THE OPENING TIP

Following a rousing victory over cross-town rival University of Portland, the Portland State Vikings move on to the second of three straight West Coast Conference opponents. PSU plays at BYU on Wednesday night in what figures to be an extremely challenging matchup.

The Vikings (5-3) saw improved play in their 87-78 win over the Pilots last Wednesday night. PSU is now 4-0 at home in the new Viking Pavilion. However, they have yet to win a true road game this season, losing at Pac-12 foes Oregon and Stanford (the Vikings are 1-1 in neutral site games).

BYU figures to be as tough as anyone the Portland State has seen this season. The Cougars are 7-4 this season, including 6-1 at home, where they routinely play in front of more than 11,000 fans.

PSU will need SO G Holland Woods to produce another game like he had against Portland. The 2017-18 Big Sky Conference Freshman of the Year had 27 points, hitting a career-high five three-pointers, and six assists in the win. The Vikings also got big games from big men JR C Sal Nuhu (10 pts, 9 reb, 6 blk) and SR F Jamie Orme (10 pts, 13 reb). Most significant was another resounding advantage on the backboards as the Vikings out-rebounded Portland, 55-29. PSU's 27 offensive rebounds were nearly as many as UP's total rebounds. The Vikings are proving to be one of the top rebounding teams in the nation, leading all of Division I in offensive boards (20.6 per game) and ranking third in rebound margin (+14.3).

On the other side of the ledger, BYU features one of the top forwards in the nation in Yoeli Childs who averages a double-double with 23.6 points, 11.4 rebounds and 3.1 assists per game.

BYU is the first of a three games against quality opponents heading into Big Sky Conference play. The Vikings host Loyola Marymount (9-1) on Saturday, then CSU Bakersfield (5-4) on Dec. 20.

This will be the first meeting between the schools in 40 seasons and just the second all-time. Tip-off for Wednesday's game is 7 p.m. MT/6 p.m. PT. The game will air on BYUtv.org/livetv. Live statistics are available at www.ViksLive.com.

INTERVIEW POLICY

COACH PEERY: Coach Peery is available in his office each morning from 9-10 a.m. To schedule an interview, contact Mike Lund in the office of Media Relations.

PLAYERS: Media may interview players following practice. Practice will begin on time and then players will not be available until it concludes. Players are also not available on game day until following the game.

PRACTICES: Practice times most days are 11 a.m.-1 p.m. However, contact Mike Lund in the PSU Media Relations Office for confirmation. Interviews can also be coordinated through the Media Relations Office.

TICKETS

Season tickets begin at \$150 for general admission, \$250 for reserved seats. Tickets for all home games can be purchased at GoViks.com/tickets. Prices are \$14 for general admission and \$19 for reserved seats. Fans can also call the box office to purchase tickets at 1-888-VIK-TIKS (845-8457).

DIRECTIONS TO CAMPUS

The PSU campus is located in downtown Portland. It is bordered on the north by SW Market, on the east by SW 1st, on the south by I-405, and on the west by SW 13th.

• **TO PORTLAND STATE FROM THE AIRPORT:** Exit the Airport on Airport Way, heading east. Take I-205 South for approximately 3 miles. Exit on I-84 West and follow for approximately six miles. Move into the left lane of I-84 westbound as you approach the I-5 interchange. Take I-5 southbound and move into the left lane as you cross the Marquam Bridge. Merge with I-405, moving into the right lane. The 4th, 6th and 13th Avenue exits all lead onto the Portland State campus.

• **DIRECTIONS TO THE VIKING PAVILION:** The Portland State Vikings practice at the Peter W. Stott Center located at SW 10th and Hall on the PSU campus. To get to the Stott Center/Viking Pavilion, follow the directions to the PSU campus. On-street parking is available after exiting on 6th Avenue. A parking garage is also located on 6th Avenue between Hall and Harrison Streets. Walk three blocks west through the Park Blocks.

HEAD COACH BARRET PEERY

Barret Peery was named Portland State's Men's Basketball Coach on April 10, 2017. He quickly put his stamp on the Viking program, leading the team to 20 wins, national recognition and a post-season bid in the CIT in his first year.



Peery came to Portland State after two decades of collegiate coaching to lead the Viking program into a future that includes the opening of a brand new playing facility in 2018. One of those previous seasons was as a Viking basketball assistant coach (2002-03).

