GAME STORYLINES

- **THE SERIES.** BYU and Washington are meeting for the 10th time in the series, with BYU looking to even the series at five wins apiece. The last time the two schools met was in the 2013 Kraft Fight Hunger Bowl. The Cougars led 16-14 at halftime but were shutout in the second half and fell to the Huskies 31-16. The last time in Seattle, BYU won 28-27 on a blocked extra point.
- **GOOD START.** BYU is off to its best start since a 4-0 start in 2014. It is just the third time in the last 10 seasons the Cougars have won at least three of the first four games including the 2014 campaign. BYU got off to a 3-1 start in 2009 before finishing the season ranked No. 12 with a record of 11-2.
- **PAC-12 AGAIN.** This will be the third game of four scheduled matchups with the Pac-12 this season. BYU beat Arizona 28-23 in the season opener and then fell to Cal 21-18 in week two. The Cougars will end the regular season against Utah. Four games against the Pac-12 will be the most BYU has ever played in a regular season. Since 2003, BYU has played at least one team from the Pac-12 every year, including the postseason. The Cougars have played at least two Pac-12 teams in six of eight seasons as an independent. A win for BYU would give the program its first season since 2008 with two wins over the Pac-12 in the same year. The Cougars defeated Washington (28-27) and UCLA (59-0) in 2008.
- **POWER 5 WINS.** BYU already has two Power 5 wins with victories over Arizona and Wisconsin. A win over Washington would give BYU at least three wins over Power 5 opponents for the second time in three years. In 2016 BYU defeated Arizona, Michigan State and Mississippi State. The Cougars have 25 wins over Power 5 opponents since 2003, the most among non-Power 5 teams.
- **RANKED MATCHUP.** The Cougars and Huskies are meeting as ranked teams. The last time BYU played a ranked team while being ranked was 2015 against No. 10 UCLA when the Cougars were No. 19. BYU came up just short to the Bruins in a 24-23 loss at the Rose Bowl.

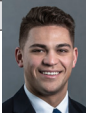

NO. 10 HUSKIES BEAT ARIZONA STATE, 27-20

SEATTLE (AP) — Jake Browning threw a pair of touchdown passes in the first quarter, added a third TD toss early in the fourth quarter, and No. 10 Washington outlasted Arizona State 27-20 on Saturday night.

Browning hit Aaron Fuller and Ty Jones on TD passes during a brilliant first quarter, and found Cade Otton in the back corner of the end zone early in the fourth quarter on a 5-yard TD to give Washington (3-1, 2-0 Pac-12) a 27-13 lead.

Arizona State (2-2, 0-1) rediscovered its run game that was absent the previous two weeks, with Eno Benjamin rushing for 104 yards. But quarterback Manny Wilkins threw for only 104 yards and star wide receiver N'Keal Harry was limited to five catches for 20 yards, unable to find space against Washington's stellar secondary.

Wilkins scored on a 1-yard TD run with 2:54 left to pull the Sun Devils within 27-20. Arizona State kicked deep with three timeouts remaining, but Washington converted a key third-and-6 when Browning hit Andre Baccellia for 9 yards with 2:34 left on a call that was overturned on replay.

Browning finished 15 of 22 passing for 202 yards, but was at his best in the first quarter when he hit 6 of 7 passes for 110 yards and his first two touchdowns. Fuller, the Huskies leading receiver, caught his first TD of the season on an 11-yard reception. Jones' TD was his fourth, an impressive 19-yard catch as he was falling backward in the end zone.

Browning became the second quarterback in Washington history to top 10,000 career passing yards when he hit Otton on a 24-yard completion in the third quarter. He trails only Cody Pickett in career yards passing at the school. Browning topped 10,000 career yards of total offense earlier in the game and his three TD passes gave him 85 for his career, moving him into a tie for eighth in Pac-12 history.

Washington linebacker Ben Burr-Kirven finished with 20 total tackles, a pair of forced fumbles and a fumble recovery.

