## NEWS AND NOTES (As of Nov. 7)

- San Diego State and Brigham Young, two teams that shared conference affiliation from 1978 through 2011, meet for just the third time in the last nine seasons when the Aztecs travel to Provo, Utah to face the Cougars.
- San Diego State is looking for just its second 2-0 start to a campaign in the last five seasons. The Aztecs have not opened a campaign with consecutive victories with at least one of those wins coming on the road since the 2010-11 season. That season, SDSU opened the year with wins at Long Beach State and at No. 11/12 Gonzaga en route to a 20-0 start, a 34-3 final record and the school's first NCAA Sweet 16 appearance.
- Saturday will mark the 74th meeting between the teams which makes it the ninth most frequent series in SDSU school history.
- San Diego State has won the last three encounters between the teams which is tied for the longest Aztec win streak in the 73 all-time meetings (also: first three games of the series 1940-77 and 2005-06).
- The Aztecs are just 3-29 against the Cougars in Provo, with victories coming on Jan. 31, 1985, Dec. 31, 1996 and Jan. 8, 2005. The most recent victory in Provo came when Chris Walton connected on a fadeaway follow shot in the lane as time expired to give SDSU a 59-57 win. The Aztecs have lost their last six games played at the Marriott Center.
- Saturday marks San Diego State's first visit to Brigham Young since the 2010-11 campaign when the top-10 teams met for the first of three times that season. The Aztecs entered the game 20-0 and ranked No. 4 nationally in both polls. The Cougars (17-1), were ranked 9th nationally in both major polls. In front of a sellout crowd of 22,700, the Cougars handed the Aztecs their first loss of the season, 71-58. Both team's All-Americans were outstanding, with Jimmer Fredette scoring 43 points and Kawhi Leonard posting 22 points and 15 rebounds. SDSU would avenge the game in the Mountain West tourney final, winning 72-54, in the championship game.
- Saturday's game features one of the nation's best home teams against an elite road program. Since the start of the 1999-00 season, Brigham Young is 276-38 at home (87.9 percent). That ranks sixth nationally in home win percentage during that span. Meanwhile, San Diego State is 102-65 in road/neutral contests since the start of the 2010-11 season. That is 15th nationally during that period.
- San Diego State opened the 2019-20 campaign in style disposing of a Texas Southern, a program that won 24 games a year ago and piled up road wins at Baylor, Oregon and Texas A&M, 86-51.
- The Aztecs never trailed, used a 20-0 run in the first half to build a 40-10 advantage in cruising to the season opening win.
- SDSU played near flawless basketball in the first half. The Aztecs built a 48-13 lead at intermission. The Aztecs made twice as many first half three-point field goals (10), then Texas Southern had total field goals (5) and limited the Tigers to just 5-of-26 field goal shooting (19.2 percent) prior to the break.
- For a program that prides itself on defense, the first half effort still resonated in the record books. The 13 points allowed are tied for the fourth lowest first-half output for an Aztec opponent in the Brian Dutcher/Steve Fisher era (since 1999-00) and the 35-point advantage at intermission matched the highest against a Division I opponent in that same time period.

