## QUICK HITS

- BYU starts WCC play against LMU this week. The Lions hold a 17-15 edge in the all-time series with a tied 6-6 record in Provo. LMU has won five of the last seven in the series, including a 4-1 win in last year's WCC Tournament and a sweep of the Cougars in the last series played in Provo in 2018.
- Starters for BYU will again be RHP Justin Sterner, LHP Cy Nielson and RHP Jarod Lessar. Sterner has allowed no more than one run and four hits in three of four starts this season. Nielson is coming off a nine-strikeout performance at Oklahoma State while Lessar allowed only one hit in three innings in his start at OSU.
- Thirty-four players have seen time this season for BYU, including 15 freshmen. Nine freshmen have made at least one appearance in the starting lineup, not counting Cy Nielson's starts on the mound.
- BYU is averaging 8.38 strikeouts per game which would be second-highest in program history if the season ended today. The program record is 8.85 set in 1967; the current second-best mark is 8.31 in 1969 and third is 7.74 set last season.
- Five of BYU's seven wins this year have come with game-winning runs scored in the eighth inning or later. The first four wins all came in the eighth inning with the Cougars' Saturday win at Cal Poly scoring in the top of the 14th frame. Seven games have been decided by two runs or fewer.
- Freshman Andrew Pintar leads the team with a .286 average among players with 30 or more at bats. The freshman also leads BYU with 16 hits, 12 runs and three doubles. On the mound, freshman reliever Bryce Robison leads the team with a 1.32 ERA among pitchers with six innings pitched or more. Freshman Cy Nielson leads the team with 27 strikeouts.
- The BYU defense has turned 15 double plays this year, the 14th-most of any team in the nation. Most have been started by the freshman duo Brock Watkins and Andrew Pintar in the middle infield, with freshman Peyton Cole and sophomore Austin Deming contributing from their infield positions as well.

## LAST WEEK

BYU went 0-3 on the road at Oklahoma State. Despite only trailing the Pokes 15-14 in overall hits in the series, the Cougars were outscored 16-4 overall, losing by scores of 2-0, 6-1 and 8-3.

Game one was scoreless through six innings until OSU scratched across two in the seventh for the winning margin. BYU batters struck out 19 times in the contest and didn't have a hit after the first inning.

In game two, BYU starter Cy Nielson had a career high nine strikeouts in seven innings, but two home runs from OSU were too much for the Cougars.

With game three tied 1-1 in the fifth, Oklahoma State scored seven unanswered to sweep the series, getting hits in key moments off seven BYU pitchers.

LMU swept San Jose State on the road last week, winning by scores of 7-5, 8-3 and 7-2.

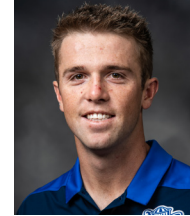
