GAME STORYLINES

- **SERIES NOTES.** BYU and California are meeting for the fifth time overall and the second time at LaVell Edwards Stadium. The Cougars defeated the Golden Bears 42-35 on the road in the regular-season finale in 2014. In Cal's only other visit to Provo, BYU topped the Golden Bears 38-28 in 1999.
- **WHITEOUT.** The game is scheduled to be a "whiteout" with the Cougars in their white jerseys, white pants and white helmets for the game. Fans are encouraged to wear white to the game.
- **HOME OPENERS.** BYU is 7-3 in home openers over the past 10 seasons, with wins over Power 5 teams Texas, Washington State and Washington. Last season, BYU defeated Portland State 20-6 in the opener at LaVell Edwards Stadium.
- **BOUNCE BACK LIKE LAVELL.** Head coach Kalani Sitake and the Cougars are hoping to bounce back in 2018 similar to how LaVell Edwards and company did after his second season at the helm of the program. Edwards' second season (1973) was his only losing season of his 29-year career as the head coach. In season three of Edwards' tenure, the 1974 squad turned around from 5-6 the year before to 7-4-1, a WAC championship and a Fiesta Bowl appearance – the first bowl appearance in program history. BYU looks to follow in the hall of famers' footsteps.
- **NEW PLACES, NEW AND FAMILIAR FACES.** BYU had several changes on the coaching staff in the offseason. Jeff Grimes is the new offensive coordinator. Grimes spent the last four seasons as the offensive line coach and run game coordinator at LSU and brings 25 years of coaching experience to his second stint as a Cougar. Grimes was BYU's offensive line coach from 2004-2006. Passing game coordinator and quarterbacks coach Aaron Roderick played at BYU in the late 90s and spent three years as a graduate assistant with the Cougars. Two other offensive coaches joined the program, Fesi Sitake and AJ Steward. Sitake was most recently the offensive coordinator at Weber State and Steward coached running backs at Rice. On the defensive side, Preston Hadley is the new safeties coach after coaching defensive backs at Weber State. Hadley played cornerback for BYU in 2011-12.
- **CALIFORNIA NATIVES.** BYU has 25 players on the roster from California, second-most next to Utah. Offensive lineman Kieffer Longson is from San Ramon about 30 minutes from Berkeley, while fellow lineman Austin Hoyt is about two hours away in Lone. Wideout Dylan Collie is from a more inland El Dorado Hills while Squally Canada is grew up about 20 minutes from Berkeley. Linebacker Riggs Powell is from Aptos, south of San Jose.

After home games, postgame press conference will be conducted in the LaVell Edwards Stadium press room, located on the southeast end of the stadium next to the BYU locker room. At the discretion of the visiting team, opponent interviews will be conducted in the Blue Zone, near the opponent's locker room located on northwest end of the stadium. Coach Sitake and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A direct video feed will also be sent to the press box from the BYU postgame press conference. A basic transcript of Sitake's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided with additional player quotes upon availability. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

DEFENSE PROVIDES SPARK IN SEASON-OPENING WIN

BERKELEY – The 2018 season opener put an offseason of hard work on full display as Cal's defense forced four turnovers and limited visiting North Carolina well enough early to begin Wilcox's second season with a 24-17 victory over the Tar Heels.

North Carolina struggled to gain positive yardage at all in the first half, failing to pick up even one first down in the first quarter. Cal's first takeaway also set the stage for the first points of the season as an interception by safety Jaylinn Hawkins put the Bears on the North Carolina 23-yard line. Four plays later, Patrick Laird darted over the right side of his offensive line for a 4-yard touchdown run that put Cal ahead 7-0.

The second quarter started with the same intensity, only this time the Cal defense took the opportunity to do the scoring itself. Cameron Goode did the honors, feigning an edge rush before dropping into coverage and grabbing a Nathan Elliott pass for the Bears' second interception. The sophomore took off for a 38-yard return and gave the Bears a 14-0 advantage.

New Cal kicker Greg Thomas added to the lead with a 35-yard field goal and an interception by Ashtyn Davis punctuated a half in which Cal held North Carolina to just one first down and 38 yards of total offense.