In addition to Portland State, Peery has been an assistant coach at high-profile programs like Utah and Arizona State, at a Big Sky school; his alma mater Southern Utah, and comes from Santa Clara where he was the Associate Head Coach. He has worked with Head Coaches Bill Evans (Southern Utah), Jim Boylen (Utah) and Herb Sendek (Arizona State, Santa Clara) at the Division I level, as well as Heath Schroyer at Portland State.

Peery had two head coaching stints to great acclaim at the junior college level. He compiled a career record of 178-30 in six seasons at College of Southern Idaho (2002-05, 85-19) and Indian Hills (IA) Community College (2011-14, 93-11). In 2014, Indiana Hills was the NJCAA runner-up, going 34-3 and winning regional and district titles.

Peery's teams routinely were among the top scoring in the nation. His 2012-13 squad averaged 97.9 points per game. In three seasons at Indian Hills, his teams went 60-1 at home and reached the number one ranking in the nation.

At CSI, Peery led his team to two national tournaments in three seasons and twice led the nation in scoring. The Golden Eagles placed fourth in the nation in 2006-07. Peery was the Scenic West Athletic Conference Coach of the Year in 2007-08 after leading his team to a third straight SWAC title. CSI was ranked number one in the nation for the last four weeks of the regular season.

COMING UP

The Vikings wrap up the non-conference schedule with home games against Loyola Marymount (Dec. 15) and CSU Bakersfield (Dec. 20). Big Sky Conference play begins on Dec. 31 when the Vikings host Northern Colorado in a 2:05 p.m. game.

GAME NOTES: PORTLAND STATE vs. BYU

- **ALL-TIME SERIES:** BYU leads the all-time series, 1-0. The Cougars won the only meeting, 111-82, on Nov. 25, 1978 in Provo.
- **PORTLAND STATE vs. THE WEST COAST CONFERENCE:** Portland State is 40-72 all-time against current members of the West Coast Conference, but has gone 4-1 under Barret Peery dating to last season... PSU is playing three members of the conference this season (Portland; BYU; vs. Loyola Marymount on Dec. 15).
- **COACHES:** Vikings Coach Barret Peery (Southern Utah, 1996) is in his second season on the Park Blocks and has a 25-17 career record. Peery has never faced BYU. He is 4-1 against West Coast Conference schools... Peery's only other head coaching experience is at the junior college level where he was 178-30 in six seasons (2005-08, College of Southern Idaho; 2011-14, Indian Hills (IA) CC)... the Cougars are coached by Dave Rose (Houston, 1983) in his 14th season. Rose is 336-126 all-time. He has never faced the Vikings.

BYU COUGARS

- Brigham Young University is a member of the West Coast Conference, located in Provo, UT.
- The Cougars were 24-11 last season, 11-7 and third in the WCC. They lost to Stanford in the first round of the NIT. All five starters and 10 letterwinners return from that squad.
- This season, BYU has started out 7-4, including 6-1 at home. The Cougars are a strong shooting team, hitting .472 from the field and .749 at the free throw line while averaging 84.6 points per game.
- JR F Yoeli Childs averages 23.6 points, 11.4 rebounds and 3.1 assists per game. He also shoots .556 from the field, .759 at the free throw line and has a team-leading 12 blocked shots.
- JR G TJ Haws is also a top performer, averaging 16.2 points, 4.6 rebounds and 5.1 assists. Haws is shooting .472 from the field, .400 from three-point range with a team-high 24 triples, and .857 at the line.
- JR G Jahshire Hardnett also averages double figures with 11.2 points per game.

SUSTAINABLE AND RECYCLABLE VIKING QUICK NOTES

WINNING LINES

- Portland State is 5-3 on the season, 4-0 at home, 0-2 on the road, 1-1 at neutral sites.
- The Vikings have won two in row.
- PSU was 20-14 in 2017-18, 8-5 at home, 10-6 on the road, 2-3 at neutral sites.
- In Big Sky Conference games, PSU was 9-9 (4-5 at home, 5-4 on the road).

