# **BRONCO FOOTBALL GAME NOTES**

**THE GAME:** The Boise State football team will play its second-straight Friday game this week, squaring off against BYU at Albertsons Stadium, Oct. 24.

The Broncos (5-2) and Cougars (4-3) are slated to kick at 7 p.m., and the game will be nationally televised by ESPN.

THE SERIES: Despite being just 380 miles apart, Friday's match-up is just the fourth all-time between Boise State and BYU. The Broncos are 3-1 against the Cougars, the only loss coming last season in Provo, Utah (37-20; Oct. 25, 2013). Boise State has won each of the two previous meetings played in Boise: Sept. 24, 2004 (28-27) and Sept. 20, 2012 (7-6).

# **BRONCOS IN THE POLLS**

**IT'S BEEN A WHILE:** For the first time since 2008, Boise State opened a season unranked in both the Associated Press and Amway Coaches Polls.

The Broncos had opened each of the last five seasons ranked in each preseason poll:

2009 - 14 (AP) / 16 (Coaches) 2010 - 3 (AP) / 5 (Coaches) 2011 - 8 (AP) / 6 (Coaches) 2012 - 24 (AP) / 22 (Coaches) 2013 - 19 (AP) / 19 (Coaches)

Prior to this season's debut polls, the Broncos had been one of only 11 schools to start each of the last five seasons ranked in the Coaches Poll, and one of 12 schools to open each of the last five seasons ranked in the AP Poll.

# A DOZEN YEARS IN THE RANKINGS:

Boise State has been ranked for at least one week in both the AP and Coaches Polls in each of the 12 seasons prior to 2014.

**SUCCESS WHEN RANKED:** Boise State has an all-time record of 88-11 (.889) when ranked in the top 25 of the AP and/ or Coaches Polls. A complete breakdown of every game played while ranked can be found on page 20.

NON-SATURDAY GAMES: Including last week's 37-27 victory over Fresno State (Oct. 17), Boise State has never lost at home on Friday night, going a perfect 11-0 all-time.

The Broncos are 42-12 when playing a game on any day other than Saturday all-time, including a 36-7 mark during the regular season and a 21-5 record on Friday regular-season games.

NONCONFERENCE HOME GAMES: With its victory over Louisiana (Sept. 20), Boise State has now won 18-straight nonconference home games. The last home loss to a non-league school came in the 2005 MPC Computers Bowl, a 27-21 setback to Boston College, Dec. 28, 2005. Boise State hasn't lost such a game during the regular season since 2001 (Washington State, 41-20), a streak of 28-straight victories.

PROTECTING THE BLUE: Since opening Albertsons Stadium (formerly Bronco Stadium) in 1970, Boise State is 240-51 at home, a winning percentage of .825. The mark ranks fourth nationally, trailing only Baylor (3-0 at McLane Stadium; 1.000), Marshall (139-25 at Joan C. Edwards Stadium; .848) and Georgia Southern (179-33 at Paulson Stadium; .844).

Following its victory over Fresno State (Oct. 17), Boise State has now won 10-consecutive home games. The Broncos went a perfect 6-0 at home in 2013, the first perfect home record since 2010. Boise State lost once at home in both 2011 and 2012, but prior to that had put together five-straight perfect seasons at home, and nine-straight perfect regular seasons at home. The only home loss during that time came in the 2005 MPC Computers Bowl against Boston College (27-21).

Boise State has the best home winning percentage in the country since the start of the 2000 season with a record of 88-4 (.957).

**OCTOBER SUCCESS:** Prior to dropping last year's game against BYU (37-20; Oct. 25), Boise State had won 50-consecutive games during the month of October. The Broncos, 2-0 during October in 2014, are

65-12 since joining what is now the Football Bowl Subdivision in 1996.

Boise State has not lost an October home game since 1998 (North Texas, Oct. 10; 21-13), a span of 34-straight such wins.

BUCKLING DOWN: In 100 total drives against the Bronco defense this season, opponents have scored 31 times (.310). However, of those 100 drives, 61 went for less than 20 yards (.610).

Additionally, Boise State has forced 41 threeand-outs in seven games, an average of 5.86 per game and 41 percent of drives against the team on the season.

