SERIES NOTES

- Texas State and BYU will play for the first time when the Bobcats travel to Provo on Saturday, Oct. 24.
- This marks the sixth time that Texas State has played a football game in the state of Utah. The last time was Nov. 3, 2012, when the Bobcats played a Western Athletic Conference game at Utah State. Texas State also played FCS games at Southern Utah in 1996, 1998, 2003, and 2006.

FIVE THINGS TO KNOW

- Texas State enters the BYU game with a 1-5 overall record and a 1-3 mark in road games after suffering a 30-20 loss at South Alabama on Oct. 17. It was the third straight road loss for the Bobcats following a 24-21 setback at Boston College on Sept. 26 and a 37-17 defeat at Troy on Oct. 10. Texas State's victory came at ULM on Sept. 19.
- The Bobcats play their first game against a nationally-ranked opponent since playing at No. 24- ranked Appalachian State on Nov. 23, 2019. The Bobcats opened the 2019 season at No. 11-ranked Texas A&M on Aug. 29. The BYU game marks the ninth game overall in which Texas State plays a nationally ranked FBS team.
- The BYU game marks the second time in school history that Texas State has played a football game on ESPN. The Bobcats made their first appearance on the network in the 2020 season-opener against SMU, and that was the network's most watched game of the day. Also, the Bobcats have played four more games on other ESPN linear networks this season. Texas State hosted UTSA on ESPN2. The Bobcats will play their third game on ESPNU against Louisiana on Oct. 31 after playing ULM and South Alabama on the network earlier this season. Overall, Texas State has played six football games on ESPN2 and nine contests on ESPNU. The BYU game marks Texas State's 91st consecutive game to be televised.
- Texas State leads FBS teams with 23 first-time starters in 2020. The first-time offensive starters include linemen Dalton Cooper, Russell Baker, and Alex Costilla, tight ends Jackson Lanam and Jake Lynch, wide receivers Marcell Barbee, Drue Jackson and Chandler Speights, quarterback Brady McBride and running back Brock Sturges. The new defensive starters are: linemen Jordan Revels, Gjemar Daniels, Samuel Obiang, Jaquel Pierce, and Kingsley Onyirioha, linebackers Christian Taylor, and Sione Tupou, and safeties DeJordan Mask, Kevin Anderson, Brendon Luper, Grid Isadore, Zion Childress, and Tory Spears.
 The Bobcats have a total of 50 new players on its 2020 roster. Texas State has 21 new defensive players, 25 offensive players, and four specialists this season.
- Texas State enters the BYU game ranked 11th nationally in defensive touchdowns, 37th in turnovers gained, 28th in interceptions, and 37th in fumbles recovered. The Bobcats are ranked eighth nationally in offensive first downs and 38th in passing offense. TXST leads the nation in punt returns, and is nationally-ranked sixth in blocked kicks, and 13th in kick return defense.

HOME GAME COVERAGE

MEDIA CREDENTIALS

- Limited working media and photographer credentials for Texas State's home games are distributed through the Sports Information Office. Requests should be made by sports editors or sports directors of accredited media outlets. Requests should be made as early as possible and should be limited to working media only.
- Send credential requests to Rick Poulter, Assistant AD/Sports Information via E-Mail (rpoulter@txstate.edu).

- Media parking at Bobcat Stadium is available on a limited basis on the West side of the stadium. Additional parking is available in the lot located on Thorpe Lane behind the Track and Field Stadium. Requests for parking passes should be made well in advance to the Sports Information Office.

TEXAS STATE PRESS BOX

- The Texas State Press Box, located on the fourth level of the Jerry D. and Linda Gregg Fields West Side Complex at Bobcat Stadium, will be filled at 50 percent capacity in 2020. The press box opens three hours prior to kickoff. The working press box, coaches' booths and radio/TV booths are located

on the same level. Covid-19 symptom screenings and media credentials are required for admittance to the press box and for pregame meals.

GAME DAY SERVICES

- Pregame notes and programs are provided online. Play-by-play, team and individual statistics, along with post-game quotes and notes will be provided online as well. Game statistics are also distributed via E-Mail following the conclusion of the game. SIDELINES

- Texas State follows guidelines set forth by the NCAA Public Relations Committee, the NCAA Football Rules Committee, the Sun Belt Conference, the American Football Coaches Association, and the National Press Photographers Association.

- A total of six media photographers are permitted to shoot outside the 8-yard lines and must have wristbands visible at all times. In an effort to ensure the best possible working conditions, anyone holding a media pass who is not actively involved in coverage of the game will be asked to vacate the sidelines. Similar procedures will be in effect in the press box.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS

- Texas State holds its post-game interviews in the team meeting room located inside the Football End Zone Complex at Bobcat Stadium. Texas State head coach Jake Spavital and requested players are available approximately 10 minutes after each game. Texas State's locker room is closed following each game and practice.
- Visiting SIDs will establish media interview and locker room admittance policies for their respective teams.