The Tar Heels hit the scoreboard first in the second half with a 43-yard field goal by Freeman Jones but Cal re-established command with a lengthy scoring drive of its own. Quarterbacks Chase Garbers and Brandon McIlwain both saw time behind center during the drive but it was Garbers who eventually put the Bears in the end zone, connecting with Laird in the right flat for a 4-yard touchdown pass.

North Carolina's first touchdown came on a 3-yard run by Antonio Williams but the 19-play drive burned over six minutes off the clock and left the Tar Heels down 24-10 with 6:31 left to play.

A 14-yard pass from Elliott to Anthony Ratliff-Williams brought UNC to within a touchdown with 1:13 left and the Tar Heels recovered the ensuing onside kick to regain possession only to see that play nullified by an illegal block penalty. Try No. 2 at the kickoff ended with North Carolina touching the ball before it traveled 10 yards and the Bears kneeled to run out the clock.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR EIGHT

The 12-game independent schedule for 2018 features eight teams that played in a bowl game in 2017. Four games are against Pac-12 opponents. BYU also takes on likely top-10 opponent Wisconsin on the road and features games against Mountain West foes Utah State, Boise State and Hawai'i. Independents UMass and New Mexico State also appear on the schedule along with Mid-American favorite Northern Illinois and FCS power McNeese State.

The Cougars will host six home games including Cal, McNeese State, Utah State, Hawai'i, Northern Illinois and New Mexico State. BYU is on the road against Arizona, Wisconsin, Washington, Boise State, UMass (Gillette Stadium) and Utah in Salt Lake City.

Of BYU's 12 opponents in 2018, eight played in a bowl game last year: Utah State, Northern Illinois, New Mexico State, Arizona, Wisconsin, Washington, Boise State and Utah.

BYU VS. POWER 5 TEAMS

BYU is tied for No. 1 with Navy for the most wins (24) over Power 5 opponents by a non-Power 5 school since 2003. BYU had a streak of 11 consecutive seasons with at least one win over a Power 5 team snapped last season.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 63,470 after various refurbishments. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. BYU's winning percentage at LaVell Edwards Stadium is ranked No. 11 among teams playing in their current stadium.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates more than 400 missions around the world in over 150 nations speaking more than 160 languages. More than 67,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours — seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples) — teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

About 65 percent of the current team has served a mission. Members of the team have served in 28 different countries and six of the seven continents around the globe. More than 30 members of the team (previous signees or on roster) are currently serving in the mission field.

The Polynesian Islands have become a hotbed for recruiting in recent years, but BYU has been one of the pioneers in bringing these players from Tonga, Samoa, the Hawaiian Islands and all of Polynesia to the forefront of college football since the early 1950s. About 40 members of the current roster are of Polynesian descent.

Some of BYU's most celebrated and decorated players have come from the Pacific islands, including All-Americans, national record holders, players who have gone on to compete in the NFL and now, several members of BYU's current coaching and support staff.

Kalani Sitake was named BYU's 14th head coach on Dec. 19, 2015, becoming the first Tongan head football coach in the NCAA. His staff includes Polynesians Ilaisa Tuiaki, Fesi Sitake, Nu'u Tafisi, Jack Damuni, Jasen Ah You, Alema Fitsemanu, Vince Feula, Matt Ah You and Harvey Unga.

CANADA'S THREE TOUCHDOWNS POWER BYU TO 28-23 WIN AT ARIZONA

TUCSON, Ariz. – Led by Squally Canada's three touchdowns and an efficient night on offense and defense, the BYU football team powered its way to a 28-23 win over Arizona in the 2018 season opener Saturday night at Arizona Stadium.

Canada had 98 yards on the ground on 24 carries in addition to his three scores. He added two receptions for 29 yards. Quarterback Tanner Mangum completed 18 of 28 passes for 209 yards and one touchdown. Moroni Lauulu-Pututau posted 24 yards on three receptions and Matt Bushman caught a 24-yard score.

