**MONTANA STATE HEAD COACH TRICIA BINFORD (BOISE STATE, 1995)
OVERALL RECORD/YEARS: 254-202 (16 YEARS); BIG SKY CONFERENCE RECORD: 156-105

When Tricia Binford took over the Montana State women's basketball program in the spring of 2005, she inherited a program in search of stability and someone to guide the Bobcats back to the upper echelons of the Big Sky Conference.

Now, 16 years later, the former Boise State and WNBA standout is MSU's longest tenured coach as well as its winningest in history with an unprecedented level of excellence on the court, in the classroom and within the community. Those three hallmarks make Bobcat basketball one of the most respected programs in the country.

For the past 13 seasons, Binford has not had a losing season, a stretch that ranks No. 1 in the annals of Bobcat women's basketball. MSU averaged 2,322 fans during the 2019-20 campaign, ranking second in the Big Sky and among the top 61 in all of NCAA Division I women's hoops. To say Binford has turned MSU, Worthington Arena and the greater Gallatin Valley into a

hot-bed for the sport is an understatement. The Cats have won 54 of its last 62 games inside the friendly confines of the Brick Breeden Fieldhouse, which includes Montana State's stretch of 31 consecutive home court wins (Dec. 2015 - Jan. 2018) that ranked second only to national power UConn at the time the streak was snapped.

Last winter, and for the 14th straight season, the Bobcats did not have a losing record in Big Sky action. The Bobcats finished Big Sky play with a 19-1 league mark. No other women's basketball program in Big Sky history has ever won 19 conference games. For its efforts, MSU entered the 2020 Big Sky Conference Tournament as the No. 1 seed.

On the court, Binford's squads have been a part of four championship games, winning the Big Sky Tournament title in 2017, while its 2020 championship game appearance was halted by the COVID-19 pandemic. MSU made 14 straight postseason appearances, including owning the No. 1 seed in 2016, 2017 and 2020. In the classroom, the Bobcats have been ranked among the top 12 academic teams in the nation at the NCAA Division I level in five of the last eleven years. And, within the community, the women's program has consistently given back its time.

Binford has notched 254 career victories at Montana State, which ranks first on MSU's all-time women's basketball coaching ladder and fourth in Big Sky history. She has registered 156 victories in Big Sky Conference play.

In her 15 years in the Gallatin Valley, Binford has produced a whopping 104 Big Sky Conference All-Academic honorees; 32 Big Sky Conference Players of the Week; 28 All-Big Sky Conference performers; one Two-Time Academic All-America; five CoSIDA Academic All District VII recipients; three Big Sky MVPs - Fallyn Freije, Peyton Ferris and Jasmine Hommes; two Big Sky Conference Defensive Players of the Year; three Big Sky Newcomers of the Year; two Big Sky Conference Freshman of the Year; three Big Sky Top Reserves of the Year; one All-America Honorable Mention in Katie Bussey in 2012; and five MSU/Big Sky Conference Female Scholar Athletes of the Year.

Binford became the 11th Head Women's Basketball Coach at Montana State on April 13, 2005. Prior to MSU, Binford, served two seasons at Utah State. At USU, Binford earned her coaching wings under head coach Raegan Scott-Pebbley. The duo helped reestablish the Aggie program following a 16-year hiatus. With the Aggies, Binford was responsible for recruiting, defense, and guard play.

Binford also served as an assistant coach at her alma mater - Boise State University - from 1999-2001.

Binford was the 31st overall pick in the 1998 WNBA draft, and played professionally with the Cleveland Rockers from 1999-02, where she participated on the 2001 Eastern

Conference Championship team. She played with the Utah Starzz from 1998-99.

Binford played professionally in Australia for two years, including stints with the NWBL's Brisbane Blazers, Latrobe Demons and Launceston Tornados.

Playing in the NWBL in 1997, she set a single-game scoring record with 67 points - which was part of a quadruple-double along with 14 assists, ten steals and ten rebounds.

As Tricia Bader, she was a three-time All-Big Sky Conference selection on some of the best teams in Boise State history. She led the Broncos to a national ranking and the NCAA tournament.