- ◆ The Aztecs were led by junior guards **Jordan Schakel** and **Malachi Flynn** with 15 points apiece. Schakel connected on his four shots of the game and had eight points before four minutes expired. He connected on 4-of-5 three-point attempts in the game. Flynn, celebrating his SDSU debut after transferring from Washington State, stuffed the stat sheet by adding five rebounds and a game-high five assists to go along with his 15 points.
- ◆ SDSU dominated in every category, including a 62-41 advantage on the glass. Sophomore forward **Natahan Mensah** had a game-high 11 rebounds and true freshman forward **Keshad Johnson** came off the bench to add 10 rebounds and seven points in 15 minutes of action.
- ◆ Sure it is early, but San Diego State currently ranks 1st in offensive rebounds per game (26.0), 6th nationally in field goal percentage defense (22.6 percent), T-14th in points allowed (42.0) and T-24th in rebound margin (+21.0).
- ◆ **Following the road game at Brigham Young, San Diego State returns to America's Finest City for a four-game homestand and will not leave the Pacific Time Zone again until the Mountain West Conference opener on Dec. 4 at Colorado State.**
- ◆ San Diego State entered its 99th season of basketball, its 50th season at the Division I level and the third under the direction of Brian Dutcher on Tuesday Nov. 5, with a game against Texas Southern University.
- ◆ San Diego State and Texas Southern met for the fourth time in school history. The Aztecs defeated the Tigers 79-64 on Dec. 6, 1991, 74-62 on Dec. 3, 2012, 103-64 on Nov. 14, 2018 and 77-42 last Tuesday. Those games were contested in Austin, Texas, in the Texas Longhorn Classic, and three in Viejas Arena, respectively.
- ◆ San Diego State won its 14th straight season-opener against unranked teams, a run dating back to the start of the 2005-06 season. SDSU's last lost to an unranked opponent on opening night came on Nov. 19, 2004, when it came out on the wrong end of a double-overtime 80-72 loss against UC Santa Barbara.
- ◆ San Diego State has won seven straight season openers and 14 of the last 15 to begin a campaign. The lone blemish came at the start of the 2012-13 season when SDSU fell to No. 9/9 Syracuse on the USS Midway. Taking into account that the Syracuse game was played outdoors, on the flight deck of the USS Midway, the Aztecs have come out victorious in its last 14 season openers played indoors.
- ◆ The Aztecs are currently in a 10-game winning streak in season openers that have taken place at home.
- ◆ San Diego State prepped for the regular season by winning its 27th consecutive exhibition game with an 86-51 victory over preseason No. 5 ranked UC San Diego on Wednesday, Oct. 30, at Viejas Arena. Senior forward Yann Wetzell scored on a three-point play to open the game and then saw the Tritons tie it at 3-3 and 6-6. SDSU then went on a 6-0 run and never looked back. The team led by 25 points at the half before cruising to the 35-point victory. Sophomore forward Aguek Arop and senior forward Nolan Narain were the only two scholarship players that did not play in the game.
- ◆ Head coach Brian Dutcher begins his third season at the helm after guiding San Diego State to a 21-13 record last year and is 43-24 in his first two seasons. In 2018, he was the only first-year coach to lead his team to the NCAA tournament and

in 96 previous seasons of Aztec basketball, no head coach had won more games and/or won a conference title in his first year until Dutcher accomplished the feat. In addition, Dutcher is the first Aztecs' men's basketball coach to win 20+ games in each of his first two seasons.