ALL IN THE FAMILY

- Texas State's head coach Jake Spavital and defensive coordinator Zac Spavital are one of eight sets of brothers coaching at FBS schools in 2020. They come from a coaching family as their father, Steve, was a high school coach in Tulsa and Broken Arrow, Okla. Jake and Zac Spavital also coached together at Houston in 2009 when Jake was a graduate assistant working with Case Keenum and Zac was a cornerbacks coach. Below is a chart of brothers coaching at the same FBS school.

- Texas State head coach Jake Spavital is in his second season as a head coach and first year of calling the offensive plays at Texas State in 2020. Spavital began his head coaching career after serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Texas A&M under Kevin Sumlin, California under Sonny Dykes, and West Virginia under Dana Holgorsen.

NFL QUARTERBACKS TUTORED BY JAKE SPAVITAL

- While he was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Texas A&M, Jake Spavital coached Heisman Trophy winners Johnny Manziel and Kyler Murray. In addition, he coached NFL quarterbacks Case Keenum at Houston, Brandon Weeden at Oklahoma State, Geno Smith and Will Grier at West Virginia, Kyle Allen at Texas A&M, and Davis Webb at California.

NASTY WIDE OUTS

- Offensive coordinator Jacob Peeler comes to Texas State after producing two of the NFL's top wide receivers in the Tennessee's A. J. Brown and Seattle's D. K. Metcalf at Mississippi. Brown was a two-time All-American, Conerly Trophy winner and Biletnikoff Award semifinalist while rewriting the receiving records at Ole Miss.

Brown ended his three-year career as the school's all-time leader with 2,984 receiving yards and twelve 100-yard receiving performances in his career. Brown set single-season records with 85 catches and breaking his own mark with 1,320 receiving yards in 2018.

Peeler coined the wide receivers as "Nasty Wide Outs", a name he brought with him from California. While he was at Cal, Peeler coached freshman All-American Demetris Robertson at California. Robertson hauled in 50 catches for 767 yards and seven TDs that season.

ON THE DEFENSIVE SIDE

- Zac Spavital, is in his second season as the defensive coordinator after serving as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Texas Tech in 2018. He coached the linebackers at Texas Tech for four seasons after serving seven years as an assistant coach at Houston. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Oklahoma.

OPPORTUNISTIC DEFENSE

Throughout his career, defensive coordinator Zac Spavital has worked with defenses ranked among the top team in the nation in turnovers gained and defensive scoring.

In his final season at Houston, the Cougars ranked 19th nationally in total defense (334.6 yards per game), 11th in scoring defense (19.5) and ninth in turnovers gained (30).

Texas Tech ranked sixth nationally in forced turnovers (29), fourth in fumble recoveries (15) and eighth in defensive touchdowns (4) in 2017. He also produced All-Big XII linebackers Dakota Allen and Jordyn Brooks.

This season, Texas State enters the BYU game ranked 11th nationally in defensive touchdowns, 37th nationally in turnovers gained, and 37th in fumbles recovered.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

BALANCED OFFENSE

- Texas State enters the BYU game ranked among the Sun Belt Conference's top seven scoring, rushing and passing offenses. The Bobcats are ranked sixth in scoring offense, sixth in rushing offense, and seventh in passing offense.

350 YARDS OF OFFENSE

- Texas State enters the BYU game having accumulated over 340 yards of offense in five of its first six games.
- The Bobcats tallied 348 yards of offense at South Alabama, 357 yards on offense at Boston College, 398 yards at ULM, 472 yards versus UTSA, and 544 yards against SMU with head coach Jake Spavital calling the offensive plays.
- The only time the Bobcats have not gained 340 yards on offense was at Troy when the Bobcats accumulated just 254 total yards.
- The 544 yards of total offense against SMU were the most offensive yards by the Bobcats since they posted 547 yards against FCS member Texas Southern on Sept. 8, 2018.

A REVIVED GROUND ATTACK

- Texas State is rushing for an average of 138.5 yards per game after running for a combined 831 yards on 200 carries in its first six games.
- The Bobcats ran for 161 yards on 36 carries at Troy for their second-highest total of the season. Texas State began the season with 189 yards rushing against SMU before gaining 142 yards at ULM, 128 yards at Boston College, 123 yards rushing versus UTSA, and 88 yards at South Alabama.
- Texas State has rushed for over 100 yards in the first five games after surpassing 100 yards rushing in just three games last season.

SOARING IN THE AIR

- Texas State has one of the top six passing offenses in the Sun Belt Conference after averaging 235.7 yards passing in the first six games.
- The Bobcats threw for 260 yards at South Alabama and that is the fifth game in which Texas State has thrown for over 200 yards. The Bobcats had a season-best 349 yards passing against UTSA, 256 yards at ULM, 229 yards at Boston College, and 227 yards against SMU.

