OPENING TIP: Colorado is averaging 41.2 points in the second half of games this season shooting 46.7 percent from the field and 39.8 percent from 3-point range. In the first half the Buffaloes average 33.7 points while shooting 40.1 percent from the field and 31.3 percent from 3-point range.

ABOUT THE BUFFALOES: Colorado is 7-2 overall, has won two straight and four of its last five. The Buffaloes are coming off their biggest win of the season, a 68-66 decision over Xavier, ranked No. 13 (Associated Pres)/No. 14 (USA Today Coaches) in the latest Top 25 polls.

Colorado ventures away from Boulder for the third time this season,

and its second true road contest. The Buffaloes picked up their first road win over another West Coast Conference team, a 76-63 triumph over Portland on Dec. 3.

Colorado is averaging 74.9 points per game while shooting 43 percent from the field. The Buffaloes are outrebounding their opponents by just under eight boards per game. Defensively, Colorado has held the opposition to 64.7 points per game. The Buffaloes are second in the Pac-12 Conference in 3-point defense (.273) while ranking third in offensive rebounds (13.6 orpg) and fourth in field goal percentage defense (.376), rebounding margin (+7.3) and rebounding offense (42.4 rpg).

Depth and balance have been a key for Colorado. Three Buffaloes are averaging double-digits in scoring while four more are averaging between five and 10 an outing. Four players have at least four rebounds per game while five have at least eight assists.

Senior **Derrick White** is averaging 15.0 points, 4.2 rebounds and 3.6 assists per game while hitting a team-best 52.0 percent from the field. White had a game-high 23 points along with six rebounds and four assists in the win over Xavier. He was named to the Legends Classic All-Tournament team averaging 18.0 points, 5.5 assists and 5.0 rebounds, shooting 54 percent against Notre Dame and Texas. He scored 20 points and dished out a team-season high nine assists against the Fighting Irish. The nine assists are the most by a Buffalo since Askia Booker had 12 against UCLA on Feb. 13, 2014. White had a team-high 16 points with 5 rebounds, 2 assists, 2 steals and 2 blocks against Texas.

White is seventh in steals, 10th in assists 11th in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.1) and 15th in scoring and field goal percentage on the Pac-12 charts.

Xavier Johnson is second on the team in scoring at 14.8 points per game while ranking third in rebounds at 6.3 an outing. Johnson had 18 points and seven rebounds in the win over Xavier, hitting 7-of-11 from the field including 3-of-4 from 3-point range. His second 3-pointer against the Musketeers was the 100th of his career. Johnson has made 12 of his last 22 field goal attempts (.545).

He averaged 19 points over three-game span which included the Legends Classic and Wofford, putting in a pair of 20-point performances. Johnson matched a career high with a team season-best 27 points against Wofford. He also had a season-high 12 rebounds against the Terriers, logging his seventh career double-double. Johnson had a game-high 23 points in the Legends Classic semifinal against Notre Dame.

On the Pac-12 leaderboard, Johnson ranks eighth in 3-point percentage, 17th in scoring and 20th in rebounding.

George King is third on the team in scoring at 11.2 points per game and second in rebounding at 7.1 per contest. King recorded his third double-double of the season, and fourth of his career, with 16 points and a team-high 10 rebounds against Xavier. His three double-doubles have come in the last six contests.

King had a fantastic Legends Classic, recording back-to-back double-doubles and averaging 14.5 points and 13.0 rebounds over the two-day series. He tallied a personal-best 13 rebounds in both contests. King scored 17 points against Notre Dame while pitching in 12 in the win over Texas. He had 10 rebounds in the first half alone against Texas.

King is 15th in defensive rebounds (5.2 drpg) and 17th in overall

and 10 rebounds. Buff sophomore **George King** led Colorado in scoring with 23 points, including a 4-tor-6 night from 3-point range, while **Josh Fortune** added seven points, six rebounds and five assists and **Dom Collier** had a nine-point, seven-rebound, four-assist effort.

Nick Emery led BYU with 23 points, 18 of them coming in the second half, when the Cougars turned a potential blowout into a game that kept the biggest Coors Events Center crowd of the season (8,913) in their seats until the end. The Buff's pattern this year has been to start slowly and play well in the second half. Saturday night, they changed it

up and put together probably their best first half of the season, taking a 48-36 lead into the locker room at intermission. Scott had 16 points in the first half and King and Xavier Talton each had eight as the Buffs took control midway through the half with a 12-2 run and seemed prepared to blow the game open.

That feeling didn't change in the early minutes of the second half. CU opened the period by outscoring the Cougars 13-0, and with 15:46 left in the game, Colorado held a 61-36 lead.

At that point, all that seemed left for the Buffs was to take care of the lead and coast home with the win. The Cougars, however, put the brakes on in a hurry. Almost before Colorado fans had a chance to revel in the big lead, the Cougars crafted an 18-3 burst that reduced the deficit to 10 with 11 minutes still left in the game.

"We knew they were going to make a run, no question," Boyle said. "We helped it with six turnovers in eight possessions. It went from a 25-point game to a 10-point game pretty darned quickly."

Indeed, in the few minutes when the Buffs were committing six of their 13 total turnovers, the Cougars were finding their shooting eye. Emery and fellow freshman Zac Seljaas (18 points) fueled a 13-0 BYU surge that saw the Cougars pull to within 64-54, finally forcing Boyle to call a timeout.

"I was going to call a timeout (earlier), but there was a media timeout coming," Boyle said. "I have confidence in our defense. We're up 13, then Emery comes down and and hits a 3 in transition and cuts it to 10. I called a timeout a possession too late."

But from that point on, the Buffs managed to keep the Cougars at bay. A King 3-pointer, two Scott free throws and a **Tory Miller** tip-in bumped the lead back to 16, 83-67, with 4:40 left, and while the Cougars cut the lead back to eight with 2:40 left and to six in the waning seconds, they never managed to get it back to a one-possession game.

An Emery basket with 1:10 left pulled BYU to within seven, 87-80, but King and Collier each hit a pair of free throws and Fortune hit one in the final minute to seal the win.