Home Court(s)

- Portland State opens the Viking Pavilion at the Peter W. Stott Center in 2018-19. The Stoller Family Court will be PSU's fifth (and hopefully final) home court since joining the Big Sky Conference in 1996-97. The main home court was the old Peter W. Stott Center. However, the Vikings also used the Rose Garden (now Moda Center) and Memorial Coliseum occasionally over the years. In 2017-18, PSU used Lewis & Clark College's Pamplin Sports Center as a home court while the Viking Pavilion was being completed. Here is the breakdown:

- Viking Pavilion - 4 games, 4-0
- Peter W. Stott Center - 233 games, 168-65
- Rose Garden (Moda Center) - 28 games, 19-9
- Memorial Coliseum - 19 games, 13-6
- Lewis and Clark - 12 games, 7-5
- 23rd season - 296 games, 211-85 at home overall

- Since the start of the 2006-07 season, PSU is 124-46 at home, including 71-38 in Big Sky Conference regular season and tournament games.
- Portland State has lost only eight non-conference home games in the last 12 seasons (53-8). PSU is 28-8 against Division I schools, and 25-0 against lower division schools over that span.

Big Sky Battles

- Portland State is 185-198 all-time in all Big Sky Conference games, including the Big Sky Tournament (12-13).
- PSU is 120-63 in home games, 59-125 in road games and 6-10 in neutral-site games.

And The Trivial

- Portland State is 29-30 all-time in overtime, including 2-1 in 2017-18.
- PSU is 2-17 against nationally-ranked opponents since joining the Big Sky Conference in 1996-97.
- The Vikings are 0-2 on television (0-0 home, 0-2 road) this season. Portland State is 23-53 in games televised in the Portland area since joining the Big Sky Conference in 1996-97. That includes a 9-7 home record and 13-41 road record and 1-5 neutral site record.
- Portland State has won 35 straight games against lower division schools dating back to 2002. The Vikings are 47-1 against lower division schools in 23 seasons as a member of the Big Sky Conference and Division I (1996-2017).

WHO IS HOT

- **20-20:** SO G Holland Woods had his second straight 20-point game against Portland (he sat out the win over Portland Bible). Woods went for 27 points (8-14 FG, 5-7 3-pt, 6-6 FT) - just two off his career high. He hit a career-high five three-pointers - all in the first half - and had six assists. Woods had 20 points and five assists at Stanford on Nov. 28... Woods has seven 20-pointers in his 41-game career.
- **THE BENCH IS NO DETERRENT:** JR C Sal Nuhu and JR G Michael Nuga have each scored in double figures in six straight games even though neither has started. Nuhu has averaged 12.8 points and Nuga has averaged 16.0 points during that span.
- **REBOUNDERS:** Portland State has out-rebounded all eight opponents this season as has a +14.3 rebounding margin to rank third in the nation. The Vikings are averaging 20.6 offensive rebounds per game which leads the nation. They have converted those offensive boards to 166 second-chance points (20.8 points per game).

WHO IS NOT

- **THREE-POINT SHOOTING:** Portland State is shooting 54-198 from three-point range this season (.273). The good news is the Vikings have hit 17-39 in their last two games (.436).
- **PARDON ME:** The Vikings are averaging 24.9 fouls per game - 350th in the nation - including a season-high 36 against UC Santa Barbara.

YOU'VE GOT TO PUT THE BISCUIT IN THE BASKET: There is no question that shooting efficiency is the most important element in basketball. So far, the Vikings have been inconsistent when chucking the rock at the old peach basket. Here is a breakdown:

- Field goal percentage: 252-590, .427
- Two-point percentage: 198-392, .505
- Three-point percentage: 54-198, .273
- Shooting in wins: .491/.379
- Shooting in losses: .318/.122
- Shooting in home games: .505/.367
- Shooting in road/neutral site games: .348/.194

NATION'S BEST: It's still a small sample size after seven games, and the Vikings have played some lower division opponents, but they lead the nation in a handful of categories:

- Offensive rebounds per game: 20.6
- Total rebounds per game: 47.7 (rank third in rebound margin, +14.3)
- Steals: 12.1

PEERY PRESSURE, PART II: Portland State Head Coach Barret Peery emphasizes a full-court pressure defense that forces turnovers and creates transition opportunities. Then, on the offensive end, his team relentlessly attacks the offensive glass. Here are the analytics of those two areas. In 2018-19:

- The Vikings have forced 21.5 turnovers per game and have a +6.9 turnover margin.
- The Vikings average 20.6 offensive rebounds per game while opponents average 7.8.
- In all, the difference in total turnovers (55) and total offensive rebounds (103) is 158 extra possessions compared to opponents (19.8 per game).
- As a result, PSU has 173 more field goal attempts than the opponents. Opponents have 20 more free throw attempts.

CHEERING FOR BOO BOO: SO G Holland "Boo Boo" Woods is the Vikings' leader in scoring (16.7), and assists (5.0). He ranks fifth in the Big Sky in scoring, third in assists and sixth in steals (1.9).