OFFENSIVE LINE NOTES

- Texas State has a mixture of four veterans with the three new starters on the offensive line in 2020.
- The two most experienced linemen are senior center Reece Jordan and junior Tait Heitmeier.
- Jordan is the most experienced offensive lineman for the Bobcats with 36 starts. He has started 31 games at center.
- Heitmeier returned to the starting lineup at right guard at ULM after missing the first two games with an injury. He has made 18 starts in his career.
- Eddie Rivas started at left guard during the last four games after making five starts in 2019. Jaydan Smith started at left guard against ULM and Boston College.
- The three new starters include redshirt freshman Dalton Cooper, and junior college transfers Russell Baker and Alex Costilla.
- Cooper is a former offensive and defensive lineman from Prague High School in Oklahoma. He played in one contest last season for the Bobcats.
- Baker is a junior college transfer from Northeastern Oklahoma A&M College and played on a Class 6A state championship team in Owasso, Okla.
- Costilla is a San Marcos native who played the last two years at Tyler Junior College and was one of the top 24 junior college recruits in Texas.

QUARTERBACK NOTES

NEW STARTING QUARTERBACK

- Texas State opened the season with a new starting quarterback for the fourth straight year when sophomore transfer Brady McBride made his first collegiate start against SMU.
- McBride made his fourth start of the season, including the last three games at Boston College, Troy, and South Alabama.
- He had his best day passing at South Alabama when he completed 28-of-40 passes for 260 yards and one touchdown against the Jaguars.
- McBride completed 19-of-29 passes for 229 yards and two touchdowns at Boston College.
- He threw for 227 yards and two touchdowns while completing 21-of-39 passes against SMU
- McBride is a sophomore transfer from Memphis who had to sit out last season. He played in three games for the Tigers before sitting out the rest of the 2018 season as a redshirt. He threw for 88 yards on 8-of-14 passing and ran for 31 yards on seven carries.

VITT RETURNS AT QB

- Tyler Vitt has started the two games against UTSA and ULM after sitting out the season opener against SMU.

- Vitt was named the Davey O'Brien Award's "Great 8" and Manning Award "Star of the Week" in Week 3 after leading Texas State to a 38-17 victory over ULM on Sept. 19.
- He completed 14-of-21 passes for 256 yards and two touchdowns and led the Bobcats with 82 yards rushing and ran for another TD at ULM.
- Since he is a "Week 3 Great 8" selection, Vitt will be placed on the Mid-Season Watch List for the Davey O'Brien Trophy.
- Vitt made his first start of the season against UTSA and threw for a career-best four touchdown passes, including the longest pass of his career with a 66-yard TD throw in the first quarter.
- He threw a pair of touchdown passes to Marcel Barbee and another TD pass to Jah'Marae Sheread against the Roadrunners, completing 26-of-40 passes for 346 yards.
- Vitt enters the BYU game responsible for seven touchdowns in his three games this season. He threw for four TDs against UTSA, while passing for two touchdowns and running for another TD at ULM.

RUNNING BACK NOTES

STURGES, HILL AND JETER FORM DYNAMIC TRIO

- Junior college transfer Brock Sturges, redshirt freshman Calvin Hill, and sophomore Jahmyl Jeter are splitting time at the running back position.
- They enter the BYU game having combined for 717 yards and seven touchdowns in Texas State's first five games.

HILL AND STURGES AMONG SUN BELT LEADERS

- Both Calvin Hill and Brock Sturges are among the top seven Sun Belt Conference leaders in total rushing yards in 2020.
- Hill enters the BYU game ranked third in the Sun Belt with 325 rushing yards and fourth in rushing touchdowns with three on 55 carries this season after rushing for 25 yards on seven carries at South Alabama.
- He recorded the first 100-yard rushing game of his career when he led the Bobcats with 100 yards on 13 carries versus SMU. He tallied for 50 yards and a TD on 10 carries against UTSA.
- Sturges ranks seventh in the Sun Belt with 251 total rushing yards and tied for fourth in the Sun Belt with four rushing touchdowns on 69 carries.
- Sturges rushed for 95 yards and a TD on 14 carries against SMU and led the Bobcats with 69 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries against UTSA. He also caught a 66-yard TD pass on Texas State's first drive against the Roadrunners.

JETER JOINS OFFENSIVE BACKFIELD

- Jeter enters the BYU game with 111 rushing yards on 16 carries in the last three games. He led the Bobcats with 31 yards on five carries at South Alabama after rushing for 44 yards and a TD on seven carries at Troy.
- Jeter had Texas State's longest run of the season with a 40-yard rush against the Trojans.
- Jeter played in his first game for the Bobcats at Boston College and rushed for 36 yards on four carries.
- A transfer from Oklahoma State, Jeter was ruled eligible to play for the Bobcats on Sept. 24.

WIDE RECEIVERS/TIGHT ENDS

HAYDEL AMONG SUN BELT LEADERS

- Senior wide receiver Jeremiah Haydel ranks seventh among Sun Belt Conference leaders with 275 receiving yards on 22 catches. He ranks 13th in the Sun Belt with 3.7 receptions per game after catching four passes for 34 yards at South Alabama.
- Haydel had season-highs of 6 catches, 152 receiving yards and two TD receptions at ULM. He had five catches against UTSA after catching four passes for 37 yards and a touchdown against SMU.