"Colorado is a really good team," BYU's Rose said. "They are very well-coached and they spaced the floor really well. They beat us in big, key moments. We did some really good things ... but overall, Colorado really impressed me with their team and how they play together."

The Buffs finished with a 49-41 edge in rebounding and held the Cougars to 39 percent shooting from the field (30 for 77). CU shot 46 percent (31 for 68) and recorded 18 assists against 13 turnovers.

Guard **Josh Fortune** is Colorado's fourth leading scorer at 9.4 points per game. He tied a season-high with 14 points at Portland. He leads the Buffaloes and ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in free throw shooting at 88.6 percent, hitting on 31-of-35 attempts. Fortune saw his consecutive free throws made streak end at 19 against Portland. That streak included a perfect 10-of-10 game against ULM, the program's best performance without a miss since Askia Booker was 14-of-14 against DePaul on Dec. 22, 2014.

Wesley Gordon tops Colorado in rebounding at 8.9 per game. Gordon is pitching in 6.9 points per game while leading the squad in blocks (12) and ranking third in assists (18). After being held to three blocks in his first four games, he has nine in the last five, allowing him to climb into sole possession of second place on CU's all-time list at 168.

He has corralled at least nine rebounds in 7-of-9 games with his averaging upping to 10.3 over those contests. Gordon recorded his 11th career double-double with 11 points and 14 rebounds against Seattle U. He hit double-figures in rebounding for the 23rd time in his career with 10 at Portland.

On the Pac-12 charts, Gordon is third in offensive rebounding (3.1 orpg), eighth in overall rebounding, 10th in defensive boards (5.8 drpg) and 11th in blocked shots (1.3 bpg).

Sophomore **Thomas Akyazili** is second on the team in assists (2.3 apg) while scoring 3.4 points per contest. He had five points and dished out two assists against Colorado State. Akyazili dished out a career-best six assists in the season-opener against Sacramento State.

Junior **Tory Miller** is fourth on the team in blocks (5) and sixth in rebounds (3.9 rpg) while pitching in 5.3 points an outing. He had a season-high 10 points against ULM, the ninth double-figure scoring game of his career. He also added his first career 3-pointer (in five attempts) against Sacramento State.

Dominique Collier has missed the last seven games with a foot injury. He had a team-high 12 points in the opener against Sacramento State, hitting 4-of-6 from 3-point range. He saw limited minutes in the game against Seattle U due to that injury.

Freshmen Lucas Siewert and Deleon Brown had successful debuts against Sacramento State, both finishing with nine points. Siewert, a 6-10 forward, made all three of his shots from beyond the arc and had five rebounds. Brown, was 3-of-4 from the floor and dished out an assist. Bryce Peters, made is collegiate debut against ULM scoring his first career points on a dunk off a fast break. He finished with 9 points, 3 rebounds and a game-high 3 steals.

TICKETED FOR REDSHIRT: The Buffaloes are planning to redshirt two freshmen. **Dallas Walton**, a 7-0 forward and **Alexander Strating** a 6-7 forward. Walton earned All-Jefferson County Conference first team honors for Arvada (Colo.) West High School in 2015-16. Strating hails from the Netherlands and played for the Canarias Basketball Academy in Spain last year. Those plans could change early in the season if needed, but not later.

Namon Wright, a 6-5 guard, will sit out the 2016-17 season after transferring from Missouri and will have two years of eligibility remaining. He averaged 8.2 points and 3.8 rebounds and made 79 3-pointers in 61 games with the Tigers.

of its last five after starting the season out at 4-0. The Cougars have won 4-of-5 at home, including a 77-66 decision over Weber State on Dec. 7. BYU is averaging 86.6 points per game, leading the West Coast Conference and ranking 18th in the nation. The Cougars are second in NCAA Division I in rebounding, corralling 46.6 boards per game. BYU allows its opponents 76.1 points per game on 39.3 percent shooting.

Sophomore forward Eric Mika leads BYU at 21.4 points, 8.7 rebounds and 1.9 blocks per game. Mika, a Preseason All-WCC selection and Kareem Abdul-Jabbar Award candidate, is coming off a 26-point, 10-rebound effort against Weber State. Sophomore guard Nick Emery is averaging 15.3 points and leads BYU in 3-pointers with 21. Freshman guard TJ Haws is pitching in 11.8 points and 2.7 assists an outing.

Dave Rose is in his 12th season at BYU with a record of 289-102. His .739 winning percentage is a Cougars' record and is 10th among active NCAA coaches.

THE SERIES: This will be the 24th meeting between Colorado and BYU, but just the second in 61 years. The Buffaloes hold a 17-6 edge, claiming a 92-83 decision on Dec. 12, 2015, at the Coors Events Center. Colorado makes its first trip to Provo, Utah, since BYU won on back-to-back dates Dec. 16-17, 1955. Colorado is a perfect 10-0 against BYU in Boulder as the Cougars come to the base of the Flatirons for the first time since back-to-back games on Dec. 4 & 6, 1954. The series is tied 6-6 in Provo where the Cougars have won the last three. Colorado's last win at BYU came on Feb. 16, 1946, a 65-53 decision.

Tad Boyle is 1-0 against BYU as a head coach. Dave Rose is 0-1 against Colorado has a head coach.

RIGHT AT HOME: Colorado has won 13 of its last 14 and 23 of 25 in the friendly confines of the Coors Events Center.

The Buffaloes had a streak of 14-straight home wins against nonleague opponents snapped in the loss to Colorado State. When Pac-12 play begins, Colorado will bring an eight-game win streak against league opposition at home, tied for the 12th best run in team history.

In the **Tad Boyle** era, Colorado is a sparkling 93-16 at the Coors Events Center (.853). The Buffaloes are 406-167 (.709) all-time at the CEC, picking up win No. 400 in style as Colorado defeated No. 9/10 ranked Arizona 75-72 in front of the third-largest crowd in facility history (11,309) on Feb. 24, 2016.

GRAND ACHIEVEMENTS: Xavier Johnson became the 33rd player to score 1,000 points at Colorado on Nov. 14, but two other players are recording unique milestones of their own.

