### TROY BY THE NUMBERS

**1** Carlton Martial is the NCAA's active career leader in forced fumbles per game; Martial is averaging 0.25 forced fumbles per game

**6** Games with 40-plus points for the Trojans under head coach & play caller Chip Lindsey; the 11th most in the country the last two seasons

**6** Games with 500-plus yards of total offense last season by the Trojans; tied for the most in Troy's DI era

**7** Games with a touchdown reception for Khalil McClain in his 13 career games as a Trojan

**9** Teams are playing a full 12-game schedule this season -- Troy, Arkansas State, SMU, Texas State, ULM, Southern Miss, UTEP, Army, UTSA

**12** Players at the FBS level the last 20 seasons who have finished a season with at least 100 tackles, 15 tackles for loss and three interceptions -- Carlton Martial did so last year to become the first underclassman in that group

**47** Points scored by the Trojans at Middle Tennessee last weekend; it was the most in a season opener against an FBS team in school history and sixth most overall

**71** Interceptions by the Trojans since the start of the 2016 season are the second most in the country

**93** Plays run by the Trojan offense in the opener at Middle Tennessee, the second most in the country this season. Under Chip Lindsey, Troy's 83.71 plays-per-game average is the third most in the country

**106** Turnovers forced by the Troy defense since the start of the 2016 season; the second most in the country

### DID YOU KNOW?

- Troy has two former walk-ons starting on its defense and both are making huge impacts ... Carlton Martial is a two-time All-American at linebacker and Craig Slocum was named to the Pro Football Focus National Team of the Week following his first career start this past weekend

- Troy strength coach Rusty Whitt had a decorated career as a Special Forces Sergeant in the United States Army. He served as a Senior Special Forces Communication Sergeant in the 10th Special Forces Group ... he received a combat infantry badge, two Iraqi campaign medals and an Army commendation medal with valor

- Troy is 6-1 when leading at halftime under Chip Lindsey and the Trojans are a perfect 5-0 when rushing for more than 200 yards; Troy did both against Middle Tennessee

- Troy held Middle Tennessee to 241 yards of total offense in the opener. It was the fewest by an FBS opponent against the Trojans since Troy held South Alabama to 224 yards in 2017

- Chip Lindsey coached offenses -- OC at Southern Miss, Arizona State and Auburn -- plus head coach at Troy have been shutout just once (first career game at Southern Miss)

- Troy's bandit has earned All-Sun Belt First Team in four of coach Bam Hardmon's five seasons coaching the position -- Hunter Reese (2017 & 2018), Rashad Dillard (2016) & Tyler Roberts (2015)

- Over the last five seasons (2016-20), Troy ranks 14th nationally with 6.69 points per game off turnover -- the Trojans scored 17 points off three MTSU turnovers last week; the most in the country this season

- Carlton Martial was named to five preseason All-America teams heading into the 2020 season - Walter Camp (1st), The Athletic (2nd), CBS Sports (2nd), Pro Football Focus (2nd), Phil Steele (4th)

- Gunnar Watson became the first Troy quarterback since Corey Robinson (2010) to win his debut as QB1 for the Trojans

- Troy used six different running backs in the game against Middle Tennessee; they averaged 5.4 yards per carry as a unit

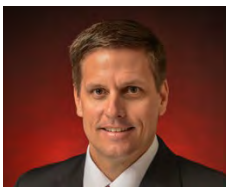

# CHIP LINDSEY

## SECOND SEASON (6 - 7)

Chip Lindsey, one of the nation's top innovative offensive minds, begins his second season as Troy's head coach.

Lindsey has been the architect of some of the nation's most electric offenses since moving to the collegiate ranks and his first season with the Trojans was no exception.

The Trojans topped the 500-yard mark in total offense on six different occasions to tie the program's DI record and scored 35-plus points eight times; the second most in program history and fourth most in Sun Belt Conference history. The Trojans finished ninth nationally in passing offense (313.2), 25th in scoring offense (33.8) and 18th in total offense (456.3).