POINTS OFF TURNOVERS: Boise State has scored 69 points off turnovers this season, the seventh-most in the country. Additionally, the Broncos' average of 9.9 points off turnovers per game ranks fifth nationally. Included have been three defensive touchdowns – a fumble recovery (Tanner Vallejo) and an interception (Donte Deayon) against Connecticut, and an interception against Nevada (Tyler Gray).

**RUSH DEFENSE:** The Bronco defense held each of its first four opponents of the season to less than 100 yards rushing, the longest streak since holding five straight to less than 100 in 2009. The streak is the longest to open a season since also holding four-straight to less than 100 in 2006.

Boise State ranks 24th nationally in rush defense, allowing an average of 120.4 yards per game.

**RETURN OF #DBU:** Boise State ranks fourth nationally with 13 interceptions, trailing only Ole Miss (15), Louisville (15) and Houston (14).

Four players - Darian Thompson (4), Donte Deayon (4), Tyler Gray (2) and Jeremy Ioane (2) - have multiple interceptions. Thompson and Deayon rank tied for sixth nationally individually.

The Broncos are in their first year under the guidance of defensive coordinator

Marcel Yates, who had previously served on the Boise State staff from 2003-11 before becoming co-defensive coordinator at Texas A&M from 2012-13. During Yates' final six seasons with the Broncos, he coached six defensive backs that were selected in the NFL Draft - earning Boise State the moniker DBU.

**BIG-PLAY DEFENSE:** The Broncos have gained 17 turnovers this season (13 interceptions and four fumbles), tied for the 11th most in the country.

Sophomore Tanner Vallejo has two of the team's four fumble recoveries, ranking tied for 10th nationally, while Darian Thompson and Donte Deayon each have four of the 13 interceptions, ranking tied for sixth nationally.

Additionally, the Bronco defense is averaging 8.3 tackles-for-loss per game, a mark that ranks tied for fifth nationally (Tennessee). Included are 3.14 sacks per game, tied for 19th nationally (North Texas).

Boise State has double-digit tackles-for-loss in two games this season, and had eight sacks against Connecticut (Sept. 13), tied for the most since joining the WAC in 2001, and the most since also recording 8.0 against BYU in 2004. The total is also tied for the seventh most in the FBS in 2014.

RED ZONE SCORING: Since falling to Air Force (Sept. 27), a game in which the Broncos scored just twice in four red zone opportunities, Boise State is 11-for-11 inside the 20-yard line. Of those 11 scores, eight have been touchdowns. On the season, Boise State is 28-of-35 inside the red zone (.800), ranking tied for 86th nationally.

PASSING YARDS ALLOWED: Through the first three games of the season, Boise State allowed 354.3 passing yards per game. Although the Bronco defense currently ranks 79th nationally in passing yards allowed (245.4), the team has allowed just 163.8 its last four games. Only four schools are allowing fewer than 164.8 yards per game through the air on the season – San Jose State (94.5), New Mexico State (143.5), Stanford (153.0) and LSU (156.3).

**SPECIAL TEAMS DEFENSE:** The Broncos rank ninth nationally in kick return defense (16.17 yards per return).

EFFICIENT OFFENSE: The Broncos rank third nationally in completion percentage (.691), trailing only UCLA (.726) and Oregon (.718). Grant Hedrick ranks second nationally individually (.719), and opened the Louisiana game with 15-consecutive completed passes (Sept. 20). He trails only Brett Hundley of UCLA nationally (.725).

Boise State also ranks tied for 26th nationally with 171 first downs, 34th nationally in third-down conversion percentage (50-of-112; .446) and 28th nationally in time of possession (31:59).

The Broncos are averaging 485.0 yards of total offense per game, ranking 22nd nationally. Of the yardage, 291.0 yards per game are coming through the air, the 25th-best mark in the country.

WINNING IN CONFERENCE: The Broncos' loss at Air Force (Sept. 27) was just the 10th league loss since 2000. Boise State is 102-10 in league games during that time - the highest winning percentage in the country (.911).

MW LOSSES: Prior to a 28-14 loss to Air Force (Sept. 27), Boise State had lost just four league games since joining the Mountain West in 2011 – by a combined seven points: TCU in 2011 (36-35); San Diego State in 2012 (21-19); Fresno State (41-40) and SDSU (34-31, OT) in 2013.

# MOUNTAIN DIVISION SUCCESS:

Boise State's loss to Air Force (Sept. 27) was the team's first to an opponent from the Mountain Division since Nov. 1, 1997 (Utah State). Despite not winning the division last season, Boise State went 5-0 against its counterparts, the only conference losses coming to West Division foes Fresno State and San Diego State.