Senior **Derrick White** reached the 2,000-point mark for his collegiate career during the Colorado State game. White scored 1,912 points in three seasons at UCCS (2012-15). Senior Josh Fortune needs 83 points to reach 1,000 in his collegiate career. Fortune scored 481 points in two years at Providence College (2012-14) and has 436 in 43 games at Colorado.

4 OF A KIND: Colorado sports an unusual occurrence with four fifth-year seniors on its roster, each traveling a different path to get to this point.

Wesley Gordon has taken the most traditional five-year route. He took a redshirt season his true freshman year as Colorado was loaded in the front court led by Andre Roberson currently with Oklahoma City of the NBA. Gordon is among Colorado's all-time leaders

in rebounds and blocked shots.

Xavier Johnson played his first three seasons (2012-15) before an Achilles injury derailed his 2015-16 season. Johnson has been a steady performer, averaging double-digits over his three years and joining the 1,000-point club on Nov. 14 against Seattle U.

Josh Fortune is the mid-career transfer. After two years at Providence College, helping the Friars to the 2014 Big East title, Fortune transferred to Colorado and sat out the 2014-15 season. He was a key contributor to Colorado's NCAA Tournament run as a junior ranking third on the team in scoring.

Derrick White will get his one-year shot in Boulder this year. White played his first three years at NCAA Division II UCCS, earning

All-America honors. He practiced with the Buffaloes last year as a redshirt.

Additionally, the Buffaloes also have a fourth-year junior in **George King**, the reigning Pac-12 Most Improved Player of the Year.

BOYLE IN WINNING PERCENTAGE LEAD: Tad Boyle has hovered right around the school's all-time winning percentage lead since the early portion of the 2015-16 season (minimum two seasons), Boyle, who has won 62.6 percent of his games with Colorado (137-82), is just ahead of CU Athletic Hall of Fame coach Forrest "Frosty" Cox who was 147-89 (.623) in 13 seasons between 1936-50. Boyle is 193-147 in his 11th year as a collegiate head coach.

IN THE POLLS: Colorado received votes for the fifth straight week in the USA Today Coaches Top 25 Poll on Dec. 5. The Buffaloes received votes in the first four Associated Press polls.

Seven 2016-17 opponents have been or currently are ranked in one of the Top 25 polls including Oregon, UCLA, Arizona and Xavier who have each made a Top 10 appearance this year. Texas was ranked in both polls before dropping out Nov. 28. California had a one-week run at No. 25 in the AP poll. No. 23/22 Notre Dame debuted in the Dec. 5 edition of both polls.

AGAINST RANKED TEAMS: Colorado has won two straight and three of its last five against ranked opponents. This is the first season with two wins over ranked teams since 2013-14 (2-6 overall).

The Buffaloes have back-to-back wins against ranked opponents for the first time since winning three straight in February-March 2013: Feb. 7 at #19/19 Oregon (48-47), Feb. 14 vs. #9/9 Arizona (71-58), March 7 vs. #19/25 Oregon (76-53).

With its win over No. 13/14 Xavier, Colorado defeated its highest ranked nonconference opponent since its 75-72 win over No. 6/7 Kansas on Dec. 7, 2013. Colorado claimed a win in its first game against a ranked opponent this season with its 68-54 win over No. 22/21 Texas on Nov. 22. It was Colorado's first win over a ranked opponent away from Boulder since a 76-53 win over No. 19 Oregon on March 7, 2013.

Colorado's 14 wins over ranked opponents in Boyle's six-plus seasons is by far the best streak in team history. In fact Boyle coached teams, with a record of 14-24, have accounted for 24 percent of wins over ranked opponents (58) since 1949-50.

FOR OPENERS: Colorado improved to 90-24 all-time in home openers and has won its last nine, making Boyle a perfect 7-0 in home openers. The Buffaloes have won 14 of their last 15. Colorado is 79-35 (.693) in all-time season openers. The Buffaloes are 5-2 under Boyle. The Buffaloes are 32-5 in overall season openers since the 1980-81 season.

Colorado's 90 points against Sacramento State were its most in a season opener since defeating Cal Poly 97-69 to begin the 2002-03 season. The 37-point margin of victory in a season-opener tied for the largest in team history, matching only a 54-17 win at Denver on Jan. 29, 1903, the second season of the program.

LONG WAIT OVER: Two Colorado seniors made their long-awaited debuts at the Coors Events Center in the season opener.

Xavier Johnson had six points, seven rebounds and a pair of assists, making his return after missing the 2015-16 season due to a torn Achilles tendon in his left leg.

Derrick White had nine points and four assists in is Colorado debut. He sat out last after transferring from UCCS. He was an NCAA Division II All-American for the Mountain Lions averaging 22.0 points, 5.9 rebounds, 3.9 assists and 1.6 steals over his three-year UCCS career.

HIGHLY RANKED TRIO HEADED TO BOULDER: What could be the best men's basketball signing class in the Tad Boyle era at the University of Colorado was made official on Nov. 9 as **Evan Battey**, **Tyler Bey** and **D'Shawn Schwartz** inked their National Letters of Intent to join the Buffaloes for the 2017-18 season.

Rivals.com rates Colorado's class the 16th best in the nation while Scout.com has the Buffaloes at 18th. Scout considers all three signees four-star recruits. Schwartz and Bey are also four-star players according to Rivals.

Highly regarded as the top player in Colorado, Schwartz is a 6-6, 210-pound wing from Colorado Springs. He averaged 19.9 points and 8.5 rebounds as a junior at Sand Creek High School, earning Class 4A All-State Second Team honors. Schwartz is a two-time All-Pikes Peak Athletic Conference First Team pick and back-to-back runner-up for that league's Player of the Year honor.

Bey, a 6-7, 205-pound small forward, is a Las Vegas native attending

Middlebrooks Academy in Los Angeles. He's rated as the 27th best small forward in the nation by Scout and third in the state of California. Rivals rates him in their Top 150 as the 114th best overall player.

Battey, a 6-8, 275-pound forward, hails from the Los Angeles area and was an All-Orange County and All-Crestview League selection for Villa Park High School in 2015-16. He averaged 24 points a game for the Spartans and rated as the third best post player in the state of California. ESPN ranks him as California's ninth-best overall prospect.