IN THE SCORING COLUMN

- Jeremiah Haydel and Marcell Barbee are tied for sixth among league leaders with four touchdowns scored.
- Haydel caught three touchdown passes and had a 91-yard punt return for a TD against UTSA. He caught two TD passes at ULM and one TD pass versus SMU. His TD catch against SMU went viral on social media with more than 2 million views.
- Barbee ranks 11th in the nation and fourth in the Sun Belt Conference with four touchdown receptions. He caught four passes for 45 yards and two touchdowns at Boston College. He recorded four receptions for 75 yards and two TDs against UTSA.
- Barbee has 16 receptions for 218 yards to rank third among team leaders. He made his first start for the Bobcats at South Alabama, and had a team-high five catches for 45 yards.

SHEREAD AMONG SUN BELT LEADERS

- Jah'Marae Sheread ranks 11th among Sun Belt leaders in receiving yards after catching 19 passes for 227 yards and one touchdown this season. Sheread had four catches for 72 yards at South Alabama, four receptions for 44 yards at ULM, four catches for 57 yards and a TD against UTSA, and four catches for 42 yards versus SMU. He also led Texas State with three receptions at Troy.

LANAM ENJOYS CAREER DAY

- Tight end Jackson Lanam led the Bobcats with five catches for 48 yards and touchdown at South Alabama.
- Lanam enters the BYU game with seven receptions for 90 yards and a TD this season. He had two catches for 42 yards against UTSA earlier this season.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

- Texas State ranks 28th nationally and third in the Sun Belt Conference with four interceptions. The Bobcats are 37th nationally and rank third in the Sun Belt with six forced turnovers. Texas State has recovered two fumbles, which ranks 37th nationally and fourth in the Sun Belt.
- The Bobcats intercepted a pass at Boston College, intercepted a pass and recovered a fumble at ULM and registered two interceptions and forced another fumble against SMU.

SECONDARY NOTES

MORRIS AMONG INTERCEPTION LEADERS

- Junior cornerback Jarron Morris enters the BYU game tied for eighth nationally and second in the Sun Belt Conference with two interceptions.
- Morris recorded one interception at both ULM and Boston College.
- He tied Texas State and Sun Belt Conference records when he returned an interception 100 yards for a touchdown at ULM.
- He ranks sixth among team leaders with 29 tackles, and is fifth on the team with 3.0 tackles for loss.
- Morris recorded six solo tackles at South Alabama. He registered eight tackles against SMU and seven versus UTSA.
- Morris forced a fumble at the goal line versus SMU and blocked a field goal attempt at Boston College.

ROGERS FORCING TURNOVERS

- Kordell Rogers returned to the starting lineup at South Alabama and registered two solo tackles.
- Rodgers is tied with Jarron Morris for the team lead with two turnovers gained after recovering a fumble and returning it 18 yards at ULM.
- Rodgers also intercepted a pass against SMU and returned it 30 yards.
- His fumble recovery at ULM ties him for ninth nationally and second among Sun Belt leaders.

ISIDORE DEBUTS WITH AN INTERCEPTION

- Grid Isidore began his Bobcat career with an interception when he intercepted a pass against SMU.
- Isadore has seven tackles this season.

NEWCOMER IN THE SECONDARY

- For the second straight season, Texas State has a freshman playing significant minutes in the defensive secondary.
- Zion Childress has 29 tackles, two pass breakups, and a fumble recovery this season.
- He had a fumble recovery against SMU and that ties him for ninth nationally and second among Sun Belt leaders.
- He tallied five tackles, assisted on a tackle for loss, and broke up a pass at South Alabama.
- Childress tallied six tackles against Boston College and SMU. He had four tackles versus Troy, ULM and UTSA.

ANDERSON ENJOYS MOST PRODUCTIVE GAME AT BC

- Kevin Anderson enters the BYU game with 23 tackles after recording 15 stops in the last three games.
- Anderson registered a career-high seven tackles at South Alabama, three tackles at Troy and five stops at Boston College.

- Anderson also had three tackles versus SMU and UTSA, and he assisted on a tackle for loss against SMU.

MASK IN THE SECONDARY

- Sophomore DeJordan Mask enters the BYU with 30 total tackles after collecting a career-high 12 stops at Troy. The 12 tackles are the highest total by a Bobcat this season.
- Mask opened the season with seven tackles versus SMU after recording just six stops in 2019.

SPEARS LEADS SECONDARY IN TACKLES

- Tory Spears leads the secondary players and ranks third among team leaders with 33 total tackles.
- Spears has tallied 23 stops in the past three games, including eight tackles at South Alabama.
- He is one of two Bobcats to record 10 tackles in a game this season with 10 stops at Boston College.