Boise State is still undefeated against three of its five Mountain Division counterparts, going 16-0 against Colorado State (4-0), New Mexico (5-0) and Wyoming (8-0). Utah

State, the only division opponent to defeat the Broncos prior to this season, has won just four times in the all-time series, and has lost 11-consecutive games to Boise State, which leads the all-time series 14-4. The Broncos are now 2-1 against Air Force.

**DEFENDING THE PASS:** Prior to Air Force, Boise State had allowed opponents to pass for 309.3 yards per game. The Broncos held the Falcons to 48 passing yards, the fewest allowed by Boise State since holding New Mexico to 44 yards, Sept. 29, 2012.

HARSIN ERA BEGINS: The Broncos' match-up with Ole Miss marked the first game played under head coach Bryan Harsin. Harsin, a former Boise State quarterback from 1995-99, also served on the Broncos' staff from 2001-10, serving as offensive coordinator from 2006-10. Harsin's hire was announced Dec. 11, 2013, by Director of Athletics Mark Coyle.

At 37, Harsin is the fourth-youngest head coach in the country. Only PJ Fleck (33, Western Michigan), Matt Campbell (34, Toledo) and Kliff Kingsbury (35, Texas Tech) are younger. Harsin is also one of only 13 head coaches nationally that is currently coaching at his alma mater.

**RACKING UP YARDS:** The Broncos gained 676 yards against Colorado State (Sept. 6) - the fifth-most in school history.

**CONFERENCE OPENERS:** With a victory over Colorado State (Sept. 6), Boise State has now won 15-consecutive conference openers since a loss in 1999. The game was the earliest conference opener in school history.

SCORING OUTPUT: With Bryan Harsin as offensive coordinator (2006-10), Boise State scored 2,733 points - the highest total in the country. The Broncos averaged 41.41 points per game during that time, also the nation's highest mark.

Since 2000, Boise State leads the nation in scoring, averaging 39.93 points per game. Oregon is second at 37.61 points per game.

Last season Boise State finished ranked 19th nationally with a scoring average of 37.5. During Harsin's five years as coordinator, the Broncos' lowest finish was 12th.

PREDICTED AT THE TOP: For the fourth-consecutive year, Boise State topped the Mountain West Preseason Poll. The Broncos claimed 20 first-place votes to pace the Mountain Division with 183 points. Utah State checked in at No. 2, claiming 12 first-place votes (176). Fresno State (174) was predicted to win the West Division, followed by San Diego State (172). Both the Bulldogs and Aztecs claimed 15 first-place votes.

Jay Ajayi, Donte Deayon, Jeremy Ioane and Matt Miller each earned Preseason All-MW honors.

**16-YEAR WINNING STREAK:** Entering 2014, Boise State is riding a streak of 16-consecutive winning seasons. The Broncos went 5-6 in 1997, the last season without a winning season.

ESTABLISHING A LEGACY: The Broncos are the winningest football program in the country since 2000, with an overall record of 160-28 (.851). Oklahoma (158-36; .814), Ohio State (149-36; .805), LSU (149-41; .780) and Texas (143-44; .765) round out the top five.

**EARLY OPENINGS:** The Broncos' 2014 season-opening game against Ole Miss (Aug. 28), was the earliest game played in school history. The Broncos' game against Colorado State (Sept. 6) was the earliest conference game played in school history.

NEW LIDS: Boise State unveiled orange helmets against Ole Miss, believed to be the first such helmet in the Broncos' repertoire since joining the NCAA in 1970. Boise State had at least one set of orange helmets when the school was a junior college, but archives do not show an orange helmet from 1970-2013.

YOUNG SQUAD: Based on the number of underclassmen on the Boise State fall camp roster, the Broncos are one of the 20 youngest teams in the country. Of the Broncos' initial 105 players during fall camp, 67 were either freshmen or sophomores (63.8 percent) tied for the 19th-highest total in the country.

**OFFENSIVE LINE STARTS:** Boise State returned just 26 starts along its offensive line entering 2014, tied for the seventh-fewest in the country. Entering 2014, Marcus Henry had started a team-high 12 games, followed by Rees Odhiambo (eight), Travis Averill (three), Steven Baggett (two) and Mario Yakoo (one).

