BYU (6-4)



The No. 9 University of Washington women's basketball team (11-1) wraps up its non-conference schedule on Thursday (Dec. 22) on the road against BYU (6-4) at 2 p.m. PT. The Huskies look to extend an eight-game winning streak.

For the first time in 18 years, Washington cracked the Top 10 in the regular season, checking in at No. 9 in the latest AP Top 25 poll. The Huskies are the highest ranked Pac-12 team, joining five others: UCLA at No. 10, Stanford at No. 14, Colorado at No. 15, Arizona State at No. 21 and Oregon State at No. 25. The last time Washington was ranked in the Top 10 during the regular season was in 1998, the same year all four of the Husky freshmen were born.

In the latest RPI, the Huskies are ranked No. 11, as well as in the USA Today Coaches Poll. With its highest ranking since 2003-04, the Huskies selected to finish third in the Pac-12. The Huskies received two first-place votes and garnered 93 points.

BY THE NUMBERS

1st

The Huskies lead the nation with 137 made three-pointers. Washington is 137-of-334 from three-point range, hitting at a .410 clip and 12 different players have hit at least one.

1st

Washington seniors Kelsey Plum and Chantel Osafor are leading the nation in scoring and rebounding, respectively. Plum is averaging 30.3 points per game and Osafor is averaging 14.2 rebounds per game.

4th

The Huskies have outscored their opponents, 1088-693 and their 32.9 scoring margin ranks fourth in the nation.

4th

Washington's 11.2 three-pointers per game ranks fourth in the NCAA.

4th

Washington's 90.7 points per game ranks fourth in the nation.

100+

Washington has hit or gone over the century mark five times this season. The only other season the Huskies reached 100 or more that many times was in 1981-82 (five times).

KELSEY PLUM



Just 11 games into her senior season, Kelsey Plum broke the all-time Pac-12 scoring record on Dec. 11, scoring 44 points against Boise State. She now has 2,782 career points.

Since arriving on campus in 2013, she has started in every game (116), scoring in double-figures in 114 of those contests, including 85 20-plus point games and 27 30-plus games.

The Poway, Calif. native's 960 points last season led the nation and her 25.9 points per game ranked fourth. As a junior, she broke Washington's all-time scoring record and also led the nation in free throws made (266) and minutes played (1,414).

Plum entered her senior year with career averages of 23.3 points, 4.0 rebounds and 3.4 assists. She became the first player in program history to earn a spot on the Associated Press Preseason All-America Team.

PLUM BY THE NUMBERS

2,782 Plum became the **all-time Pac-12 scoring leader** on Dec. 11, 2016. She now has 2,782 career points.

1st Plum's 30.3 **points per game**, 120 field goals made and 364 total points leads the NCAA.

270 She broke the career 3-point record at UW on Dec. 18, 2016. She now has 270 in her career.

CHANTEL OSAHOR



After leading the team off the bench as a sophomore, Chantel Osahor had a breakthrough junior season in which she set the Washington single-season rebounding record with 417.

She's one of only two returning Pac-12 players to average a double-double last season and her 3.41 assists per game were second-most among Pac-12 forwards. The Phoenix, Ariz. native led all post players in the Pac-12 with a 1.7 assist to turnover ratio (127 assists / 74 TO's). Osahor led the team with 11 double-doubles last season.

She has already recorded nine double-doubles this season, which ties for most in the NCAA. Osahor also leads the nation in rebounds per game (14.2). She is on track to reach 1,000 points and 1,000 rebounds in her career. She's 243 points shy of 1,000 and 110 rebounds away from 1,000.

ley, St. Joseph's, Tulsa, UNLV, Weber State and Utah State. The Cougars' losses include a pair of Pac-12 schools: Georgia, Oklahoma, Oregon State and Utah. BYU's RPI is ranked No. 38, the highest of all West Coast Conference teams.

Three Cougar players are averaging double figures, led by Cassie Broadhead (15.7), Mackenzi Pulsipher (13.5) and Kalani Purcell (11.3). Kristine Nelson averages 9.3 points per game and is second on the team with 15 three-pointers. Purcell is also BYU's leading rebounder (8.8) and assists (4.5 per game).

The Cougars are averaging 63.4 points per game while allowing 61.1 and 36.4 boards per game to opponents' 40.8.

