GAME STORYLINES

- **SERIES NOTES.** BYU and Arizona are meeting for the 24th time. It is also the fourth time since 2006 that the Cougars and Wildcats meet in the season opener, and the seventh overall. BYU has more openers against Arizona than any other school. The series has been a fairly even match, with BYU trailing 10-12-1 overall. The two teams met 16 times over the 1960s and 70s as members of the Western Athletic Conference.
- **SEASON OPENERS.** BYU is 9-1 in its last 10 season openers. The Cougars have defeated six Power 5 times over that span, including Arizona (2016), Nebraska (2015), Washington State (2012), Mississippi (2011), Washington (2010) and Oklahoma (2009). Since 2001, no other team has opened against as many Power 5 teams than BYU with 14. BYU has gone 10-4 in those games, giving it more wins than any other school against Power 5 teams in season openers since 2001.
- **DEJA VU.** For the second time in three years, BYU is opening the season against the Arizona Wildcats. The 2016 game was Kalani Sitake's first game as a head coach and was filled with drama at University of Phoenix Stadium. Jamaal Williams and Taysom Hill returned to the field after missing 2015 and kicker Jake Oldroyd drilled a 33-yard field goal with four seconds left to win it 18-16.
- **BOUNCE BACK LIKE LAVELL.** Head coach Kalani Sitake and the Cougars are hoping to bounce back in 2018 similar to how LaVell Edwards and company did after his second season at the helm of the program. Edwards' second season (1973) was his only losing season of his 29-year career as the head coach. In season three of Edwards' tenure, the 1974 squad turned around from 5-6 the year before to 7-4-1, a WAC championship and a Fiesta Bowl appearance – the first bowl appearance in program history. BYU looks to follow in the hall of famers' footsteps.
- **NEW PLACES, NEW AND FAMILIAR FACES.** BYU had several changes on the coaching staff in the offseason. Jeff Grimes is the new offensive coordinator. Grimes spent the last four seasons as the offensive line coach and run game coordinator at LSU and brings 25 years of coaching experience to his second stint as a Cougar. Grimes was BYU's offensive line coach from 2004-2006. Passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach Aaron Roderick played at BYU in the late 90s and spent three years as a graduate assistant with the Cougars. Two other offensive coaches joined the program, Fesi Sitake and AJ Steward. Sitake was most recently the offensive coordinator at Weber State and Steward coached running backs at Rice. On the defensive side, Preston Hadley is the new safeties coach after coaching defensive backs at Weber State. Hadley played cornerback for BYU in 2011-12.
- **HEADING HOME.** Top returning tight end Matt Bushman is heading back to his old high school stomping grounds in Tucson. The sophomore standout played at Sabino High School and was not only an all-state tight end but also a terrific baseball player. In fact, Bushman played for BYU's baseball team during the 2017 season prior to his freshman All-American football season. BYU has four other players from Arizona, including long snapper Mitch Harris, offensive lineman Chandon Herring, wideout Gunner Romney and defensive back Beau Tanner.

Coach Sitake and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A basic transcript of Sitake's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided with additional player quotes upon availability. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

LATE SCORE GIVES PURDUE 38-35 WIN OVER ARIZONA

SANTA CLARA, Calif. -- Elijah Sindelar threw a 38-yard touchdown pass to Anthony Mahoungou with 1:44 remaining and Purdue capped coach Jeff Brohm's first season in dramatic style with a 38-35 victory over Arizona in the Foster Farms Bowl on Wednesday night.

The Boilermakers (7-6) had squandered a 17-point halftime lead when Khalil Tate threw his fifth TD pass with 3:21 remaining to give the Wildcats (7-6) the lead.

But Sindelar responded with a 75-yard drive that ended with the deep throw into the end zone to Mahoungou, giving the Boilermakers their first winning record since 2011 and first bowl win over a major conference team since beating Washington in the 2002 Sun Bowl.

Sindelar threw for 396 yards and four touchdowns, with Mahoungou (118 yards) and Gregory Phillips (149) each topping the 100-yard mark and catching two TD passes.