Senior Corbin Kaufusi posted seven tackles, two tackles for loss and one sack. Fellow senior Butch Pau'u also nabbed seven total tackles while Michael Shelton had two tackles, a pass breakup, blocked a field goal and recorded a 37-yard punt return.

BYU outgained the Wildcats 392 to 326. The Cougars held Arizona to 129 yards on the ground after the Wildcats were No. 3 nationally last season with more than 300 per game. BYU also limited Heisman hopeful Khalil Tate to 17 of 34 passing for 197 yards and just eight carries for 14 yards. Tate was No. 7 nationally in 2017 with 129.3 rushing yards per game.

First Half Review

The Cougars put the first points on the board for the 2018 season with a touchdown from Canada. A 30-yard pass from BYU quarterback Mangum to junior Aleva Hifo put the Cougars on the Arizona 27-yard line and propelled BYU into the blue zone. With the ball on the 1-yard line, Canada rushed for his ninth career touchdown and first of the season. Freshman Skylar Southam made good on the PAT putting the Cougars up 7-0 with 9:58 left in the second quarter.

The Wildcats answered back kicking a 24-yard field goal making the score 7-3 followed by a 15-yard passing touchdown from Arizona quarterback Khalil Tate to Tony Ellison just before halftime. The Wildcats went into the break up 10-7.

Second Half Review

On the first drive of the second half, the 2017 freshman All-American Matt Bushman recorded his first touchdown of the 2018 season with a 24-yard pass from Mangum. A 22-yard pass to Dylan Collie, set up Bushman to get into the end zone. Collie had the ball tipped away but dove to secure the catch before hitting the ground. The Cougars took the lead again 14-10 with 8:25 left in the third quarter. Canada rushed for two more touchdowns, his first three-touchdown game, before the quarter was over. BYU ended the third quarter ahead 28-10, racking up 21 points in the third.

Arizona answered back with two touchdowns of their own during the fourth quarter cutting the Cougars lead to 28-23 with 3:23 left in the game. The Cougars put together enough first downs to let the clock wind-down and secured its first win of the 2018 season 28-23 over the Wildcats.

3-3 BYU went 3 for 3 with three touchdowns inside the red zone, or the "blue" zone at BYU (inside the 20s). Last year, the Cougar offense scored touchdowns just 44.7 percent of the time inside the blue zone.

36:33 BYU held the ball for 36:33 against Arizona, ranking No. 13 nationally on opening weekend. In 2017, BYU's average time of possession was 27:53 and season-high was 36:30 at Hawaii.

4,578 To date, the Collie family has totaled 4,578 receiving yards at BYU between Scott and sons Zac, Austin and Dylan. Dylan's first BYU reception came in the form of a 22-yarder at Arizona. Austin has the bulk of them with 3,255 yards – second most in school history. With Dylan at BYU now, the Collie family has a chance to catch the Bellini brothers (5,064) for the most receiving yards in school history by an immediate family. Dylan's 1,300 yards at Hawaii would put the Collie's collegiate total at 5,878.

