## TIGERS SET TO FACE BYU ON THE ROAD

The TSU Tigers basketball team will take on BYU this weekend as they conclude non-conference play on the road. Since becoming the head coach at Texas Southern Mike Davis has captured five championships and in 2014 he led the Tigers to the NCAA Tournament marking the programs first appearance in the Big Dance in over a decade. No stranger to championship success in 2002 Davis led Indiana to the NCAA Title game. This years team is headlined by SWAC Freshman of the Year Trae Jefferson. During the offseason Texas Southern also added several quality players to a roster that should be built for success in and out of conference play. Texas Southern will play its first 13 games of the season on the road.

## JEFFERSON NAMED WEEK ONE SWAC PLAYER OF THE WEEK

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – The Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) has recognized Texas Southern guard Demontrae Jefferson as the SWAC Men's Basketball Player of the Week for his outstanding performance during week one of the regular season.

Jefferson averaged 21 points per game to go along with 3.5 assists, and one steal as the Tigers fell to Gonzaga and Washington State on the road to open the season.

He also shot a combined 7-of-14 from 3-point range in the two games.

The sophomore guard scored 22 points with six assists with two steals at Washington State on Sunday.

## LAST OUTING

FORT WORTH, Texas- Texas Southern's Demontrae Jefferson poured in a game high and season high 29 points on Monday but it wasn't enough to get TSU past #15 TCU as the Tigers fell by a score of 91-72.

The Tigers kept things close in the first half as they trailed TCU at the break by only two points (41-39).

Trayvon Reed and Robert Lewis each contributed 14 points in the contest and their scoring was a big factor in what was a highly competitive first half.

In the second half the Tigers were outscored 50-33 as JD Miller helped lead the charge for the Horned Frogs as he contributed 20 points.

Texas Southern shot 44.3 percent from the field on Monday while limiting TCU to shooting 43.6 percent. TSU scored 16 points in transition but allowed TCU to score 27 second chance points offensively.

Individually TSU guard Jefferson has been scoring at an extremely high level this season as he currently ranks 12<sup>th</sup> in the NCAA in points per game (23.4 ppg) while also leading the Southwestern Athletic Conference.

He is ranked 3<sup>rd</sup> in the league in assists per game (3.7 apg) and is the only player in the SWAC to average 20 plus points per game.

Texas Southern closes out non-conference play this weekend on the road at BYU.

## WYOMING 72, TSU 66

LARAMIE, Wyoming- The Texas Southern Tigers took a five point lead into halftime at 35-30 but they were unable to keep the momentum in the second half as they fell to Wyoming 72-66 on the road.

Demontrae Jefferson tallied a game high 27 points as he shot 9-of-20 from the field. Donte Clark and Robert Lewis added 11 and 10 points respectively.

TSU was outscored 42-31 in the second half as they shot 36 percent from the field while limiting Wyoming to shooting 38 percent.

Texas Southern will now get set to face TCU on Monday, December 18 at 7:00 pm.

## BU 99, TSU 68

WACO, Texas – Despite 24 points from Demontrae Jefferson, the Tigers fell on the road at the Ferrell Center on Thursday night against No. 21 Baylor by a score of 99-68.

Nuni Omot and Manu Lecomte scored 22 points apiece to lead the Bears who shot 66 percent from the floor as a team.

The Tigers trailed 43-32 at halftime and could not get any closer for the remainder of the game.

Center Trayvon Reed had 12 points and five rebounds and Donte Clark added 10 points and four assists for Texas Southern.

## OU 74, TSU 68

EUGENE, Oregon – Texas Southern dropped a 74-68 decision to the Oregon Ducks on Monday. TSU trailed 32-31 at halftime keeping the score close throughout the games' first half.

The Tigers trailed 65-64 with 3:32 remaining in the game, but that's as close as they would get as the Ducks outscored Texas Southern 9-4 in the closing minutes to survive.

Four players scored in double digits for the

Tigers including Donte Clark (17), Demontrae Jefferson (16), Derrick Bruce (12), and Lamont Walker (10).