LEADING THE WAY

Washington has four players averaging double figures: Plum (30.3), Osahor (13.7), McDonald (12.4) and Romeo (10.7). Osahor is averaging a double-double with 14.2 boards per game. Plum leads the team with 68 assists (5.7 per game).

PLUM BREAKS ALL-TIME PAC-12 SCORING RECORD

Just 11 games into her senior season, Kelsey Plum broke the all-time Pac-12 scoring record on Sunday (Dec. 11), surpassing former Stanford Cardinal and 2014 WNBA Rookie of the Year Chiney Ogwumike (2011-14, 2737 points). Plum, who now has 2,759 career points, tied a season-high with 44 points in Washington's win against Boise State.

She scored 22 in the first half alone to tie the record before breaking it with a free throw at the 8:38 mark of the third quarter. She matched her season-high with 44 points, which is a new high at home for the senior. Plum also matched her career-high with nine rebounds to go along with four assists and five steals. She was a flawless 9-of-9 from the foul line.

HUSKIES SWEEP PAC-12 WEEKLY AWARDS

After becoming the all-time leading scorer in Pac-12 history, Kelsey Plum was named Pac-12 Player of the Week, while freshman Aarion McDonald earned Pac-12 Freshman of the Week, the Conference announced Monday (Dec. 12).

Plum and McDonald helped the No. 11-ranked Washington women's basketball team to a pair of wins last week, beating CSUN (101-44) and Boise State (92-66) to improve to 10-1 on the year. This is Plum's second Pac-12 Player of the Week honor this season and fourth of her career while McDonald earned her first career Pac-12 honor.

McDonald scored 23 against CSUN before tallying 21 points against Boise State.

PLUM BREAKS CAREER 3-POINT RECORD AT UW

Against Savannah State (Dec. 18), Plum was 5-of-8 from three-point range and became the

program's career leader in three-pointers (270). Entering the game, she was tied with Jazmine Davis (2011-15) with 265 made in her career.

LAST TIME OUT

The Huskies won its eighth consecutive game, beating Savannah State, 87-36, Sunday (Dec. 18) at home. Washington improved to 11-1 on the season while earning the 800th win in program history in its final non-conference home game of the year.

Plum led the way with 23 points, eight rebounds, eight assists and five steals. The senior was 5-of-8 from three-point range and became the program's career leader in three-pointers (270).

The Huskies got 40 points from its bench, led by redshirt junior Heather Corral, who missed the last four games with an injury. She finished with 15 points, including three triples in 18 minutes of action. Rounding out the double-digit scoring efforts was freshman Mai-Loni Henson who tallied 11 points, seven rebounds and two steals in 24 minutes.

NATION-LEADING 3-POINT SHOOTING

All 12 players who have played this season have recorded at least one three-pointer.

The Huskies lead the nation with 137 made three-pointers. Washington's 11.2 three-pointers per game ranks fourth in the NCAA.

MCDONALD INTO THE LINEUP

After missing the first seven games of the season with an injury, freshman point guard Aarion McDonald made her collegiate debut against Grand Canyon, sinking the first shot she took, a three-pointer and ended the night with six points in 12 minutes.

McDonald made her first collegiate start in the game against CSUN and went on to score a career-high 23 points on 9-of-11 shooting and 3-of-4 from behind-the-arc. Against Boise State, McDonald finished the night with 21 points, six rebounds and four steals.

RETURN OF HEATHER CORRAL

Returning in the backcourt is Heather Corral who has been plagued by injuries throughout the majority of her career. The Vancouver, Wash. native missed the past two seasons with a knee injury and was limited to just seven games as a sophomore after playing in 24 contests as a freshman, averaging 4.5 points per game.

Corral started in the first seven contests before sitting out four games with a hand injury. She returned against Savannah State and

was the team's second leading scorer with 15 points, including three triples. She is averaging 7.5 points per game and is 15-of-33 from behind the arc.

OSAHOR CAREER-HIGH 22 REBOUNDS

One game after scoring a career-high 25 points against Grand Canyon, Osahor grabbed a career-high 22 rebounds against Fresno State. This was her third career 20-plus rebound game. Osahor is one of only four players in program history to have a 20-plus rebound game.

OSAHOR EARNS FIRST CAREER PAC-12 WEEKLY HONOR

Osahor was named the Pac-12 Player of the Week for the first time in her career (Nov. 28).

