## BYU STORYLINES

- BYU enters the 2017-18 season riding streaks of 12-straight 20-wins seasons and 12-straight trips to the postseason. Last season the Cougars won 22 games and received an at-large bid to the NIT. During the last 12 seasons, BYU has received eight at-large bids to the NCAA tournament and four to the NIT.
- Sophomores Yoeli Childs and TJ Haws were named to the 2017-18 All-WCC Preseason Men's Basketball Team, as voted on by the league's coaches. Both Childs and Haws were named to the All-WCC Freshman Team in 2016-17 while Haws earned All-WCC First Team honors.
- BYU coach Dave Rose welcomes the return of four players from LDS missions, including junior Luke Worthington and sophomores Ryan Andrus, Dalton Nixon and Zac Seljaas.

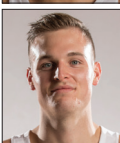

**BY THE NUMBERS**

- 1** BYU's 79-71 win at No. 1 Gonzaga on Feb. 25 was the first win in program history against a No. 1 ranked team. Eric Mika led the way with 29 points and 11 rebounds while TJ Haws added 17 points and Elijah Bryant scored 14.
- 2** The number of first-team All-WCC honorees for BYU in TJ Haws and Eric Mika. The Cougars have had two players on the All-WCC First Team in all six seasons BYU has been in the league
- 3** Sophomore Yoeli Childs posted double-doubles in each of BYU's three exhibition games. He opened exhibition play with 17 points and 19 rebounds at New Mexico. In BYU's two home exhibition contests, he had 25 and 14 vs. Westminster and 11 and 17 vs. Colorado College. Overall he averaged 17.7 points, 16.7 rebounds and 2.3 blocks while shooting 71.0 percent from the field.
- 12** The number of consecutive seasons BYU has won at least 20 games. BYU has also reached the postseason in 12-straight seasons. Both streaks are program records.
- 25** Dave Rose reached 300 wins in his 407th career game on Feb. 4. He is tied with Bob Knight and John Thompson for 25th fastest to 300 career wins in NCAA history.
- 50** Nick Emery became the 50th player in BYU history to score 1,000 career points. He reached the mark in a 89-81 win over LMU in the WCC Championships on March 4, 2017.
- 305** Dave Rose (2005 to present) is second all-time in BYU basketball history with 305 career victories, behind only the great Stan Watts, who coached the Cougars to 371 wins from 1949 to 1972 and was inducted into the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame in 1986.

**THE BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME: HOOPHALL AWARDS**

BYU sophomore guard TJ Haws is a preseason candidate for the 2018 Jeff West Shooting Guard of the Year Award, presented by the Naismith Memorial Basketball Hall of Fame. Haws earned first-team All-WCC honors in 2016-17 while averaging 13.8 points, 2.9 rebounds, 3.2 assists and 1.0 steal. The Alpine, Utah, native also hit a team-high 76 3-pointers, second all-time among BYU freshmen.

**LAST TIME OUT – EXHIBITION RECAPS**

**BYU DEFEATS NEW MEXICO IN CHARITY EXHIBITION**

ALBUQUERQUE, New Mexico – Led by a double-double from sophomore Yoeli Childs, BYU men's basketball earned a hard-fought 79-73 charity exhibition win against New Mexico Friday night in Dreamstyle Arena. All proceeds from the exhibition will go to the Hurricane Harvey Relief Fund to aid in the recovery from flooding in Houston and the surrounding area.

Yoeli Childs posted 17 points, 19 rebounds and four blocks while TJ Haws (14 points), Elijah Bryant (13) and Luke Worthington (12) also scored in double figures. Haws added a game-high six assists to go with seven rebounds while Bryant grabbed eight boards.

Jahshire Hardnett and Dalton Nixon provided a needed spark off the bench combining for 17 points on 6 of 9 shooting. Hardnett had nine points, three assists and two steals while Nixon totaled eight points and two rebounds.

As a team, the Cougars out-shot New Mexico 51.9 percent to 37.1. BYU also won the rebound battle, 48-33.

**COUGARS TOP WESTMINSTER 76-62 IN EXHIBITION**

PROVO, Utah – Yoeli Childs and Elijah Bryant led the BYU men's basketball team to a 76-62 win over Westminster in the second exhibition game of the season.