The Huskies pass protection could not have been much better allowing Browning time to find his receivers down field, especially in the first quarter. Browning was sacked only once against a defense that had 12 sacks coming into the game.

The Huskies close out the nonconference portion of their schedule hosting BYU next Saturday.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR EIGHT

The 12-game independent schedule for 2018 features eight teams that played in a bowl game in 2017. Four games are against Pac-12 opponents. BYU also takes on likely top-10 opponent Wisconsin on the road and features games against Mountain West foes Utah State, Boise State and Hawai'i. Independents UMass and New Mexico State also appear on the schedule along with Mid-American favorite Northern Illinois and FCS power McNeese State.

The Cougars will host six home games including Cal, McNeese State, Utah State, Hawai'i, Northern Illinois and New Mexico State. BYU is on the road against Arizona, Wisconsin, Washington, Boise State, UMass (Gillette Stadium) and Utah in Salt Lake City.



BOWLING OPPONENTS

Of BYU's 12 opponents in 2018, eight played in a bowl game last year: Utah State, Northern Illinois, New Mexico State, Arizona, Wisconsin, Washington, Boise State and Utah.

BYU VS. POWER 5 TEAMS

BYU has the most wins (25) over Power 5 teams by a non-Power 5 opponent school since 2003. BYU had a streak of 11 consecutive seasons with at least one win over a Power 5 team snapped last season. Navy is No. 2 at 24.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of carrying team flags out of the tunnel, along with an American Flag and alumni flags. Each week different players and alumni have the honor of being a flag bearer.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 63,470 after various refurbishments. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. BYU's winning percentage at LaVell Edwards Stadium is ranked No. 14 among teams playing in their current stadium.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates more than 400 missions around the world in over 150 nations speaking more than 160 languages. More than 67,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours — seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples) — teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

About 65 percent of the current team has served a mission. Members of the team have served in 28 different countries and six of the seven continents around the globe. More than 30 members of the team (previous signees or on roster) are currently serving in the mission field.

POLYNESIAN PIPELINE

The Polynesian Islands have become a hotbed for recruiting in recent years, but BYU has been one of the pioneers in bringing these players from Tonga, Samoa, the Hawaiian Islands and all of Polynesia to the forefront of college football since the early 1950s. About 40 members of the current roster are of Polynesian descent.

Some of BYU's most celebrated and decorated players have come from the Pacific islands, including All-Americans, national record holders, players who have gone on to compete in the NFL and now, several members of BYU's current coaching and support staff.

Kalani Sitake was named BYU's 14th head coach on Dec. 19, 2015, becoming the first Tongan head football coach in the NCAA. His staff includes Polynesians Ilaisa Tuiaki, Fesi Sitake, Nu'u Tafisi, Jack Damuni, Jasen Ah You, Alema Fitsemanu, Vince Feula, Matt Ah You and Harvey Unga.

NO. 25 BYU EARNS HOME VICTORY 30-3 OVER MCNEESE STATE

PROVO, Utah – A 24-point second quarter, led by freshman Lopini Katoa's two touchdowns, gave the No. 25 BYU football team a 30-3 win over McNeese State at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

It was the first meeting between BYU and McNeese, as well as the Cougars' lone Football Championship Subdivision matchup of the year. The upset-minded Cowboys came into Provo ranked No. 10 among FCS teams.

Katoa led BYU in scoring, notching two touchdowns en route to 24 points in the second quarter. He also led the running game with 64 yards on 10 attempts. Senior Squally Canada was right behind Katoa with 57 yards on 10 attempts. Matt Hadley got his first action at running back of the season, running for a team-high 20 yarder in the fourth quarter.

BYU's passing game featured nine players getting receptions, with six players going for double-digit receiving yards. Aleva Hifo led the group with 38 yards, while Talon Shumway had the lone score among the receivers with a 7-yard touchdown.