Osahor had a stellar week, leading the Huskies to three wins over Idaho, Seattle U and Portland. The senior recorded the first triple-double in program history in a 105-53 win against Idaho on Nov. 22. She finished the night with 11 points, 21 rebounds and 10 assists, with the latter two being new career-highs.

Four days later against the Redhawks, Osahor put up a double-double, scoring 18 points and grabbing 13 boards. She also dished out five assists in the contest.

The next day against Portland, she accounted for her sixth-straight double-double, putting together another all-around performance with 13 points, 17 rebounds, five assists and two steals.

PLUM DROPS 44 (TWICE)

Plum poured in 44 points, one shy of tying her career-high, to lead the team to a 94-64 win against Seattle U on Nov. 26 at the Connolly Complex.

The Poway, Calif. native matched that, scoring 44 points against Boise State (Dec. 11), a new career high at home for the senior.

NINE CONSECUTIVE DOUBLE-DOUBLES

Chantel Osahor recorded nine consecutive double-doubles before seeing limited action against Boise State following an injury.

FIRST TRIPLE DOUBLE IN PROGRAM HISTORY

Osahor accounted for the first triple-double in program history in the win vs. Idaho, 105-53, on Nov. 22.

Osahor finished the night with 11 points, 21 rebounds and 10 assists, with the latter two being new career-highs for the Phoenix, Ariz. native.

PROGRAM RECORD 19 THREE-POINTERS

Washington knocked down a program record 19 three-pointers in a 105-53 win against Idaho on Nov. 22.

Seven different Huskies contributed to the record-setting night from behind the arc, led by Natalie Romeo who recorded six in the game, including five in the first quarter to tally 18 points.

NCAA RECORD MOST THREES IN GAME

Washington and Idaho broke an NCAA record with a combined 97 three-pointers attempted in the game, shattering the old record of 86.

NATALIE ROMEO

Before the season opener, the team received news that Natalie Romeo's waiver request was approved for immediate eligibility after transferring in May from Nebraska. Romeo set the Cornhuskers' single-season three-point record during her sophomore year (104) which ranked tied for seventh nationally following the season.

The junior has continued that success at Washington. She's currently one of four averaging double figures (10.7) and is second on the team with 37 three-pointers. Romeo knocked down six 3-pointers, including five in the first quarter, against Idaho before hitting seven against Portland.

VS. NO. 1 NOTRE DAME

Despite outscoring the Irish, 52-46, through the final three quarters, Washington could not overcome a 25-8 first quarter deficit and suffered its first loss of the season on Nov. 20 as No. 1 Notre Dame prevailed, 71-60.

Plum and Osahor led the Huskies with 22 points and 11 points, respectively. Osahor led the team with 12 rebounds to register her third double-double of the season.

Romeo added nine points off three triples while freshman Mai-Loni Henson and sophomore Deja Strother added eight points each off the bench.

WNIT SEMIFINALS VS. No. 25 MISSOURI

To advance to the championship game, the Huskies beat No. 25 Missouri, 79-66 in the semifinals of the Preseason WNIT. Washington used 15 three-point baskets and four double-figure scoring efforts to earn the win.

The Huskies' starters accounted for all 79 points in the game.

16 TRIPLES VS. COLORADO STATE

Against Colorado State, Washington was fueled by a combined 16 three-pointers and 10 different players were in the scoring column.

Six different Huskies contributed to the three-point barrage, led by Plum who went 5-of-9 from downtown. The senior had another all-around game, finishing with 26 points, eight assists, four rebounds while going 5-5 at the foul line. Osahor recorded a double-double in the win with 19 points and 11 boards.

PLUM EARNS PAC-12 PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Days after helping Washington to a convincing 100-52 season opening win against Eastern Washington, Plum was named the Pac-12 Conference Player of the week for the third time in her career.

The point guard knocked down 11 shots, including three three-pointers and went 7-8 from the foul line en route to 32 points in 28 minutes. She also dished out a team-leading five assists and pulled down five boards while recording three steals in the win.

Joining Osahor in the frontcourt is Katie Collier who is the team's fourth leading-rebounder (5.3) and fifth-leading scorer (8.2).