Tate was just as good, showing he can win with his arm as well as he can with his legs that carried him to 1,353 yards rushing in the regular season. Tate threw for 302 yards and five touchdowns but his late interception to Jacob Thieneman ended the comeback attempt.

Brohm pulled out all the stops, going for it three times on fourth down, calling a couple of flea-flickers and using an innovative trick play to set up a field goal at the end of the first half that made it 31-14.

The Boilermakers took over at their 32 with 56 seconds left after Tate lost a fumble. Purdue appeared to be taking a knee on the play to run out the clock, but running back D.J. Knox was crouching hidden behind a guard. Sindelar then handed the ball to Knox, who waited an instant and then ran around left end for a 30-yard gain that helped set up the field goal.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR EIGHT

The 12-game independent schedule features eight teams that played in a bowl game in 2017. Four games are against Pac-12 opponents. BYU also takes on likely top-10 opponent Wisconsin on the road and features games against Mountain West foes Utah State, Boise State and Hawai'i. Independents UMass and New Mexico State also appear on the schedule along with Mid-American favorite Northern Illinois and FCS power McNeese State.

The Cougars will host six home games including Cal, McNeese State, Utah State, Hawai'i, Northern Illinois and New Mexico State. BYU is on the road against Arizona, Wisconsin, Washington, Boise State, UMass (Gillette Stadium) and Utah in Salt Lake City.



BOWLING OPPONENTS

Of BYU's 12 opponents in 2018, eight played in a bowl game last year: Utah State, Northern Illinois, New Mexico State, Arizona, Wisconsin, Washington, Boise State and Utah.

BYU VS. POWER 5 TEAMS

BYU is No. 2 for the most wins (23) over Power 5 opponents by a non-Power 5 school since 2003, trailing only Navy's 24. BYU had a streak of 11 consecutive seasons with at least one win over a Power 5 team snapped last season.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 63,470 after various refurbishments. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. BYU's winning percentage at LaVell Edwards Stadium is ranked No. 11 among teams playing in their current stadium.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates more than 400 missions around the world in over 150 nations speaking more than 160 languages. More than 67,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours — seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples) — teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

About 65 percent of the current team has served a mission. Members of the team have served in 28 different countries and six of the seven continents around the globe. More than 30 members of the team (previous signees or on roster) are currently serving in the mission field.

The Polynesian Islands have become a hotbed for recruiting in recent years, but BYU has been one of the pioneers in bringing these players from Tonga, Samoa, the Hawaiian Islands and all of Polynesia to the forefront of college football since the early 1950s. About 40 members of the current roster are of Polynesian descent.

Some of BYU's most celebrated and decorated players have come from the Pacific islands, including All-Americans, national record holders, players who have gone on to compete in the NFL and now, several members of BYU's current coaching and support staff.

Kalani Sitake was named BYU's 14th head coach on Dec. 19, 2015, becoming the first Tongan head football coach in the NCAA. His staff includes Polynesians Ilaisa Tuiaki, Fesi Sitake, Nu'u Tafisi, Jack Damuni, Jasen Ah You, Alema Fitsemanu, Vince Feula, Matt Ah You and Harvey Unga.

GROUND GAME PROPELS BYU OVER HAWAI'I 30-20 TO FINISH 2017 SEASON

HONOLULU — A season-high 285 yards rushing propelled BYU football to a 30-20 win over Hawai'i Saturday at Aloha Stadium.

BYU had 451 yards of total offense and a season-high 285 yards rushing. Squally Canada ran for 113 yards on 17 carries — all in the first half, including 99 yards in the first quarter. He scored two touchdowns in a game for the first time in his career and had over 100 yards for just the second time. Austin Kafentzis added 98 yards on 18 carries while Riley Burt had 13 carries for 75 yards. True freshman quarterback Joe Critchlow completed 14 of 23 passes for 166 yards and one touchdown.

BYU put points on the board during its first possession, driving 85 yards down the field in 2:33. Canada had three carries for 68 yards on the drive, including a 40-yard touchdown run. Kicker Rhett Almond hit the extra point to give the Cougars a 7-0 lead with 12:27 on the clock.