On the defensive side, the Cougars forced four turnovers, a new season high, with two fumbles and two interceptions. Senior Michael Shelton led the squad with six tackles, all of them solo, and forced the first fumble of his career. Corbin Kaufusi was next with five tackles, including one sack, as well as a blocked field goal early in the decisive second quarter.

McNeese marched down the field following the opening kickoff, making it all the way to the BYU 38-yard line before a tackle for loss by Chris Wilcox on third down forced a punt. The Cougars were unable to capitalize on their opening drive after a fumble that they managed to recover set them behind the chains.

BYU's defense appeared to stop the Cowboys on third down once again on the following drive, but a facemask penalty gave the offense an automatic first down and great field position in the red zone. The Cougars were able to hold the Cowboys to a field goal, going down 3-0 midway through the first quarter.

McNeese quarterback James Tabary threw a 39-yard pass to Cyron Sutton early in the second quarter to bring the Cowboys up to the BYU 26-yard line. Corbin Kaufusi blocked a field goal attempt and it was recovered by Troy Warner and returned for a 22-yard gain. BYU then quickly moved the ball up the field, and Katoa punched in a 4-yard touchdown run to put the Cougars up 7-3 with 8:42 left in the first half.

Tanner Jacobson intercepted a McNeese pass early on the following drive, putting BYU's offense back on the 31-yard line. Canada then broke away for a 16-yard run to bring the Cougars inside the 20. A 7-yard pass gave wide receiver Talon Shumway his first career touchdown, and put BYU up double digits, 14-3, with 6:37 left in the first half.

Corbin Kaufusi was then able to pursue and sack the McNeese quarterback on third down, followed by 21-yard punt return by Shelton. Canada topped his previous game-high run with an 18-yard breakaway, followed by a 14-yard run by Katoa into the end zone for his second touchdown of the game.

A fumble on the Cowboys' first play of the following drive was recovered by the Sawyer Powell, putting BYU back on the 25-yard line. A 30-yard field goal from Skyler Southam gave BYU a 24-3 lead heading into halftime. The Cougars forced two turnovers and converted them into 10 points in the second quarter alone, scoring 24 unanswered points in the period.

THE BYU OFFENSE

- **GAME EXPERIENCE.** BYU returns experience at key positions. Quarterback Tanner Mangum has played in 30 games with 25 starts. Offensive linemen Thomas Shoaf and Austin Hoyt have combined for 45 starts and played in 70 games. Running back Squally Canada has 29 games under his belt while fullback Brayden El-Bakri has 31 games. Dylan Collie played in 39 games at Hawaii before coming back to BYU.
- **GETTING GRIMEY.** Offensive coordinator Jeff Grimes is not a stranger to BYU, having spent the 2004-06 seasons with the Cougars as the offensive line coach. In 2005 BYU ranked No. 13 in total offense with 462 yards per game and in 2006 ranked No. 4 at 465 yards per game.
- **COACHING EXPERIENCE.** The BYU offensive staff has more than 80 years of coaching experience. Jeff Grimes has the most with about 25 years. Tight ends coach Steve Clark has been coaching since 1994 and passing game coordinator Aaron Roderick is approaching 20 years in the profession. Roderick, Clark and wide receivers coach Fesi Sitake have all been offensive coordinators at the college level.

BYU DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

0-10 BYU held McNeese without a third down conversion for the game. The Cougar defense stymied the Cowboys 0 for 10 on third down throughout the game. The defense gave up just 10 first downs to McNeese for the game.

4x6 BYU forced four turnovers during the 30-3 win against McNeese. Six players had a hand in the turnovers, including Tanner Jacobson and Rhett Sandlin both with their first career interceptions which were returned for 19-yards and 20-yards, respectively. Michael Shelton recorded his first forced fumble which was picked up by Sawyer Powell for his first career fumble recovery. Austin Kafentzis forced his first fumble that Alden Tota recovered, also for his first.