He also guided quarterback Kaleb Barker, just 331 days removed from an ACL injury, to one of the best seasons in Troy history. Barker finished third nationally in completions per game (24.92), fifth in yards per game (302.3), fourth in 300-yard passing games (6) and 14th in touchdown passes (30). Among the Troy all-time greats to play the position, Barker finished third in touchdown passes and passing yards (3,628) and fourth in completions (299). Both Barker and receiver Kaylon Geiger were named to the All-Sun Belt First Team and Geiger was the league's Newcomer of the Year.

On the defensive side of the football, linebacker Carlton Martial became just the 12th player in the last 20 years to finish a season with 100 tackles, 15 tackles for loss and three interceptions on his way to All-America honors while true freshman safety Dell Pettus was named a Freshman All-American.

The offseason saw the positive momentum continue as Lindsey and his staff signed one of the top recruiting classes in program history as the Trojans welcomed the second-ranked class in the Sun Belt and the second-highest rated class in school history according to 247Sports. Troy added 17 three-star players in the class including several ranked near the top 100 in their position nationally.

Lindsey was named the offensive coordinator at Kansas the month prior to being named Troy's head coach in Jan. 2019 following two seasons at Auburn and one season at Arizona State as both schools' offensive coordinator.

Lindsey's first stint at Auburn as an offensive analyst resulted in the Tigers winning the SEC Championship and making a BCS National Championship run, while his most recent tenure on The Plains saw Auburn set school records and post one of the best offensive seasons in SEC history.

In 2017, Auburn became just the eighth team in SEC history and the first in Auburn history to rush and pass for 3,000 yards in a season. The Tigers also ranked 26th nationally in total offense and set an Auburn record scoring 327 points in SEC play. Auburn won the SEC West Division after knocking off a pair of top-ranked teams in Georgia and Alabama over a three-week period.

All-SEC quarterback Jarrett Stidham, the second Auburn player ever to throw for 3,000 yards in a season, led the SEC and ranked ninth nationally in completion percentage. Running back Kerryon Johnson was SEC Offensive Player of the Year, and Ryan Davis set an Auburn receiving record with 84 catches.

Prior to leaving for Kansas, Lindsey's final season at Auburn saw the Tigers defeat Pac-12 Champion Washington and nationally-ranked Texas A&M.

Lindsey returned to Auburn from Arizona State, where he served as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in 2016. The Sun Devils started 5-1 before losing three quarterbacks to injury; running back Kalen Ballage tied an NCAA record scoring eight touchdowns in a 68-55 win over Texas Tech.

As offensive coordinator at Southern Miss from 2014-15, he developed the Conference USA 2015 Offensive Player of the

Year and current San Francisco 49ers quarterback Nick Mullens, who ranked second in the league in passing yards (4,145) and TD passes (36), and ranked in the top eight in the nation in both marks in 2015.

The Southern Miss offense broke five single-season school records in 2015: completions (312), passing yards (4,263), total offense yards (6,758), touchdowns (67) and points (528), as the Golden Eagles recorded nine wins, a Conference USA West title, and a berth in the Zaxby's Heart of Dallas Bowl against Washington.

Lindsey's 2015 Golden Eagle offense ranked fifth in the nation in total touchdowns, seventh in total points, eighth in total passing yards and completions, and 12th in points per game and passing yards per game. The 2015 Golden Eagles tallied more than 4,200 passing yards and just under 2,500 rushing yards. The national leader with 102 explosive plays, Southern Miss was just the second school in FBS history with a 4,000-yard passer, a 1,000-yard receiver and two 1,000-yard rushers.

Prior to his first stint at Auburn, from 2011-12, Lindsey served as head coach at Spain Park (Ala.) High School, leading the school to its first 6A regional championship.

Lindsey served as quarterbacks coach at Troy in 2010, following a long and distinguished career as a prep coach (1997-2009) in football and baseball. At Troy, he coached the Sun Belt Freshman of the Year Corey Robinson and helped guide the Trojans to their fifth consecutive Sun Belt Championship. Robinson set a school record for completions (321) that season while his 3,726 passing yards rank as the second most in Troy history; he threw for 387 yards and four touchdowns in Troy's New Orleans Bowl victory. The Trojans totaled the second most passing touchdowns (33) and most completions (340) in a season in school history.