BUFFS FIFTH IN PRESEASON POLL: Colorado was picked to repeat its 2015-16 Pac-12 Conference finish as the Buffaloes were selected fifth in the annual media preseason poll.

Colorado earned 199 points, 10 shy of fourth place California. The Buffaloes were 10-8 in the 2016 final league standings.

Defending champion Oregon was picked to repeat its title with 320 points and collecting 23 of 27 first place votes. Arizona received the other four first place votes and were second with 298 points followed by UCLA in third (259).

After Colorado, Washington was sixth (167) followed by USC (163), Utah (142), Oregon State (122), Stanford (119), Arizona State (78) and Washington State (30).

2017 PARADISE JAM: While the 2016-17 season is just underway, a piece to the 2017-18 season is already in place. Colorado will be one of eight teams participating in the Paradise Jam, Nov. 17-20, 2017, in St. Thomas, U.S. Virgin Islands. The Buffaloes will play three games in four days against a field that includes Drake, Drexel, Houston, Liberty, Mercer, Quinnipiac, and Wake Forest.

BOULDER - The Colorado Buffaloes shot down Sacramento State 90-53 on Friday night at the Coors Events Center, opening the 2016-17 men's basketball season with an impressive display of long-range shooting and overall balance.

CU, which shot 38.9 percent from 3-point range last season, hit 13 of its 21 3-point attempts (61.9 percent) and finished opening night at 53.3 percent overall from the field (32-of-60).

Dominique Collier (12 points), Josh Fortune (11) and George King (10) reached double figures on a night when 10 of Tad Boyle's 12 players who suited up scored.

Collier, coming off the bench, hit four of his six 3-point attempts while 6-10 freshman Lucas Siewert made all three of his shots from beyond the arc. HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs rolled to a 23-point halftime lead (42-19),

shooting 48.3 percent (14-of-29) from the field while holding the Hornets to 20.6 percent (7-of-34).

CU took a 3-0 lead on Derrick White's trev - the first field goal attempt of his Buffs career - and steadily pulled away over the next 8 minutes. White, who sat out last season after transferring from UCCS, finished the half with a team-high seven points and nine for the night.

Boyle said White "was about 70 percent" after suffering a twisted ankle in a midweek practice and Collier also was recovering from a foot injury.

Boyle used 10 players in the first half and nine of them scored. He cleared his bench in the final minutes.

The Buffs opened their first double-figure lead (16-6) on a 3-pointer by Fortune with just under 12:30 to play in the opening half. Fortune's trey was one of seven in the first half by CU, as the Buffs shot 63.6 percent (7-of-11) from behind the arc.

From that point, CU increased its lead to 17 points on two occasions before a layup by White at the first-half buzzer produced the 23-point bulge at intermission.

The Buffs kept up the pressure in the second half, building a 73-36 advantage with 7:47 remaining and coasting to their final margin. The Hornets never led and managed just one early tie.

TURNING POINT: After a 6-6 tie, the Buffs went on an 18-1 run to go up 24-7. CU hit four of its seven first-half treys during that surge, with Collier, Fortune, Tory Miller and Deleon Brown knocking down the four long-range shots.

CU STANDOUTS: Collier - 12 points (4-of-6 3-pointers); Fortune - 11 points (4-of-5 from the field, 2-of-2 3-pointers); Wes Gordon - 12 rebounds, 7 points; White - 9 points, 4 assists; George King - 10 points; Thomas Akyazili, 8 points, 6 assists.

KEY STATISTICS: The Buffs held the Hornets to seven first-half field goals in 34 attempts (20.6 percent) in building a 23-point halftime lead. Sac State's final shooting percentage was 29.4 percent (20-of-68) CU finished with 20 assists on 32 made field goals and committed only 10 turnovers . . The Buffs outrebounded the Hornets 47-40 but Boyle wasn't pleased with Sac State's 17 offensive rebounds

WHAT IT MEANS: The best thing to be gleaned from most openers is a 'W' and that's what the Buffs took from this one. But that was far from the lone takeaway; Boyle's seventh CU team offered plenty of opening-night upside. It demonstrated depth, athleticism and every bit of the offensive firepower that was expected. As always, though, Boyle's emphasis in the coming weeks will be on ratcheting up his defense and board work

BOULDER - On a night when the Colorado Buffaloes' shooting deserted them, they were forced to fall back on the principles that head coach Tad Boyle holds sacred above all others: defense and rebounding.

Those came through, and they proved to be just enough to produce a 67-55 win Monday over visiting Seattle in the first round of the Legends Classic. Colorado improved to 2-0 with the win.

HOW IT HAPPENED: One game after shooting a blistering 13-for-21 from 3-point range in a 90-53 win over Sacramento State, CU hit just 19 of its 53 field goal tries, including a 3-for-18 night from 3-point range.

But while their shots weren't falling, the Buffs still commanded a 55-35 edge on the boards and their defense provided a 36-24 scoring edge in the second half. Wesley Gordon had a 14-rebound, 11-point double-double - the 11th of - and Derrick White scored a game-high 15 points to go with six his career rebounds. Xavier Johnson added 13 points and six rebounds for the Buffs and Josh Fortune finished with 12 points and seven rebounds.

"That was the definition of winning ugly," head coach Tad Boyle said.

Indeed, the Buffs never seemed to find their offensive groove for any length of time. But after falling behind 33-31 early in the second half, Colorado put to gether a 16-2 run to take a lead the Buffs would never relinquish. George King started the surge with a 3-pointer - CU's first of the night after an 0-for-9 stretch - to give CU a 47-35 lead with 12:48 to go in the game.

CU's defense also stepped up in that stretch, as the Buffs collected four blocked shots and four steals along with forcing eight straight missed shots by the Redhawks.

The Redhawks, though, wouldn't go away and slowly chipped away at the lead. A Brendan Westerdorf 3-pointer and free throw with 5:40 to go cut CU's edge to 54-51, and it took a White free throw and back-to-back 3-pointers from Fortune to give the Buffs some breathing room down the stretch. Fortune's second 3-pointer gave the Buffs a 61-53 lead with just 2:50 to go and they held the Seahawks at bay in the final minutes.

While the Buffs were no doubt cold offensively, their defense produced the same effect on the Redhawks. Seattle hit just 19 of its 63 field goal attempts, including a 6-for-32 effort from 3-point range.