WR NUMBERS: Boise State's returning wide receivers entered 2014 having combined for 345 career catches, tied for the seventh most in the country. Additionally, the receivers combined for 36 touchdowns, the fourthmost nationally entering this season.

However, 92.2 percent of the reception total belonged to Matt Miller (216) and Shane Williams-Rhodes (102), and 91.7 percent of the touchdown total belongs to the duo (Miller, 26; Williams-Rhodes, seven).

BOWL GAMES: Boise State has made 12-consecutive bowl appearances, tied for the seventh-longest active streak nationally. The Broncos have played in a bowl game in 14 of the last 15 seasons, winning nine.

SENIOR SUCCESS: This year's Boise State senior class is looking to become the 13th straight to win 40 games during their careers - or an average of 10 wins per season. At the moment, this year's class already boasts 36 victories.

SHUTOUT STREAK: Boise State has not been shutout in 218-consecutive games, tied for the 12th-longest active streak in the country and the 22nd-longest streak in NCAA history.

The last shutout came on the road against No. 15 Washington State, Sept. 27, 1997 (58-0). The loss to the Cougars is one of only two shutouts the Broncos have suffered since becoming a four-year institution in 1968.

PROTECTING THE QB: The Broncos gave up 26 sacks last season, the team's highest total since giving up 28 in 2004. This year Boise State breaks in a new starter at each postion along the offensive line, as the only two returning starters are switching positions - Rees Odhiambo moves from right tackle to left tackle, and Marcus Henry moves from right guard to center.

Also new is the Broncos' offensive line coach, Scott Huff, who moves from coaching the tight ends to offensive line. A former firstteam All-WAC center for the Broncos, Huff also coached the offensive line at Boise State from 2007-09. During that time the Broncos averaged just 12.3 sacks allowed each season - including just five in 2009.

AMONG THE GREATEST: Boise State began the 2014 season with the third-best all-time record among NCAA Football Bowl Subdivision teams. The Broncos' all-time record at the four-year level entering 2014 is 396-153-2 (.721). Notre Dame leads the list with an all-time record of 872-305-42 (.7325), followed by Michigan (910-321-36; .7324).



# HEAD COACH BRYAN HARSIN



Bryan Harsin was hired as head coach of the Boise State football team, Dec. 11, 2013.

A member of the Boise State coaching staff from 2001-10, Harsin takes over for Chris Petersen, who left the Broncos to become the head coach at Washington. Harsin has since served as co-offensive coordinator at Texas (2011-12) and head coach at Arkansas State (2013).

"We are extremely excited in our selection of Bryan Harsin as the next head football coach at Boise State," Coyle said. "Bryan is one of the top young head coaches in college football and we are thrilled to bring him back to Boise to lead the Bronco program. Bryan played a key role in the development of the football program as an assistant for 10 years at Boise State and we look forward to his leadership as we continue the ascension of Bronco football."

"We're coming home," Harsin said. "Kes (his wife) and I are thrilled about returning to Boise State, it's a special place built by special people. One of the hardest decisions we ever made was leaving Boise. We did that so I could become a better coach, so I could one day have the opportunity to return as head coach - that day has arrived.

"I appreciate the history and tradition of the Boise State program," Harsin continued. "I embrace that success but won't rest on it. We will build this program every day with a sense of urgency. I can't wait to get to work. Go Broncos!"

"I am very excited to welcome Bryan Harsin back to Bronco Nation," Boise State President Dr. Bob Kustra said. "His return is great news for all of us who do not want to lose momentum with the national reputation the program has achieved. As we write the next chapter of Bronco football history, I know it will continue to bring distinction to Boise State University."

A graduate of Capital High School in Boise, Harsin was Petersen's offensive coordinator for five of his eight seasons as head coach (2006-10), and was named a finalist for the 2009 Broyles Award, awarded annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Boise State went 61-5 during his tenure as offensive coordinator, including undefeated seasons in 2006 (13-0) and 2009 (14-0), and an undefeated regular season in 2008.

With Harsin at the helm, Boise State finished in the top-25 nationally each season in both total offense and scoring offense. The Broncos led the country in scoring in 2009 (42.21), and

finished as the nation's second-highest scoring team in both 2006 (39.69) and 2010 (45.08). Boise State also ranked second nationally in total offense in 2010 (521.31), and added top-10 finishes in the statistical category in 2006 and 2009.

