Upcoming game: San José State vs. BYU
Friday, November 6, 2015,
Spartan Stadium, San José, Calif., 8:30 p.m. (PT)/9:30 p.m. (MT)

San José State record: 4-4, 3-2 Mountain West. The Spartans used a victory to reach the .500 plateau for the third time this season. San José State posted a 31-21 conference win over New Mexico on October 24.

BYU record: 6-2. The Cougars won their fourth in a row with a 70-6 triumph over Wagner on October 24 to become bowl-eligible. Like the Spartans, BYU had a bye the week of October 31.

San José State head coach Ron Caragher: In his third season as the San José State head coach. Has a record of 13-19 with the Spartans. Overall, he is in his ninth season as a major college head coach with a 57-41 record. Caragher's first six seasons as a head coach were at the University of San Diego. He is 0-0 as a head coach against BYU.

The 1990 UCLA graduate is 3-0 in games against BYU in which he either was a player or assistant coach with the Bruins. As a true freshman, Caragher was a member of the UCLA team that ended BYU's 25-game winning streak over parts of three seasons in a 27-24 victory in Provo on September 7, 1985. The following season, UCLA defeated BYU, 31-10, in the 1986 Freedom Bowl in Anaheim, Calif. Caragher did not play in either game.

As a UCLA assistant coach, the Bruins won at BYU, 23-9, on September 9, 1995.

BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall: In his 11th season at BYU. Has a major college coaching record of 96-41, all with the Cougars. He is 1-1 as a head coach against San José State.

Mendenhall was a defensive back on the 1987 Oregon State team that handed San José State its only regular season loss, 36-34, in Corvallis, on September 19, 1987. Mendenhall was one of three Beavers with a team-leading nine tackles.

Also, he was a member of the University of New Mexico football staff in 1998 when San José State defeated the Lobos, 37-20, in a Western Athletic Conference football game.

Series history: The Spartans lead the series, 10-6. The home team has a win in the last six meetings between these teams. San José State won the most recent game, 20-14, on November 17, 2012. BYU's last win in the series was a 29-16 victory on October 8, 2011 in Provo. The last time the road team won in this series was a 19-9 Cougar victory in Spartan Stadium on September 24, 1966.

Late-night Spartans: The 8:30 p.m. (PT) San José State-BYU game time is the latest for the Spartans in 2015 regardless of time zone. The September 12 San José State at Air Force game officially started at 8:21 p.m. (MT) and ended at 11:53 p.m. (MT)/10:53 p.m. (PT).

On November 21, San José State plays at Hawai'i in a 6:00 p.m. (HT)/8:00 p.m. (PT) Mountain West contest.

Besides the Air Force game, the September 3 New Hampshire win (10:04 p.m. PT), the September 26 Fresno State victory (10:56 p.m. PT) and the October 17 San Diego State Homecoming game (10:34 p.m. PT) ended after 10:00 p.m. local time.

The last time a San José State home game ended after 11:00 p.m. (PT) was on November 24, 2012 when the Spartans defeated Louisiana Tech, 52-43. The game began at 7:41 p.m. and officially ended at 11:20 p.m. (PT).

Ron Caragher on KRTY FM:

San José State head coach Ron Caragher is heard weekly on KRTY (95.3, San José), Tuesdays at 6:30 a.m. (PT). Gary Scott Thomas and Julie Stevens serve as hosts.

Seven Spartans played in the 2012 BYU win: Seven current San José State players played in the 2012 win over BYU. Long snapper **Ryan DiSalvo**, placekicker **Austin Lopez** and cornerback **Jimmy Pruitt** had the most prominent roles. DiSalvo handled all long snapping. Lopez converted two PATs after his first PAT was blocked.

Pruitt, who has eight career interceptions, had the first of his career in the fourth quarter deep in Spartan territory ending a potential BYU scoring drive.

Safety **Simon Connette**, defensive tackle **Tony Popovich**, offensive tackle **Wes Schweitzer** and wide receiver **Hansell Wilson** either had reserve or special teams roles. Nineteen more Spartans on the 2015 team were on the roster in 2012.

Spartans exceed 2014 win totals: San José State's win over New Mexico gave the Spartans a 4-4 overall record and 3-2 mark in Mountain West play. In 2014, San José State had a 3-9 overall win-loss record and was 2-6 in conference action. Since joining the Mountain West in 2013, the Spartans' best single-season win total is six by the 2013 team.

Last of three consecutive home games: The November 6 BYU game is the last of three consecutive San José State home games over a four-week span. The Spartan hosted conference opponents San Diego State on October 17 and New Mexico on October 24.

The last time San José State played three consecutive home games was in the 2007 season when the Spartans posted a non-conference win over UC Davis, beat Idaho and lost an overtime game to #16-Hawai'i.

Final regular-season non-conference game: The BYU game marks the last of four regular-season non-conference contests for San José State. Presently, the Spartans are 1-2 with a win over New Hampshire and losses at Oregon State and Auburn.