- Four Aztecs scored in double figures in the win against the Tritons, but only one was among the starting five, Nathan Mensah. The sophomore forward had 10 points (5-of-8 FG), seven rebounds and a steal. Off the bench freshman forward Keshad Johnson led SDSU with 12 points (3-of-5 FG, 2-of-3 3FG, 4-of-4 FT) in the victory. Matt Mitchell, a junior forward, also totaled 12 points (5-of-8 FG, 2-of-3 3FG) and Joel Mensah, no relationship to Nathan Mensah, finished with 11 points (5-of-6 FG), five rebounds and an assist.
- The class breakdown of San Diego State's 86 points in the UC San Diego game is: 12 by seniors, 35 by juniors, 25 by sophomores and 14 by freshmen.
- The minutes breakdown by class was 40 for the seniors, 85 for the juniors, 52 for the sophomores and 23 by the freshmen.
- The Aztecs were picked to finish in second place in the preseason poll of the Mountain West media. SDSU has finished either first or second in the Mountain West preseason poll in each of the last six years. It is also the 11th time in the 21 seasons the Mountain West has been in existence that San Diego State has been picked first or second in the poll. All 11 times, additionally, have occurred in the last 15 years.
- Malachi Flynn, a junior transfer from Washington State who sat out last season due to NCAA Transfer Rules, was selected the league's Preseason Newcomer of the Year. In his final season at Washington State, Flynn averaged 15.8 points, 4.3 assists, and 3.4 rebounds per game.
- The 2019-20 Aztecs return six of their top nine scorers off a team that posted a 21-13 record and advanced to the championship game of the Mountain West Conference tournament in 2019. San Diego State is one of just nine schools nationally to win at least 19 games each of the last 14 seasons and is one of 29 schools to play in seven of the last 10 NCAA tournaments.
- In addition to the Mountain West media, which predicted the Aztecs would finish in second place, two other publications agreed that San Diego State would finish the regular season in second place - CBS Sports Network and Street & Smith Yearbooks.
- The Aztecs have four players on the roster that stand 6-10 and all are international students. Senior Nolan Narain is from Hamilton, Ontario, Canada. Graduate transfer Yanni Wetzell comes to The Mesa from Auckland, New Zealand and sophomores Joel and Nathan Mensah, who are not related, are from Korle Gonno and Labadi, Accra, Ghana, respectively.
- SDSU's regular-season opener is Tuesday, Nov. 5, against Texas Southern at 7 p.m. in Viejas Arena. It will be the fourth meeting in the series, with the Aztecs holding a 3-0 lead. The teams faced off last season (11/14/18) with SDSU coming away with a 103-64 victory.
- The tipoff time for the game at BYU (11/9) has been announced for 2 p.m. MT.

## ABOUT SAN DIEGO STATE

- Head coach Brian Dutcher welcomes back two returning starters in junior forward **Matt Mitchell** and sophomore forward **Nathan Mensah**. The pair played in all 34 games a year ago with Mitchel starting 33 games, and Mensah receiving the opening nod in each of the final 20 contests. The only other returners who have started a game for SDSU are junior guard **Jordan Schakel**, who got 16 starting assignments last year, and senior forward **Nolan Narain**, who made one start in 2017-18.
- Schakel returns as one of the team's top three-point threats. The Torrance, Calif., native ranked second on the team last year in three-point makes (44) and led the team in three-point percentage (.415; min. 40 3-PT FGA), while playing in 28 games (23.3 mpg). Schakel averaged 7.4 points and 3.8 rebounds, and took great care of the ball, committing 15 turnovers in 651 minutes. In two seasons, he has committed just 24 turnovers in 1,106 total minutes (less than one turnover (.086) per 40 minutes played).
- SDSU will replace its leader in scoring average (Devin Watson - 16.0), rebounding average (Jalen McDaniels - 8.3), assists (Watson - 142), steals (Jeremy Hemsley - 38), and minutes (Watson - 1,155) from a season ago.
- SDSU has three Division I transfers on the 2019-20 roster. **KJ Feagin** (Santa Clara) and **Yanni Wetzell** (Vanderbilt) are grad transfers who will play immediately and **Malachi Flynn** (Washington State), who sat out last season due to NCAA Transfer rules, will have two seasons of eligibility, beginning in 2019-20, to compete for the Aztecs.
- San Diego State has lost three starters (Jeremy Hemsley, Jalen McDaniels and Devin Watson) from its 2018-19 squad that reached the championship game of the 2019 MW Tournament. The impact of the loss of trio can not be underestimated. They provided SDSU with 56.9 percent of its scoring last season (1,389-of-2,437 points), 56.2 percent of its assists (274-of-487), 53.5 percent of its steals (105-of-196) and 39.6 percent of its rebounds (487-of-1,228).
- When the 2019-20 season tips off, the Aztecs will have seven players on its roster who have never played a game in a San Diego State uniform. Guards **Malachi Flynn** (Washington State) and **Caleb Giordano**, a junior and sophomore, respectively, utilized red-shirt seasons in 2018-19. **KJ Feagin** (Santa Clara) and **Yanni Wetzell** (Vanderbilt) are grad transfers with one year of eligibility each. **Trey Pulliam** is a junior transfer from Navarro College in Texas and **Keshad Johnson** and **Mike Pope** are freshman from Oakland and San Diego, Calif., respectively.
- Junior **Matt Mitchell** and sophomore **Nathan Mensah**, both forwards, are back for their respective seasons after receiving starting nods throughout the 2018-19 campaign. Mitchell (10.3 ppg, 4.1 rpg) played in all 34 games, starting 33 times, and enters 2019-20 with 65 starting assignments in 67 career games, which is the most on the active roster. Mensah, meanwhile, started the final 20 games of the season and led the team in blocks (39) and field goal percentage (.541), while scoring 5.6 points and ranking second with 5.5 rebounds-per-game.
- SDSU also welcomes back sophomores **Adam Seiko** (guard), **Aguek Arop** (forward), and **Joel Mensah** (forward) as well as senior **Nolan Narain** (forward). In 2019-20 Seiko averaged 2.2 points and 1.0 rebounds in his initial season on The Mesa. Arop (3.1 ppg, 2.7 rpg), Mensah (1.1 ppg, 1.0 rpg) and Narain (2.9 ppg, 2.2 rpg) will play larger rolls and make larger contributions in 2019-20.
- The Aztecs bring in just one freshman, **Keshad Johnson**. The graduate of San Leandro (Calif.) High School was designated a three-star recruit by all of the major recruiting services and was listed by ESPN as one of the top-25 prep players in the state at the time of his signing. In signing with SDSU, he turned down scholarship offers from schools in the Big East, American and Mountain West Conferences. This is the smallest freshman class since Dutcher has been on The Mesa, which dates to the start of the 1999-00 campaign.