Boise State finished no lower than 12th in scoring offense during his time as offensive coordinator, and no lower than 18th in total offense.

As quarterbacks coach, Harsin mentored Kellen Moore, the winningest quarterback in college football history, during his first four seasons as a Bronco. Moore, now with the Detroit Lions, was named first-team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America in 2010, and became Boise State's first Heisman Trophy Finalist that same season.

The former Bronco letterwinner began his coaching career at Boise State as a graduate assistant in 2001, before taking over the tight ends as a full-time assistant coach from 2002-05. When Petersen was hired as head coach in 2006, Harsin assumed the role of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

The Broncos are in the midst of the seventh-longest active streak in the nation of consecutive bowl appearances (12), and Harsin was a part of each of the first nine - including the team's victories in both the 2007 and 2010 Tostitos Fiesta Bowls.

With Harsin on staff, Boise State also won eight conference championships.



While with Texas, Harsin helped guide the ascension of an offense that ranked 88th in scoring prior to his arrival, to No. 24 nationally in 2012 (36.1). Despite starting 10 freshmen and sophomores on offense during his first season with the Longhorns, Texas put up more than 500 yards of total offense five times and ranked 21st nationally in rushing (202.6). The Longhorns rushed for more than 400 yards in back-to-back games, just the fifth and sixth such performances all-time at Texas.

In his second season at Texas, Harsin, who also coached quarterbacks, mentored two different student-athletes that finished the season ranked in the top 20 in passing efficiency. Texas averaged more than 441 yards per game.

Harsin then earned his first head-coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship. The Red Wolves finished the regular season 7-5 overall and 5-2 in league play, earning a bid to the GoDaddy.com Bowl.

The Red Wolves ranked fifth-nationally in completion percentage in 2013 (.693), and were one of the best teams in the country at taking care of the football. Arkansas State lost just 13 turnovers this past season, the seventh-fewest in the country. The Red Wolves threw just six interceptions, the 10th-fewest in the nation.

Additionally the team's rushing attack ranked 29th nationally, averaging 206 yards per game.

Harsin was a member of the Bronco football team from 1995-99, earning three varsity letters. Following his graduation with a degree in business management, Harsin coached running backs and receivers at Eastern Oregon in 2000.

Harsin and his wife Kes have two daughters, Devyn Lynn and Dayn

**OUT WITH INJURY:** Matt Miller had surgery on a ligament in his left ankle Oct. 13, and is expected to miss most - if not all - of the remainder of the 2014 season. The following notes were where Miller stood heading into the Nevada game (Oct. 4), the first missed game of his career.

NATIONAL RANKINGS: Redshirt senior wide receiver Matt Miller ranks 16th nationally through the first five weeks of the season in receiving yards (461) and is 30th nationally in receiving yards per game (92.2), ranking first and second in the MW, respectively.

**RECORD WATCH:** Miller has already broken the Broncos' career receptions record this season, passing Austin Pettis (229; 2007-10) on the all-time list. Miller entered the season with 216 receptions, then caught 14 through the first two games of the season to pass Pettis.

He is currently just 15 yards away from breaking the all-time receiving yards mark at Boise State, currently held by Titus Young (3,063; 2007-10).

NATION'S LONGEST STREAK: Miller has caught at least one pass in each of his 44 career games, the longest streak in the country. Wyoming's Dominic Rufran holds the nation's second-longest streak at 42 games.

**SEASON-OPENING STARTS:** Miller has started each of the last four season openers for Boise State, the only member of the Boise State offense to start each of the last four season openers.

**NATIONAL RANKINGS:** Miller ranks in the national top three in both career receptions and career receiving yardage, boasting 240 and 3,004, respectively. The national leaders can be found below:

**LAST YEAR'S RANKINGS:** Miller ranked amongst the national leaders in a number of statistical categories at the conclusion of the 2013 season: 12 touchdowns were tied for 10th-most nationally; 88 catches were 16th; 6.8 receptions per game ranked 21st; 1,140 receiving yards ranked 23rd; 87.7 yards per game ranked 27th.

**ENDING ON A HIGH NOTE:** Miller set career bests with 11 catches for 206 yards en route to Bronco Most Valuable Player honors at the 2013 Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. Included was an 85-yard touchdown catch, the longest play in the bowl's history and the longest reception by a MW player in a bowl game since the league's inception.