A two-time coach of the year honoree (2008-09) at Lassiter (Ga.) High School, he guided the development of Parade All-American Hutson Mason, who broke every single-season state passing record in 2009, including passing yards (4,560) and touchdowns (54), and Phillip Lutzenkirchen, who would break tight end records at Auburn. The Trojans went 12-1 and won a regional championship in 2009, and Lindsey received state coach of the year honors from the Atlanta Falcons and the Cobb County Touchdown Club. The Associated Press, Marietta Daily Journal and Cobb County Touchdown Club named him the 2008 Georgia Coach of the Year.

Lindsey served as offensive coordinator at Hoover (Ala.) High School in 2007 as the team finished 10-2 and advanced to the third round of the state playoffs. Lindsey's first experience as a head coach came from 2005-06 at Colbert Heights (Ala.) High School, where he earned 2006 Coach of the Year honors from the Florence Times-Daily.

Lindsey spent the 1997-2004 seasons as an assistant coach, including Florence, Deshler, Sparkman, and Springville High Schools in Alabama.

Lindsey played football at the University of North Alabama before transferring as a student to Alabama, where he received his bachelor's degree in history and English in 1997. He earned a master's in educational leadership from the University of Phoenix in 2005.

A native of Madison, Ala., Lindsey graduated from Bob Jones High School, where he was a three-sport letterman.

Lindsey and his wife Cecily have four children: Claire, Caroline, Cooper and Conner.

- Troy officially moved into its new North End Zone Facility on Aug. 15, 2018, the first day of classes on campus.
- Troy began construction on a North End Zone Football Facility following the completion of the 2016 football season.
- The \$24 million facility provides the Troy football program with over 70,000 square feet of space for student-athletes, staff and fans. Additionally, a 35-by-90-foot video board and 400 new club seats will be included in the project. The facility is located 30 feet off the backline in the north end zone of Veterans Memorial Stadium and will be three floors.

**TROY IN THE POLLS**

- When Troy made an appearance in the AP Top 25 on Nov. 13, 2016, it marked the first time in Troy's history that it appeared in either major poll.
- Troy also became the first Sun Belt team to ever appear in the national rankings.
- Troy's final positioning in the AP and Coaches Poll in 2017 were both program highs. The Trojans finished with 14 points, good for No. 31, in the AP Poll, and 40 points, good for No. 27, in the Coaches Poll.

• Troy's preseason votes in the 2018 AP Poll were the first in school history in the initial poll of the season, while the preseason coaches votes are the most in school history.

**100TH SEASON OF TROY FOOTBALL**

- The 2020 season is a special one for the Trojans as it marks the 100th season of Troy Football.

**SCHEDULE OVERHAUL**

- Troy's schedule now is not what Troy's schedule was when it originally came out on March 1.
- The Trojans lost all four of their originally scheduled non-conference games with UMass and Arkansas-Pine Bluff postponing or canceling their seasons, while Tennessee and NC State (home game) elected to not play Troy due to its conferences' scheduling policies.
- Troy replaced those four games with a home-and-home against Middle Tennessee, a road trip to BYU (Cougars playing at Troy in 2026) and an FCS game against Eastern Kentucky.
- Troy's game against ULM was moved from Oct. 17 to Sept. 5 and then moved again to Dec. 5 following a COVID outbreak within the ULM program.
- Troy's new home opener against Texas State was originally scheduled for Thursday, Oct. 8, on ESPNU, but was moved to Saturday, Oct. 10, to accommodate either an ESPN or ESPN2 broadcast.
- For extra fun, ESPN moved Troy's game at Middle Tennessee from ESPN2 to ESPN and from 3 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. the day before the game.