23 Ranked No. 23 in the nation for scoring defense at 17.0 points per game, the BYU held McNeese to only three points and no touchdowns. It was the first time since a 20-3 win at Cincinnati in 2016 that BYU held a team out of the end zone.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **TURNOVERS.** BYU's defense has forced eight turnovers in the first four games, nabbing four interceptions and picking up four fumbles. The Cougars are tied for No. 21 nationally with their eight takeaways. BYU is ranked No. 9 in turnover margin at +5.
- **FEEL THE POWER OF THE DARK SIDE.** BYU had a few players from the offense join the defense for the 2018 season. Wildcat quarterback and running back Austin Kafentzis moved to safety during the off-season. Austin Chambers swapped to defensive line from the offensive line while Nate Sampson left the tight end group to join the linebackers. Bracken El-Bakri moved to defensive line after spending time as a fullback last season.
- **GETTING THE BEST 11.** A few players on the defense moved positions to help put the best 11 on the field. Sione Takitaki moved back from defensive line to linebacker, his more natural position. Zayne Anderson moved up to flash linebacker from safety to fill the void left by NFL linebacker Fred Warner. Dayan Ghanwoloku and Troy Warner both moved to safety from corner to allow the young up-and-coming corners to get some more experience and provide leadership in the middle.

Kalani Sitake (pronounced kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay) was named head coach overseeing the BYU football program on December 19, 2015, by director of athletics Tom Holmoe.

Sitake is the 14th head coach in BYU history. He came to BYU from Oregon State, where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator.

A former Cougar running back (1994, 1997-2000), Sitake returned to his alma mater with 15 years of coaching experience, including seven years a defensive coordinator and four seasons as an assistant head coach. He enters his 18th season overall in 2018.

Prior to serving as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Oregon State in 2015, Sitake spent 10 seasons at the University of Utah. He started at Utah in 2005 as the linebackers coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2009 before also being named assistant head coach in 2012.

Sitake coached several Pac-12 and Mountain West Conference honorees, including Morris Trophy winners Star Lotulelei (2011) and Nate Orchard (2014). He also helped 14 players who became NFL Draft picks during his time at Utah, coaching 12 all-league players and three freshmen All-Americans. He helped the Utes win seven of eight bowl games during his tenure.

During his career, Sitake has helped mentor 16 NFL Draft picks, including BYU linebacker Fred Warner, drafted in the third round in 2018 by the San Francisco 49ers, and running back Jamaal Williams, who was selected in the fourth round by the Green Bay Packers in the 2017 NFL Draft. Williams finished his BYU career as the school's all-time leading rusher after averaging the nation's fifth-best per-game totals at 137.5 yards per outing for Sitake's Cougars in 2016.

Sitake began his coaching career in 2001 as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Arizona before becoming a defensive graduate assistant at BYU in 2002. Sitake then joined the staff at Southern Utah where he coached running backs, tight ends and offensive line during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

Born in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, and raised in Laie, Hawai'i and Provo, Utah, Sitake becomes the first FBS head football coach of Tongan descent. He is just the fourth BYU head coach to guide the program since 1972, when Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards took over the program. He is the first former player under Edwards to be named head coach at BYU.

Sitake began his BYU playing career in 1994 prior to serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Oakland, California. After returning and redshirting in 1997, Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000 under Edwards.

He was named BYU's Football Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1998, Impact Player of the Year in 1999, along with team captain and the most valuable running back in 2000. He signed a free agent contract with the Cincinnati Bengals in 2001, but was forced to retire due to an injury.

Sitake graduated from BYU in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in English. He and his wife Timberly have three children, Skye, Sadie and Kelaokalani (KK).

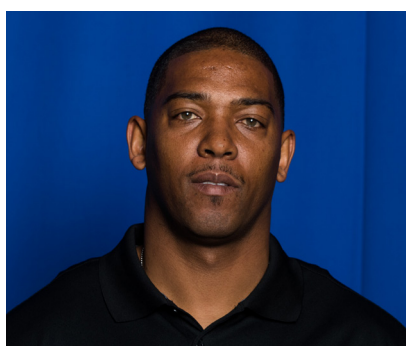