## LUTE OLSON NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

- Malachi Flynn**, a redshirt junior guard, was named to the Lute Olson National Player of the Year watch list earlier this week.
- Flynn is the first Aztec to be named to the Award's watch list in the now 11 years it has been in existence.

- ◆ Before transferring to SDSU, the native of Tacoma, Wash., averaged 12.8 points, 3.2 rebounds, 3.6 assists, while shooting 40.6 percent from the field in two seasons at Washington State.

### NEXT SIGN POST IS 1,000 POINTS

- ◆ San Diego State has two players who are on the precipice of the 1,000 career-points **Matt Mitchell** and **Malachi Flynn**.
- ◆ Mitchell, a junior forward began 2019-20 with 695 points, and after totaling nine against Texas Southern, is now less than 300 from the milestone (296).
- ◆ If Mitchell continues to score at his career pace (10.4 points per game), he will pass 1,000-career points in the team's opening game of the 2020 Mountain West Championship Tournament.
- ◆ When Mitchell reaches 1,000-career points, he will be the 34th Aztec in program history to reach quadruple digits. Mitchell will be the third player in as many years to reach 1,000 points scored in an Aztecs uniform (Jeremy Hemsley passed 1,000 points in 2018 and finished his career on the Mesa in 2019 with 1,392 points & Malik Pope reached 1,000 points, finishing with 1,111, in his senior season of 2018).
- ◆ Flynn, a redshirt junior guard, arrived at San Diego State after competing at Washington State for two seasons and compiling 791-career points. He began the season 209 points from 1,000 for his career and after scoring 15 against Texas Southern in the season opener, is 194 from the sign post.
- ◆ If Flynn continues to score at his career-pace (12.8 points per game), he will pass 1,000 points against Boise State (1/11/20).

### TALL STRANGERS

- ◆ The four tallest players on the 2019-20 San Diego State roster all stand 6'-10" and all are foreign born.
- ◆ Yanni Weitzell, a graduate transfer and forward, is a native of Auckland, New Zealand.
- ◆ Nathan Mensah, a sophomore forward, hails from Labadi, Accra, Ghana.
- ◆ Joel Mensah, no relations to Nathan and a sophomore forward, is from Korle Gonno, Accra, Ghana.
- ◆ Nolan Narain, a senior forward, came to the States from north of the border in Hamilton, Ontario, Canada.

