## QUICK HITS

- BYU and Cal Poly are meeting for the first time since 2003. The series is 1-1 overall, with Cal Poly winning 14-5 in 2002 and the Cougars winning 11-1 the following year.
- The Cougar bullpen currently boasts a 1.40 ERA after pitching the majority of three out of the team's first four games. Nine different pitchers have already come on in relief, including six true freshmen. Seven pitchers have yet to allow an earned run.
- Senior catcher Abraham Valdez leads the Cougars batting .400 with a double, two runs and two walks. Freshman Andrew Pintar is next at .333 with two doubles, two runs, an RBI and a walk. Junior Hayden Leatham leads the team with 11 total bases, including two home runs and a double for three RBI and two runs.
- BYU head coach Mike Littlewood enters his eighth season at the helm of the Cougars and has a 216-162 (.573) overall record and 111-75 (.597) mark in WCC games. Last season's WCC Coach of the Year, Littlewood ranks 9th in overall winning percentage in WCC history.
- BYU was picked to finish second in the WCC by conference coaches but had five of the nine first place votes. Mitch McIntyre and Easton Walker were also both named preseason All-WCC after both players were named All-WCC last season. On the national front, sophomore RHP Reid McLaughlin was named a preseason All-American by the NCBWA.
- The Cougar defense is ranked 11th in the nation after pulling off five double plays through four games while sporting a .987 fielding percentage. The top six fielding percentages seasons in program history have all come under Littlewood, including last year's program-record .974 percentage.
- Last week's win over No. 25 Oregon State was the Cougars' first win over the Beavers since 1991, breaking an eight-game OSU win streak. It was also BYU's first win over a ranked team since defeating No. 22 Gonzaga on May 27, 2017, to win the WCC Tournament.

## 2020 SEASON PREVIEW

- BYU returns 35% of its runs scored, 33% of its hits, 43% of its doubles, 38% of its triples, 34% of its home runs, 36% of its RBIs, 35% of its walks and 49% of its stolen bases from 2019.
- The Cougars also return 81% of their wins, 82% of their saves, 69% of their innings pitched, and 68% of their strikeouts from 2019.
- All-WCC honoree Easton Walker (2.20, 7-2), Freshman All-American reliever Reid McLaughlin (2.61, 7-1) and Justin Sterner (2.92, 8-3) were the first three BYU pitchers to finish with an ERA under 3.00 with at least 50 innings pitched in the same season since 1967. All three return in 2020.
- Junior Danny Gelalich has the top average among returners, batting .328 last season. Junior Mitch McIntyre is next at .291; the left-hander was second on the team with 14 doubles and seven home runs with 30 walks.
- Sixteen freshmen (including redshirt Jack Sterner) are on this year's roster. D1Baseball ranked the class 16th and Baseball America 25th in the nation. Other newcomers include transfers Chase Bauerle, Joshua Cowden, Hayden Leatham and Jacob Rogers.

## LAST WEEK

BYU went 2-2 competing in the Sanderson Ford Baseball Classic in Surprise, Ariz., defeating Gonzaga before losing both games of a doubleheader and then closing out with a win against Oregon State.

BYU scored six runs in the eighth innings against the Zags to blow open a tied game and win, 7-1 in a non-conference game against their WCC rival.

New Mexico just needed two runs in game one and came from behind in game two to defeat the Cougars twice. BYU held a 3-0 lead in the second game but lost, 5-3, behind a fielding miscue and a pair of wild pitches.

Closing out against Oregon State, this time it was BYU who rallied a comeback down 3-1 to win 4-3. The Cougars loaded the bases in the eighth in a tie game, then scored after Zack Peterson was hit by a pitch. Three freshmen pitchers then shut down the Beavers' bats to win.

Cal Poly went 2-1 last week at the MLB4 in Scottsdale, Ariz., defeating UConn, losing to Michigan and then beating Vanderbilt.

The Mustangs shut out the Huskies, 5-0, on seven hits against UConn's two.

In game two, No. 12 (now top five in the polls) Michigan went up 5-0 thanks in part to six Cal Poly errors and went on to win, 8-5.

Finally, Cal Poly defeated defending national champion Vanderbilt 9-8 by scoring two runs in the bottom of the ninth. The Mustangs loaded the bases, then two sacrifice flies brought in the winning runs.

## PITCHING THE LIGHTS OUT

BYU's pitching staff was one of the best in Cougar history in 2019. With most major contributors from last season returning in 2020 to join a highly rated recruiting class, second-year pitching coach Michael Bradshaw will look to push BYU to greater heights this season. Here are some of the Cougars' notables from 2019:

- BYU's 3.65 ERA was the best team mark since the 1982 staff posted a 3.61
- The Cougars' .256 opposing batting average, 4.18 runs allowed per game and 7.88 strikeouts per game were each the best marks in program history over the last 40 seasons
- BYU's K/BB ratio of 2.59 was the second-best in program history, just behind a 2.39 in 1967
- BYU's 8.57 hits allowed per game was the lowest average since 7.88 in 1991