LINEBACKER NOTES

TUPOU STARTS AT ONE INSIDE LINEBACKER SPOT

- Sione Tupou, a transfer from UTEP, enters the BYU game ranked fourth among team leaders with 31 tackles this season after recording a combined 16 stops in the last three games.
- He had six tackles at Troy, sandwiched by five tackles at both Boston College and South Alabama.
- Tupou has started five of Texas State's first six games this season.
- He came off the bench to record four tackles, a forced fumble, and two quarterback hurries at ULM.
- Tupou tied for the team lead with a career-best eight tackles against UTSA.

TAYLOR STARTS AT INSIDE LINEBACKER TOO

- Texas Tech transfer Christian Taylor has started each of the first six games at Texas State's other inside linebacker position.
- Taylor has recorded 27 tackles this season after he totaled 10 stops in the last three games.
- He had four tackles at both South Alabama and Boston College. He also had four stops at ULM.
- In addition, Taylor recorded two tackles for loss at South Alabama and Boston College. He registered a sack at Boston College.
- Taylor tallied season-high seven tackles and an assisted tackle for loss against SMU, and six stops versus UTSA in his first two games for the Bobcats.

GRAHAM RETURNS AT USA

- Redshirt senior linebacker Gavin Graham enters the BYU game with 34 tackles to rank second among team leaders after recording five tackles at South Alabama.
- Graham led the Bobcats with a season-high nine tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, and 0.5 sacks at ULM.
- He tied for the team lead with eight tackles, assisted with a sack, and added 1.0 tackles for loss against UTSA.
- Graham recorded six tackles with a tackle for loss against SMU.
- He returned this season after sitting out the final nine games of the 2019 season with a knee injury.

ON THE DEFENSIVE FRONT

EZIDORE ON THE LINE

- A returning starter from 2019, Nico Ezidore is coming off the best game of his career. Ezidore led the Bobcats with career highs of nine tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss, 1.0 sacks at South Alabama.
- He leads Texas State with 35 total tackles among team leaders with 26 tackles after recording four stops at Troy.
- He tallied five tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and assisted on a sack at Boston College after he registered six tackles and assisted on a sack at ULM .
- Ezidore had a season-high seven tackles and a career-best 1.5 tackles for loss against UTSA.
- He began the season with four tackles and assisted on sack against SMU.

OBIANG STEPS INTO STARTING LINEUP

- Junior college transfer Samuel Obiang made his second straight start of the season at South Alabama and recorded two tackles.
- Obiang made his first start as a Bobcat at Troy and recorded four tackles, with two solo stops against the Trojans.
- He had a solo tackle at Boston College and recorded two stops at ULM.
- Obiang also had one stop against both SMU and UTSA after transferring to Texas State from North-eastern Oklahoma A&M.
- Obiang recorded two tackles at ULM after a total of one stop against both UTSA and SMU.

SPECIAL TEAMS

BLOCKING KICKS

- Texas State enters the BYU having blocked a kick against Boston College and Troy.
- London Harris blocked an extra-point attempt at Troy for the second blocked kick of his career. He also blocked a kick against South Alabama in 2018.
- Jarron Morris also blocked a field goal attempt at Boston College for Texas State's first blocked kick this season.

COVERING KICKOFFS

- Texas State enters the BYU leading the Sun Belt Conference in kickoff coverage after allowing a net return average of 41.7 yards per kick. The Bobcats lead the Sun Belt with 17 touchbacks.
- Jacob Bates averages 61.4 yards per kickoff with 17 touchbacks on 30 kickoffs.
- Texas State ranks 13th nationally and third in the Sun Belt Conference after surrendering 16.60 yards per kickoff.

BOBCATS LEAD IN PUNT RETURNS

- Texas State enters the BYU game leading the nation in punt returns after returning with 22.57 yards on six punt returns.
- Jeremiah Haydel is one of 10 players in the nation to return a punt for a touchdown. He has the longest punt return in the Sun Belt Conference with a 91-yard return for a touchdown against UTSA.
- Haydel's 149 yards on four punt returns also leads the Sun Belt for the most punt return yards in a game this season.

SHEREAD ON KICKOFF RETURNS

- Jah'Marae Sheread ranks 30th in the nation and fourth among Sun Belt leaders in kickoff returns with a 20.5 average on 16 returns in 2020.
- Sheread returned eight kickoffs for 179 yards in the last two games. He had four returns for 98 yards at South Alabama and four kickoff returns for 81 yards at Troy.
- He had a season-long return of 32 yards at South Alabama, and had 28-yard returns against Troy and UTSA.

KELLER MAKES DEBUT

- Redshirt sophomore Seth Keller enters the BYU game having scored a career-high eight points at South Alabama. Keller also tallied eight points at ULM. He was successful on two field goal attempts and two extra-point tries in both games.
- Keller kicked a career-long 41-yard field goal at South Alabama. He also kicked a 40-yard field goal at ULM.