- He has led the team in scoring six times and assists five times this season.
- Woods, the Big Sky leader in assists last season (5.6), has led the Vikings in assists in 31 of 41 career games.
- Scored in double figures six times with three 20+ point games.
- Woods reached 200 career assists in 36 career games. He is now 21 assists short of reaching the Portland State all-time top 10 for assists.
- Went for 20 points and five assists at Stanford.
- Had 27 points (8-14 FG, career-high 5-7 3-pt, 6-6 FT) and six assists in a win over Portland.

NU-COMERS PLAYING WELL: Portland State newcomers JR G Michael Nuga and JR C Sal Nuhu are having a big impact off the bench for the Vikings.

Nuga Nuggets:

- Nuga ranks second in the team in scoring at 13.5 points per game in less than 20 minutes per night.
- He is shooting .500 from the field and .385 from three-point range.
- Has scored in double figures the last six games, averaging 16.0 points.
- Went for 17 points and nine rebounds against Stanford.

Yahoo For Nuhu:

- Nuhu averages 10.8 points in 18 minutes per game.
- He averages 6.4 rebounds and has a Big Sky-leading 1.9 blocked shots per game.

- Nuhu shoots .615 from the field.
- In the last six games, he has scored in double figures, averaging 12.8 points and 7.3 rebounds.
- Posted a double-double against Stanford with 15 points and 14 rebounds.
- Went for 10 points, nine rebounds and a season-high six blocked shots against Portland.

FINDING HIS F-ORME: SR F Jamie Orme is taking a big step forward in 2018-19 by moving into the starting lineup. He averaged 4.0 points and 3.1 rebounds last season in 13 minutes per game. Now he is averaging 9.9 points and a team-leading 6.8 rebounds.

- Ranks seventh in the Big Sky in rebounding.
- Scored in double figures six times and has two double-doubles this season.
- Has season highs of 19 points, 13 rebounds (twice) and five assists.

WHAT BROWN CAN DO FOR YOU: SR G Derek Brown has also taken a big step up in 2018-19 with his move to the starting lineup. Last year, he averaged 5.1 points in 12 minutes per game... this season Brown averages 10.0 points, 2.4 assists and 1.9 steals.

- Scored in double figures four times.
- Has season highs of 16 points, six rebounds and eight assists.

NEW SEASON, NEW LOOK: Portland State Head Coach Barret Peery has four new starters in his lineup this season, along with returning starter SO G Holland Woods. Also tipping it off are SO C Brendan Rumel (three total starts in the previous two years), SR F Jamie Orme (one start last year), JR F Robert McCoy and SR G Derek Brown.

- In addition to McCoy, also new to the Vikings are JR Gs Michael Nuga and Juwan Williams, JR F Rashaad Goolsby, JR C Sal Nuhu and FR F Filip Fullerton.

PARTICIPATION AWARDS ALL AROUND: Portland State Head Coach Barret Peery's style of aggressive full-court pressure requires fresh bodies at all times. The Vikings sub early and often and everybody plays. So far, the core 10 players are all averaging at least 12 minutes per game or more. Only four average over 20 minutes, and only SO G Holland Woods averages over 30.

- The roster will expand as SR Gs Michael Mayhew and Vonte Carter will be available on Wednesday at BYU. Both have restored their academic eligibility. Mayhew started 20 games for the Vikings last season, playing in all 34. He averaged 8.1 points, hitting a team-high 66 three-point field goals. Carter played in nine games off the bench, averaging 2.7 points.

IF YOU BUILD IT: The crowd of 2,020 that attended the game against Portland in the Viking Pavilion is the largest crowd of the season so far. Portland State's home opener against UC Riverside had a crowd of 1,424. The largest recent crowd was a sellout of 1,500 attended the Portland State/Oregon State game in the old Stott Center gym on Dec. 12, 2012... PSU is averaging 1,262 fans through four home games - the most since the 2007-08 season (1,347).

WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW ABOUT PORTLAND STATE

Portland State University, located in Portland, has an enrollment of 28,407 students. PSU was founded in 1946 as Vanport College - a two-year institution.

Athletically, Portland State began as a junior college in 1946-47, but competed in the Oregon Collegiate Conference (NAIA) beginning in 1948-49 to 1964-65. PSU became a four-year institution - Portland State College - in 1955. The Vikings won five OCC titles and competed in the NAIA playoffs twice.