## GIANT KILLERS

- For the second straight season and for the fifth time since moving to the FBS level, Troy knocked off a team from a Power Five Conference when the Trojans defeated Nebraska, 24-19, in 2018.

- There is at least one member of the current coaching staff that was either a player or coach in each one of the previous victories – 2001 vs. Mississippi State (D. Williams), 2004 vs. Missouri (J. Smith), 2007 vs. Oklahoma State (C. Williams, J. Smith), 2017 vs. LSU (C. Williams, B. Hardmon, J. Smith); 2018 vs. Nebraska (C. Williams, B. Hall, B. Hardmon, J. Smith).

- In the five victories, Troy forced a combined 19 turnovers -- Mississippi State (4), Missouri (3), Oklahoma State (5), LSU (4) and Nebraska (3).

- In four of the five victories, Troy had a big special teams play -- Missouri (Blocked Punt), Oklahoma State (Blocked PAT, Punt Return TD), LSU (Whistle Field Goal at End of First Half) and Nebraska (Punt Return TD).

## STRENGTH COACH FORMER US SPECIAL OPS

- Troy strength coach Rusty Whitt had a decorated career as a Special Forces Sergeant in the United States Army. He served as a Senior Special Forces Communication Sergeant in the 10th Special Forces Group and was a member of the U.S. Army from August 2003 to January 2009 where he was deployed to Iraq as part of Operation Iraqi Freedom (OIF) V and VI.

- He developed and initiated a comprehensive pre-deployment conditioning program for his Special Forces Team prior to and during OIF V and VI. He received a combat infantry badge, two Iraqi campaign medals and an Army commendation medal with valor.

- Enlisted in the Army after watching the horrific events of 9/11 unfold while the head strength coach at Sam Houston State.

## IN-SEASON HOME-AND-HOME

- Troy and Middle Tennessee will meet twice during the 2020 season thanks to all four of Troy's originally scheduled non-conference games being canceled.

- The in-season home-and-home with Middle Tennessee will mark just the third time since 1999 that Division I teams will meet twice in the same regular season.

- New Mexico State and Liberty played twice in both 2018 and 2019; previously, the last time it was done was between UConn and UMass in 1998 when both programs were FCS members.

- It will be the first time that Troy has played an opponent twice in the same season since 2000 when the Trojans met Appalachian State in both the regular season and in the FCS Playoffs.

- The last time Troy played the same team twice in the REGULAR season ... 1942 against Marion Military Institute. Troy's other in-season match ups against a team twice - Luverne HS (1921, 1922, 1926), Montgomery OPX (1910), Oglethorpe (1941), Palmer College of Chiropractic (1926, 1927), Ramer HS (1921), Union Springs HS (1909), West Alabama (1939) and Wetumpka HS (1911).

- Troy won the first game against Middle Tennessee (47-14).

- Troy scored 30-plus points in five straight games last season before the offense sputtered in the final two games with QB Kaleb Barker playing injured.

- Charles Strong, Kimani Vidal and Tyler Hussey all recorded their first career touchdowns, while quarterback Gunnar Watson also threw his first career touchdown pass in the game.

## OFFENSE QUICK HITTERS

- Eight different Trojans rushed the ball in the victory over Middle Tennessee and 10 different players caught a pass.

- Tyler Hussey caught an 8-yard touchdown pass from Jacob Free in the fourth quarter ... Hussey is a walk-on from Troy who converted to receiver after originally joining the program as a long snapper. Also, Hussey found out he was on the trip the night before Troy departed for Murfreesboro after another player was a late scratch.

### CHIP LINDSEY'S QB TREE

- Troy head coach Chip Lindsey has a history of developing quarterbacks wherever he has been.

- Two of his former quarterbacks were on NFL Opening Week rosters -- Jarrett Stidham (Patriots) and Nick Mullens (49ers).

- Lindsey also coached and developed Mullens at Spain Park High School where he was the head coach. Mullens broke Brett Favre's Southern Miss records with 11,994 passing yards and 87 touchdowns; was named the C-USA Offensive Player of the Year.