**100-YARD GAMES:** Miller has eight career 100-yard receiving games, tied for the fifth most in school history. The school record is 13, set by Ryan Ikebe from 1993-96.

**ONLY ONE LEFT:** Ajayi is the only member of the 2013 All-Mountain West First Team returning for the 2014 season.

**ONE OF THE NATION'S BEST:** Ajayi rushed for 1,425 yards and 18 touchdowns on 249 carries in 2013, earning first-team All-Mountain West honors. His yardage total ranked 15th nationally, his 109.6 yards per game ranked 19th nationally and his touchdown total ranked tied for eighth nationally.

Ajayi's 2013 rushing total is the fourth highest amongst those returning in 2014. Only Ameer Abdullah of Nebraska (1,690), Melvin Gordon of Wisconsin (1,609) and Travis Greene of Bowling Green (1,594) posted higher totals last season and return for 2014.

**NATIONAL RANKINGS:** Ajayi ranks nationally in a number of statistical categories, of which a breakdown can be found below:

ALL PURPOSE - 7th (169.14) RUSHING TOUCHDOWNS - 9th (10) SCORING - 10th (10.3) RUSHING YARDS - 12th (867) RUSHING YARDS PER GAME - 13th (123.9)

**JAY TRAIN:** Ajayi - otherwise known as the Jay Train - has rushed for 150-or-more yards in three of his last four games, bringing his career total to 2,840 yards - the eighth-most in school history.

He has five rushing touchdowns in his last two games, bringing his total on the season to 10 - the ninth-most in the country. His 32 career rushing touchdowns rank tied for sixth all-time at Boise State.

He has 35 career total touchdowns, tied for the ninth-most in school history. His 210 total points are tied for the 15th-most in school history. He is just the 16th Bronco to record 200-or-more points in a career.

**200-YARD GAMES:** Redshirt junior running back Jay Ajayi rushed for 219 yards against Colorado State (Sept. 6). He is just the fourth player in school history with multiple 200-yard rushing games, joining Cedric Minter (4; 1977-80), Ian Johnson (2; 2005-08) and Brock Forsey (2; 1999-2002).

**MW POW:** Ajayi was named Mountain West Offensive Player of the Week twice during the first four weeks of the season, earning the nod following performances against Colorado State (Sept. 6) and Louisiana (Sept. 20).

**THE BRAHMA BULL:** Ajayi entered 2014 averaging 5.96 yards per carry on 331 attempts – the seventh-highest average nationally amongst players with more than 250 career carries.

Of Ajayi's 503 career carries, only 40 have resulted in lost yardage or 8.0 percent of his rushing attempts.

**100-YARD GAMES:** Ajayi has 11 career 100-yard games, ranking eighth on the Broncos' career list.

NATIONAL RANKINGS: Redshirt senior quarterback Grant Hedrick ranks second-nationally in completion percentage (.719), having completed 166-of-231 attempts this season. Only UCLA's Brett Hundley (148-of-204; .725) has a better completion percentage in 2014.

**STEPPING UP:** Hedrick has a pair of 300-yard passing games in 2014, throwing for 352 yards against Colorado State (Sept. 6) and 346 yards against Nevada (Oct. 4).

He has four 300-yard performances during his career (two in 2013), tied for the sixth most in school history.

STEPPING IN: Hedrick, now a redshirt senior, took over at quarterback against Nevada when then-starter Joe Southwick was injured on the Broncos' first offensive play in 2013. He made his first-career start against BYU the following week (Oct. 25), becoming the first back-up quarterback to start a game due to injury for Boise State since B.J. Rhode in 2002 (Wyoming; Sept. 14).

Hedrick played all but one series for the Broncos the rest of the season, completing 155-of-226 passes for 1,711 yards, 15 touchdowns and five interceptions during that time.

Hedrick's completion percentage of .690 on the season ranked fifth nationally, and his efficiency rating of 150.0 ranked 23rd nationally. His 22.1 completions per game once stepping in as the starter would have ranked 16th-nationally, and his 244.4 yards passing per game would have ranked 35th.

A BIG PERFORMANCE: In just his second-career start (Colorado State), Hedrick accounted for each of Boise State's six touchdowns, leading the Broncos to a 42-30 victory. Hedrick threw five touchdown passes, tied for the second-most in school history, and added a rushing score. His six touchdowns were the most by a Bronco quarterback since Ryan Diniwddie also accounted for six against Nevada, Nov. 29, 2003.

