Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU `93, played `85-`88) is in his sixth season as head coach at BYU, 32-21 (.604) in 2013; 22-31 (.415) in 2014; 28-25 in 2015; and 37-17 in 2016; and 38-21 in 2017 for n 157-115 (.577) record with the Cougars. The 51-year-old coach had a 219-128 (.631) record in seven seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie `08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia `07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU `99), all in their fifth year at BYU.

Series vs. Nebraska Omaha

BYU leads the series 1-0 after beating the Mavericks 19-9 in 2012 at Omaha. Adam Law (Mariners) and Jaycob Brugman (Orioles) from that BYU team both are currently playing in pro ball. The Mavericks and Cougars share no common opponents this season. UNO is from the Summit League (Denver, Fort Wayne, North Dakota, North Dakota State, Oral Roberts, South Dakota, South Dakota State, Western Illinois)

Home Openers

BYU has a 51-7 record in home openers in Provo, dating back to 1960. Coach Littlewood is 4-1 in home openers. Vance Law was 9-4, Gary Pullins was 22-1 and Glen Tuckett was 16-1 in their home openers.

Hitting Streaks

Casey Jacosen leads the team with a current five-game hitting streak, followed by Jarrett Pearn at three games and David Clawson, Brock Hale and Daniel Schneemann at two games apiece. Mitch McIntyre, Clawson, had hit safely in the first seven games this season. Brennon Anderson had an 11-game hitting streak last season. Hale's 15-game hitting streak ended in the Gonzaga 10-3 game. Schneemann had a 14-game hitting streak ended at LMU. Hale had a 15-game hitting streak ended against UConn. Keaton Kringlen's hitting streak ended at 13 games at Georgia State.

Hale Rawlings WCC Player of Week vs. Auburn

Outfielder Brock Hale of BYU has been selected as the Rawlings West Coast Conference Player of the Week for his performance at now No. 15 Auburn. The junior from Mesa, Arizona raised his batting average from .176 to .279 in the doubleheader, netting five RBI last Saturday against Auburn. Hale ended up hitting 4-for-4 in game one, including a three-run homer and double in game one of the doubleheader. In the nightcap he hit a solo home run and another double in batting 2-for-5.

Last year, Hale homered in the first game of the week against Utah and had a three-run homer in the six-run fourth of the final game of the week against Portland. For the week he had nine RBI, two doubles and two home runs.

Kringlen National & WCC Player of Week vs. Utah, SMC

Last year, Keaton Kringlen was named National Player of the Week by three organizations (Collegiate Baseball, National Baseball Writers Association and College Sports Madness) and Rawlings WCC Player of the Week. In the four games he had a slugging percentage of 1.571 with a batting average of .571, while going 8-for-14 with a triple, four homers, 14 RBI and 22 total bases for the Cougars. Three of those homers came in a 14-1 victory to complete a three-game sweep over league-leading Saint Mary's. His triple at Utah and his two-run inside the park homer vs. SMC in a 7-6 win were the game-winning RBI.

Oldest-Youngest on the team

The oldest on the team is 25-year-old Hayden Rogers and the youngest is 18-year-old Walker Sigman.

Jack Morris to Hall of Fame in Cooperstown

Former BYU pitcher Jack Morris will be inducted into the baseball Hall of Fame at Cooperstown, N.Y., on July 29. Morris played for BYU in 1975 (6-3, 5.08) and 1976 (4-6, 4.72). The native of St. Paul, Minn., was drafted in the 5th round by the Detroit Tigers. He played 18 years in the Major League for the Tigers (1977-1990), Minnesota Twins (1991), Toronto Blue James (1992-93) and Cleveland Indians (1994), recording a 254-186 record with a 3.90 ERA. The five-time All-Star won three World Series rings, one of which came from following a 10-inning 1-0 shutout in 1991 for Minnesota vs. Atlanta in Game 7. He threw a 4-0 no-hitter in 1983 vs. the Chicago White Sox.

Top 25 Teams

The Cougars lost three games at No. 18 Auburn, who moved up to No. 15 following the series.

BYU lost at No. 21 Georgia Tech in the 2017 season opener, 5-3 and the Cougars won 2 of 3 at No. 19 San Diego last season. BYU split in the 2017 WCC tournament with No. 27 Loyola Marymount and defeated No. 22 Gonzaga in two games for the tournament crown.

BYU won the first of three games in 2016 against No. 25 Creighton. In 2015 BYU played four nationally ranked teams: UC Santa Barbara, Nebraska, San Diego and upset No. 29 San Diego State.

In 2014, the Cougars played two nationally ranked teams, No. 19 TCU and No. 26 Texas Tech. In 2013, BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Also in 2013, BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1; and BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball).

In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after up-setting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.

Deseret First Duel

For the ninth of 10 times BYU won the baseball portion of the Deseret First Duel in games against Utah. BYU won the baseball portion of the Duel in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017. BYU won the 2014 competition due to a tiebreaker with a 38-21 run differential after the two teams split the four-game series. The 2008 series won by BYU and the 2011 series won by Utah were also by run differential.