### SEASON OPENERS

- ◆ San Diego State opened its 99th season of basketball and the 50th at the Division I level on Tuesday night in a 77-42 victory over Texas Southern. The Aztecs have been strong in season-opening games:
- ◆ In 99 years of basketball at San Diego State, the Aztecs are 66-33 (.667) in season opening games.
- ◆ In 50 seasons of Division I basketball at San Diego State, the Aztecs are 31-19 (.620) in Division I season-opening games.
- ◆ San Diego State has won its last 15 home openers, regardless of if the game was the season opener.
- ◆ The Aztecs have won seven consecutive season openers, regardless of location.

### NEW RULES FOR 2019-20

With a new season comes some new rules from the NCAA.

- ◆ **THREE-POINT LINE** - has been moved back from 20 feet, 9 inches to the international distance of 22 feet, 1¾ inches.
- ◆ **SHOT CLOCK RESET** - has been reduced from 30 seconds to 20 seconds after a field goal attempt hits the rim and the offensive team rebounds the ball in the front court.
- ◆ **LIVE-BALL TIMEOUTS** - coaches will be allowed to call live-ball timeouts in the last two minutes of the second half and any overtime periods. Previously coaches have not been able to call any live-ball timeouts during the game.
- ◆ **TECHNICAL FOULS** - players will be assessed a technical foul should they use derogatory language about an opponent's race, ethnicity, national origin, religion, gender, gender expression, gender identity, sexual orientation or disability.

### HOME COURT ADVANTAGE

San Diego State has advanced to the NCAA tournament seven of the last 10 seasons and has a NIT national semifinalist appearance as well during that span. One reason for the success is that Viejas Arena is a very tough place for opponents. Since the start of the 2009-10 campaign, and entering this season, San Diego State has the ninth-highest winning percentage in the country, amassing a 143-20 home record, winning 87.7 percent of its home games during that span.

With the 2019-20 season underway, here are a few of the categories to keep an eye on.

- ◆ In its last 167 home games, San Diego State has compiled a 147-20 mark, including a 70-9 record against non-conference competition at Viejas Arena.
- ◆ Since the start of the 2012-13 campaign, the Aztecs are 99-16 at home, including a 45-8 record in non-conference home contests during that stretch (43-6 against non-top 25 non-conference foes).
- ◆ The Aztecs are 37-7 in their last 44 non-conference home games.

### PRESEASON MOUNTAIN WEST CONFERENCE POLL

San Diego State has been picked second in the annual Mountain West preseason media poll.

The preseason favorite, according to the media that regularly cover the conference, is Utah State, which shared the 2018-19 regular-season title and won the conference tournament. The Aggies earned 187 points and all 17 first-place votes to finish in front of SDSU, the team Utah State edged in last season's Mountain West championship game, and its 150 points.

New Mexico has been predicted to finish in third-place in this year's preseason poll. UNM picked up 141 points to finish ahead of fourth-place Nevada (135 points) and fifth-place Boise State (128).

Fresno State (6th; 103 points), UNLV (7th; 89) and Air Force (8th; 76) were the next three teams to fall in line behind the Broncos with Colorado State (9th; 59), Wyoming (10th; 36) and San José State (11th; 17) rounding out the poll.

have occurred in the last 15 years. This is the first time in the last six years that the Aztecs haven't received at least one first-place vote.

## THE SERIES

San Diego State trails in the series 48-24 to Brigham Young, but have won the last three matchups -72-54 in the 2011 MW Championship game (3/12/11), 92-87 in double overtime in the 2014 Maui Invitational quarterfinals (11/24/14) and 90-81 in Viejas Arena last season (12/22/18).