Binford was also a member of the 1993 West Team at the U.S. Olympic Festival coached by current Connecticut head man Geno Auriemma.

For her efforts, she was named the 1996 Idaho NCAA Woman of the Year and was inducted in the Boise State Hall of Fame in 2001.

Binford left Boise State with the school's career assists record and was second in steals. She posted a career 1,171 points — all from the point guard position.

Binford prepped at Roaring Fork High School in Carbondale, Colo., where she was the Colorado Player of the Year and a Street and Smith's High School All-American in 1991.

She received her degree in criminal justice from Boise State in 1995.

THAT WAS THE GAME THAT WAS:

Montana State senior and the reigning Big Sky Conference Top Reserve Tori Martell nailed a Bobcat school-record eight three-pointers and scored a career-high 26 points to lift MSU to an 84-72 victory over North Dakota on Sunday afternoon in Worthington Arena as the Bobcats opened its 2020-21 campaign.

With the victory, Montana State ran its consecutive win streak to 18 games, also a school record. The 2019-20 Bobcats rattled off 17 straight victories from Jan. 11 to March 11 to setup Sunday's record setting performance.

Montana State (1-0) hit seven triples in the opening stanza as six different Bobcats connected from long distance. Coupled with two Darian White free throws, the Bobcats led 23-16 after the opening 10 minutes. MSU pushed the margin to 42-33 at intermission behind 15 points from Martell and eight via White. In all, MSU connected on 10-of-21 from beyond the arc at the break, while Martell went five-of-five from 3-point territory.

Montana State took its largest lead of contest at 56-35 on a Martell three-pointer at the 5:51 mark of the third frame. North Dakota (0-2) finished the third quarter on an 11-3 run to cut MSU's advantage to 62-49 heading into the final 10-minutes.

The Fighting Hawks closed to within 76-67 with three-minutes remaining, but MSU answered with a three-pointer from freshman Taylor Janssen and Martell's eighth triple to secure the victory.

Martell finished connecting on eight-of-11 from long distance and added a pair of free throws to shatter her previous career-high of 19 points set during her sophomore season.

White finished with 22 points- just one

point short of matching her career-high. The Boise product went seven-of-12 from the field and was seven-of-12 from the line, as well. White also added six assists, five rebounds and four steals.

Also posting double-digits for MSU was Janssen with 10 points. The 6-3 freshman from Rosemount, Minn., also recorded five rebounds, three assists and two steals.

UND held a sizeable 52-39 advantage under the boards as MSU gave up 22 offensive rebounds to the Fighting Hawks. Bobcat freshman Katelynn Limardo guided Montana State under the glass with a team-high six rebounds.

For the game, MSU shot 38.6% from the field and tallied 14-of-40 from beyond the arc. The Bobcats defense held UND to just two-of-16 from long distance.

THE SCOUTING REPORT:

BYU - Brigham Young defeated Utah State 87-66 on Monday night in Logan. The Cougars (2-1) were led by Shaylee Gonzales with 27 points and Lauren Gustin with 21 points and 17 rebounds. Gonzales is a 5-10 sophomore guard from Gilbert, Arizona, while Gustin is a 6-1 sophomore forward from Salem, Utah. After three games, BYU is led by Gonzales, who averages 20.7 points per game. She is also BYU's top three-point threat, connecting on ten triples to date. Also averaging double-digits in Gustin and Paisley Harding, who average 13.3 and 12.0 points, respectively. Gustin is hauling down a BYU best 13.7 rebounds per contest. As a team, the Cougars are shooting 42.7% from the field, 37.5% from long distance and 84.2% at the free throw line. In BYU's two wins over LSU and Utah State, the Cougars margin of victory was +18.5. BYU's lone loss

was a 77-48 drubbing by Pac 12 rival Washington, in Seattle.

Utah - Utah (1-1, 1-1) opened its Pac 12 season last weekend, dropping an 85-43 decision to No. 10 Oregon in Eugene. Against the Ducks, Utah was paced by Niyah Becker, who tallied 11 points and two rebounds. She was the only Ute player in double-figures. As a team, Utah shot 28.6% from the field, including 15.4% from long distance. On Tuesday night, the Utes knocked off No. 15 Oregon State 85-79 in Corvallis. Brynna Maxwell, a 6-foot sophomore guard from Gig Harbor, Wash., guided the Utes with 34 points on 10-15 from the field, including four 3-pointers. Maxwell also went 10-10 at the line. On the season, Utah is led by Maxwell, who averages 20 points per game.

