QUICK HITS

- BYU and New Mexico are meeting for the second time this season after playing a doubleheader on Feb. 15 in Surprise, Ariz. The Lobos won both games by scores of 5-4 and 2-0. This will be BYU's first trip to Albuquerque since playing a three-game series as Mountain West Conference foes in 2010.
- New Mexico has won seven of the last eight matchups dating back to 2010 with seven of the eight games decided by two runs or fewer. The Cougars' last victory was a 1-0 game in April 2011 in Provo.
- In the latest national statistical rankings, BYU ranks first in batters hit (1), third in double plays (9), eighth in sac flies (7), 30th in sac bunts (5) and 55th in walks (37). Mitch McIntyre is also 16th in the nation with nine walks drawn.
- BYU head coach Mike Littlewood enters his eighth season at the helm of the Cougars and has a 220-163 (.574) overall record and 111-75 (.597) mark in WCC games. Last season's WCC Coach of the Year, Littlewood ranks 9th in overall winning percentage in WCC history.
- BYU was picked to finish second in the WCC by conference coaches but had five of the nine first place votes. Mitch McIntyre and Easton Walker were also both named preseason All-WCC after both players were named All-WCC last season. On the national front, sophomore RHP Reid McLaughlin was named a preseason All-American by the NCBWA.
- All five of BYU's wins this year have come with game-winning runs scored in the eighth inning or later. The first four wins all came in the eighth inning with the Cougars' Saturday win at Cal Poly scoring in the top of the 14th frame. From the eighth inning on, BYU is outscoring opponents 15-5 on the year.
- Andrew Pintar and Bryan Call lead the team with .286 batting averages. On the mound, starter Justin Sterner has a 0.75 ERA in 12 innings, allowing just one earned run against 14 strikeouts. Another seven pitchers have thrown at least one inning without allowing an earned run, led by Bryce Robison who has started his career without allowing a run in his first 6.2 innings pitched.

LAST WEEK

BYU went 3-1 on the road at Cal Poly, with all three Cougar victories coming late - the last in 14 innings.

Four runs in the top of the eighth broke open a tied game to give BYU a 6-2 win in game one. Hayden Leatham's grounder brought in the game-winning run, then Austin Deming cleared the bases loaded with a triple. The Cougar pitching staff allowed zero earned runs with 10 strikeouts.

For the fourth time in four wins, BYU scored the game-winner in the eighth inning. This time, Danny Gelalich hit a sac fly to score Bryan Call. Freshman Bryce Robison earned the win, pitching the final three innings allowing just one hit.

In the first game of a Saturday doubleheader, BYU lost 10-0 on 16 hits.

Down 4-3 in the ninth with two outs, freshman Cutter Clawson came in to pitch hit and laced an RBI-double to tie the game. Both teams remained scoreless until the top of the 14th when Danny Gelalich hit a second RBI-double to score Peyton Cole. Tyson Heaton held the Mustangs scoreless over the final two frames to seal the win as the BYU pitching staff held Cal Poly without a run over the final seven innings and 12 of 14 overall.

New Mexico swept Northern Colorado at home last week in three games. The Lobos won game one, 7-6 behind six extra base hits.

In game one of a Sunday doubleheader, New Mexico scored a run in the bottom of the eighth to win, 3-2. In game two, the Lobos had a much easier time, taking a 9-0 win by out-hitting the Bears 11-3.

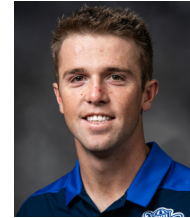