The Tigers will travel to face the Baylor Bears on Thursday as they get set to compete in the last four games of non-conference play for the 2017-18 season.

## TOLEDO 71, TSU 69

TOLEDO, Ohio- The Texas Southern Tigers jumped out to a 19 point lead over Toledo in the first half but TSU was unable to keep the momentum going in the second half as they dropped a 71-69 decision to the Rockets on the road.

Texas Southern led 42-30 going into intermission but it was a tale of two halves as the Toledo Rockets began to connect on key shots in the games' final stanza while also making some critical stops.

After the Rockets converted 1-of-2 free throws with eight seconds remaining in regulation Texas Southern had one last possession to either tie or win the game. But a three point attempt by Brian Carey as time expired fell short sealing the win in favor of Toledo.

Donte Clark went 8-of-20 from the field for a team high 27 points while teammate Demontrae Jefferson connected on 8-of-25 shot attempts as he contributed 25 points for the Tigers offensively.

Clark missed out on a double-double by one rebound as he tallied nine boards to go along with three assists, one block, and one steal in what was an all-around performance for the transfer guard.

The Tigers will have over a week off before they take the court again as their next outing is slated to take place on Monday, Dec. 11 on the road at Oregon.

## OAKLAND 97, TSU 87

OAKLAND, Michigan- The Texas Southern Tigers placed a total of four players in double figures highlighted by Demontrae Jefferson's 25 points (11-of-21) along with fellow teammate Donte Clark's 24 points (8-of-23) in a 97-87 road loss to the Oakland Grizzlies.

The Tigers trailed going into halftime 46-40. The back and forth contest included nine lead changes along five times in which the score was tied.

Texas Southern scored a total of 40 points inside the paint as center Trayvon Reed posted a double-double racking up 14 points and 11 rebounds.

The Tigers will now get set to travel to face the Toledo Rockets on the road Saturday.

#### **CU 84, TSU 77**

HOUSTON- Texas Southern placed a total of five players in double figures but it wasn't quite enough as the upset minded Tigers fell to Clemson by a score of 84-77 on the road.

Demontrae Jefferson led all TSU scorers with 22 points, followed by Kevin Scott (14), and Derrick Bruce (12).

The Tigers trailed 40-36 at halftime and were only outscored 44-41 in the second half but Clemson was able to make several runs in the second half which continued to push their leads to double digits.

Texas Southern will have a few days off before its next game on the road versus Oakland on Nov. 30<sup>th</sup>.

#### **KU 114, TSU 71**

LAWRENCE, Kansas- Trayvon Reed notched a double-double as he contributed 19 points and 14 rebounds but it wasn't enough as the Texas Southern Tigers dropped a 114-71 decision to the #3 Kansas Jayhawks on the road.

Demontrae Jefferson returned to the Tigers starting lineup on Tuesday as he shot 9-of-22 from the field including a 6-of-13 showing from beyond the arc for a total of 24 points to lead the team in points scored.

TSU trailed 66-30 at the break as the Jayhawks shot extremely efficiently from the field in the first half going 23-of-39 (59 percent) which helped them take control of the game early.

In the second half of play TSU was only

outscored 48-41. The Tigers shot 36 percent (26-of-71) from the field for the game while shooting 37 percent (12-of-32) from three point range.

Texas Southern will now get set to travel and face Clemson next as they continue non-conference play.

SYRACUSE, N.Y. – All starting five members of the Tigers reached double digits in scoring but it wasn't enough as Texas Southern fell at the Carrier Dome 80-67 to Syracuse.

Donte Clark scored a team-high 20 points, Robert Lewis contributed with 13 points while Trayvon Reed added 12 points and eight rebounds.

Kevin Scott had 11 points, seven rebounds, seven assists and two steals and Derrick Bruce finished with 10 points for TSU.

The Orange received 21 points from Tyus Battle and four others reached double figures in scoring as Syracuse shot 50 percent from the floor in the second half which helped them pull away from the Tigers. Texas Southern will now get set to travel and face the Kansas Jayhawks on Tuesday, Nov. 21.