Portland State joined the NCAA in 1965-66. The Vikings reached the College Division playoffs in 1966-67. College Division was the forerunner to Division II. Portland State was given university status in 1969.

During the 1970s, Portland State competed as a Division I program. The Vikings' biggest star was Freeman Williams, who still ranks as the second all-time leading scorer in college basketball history behind Pete Maravich. Williams, a Division I All-American in 1978, scored 3,249 points in his career.

The university dropped the men's basketball program in 1981 for budgetary reasons. It remained dormant until 1996-97 when basketball was reinstated and Portland State joined the Big Sky Conference. PSU has had 10 winning records in its 21 years as a member.

Portland State won the Big Sky Conference regular season title in 2004-05 (19-9, 11-3), but lost in the Big Sky Tournament semifinals, missing a chance for the NCAA Tournament.

In 2007-08, the Vikings won the Big Sky Conference regular season and tournament titles going 23-10, 14-2 in the Big Sky Conference. The resulting NCAA berth was the first at the Division I level for the Viking program. The Vikings lost to eventual national champion Kansas, but concluded the most successful season in school history.

In 2008-09, PSU once again won 23 games - matching the school record - and reached a second straight NCAA Tournament after winning the Big Sky Conference Tournament for the second year in a row.

With 78 wins from 2007-10, PSU had its most successful era in school history.

Portland State has had 19 first team All-Big Sky Conference selections since 1996, including two Big Conference Players of the Year (Seamus Boxley, Jeremiah Dominguez), three Big Sky Defensive Players of the Year (Seamus Boxley - twice, Scott Morrison), and four Big Sky Newcomers of the Year (Jason Hartman, Ime Udoka, Dupree Lucas, Jeremiah Dominguez), one 6th Man of the Year (DaShaun Wiggins) and two Big Sky Freshmen of the Year (Seamus Boxley, Holland Woods).

Among Vikings in the NBA, Freeman Williams and Ime Udoka each spent seven playing seasons in the league. Udoka is currently an assistant coach for the San Antonio Spurs.

NEW RECORDS: Portland State took advantage of a lower division opponent in beating Portland Bible, 123-40, on Dec. 1. The result was several new school records:

- Margin of victory: 83 points
- Turnovers forced: 43
- Steals: 31
- Individual steals: Deante Strickland, 9

SEASON HIGHLIGHT REEL

- **Nov. 6: #14 Oregon 84, PSU 57:** The Vikings opened the season with their usual aggressive approach on defense and the glass, but suffered through a woeful shooting night in a loss to the 14th-ranked Ducks. PSU made only 21-73 shots from the field (.288) compared to 27-50 for Oregon (.540). SO G Holland Woods led the Vikings with 13 points and three assists.
- **Nov. 10: PSU 71, UC Riverside 64:** The Vikings held the Highlanders without a field goal for eight minutes late in the second half. PSU trailed by four with 8:24 to play but pulled away in the closing minutes leading by as many as 10. SR G Derek Brown scored 12 points with six rebounds and three assists.
- **Nov. 16: PSU 125, Willamette 61:** PSU needed little time to dispatch Division III Willamette, jumping to a 23-0 lead in the first five minutes and cruising to an easy win. SO G Holland Woods and JR G Michael Nuga each scored 22 points, while SR F Jamie Orme (19 pts, 13 reb) and JR F Robert McCoy (11 pts, 12 reb) each had double-doubles.
- **Peery Wins 200th:** Portland State Head Basketball Coach Barret Peery captured his 200th career victory on Saturday in a 125-61 win over Willamette. Peery, who is in his second season at Portland State, is currently 22-15 as Vikings' Head Coach. He also won 178 games in six seasons at the junior college level (93-11, Indian Hills CC (IA), 2011-14; College of Southern Idaho, 85-19, 2005-08). His composite record is 200-45.
- **Nov. 23: UCSB 76, PSU 69:** Portland State shoots .355 from the field, making only 3-23 three-pointers in the game. The Vikings also had 36 fouls, sending the Gauchos to the line 42 times. JR G Michael Nuga came off the bench to score 13 points for PSU.
- **Nov. 24: PSU 91, Northwest Nazarene 75:** Portland State jumped to a 23-5 lead in the first eight minutes and never looked back. The Vikings held the Nighthawks to .367 shooting and forced 20 turnovers. SR G Derek Brown scored 16 points with five rebounds. SO G Holland Woods had 16 points and nine assists.
- **Nov. 28: Stanford 79, PSU 67:** Another struggle in the shooting department cost the Vikings big as they out-rebounded Stanford 51-36 and forced 19 Cardinal turnovers. PSU made only 26-82 shots (.317) and 2-24 three-pointers (.083). SO G Holland Woods had 20 points and five assists, JR G Michael Nuga scored 17 points with nine rebounds, and JR C Sal Nuhu added 15 points and 14 rebounds.
- **Dec. 1: PSU 123, Portland Bible 40:** PSU took advantage of lower division Portland Bible setting new school records for margin of victory (83), turnovers forced (43) and steals (31). JR F Robert McCoy led seven Vikings in double figures with 26 points and eight rebounds. JR C Sal Nuhu had 17 points on 8-8 field goals in only 10 minutes of action. SR G Deante Strickland had eight assists and a school-record nine steals.
- **Dec. 5: PSU 87, Portland 78:** SO G Holland Woods had one of his best games as a Viking, hitting a career-high five three-pointers on the way to a 27-point, six-assist night. SR F Jamie Orme added a double-double (10 pts, 13 reb) and JR C Sal Nuhu came close (10 pts, 9 reb, 6 blk) as the Vikings out-rebounded the Pilots, 55-29, winning their third straight over UP.