The last time San José State won at least two non-conference games in a season was in 2012 when the Spartans were 5-1 with victories over UC Davis, Colorado State, San Diego State and Navy in consecutive games and BYU in the 11th game of the season.

Coming off a bye week: San José State split its two games following a bye week in the 2014 season. The Spartans lost at Minnesota, 24-7, on September 20 and won in overtime at Wyoming, 27-20, on October 18.

Spartans in news during bye week: Running back **Tyler Ervin**, tight end **Billy Freeman** and punter **Michael Carrizosa** were in the news during San José State's bye week ending October 31.

Ervin was named to the Paul Hornung Award Weekly Honor Roll for the second time this season and added to the Doak Walker Award watch list recognizing college football's top running back.

For the third time this season, Freeman was one of two honorable mention choices for the John Mackey Tight End of the Week Award.

Carrizosa was one of 79 punters listed for the annual Ray Guy Award honoring the top punter in the country for the season.

Season-high rushing vs. New Mexico: For the third time this season, San José State rushed for at least 200 yards in a game with a season-high 317 yards in its 31-21 win over New Mexico on October 24. The Spartans are 3-0 this season when rushing for at least 200 yards. San José State gained 285 yards in its win over New Hampshire and 291 in the conference victory over Fresno State (9/26).

The November 2, 2013 win at UNLV (33-10) was the last time a San José State team rushed for more than 300 yards with 312 yards and two touchdowns on 45 carries.

Most rushing touchdowns in a season since 2004: After eight games, San José State has 18 rushing touchdowns. This year's Spartans already surpassed the team's 11 rushing touchdowns in 2014, 12 in 2013 and 17 in 13 games in the 2012 season.

The last time a Spartan team scored 20 or more rushing touchdowns in a season was in 2004 with 22.

Red Zone offense still producing TDs: San José State's rate of touchdowns when in the "red zone" is 76.9 percent with its one touchdown in two chances in the New Mexico win.

The Spartans rank tied for 28th nationally in red zone offense with their .885 conversion rate (23-of-26) scoring either a touchdown or a field goal.

Equality after eight games: San José State's 221 points scored matches the 221 points allowed after eight games.

Offensively, the Spartans have 83 rushing first downs and 84 passing first downs. West Virginia is the only other Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) team with a similar ratio and balance of 67 first downs by rushing and 68 by passing.

Team passing completion percentage: San José State enters the BYU game with a team passing completion percentage of 67.9 percent - tops in the Mountain West.

In the New Hampshire (9/3) and Fresno State (9/26) wins, the Spartans completed 85.7 percent and 86.9 percent of their passes, respectively, and did not throw an interception in either game.

San José State quarterback **Kenny Potter** ranks 14th nationally and first in the Mountain West with a 67.7 percent pass completion rate.

Interceptions factor into equation: In each of San José State's four losses, the Spartans were on the short end of two intercepted passes per game. In San José State's four wins, the Spartans were intercepted just once. San José State enters the New Mexico game with a minus-5 turnover ratio.

Outstanding 2015 for Tyler Ervin: Tyler Ervin ranks among the most productive Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players this season.

Through October 31, he is third nationally in rushing yards (1,159) and in all-purpose running yards per game (219.50) and third in rushing yards per game (144.9). He is tied for fifth in total touchdowns scored (14) and is tied for seventh in rushing touchdowns (12).

Ervin is tied for 14th in points scored at 10.5 points per game.

College football's busiest player: Tyler Ervin heads into the BYU game with more opportunities to handle the football either by rushing, receiving, punt return, kickoff return or interception return than any Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) player this season.

Twice in the team's last five games, he had the football more than 40 times. When the 177-pound senior ran for a school record 300 yards against Fresno State (9/26), he accumulated 345 yards of all-purpose running on 42 rushes and four pass receptions. In the recent New Mexico victory, he handled the ball 41 times (36 rushes, two pass receptions, three kickoff returns).

1,000 yards & more for Ervin in 2015: Tyler Ervin is the first Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) player with two games rushing for 250 or more yards in games played this season through October 24.

Ervin, with 1,159 yards for the season, gained a school-record 300 yards and scored three touchdowns on 42 carries in the September 26 Fresno State win. In the October 24 victory over New Mexico, he rushed 36 times for 263 yards and a touchdown.

He is the only FBS player this season with 36 or more carries in multiple games and with two of the top-five all-purpose yardage games. His career high of 345 all-purpose yards came in the Fresno State game.

Tyler Ervin establishes school rushing mark: Tyler Ervin's 300 yards gained on 42 carries in the win over Fresno State (9/26) broke the previous San José State single-game record of 286 set by Nathan DuPree in an October 31, 1992 game at UNLV.

His 42 carries were a personal single game high, one shy of the San José State single-game record of 43. His previous high of 22 carries was in the 2014 Utah State game.

With four pass receptions for 45 yards, Ervin accumulated 345 yards in all-purpose running against Fresno State. His all-purpose yardage total was more than Fresno State's 247 yards of total offense.

Punting stays up: San José State enters the BYU game as the national leader in net punting with a 43.5 yard figure. The Spartans are second for the third week in a row. Punter **Michael Carrizosa** continues is the individual national leader among Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players with a 49.0 per punt average.