- ◆ The Aztecs are just 3-29 against the Cougars in Provo, with victories coming on Jan. 31, 1985, Dec. 31, 1996 and Jan. 8, 2005.
- ◆ In the last meeting in Provo, a 71-58 win for the Cougars, the two stars for their respective teams went off. BYU's Jimmer Fredette finished with 43 points and Aztec Kawhi Leonard totaled 22 points and 15 rebounds.
- ◆ The Aztecs have never won more than three games in a row against BYU and have only accomplished the feat three times. The series started with three straight for SDSU (12/19/40, 12/20/40 & 12/23/77), then again in the early 2000's (1/8/05, 2/7/05, & 1/21/06) and finally in the last three meetings (3/12/11, 11/24/14 & 12/22/18).
- ◆ In last year's meeting, junior forward Matt Mitchell played a career-high 36 minutes and scored a season-high 22 points.
- ◆ San Diego State is 133-155 against the current members of the WCC.

## LAST TIME OUT

### SAN DIEGO STATE 77, Texas Southern 42

Nov. 5, 2019 | Steve Fisher Court at Viejas Arena

**SAN DIEGO** -- The first 20 minutes of San Diego State's season was a thing of beauty.

Jordan Schakel and newcomer Malachi Flynn scored 15 points apiece and Nathan Mensah had 11 rebounds for San Diego State, which ran past Texas Southern 77-42 Tuesday night.

San Diego State led the entire game and was up 40-10 with just less than four minutes to play in the first half. It was 48-13 at halftime, after SDSU made nine 3-pointers and outrebounded Texas Southern 30-16.

"The first half was fun to watch," third-year coach Brian Dutcher said. "We guarded at an elite level, shared the ball, played well."

SDSU didn't keep up the intensity in the second half.

"Then the second half was just tough to get through," Dutcher said. "We had 10 assists at half then we only had two assists in the second half. I think the thing that would have made it easier is if we'd made some free throws. Games like this, you make your free throws the lead stays what it is, but we missed so many free throws."

Overall, though, Dutcher was pleased.

"This is a good team, a good group of guys that appears to be able to defend at a pretty high level. Our defense has been pretty solid and at the end of the day that's how we're going to win, with our defense and our rebounding."

The Tigers of the SWAC didn't crack 20 points until Yahuza Rasas made a layup with 11 minutes to go to make it 57-21.

Texas Southern coach Johnny Jones was ejected after being called for his second technical of the game, with 7:14 to go.

The Aztecs won the opening tipoff and Schakel drained the first of his four 3-pointers in the first half to get the rout started. The junior guard made another shot from behind the arc two minutes later. Flynn's first points with the Aztecs came on a corner 3 for a 15-6 lead.

Freshman Keshad Johnson's first points also came on a 3 to give the Aztecs their 40-10 lead.

"It felt pretty good," Schakel said of the hot start. "I was glad that it happened in the first couple minutes to get us off to a good start. I think we played well in the first half. It's always devastating when you're able to make 3s at a high clip like that. We have a lot of good shooters on this team and when we move the ball like that it's bound to happen."

Johnson added 10 rebounds for SDSU, which outrebounded the Tigers 62-41.

Tyrik Armstrong led the Tigers with 10 points.

"I thought they did a tremendous job," Jones said about the Aztecs. "I thought they played with a great deal of urgency and poise. ... Certainly hats off to those guys. I've watched them play for several years. They've lost a lot of guys last year and it seems like they've done a tremendous job of reloading."

## BANTER

Jones had an interesting exchange with referee Mike Scyphers before getting his first technical, after Justin Hopkins was called for a foul.

"He called a flopping foul on one of our kids and our kid got hit by a kid 240 pounds and he went down," Jones said. "It wasn't a charging foul, he got hit in the hip and he went down. (Scyphers) said, 'He shouldn't have fell,' and I said, 'So if Mike Tyson hits a guy, he shouldn't fall?'"

Scyphers responded: "Don't start bringing up Mike Tyson to me."