Hedrick completed 19-of-27 passes for 305 yards against the Rams, his first-career 300-yard performance. In addition to the five touchdown passes, he did not throw an interception. He threw touchdown passes to four different receivers, including a 68-yarder to sophomore Shane Williams-Rhodes - the longest pass play for Boise State since Kellen Moore hit Doug Martin for a 71-yarder against Toledo, Sept. 16, 2011.

**DUAL THREAT:** Hedrick had six rushing touchdowns last season, the most by a Bronco quarterback since Jared Zabransky also had six in 2006. He also finished as the team's second leading rusher, picking up 277 yards on 68 carries.

Hedrick is also the Broncos' second-leading rusher this season with 260 yards and two touchdowns through seven games. Included was an 80-yard, one-touchdown performance against Colorado State (Sept. 6).

ENDING, STARTING ON A HIGH NOTE: Hedrick set career highs in completions (32), attempts (44) and yards (382) against Oregon State in the 2013 Sheraton Hawai'i Bowl. In the 2014 season opener, he bested the completion (36) and attempt (46) totals.

**INTERCEPTION MACHINES:** Junior cornerback Donte Deayon is tied for the team-high with four interceptions (in just five games) this season (Darian Thompson). His career total is now 11, one shy of cracking the Broncos' career top-10 list. His 0.8 interceptions per game would rank third nationally, but since he has not played in 75 percent of the team's games, he does not qualify.

Deayon's 11 interceptions have come in 23 games, nearly one pick every two games.

**PICK SIX:** Deayon missed the Broncos' game against Colorado State (Sept. 6) with an injury, then returned in a big way against Connecticut (Sept. 13). In addition to six tackles, Deayon returned an interception 50 yards for a touchdown with 4:00 minutes remaining in the fourth quarter, putting the Broncos up 38-21 and putting the game out of reach.

**SIX PICKS:** Deayon led the Broncos with six interceptions in 2014, tied for the seventh-most in the country and the most by a Bronco since Brandyn Thompson also had six in 2009. His per-game average of 0.5 ranked ninth nationally and second in the Mountain West.

Included was a streak of three-consecutive games with an interception, the longest by a Bronco since linebacker Korey Hall also had one in three-straight in 2006.

**DEFENDING:** His nine pass break-ups in 2013 tied for the team high. Combined with his six interceptions, Deayon averaged 1.2 passes defended per game, ranking tied for 32nd nationally.

COULD HAVE HAD IT?: Junior wide receiver Shane Williams-Rhodes had a team-high 77 receptions through 11 games last season before missing the final two games with an injury. His teammate - Matt Miller - broke the single-season reception record, catching 20 passes in the final two games. Williams-Rhodes' per-game average of 7.0 receptions led the team, ranked fifth in the Mountain West and was 17th nationally. The total was also the third most by an underclassman nationally.

NATIONAL RANKINGS: Williams-Rhodes hauled in a careerhigh 14 receptions in the season opener against Ole Miss, the highest reception total in the country during the first week of the season and tied for the third-most catches in a single game in school history. The catch total was the highest by a Bronco since Tim Gilligan caught a school-record 16 passes against Louisiana Tech in 2003. 


Bob Behler (left), named Idaho Sportscaster of the Year in each of the last four years, is in his seventh season calling play-by-play for the Broncos.

Albertsons Stadium - and Lyle Smith Field - is the home of Boise State football and the annual Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Smith is the undisputed father of Bronco football, who from 1946-67 built one of the top junior college programs in the country. When he retired from his head coaching position to become the athletic director, Smith had a record of 156-6-6 (.846).

Completed during the summer of 1970 at a cost of \$2.2 million, what was originally known as Bronco Stadium had a seating capacity of 14,500. Since that time the stadium has expanded four times to its current capacity of 36,387.

Boise State established a first in 1986 by installing the first blue AstroTurf in the country. The second blue AstroTurf field was installed in 1995, with the third prior to the 2002 season.

The first Blue FieldTurf surface was installed in 2008. A second Blue FieldTurf field was installed prior to the 2010 season, making a total of five different blue fields at the stadium.

Boise State's was the first collegiate stadium to have the entire field produced in a special color.