The scoring difference came at the free throw line. Colorado shot 41 free throws and needed every attempt, as the Buffs hit just 26 of those tries. White, a career 83 percent free throw shooter at UC-Colorado Springs, was an uncharacteristic 3-for-8 from the line.

Colorado's shooting wasn't the only sore spot for the Buffs. One game after committing just 10 turnovers against Sacramento State, the Buffs had 19 mis-cues, which the Redhawks converted into 13 points.

TURNING POINT: After the Redhawks opened the second half with a bucket to take a 33-31 lead, the Buffs went on a 16-2 run, started by a George King 3-pointer. CU never trailed again.

CU STANDOUTS: Gordon had his 11th career double-double, a 14-rebound, 11-point effort that included six offensive boards. ... White had 15 points, six rebounds, two assists, a block and a steal. ... Fortune had 12 points and seven ohnson had 13 points and six rebounds

KEY STATISTICS: The Buffs had a dominating 55-35 edge on the boards, which included 19 offensive rebounds that produced 16 second-chance points. Colorado also shot 41 free throws compared to Seattle's 14, and the Buffs hit 26 of those free throws

WHAT IT MEANS: The Buffs improved to 2-0, but more importantly, learned that Boyle's insistence on rebounding and defense is something that will pay dividends when the shots aren't falling

BOULDER - Tad Boyle's Colorado Buffaloes rediscovered their shooting touch and played defense with a purpose Thursday night, rolling to an 89-70 win over ULM in their second game of the Legends Classic.

The Buffs had five players in double figures led by Josh Fortune and Xavier Johnson with 14 points each. Derrick White and George King each chipped in 12 and Wesley Gordon had nine rebounds, four assists and two points as Colorado improved to 3-0.

CU also got some good production off the bench, getting 10 points and eight points from junior Tory Miller, as well as nine points from true freshmen Bryce Peters and Deleon Brown.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs didn't let their ice-cold shooting effort from Monday's win over Seattle follow them into Thursday's game.

Instead, King opened the game with a 3-pointer, then hit another barely a minute later as the Buffs quickly opened up an 8-0 lead. White then scored eight unanswered points to give the Buffs a 16-3 lead and the Warhawks never seriously threatened to make it a game.

The Buffs stretched their lead to 38-19 late in the first half, then closed with a four-point flurry in the last four seconds of the half to take a 48-23 lead into the locker room at intermission. CU shot 15-for-34 in the first half, limited ULM to 7-for-28 shooting and had a 28-17 rebounding edge.

Colorado then kept the lead in the 20-point range for most of the game and Boyle pulled his starters for good with a few minutes to go.

King, who was just 6-for-17 from the field in CU's first two games, finished with a 4-for-6 night, including 2-for-3 from 3-point range. Fortune was just 2-for-8 from the field, but had a perfect 10-for-10 night at the free throw line.

White, meanwhile, continues to show why Boyle and his staff have been so excited to get the transfer from UC-Colorado Springs on the floor. The 6-foot-5 senior has been handling point guard duties, and had four assists, three rebounds and two steals to go with his 12 points. The majority of those assists and rebounds came at key moments when the Buffs were building their big first-half lead.

Peters made his first appearance as a Buff and dazzled the crowd with a steal and dunk for his first basket in a CU uniform and also hit a 3-pointer for part of his nine points. Brown had two 3-pointers and true freshman Lucas Siewert had two points and six rebounds. Peters and Lucas Siewert each had 17 minutes on the floor while Brown had 20 minutes.

The Buffs also had a solid rebounding edge for the third game in a row, outrebounding the Warhawks 49-37. Along with Gordon's nine and Miller's eight, Fortune matched Siewert's total with six.

TURNING POINT: This one was never close. The Warhawks briefly closed an early double-digit deficit to eight, 20-12, but the Buffs answered with a 13-4 run that put the game away with three minutes still left in the first half.

CU STANDOUTS: Five players in double figures meant it was a balanced effort, but Derrick White's 12-point, four-assist, three-rebound, two-steal effort stands out because of it's versatility. ... Wesley Gordon was his usual force on the boards, finishing with nine rebounds, and he also had four assists. ... Tory Miller had eight rebounds, with five coming on the offensive boards. ... Fortune's 10-for-10 night from the free throw line helped the Buffs go 28-for-35 from the line. KEY STATISTICS: The Buffs had three consecutive defensive stops on

seven different occasions in the first half, a statistic that Boyle loves to see. ... The Buffs' emphasis on rebounding continues to pay dividends, and Thursday's 49-37 edge was no different, as it helped produce 19 second-chance points. The Buffs also had more assists (14) than turnovers (12), a ratio that Boyle would no doubt like to see improve, but one that is still one the Buffs can live with

BROOKLYN, N.Y. - Down by 15 points at halftime, the Colorado Buffaloes gamely battled back but couldn't overtake Notre Dame, losing 89-83 on Monday night in the semifinals of the Legends Classic at the Barclays Center.

CU losing for the first time this season (3-1) closed to within four points twice in the final minute. Notre Dame (4-0) held off the Buffs by making 12 consecutive free throws in the final 1:33 and finished 27-of-29 for the game.

Xavier Johnson led the Buffs with 23 points, with Derrick White adding 20. The Irish had four players in double figures, headed by Bonzie Colson's 22 and Matt Farrell's 20.

HOW IT HAPPENED: CU didn't have an early defensive answer for Notre Dame's high-powered offense, and losing Wesley Gordon to a pair of quick fouls only exacerbated the Buffs' problems.

En route to hitting half of their 12 3-point attempts and shooting 54.5 percent from the field overall in the first half, the Fighting Irish opened their first double-digit lead (24-13) on a 3-pointer by V.J. Beachem. It was part of a 9-0 run that earned Notre Dame a 28-14 advantage.

The Buffs pulled to within 10 (38-28) on a 3-point play by White and two free throws by Deleon Brown with 4:02 left before the break. But the rest of the half belonged to the Irish. A 10-2 run opened their largest lead (48-30) of the game and by intermission they were still up 50-35.