Spartans among national leaders in blocked kicks: San José State is one of 16 teams tied for sixth nationally in blocked kicks with the three. Each of the Spartans' three blocks occurred in a team victory - New Hampshire, UNLV and New Mexico. San José State's opponent, BYU, is tied for third in the category with four blocked kicks this season.

Penalties stay down: San José State is among the least penalized teams in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) in games played through October 31. The Spartans rank second in fewest penalty yards per game (32.5) and fewest penalty yards (260) and tied for fifth in fewest penalties per game (4.13).

Season-high pass interceptions: For the first time this season, the San José State defense came up with two pass interceptions in a game in the UNLV triumph (10/10). **Maurice McKnight**, with his first of the season, and **Jimmy Pruitt**, with a team-high third of the year, had the interceptions.

The last time San José State lost a game in which it had two or more interceptions was an October 8, 2011 loss at BYU (29-16) when the Spartans intercepted the Cougars twice. San José State has wins in its last 10 games in which it had two more interceptions.

Pass defense keeps high ranking: The Spartans enter the week of November 2, the national leader in fewest passing yards allowed per game (122.1) and 12th in passing efficiency defense (103.5 rating). Opponents are completing 50.0 percent of their passes against San José State - best among Mountain West teams.

Last two road wins came in overtime: San José State ended a seven-game road losing streak dating back to the 2014 season with its 33-27 overtime win at UNLV on October 10. Prior to defeating UNLV, the Spartans previous road win was a 27-20 overtime victory at Wyoming on October 18, 2014.

San José State overtime trivia: San José State now has a 3-5 record in overtime games after outlasting UNLV, 33-27, on October 10. Two of the Spartans' three overtime wins are against UNLV. The most recent overtime game is the first time San José State won an overtime game by being on offense second. All three Spartan overtime wins were done in the first overtime.

The corner store: Since junior **Cleveland Wallace, III**, and senior **Jimmy Pruitt** were paired as San José State's starting cornerbacks in the third game of the 2014 season, there are six games in which an opponent failed to gain 100 passing yards.

Wallace, III, was a 2014 second-team All-Mountain West selection and Pruitt received honorable mention accolades. Wallace had his first interception of the season in the Oregon State game. Pruitt has interceptions at Air Force, against Fresno State and

Eleven first-time starters: Center **Keoni Taylor**, **Chris Gonzalez** at right guard, defensive end **Nick Oreglia**, defensive tackle **Loni Fa**, linebacker **Frank Ginda** and defensive back **Andre Chachere** made their first Spartan start in the September 3 game vs. New Hampshire.

Quarterback **Kenny Potter** and linebacker **Epie Sona** made their first major college starts in the Mountain West opener at Air Force on September 12.

Wide receiver **Justin Holmes** started for the first time against Fresno State on September 26. Tight end **Josh Oliver** made his first major college start in the San Diego State contest.

Dominic Barnes is the latest to make his first major college start. Barnes, a natural defensive back, opened at a linebacker position for San José State in the win over New Mexico on October 24.

Sharing the load: Of the 23 times San José State passed for at least 400 yards in a game, the 422 yards in the New Hampshire win marked the first time two quarterbacks each accounted for at least one-third of the passing yardage output. Starter **Joe Gray** passed for 253 yards (59.9 percent); **Kenny Potter**, 167 yards (39.6 percent); and **Malik Watson**, 2 yards (0.5 percent), against New Hampshire.

Offensive outburst at start of the season: San José State was credited with 707 yards of total offense in its win over New Hampshire. The total is the fifth best single-game figure in school history, the sixth time the Spartans gained at least 700 yards in a game and ranks 13th among 2015 single-game performances through October 10.

Less than 200 yards allowed: The Spartan defense had a solid night in its opener forcing New Hampshire to give up the football on six possessions without gaining a first down and yielding just 186 yards of total offense.

Season captains named: Running back **Tyler Ervin**, cornerback **Jimmy Pruitt**, offensive tackle **Wes Schweitzer** and linebacker **Christian Tago** were named team captains for the 2015 season. Tago is the only non-senior among the four.

Seven get the scholarship word: During preseason camp, head coach **Ron Caragher** announced seven players would be placed on scholarship. Cornerback **Dominic Barnes**, running back **Chris Dadson** and wide receiver/holder **Chris Kearney** received the news early in the month. Defensive ends **Mikal Berry** and **Nick Oreglia**, quarterback **Mitch Ravizza** and offensive lineman **Michael Talafus** were informed following the August 15 practice. Of the seven, Kearney is the only senior and Berry is the one sophomore.

Dual-sport Spartans: Since the end of the 2014 football season, wide receiver **Tyler Winston** and quarterback **Mitch Ravizza** played a second NCAA Division I sport. Winston played 21 minutes and scored 4 points as a reserve guard in the San José State men's basketball game against Seattle University (12/13/14). Ravizza completed his third season as a utility player/pinch runner on the Spartan baseball team.
