THE GAME: Fresh off a season-opening victory against Washington, the Boise State football team (1-0) will hit the road for the first time in 2015, traveling to Provo, Utah, to square off against BYU (1-0), Saturday (Sept. 12). The Cougars also won their season opener, knocking off Nebraska on the road.

Kickoff between the Broncos and Cougars is scheduled for 8:15 p.m., and the game will be nationally televised by ESPN2.

THE SERIES: Despite being just 380 miles apart, Saturday's match-up is just the sixth all-time between Boise State and BYU. The Broncos are 4-1 against the Cougars, the only loss coming in 2013 in Provo, Utah (37-20; Oct. 25, 2013). Boise State is 1-1 on the road against BYU, earning a victory Oct. 30, 2003 (50-12). This season's match-up is the fourth in a 12-year series that began in 2012 and will end in 2023.



NATIONAL POLLS

BRONCOS IN THE POLLS

14 YEARS IN THE RANKINGS: Boise State debuted at No. 23 and No. 24 in the preseason edition of the 2015 Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Polls, respectively.

The Broncos have been ranked for at least one week in both the AP and Coaches Polls in each of the last 14 seasons.

EARLY EXPECTATIONS: Boise State opened the 2015 season ranked in both the AP (23) and Coaches (24) Polls, the sixth time in the last seven seasons that the Broncos were ranked to start the year. Boise State opened 2014 outside of the top 25, and concluded the season ranked 16th in each.

A look at where the Broncos started each of the last seven years can be found below:

- 2010 - 3 (AP) / 5 (Coaches)
- 2011 - 8 (AP) / 6 (Coaches)

- 2014 - Not Ranked
- 2015 - 23 (AP) / 24 (Coaches)

SUCCESS WHEN RANKED: Boise State has an all-time record of 91-11 (.892) when ranked in the top 25 of the AP and/or Coaches Polls. A complete breakdown of every game played while ranked can be found on page 20.

CFP POLL: Boise State concluded the inaugural season of the College Football Playoff Poll at No. 20 in the final edition of the rankings. As the highest-ranked team from the Group of Five, the Broncos earned a trip to the VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

The Broncos checked in at No. 23 in the CFP Poll Nov. 25, the team's first appearance in the new ranking system.

Only three Group of Five schools were ranked in the poll during the 2014 season, and Boise State was the only team to post a win the week after joining the rankings. The Broncos went 2-0 while ranked in the CFP Top 25.

THE HARSIN ERA: The Broncos are in their second year under head coach Bryan Harsin, a former Bronco quarterback and assistant coach. Harsin led the Broncos to a record of 12-2 in his debut season, which included the school's first outright Mountain West Championship since joining the league in 2011 and the school's third victory in the Fiesta Bowl.

For his efforts during his debut season, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation.

WINNING STREAKS: The Broncos have won each of their last 10 games, the nation's second-longest active streak. Only Ohio State (13) boasts a longer winning streak (as of Sept. 6).

Boise State's home winning streak of 15-consecutive games is tied for the third-longest streak in the country (Florida State). Alabama and Baylor have each won 16-consecutive home games.

Additionally, the team has won three-straight road games, tied for the 14th-longest streak nationally.

WINNING WITH 16: Boise State scored just 16 points in its season-opening victory over Washington (16-13; Sept. 4), the fewest in a win since notching a 7-6 victory over BYU, Sept. 20, 2012. Since the win over the Cougars, the Broncos had lost four-straight when scoring fewer than 20 points.

KICK RETURN DEFENSE: The Broncos kick return unit allowed just two returns for 22 yards against Washington (Sept. 4). The 11.0-yard average ranked tied for 10th nationally following the opening week of the season.

ROAD OPENERS: The Broncos were victorious in their true road opener last season, knocking off Connecticut, 38-21 (Sept. 13). The Broncos opened the season at a neutral site, falling to Ole Miss (35-13;

Aug. 28). The win over the Huskies snapped a two-game slide in road openers, falling to Washington in 2013 and Michigan State in 2012. Prior to the losses, the Broncos had won four-straight road openers from 2008-11.

HOME OPENERS: Boise State opened the 2015 season at home for the first time since defeating Oregon 19-8, Sept. 3, 2009. The Broncos won this year's opener 16-13 over Washington, Sept. 4. When opening the season in Boise, the Broncos have won nine-consecutive games, and are 21-8 all-time. The last loss came to Cal State-Northridge, Aug. 30, 1997, a game that was later forfeited to Boise State.