PEERY WINS 200TH CAREER GAME

Portland State Head Basketball Coach Barret Peery captured his 200th career victory on No. 17 in a 125-61 win over Willamette. Peery, who is in his second season at Portland State, won his 22nd game as Vikings' Head Coach. He also won 178 games in six seasons at the junior college level (93-11, Indian Hills CC (IA), 2011-14; College of Southern Idaho, 85-19, 2005-08). His composite record is now 203-47.

WHAT IS PEERY PRESSURE?

Portland State Head Coach Barret Peery emphasizes a full-court pressure defense that forces turnovers and creates transition opportunities. Then, on the offensive end, his team relentlessly attacks the offensive glass. The results proved out quite well in 2017-18. Here are the analytics of those two areas.

- The Vikings forced 18.1 turnovers per game and had a +5.4 turnover margin (1st in the nation).
- The Vikings averaged 14.5 offensive rebounds per game (2nd in the nation) while opponents averaged 10.2 offensive rebounds.
- In all, the difference in total turnovers (184) and total offensive rebounds (145) meant 329 extra possessions compared to opponents (9.7).
- It is no wonder the Vikings had 361 more field goal attempts and 199 more free throw attempts than their opponents last year and 85.2 points (3rd in the nation).

THE VIKING PAVILION

Portland State University held Grand Opening ceremonies for the new Viking Pavilion at the Peter W. Stott Center on April 9.

The long-awaited arena and events facility became a first-class venue for the university and the Viking Athletics program. Viking volleyball opened the Pavilion for Viking Athletics with the first official sporting events in August. The first major athletics event was on Apr. 28 when PSU hosted a Grand Opening Gala (Wine and Roses). Numerous other campus events have taken place over the past six months.

The Viking Pavilion, a 141,700-square foot facility seats just over 3,000 people for basketball. Seating is more than double the size of the old Stott Center main gym. The facility also has a new weight room, locker rooms, academic center and administrative offices as well as the new OHSU Sports Medicine Center. A new Viking Athletics Hall of Fame display will be completed in October. Other additions include five new classrooms, new student lounges and a new cafe.

The \$52.1 million project, which was part renovation and part rebuild, was designed by Woofter Architects/Perkins+Will. Fortis Construction was the general contractor. \$19.1 million came from private gifts and PSU project funds, \$7.5 million was a sponsorship from OHSU, \$24 million are from state bonds and \$1.5 million are from student fees. None of the funding came from general operating funds or tuition dollars. Formal fund-raising began in 2013. An official ground breaking took place on April 23, 2016.

WOOD, GREELEY WILL REDSHIRT 2018-19 SEASON

FR F Trey Wood is scheduled to redshirt the 2018-19 season. The 6-9 recruit from Anthem, AZ had corrective surgery on his right shoulder in mid-October and will spend the season recuperating.

FR G Kyle Greeley, a 6-5 recruit from West Salem, will also redshirt the 2018-19 season.

JADEN NIELSEN-SKINNER SIGNS WITH VIKINGS

Portland State Basketball Head Coach Barret Peery has announced the signing of Jaden Nielsen-Skinner to a national letter of intent for the 2019-2020 academic year.

"Jaden is an individual that we targeted early on when we came to Portland State. We offered him quickly," said the second-year Head Coach. "He is extremely quick with the basketball and plays fast at both ends of the floor. I love Jaden's knowledge and feel for the game. He fits who we are both on and off the court."