THE BYU OFFENSE

- **IN GOOD COMPANY.** With 49 receptions and 520 yards last season, freshman All-American tight end Matt Bushman had the most catches and yards of any BYU tight end in a single season since Dennis Pitta in 2009. The consensus All-American Pitta finished his senior campaign with 62 receptions and 829 yards.
- **GAME EXPERIENCE.** BYU returns experience at key positions. Quarterback Tanner Mangum has played in 27 games with 22 starts. Offensive linemen Thomas Shoaf and Austin Hoyt have combined for 41 starts and played in 64 games. Running back Squally Canada has 26 games under his belt while fullback Brayden El-Bakri has 30 games. Dylan Collie played in 39 games at Hawaii before coming back to BYU.
- **GETTING GRIMEY.** Offensive coordinator Jeff Grimes is not a stranger to BYU, having spent the 2004-06 seasons with the Cougars as the offensive line coach. In 2005 BYU ranked No. 13 in total offense with 462 yards per game and in 2006 ranked No. 4 at 465 yards per game.
- **COACHING EXPERIENCE.** The BYU offensive staff has more than 80 years of coaching experience. Jeff Grimes has the most with about 25 years. Tight ends coach Steve Clark has been coaching since 1994 and passing game coordinator Aaron Roderick is approaching 20 years in the profession. Roderick, Clark and wide receivers coach Fesi Sitake have all been offensive coordinators at the college level.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **DY(NO)MITE - NO EXPLOSIVE PLAYS.** The Cougar defense allowed just two plays of 20 yards or more to Arizona in the season opener, including one rushing and one passing. BYU ranked No. 1 in 2017 in allowing rushing plays of 20 yards or more, giving up just three running plays all year of more than 20 yards. The team allowed just one run more than 30 yards. The defense allowed just 41 plays of 20 yards or more of any kind last year, ranking No. 4 in the FBS.
- **FEEL THE POWER OF THE DARK SIDE.** BYU had a few players from the offense join the defense for the 2018 season. Wildcat quarterback and running back Austin Kafentzis moved to safety in the spring while wide receiver Beau Tanner moved to defensive back. Austin Chambers swapped to defensive line from the offensive line while Nate Sampson left the tight end group to join the linebackers. Bracken El-Bakri moved to defensive line after spending time as a fullback last season.
- **GETTING THE BEST 11.** A few players on the defense moved positions to help put the best 11 on the field. Sione Takitaki moved back from defensive line to linebacker, his more natural position. Zayne Anderson moved up to flash linebacker from safety to fill the void left by NFL linebacker Fred Warner. Dayan Ghanwoloku and Troy Warner both moved to safety from corner to allow the young up-and-coming corners to get some more experience and provide leadership in the middle.

Kalani Sitake (pronounced kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay) was named head coach overseeing the BYU football program on December 19, 2015, by director of athletics Tom Holmoe.

Sitake is the 14th head coach in BYU history. He came to BYU from Oregon State, where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator.

A former Cougar running back (1994, 1997-2000), Sitake returned to his alma mater with 15 years of coaching experience, including seven years a defensive coordinator and four seasons as an assistant head coach. He enters his 18th season overall in 2018.

Prior to serving as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Oregon State in 2015, Sitake spent 10 seasons at the University of Utah. He started at Utah in 2005 as the linebackers coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2009 before also being named assistant head coach in 2012.

Sitake coached several Pac-12 and Mountain West Conference honorees, including Morris Trophy winners Star Lotulelei (2011) and Nate Orchard (2014). He also helped 14 players who became NFL Draft picks during his time at Utah, coaching 12 all-league players and three freshmen All-Americans. He helped the Utes win seven of eight bowl games during his tenure.

During his career, Sitake has helped mentor 16 NFL Draft picks, including BYU linebacker Fred Warner, drafted in the third round in 2018 by the San Francisco 49ers, and running back Jamaal Williams, who was selected in the fourth round by the Green Bay Packers in the 2017 NFL Draft. Williams finished his BYU career as the school's all-time leading rusher after averaging the nation's fifth-best per-game totals at 137.5 yards per outing for Sitake's Cougars in 2016.

Sitake began his coaching career in 2001 as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Arizona before becoming a defensive graduate assistant at BYU in 2002. Sitake then joined the staff at Southern Utah where he coached running backs, tight ends and offensive line during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

Born in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, and raised in Laie, Hawai'i and Provo, Utah, Sitake becomes the first FBS head football coach of Tongan descent. He is just the fourth BYU head coach to guide the program since 1972, when Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards took over the program. He is the first former player under Edwards to be named head coach at BYU.

Sitake began his BYU playing career in 1994 prior to serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Oakland, California. After returning and redshirting in 1997, Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000 under Edwards.

He was named BYU's Football Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1998, Impact Player of the Year in 1999, along with team captain and the most valuable running back in 2000. He signed a free agent contract with the Cincinnati Bengals in 2001, but was forced to retire due to an injury.

Sitake graduated from BYU in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in English. He and his wife Timberly have three children, Skye, Sadie and Kelaokalani (KK).