O'KELLY ENJOYS A CAREER DAY

- Sophomore punter Seamus O'Kelly ranks 35th nationally and sixth in the Sun Belt Conference with an average of 40.2 yards on 33 punts.
- O'Kelly has placed eight punts inside the 20-yard line with one touchback this season.
- O'Kelly averaged a career-best 44.9 yards on seven punts at Troy after kicking four punts of 45 yards or longer. He had a career-long 65-yard boot for a touchback in the first quarter, and came back with punts of 48, 47 and 45 yards against the Trojans. His 65-yard punt is the second-long boot in the Sun Belt Conference this season.
- O'Kelly averaged 44.7 yards on three punts at South Alabama, and 44.6 yards on seven punts against UTSA.
- He had a 53-yard punt at South Alabama, and a 49-yard punt against both SMU and UTSA.

WEEKLY AWARD WINNERS

VITT EARNS MANNING AND O'BRIEN WEEKLY AWARDS

- Tyler Vitt was named a Davey O'Brien "Week 3 Great 8" selection and a Manning Award "Star of the Week" after leading Texas State to a 38-17 victory over ULM on Sept. 19.
- Vitt completed 14-of-21 passes for 256 yards and two touchdowns and led the Bobcats with 82 yards rushing and ran for another TD at ULM.
- Since he is a "Week 3 Great 8" selection, Vitt will be placed on the Mid-Season Watch List for the Davey O'Brien Trophy.

HONORABLE MENTION TYLER ROSE SELECTIONS

- Both Tyler Vitt and senior wide receiver Jeremiah Haydel were named Honorable Mention Tyler Rose selections for Week 3.
- Haydel caught six passes for 152 yards and two touchdowns at ULM. He caught a 32-yard TD pass that gave Texas State a 14-7 lead, and the Bobcats never trailed again. He also caught an 11-yard pass to set up a field goal and scored the final offensive touchdown in the game with a 75-yard catch that gave Texas State a 31-14 lead.

PRESEASON HONOR ROLL

- Athlon Sports named seven Texas State players to its 2020 Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference teams. Jarron Morris was named a Second-Team cornerback, and Caeveon Patton was on the Third-Team defensive line. Reece Jordan was a Fourth-Team offensive lineman, Nico Ezidore was a Fourth-Team defensive lineman, and Khambrail Winters was named a Fourth-Team cornerback. DeJordan Mask was a Fourth-Team kick returner.
- Jarron Morris and Seamus O'Kelly were named Dave Campbell's Texas Football All-Texas College Second-Team selections.

BOBCAT STADIUM



- Bobcat Stadium is the home field for the Texas State Bobcats. The stadium opened in 1981 and was expanded to its current 30,000-seat capacity in 2012.

- The stadium includes a Football End Zone Complex, which was built in 2002 and houses newly renovated offices, locker room and meeting areas, a full-service training center, weight room, equipment room, and offices for the football coaches and support staff. The J. Garland Warren Reception Room is located on the second floor and serves as a banquet room for Texas State Athletics. It is the site for press conferences and weekly football media updates.

- The playing surface is named Jim Wacker Field in honor of Texas State's former football coach (1979-82) and athletic director (1998-2001). Wacker's 42-8 record at Texas State is the best four-year mark in school history. He also led the Bobcats to a pair of back-to-back NCAA Division II national championships in 1981 and 1982. His 1982 team finished the season with a 14-0 record, and he was named the College Division Coach of the Year by the American Football Coaches Association. He passed away on Aug. 26, 2003, after a lengthy battle with cancer.

- In 2006, the Bill Miller Room was dedicated in honor of Bill Miller, who is a former football coach (1965-78 when he compiled a record of 86-53-3) and athletic director in 1975-92. His 86 career victories are the most wins by a Texas State head football coach. The room was initially used to host Athletic Alumni functions during home football games. The space now serves as an academic study area for the Bobcat football team.

- The Jerry D. and Linda Gregg Fields West Side Complex added new premium seating consisting of 15 luxury suites and a club seat level containing 450 seats beginning in 2009.

- The addition of a \$33 million expansion enclosing the north end zone added 13,500 general admission seats for upper and lower levels and increased the seating capacity in the Bobcat Stadium to 30,000.

- The North Side Complex also houses a Strutters Gallery, the Texas State Athletic Ticket Office, a visiting team locker room, a weight room, a training room, locker rooms, and coaching offices for Texas State's men's and women's track and field teams. Besides, the north side expansion added concession stands, restrooms, and a first aid center on the complex of the stadium.

- In the southwest corner of Bobcat Stadium is the Pavilion, which serves as a pregame and halftime hospitality area for the Bobcat Club and "T" Association on game days.

- A new playing surface was added in 2016 when Texas State became the nation's first Division I football program to install the FieldTurf Revolution 360. The new turf is equipped with "CoolPlay," which is FieldTurf's exclusive and innovative Extruded Cork Composite (ECC) top dressing that will keep the playing surface 35 degrees cooler than traditional artificial turfs. The field now features alternating shades of green every five-yards, and the state of Texas is in the design of the turf just outside of the south end zone behind the goalpost. The end zones are in Texas State maroon with Texas State, lettered in gold with white outline.