#### **OSU 82, TSU 64**

COLUMBUS, Ohio- Texas Southern cut a double-digit deficit to two points at 59-57 with under seven minutes left to play but it wasn't enough to pull off the upset over Ohio State as the Buckeyes prevailed 82-64 after closing out the game on a strong note offensively.

Texas Southern was led in scoring by Donte Clark who tallied 17 points and seven rebounds to go along with four assists and one steal.

Trayvon Reed and Derrick Bruce added 14 points a piece while fellow teammate Robert Lewis contributed 11 points.

OSU led 42-29 at halftime as they shot 46.2 percent from the field for the game. Texas Southern shot 41.5 percent from the floor while collectively going 14-of-15 from the free throw line.

The Tigers will travel to face Syracuse on

Saturday, Nov. 18 as TSU continues non-conference play on the road.

#### **WSU 86, TSU 84**

PULLMAN, Washington- The Texas Southern Tigers nearly pulled off yet another signature Mike Davis non-conference upset as they lost a nail-biter to Washington State of the PAC-12 falling 86-84 in overtime.

Donte Clark and Demontrae Jefferson each contributed 22 points in the contest to lead the team as they both played well offensively.

Texas Southern led 42-24 at halftime before WSU stormed back in the second half outscoring TSU 48-30 to force overtime.

Washington State tallied 14 points in overtime while the Tigers posted 12 points which ended up being enough for Washington State to hold on for the victory.

Texas Southern travels to face Ohio State the next time the Tigers take the floor.

#### **TSU ENTERS 2017-18 CAMPAIGN WITH THIRD LONGEST HOME GAME WIN STREAK**

Entering the 2017-18 campaign the Texas Southern Tigers Men's Basketball program currently has the third longest active NCAA home game winning streak in Division I.

**Streak:** 23 games

**Last loss:** Feb. 7, 2015

**Opponent:** Prairie View A&M, 58-55

Texas Southern's road record in the last three seasons is 29-34, so how could the Tigers possibly have the third-longest active home winning streak in college basketball? Texas Southern schedules one of the most ambitious non-conference schedules around.

Last season, the Tigers' non-league schedule included Arizona, Louisville, Cincinnati, LSU, TCU, and Baylor, and they didn't play a home game until Jan. 14. The experience has paid off in conference play. The Tigers have won the SWAC in each of the last three seasons. They've been perfect at home over the last two years.

## **TIGERS TABBED TO WIN SWAC IN PRESEASON POLL**

Texas Southern has been picked to repeat as the Southwestern Athletic Conference Men's Basketball Champions in a Preseason Poll of the league's Head Coaches and Sports Information Directors.

The announcement was made by the SWAC during its annual media teleconference on Wednesday, October 11.

The Tigers finished 2016-17 with an overall record of 23-12, a record with five more victories than the previous season, to go along with a 16-2 conference mark, a record they matched from the previous year.

TSU wrapped up last season as the season's conference tournament champions for the third time in the last four seasons after defeating Alcorn State 53-50.

Texas Southern's Demontrae Jefferson and Kevin Scott were each selected to the All-SWAC Preseason First Team at guard and forward respectively.

Jefferson was sixth in the conference in scoring with 14.8 points per contest, fourth in assists (3.3 per game) and 13th in 3-pointers made (1.4 per game).

Scott averaged 10.0 points per game (23rd) to go along with 4.9 rebounds per game (11th) and was 10th in field goal percentage (.442) and 10th in steals (1.3 per game).

The second team includes TSU forward Lamont Walker who saw action for the Tigers last season in a reserve capacity.

The year before that TSU knocked off Temple 90-89 (12/18/13). This season the Tigers have posted road wins over Rice, La Salle, and James Madison.

### **TIGERS RELEASE 2017-18 SCHEDULE**

The Texas Southern Tigers have released their full 2017-18 basketball schedule. The Tigers will open the season Nov. 11 against Gonzaga at McCarthey Athletic Center in Spokane, Wash.