Also returning is Deja Strother and Hannah Johnson. Strother saw action in 20 games as a sophomore, scoring 39 points and pulling down 36 boards while Johnson returns after seeing action in 16 games last season.

Johnson, who has made four starts this season, is the team's second leading rebounder (5.5). In the season opener, she scored a career-high 10 points. Strother scored eight points off the bench against No. 1 Notre Dame before tying a career-high 11 in just 11 minutes against Grand Canyon (Dec. 1). She pulled down a career-high 10 rebounds against Boise State (Dec. 11).

RETURNING TO THE BACKCOURT

Walk-on turned scholarship guard, Mackenzie Wieburg returns for her junior season and has seen action in all but one game this year. After being sidelined with a hand injury, Jenna Moser saw her first action of the season against Savannah State. Kelli Kingma (hand) and Brianna Ruiz (knee) are sidelined with injuries.

QUARTET OF FRESHMEN

The Huskies welcome a quartet of talented freshmen – Mai-Loni Henson, Aarion McDonald, Amber Melgoza and Gigi Garcia.

While Garcia has been sidelined with an injury, Henson and Melgoza have seen a solid amount of playing time, averaging 6.3 and 3.4 ppg, respectively. After an injury kept her out of the first seven games, McDonald made her collegiate debut against Grand Canyon and is now the team's third leading scorer (12.4 ppg).

LAST SEASON'S HISTORIC RUN

Washington will look to build off the best season in school history, an NCAA Final Four appearance and a 26-win season, the most since 1990. The season was highlighted by four wins in the NCAA Tournament. As a seventh-seed, the Huskies beat tenth-seeded Penn, second-seeded Maryland, third-seeded Kentucky and fourth-seeded Stanford to reach the first Final Four in program history.

PLUM CHASING THE NCAA ALL-TIME SCORING RECORD

Plum needs 612 points to break the NCAA all-time scoring record. She scored 960 points in 37 games last season. Breakdown: Jackie Stiles (3,393), Brittney Griner (3,283), Patricia Hoskins (3,122).

PLUM CHASING THE NCAA CAREER FREE THROW RECORD

Plum is also chasing the 32-year-old NCAA career free throw record. She needs 150 to break the record. She made 266 last season. Breakdown: Lorri Bauman (Drake, 1981-1984): 907 made free throws (1,090 attempts, 83.2%)

Worth noting: Plum already has the Pac-12 career free throw record (739) and season (266 in 2015-16).

HEAD COACH MIKE NEIGHBORS

FOURTH SEASON



Mike Neighbors enters his fourth season as the head coach at Washington and sixth with the Huskies overall. He was promoted to head coach on April 21, 2013. He had previously worked as the top assistant coach for two seasons with the Huskies.

In just three seasons at the helm, Neighbors has built the Huskies into a national contender, amassing a 80-36 record, including two trips to the NCAA Tournament, punctuated by last season's historic run to the Final Four. Last year's Huskies won 26 games, the most at UW since 1990, while also advancing to the semifinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. The Dawgs entered the NCAA's as a No. 7 seed, defeating No. 10-seed Pennsylvania, No. 2 Maryland, No. 3 Kentucky and No. 4 Stanford to reach the Final Four.

He has mentored UW's all-time leading scorer in Kelsey Plum who was a 2016 USBWA All-American, a WBCA All-American, a Wooden Award All-American, a third team AP All-American and ESPW second team All-American. Plum finished the season 2,418 points while also breaking the 20-year old Pac-12 career record for free throws made (676).

In 2014-15, the Dawgs made their first trip to the NCAA tournament in eight seasons. Washington won 23 games, which was at the time, the most since 1995 and defeated five teams ranked in the top-25 at some point during the season. Those wins included beating No. 5 Texas A&M, No. 7 Oregon State and Florida State who finished with a No. 7 ranking and made the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

Neighbors record now includes wins over 16 ranked teams in three seasons, while owning a career Pac-12 winning percentage of .592 (32-22), which ranks third among active conference coaches behind only Tara Vanderveer and Lindsay Gottlieb.

In 2015, the Dawgs also earned their first national ranking since 2003 when they earned a spot in the top-25 of the Coaches Poll. The Huskies were named midseason as one of the top-20 teams in the country in the NCAA Tournament Early Look. The Dawgs would go on to earn a No. 6 seed in the NCAA's, traveling to Iowa City where they were upset by No. 11 Miami in an exciting up-tempo game that went down to the final possessions.