## BIG PICTURE

Texas Southern: It was a frustrating night for the Tigers, who were simply outmanned in dropping to 0-4 all-time against SDSU. Last year, the Tigers lost 103-64, also in San Diego. Jones was whistled for his first technical with eight minutes to go in the first half.

SDSU: After losing their senior backcourt of Devin Watson and Jeremy Hemsley and having Jalen McDaniels turn pro, the Aztecs unveiled their new-look lineup that includes transfers Flynn (Washington State) and KJ Feagin (Santa Clara) in the backcourt, and forward Yanni Wetzell (Vanderbilt). The Aztecs are trying to get back to the NCAA Tournament after missing the postseason last year.

## UP NEXT

# BRIAN DUTCHER

Head Coach

Third Season • 21st Season Overall at SDSU • Minnesota, 1982

Brian Dutcher, a long-time San Diego State men's basketball assistant coach, begins his third season as head coach. Dutcher completed his first year at the helm in 2017-18, following Steve Fisher's retirement announcement on April 11, 2017. Dutcher, who was on Montezuma Mesa for all of Fisher's 18 seasons, held the title of associate head coach/head coach in waiting the previous six years and is the program's 15th head coach.

Last season, Dutcher guided San Diego State to a 21-13 record which included multiple victories over nationally ranked Nevada. He is the only head coach in program history to record 20+ wins in each of his first two seasons and for the second year in a row directed his squad to the championship game of the Mountain West Championship tournament.

In his first season, Dutcher led the Aztecs to the 2018 Mountain West tournament title and the NCAA tournament, the program's first appearance in three seasons. He was the only first-year head coach in the NCAA tournament and SDSU ultimately finished the year with a 22-11 record.

Over the course of his 20-year career at San Diego State, Dutcher has helped the Aztecs reach the post-season 14 times, including nine trips to the NCAA tournament, win a conference-best 11 Mountain West titles and record 14 seasons of at least 20 victories.

Since 2008-09, Dutcher and SDSU twice advanced to the NCAA Sweet 16 (2011, 2014) and NIT semifinal round (2009, 2016), won at least 25 games seven times and captured eight MW championships (five regular season, three tournament).

Dutcher arrived at SDSU shortly after Fisher was hired on March 26, 1999. In his first year in "America's Finest City," the Aztecs won only five games, but improved upon their win total from the season before. After that, San Diego State posted a 14-14 record in 2000-01, before winning the 2002 MW Championship, earning an NCAA tournament bid and finishing with a 21-12 record. The 2002-03 campaign saw SDSU receive an NIT invitation, which culminated in the program's first Division I postseason victory.

After helping attract the first McDonald's All-American to the 2002-03 squad, Dutcher assisted in securing the signatures of future starters and all-league performers Brandon Heath and Marcus Slaughter. The duo started their first two seasons on The Mesa, leading to the 2005-06 season that produced the school's first Mountain West regular-season and tournament title sweep.

The Aztecs advanced to the NCAA tournament and ultimately won a then-school-record 24 games. That appearance led to a string of 10 consecutive postseason berths.

From the 2006-07 campaign through 2008-09, San Diego State registered 20 or more wins and went to three straight NITs. In 2009, the Aztecs advanced to the NIT semifinals and broke the previous school record with 26 victories.

The run to the NIT semifinals was a springboard to the most successful run in SDSU basketball history. Led by future NBA first-round draft pick and NBA champion Kawhi Leonard, the 2009-10 Aztecs won the MW Championship, advanced to the NCAA tournament and fell four points shy of moving on to the second round before finishing with a 25-9 record.

