SEASON PREVIEW 2020-21

BYU men's basketball enters year two of the Mark Pope era with a promising roster in what will likely be one of the most unique seasons in college basketball history. The 2019-20 season was cut short due to the COVID-19 pandemic and concerns about the virus continue to impact sports at all levels. The start date for the 2020-21 men's basketball season has been pushed back to Nov. 25 but the 2021 NCAA Tournament remains on schedule.

In 2019-20, Pope led the Cougars to a final national ranking of No. 18/16 in the AP/USA Today Coaches polls and a 24-8 overall record. BYU was poised to return to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 2016 and were projected to receive a single-digit seed. Days before Selection Sunday, it was announced that the 2020 NCAA Tournament was canceled due to the pandemic. BYU's 2020-21 squad is deep and experienced and features several exciting newcomers. Check out a position breakdown below.

Point Guard

The lead guard position will be captained by a pair of seniors who will likely play together for a majority of the minutes. Alex Barcello, who transferred from Arizona before last season, started all 32 games at the two-guard in 2019-20 and averaged 9.3 points, 3.1 rebounds and 1.8 assists in his debut season with the Cougars. The Preseason All-WCC honoree will be joined in the backcourt by Brandon Averette, who comes to BYU as a graduate transfer from Utah Valley. Averette, who played his freshman and sophomore seasons at Oklahoma State, averaged 12.8 points, 2.1 rebounds and 3.0 assists while starting all 30 games for the Wolverines in 2019-20.

Jesse Wade also returns to the program after an injury-riddled 2019-20. A junior, Wade played his freshman season at Gonzaga before sitting out 2018-19 at BYU due to NCAA transfer rules. A prolific scorer and shooter in high school, Wade will give Pope another option at either guard spot in 2020-21. In addition to Wade, walk-on Cameron Pearson returns for his sophomore season.

Wing

Connor Harding, a two-year letterwinner with starting experience, is one of the more versatile players on the roster. A capable ball-handler and passer who may see time at the point guard spot, Harding can attack the basket and shoot from the outside. Last season he averaged 6.1 points, 3.2 rebounds and 1.3 assists while shooting 51.8 percent from the field and 44.2 percent from 3-point range. He is a likely candidate to pick up some of the scoring slack.

Trevin Knell returns for his sophomore season and has his sights set on an increased role. Knell played his freshman season just off a mission and missed significant time due to a hand injury. He showed promise as a capable defender and has the potential to be a significant threat as an outside shooter. Wyatt Lowell is eligible after sitting out last season due to NCAA transfer rules. The 2018-19 WAC Freshman of the Year while playing at Utah Valley, Lowell was often the best shooter in the gym in practices during his redshirt year. At 6-foot-10, Lowell has the ability to score in a variety of ways and gives Pope the ability to go big without sacrificing 3-point shooting.

The returnees are joined by a very intriguing group of newcomers on the wing. Hunter Erickson and Caleb Lohner are two highly touted freshmen who prepped in Utah. Erickson played at Timpview High School where he was a two-time first-team all-state honoree and averaged 22.0 points as a junior and 22.6 as a senior. The high-scoring guard served an LDS mission following high school. Lohner graduated from Wasatch Academy in 2020 and brings a college-ready 6-foot-8 frame to the Cougars. Playing with several other Division I level athletes, Lohner averaged 14.5 points and 5.8 rebounds while helping lead Wasatch to a record of 27-2 in 2019-20. As a junior, he posted 10.4 points and 5.4 rebounds on a team that finished the season ranked No. 10 in the USA Today Sports Super 25 and played in the GEICO High School Nationals.

Townsend Tripple rounds out the incoming freshman class. A 6-foot-8 wing, Tripple earned first-team all-state honors at Rocky Mountain High School in Idaho and is a threat to shoot from the outside.

The incoming class also features three transfers, including Gideon George and Spencer Johnson from the junior college ranks. George, who played at New Mexico Junior College, was a two-time NJCAA Region V Team and All-Western Junior College Athletic Conference Team honoree. Last season he averaged 14.5 points and 8.0 rebounds and has two years of eligibility remaining. Johnson played his freshman season at Salt Lake Community College in 2019-20. He averaged 13.2 points and 4.9 rebounds while earning All-Region 18 Second Team honors and helping SLCC to a record of 29-4 and the No. 4 overall seed in the NJCAA National Tournament. Johnson has three years of eligibility remaining.

Brandon Warr comes to BYU after three seasons at Westminster in Salt Lake. He averaged 15.3 points and 8.9 rebounds last season while earning second-team all-conference honors. Warr will sit out this season and play his senior year in 2021-22.