Overall in home openers, including seasons in which the Broncos played a road game before opening at home, Boise State is 38-10 since becoming a four-year institution prior to the 1968 season. The Broncos have won 14-straight such games, with the last loss coming against Washington State, Sept. 8, 2001 (42-20).

MW CHAMPIONS: Boise State won the 2014 Sports Authority Mountain West Football Championship, the team's second league title since joining the league in 2011 and the first outright championship since winning the Western Athletic Conference crown in 2009.

The conference championship was Boise State's 10th in the previous 12 seasons, and the 18th league title in school history.

AMONG THE GREATEST: Boise State began the 2015 season with the third-best all-time winning percentage amongst the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Broncos' all-time record at the four-year level is currently 409-155-2 (.724). Notre Dame is first (883-310-42; .732) on the all-time list, and Michigan is second (915-329-36; .729).

17-YEAR WINNING STREAK: Boise State enters 2015 with a streak of 17-straight winning seasons. The Broncos went 5-6 in 1997, the last season without a winning record and one of only five seasons with a losing record in school history.

ESTABLISHING A LEGACY: The Broncos are the winningest football program in the country since 2000, with an overall record of 168-28 (.857). Ohio State (158-36; .814), Oklahoma (162-39; .806), LSU (150-45; .769) and Oregon (148-46; .763) round out the top five.

ANOTHER 10-WIN SEASON: After winning just eight games in 2013, the Broncos once again reached the 10-win mark in 2014 (12-2), the eighth time in nine seasons and the 13th time in 16 seasons. Boise State has won 12-or-more games in six of the last nine.

SENIOR SUCCESS: Should this year's Boise State football team win at least nine games, the Broncos' 2015 senior class will become the 14th straight to win at least 40 games during their careers, or an average of 10 wins per season. This year's senior class already has 32 victories under its belt from 2012-15.

The Broncos' 2011 senior class won 50 games, the most in FBS history. The 2009 and 2012 senior classes won 49 games, tied for the second-most all-time, while the 48 victories for the 2010 class are tied for the sixth-most in FBS history. In all, Boise State senior classes boast four of the top-10 all-time marks, six of the top 20 and seven of the top 30.

TURNOVER MARGIN: The Broncos lost the turnover battle against Washington (Sept. 4), but still won the game - the first such occurrence since San Diego State, Nov. 15, 2014. In the last 10 years (2006-15), Boise State has been victorious when losing the turnover battle 24 times, including four times against schools from Resource Five conferences. The last such win came against Arizona State in the 2011 MAACO Bowl Las Vegas.

Boise State concluded the 2014 season with a turnover margin of 0.50, ranking tied for 30th nationally (Florida). The Broncos ranked tied for 76th nationally following a seven-turnover performance against Air Force, Sept. 27. From that point on however, Boise State gained 19 turnovers and lost just 11, going 9-0 during the stretch.

THE BLUE: Since opening Albertsons Stadium (formerly Bronco Stadium) in 1970, Boise State is 245-51 at home, a winning percentage of .828. The mark ranks fourth nationally amongst current stadiums, trailing only Baylor (McLane Stadium; 6-0, 1.000), Marshall (Joan C. Edwards Stadium; 143-26, .846) and Georgia Southern (Paulson Stadium; 181-33; .846).

The Broncos went 7-0 at Albertsons Stadium in 2014, the most home victories since also going 7-0 in 2009. Boise State was also perfect at home in 2013, going 6-0. The Broncos lost once at home in both 2011 and 2012, but prior to that had put together five-straight perfect seasons at home, and nine-straight perfect regular seasons at home. The only home loss during that time came in the 2005 MPC Computers Bowl against Boston College (27-21).

Boise State has the best home winning percentage in the country since the start of the 2000 season with a record of 93-4 (.959).

MW SUCCESS: Since joining the Mountain West for the 2011 season, Boise State has lost just five league games. Prior to a 28-14 loss to Air Force (Sept. 27) last season, the Broncos' four league losses were by a combined seven points: TCU in 2011 (36-35); San Diego State in 2012 (21-19); Fresno State (41-40) and SDSU (34-31, OT) in 2013.

The Broncos' loss at Air Force was just the 10th league loss since 2000. Boise State is 106-10 in league games during that time - the highest winning percentage in the country (.914).

The Broncos' loss to the Falcons was the team's first to an opponent from the Mountain Division since Nov. 1, 1997 (Utah State). Despite not winning the division in 2013, Boise State went 5-0 against its counterparts, the only conference losses coming to West Division foes Fresno State and San Diego State.