JAKE SPAVITAL

HEAD COACH

Second Season at Texas State
Missouri State, 2008

Jake Spavital is taking on a new role in his second year as the head coach at Texas State. The second-youngest head coach in the Football Bowl Subdivision, Spavital returns to calling offensive plays in 2020 after overseeing some of the nation's most prolific offenses as an offensive coordinator at Texas A&M, Cal, and West Virginia. Spavital took the reins at Texas State on Nov. 30, 2018, but did not call plays. He is Texas State's 20th head coach since the program began in 1904.

AT WEST VIRGINIA

Spavital came to Texas State after serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under head coach Dana Holgorsen at West Virginia from 2017-18. During his tenure with the Mountaineers, West Virginia featured one of the most potent offenses in all of college football.

In 2018, West Virginia featured one of the nation's top eight offenses that eclipsed 500 yards and 40 points eight times. The Mountaineer offense produced a finalist for the Heisman Trophy, a Second-Team All-America offensive lineman, a Second-Team All-America wide receiver, and four NFL Draft selections.

West Virginia ranked No. 3 in passing offense, No. 4 in passing efficiency, No. 3 in total offense and fourth-down conversions, No. 9 in scoring offense, No. 12 in completion percentage and passing yards per completion, and No. 25 in third-down conversions.

The Mountaineers accumulated 5,724 yards, including 3,939 passing yards and 38 touchdowns. West Virginia ended the regular season ranked No. 15 in the AP poll and No. 16 in the coaches' poll after spending the entire season nationally ranked for the first time since 2007.

Quarterback Will Grier was selected by the Carolina Panthers in the third round of the 2019 NFL Draft, becoming the eighth quarterback under Spavital's tutelage to be drafted or to play in the NFL. The others included Case Keenum, Brandon Weeden, Geno Smith, Johnny Manziel, Kyler Murray, Kyle Allen, and Davis Webb.

Grier finished fourth in the Heisman balloting and was a finalist for the Maxwell Award, the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, the Senior Class Award, and the Manning Award. He was a Second-Team All-Big 12 selection behind Heisman Trophy winner Kyler Murray after completing 67 percent of his 3,974 passes for 3,864 yards and 37 touchdowns with just eight interceptions in 11 games in 2018.

Offensive lineman Yodny Cajuste was taken in the third round by New England. He was named a Football Writers Second-Team All-American and Big 12 Co-Offensive Lineman of the Year after playing 776 snaps as the key blocker in the Mountaineer offense in 2018.

The Seattle Seahawks chose wide receiver Gary Jennings in the fourth round after he caught 54 passes for 917 yards and 13 touchdowns to earn Honorable Mention All-Big 12 honors in 2018. As a junior, Jennings tallied a team-best 97 receptions for 1,096 yards. He ended his collegiate career with 168 catches for 2,294 yards and 17 touchdowns.

Tight end Trevon Wesco was selected by the New York Jets in the fourth round after being named a First-Team All-Big 12 selection as a senior. He registered 26 catches for 366 yards and a touchdown and developed into one of the best blocking tight ends in the country.

West Virginia ranked among the nation's top 20 offenses in 2017 when Spavital returned to Morgantown. The Mountaineers ranked No. 13 in passing offense, No. 16 in passing efficiency, and No. 20 in total offense. West Virginia ranked No. 3 in fourth-down conversion percentage, No. 8 in fewest tackles for loss allowed, and No. 25 in first downs, fewest sacks, and passing yards per completion.

David Sills V was a two-time All-Big 12 performer and an AFCA and Walter Camp Second-Team All-American before signing with the Buffalo Bills as a free agent. He caught 65 passes for 986 yards and 15 touchdowns in 2018. Sills was a

finalist for the 2017 Biletnikoff Award after recording 60 receptions for 980 yards and 18 touchdowns for the Mountaineers.

Grier was a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award and Big 12 Newcomer of the Year after throwing for 3,490 yards and 34 touchdowns. A broken finger on Grier's passing hand during the Texas game ended his season.

AT CALIFORNIA

Spavital returned to Morgantown after serving as the interim head coach at Cal in January 2017. He was the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for one of the nation's top 10 offenses during the 2016 season. The Golden Bears were ranked No. 4 in passing offense (358.8 yards per game), No. 8 in first down offense (335), No. 10 in total offense (518.3 yards per game), and No. 22 in scoring offense (37.1 points per game).

Cal established single-season school records for pass completions (383), fewest fumbles lost (3), and fewest turnovers (15), while equalling a school mark for most field goals made (22). The Golden Bears set NCAA FBS single-game re-

cords with 118 plays and 40 first downs in a 52-49 double-overtime win over Oregon.