Post

BYU has an experienced group of returning players in the post, including juniors Kolby Lee and Gavin Baxter, who both have significant starting experience in a BYU uniform. After dealing with injuries as a freshman, Lee started 28 games last season and averaged 7.0 points and 3.2 rebounds on 62.5 percent shooting, the third-best field goal percentage in a season in BYU history. Baxter overcame a shoulder injury to contribute in the final seven games last season. As a freshman in 2018-19, Baxter earned All-WCC Freshman Team recognition while posting averages of 4.7 points, 3.1 rebounds and 1.1 blocks per game. He set the BYU record for field goal percentage in a season, shooting 64.8 percent from the field.

Utah Valley transfer Richard Harward gives BYU experience and a big body in the post. The 6-11, 255-pound junior is eligible after sitting out last season. He had a breakout sophomore season playing for Pope in 2018-19, when he averaged 6.9 points and 4.9 rebounds and shot 63.8 percent.

Purdue transfer and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award watch list member Matt Haarms comes to BYU after playing three years at Purdue, where is fourth all-time in career blocks and sixth in field goal percentage. Last season he posted averages of 8.6 points, 4.6 rebounds and 2.0 blocks. During his sophomore campaign, Haarms averaged 9.4 points and 5.4 boards while leading the Big Ten in blocks at 2.1 per game. He helped the Boilermakers finish 26-10 and advance to the Elite Eight of the 2019 NCAA Tournament.

Cougars to play in Legends Classic Presented by Old Trapper

On Oct. 14, BYU men's basketball was added to the field of the Legends Classic Presented by Old Trapper. The tournament will be held at Mohegan Sun in Uncasville, Connecticut. The Cougars will play USC on Dec. 1 and face either UConn or Vanderbilt on Dec. 3.

Preseason recognition

Several Cougars have earned recognition heading into the 2020-21 season. Senior center Matt Haarms has been named one of 20 watch list members for the 2021 Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Center of the Year Award by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. In the WCC Preseason Polls, BYU was picked to finish second and senior guard Alex Barcello was named to the Preseason All-WCC Team. Finally, college basketball writer Jon Rothstein named Mark Pope one of 12 coaches on the rise entering 2020-21.

Pope sets records in his first season

Mark Pope became the 19th head coach in BYU history when he was hired on April 10, 2019. He came to Provo after four seasons at Utah Valley in Orem where he led the Wolverines to 77 wins, three-straight postseason bids and back-to-back 20-win seasons. In his inaugural season at the helm in 2019-20, Pope became the fifth BYU coach to record 20 wins in his opening season, joining G. Ott Romney (20-10 in 1928-29), Stan Watts (22-12 in 1949-50), Roger Reid (21-9 in 1989-90) and Dave Rose (20-9 in 2005-06). His 24 wins are a BYU record for a coach in his first season and his .750 win percentage is second best. Floyd Millet had the best win percentage by a Cougar coach in his first season* at .850 (17-3 in 1941-42). Pope is only the second coach to have his team ranked in his first season (Glenn Potter in 1972-73) and the first to finish his first season with his team ranked in the top 25.

Improved 3-point shooting

In Mark Pope's first season as head coach, BYU made significant improvements shooting from long range and set several program records along the way. The Cougars shot 42.2 percent in 2019-20 (first in the nation) after hitting 33.0 percent in 2018-19. Several of BYU's returning players made significant improvements from 2018-19 to 2019-20, including Connor Harding (30.9 percent to 44.2), Kolby Lee (25.0 to 71.1) amd Alex Barcello (29.2 to 48.6). The 2019-20 Cougars also set program record for 3-point field goals (332) and 3-point field goals per game (10.4) in a single season.

BY THE NUMBERS

- The number of consecutive games BYU made 10-plus 3-pointers in 2019-20 on two occasions (11/27 to 12/14 and Jan. 25 to Feb. 13), a school record for consecutive games with double-digit 3s. The previous record was three.
- 9 The number of consecutive games BYU shot 50.0 percent-plus from the field in 2019-20 (1/11/20 to 2/9/20), tied for the longest streak in team history. The previous record was set in the final nine games of the 1988-89 season.
- 15 Including the 2019-20 season, BYU has posted a winning on-court record in 15-straight seasons (officially 12 all but one win in 2015-16 and 2016-17 were vacated by the NCAA). The Cougars won 20-plus games in 14 of those seasons and 19 in the other.
- The number of games BYU made double-digit 3-pointers in 2019-20, a Cougar record for games in a season with double-digit 3s. The 2015-16 team had 13 games with double-digit 3-pointers. The 2010-11 and 2014-15 teams reached the mark 12 times and the 2007-08 team made 10-plus 3s 11 times.
- BYU's final ranking in 2019-20. It marked the first time BYU was ranked during the regular season and finished a season ranked in the top 25 since the 2010-11 season. Mark Pope became the first BYU coach to finish in the top 25 during his first season.
 - BYU's win total in 2019-20, Mark Pope's first season at the helm. The 24 wins mark the most by a BYU head coach in his first season.
- 48.6 Alex Barcello's 3-point field goal percentage in 2019-20, fourth all-time in 3-point field goal percentage (minimum 35 attempts) in a single season in BYU history.