Boise State is still undefeated against three of its five Mountain Division counterparts, going 18-0 against Colorado State (4-0), New Mexico (6-0) and Wyoming (9-0). Utah

State, the only division opponent to defeat the Broncos prior to 2015, has won just four times in the all-time series, and has lost 12-consecutive games to Boise State, which leads the all-time series 15-4. The Broncos are now 2-1 against Air Force.

Additionally, no team in the Mountain West boasts a winning record over Boise State.

ADADEMIC SUCCESS: The Boise State football team earned a Public Recognition Award from the NCAA for the fifth-consecutive year, for having its most recent multi-year Academic Progress Rate (APR) score rank in the top-10 nationally. Boise State is one of only five schools to receive the award in each of the last five years (Clemson, Duke, Northwestern and Rutgers). The Broncos' single-year APR score of 973 ranked tied for 10th nationally, the fifth-straight year inside the top 10 nationally.

SHUTOUT STREAK: Boise State has not been shutout in 226-consecutive games, tied for the 10th-longest active streak in the country (Georgia Tech) and tied for the 21st-longest streak in NCAA history.

The last shutout came on the road against No. 15 Washington State, Sept. 27, 1997 (58-0). The loss to the Cougars is one of only two shutouts the Broncos have suffered since becoming a four-year institution in 1968.

RED ZONE SCORING: Boise State scored in each of its last 47 red zone opportunities of 2014, of which 38 were touchdowns. Following its loss to Air Force (Sept. 27), the Broncos ranked 112th nationally (.708), but climbed all the way to conclude the season at 17th (.901). On the season, Boise State was 64-of-71 inside the red zone.

The Broncos ran their streak to 49, scoring touchdowns on their first two possessions against Washington (Sept. 4), but were stopped on 4th-and-1 at the Washington 15 in the second quarter.

The Broncos are 3-for-4 in the red zone in 2015 (.750).

PILING UP YARDS: The Broncos concluded the 2014 season ranked 14th nationally in total offense, putting up an average of 494.3 yards per game. Of the yardage, 280.4 per game came through the air, the 23rd-best mark in the country. Boise State ranked 29th in rushing (213.9) last season.

SCORING MACHINE: The Broncos ranked ninth nationally and led the Mountain West at 39.7 points per game in 2014. Since the 2000 season, Boise State is averaging 40.1 points per game, the nation's highest scoring average.

With Bryan Harsin as offensive coordinator (2006-10), Boise State scored 2,733 points - the highest total in the country. The Broncos averaged 41.41 points per game during that time, also the nation's highest mark, and never finished lower than 12th nationally in scoring.

O-LINE EXPERIENCE: Entering 2015, Boise State returned a combined 95 career starts along the offensive line. The mark ranked tied for the 15th-most in the country - and first in the Mountain West - according to research done by Phil Steele.

Entering 2015, Travis Averill (17 starts), Steven Baggett (15), Marcus Henry (26), Archie Lewis (5), Rees Odhiambo (17) and Mario Yakoo (15) have each started for the Broncos along the offensive line. Boise State returns all but one start (Eli McCullough, Air Force) along the offensive line from the 2014 season.

BUCKLING DOWN: In the 2015 season opener, Washington did not score a touchdown on offense in 12 drives. The last time the Bronco defense held its opponent without an offensive touchdown was Oct. 20, 2012 (UNLV). Additionally, Washington gained fewer than 20 yards on eight of its 12 drives (.667), and went three-and-out on three drives (.250).

The Bronco defense allowed just six points to the Huskies on two field goals - on drives of four and 17 yards - and the longest drive against the Broncos was 36 yards. Washington ran just five plays inside the Boise State 20-yard line, and went more than 50 minutes without reaching the red zone. Washington was 1-for-2 in the red zone, giving Boise State the 16th-best mark nationally in red zone defense (.500).

In 198 total drives against the Bronco defense last season, opponents scored 58 times (.293). However, of those 198 drives, 114 went for less than 20 yards (.576). Additionally, Boise State forced 75 three-and-outs in 14 games, an average of 5.36 per game and 37.9 percent of drives against the team on the season. The Broncos ranked ninth nationally in both three-and-outs per game and percentage of drives resulting in three-and-outs.

TOTAL DEFENSE: The Broncos held the Huskies to 179 yards (Sept. 4), the second-fewest allowed to an FBS opponent in the opening week of the college football season. Notre Dame held Texas to 163 yards.