In the win, Childs posted another double-double with 25 points and 14 rebounds, missing only two shots on the night. Childs also had a double-double vs. New Mexico with 17 points and 19 rebounds. Bryant contributed 17 points and six rebounds while TJ Haws and Dalton Nixon combined for 16 points.

Childs led the way from the beginning, scoring the first six points of the game and giving BYU an early 12-4 lead. Ten minutes into the game Childs had 13 points and five rebounds, including two dunks.

Through a team effort where nine different players scored, the Cougars went on a 20-3 run to earn a dominant 22-point lead with 4:55 left in the half.

**BYU DOMINATES COLORADO COLLEGE, 95-35**

PROVO, Utah – Five Cougars scored in double figures as BYU men's basketball dominated Colorado College in a 95-35 victory Wednesday night at the Marriott Center.

Zac Seljaas led all scorers with 19 points and hit 6 of 9 3-pointers. TJ Haws and Elijah Bryant added 13 and 12 points, respectively, while Yoeli Childs and Jahshire Hardnett had 11 apiece. Childs also pulled down 17 rebounds.

The Cougars out-rebounded the Tigers 55-24 while out-shooting 52 percent to 24 percent from the field. After missing its first six shots, BYU scored nine unanswered points and took an early 12-3 lead on four-consecutive 3-pointers from TJ Haws, Zac Seljaas and Elijah Bryant.

Strong 3-point shooting enabled the Cougars to build a comfortable lead, taking a 34-point advantage at half-time, 48-14. BYU hit nine first-half 3-pointers, including three from both Haws and Seljaas as well as one from Bryant, Hardnett and Dalton Nixon.

**NOTES AND STORYLINES**

**Freshman 3-point field goals**

BYU's 2016-17 roster includes the players who hold the top three spots for 3-point field goals by a freshman. Nick Emery and Zac Seljaas both smashed the previous record of 44 in 2015-16. Emery hit 97 3-pointers for the current freshman record and fourth most in a season in BYU history, while Seljaas hit 68. Last season, Haws hit a team-high 76 3-pointers for second most by a Cougar freshman.

**Super Sophomores**

BYU's 2017-18 roster includes three players who etched their names in the BYU record book during the freshman seasons. Yoeli Childs and TJ Haws were freshmen in 2016-17 while Zac Seljaas was a rookie in 2015-16. All three are back this season, looking to build on their record-setting freshman campaigns. Childs finished his freshman year first all-time among BYU freshmen in rebounds and second in rebounds per game, blocks, blocks per game and field goal percentage.

Haws concluded his first year second all-time among BYU freshmen in 3-point field goals, fourth in points scored, fifth in assists, tied for first in games started and third in double figure scoring games. Seljaas finished the 2015-16 season first all-time among BYU freshmen in 3-point field goal percentage, second in 3-point field goals, second in 3-point field goals per game, second in games with 3-plus 3-point field goals and tied for second most games with 5-plus 3-pointers.

**All-Haws Team**

TJ Haws earned first-team All-WCC honors as a freshman in 2016-17, becoming the third Haws in BYU history to earn all-league honors. His father Marty Haws earned first-team All-WAC honors as a senior in 1989-90 and his brother Tyler was a four-time all-league honoree. As a freshman in 2009-10, Tyler was named to the All-Mountain West Conference Third Team. Following a two-year mission for the LDS Church, Tyler earned first-team honors as a sophomore, junior and senior. In addition to joining his father and brother as an all-conference performer, TJ became the second Cougar in program history – the other being Danny Ainge – to earn first-team all-league honors as a freshman.

**Dave Rose**

BYU head coach Dave Rose has led the Cougars to one of the most successful eras in program history since taking over in 2005. His career record of 305-111 ranks him second in BYU history in total victories and first in winning percentage (.733). Rose has been named conference coach of the year three times, led the Cougars to four conference titles, eight NCAA tournament appearances, four NIT appearances, eight 25-win seasons and 12 20-win seasons.

**BYU and the Postseason**

Under Dave Rose, BYU has reached the postseason in 12-straight seasons, a school record. The previous record was six-straight seasons (1989-90 to 1994-95). During that time the Cougars have earned eight bids to the NCAA tournament and four to the NIT. The Cougars' eight NCAA tournament bids in the last 12 years are more than 200-plus NCAA Division I schools have since beginning their programs.
