QUICK HITS

- BYU and Oklahoma State have played 13 times previously with the Cowboys owning a 9-4 advantage. The two teams last faced off in a two-time series in Stillwater in 2009 with OSU winning both games. BYU's last victory came in a 9-8 road victory in 2005.
- The Cougars are 25-70 all-time against current Big 12 teams, including 38 games against TCU when both were members of the Mountain West Conference. BYU last played a Big 12 squad in a three-game sweep over Kansas in 2016.
- BYU is 6-13 playing in the state of Oklahoma, including 1-4 at Oklahoma, 2-4 at Oklahoma State and 3-5 at Oral Roberts.
- Thirty-four players have seen time this season, including 15 freshmen. Nine freshmen have made at least one appearance in the starting lineup, not counting Cy Nielson's two starts on the mound.
- BYU was picked to finish second in the WCC by conference coaches but had five of the nine
 first place votes. Mitch McIntyre and Easton Walker were also both named preseason AllWCC after both players were named All-WCC last season. On the national front, sophomore
 RHP Reid McLaughlin was named a preseason All-American by the NCBWA.
- Five of BYU's seven wins this year have come with game-winning runs scored in the eighth inning or later. The first four wins all came in the eighth inning with the Cougars' Saturday win at Cal Poly scoring in the top of the 14th frame. Seven games have been decided by two runs or fewer.
- Freshman Andrew Pintar leads the team with a .319 average among players with 20 or more
 at bats. The freshman also leads BYU with 15 hits, 11 runs and three doubles. On the mound,
 freshman Bryce Robison leads the team with a 1.42 ERA among pitchers with six innings
 pitched or more. Junior Justin Sterner leads the team with 19 strikeouts.
- BYU is 4-0 when scoring in the first inning, 4-0 when committing zero errors and 4-0 when out-hitting the opponent.

LAST WEEK

BYU went 1-3 on the road at New Mexico, winning just the third game of the series. In game one, the Cougars came back down 6-0 to tie the game at 6-6, then tied it again at 7-7 in the ninth. But a run with two outs in the bottom of the inning gave the Lobos an 8-7 victory.

In game two, the first of a Friday doubleheader, the BYU bats couldn't get going in a 4-0 loss. But in the nightcap, the Cougars set a season high with 18 runs on 17 hits, including four from Andrew Pintar and three from Jaren Hall highlighted by a grand slam.

Saturday resulted in a 12-1 loss as four runs in the bottom of the third gave New Mexico momentum the Lobos never relinguished.

On Tuesday, BYU did not allow a hit over the final seven innings of the game in a home-opening win against Utah Valley, 5-4. Six pitchers combined to shut out the Wolverines over the final eight innings. The Cougars brought in the game-winning run in the fifth inning on a bases loaded walk to defeat UVU for the ninth-straight time.