RUSH DEFENSE: The Bronco defense held Washington to 29 yards on 22 carries in the season opener (1.3 yards per rush), the fewest allowed by Boise State since Colorado State rushed for 28 yards, Sept. 6, 2014. The total was the ninth-fewest in the country during the opening week of the season, and the third-fewest allowed to an FBS opponent. The total was also the fewest allowed by the Broncos to a team from a Resource Five conference since Arizona State rushed for negative-11 yards in the 2011 MAACO Bowl Las Vegas.

Boise State held seven opponents to fewer than 100 yards rushing in 2014, the most since holding eight to less than 100 in 2009.

CHAIN STOPPERS: Washington picked up just 12 first downs (Sept. 4) against the Bronco defense, tied for the 24th-fewest nationally.

RETURN OF #DBU: Boise State ranked tied for fifth nationally with 22 interceptions in 2014. Of the 22 interceptions, five were returned for touchdowns, tied for the most in the country (FIU, Georgia Tech and TCU).

Individually, Darian Thompson ranked tied for fourth nationally (0.5 per game), while Donte Deayon ranked tied for seventh nationally (0.5 per game). Thompson had an interception in the season opener against Washington (Sept. 4).

BIG-PLAY DEFENSE: The Broncos gained 31 turnovers last season (22 interceptions and nine fumbles), tied for the ninth-most in the country (Memphis). Boise State scored on turnovers six times, tied for the second-most in the country with six other schools. Washington scored seven times on defense to lead the country.

Tanner Vallejo had three of the team's nine fumble recoveries, ranking tied for 10th nationally, while Darian Thompson and Donte Deayon ranked tied for fourth (0.5 per game) and tied for seventh (0.5 per game) nationally in interceptions, respectively.

TOUGH UP FRONT: The Broncos lost just one individual from its 2014 defensive line (Beau Martin), a unit that helped the Broncos rank seventh nationally in both tackles-for-loss (7.8 per game) and sacks (3.36 per game).

CONVERSION %: Washington converted just 4-of-14 third-down opportunities against the Bronco defense in the season opener (.286). Opponents converted just 34.8 percent of third-down attempts against the Bronco defense in 2014 (78-of-224), the nation's 18th-best mark. Additionally, teams converted just 12-of-28 fourth-down attempts (.429), a mark that ranked tied for 32nd nationally.

KAMALEI CORREA

ALL-MW: Junior STUD end Kamalei Correa was named first-team All-Mountain West this past season, the first all-league accolade of his career. He led the Mountain West in sacks (12.0) and ranked 13th nationally in sacks per game (0.86) in 2014. He also ranked third in the Mountain West with 19.0 tackles-for-loss and tied for 18th nationally with 1.4 TFLs per game.

He kicked off the 2015 campaign with 2.0 TFLs and a sack against Washington, Sept. 4.

2015 WATCH LISTS: Correa was named to the Chuck Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Rotary Lombardi Award Preseason Watch Lists.

FOR COMPARISON'S SAKE: Former Bronco DeMarcus Lawrence was a second-round selection in the National Football League Draft following the 2013 season (No. 34 overall), having left Boise State a year early. During his sophomore year with the Broncos, Lawrence registered 48 tackles, 13.5 tackles-for-loss and 9.5 sacks in 11 games. Correa, in 14 games, recorded 59 tackles, 19.0 TFLs and 12.0 sacks.

DONTE DEAYON

ALL-MW: Senior cornerback Donte Deayon was named second-team All-Mountain West for the second-straight season in 2014.

2015 WATCH LISTS: Deayon was named to the Jim Thorpe Award Preseason Watch List for the second-straight year in 2015.

INTERCEPTION MACHINE: Deayon boasts 13-career interceptions, tied for the ninth-most in school history. Included were a team-high six in 2013, tied for the seventh-most in the country. His per-game average of 0.5 ranked ninth nationally. With six interceptions last season, he ranked third in the Mountain West and tied for ninth in the nation. He also hauled in six interceptions in 2013, leading the team and ranking tied for seventh nationally.

He led Boise State with 15 passes defended (nine pass break-ups and six interceptions), ranking tied for first in the Mountain West and tied for 19th nationally with 1.3 per game.

TOUCHDOWN, DEAYON: Deayon scored three non-offensive touchdowns in 2014, twice on interception returns – one each against Connecticut and 10th-ranked Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl – and once on a punt return.