Quarterback Davis Webb was named Athlon's Pac-12 Newcomer of the Year, a semifinalist for the Davey O'Brien Award and a semifinalist for the Earl Campbell Tyler Rose Award. He completed 382-of-620 passes for 4,295 yards and 37 touchdowns that season. He ranked No. 3 nationally in completions and points responsible for, No. 4 in total yards, No. 5 in passing yards, and No. 8 in passing touchdowns.

The offense also produced Freshman All-American wide receiver Demetris Robertson after he caught 50 passes for 767 yards and set school freshman records. Chad Hanson was a First-Team All-Pac-12 selection after ranking second nationally with 124.9 receiving yards per game and seventh with 92 receptions.

AT TEXAS A&M

Spavital went to Cal after spending three years as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Texas A&M from 2013-15. He shared play-calling duties during the 2013 season before earning full responsibility from 2014-15. The Aggies enjoyed a 25-14 record during Spavital's three-year stint, including 8-5 marks in his final two years as the offensive coordinator.

In 2015, Texas A&M had a 1,000-yard rusher and 1,000-yard receiver in the same season for the fourth time in school history.

Tra Carson rushed for 1,165 yards, and Christian Kirk had 80 receptions for 1,009 yards and seven touchdowns.

In 2014, the Aggies led the Southeastern Conference and ranked No. 7 in the nation with 39 passing touchdowns and were No. 12 nationally in passing offense with 305.5 yards per game. Texas A&M posted upsets at No. 9, South Carolina (52-29), and No. 3 Auburn (41-38) in 2014.

In 2013, the Aggies set single-season SEC and school records with 4,593 passing yards and had 6,999 total yards of offense to rank No. 2 in the SEC and Texas A&M history, No. 4 nationally in total offense (538.4), and No. 7 in passing offense (353.3).

The Aggies broke the school record for completion percentage by connecting on 69.3 percent of their passes and finished No. 3 in SEC history.

Quarterback Johnny Manziel threw 37 touchdown passes, tying him for No. 4 in the nation, while passing for 4,114 yards, ranking No. 8 nationally.

AT WEST VIRGINIA

From 2011-12, Spavital was the quarterbacks' coach at West Virginia and spent two seasons tutoring Heisman Trophy candidate Geno Smith, who racked up 11,662 passing yards and 98 touchdowns in his career. The Mountaineers ranked No. 9 nationally in passing efficiency (161.97) and scoring offense (39.5 points per game), No. 10 in passing offense (330.2 yards per game), and total offense (502.0 yards per game). Smith was No. 5 nationally in passing yards (4,205), passing yards per game (323.5 yards per game) and No. 6 in passing efficiency (163.86).

In his first season at West Virginia, Spavital helped lead the Mountaineers to a 10-3 overall record and a win over Clemson in the 2012 Orange Bowl. West

Virginia ranked No. 6 nationally in passing offense (346.9 yards per game) and was No. 13 in scoring offense (37.6 points per game), No. 15 in total offense (469.5 yards per game), and No. 19 in passing efficiency. That year, Smith became the first 4,000-yard passer in West Virginia history when he threw for 4,385 yards. He was responsible for 33 touchdowns (31 passing, two rushing) to set another school record.

AT OKLAHOMA STATE

Spavital spent the 2010 season as an offensive graduate assistant at Oklahoma State. There, he helped mentor future NFL quarterback Brandon Weeden. Weeden was a finalist for the Manning Award after earning First-Team All-Big 12 and First-Team Academic All-Big 12 honors that season. He was on the mid-season watch lists for the Maxwell Award and Davey O'Brien Award after throwing for 4,277 yards and 34 touchdowns. He ranked third nationally in passing yards and passing yards per game, fifth in total offense, and sixth in passing touchdowns.

AT HOUSTON

He went to Oklahoma State after serving as an offensive graduate assistant coach at Houston in 2009, where he worked with Case Keenum, who finished the season with over 5,800 yards in total offense and was a Sammy Baugh Award recipient. Keenum was a finalist for the Manning and O'Brien awards and the Conference USA MVP and Offensive MVP after completing 492-of-700 passes for 5,671 yards and 44 touchdowns.

AT TULSA

Spavital began his coaching career as an offensive quality control assistant under head coach Gus Malzahn in 2008. That year, Tulsa was the No. 1 ranked offense in the Football Bowl Subdivision and boasted an 11-4 record and a victory over Ball State in the GMAC Bowl.

PLAYING CAREER

A native of Tulsa, Okla., Spavital was a two-year letterman as a quarterback and punter at Missouri State from 2004-07. He earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 2008.

Spavital was a Consensus First-Team All-State quarterback at Tulsa's Union High School, posting a 26-1 career record and leading Union to the Class 6A state championship in 2002. He was selected to play in the 2004 Texas vs. Oklahoma Oil Bowl All-Star game.

PERSONAL

Spavital is married to the former Meghan Morris, one of the top gymnasts in West Virginia history. They have a daughter, Madison Grace, and a son, Landyn Zachary.

His father, Steve, is a former high school football coach, while his brother, Zac, is the defensive coordinator at Texas State.