Johnson and White had 9 first-half points each for the Buffs, who made only two of their eight 3-point attempts and shot 37.1 percent overall from the floor. CU finished at 42 percent from the field and 31.8 percent from beyond the arc.

The Buffs needed an explosive second-half start and at least got a glimmer of one. Finally back on the floor after only 3 first-half minutes, Gordon scored the first points of the final, and White followed with a trev. The Buffs were back to within 10 (50-40), but they needed to match that start on the defensive end.

Easier said than done . . . A 6-0 run pushed Notre Dame's lead to 56-40 and CU's goal of at least reducing its deficit to single digits halfway through the half was looking grim. But the Buffs weren't done.

At the 10-minute mark Steve Vasturia used a head fake at the free throw line to blow by his defender and score a layup that gave the Irish a 66-51 lead.

The Buffs answered quickly, getting back-to-back 3-pointers from freshman Bryce Peters and Johnson to creep to within 9 points (66-57) - their first singledigit deficit since 21-14.

The Irish responded with 5 quick points, the last 3 on a conventional threepoint play by Beachem, who dunked on a baseline drive and was fouled. Notre Dame led 71-57 - and CU returned to catch-up mode.

This time the Buffs appeared serious about it. An 8-0 spurt - a field goal and two free throws by Johnson, a jumper from the left wing and two foul shots by Peters – pulled them to within 71-65 with 4:19 remaining.

CU finally got the deficit to 4 (81-77) on a 3-pointer from the left corner by George King with 45.5 seconds left and closed to 4 (85-81) once more on another basket by King. But the Irish stayed steady at the free throw line and closed it out.

TURNING POINT: After battling back from a 15-point halftime deficit to pull to within 4 points in the final minute the Buffs couldn't get over the hump, held off by 12 consecutive free throws by the Irish in the final 1:33.

KEY STATISTIC: The Irish shot 50 percent from beyond the arc and 54.5 percent fom the field overall in the first half, digging a 15-point halftime hole for the Buffs

WHAT IT MEANS: CU discovered what it takes to compete with and defeat a tested, talented team like Notre Dame. That would be 40 minutes - not 20 - of focus and intensity

BROOKLYN, N.Y. - Tad Boyle's Colorado Buffaloes bounced back from their first loss of the season in fine fashion.

One day after falling to Notre Dame, 89-83, in the Legends Classic semifinals at the Barclays Center, the Buffs rebounded Tuesday to knock off No. 22 Texas, 68-54, to improve to 4-1

Once again, the Buffs received excellent performances from junior George King and senior Derrick White. King turned in his second-straight double-double with 12 points and 13 rebounds, coming on the heels of his 17-point, 13-rebound effort against the Irish. White followed up a 20-point, nine-assist, five-rebound effort Monday to log 16 points, five rebounds, two blocks, two assists and two steals in Tuesday's win

The Buffs held the Longhorns to 36.8 percent shooting (21-for-57) while carving out a 43-32 rebounding edge. The Buffs also shot 44 percent from the floor (29-for-66) a had 13 turnovers

HOW IT HAPPENED: After leading by as much as 11 in the first half and by 12 with just under eight minutes to play, Colorado withstood a late Texas surge to come away with the win.

The Buffs led by nine at the half, 33-24, and pushed the cushion to 12 on a King 3-pointer with 7:53 to go, 52-40.

Texas, though, wouldn't go away. The Longhorns employed a full-court press and slowly chipped away at the CU lead, putting together and 11-2 run to cut CU's lead to 54-51 with 5:12 still to go on a pair of Jarret Allen free throws.

Colorado never allowed Texas to completely close the gap. Buckets from Josh Fortune and Wesley Gordon bumped CU's lead back up to seven, then after a Texas basket, Colorado put together a 7-0 run to ice the game. Fortune hit two free throws and a White 3-pointer with 2:39 remaining pushed CU's lead back to double-digits, 63-53, and the Longhorns never took it back to single digits

The Buffs took a 33-24 lead into the locker room at intermission after King had a seven-point, 10-rebound first half.

Following a Fortune 3-pointer at the 16:30 mark of the first half that gave the Buffs a 7-4 lead, CU extended the margin to 12-7 before the Longhorns battled back to tie the game at 12-12.

CU, however, responded with an 8-0 run and never relinquished the lead. White started the drive with a baseline drive before Xavier Johnson grabbed a loose ball under the basket and scored. Thomas Akyazili then had a pair of coast-to-coast layups, giving CU a 20-12 lead and forcing Texas to call time out.

Colorado extended the margin to as much as 11, going up 31-20 on a King three-point play and again at 33-22 on a King bucket before the Longhorns closed the gap with a basket at the buzzer to make the halftime count 33-24. TURNING POINT: Just after Texas had closed CU's lead to 54-51 with an

11-2 run, the Buffs got back-to-back buckets from Fortune and Wesley Gordon to create a 7-point cushion with 3:29 to go.

CU STANDOUTS: Derrick White had a solid all-around game on both ends of the floor, finishing with 16 points, five rebounds, two blocks, two assists and two steals. ... King's second straight double-double was the third of his career, as he finished the Legends Classic with 29 points and 26 rebounds in two games. ... Fortune had 11 points, three rebounds and an assist.

KEY STATISTICS: For the fourth time in five games this season, the Buffs had a commanding rebounding edge, 43-32.

WHAT IT MEANS: The Buffs return home after a 1-1 performance in the Legends Classic with a much better idea of how they stack up against NCAA Tournament-caliber teams and what they need to improve on.

BOULDER - Colorado senior Xavier Johnson continues to make his comeback from an Achilles tendon tear a successful one.

Johnson, who missed all of last year with his injury, produced his seventh career double-double with 27 points and 12 rebounds Sunday to lead the Buffs to a 75-60 win over a feisty Wofford squad.

The Buffs improved to 5-1 on the season and will next play host to in-state rival Colorado State in a 7 p.m. game Wednesday at the Coors Events Center.

HOW IT HAPPENED: While the final margin might indicate otherwise, the win didn't come easily for the Buffs. Colorado led by just one, 31-30, at the half, and trailed by a point four minutes into the second half.

But after Nathan Hoover's 3-pointer gave Wofford a 36-35 lead, the Buffs responded with an 11-0 run and the Terriers never came closer than six again.