The NCAA experience from the 2009-10 squad proved fruitful in 2010-11 when it returned all five starters, including Leonard, and a freshman named Jamaal Franklin, who would turn out to be a future MW Player of the Year and NBA draft selection. With Dutcher on staff, SDSU won its first 20 games of the year, shared the MW regular-season title and captured the MW tournament crown. The Aztecs moved on to the NCAA tournament as a No. 2 seed and won the program's first Division I NCAA tournament game. San Diego State, which was ranked as high as No. 4 and received first-place votes at one point in the season, advanced to the Sweet 16 and fell to the eventual national champion, finishing with a school-record 34 wins, a mark that still stands today. The Aztecs' also found themselves in the final top-25 polls, ranking sixth in the AP and 11th in the USA Today Coaches Poll.

Five months after SDSU's record-setting 2010-11 campaign, the University elevated Dutcher from associate head coach to associate head coach/head coach in waiting.

In his first season with his new title, Dutcher and the Aztecs advanced to the 2012 NCAA tournament as an at-large team and recorded 26 wins. The next year, SDSU was an at-large selection to the 2013 NCAA tourney, moved on to the round of 32 for the second time in three years and finished with 23 victories.

Another NCAA Sweet 16 run was in the cards in Dutcher's third season as the head coach in waiting. The Aztecs opened the season by winning 21 of their first 22 games, including 20 in a row at one point, and were led by seniors Xavier Thames, who would become an NBA draft pick, and Josh Davis. SDSU won the program's second outright Mountain West regular-season title and later swept through two games in Spokane, Washington, to secure its second Sweet 16 appearance in four seasons. San Diego State compiled 31 wins and finished the season ranked 13th in the AP and 12th in the Coaches after rising to as high as fifth nationally in both polls.

The 2014-15 campaign saw the Aztecs spend their fifth straight season in the top 25. In the process of winning 27 games, San Diego State grabbed its second straight MW regular-season crown and earned an at-large invitation to the NCAA tournament where they defeated St. John's in the round of 64. One season later, the Aztecs found themselves in the NIT after winning the MW by three games with a 16-2 record. Nevertheless, SDSU won three games and qualified for the NIT semifinals, eventually logging 28 victories.

In his final season as associate head coach/head coach in waiting (2016-17), San Diego State posted a 19-14 record despite experiencing a rash of injuries.

Before Dutcher arrived at San Diego State, he served as assistant coach and later associate head coach at Michigan under Fisher. He spent 10 seasons on the Wolverine staff, establishing himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches. His first year in Ann Arbor was 1989 and resulted in a national title for Michigan as he assisted then-interim head coach Fisher on the bench.

The Bloomington, Minn., native led UM's recruiting efforts in 1990-91 when the Wolverines inked Juwan

Howard, Ray Jackson, Jimmy King, Jalen Rose and Chris Webber. The "Fab Five" is considered perhaps the best recruiting class in NCAA history. Dutcher helped lead that group to nearly 100 wins, two berths in the NCAA championship game and a regional final over a four-year period. He was also on the Michigan staff for an NIT championship (1997).

Dutcher's recruiting prowess, however, was demonstrated by more than just the "Fab Five" haul. Michigan had the nation's top-ranked recruiting class in 1993-94 and in 1994-95, with a group that included Maurice Taylor and Jerod Ward. The accomplishment marked the first time that a university had the nation's top class in consecutive years, according to recruiting analyst Bob Gibbons.

Dutcher was born Oct. 30, 1959, in Alpena, Mich. He attended Jefferson High School in Bloomington, Minn., and went on to earn a bachelor's degree in physical education from Minnesota in 1982. While an undergraduate, he worked for his father, then-Gopher head coach Jim Dutcher. He then spent one season in the prep ranks at Apple Valley (Minn.) High School before becoming a graduate assistant at Illinois, where he earned his master's degree in physical education and athletic administration.

While in Champaign, Dutcher helped Lou Henson lead the Illini to a Big Ten championship, two appearances in the Sweet 16 and one regional final.

Dutcher's first full-time coaching job came at South Dakota State, where he spent three seasons helping turn around the Division II program before departing in 1988 for Michigan.

His final season in Ann Arbor ended with the Wolverines claiming the first-ever Big Ten Tournament championship.