A point guard at South Salem High School, Nielsen-Skinner is a two-time first team All-Greater Valley Conference selection. He averaged 22.3 points, 3.7 assists and 1.2 steals per game as a junior. During his sophomore season, he led South Salem to a third-place finish in the Oregon 6A State Tournament while averaging 18.7 points per game.

Beginning with his freshman season, Nielsen-Skinner has started every game of his high school career.

WOODS PICKED AS PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE

Portland State's Holland "Boo Boo" Woods, the Big Sky Conference Freshman of the Year in 2017-18, received another accolade before playing a single game of his sophomore season. Woods was named to the Big Sky's Preseason All-Conference Team today in a vote of league media.

In his first season as a Viking Woods averaged 10.5 points and a Big Sky-leading 5.6 assists per game. He also averaged 1.5 steals to rank fourth in the conference, and 2.7 rebounds. In addition, Woods had some big highlights throughout his freshman year:

- Eight points, five rebounds and five assists in a Thanksgiving Day game against #1-ranked Duke
- A 13-assist, 12-point performance in a 106-81 blowout victory over California on Dec. 21.
- A game-winning put-back shot to beat at Idaho on Jan. 6 with 0.6 seconds remaining.
- A school-record 10-10 field goal shooting performance, 29 points, nine assists and no turnovers to beat Eastern Washington on Feb. 3.
- A last-second three-pointer at Southern Utah to send the game to overtime

and an eventual Viking win at Southern Utah on Feb. 22.

- Scored the last 11 points (and 18 overall with four assists) for Portland State in a Big Sky Tournament first round win over Sacramento State on Mar. 6.
- The fourth-most assists for a season in Portland State school history (191).
- Averaged 32 minutes per game at point guard as he led the Vikings to 20 wins (third-most in its Big Sky history).

VIKINGS PICKED FIFTH, SEVENTH IN BIG SKY POLLS

Big Sky Conference Coaches have picked the Portland State men's basketball team to finish fifth in this season's 2018-19 league preseason poll. Big Sky media tabbed the Vikings for seventh in the 11-team league. (Polls listed on page nine of this release).

VIKINGS TELEVISED ON ELEVEN SPORTS FOUR TIMES

The Big Sky Conference released its Eleven Sports television schedule for 2018-19 and Portland State will appear in four of the 11 regular season games (Jan. 12 vs. Weber State, Feb. 16 vs. Southern Utah, Feb. 21 vs. Idaho State and Mar. 7 vs. Montana). All four games will air from the Viking Pavilion.

Eleven Sports also televises the Big Sky Conference Tournament quarterfinals and semifinals.

THE SCHEDULE

The Vikings return home after a season of playing off campus due to Viking Pavilion construction. In all, PSU will play 16 home games.

- Portland State will play three teams from the West Coast Conference, two teams from the Pac-12, two from the Big West and one from the Western Athletic Conference in the non-conference schedule. Portland State was 7-2 against teams from other Division I basketball conferences in the west last year (3-1 vs. West Coast Conference; 2-1 vs Pac-12; 1-0 against vs. Big West; 1-0 vs. Mountain West).
- PSU also plays three lower division opponents. The Vikings are 44-1 against lower division schools in the previous 22 seasons, including winning 31 in a row.
- Big Sky Conference play begins on Dec. 31 for the Vikings as Northern Colorado comes to town. That begins a new 20-game conference schedule. The league has dropped to 11 teams with the departure of North Dakota, creating a new, balanced home-and-home schedule. Due to the uneven number of teams the new league schedule also necessitates two Monday games, including Northern Colorado and a Feb. 11 game at Sacramento State.
- The Big Sky Conference Tournament takes place Mar. 13-16 at CenturyLink Arena in Boise. The format has changed to Wednesday through Saturday. The bottom six seeds will compete in first-round play on Wednesday. The top five seeds will earn quarterfinal round berths and open play on Thursday. Semifinals are on Friday, with the Championship on Saturday. The winner advances to the NCAA Tournament.

