketball teams.

The 14,500-square-foot facility was funded entirely by private donations and sponsorships totaling approximately \$4.4 million, including a lead donation from NUVI chairman and CEO Keith Nellesen.

The NUVI Basketball Center includes 8,000 square feet of court space, named the Ryan Toolson Practice Court, and nine basketball standards, with "game-day atmosphere" graphics to match the UCCU Center environment. The new Travis Hansen Strength and Conditioning Center includes roughly 1,300 square feet, with custom-made 9-foot high racks, dumbbells up to 125 pounds and an array of power and conditioning tools. The room opens up directly onto the Ryan Toolson Practice Court.

A mezzanine level overlooks the court and includes the Roger Fields Family Basketball Offices – 3,000 square feet of office space split into suites for the men's and women's coaching staff. Each suite features a large office for each head coach that can double as a conference room, and offices for three assistant coaches and basketball operations.

UVU recorded a season-best 14 steals and forced 15 turnovers against the Pilots. Against the Wildcats, Utah Valley forced 21 turnovers and finished with nine steals on the day.

Making History in the Valley

- Senior Taylor Christensen is coming off a record-breaking season of disrupting opponents' passing lanes, setting UVU's single-season program record with 78 steals in the 2016-17 season.
- Seals also etched her name inside the Utah Valley alltime record books last year, becoming the sixth player in the Division I era for the Wolverines to eclipse the 1,000-point plateau.
- In addition, Seals currently sits at fourth on the program's all-time minutes played list with 3,156 minutes of playing time. The 5-3 guard is 192 minutes shy of Utah Valley's all-time minutes leader Asumi Nakayama (2006-10), who logged 3,348 minutes during her career.
- After increasing her minutes total every season since becoming a Wolverine, Seals currently holds the top spot on the school's minutes per game chart with 34.7 MPG.

UVU-BYU Crosstown Connections



2007 Hall of Fame Inductee: Cathy Nixon

Utah Valley's 23rd-year head coach Cathy Nixon was inducted into the BYU Hall of Fame in 2007 as a player.

Nixon is fifth all-time at BYU in career scoring (1,771 total points) and sixth in scoring average (16.1 points per game). Her .857 single game field-goal percentage in 1985 is tied for fifth all-time at BYU with a minimum of 10 attempts. During an exciting game against Florida in 1987, Nixon reached a career high of 36 points in a single game.

Nixon started and ended her career strong as a Cougar. Helping BYU finish either first or second in the league during her tenure. Nixon was the fourth player in program history to score at least 1,000 points.

As a freshman Nixon helped lead her team to the NCAA Tournament in 1985, placing 17th in the tournament. That year she received High Country Athletic Conference honorable mention, which was the first of many awards to follow. Throughout the following three seasons, Nixon became a six-time All-Tournament honoree, including Most Valuable Player of the 1987-88 BYU Holiday Classic. During her sophomore year, Nixon was a Kodak All-District VII selection. Honors continued the following year as she was named to the All-Rocky Mountain Region Team.

More prestigious accolades were awarded to Nixon in 1987 and 1988 as she was named an All-American twice by the American Women Sports Federation. In 1988 Nixon received the Leona B. Holbrook Spirit of Sport Award, the highest honor BYU confers on a female athlete.



BYU Associate Head Coach: Dan Nielson

BYU Associate head coach Dan Nielson spent four seasons as an assistant coach at Utah Valley University under former BYU All-American Cathy Nixon (2009-2013). During those four years, the Wolverines won one regular-season Great Western Conference title and advanced to the league championship game three times and won the title once.

This is Nielson's second stint with the Cougar women's program. He spent four years with the team as director of operations, a graduate assistant, a volunteer practice player and a basketball summer camps counselor for both the men's and women's team.

He was a two-time All-District 14 honoree while playing basketball at Round Rock High School in Texas.



BYU Senior Women's Administrator: Liz Darger

BYU associate athletic director Liz Darger, the program's senior women's administrator, served as an assistant coach at Utah Vally University under head coach Cathy Nixon from 2009-2015.

During her first four years at UVU, the Wolverines won one regular-season Great Western Conference title and advanced to the league championship game three times and won the title once.

In addition, Darger spent time on the UVU sidelines during the squad's first two years in the Western Athletic Conference. She also coached alongside BYU associate head coach Dan Nielson from 2009-2013.





Henrie joins UVU coaching staff

Utah Valley women's basketball head coach Cathy Nixon announced the hiring of Aubree Henrie as an assistant coach prior to the 2017-18 season.

Henrie joins the UVU coaching staff after spending two seasons as an assistant at Lewis-Clark State College. Last season, Henrie helped the Warriors to a 35-2 overall record and their first trip to the NAIA National Championship in program history.

During her two-year stint on the Lewis-Clark coaching staff, Henrie helped develop two NAIA All-Americans, a Frontier Conference Player of the Year, three all-conference players and a Sixth Player of the Year award winner.

A native of Jerome, Idaho, Henrie also enjoyed an outstanding playing career as a two-time All-Great Northwest Athletic Conference selection at guard for Seattle Pacific University. In her final season, Henrie was named to the All-GNAC first team after averaging 16.5 points per game and a team-leading 5.1 rebounds per contest.