This season the Tigers will play a total of nine home games at the Health and Physical Education Arena, highlighted by conference games against Prairie View A&M (Jan. 6), and Southern University (Jan. 1). The Tigers game versus the Southern Jaguars will be broadcast live on ESPNU.

Last year, the Tigers won the Southwestern Athletic Conference (SWAC) Regular Season title for the third year in a row, and were crowned the SWAC Tournament champions, subsequently making their 7th NCAA tournament appearance in school history.

The Tigers will look to repeat this season, with this year's SWAC tournament being once again hosted in Houston with the event now moving to the Delmar Center.

### **TSU'S HUGHES SELECTED FOR INDUCTION IN HALL OF FAME**

The Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame announced the 11 members of the Class of 2017 to be honored September 7-9, 2017 during this year's Enshrinement festivities in Springfield, Massachusetts. The Class Announcement was made in Glendale, Arizona the site of the 2017 NCAA Men's Final Four, and televised live on ESPN2.

This year's class includes the all-time winningest boys high school coach and legendary Texas Southern University alumni Robert Hughes (pictured above far left), WNBA icon and ESPN Analyst Rebecca Lobo, two-time NBA scoring champion Tracy McGrady, three-time Consensus National College Coach of the Year from Notre Dame Muffet McGraw, and two-time

AP College Coach of the Year Bill Self.

Distinguished committees focused on preserving all areas from the game also selected six directly elected members. They include George McGinnis from the Veterans Committee, Nick Galis from the International Committee, Zack Clayton from the Early African American Pioneers Committee, and Mannie Jackson, Tom Jernstedt and Jerry Krause from the Contributor Committee.

"In the Class of 2017, we are recognizing eleven outstanding members of the basketball community who have each uniquely impacted the basketball landscape as we know it today," said John L. Doleva, President and CEO of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. "As coaches, players, contributors and role models, we thank them for their contributions to the sport and look forward to honoring them during Enshrinement this September."

To be elected, North American and Women's Committee finalists must receive 18 of 24 votes from the Honors Committee for election into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Direct elect committees are incorporated into the election process to maintain a strong focus on keeping history on the forefront of the voting procedures and to preserve a balance between two eras of basketball.

The Class of 2017 will be enshrined on Friday, September 8 in Springfield, Massachusetts, the birthplace of basketball and home of the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. ## Head Coach Mike Davis

Texas Southern University announced the appointment of Mike Davis to the position of Head Men's Basketball Coach on October 27, 2012. Davis arrived to TSU after spending six seasons at the helm of the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) men's basketball program.

In 2014, 2015, and 2017 Davis led the Tigers to a SWAC Tournament Championship titles as TSU defeated Prairie View A&M, Southern, and Alcorn State respectively. The Tigers advanced to the 2014 NCAA Tournament where they went on to face Cal-Poly in the First Four.

In 2015 they face Arizona as a #15 seed in the first of the Big Dance and in 2016 they garnered a #16 seed where they drew North Carolina in the first round. In 2017 TSU played against the eventual 2017 NCAA Champions the North Carolina Tar Heels.

Davis was instrumental in the development of 2014 SWAC Player of the Year Aaric Murray. Murray was also named the 2014 SWAC Tournament MVP as he led the conference in scoring (21.3), blocked shots (2.5), and shot 49 percent from the field. In 2015 he helped guide Madarious Gibbs to POY honors as well. In 2016 and 2017 Derrick Griffin and Zach Lofton were named SWAC Player of the Year respectively marking five straight years a Texas Southern player was tabbed with such honors which is a SWAC record for a member institution.

In his first season at Texas Southern Davis led the Tigers' basketball program to a 2012-13 Southwestern Athletic Conference regular season championship. TSU reeled off 12 consecutive wins to conclude the season with a 16-2 mark in conference play. Davis also eclipsed the 250 career wins mark during the Tigers 2012-13 campaign.