In his first year at the helm of the Husky program, Neighbors led the Dawgs to a third-straight 20-win season and trip to the quarterfinals of the WNIT. Washington finished 20-14, including 10-8 in the Pac-12. The Dawgs defeated five teams that were ranked at some point during the season, including an upset of then-No. 3 Stanford at Alaska Airlines Arena in front of a nationally televised audience. The win ended the 58-game road conference winning streak of the Cardinal.

Neighbors has overseen the development of several individuals, including Jazmine Davis who was named All-Pac-12 First Team all four seasons, becoming the first player in Washington history to achieve that distinction. Under Neighbors' tutelage, Davis would also become the Dawgs all-time leading scorer, while breaking nearly every school offensive record in the process. Neighbors also has continued to develop two other players that would break major school records with Aminah Williams and Talia Walton taking down the school's all-time rebounding and blocked shots records.

Previously as an assistant, Neighbors worked with the team's guards, including Davis who through two seasons has scored more points than any Husky in school history. He was regarded as one of the country's best defensive and player-development specialists.

In 2013, Neighbors helped the Huskies to a second-straight 20-win season and a return trip to the WNIT. Washington finished 21-12, including 11-7 in the Pac-12, good for a fifth-place finish.

In his first year at UW, Neighbors assisted the Husky women to a 20-14 season and trip to the quarterfinals of the WNIT. It was the first 20-win season for UW since 2002-03. Neighbors also saw the

development of guard Jazmine Davis, who was named the Pac-12 Freshman of the Year after averaging 15.7 points for the season.

Neighbors' accomplishments in women's basketball speak for themselves. He's helped sign nine McDonald's All-Americans, including Deja Strother who joins Katie Collier and Plum as McDonald's All-Americans on the Huskies roster. He has seen nine of his players drafted in the WNBA, including three who have won WNBA Championships. Everywhere Neighbors has coached, he's overseen the development of either the No. 1 or No. 2 all-time leading scorer in program history, most recently with Plum at UW. Neighbors is a regular speaker at coaching conventions and clinics around the nation, and his weekly newsletter is popular with coaches at all levels.

Neighbors came to Seattle after four seasons at Xavier, where he worked with former Huskies coach Kevin McGuff. During Neighbors' tenure in Cincinnati, he helped mold a Musketeers program that established itself as one of the best in the nation. Neighbors was named one of basketballcoop.com's "Rising Stars" in 2009, an award that recognizes assistant coaches who are some of the best in the business.

While at Xavier, Neighbors was a part of a coaching staff that produced some of the best seasons in school history. During the 2009-10 season, the Musketeers posted a 30-4 record, including a flawless 14-0 season in Atlantic-10 Conference play. Xavier ended the season ranked No. 5 in the polls. In addition, Xavier advanced to the Elite Eight of the NCAA Tournament.

In his final year at Xavier, Neighbors helped lead the program to a 29-3 record and an appearance in the NCAA Tournament's Second Round. During his tenure at Xavier, Neighbors was part of a staff that compiled a 61-5 non-conference record (108-22 overall), captured three A-10 Tournaments, three A-10 Regular Season Champs, and competed in four straight NCAA Tournaments.

Neighbors is also considered an excellent recruiter, and helped the Musketeers ink the No. 18 rated class of 2010 according to ESPN Hoopgurlz.

As the coach responsible for developing post players, Neighbors was instrumental in the growth of Amber Harris and Ta'Shia Phillips, two of the best players in Musketeer history. Harris, a 6-5 forward, was a two-time State Farm All-America selection and was drafted fourth overall by the WNBA's Minnesota Lynx. Meanwhile, Phillips was noted as one of the premier defensive players in the nation. The 6-6 center was the leading rebounder in XU history, in addition to her numerous national accolades.

Neighbors came to XU from the University of Arkansas, where he was an assistant coach for a season, his second stint in Fay-

etteville. Prior to returning to his alma mater, Neighbors was an assistant coach at the University of Colorado and the University of Tulsa, both under Kathy McConnell-Miller. In Boulder, Neighbors helped develop the school's all-time leading scorer in Brittany Spears, a 2011 WNBA draft selection. At Tulsa, Neighbors was an assistant on the up-and-coming Hurricane's program that enjoyed back-to-back postseason appearances.