- Manny Wilkens finished his career as Arizona State's fifth-leading passer in school history (8,624 yards) and added 71 career touchdowns. He signed an UDFA deal with the Green Bay Packers following he collegiate career.

- Jarrett Stidham led Auburn to victories over No. 1 Georgia and No. 1 Alabama over a three-week period ... in his two years at Auburn, Stidham threw 36 touchdowns to just 11 interceptions and passed for nearly 6,000 yards. He was selected in the fourth round of the 2019 NFL Draft by the Patriots.

- In his first season at Troy, Lindsey mentored Kaleb Barker into one of the best offensive seasons in school history. Barker was named to the All-Sun Belt First Team after he led the Sun Belt with 30 touchdown passes (seven more than anyone else in the league), 460 completions (71 more than anyone else in the league) and with 3,628 passing yards (689 yards more than anyone else in the league); all regular season numbers. He also set a pair of Troy single game records after passing for 504 yards against Southern Miss and throwing six touchdown passes at Texas State.

### THE STORY ON GUNNAR

- Third-year sophomore Gunnar Watson was named Troy's starting quarterback after the Trojans' second scrimmage of fall camp (Aug. 15).

- Played in eight total games (6 in 2019, 2 in 2018) heading into the 2020 season -- 21-of-34 for 134 yards.

- Two-time all-state selection at Taylor County (Ga.) High School and was ranked the 23rd best pro-style QB in the country by Rivals ... led Taylor County to a 19-5 record his final two seasons and did not throw in interception during the regular season of his senior season.

- Became the first Troy quarterback since Corey Robinson in 2010 to win his Trojan debut.

- Completed 26-of-37 passes for 248 yards and two touchdowns in his first career start. Troy took the foot off the gas in the second half -- Watson was 24-of-33 for 195 yards in the first half.

## ON THE BENCH

- Troy has a talented group of quarterbacks waiting in the wings behind Gunnar Watson.

- Junior Jacob Free transferred to Troy prior to the 2019 season after originally enrolling at Vanderbilt -- three-time all-state at Brantley (Ala.) High School. Rated as the No. 22 pro-style quarterback in the country by 247Sports and No. 20 quarterback by Rivals.

- Free took over for Watson in the fourth quarter at Middle Tennessee and led a mostly ground attack. However, he showed some ball skills going between his leg on a snap that got away from him and threw an 8-yard touchdown pass on his only pass attempt of the game.

- True freshman Kyle Toole led Lee County (Ga.) High School to back-to-back state titles as a sophomore and junior and posted a 40-4 career record as a starter. He is the school record holder for career passing yards.

- Junior Parker McNeil was named the National Junior College Athletic Association Offensive Player of the Year last year. He was a two-time first team All-American at Navarro College after throwing for 5,635 yards and 56 touchdowns in 21 career games for the Bulldogs. McNeil finished his JUCO career with a 62.9 completion percentage and a 348.5 yards per game average.

## SOMETHING NEW

- Troy will have a new passing leader in 2020 after the graduation of Kaleb Barker ... it will mark the first time since the 2004-06 seasons that a different player will have led the Trojans in passing over a three-year span.

### B.J. SMITH - A TRUE COMEBACK STORY

- 2019 Preseason Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year B.J. Smith entered the second game of the 2019 season coming off his sixth career 100-yard rushing game. He didn't have a chance for his seventh last year after suffering an season-ending injury early in the second game of the season.

- Smith suffered a ruptured patellar tendon on Sept. 14, 2019, and then was involved in a car accident on Jan. 5 which caused a hip dislocation and posterior wall fracture in his hip.

- He was officially cleared for full contact by Dr. Jeffrey Dugas on Aug. 16, 2020.

- Took his second touch of the season for a 19-yard gain and finished the game with 81 yards on 10 carries as the Trojans limited his workload in a blowout victory.

- Also caught a pass for 19 yards and finished the game with 100 all-purpose yards.

## BENNIE AND THE JETS

- Bennie "B.J." Smith patiently waited his turn behind Jordan "MegaChunn" Chunn for two seasons before becoming Troy's primary back in 2018.