In addition, Henrie was a 1,000-point scorer, team co-MVP and two-time captain for the Falcons. She finished her career ranked second in free throw percentage in the program's all-time record books.

Britta Hall selected to Allstate WBCA Good Works Team

OREM, Utah – Utah Valley University women's basketball sophomore guard Britta Spencer was selected to the 2017 Allstate Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) Good Works Team®, as announced by the organization. Hall is one of five women's basketball players at the NCAA Division I level to be chosen to the fifth annual Allstate WBCA Good Works Team, which is comprised of 10 players chosen among a pool of 97 WBCA nominees from NCAA Division I, II and III and the NAIA ranks.



In addition to dedicating countless hours to their studies and athletics, the members of this year's team have spent their limited free time bettering communities all over the world and demonstrating a strong commitment to improving the lives of others.

"It's definitely a humbling experience," said Spencer, who is in her first season at UVU. "Something my parents told me growing up was, 'You have to serve people and be nice.' Honestly, I didn't expect to be awarded for doing that. But it's definitely an honor and privilege that not a lot of people get, so I'm glad I can represent UVU, this community and my family in getting this award."

This year, Spencer and the other members of the Allstate WBCA Good Works Team[®] will be recognized during the 2017 WBCA Convention and at the 2017 NCAA Women's Final Four[®] in Dallas, and will also participate in a local community project in the Dallas community.

The award comes to Spencer after she took time off from playing college basketball to serve a voluntary mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints in Rancagua, Chile, for 18 months.

"I'm just really excited for her to be recognized for the person she is and the sacrifices she's made," said Utah Valley head coach Cathy Nixon. "It's a tremendous opportunity for her to represent herself, our program and our university at the Final Four. She's a person with very high values and it's made a great difference in our program. I'm very blessed to have the opportunity to coach her and I think we're very fortunate to have her here."

After a one-year stint on the women's basketball team at San Jose State, Spencer made the decision to dedicate herself to serving the people in the communities of Rancagua, possibly sacrificing her scholarship and dream of playing college basketball. Prior to her missionary service and becoming a Wolverine, Hall had set a Spartan freshman record for three-pointers made a season.

In addition to that sacrifice, she would spend a few months working before her departure overseas to earn and save enough money for the expenses required to go on a mission, with only a little bit of help coming from her parents.

"The decision to serve a mission for my church was something I knew I had to do," said Hall. "While it was hard making the decision to leave behind a dream I had since I was a little girl, I knew in the end God would bless me for it. Really, being able to serve the Chilean people was one of the biggest blessings and I feel like I grew the most during that year and a half than in any other experience I've ever had."

On a busy schedule for her 18 months in Chile, Spencer did not have normal days off. Aside from what is called a "preparation day" every Monday to provide time for housekeeping, laundry and grocery shopping, without any time for touristic activities. Instead, she and an assigned missionary partner would roam the many different Chilean communities they were placed in, searching for opportunities to provide volunteer service to the people without paid compensation.

One of those many service acts came on a typical hot, sunny day in Rancagua when Spencer and one of her assigned missionary partners had an encounter with a woman they noticed was sweating while pushing a manual reel lawnmower. She recalled taking control of the hard-to-push lawnmower, with no motor to cut the grass automatically, then proceeding to complete the arduous, yet simple task of trimming the woman's lawn.

"When you serve people is when you find the most joy, and when you serve people that's when the world becomes a better place. I think more than the big things, we just tried doing small acts of service everyday. It was more of the simple things that myself and the people I worked alongside took pride in," Hall said.

Spencer's missionary service also involved daily proselytizing of her Christian-based faith. This included conversing and connecting with people of differing religious and socioeconomic backgrounds in their native tongue of Spanish, which she learned in a couple of months at a missionary training center ran by the LDS Church before becoming fluent during her time in Chile.

In her return to the court this season, Hall ranks second on the Wolverine squad in made three-pointers (27) on 37.1 percent shooting from downtown and has averaged 9.4 points in 13 games. Before being sidelined for 11 of UVU's past 12 contests with an injury, Hall was among the top 50 in the nation in three-pointers made following the first 11 contests of the 2016-17 campaign.

ABOUT UVU'S ATHLETICS NCAA HISTORY

Until 2003, Utah Valley University competed as a NJCAA athletic program. The 2003-04 season was the school's first competing at an NCAA Division I level. In 2004-05, UVU played it first full Division I schedule. As a program transitioning from junior college to DI, UVU was termed "provisional" and remained that way until 2009. UVU'S provisional status was lifted and the program became a full member of NCAA Division I on July 8, 2009. Until then, UVU teams and individuals were not eligible to compete in NCAA champion-ship events.

The Wolverines spent six seasons as an independent before the Great West Conference became an all-sports league in 2008 and began its first full season in 2009. UVU also became a university in 2008, changing its name from Utah Valley State College (UVSC) to Utah Valley University (UVU). UVU joined the Western Athletic Conference on July 1, 2013. Joining the WAC gave UVU teams the opportunity to play for NCAA automatic bids for the first time in program history.