Wesley Gordon started the burst by muscling inside for a bucket, followed by a Derrick White steal and layup, a Johnson basket on an assist from White, and a George King 3-pointer. Two Johnson free throws capped the run and Colorado held a 46-36 lead with 12:38 to go.

The second half was no doubt an improvement over the first, when the smaller Terriers hit 50 percent of their shots (13-for-26) and held a 14-13 rebounding edge.

Johnson scored 12 points in the first half and 15 in the second, shot 9-of-14 from the floor and hit seven of his 11 free throw tries. Johnson and Gordon (nine rebounds) accounted for nearly 66 percent of the Buffs 32 total rebounds - their lowest total of the season.

"I thought Xavier Johnson was terrific," head coach Tad Boyle said. "X has played really, really unselfishly. He's taking good shots. He has 27 points tonight on 14 shots - that's efficiency. I really like the way he's helping lead this team. One thing we know Xavier does night in and night out is he competes.

Wofford temporarily halted CU's second half run, pulling back to within six on two separate occasions, the latest with just under 10 minutes to play.

But the Buffs finally began to put the game away for good after the Terriers cut the CU lead to 48-42. A Josh Fortune 3-pointer and a Bryce Peters driving bank off the glass quickly boosted CU's lead back to 11, 53-42, and the Buffs then maintained control for the remainder of the game.

Johnson was dominant down the stretch, scoring 11 points in the final 7:30.

"I thought his competitiveness kind of rubbed off on the rest of the guys," Boyle said. "We need that from everybody. It can't just be one or two guys. It has to be every Buffalo who is on the floor playing with great energy, great effort, great attitude. We had some guys hanging their head, feeling sorry for themselves tonight, which you can't be successful doing."

Colorado again produced some balanced scoring, with four players in double digits. Along with Johnson's 27, CU also received 10 points each from Gordon, White and King.

But King - who had 26 rebounds in two games in last week's Legends Classic games vs. Notre Dame and Texas - had a tough night on the boards, failing to collect a single rebound. Fortune was also blanked in that department Sunday.

The Terriers were led by 15 points from guard Fletcher Magee and 10 each from Ryan Sawvell and Cameron Jackson.

TURNING POINT: After the Terriers took a 36-35 lead early in the second half, the Buffs responded with an 11-0 run and Wofford never came closer than six again

WHAT IT MEANS: The Buffs won their second straight, but they still showed some defensive lapses as well as some rebounding issues. They'll need to shore that up before Wednesday.

BOULDER - A sub-par night offensively and from the free throw line, plus a stifling Colorado State defense, made Wednesday night a miserable one for the Colorado Buffaloes at the Coors Events Center.

The Rams rolled over the Buffs 72-58, handing CU its second loss of the season (5-2) and snapping a 12-game winning streak at the CEC.

CSU (6-1) made 17 of its first 18 free throw attempts, finishing 26-of-33, while CU was 17-of-31 from the foul line (54.8 percent) and only 19-of-59 (a season-low 32.2 percent) from the field.

Derrick White led the Buffs with 17 points and Weslev Gordon added 11 points, nine rebounds and three blocked shots. CSU had four players in double figures, topped by Emmanuel Omogbo's 15.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs led by as many as six points on two occasions in the first half, the last being 17-11 on a baseline drive and basket by Thomas Akavzili.

But the Rams didn't roll over. Instead, behind nine points by Ombogo, they reeled off an 11-2 run and finally overtook the Buffs 24-21 on Ombogo's only third trey of the season. CU would trail the rest of the night.

CSU's lead grew to 30-25 - its largest of the first half - on two free throws by 6-11 freshman Nico Carvacho with :58 seconds left before intermission

Tory Miller brought the Buffs to within 30-27 with 17.9 seconds left in the half on a lay-in. But he missed a free throw that would have given him a 3-point and pulled CU to within a basket at the half.

Instead, the Buffs trailed 30-27, and they could point to 2-of-7 free throw shooting and disjointed offensive play (11-of-25 from the field, 44 percent) compounded by nine turnovers (14 for the night) as the main culprits.

Tad Boyle called his team's 14 missed free throws "a big factor tonight. It started in the first half and it bled over to the second half. That could have gotten us back into the game, maybe tied the score or got us a lead."

The Rams regained their five-point advantage (32-27) on a driving layup by Carvacho to open the second half. And Carvacho wasn't done. With the shot clock dwindling to 2 seconds, he drained a 3-pointer that preceded another trey by Omogbo and a layup by Prentiss Nixon.

Suddenly, CSU was up 40-31 with 15:57 remaining. And CU had one secondhalf field goal - a stuff by Xavier Johnson - and a pair of free throws. The Rams were on a 10-4 run and weren't slowing down - or at that point being slowed down.

Over the next 5:30 CU outscored the visitors 9-2 and crept to within 42-40 on a conventional 3-point play by Akayzili, who was fouled on a layup

But by the half's halfway point, the Rams maintained a 46-40 lead and the Buffs were still struggling at the free throw line.

There was time enough for CU to pull it together, but a spark was needed. Gordon tried to provide it with a put-back (48-44) but he missed a free throw and yet another 3-point play opportunity slipped away.

The Rams increased their lead to seven points - 56-49 - on a pair of free throws by junior college transfer Che Bob with 4:35 remaining. White connected on a pair of foul shots 15 seconds later, reducing the Buffs' deficit to 56-51.

But Bob hit one of two free throws - his miss was CSU's first of the night after hitting 18 in a row - for another six-point Rams lead (57-51). The Buffs had 3:53 to make their comeback and avoid their first homecourt loss of the season.

A 3-pointer from the left wing by Wesley Paige with just over 3 minutes to play, one of two free throws by Bob and a layup by Devocio Butler pushed CSU's lead to 12 points - 63-51.

The Rams would push their lead to 16 with 1:08 remaining, and the night was all but over for the Buffs

PORTLAND - The Colorado Buffaloes rediscovered their offensive abilities and ratcheted up their defense in the second half here Saturday night and downed Portland 76-63 at the Chiles Center.