Under the coaching guidance of Davis Texas Southern has had multiple players named to the All-SWAC team highlighted by senior guard Omar Strong being named the 2012-13 SWAC Player of the Year his first season. Fred Sturdivant was selected as the 2012-13 SWAC Defensive Player of the Year after leading the league in blocked shots.

Through five seasons with the Blazers, Davis owned an impressive record of 122-72 (.629) overall with a 62-34 mark in Conference USA play during his six years in Birmingham. Davis holds a 237-151 (.608) overall career record in his 12 years as a head coach highlighted by seven 20+ win seasons.

Davis also led his teams to success off the court and in the classroom, as the Blazers achieved a team GPA of 3.0 during the 2010 fall semester. Additionally, the squad also had four consecutive semesters of a perfect 1000 APR score while Davis was at the helm of the program.

Davis had a highly successful season at UAB in 2010-11, as he guided the Blazers to the program's first-ever Conference USA regular season title. In doing so, he was named the 2011 Conference USA Coach of the Year, while also earning NABC All-District Coach of the Year accolades.

In 2010-11 Davis also guided the Blazers to an NCAA Tournament at-large berth with a record of 22-9 and a 12-4 mark in league play. UAB earned at least 20 victories in the regular season in four-straight years under Davis tenure (2007-2012), marking the first time that feat had been achieved in program history. The Blazers also won at least 11 conference games in each of those seasons.

Under Davis the program clinched four consecutive postseason berths (three NITs and one NCAA Tournament). Davis subsequently etched his name in the record books as he became only the second coach in UAB history to reach 90 wins in a four-year span. The only other coach in program history to accomplish the feat was Hall of Famer Gene Bartow, who reached the pinnacle with a school record 94 from 1983-87.

The Fayette, Ala., native arrived at UAB from Indiana University, where he served as the head coach of the Indiana Hoosiers from 2000-06. While there, he compiled a 115-79 record. Davis teams played some of their best basketball during the postseason, evidenced by Davis' 21-12 record in the month of March and his 7-4 NCAA Tournament mark, including a run to the NCAA Championship game in 2002.

Under Davis, the Hoosiers enjoyed considerable success, including a trip to the 2002 national championship game against Maryland. Named the 25th head coach in Indiana history on Sept. 12, 2000, Davis had the most successful first season of any of his 24 predecessors. His 21 wins were four more than any other first-year IU head coach. His success was not limited to just IU, as his 21 victories ranked him second among first-year head coaches in the country in 2000-01.

Prior to being named head coach Davis had already contributed significantly to the Indiana program. He spent the previous three seasons as an assistant coach with the Hoosiers. His successful recruitment of several of the country's top prep players earned him national recognition at Indiana.

In addition to his recruiting success, he was instrumental in the development of several players including A.J. Guyton, the Big Ten's Most Valuable Player in 2000, Kirk Haston, a first-round NBA selection in 2001, and 2002 Big Ten MVP and consensus second-team All-American Jared Jeffries, who was the 11th overall pick of the 2002 NBA Draft by the Washington Wizards.

In Davis' three seasons as an IU assistant, the Hoosiers compiled a 63-32 overall record and advanced to the NCAA Tournament all three seasons. Davis came to Indiana after a two-year stint (1995-97) as an assistant coach under David Hobbs at the University of Alabama. The 1995-96 Crimson Tide basketball team posted a 23-10 record and advanced to the NIT Final Four. Davis' coaching tenure with Alabama marked his return to the Crimson Tide.

Davis spent his collegiate-playing career with the Tide after earning the state's Mr. Basketball honor and All-America status in 1979. He was a standout for four seasons at Alabama and finished his career in the Top 25 on the Crimson Tide's all-time scoring list with 1,211 points. In his first season, he played for the legendary C.M. Newton and then spent his final three years playing under another coaching legend, Wimp Sanderson. Davis averaged 10.1 points per game for his career and ranks third all-time on the school's steals list with 165. During his four seasons at Alabama, the Crimson Tide posted an 80-42 record and advanced to two NIT and two NCAA Tournaments.