NO PLACE LIKE HOME: The Bobcats held the nation's second longest home court win streak (31) before it was snapped by Portland State on Jan. 11, 2018. Since losing to San Diego on Nov. 24, 2015, MSU has gone 56-11 (83.%) in The Brick.

THE STREAK: With its win over North Dakota on Sunday afternoon, the Bobcats ran its consecutive winning streak to a school-record 18 games. Montana State started the streak last season on Jan. 11, 2020 with a 73-62 victory at Portland State. MSU closed out the 2019-20 season with a 76-71 win over Northern Arizona in semifinal action at the Big Sky Tournament on March 11 in Boise, Idaho. The season was halted the next day due to COVID-19. MSU's 18-game win streak is the third longest in the nation, behind only Oregon (23) and Princeton (22).

PRESEASON ACCOLADES: Montana State sophomore Darian White, who broke onto the women's basketball scene last winter, has been named to the preseason all-Big Sky Conference team voted on by BSC head coaches and media members. White, a product of Boise, Idaho, was the 2020 Big Sky Freshman of the Year, after helping the Bobcats to a 25-6 overall mark, a dominating 19-1 league ledger and a Big Sky title. In what was arguably one of the best inaugural campaigns in MSU history, White collected 394 points, 150 rebounds, 104 assists and 76 steals. She played and started in all 31 games, averaging 12.7 points, 4.8 rebounds, 3.4 assists and 2.5 steals per game. White, who recorded 25 games in double-digit scoring, including the last ten games, notched a season-high 23 points in MSU's win at Eastern Washington connecting on eight-of-15 from the field and six-of-six at the line. She finished 25th in the nation in steals and 31st in the country in steals per game. In MSU's two victories at the Big Sky Tournament, White was averaging 19 points, 4.5 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 2.0 assists per game, before the championship game was called due to COVID-19. Northern Arizona's Khiarica Rasheed was tabbed the preseason MVP. Also named to the preseason all-conference squad were Gina Marxen, Idaho, Beyonce Bea, Idaho, Dora Goles, Idaho State and Alisha Davis, Northern Colorado.

NOTABLES:

*With its win over North Dakota, the Bobcats are ranked No. 1 in the nation in three-point field-goal percentage defense, after holding the Fighting Hawks to just two-of-16 (12.5%) from long distance.

*Conversely, the Bobcats were red-hot from

beyond the arc against North Dakota. In fact, all of MSU's field-goals in the first quarter (7) came from long-distance. The Cats finished the UND game connecting on 14 3-pointers, which ranks No. 1 in the nation for three-pointers per game.

*Individually, Tori Martell's eight 3-pointers per game ranks No. 1 in the nation. Her eight triples against North Dakota broke the MSU school-record of seven previously held by Amy Meckling (Jan. 2, 2000), Brandi Lewis (Feb. 13, 2003) and Hannah Caudill (Jan. 28, 2017).

*Tori Martell's eight 3-pointers against North Dakota is the most in the nation this season. Martell's eight is tied for most with Tori Williams, Colorado State, Taylor Mikesell, Oregon, Katie Benzan, Maryland, Hanna Hall, Buffalo, Priscilla Williams, Syracuse, and Kyra Spiwak, Providence.

*Montana State leads the Big Sky Conference in 3-point field-goal defense (12.5%), 3-point field-goals per game (14.0), fewest turnovers (12.0) and fewest fouls (22).

*Montana State associate head coach Sunny Smallwood is one of the longest tenured assistants at the NCAA Division I level. Smallwood began her career at Washington State in 1990 and has gone on to serve at Washington, Cal, Nebraska, Boise State and Arizona. Before starting her collegiate career, she spent 7 years as head coach at Boise High School.

*The Bobcats have claimed three Big Sky regular season titles in the last five years. MSU won regular season championships in 2016, 2017, and 2020.