- Became just sixth player in school history to rush for more than 100 yards in three straight games, the second to do so in four straight games and the first to do so in five straight games.

- Missed the bulk of the 2019 season after suffering a season-ending injury in the second game of the season.

## DK'S TIME TO SHINE

- When Preseason Sun Belt Offensive Player of the Year B.J. Smith was lost to injury in the second week of the season, DK Billingsley was called upon to carry the load.

- Rushed for 100 yards at Akron in his first game as the primary starter and followed with 103 yards against Arkansas State. He added his third game in triple figures with 100 yards in a win over South Alabama. He made it four games over 100 yards with a career-best 163 yards on just 14 carries against Georgia Southern.

- Became the first Trojan since Jordan Chunn in 2017 to rush for three touchdowns in a game when he found the end zone trice against Georgia State.

- Finished the season 63rd nationally averaging 74.9 yards per game while his 10 rushing touchdowns were the 54th most in the country.

- Troy showed off its running back depth against Middle Tennessee with six different running backs toting the rock in the win.

- Last year's leading rusher DK Billingsley didn't even carry the ball until the third quarter.

- Troy's running backs averaged 5.40 yards per carry in the game.

## A STABLE OF RUNNING BACKS

- A lot of teams throw around the phrase "a stable of running backs" but that is just the reality at Troy.

- B.J. Smith redshirted last season after his week two injury and he is joined on the depth chart by four others, yes FOUR other running backs -- all of whom are expected to play impactful snaps for the Trojans.

- True freshman Kimani Vidal has turned quite a few heads during his short time at Troy after he enrolled in January. Led Marietta (Ga.) High School to the Georgia 7A state title as a senior; named the game's MVP as he rushed for a pair of touchdowns in Marietta's 17-9 win over Lowndes, which was the school's first state title since 1967. Rushed for 1,589 yards and 24 touchdowns in 15 games (105.9 yards per game).

- Redshirt freshman Jamontez Woods also missed a bulk of time in 2019 due to injury but averaged 4.8 yards per carry in his four games of action. Rated as one of the top 100 running backs (247Sports) coming out of Gadsden City (Ala.) High School.

- Charles Strong sat out the 2019 season after transferring from Texas A&M. Rushed for nearly 4,000 career yards and scored 48 touchdowns in four seasons at Union County (Fla.) High School where he was a ESPN four-star prospect.

- Geiger caught a pass on all 12 of his targets at Coastal Carolina; his 12 receptions ranked as the fifth most in a game in school history.

- Among players active this fall, Geiger's reception (77) and receptions per game (6.4) totals from last season rank second nationally while his five 100-plus yard games last season are the third most.

- Geiger was named the Sun Belt Conference Newcomer of the Year in 2019 after he finished second in the league in receptions, yards (during regular season) and yards per game.

- Last season, came up big on third downs with nine of his 11 catches resulting in a first down, including a pair of touchdowns.

**EAFFORD A HOME RUN THREAT**

- Senior wide receiver Tray Eafford has a knack for the big play ... Eafford's nine career touchdown receptions have gone for an average of 35.78 yards (15, 16, 25, 29, 40, 43, 44, 50, 60).

- Four Trojans made their first career starts on the defensive side of the football against Middle Tennessee - Elgin Griffin, Javon Solomon, Reddy Steward and Craig Slocum.

- Troy held Middle Tennessee to just 241 yards of offense, the fewest against an FBS opponent since limiting South Alabama to 224 yards in 2017.

- The 154 passing yards allowed by Troy's defense was the fewest against an FBS opponent since 2018 (App State).

- Troy's tackle numbers were low for the game ... the Trojans were only credited with four assisted tackles against the Blue Raiders.

- Safety Craig Slocum was named to the Pro Football Focus National Team of the Week ... he intercepted a pass and was credited with one tackle, while game film showed he had at least three tackles in the game.

- True freshman Luis Medina won the 285-pound weight class his junior and senior seasons at Chattooga High School ... Chattooga won the Georgia 2A team title his senior year. Medina also finished second as a sophomore.