Hawai'i's Solomon Matautia recovered a fumble and returned it to the end zone as the Rainbow Warriors evened the score, 7-7 with 4:42 left in the quarter.

Critchlow connected with wide receiver Jonah Trinnaman on a critical fourth-and-12 for a gain of 18 yards, setting up Canada's second touchdown of the game. Canada then rushed for two and four yards on separate carries and scored on the latter as BYU regained the lead early in the second quarter, 13-7, but missed the PAT.

Both teams remained scoreless for much of the third quarter. Matt Bushman caught a 37-yard pass, energizing the BYU offense. A few plays later, Critchlow found fellow freshman Neil Pau'u for an 11-yard touchdown pass with 1:39 left in the quarter. Andrew Mikkelsen's extra point was good as the Cougars extended their lead, 20-7.

Hawai'i recovered a fumble on a punt return 25 yards from the end zone to conclude the third quarter. The Rainbow Warriors capitalized on the turnover, scoring on a 15-yard pass with 12:23 in the fourth quarter. BYU's Anderson blocked the extra point, the first blocked kick of his career, maintaining the 20-13 score.

Riley Burt ran 11 yards untouched into the end zone for his first career touchdown with 3:46 left, increasing the BYU's advantage, 30-13. Burt had two carries during the three-play drive for 32 yards.

Hawai'i responded with a touchdown of its own two minutes later on a three-yard pass to trail 30-20 with 1:48 to go.

BYU recovered the onside kick and was able to run out the clock to secure the victory in the final game of the year.

BYU OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

1 Tight end Matt Bushman is No. 1 among returning FBS tight ends with 49 receptions and 520 yards. He was named a freshman All-American by the Football Writers Association of America, USA Today Sports and 247 Sports.

4 BYU finished 2017 No. 4 nationally in tackles for loss allowed per game at just 3.77. The Cougars have been stopped behind the line of scrimmage just 49 times in 13 games, including sacks. In 2016, BYU was ranked No. 24, allowing 4.92 tackles for loss per game.

106 BYU is replacing three departed seniors from 2017 that totaled 106 starts in the middle of the offensive line with Tejan Koroma (51 starts), Tuni Kanuch (29 starts) and Keyan Norman (26 starts). The Cougars shifted former freshman All-American left tackle Thomas Shoaf to left guard to get the best five on the field in 2018.

265x3 The Cougar offense has rushed for at least 265 yards in three of the final five games of 2017. BYU ran for 266 yards against San Jose State, 265 at UNLV and a season-best 285 at Hawaii. Top rusher Squally Canada is back after running for 710 yards last season.

4,556 To date, the Collie family has totaled 4,556 receiving yards at BYU between Scott and sons Zac and Austin. Austin has the bulk of them with 3,255 yards – second most in school history. With Dylan making his BYU debut, the Collie family has a chance to catch the Bellini brothers (5,064) for the most receiving yards in school history by an immediate family. Dylan's 1,300 yards at Hawaii would put the Collie's collegiate total at 5,856.

THE BYU OFFENSE

- **IN GOOD COMPANY.** With 49 receptions and 520 yards last season, freshman All-American tight end Matt Bushman had the most catches and yards of any BYU tight end in a single season since Dennis Pitta in 2009. The consensus All-American Pitta finished his senior campaign with 62 receptions and 829 yards.
- **GAME EXPERIENCE.** BYU returns experience at key positions. Quarterback Tanner Mangum has played in 26 games with 21 starts. Offensive linemen Thomas Shoaf and Austin Hoyt have combined for 39 starts and played in 62 games. Running back Squally Canada has 25 games under his belt while fullback Brayden El-Bakri has 29 games. Dylan Collie played in 39 games at Hawaii before coming back to BYU.
- **GETTING GRIMEY.** Offensive coordinator Jeff Grimes is not a stranger to BYU, having spent the 2004-06 seasons with the Cougars as the offensive line coach. In 2005 BYU ranked No. 13 in total offense with 462 yards per game and in 2006 ranked No. 4 at 465 yards per game.
- **COACHING EXPERIENCE.** The BYU offensive staff has more than 80 years of coaching experience. Jeff Grimes has the most with about 25 years. Tight ends coach Steve Clark has been coaching since 1994 and passing game coordinator Aaron Roderick is approaching 20 years in the profession. Roderick, Clark and wide receivers coach Fesi Sitake have all been offensive coordinators at the college level.