Shaking off the ill effects of a 72-58 home loss to rival Colorado State on Wednesday night, the Buffs (6-2) rallied from a 30-28 halftime deficit by outscoring the Pilots (4-3) 48-33 in the second half.

Four CU players scored in double figures, including Xavier Johnson (19), Josh Fortune (14), Derrick White (13) and George King (12). Portland was led by Jazz Johnson (18) and Alec Wintering (17)

After hitting only 32 percent from the field against CSU, the Buffs shot just 37 percent in the first half Saturday night and missed all seven of their trevs. From 3-point range against the Rams, the Buffs hit only 16 percent.

A shooting about face was needed - and CU got it in Saturday night's second half. The Buffs shot 50 percent from the field (14-of-28) and hit five of their dozen 3-point attempts (42 percent).

HOW IT HAPPENED: CU opened by hitting just three of its first dozen shots, including 0-of-3 from long range - a continuation of the offensive problems the Buffs suffered in their home loss four nights earlier to CSU.

And their accuracy didn't get much better; they finished the first 0-of-7 from beyond the arc and hitting just 37 percent (11-of-30) from the field.

Still, they trailed only 30-28 at intermission but closing to that margin required a 7-0 run that helped bring them back from a 20-13 deficit and pulled them to within two.

That run was fueled by three free throws by Johnson and baskets by Fortune and King, A Tory Miller put-back in the final minute produced CU's two-point deficit at the break

Jazz Johnson opened the second-half scoring with a trey, increasing the Pilots' lead to 33-28. But the Buffs were finally about to regain their shooting touches

Two-point baskets by King and White, followed by an "XJ" trey gave CU a 34-33 lead – its first since 10-8 – and the Buffs wouldn't relinquish it. Of their next four field goals, two were treys - Bryce Peters, Fortune - that

pushed the Buffs ahead 43-37. The Pilots stayed within four to six points until a Fortune 3-pointer capped a 15-4 run and opened CU's largest lead of the night at 14 points (66-52). The Pilots got no closer than nine points the rest of the way.

Wesley Gordon grabbed 10 rebounds but was only 2-of-5 from the field. He didn't score his first points until 10:26 remained, but his conventional three-point play - he was fouled on a put-back - gave CU a 50-45 advantage at a critical second-half juncture

TURNING POINT: Trailing 30-28 at the half, the Buffs put together a 15-4 second-half run and pulled away. CU hit five 3-pointers in the second half after going 0-for-7 from beyond the arc in the first half. KEY STATISTICS: The Buffs shot only 43 percent from the field for the

game, but hit half of their second-half field goal attempts (14-of-28) . . . They outrebounded the Pilots 38-28 and held them to 38 percent shooting in the second half (40 percent for the game).

WHAT IT MEANS: A bounce-back game was needed after the disappointing home loss to the Rams, and the Buffs managed to get it in their first true road game of the season. It should give them momentum and a shot of confidence as they head into the final two games of a crucial non-conference stretch.

BOULDER - One week after one of the most disappointing losses in the Tad Boyle era at Colorado, Boyle's Buffaloes bounced back in a big way Wednesday night.

A barrage of CU 3-pointers erased an eight-point deficit midway through the second half and senior Derrick White made some big plays down the stretch to lead the Buffs to a 68-66 win over No. 13 Xavier at the Coors Events Center.

"Great win for our program and our league," Boyle said. "We knew it was going to be a helluva game. They battled, they scratched, they're tough. I've got a lot of respect for Xavier - that's why this win is such a big win for our program.

The win won't completely erase the sting of last week's loss to Colorado State, a defeat the Buffs know could still have an impact when it comes time for NCAA Tournament selection in March.

But Wednesday night's win will also have an equally positive impact, coming against a team that entered the week with a No. 8 NCAA RPI.

The Buffs received big contributions from a variety of players. White finished with 23 points and six rebounds, Xavier Johnson had 18 points and seven rebounds and George King recorded his third double-double in the last six games, a 16-point 10-rebound effort.

But it was White who made the biggest difference down the stretch with two baskets and a big blocked shot in the final 1:13 to help secure the win.

HOW IT HAPPENED: The Buffs looked to be ready to take control late in the first half when a White 3-pointer gave CU a 28-23 lead with 2:57 left in the half.

But that brought on a Xavier timeout, and the Musketeers then answered with an 8-0 run to end the half and an 8-2 run to start the second half. Trevon Bluiett had four 3-pointers in the Xavier surge as CU's five-point lead turned into a ninepoint deficit, 39-30, in a five-minute span.

The Buffs, though, refused to let the game get away. Trailing 47-39, Colorado went on a 15-0 run to take a 54-47 lead at the 5:57 mark. Xavier Johnson had two 3-pointers in the run and White and George King each had one, with King's trey giving the Buffs a 48-47 lead, their first since the first half.

At the same time, Colorado ratcheted up its defense. The Buffs put together eight straight defensive stops in the run, including a pair of turnovers

The Musketeers didn't go away quietly. They quickly shaved CU's seven-point lead back down to three at several different junctures, but the Buffs held them at bay down the stretch.

A White basket with 1:08 remaining and the shot clock ticking down to zero gave CU a 65-60 lead. Bluiettt cut the margin to 65-63 with a basket and free throw but White answered with another bucket with 29.2 remaining to put the lead back to four. 67-63.

Xavier's Edmond Sumner then missed one of two free throws to cut CU's lead to three and the Buffs turned it over on the inbounds. But White then blocked a Quentin Goodin layup, a Bluiett 3-pointer bounced long and King grabbed his 10th rebound of the night before taking a foul.

King hit one of two free throws with six seconds left to clinch the game before Xavier hit a layup at the buzzer to complete the scoring.

TURNING POINT: CU's 15-0 run midway through the second half changed momentum for good and brought the crowd of 7,743 alive. The Buffs hit four 3-pointers in the stretch and also produced eight consecutive defensive stops.

KEY STATISTICS: After starting 1-for-9 from 3-point range, the Buffs hit eight of their next 11. ... CU shot 44.6 percent from the field while holding Xavier to just 37.7 percent, including just 7-for-27 from 3-point range. ... The Buffs had opened the game hitting just one of nine attempts from beyond the arc; they then hit eight of their final 11