- The two did meet on the mat and the stories about who won and by how many points is up for contention between the pair.

- Moving one level back on the defense, linebacker KJ Robertson was an Alabama state champion at Thompson High School.

## CHOLOH PUTTING POINTS ON THE BOARD

- Will Cholah won the race for the first points on the board by a defensive player after sacking Middle Tennessee's quarterback in the end zone for a safety in the second quarter.

- The safety turned into nine points after the Trojans scored a touchdown on the ensuing drive.

## LB NOTES

### EXPERIENCED GROUP

- Troy's linebacker corp is the most experienced unit on the defensive side of the ball with Carlton Martial, KJ Robertson and Justin Whisenhunt all returning with significant starts under their belts.

- The trio have combined to start 42 games despite the Trojans only playing two linebackers in their 4-2-5 scheme.

### NEW LB, WHO DIS?

- Redshirt-freshman Tre' Ross has a new home for the Trojans after signing with the program as a tight end.

- Ross approached the coaches about playing defense and with injuries piling up last season, Ross got his wish before Troy's game at Louisiana.

- The move was made permanent over the offseason and Ross dropped 70 spots off his uniform number from 85 to 15 in his new role.

## SECONDARY NOTES

### WELCOME BACK

- Troy welcomes back one of the premier cornerbacks in the Sun Belt Conference for the 2020 season in Terence Dunlap who was ineligible for the 2019 season.

- As a sophomore in 2018, allowed only 53.1 percent of targeted passes to be completed, which was the second best among all Trojans. He also finished with 43 tackles, broke up four passes and allowed an average of just 2.15 yards after catch.

- Dunlap's return was all that the Trojans could have hoped for as he intercepted passes on back-to-back Middle Tennessee drives in the third quarter ... both led to Troy touchdowns which put the game on ice.

### SECONDARY SHUFFLE

- Freshman All-American Dell Pettus is making the second move of his young career.

- Pettus was originally slotted to play cornerback for the Trojans but shifted to free safety and thrived in the roll. In 2020, Pettus is on the move again, this time to strong safety.

- He is well prepared for the move thanks to a productive offseason ... Pettus added 11 pounds to his frame (now 196 pounds) under new strength coach Rusty Whitt. Pettus also added a new number switching from 19 to 31.

## SCHOLARSHIP = EARNED

- The Troy coaching staff bestowed a scholarship upon Craig Slocum on the opening day of fall camp this year; it's safe to say after just one game he's earned it.

- Named to the Pro Football Focus National Team of the Week after posting a 91.5 overall grade with an interception and three tackles (per PFF, was only officially credited with one tackle).

- Slocum intercepted a pass in the second quarter and returned it for a touchdown. However, it was called back after a questionable block in the back penalty -- MTSU's quarterback was in pursuit of Slocum and came to an abrupt stop in front of Carlton Martial who had no choice but to run into him.

### STRONG START

- Troy's rebuilt secondary got off to a solid start according to Pro Football Focus.

- Cornerbacks Terence Dunlap and Reddy Steward combined to allow just two receptions on five total targets. Dunlap intercepted a pair of passes while Steward broke up two passes.

- Craig Slocum was named to the Pro Football Focus National Team of the Week after posting a 91.5 overall grade, while Kyle Nixon did not allow a reception on two targets and broke up a pass.

### LEGASSEY WINS STARTING JOB

- Evan Legassey made one of the biggest field goals in Troy history, a 37-yard kick as time expired in the first half at LSU ... Troy would go on to win the game 24-21.

- He would lose his job the following week after missing two field goals against South Alabama and he ended the year 1-for-5 in that department.

- Two years later, Legassey is back as Troy's starting field goal kicker and his first attempt was a 47-yard bomb against Middle Tennessee that was right down the middle and would have been good from 55 yards.

- He also was true on all six of his extra point attempts. Troy kickers have now made 137 straight PATs dating back to the 2017 season.