MORE TASTY VIKING TIDBITS

- Portland State is in its 23rd season as a member of the Big Sky Conference and Division I. PSU played basketball from 1946-1981 before discontinuing the program. Basketball was reinstated for the 1996-97 season. Portland State won Big Sky Conference regular season titles in 2004-05 and 2007-08. The Vikings won Big Sky Conference Tournament titles in 2007-08 and 2008-09, advancing to the NCAA Tournament.
- Former Viking Ime Udoka played seven seasons in the NBA. He started 75 games for the Portland Trail Blazers in 2006-07. Udoka is now an assistant coach with the San Antonio Spurs, and won an NBA title with the team in 2013-14.
- Julius Thomas (2006-10), who holds Portland State records for games played (121), field goal percentage in a season and career (.671/.663), and career wins (78), was a two-time Pro Bowler for the NFL's Denver Broncos. Thomas

Post-season Tournament.

The Vikings started off the season strong, winning 10 of 13 non-conference games, and impressed during the PK80 Invitational Tournament, matching up favorably with some of the nation's best teams. PSU was noted for its pressure defense, putting the Vikings among the nation's leaders in steals, forced turnovers and points scored.

Despite a rash of mid-season injuries and illness, the Vikings were able to reach 20 victories, marking only the sixth time in school history that has occurred. Portland State pulled that off by compiling the most road wins in school history (10). In addition, PSU did not have a true home court and had to play off campus due to construction of the new Viking Pavilion.

WHAT THE VIKINGS ACCOMPLISHED IN 2017-18

Here is a look at the memorable moments and milestones for the Portland State Vikings in the 2017-18 season:

- 20 wins - the most by a Viking team since 2008-09 when it reached the NCAA Tournament... also the third-most wins in the Big Sky era (22 seasons) and third time PSU has reached 20 wins (six times in school history).
- 10-6 road record - Portland State had the most road wins and best road winning percentage in school history. Including neutral site games (12-9), the Vikings also had the most "away from home wins" in school history (11-9 in 2008-09).
- Head Coach Barret Peery had the most wins (20) and second-best winning percentage (.588) by a first-year coach at the Division I level in Portland State history.
- The Vikings beat two Pac-12 schools (Stanford, Cal) in the same season for the first time in school history.

- PSU's 10-3 non-conference record was its best in school history. The Vikings three losses came against prominent programs (Duke, Butler, Oregon).
- Comeback wins - Portland State had nine second-half, come-from-behind victories (four by double digits). Six of those were on the road, two at Memorial Coliseum.
- Portland State was 7-2 against teams from other Division I basketball conferences in the west (3-1 vs. West Coast Conference; 2-1 vs Pac-12; 1-0 against vs. Big West; 1-0 vs. Mountain West).
- Scoring - Portland State averaged 85.2 points per game this season, ranking as third-best in the nation.
- PSU was also nationally-ranked in steals (9.8, 2nd), turnover margin (+5.4, 1st), turnovers forced (18.1, 2nd) and offensive rebounds (14.5, 2nd).
- Portland State's CIT bid marked the seventh time in its 57-season basketball history that PSU has received a national post-season bid, and the second time PSU has been picked for the CIT (NAIA in 1955 and 1956; NCAA College Division in 1967; NCAA Division I Tournament in 2008 and 2009; CIT in 2014 and 2018).
- FR G Holland "Boo Boo" Woods was named the Big Sky Conference Freshman of the Year. SR G Bryce Canda and SR F Brandon Hollins were each selected as honorable mention All-Big Sky.
- FR G Holland Woods led the Big Sky Conference in assists in both season (5.6) and conference stats (5.6). SR F Brandon Hollins led the Big Sky in rebounding in conference games (9.7). SR C Ryan Edwards led the Big Sky in blocked shots in conference games (1.7).
- PSU led the Big Sky in scoring, assists, steals, turnover margin, offensive rebounds and assist-to-turnover ratio.

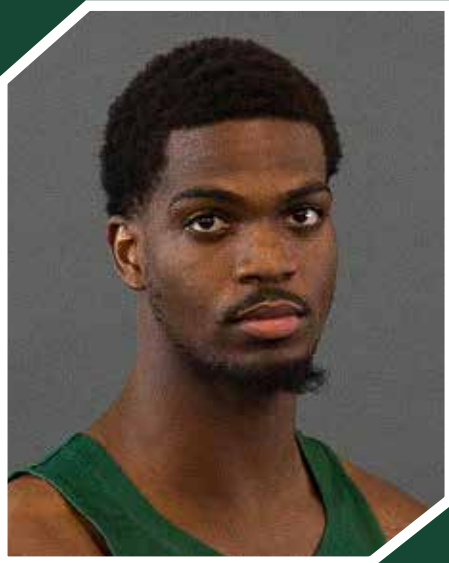