THE BYU DEFENSE

• **DY(NO)MITE - NO EXPLOSIVE PLAYS.** The Cougar defense ranked No. 1 in 2017 in allowing rushing plays of 20 yards or more, giving up just three running plays all year of more than 20 yards. The team allowed just one run more than 30 yards. The defense allowed just 41 plays of 20 yards or more of any kind last year, ranking No. 4 in the FBS.

• **FEEL THE POWER OF THE DARK SIDE.** BYU had a few players from the offense join the defense for the 2018 season. Wildcat quarterback and running back Austin Kafentzisz moved to safety in the spring while wide receiver Beau Tanner moved to defensive back. Austin Chambers swapped to defensive line from the offensive line while Nate Sampson left the tight end group to join the linebackers. Bracken El-Bakri moved to defensive line after spending time as a fullback last season.

• **GETTING THE BEST 11.** A few players on the defense moved positions to help put the best 11 on the field. Sione Takitaki moved back from defensive line to linebacker, his more natural position. Zayne Anderson moved up to flash linebacker from safety to fill the void left by NFL linebacker Fred Warner. Dayan Ghanwoloku and Troy Warner both moved to safety from corner to allow the young up-and-coming corners to get some more experience and provide leadership in the middle.

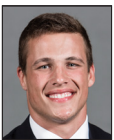

Kalani Sitake (pronounced kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay) was named head coach overseeing the BYU football program on December 19, 2015, by director of athletics Tom Holmoe.

Sitake is the 14th head coach in BYU history. He came to BYU from Oregon State, where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator.

A former Cougar running back (1994, 1997-2000), Sitake returned to his alma mater with 15 years of coaching experience, including seven years a defensive coordinator and four seasons as an assistant head coach. He enters his 18th season overall in 2018.

Prior to serving as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Oregon State in 2015, Sitake spent 10 seasons at the University of Utah. He started at Utah in 2005 as the linebackers coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2009 before also being named assistant head coach in 2012.

Sitake coached several Pac-12 and Mountain West Conference honorees, including Morris Trophy winners Star Lotulelei (2011) and Nate Orchard (2014). He also helped 14 players who became NFL Draft picks during his time at Utah, coaching 12 all-league players and three freshmen All-Americans. He helped the Utes win seven of eight bowl games during his tenure.

During his career, Sitake has helped mentor 16 NFL Draft picks, including BYU linebacker Fred Warner, drafted in the third round in 2018 by the San Francisco 49ers, and running back Jamaal Williams, who was selected in the fourth round by the Green Bay Packers in the 2017 NFL Draft. Williams finished his BYU career as the school's all-time leading rusher after averaging the nation's fifth-best per-game totals at 137.5 yards per outing for Sitake's Cougars in 2016.

Sitake began his coaching career in 2001 as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Arizona before becoming a defensive graduate assistant at BYU in 2002. Sitake then joined the staff at Southern Utah where he coached running backs, tight ends and offensive line during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

Born in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, and raised in Laie, Hawai'i and Provo, Utah, Sitake becomes the first FBS head football coach of Tongan descent. He is just the fourth BYU head coach to guide the program since 1972, when Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards took over the program. He is the first former player under Edwards to be named head coach at BYU.

Sitake began his BYU playing career in 1994 prior to serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Oakland, California. After returning and redshirting in 1997, Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000 under Edwards.

He was named BYU's Football Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1998, Impact Player of the Year in 1999, along with team captain and the most valuable running back in 2000. He signed a free agent contract with the Cincinnati Bengals in 2001, but was forced to retire due to an injury.

Sitake graduated from BYU in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in English. He and his wife Timberly have three children, Skye, Sadie and Kelaokalani (KK).