A native of Greenwood, Ark., Neighbors received his bachelor's degree from the University of Arkansas in 1993. Following his graduation, Neighbors was a director of basketball operations for the women's basketball program, serving under legendary coach Gary Blair, who won the NCAA Championship in 2011 with Texas A&M. Before moving into the collegiate ranks, Neighbors was a highly successful head coach in the Arkansas girls' high school ranks. His most notable achievement was taking a 1-24 Bentonville team to the State Championships two years later.

Neighbors has two children, one daughter Abby and a son Alec. He lives in Seattle.



ASSISTANT COACH MORGAN VALLEY



Morgan Valley is in her second season as an assistant women's basketball coach at the University of Washington in 2016-17 after being hired in August of 2015. The three-time NCAA Champion at the University of Connecticut has a deep tradition of winning at the highest level of collegiate women's basketball.

During her first season on the Washington staff, Valley helped guide the team to an historic run to the Final Four. The Huskies won 26 games, the most at Washington since 1990, while also advancing to the semifinals of the Pac-12 Tournament. The Huskies entered the NCAA's as a No. 7 seed, defeating No. 10-seed Pennsylvania, No. 2 Maryland, No. 3 Kentucky and No. 4 Stanford to reach the Final Four.

"We challenge our players on a daily basis to surround themselves with 'championship people'," said Neighbors. "We did just that with the addition of Morgan Valley to our program today. I have racked my brain trying to think of another assistant coach in the game that was a two-time high school All-American and won three NCAA Championships."

can and won three NCAA Championships."

Valley began coaching immediately after completing her eligibility, serving as a student assistant at UConn under Geno Auriemma. She then moved on to Holy Cross (2005-07), Towson, New Hampshire, University of Massachusetts (2010-14) and most recently Virginia Tech, working her way up from a graduate assistant to a full-time coach.

Valley played for some of the best teams in NCAA women's basketball history, winning a then-record 70-straight games at UConn to go with the three national titles. A guard for the Huskies from 2000 to 2004, Valley was a BIG EAST All-Star in 2001 and finished her career by helping UConn to a 139-8 record.

Known for her intelligence, leadership and hard work on the court, the transition to the sideline was a natural for Valley following her playing career.

"Morgan has worked tirelessly from a graduate assistant to every chair as a full time assistant at five Universities to break the stigma that great players can't become great coaches," said Neighbors. "Her experiences and relationships that she has developed in her 16 years in the game will be unique for our current and future student-athletes to learn from."

Valley has a Bachelor's Degree in Human Development and Family Studies from Connecticut.

"To bring a seasoned coach like Morgan speaks loudly to the commitment the University of Washington and our athletic department has made to women's basketball," said Neighbors. "Help us in welcoming the newest Dawg to the Pack."

ASSISTANT COACH TODD SCHAEFER



Fresh off of a Final Four run, University of Washington head coach Mike Neighbors has announced the hiring of Todd Schaefer as an assistant coach for the women's basketball program. Schaefer comes to Seattle after spending the last three seasons at the University of Mississippi.

"Todd and I have been trying to work together for 17 years," said Neighbors. "We tried to team up various times but the timing was never right. I couldn't be more excited to step onto the court as a team with him. His experience will benefit every student-athlete in our program. On the court, he is passionate about skill development and helping everyone reach their maximum potential and off the court he is a perfect cultural fit. He gives us another father figure to help insure our Huskies use their four years with us to best attack the next 40 years. I am excited for our Husky fans to get to know Coach Schaefer and his family and welcome them to UW."

"I want to thank Coach Neighbors for the opportunity to join the Husky program," said Schaefer. "The chance to work with Mike is something I have wanted to do for some time now and to be asked to join the Huskies coming off the season they just had is very humbling. I am more than ready to get to work and I would also like to thank my wife Lisa and my three boys for supporting this move Seattle, we can't wait to meet all the Husky fans."

In just three years as the head coach at Washington, Neighbors' coaching tree grew following the 2015-16 season as assistants Adia Barnes and Fred Castro took head coaching jobs at Arizona and Eastern Michigan, respectively. Additionally, former staff under Neighbors have gone on to work at the University of Portland (Megan Osmer) and StonyBrook (Adam Call).