## MARTIAL'S STORY

• Carlton Martial's story is a remarkable one. He came to Troy as a 5-foot-9 walk-on with no FBS offers, three FCS offers (Alabama A&M, Alcorn State, Jackson State) and doue DII offers (North Alabama, West Alabama, Tuskegee, West Florida).

• He redshirted the 2017 season and made his mark on the scout team, so much so that former head coach Neal Brown put Martial on scholarship before he every played a collegiate snap.

• The the Sun Belt by storm his freshman season en route to Freshman All-America honors ... was rated by PFF as the 20th best defensive player in the country and fifth nationally against the run – three of the four players ahead of him were selected within the first 13 picks of the NFL Draft (minimum of 375 snaps).

• In 2019, he was named to the Pro Football Focus All-America Second Team and was named the No. 35 player in the country by PFF ... Became just the 12th player and first underclassman in the last 20 years at the FBS level to finish a season with at least 100 tackles, 15 tackles for loss and three interceptions ... Named to the All-Sun Belt First Team ... Closed the year with 126 tackles, the most by a Troy player since 2000, and 18.5 tackles for loss, the fifth most in a season in Troy history, and three picks ... Only player in the country to rank in the top eight nationally in tackles (10.5) and tackles for loss per game (1.54).

• His 126 tackles stand as the most by a Troy player since 2000. That is significant because the NCAA changed the rule how defensive stats were measured prior to the 2004 season.

• Added to the rule book in 2004 was the statement – "Defensive numbers compiled by the coaching staff or other university/college personnel using game film will not be considered 'official' NCAA statistics."

• Layman's terms? Prior to 2004, schools would adjust defensive tackle numbers quite considerably based on the loose definition by coaches when they broke down the game film on Sundays after games – players tackle totals would regularly double from Saturday to Monday and clog up the record books with totals that seem unreachable.

## MARTIAL ALL OVER THE FIELD

• Last season against Southern Miss, Martial finished with 16 tackles -- the seventh most in school history -- and 4.5 tackles for loss, which tied DeMarcus Ware (2004) and Kenny Mainor (2007) for the school record.

## UNTIED SHOE

• Every player has their own superstitions but Carlton Martial might be alone with his.

• Look down at his left foot during the game and you'll noticed that he left shoe is untied. Why? No good reason other than it would never stay tied his freshman year at McGill-Toolen High School so he just left it untied and a tradition was born.

Troy Too Much for Middle Tennessee in Opener

MURFREESBORO, Tenn. – A Will Choloh safety and a five-yard touchdown pass from sophomore Gunnar Watson to senior Khalil McClain with three seconds left in the first half powered the Troy Trojans football program to a commanding 19-point lead, en route to a 47-14 victory over Middle Tennessee at Floyd Stadium to capture the coveted Palladium Trophy.



In his first start as a Trojan, Watson impressed, completing 26-of-37 passes for 248 yards and his first career touchdown. Watson becomes the first Troy quarterback to win his first career start since Corey Robinson defeated Bowling Green back in 2010 (Sept. 4).

Troy (1-0) was extremely balanced on the afternoon, rushing for 240 yards on 55 carries. Redshirt senior BJ Smith was the Trojans leading rusher (10 rushes, 81 yards) in his much-anticipated return to action.

Seven different Trojans were credited with a touchdown led by McClain (6 receptions, 75 yards and 2 touchdowns) and Charles Strong (11 rushes, 54 yards and a touchdown).

The Trojans reached at least 400 yards of total offense for the ninth time in Chip Lindsey's tenure (13 games) as head coach, as 10 different Trojans recorded a reception.

On the opposite side of the ball, the new look Trojan defense impressed, forcing Asher O'Hara and the Blue Raiders (0-2) offensive attack into three interceptions and two turnovers on downs. O'Hara completed 16-of-23 for just 109 yards and zero touchdowns. The Blue Raiders recorded just 241 yards of total offense.

The Trojans defense held an opponent to fewer than 250 yards of total offense for the first time since they held Akron to just 242 yards in a 35-7 victory.