Schaefer worked primarily with the Rebel guards and wing players at Ole Miss. During the 2015-16 season, Schaefer helped sophomore Shandricka Sessom blossom. Sessom, who averaged just 5.3 points per game as a freshman, was Ole Miss' leading scorer as a sophomore scoring 15.6 points per game. Schaefer also helped develop freshman Madinah Muhammad. Muhammad was Ole Miss' top scoring freshman with 7.5 points per game – a number that increased to 8.4 points per game against SEC competition and was second to just Sessom.

The 2015-16 season also saw three-point specialist, freshman Torri Lewis set the Tad Smith Coliseum single-game record by drilling 10 three-pointers against New Orleans. Lewis joins former Ole Miss men's player Marshall Henderson as the only players to record double-digit three-point field goals.

Schaefer went to Oxford with 18 years of coaching experience at various levels following two years at Arkansas State.

At Arkansas State, Schaefer's duties included working with the Red Wolves' perimeter players, opponent scouting and video. During the 2012-13 season with the Red Wolves, the team finished second in the Sun Belt Conference West Division and won 12 conference games.

A native of Cincinnati, Ohio, Schaefer came to Arkansas State after serving two seasons (2009-11) as the head coach at Greenbrier (Ark.) High School. Before coaching at Greenbrier, Schaefer was an assistant coach at the University of Cincinnati from 2007-09, where he coordinated the Bearcat offense and served as the director of opponent scouting, among other duties.

Prior to his time at Cincinnati, he spent three seasons at Arkansas Tech, including two as head coach during the 2005-07 seasons. While head coach at Arkansas Tech, he led the Golden Suns to a road victory over the top-ranked team in Division II basketball and a berth in the 2007 NCAA Division II Regional Tournament. He also spent 1999-2004 as the head coach at Christian Brothers University in Memphis, Tenn., where he led the Lady Buccaneers to their first-ever berth in the Gulf South Conference Tournament. Four years later, Schaefer directed CBU to the GSC West Division title and to the NCAA South Regional Tournament for the first time in school history.

Before coaching at CBU, he spent two seasons as head coach at Allen County Community College and two seasons as an assistant at Western Illinois.

Schaefer earned his Bachelor of Arts degree while majoring in English at Thomas More College in Crestview, Ky., where he was a student assistant basketball coach and a member of the football team. He and his wife, Lisa, have three sons, Landon, Will and Jake.

Former WNBA player and Vanderbilt graduate, Jasmine Lister enters her first season as an assistant coach at the University of Washington. Lister has spent the last two years as a graduate assistant on Geno Auriemma's staff at Connecticut as the Huskies took home back-to-back national titles.

"You don't have to look too deeply into Jasmine Lister's basketball journey to find excellence," said Coach Neighbors. "One doesn't start every game of her career at Vanderbilt, play more minutes than anyone in the history of the program, earn All-SEC accolades on the court and in the classroom, play professional basketball in the WNBA, then win two consecutive NCAA Championships with UCONN without having excellence. Now that she's a Husky, we're excited for her to have the opportunity to mentor our student-athletes and share how she was able to be successful at a high level – through hard work and sacrifice."

"I'm really excited for the opportunity that Coach Neighbors has presented and I can't wait to get started," said Lister. "This program has really reached some new heights under Coach Neighbors' guidance the last couple of years and I'm ready to be a part of it and contribute the best that I can. I'm looking forward to working with this great staff and with the talented group of student-athletes that are a part of our program."

Lister competed collegiately at Vanderbilt from 2010-14, where she earned her BA degree in Women's and Gender Studies. She left Nashville as one of the most durable players in program history. She started every single game of her career (129), shattered Vandy's record for minutes played (4,626) and was named to one of the All-SEC teams each season she competed along with earning WBCA All-American Honorable Mention honors as a senior.

While Lister was at Vanderbilt, the Commodores didn't miss the NCAA Tournament once and advanced as far as the second round twice. Following her stellar career in Nashville, Lister spent the 2014 WNBA preseason in training camp here in Seattle with the Storm before accepting the position on Auriemma's staff in Storrs. When the 2015 WNBA season started, the Los Angeles Sparks called and the 5-4 guard saw action in seven games during that season.

She recently finished her Master's Degree in Sports Management at UCONN after helping the Huskies to their 10th and 11th NCAA titles.