POW: Deayon garnered Mountain West Player of the Week honors on both defense (Fresno State) and special teams (Wyoming) in 2014, the first Bronco to earn both honors since Quinton Jones in 2006.

RYAN FINLEY

QB FIRST STARTS: Redshirt sophomore quarterback Ryan Finley made the first start of his career against Washington, Sept. 4. The Broncos were victorious (16-13), making Finley the first Bronco signal caller to win his first start since Kellen Moore led the Broncos to a victory over Idaho State (49-7), Aug. 30, 2008. He is also the first Bronco quarterback to win his first start against a school from the Resource Five.

MARCUS HENRY

ALL-MW: Redshirt senior center Marcus Henry was named first-team All-Mountain West in 2014, his first all-league accolade. Henry made the move to center last season after starting 12 games in 2013 at right guard.

2015 WATCH LISTS: Henry was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award, Outland Trophy and Rimington Trophy Preseason Watch Lists.

REES ODHIAMBO

ALL-MW: Redshirt senior left tackle Rees Odhiambo garnered the first all-league accolade of his career in 2014, earning second-team All-Mountain West honors.



GAME NOTES (INDIVIDUAL)

Odhiambo made the move to left tackle last season after starting eight games at right tackle in 2013.

2015 WATCH LISTS: Odhiambo was named to the Rotary Lombardi and Outland Trophy Preseason Watch Lists.

JAKE ROH

ALL-MW: Redshirt sophomore tight end Jake Roh hauled in 35 catches for 408 yards and two touchdowns in 2014, his debut collegiate campaign, earning honorable mention All-Mountain West honors.

RECEIVING TOTALS: Roh led all Bronco tight ends in both receptions and yards, and tied for the group lead in touchdowns last season.

The reception total was also the highest by a Bronco tight end since Jeb Putzier caught 44 passes as a senior in 2001. Putzier was a sixth-round selection in the National Football league Draft by the Denver Broncos.

THOMAS SPERBECK

BREAKOUT RECEIVER: Junior wide receiver Thomas Sperbeck led the Broncos with 877 receiving yards last season, and ranked second with 51 receptions. What makes the totals impressive is that he did not have a catch prior to then-starter Matt Miller going down with an injury in the Broncos' fifth game of the season (Air Force).

2015 WATCH LISTS: Sperbeck was named to the 2015 Fred Biletnikoff Award Preseason Watch List.

MVP MOMENT: Sperbeck caught 12 passes for 199 yards - both career highs - en route to Offensive Most Valuable Player honors at the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

DARIAN THOMPSON

ACCOLADES: Redshirt senior safety Darian Thompson garnered the first all-league accolades of his career in 2014, being named first-team All-MW. Thompson was

also named CBSSports.com All-America Second Team.

2015 WATCH LISTS: Thompson was named to the Walter Camp Player of the Year, Chuck Bednarik Award, Bronko Nagurski Trophy and Jim Thorpe Award Preseason Watch Lists.

INTERCEPTION MACHINE: Thompson recorded a team-high seven interceptions in 2014, tied for the third-most in the country. His per-game average of 0.6 also ranks tied for third nationally.

He hauled in his first interception of the 2015 season in the opener against Washington, bringing his career total to 15 - tied for the fourth-most in school history.

TANNER VALLEJO

ACCOLADES: Junior linebacker Tanner Vallejo was named second-team All-MW in 2014, the first all-league honor of his career.

He was also named Defensive MVP of both the 2014 Sports Authority Mountain West Football Championship and the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

2015 WATCH LISTS: Vallejo was named to the Rotary Lombardi Award Preseason Watch List.

RECOVERING FUMBLES: Vallejo ranked tied for 10th nationally with three fumble recoveries last season.

TACKLING MACHINE: Vallejo started every game for the Broncos in 2014. He led the team with 100 tackles and was second on the team with 16.5 tackles-for-loss.

TOUCHDOWNS: Vallejo picked up a fumble and returned it 31 yards for a touchdown on Connecticut's opening drive, Sept. 13, 2014. It was the first fumble recovery for a touchdown by a Bronco since Demarcus Lawrence accomplished the feat against Hawai'i, Nov. 10, 2012.

Vallejo added an interception return

for a touchdown against Fresno State in the league championship game. The interception was the first of his career, and the touchdown gave him two defensive scores on the season. He is the first Bronco with multiple defensive scores in the same year since Shea McClellin accomplished the feat in 2010.

SHANE WILLIAMS-RHODES

ALL-MW: Senior wide receiver Shane Williams-Rhodes was named honorable mention All-Mountain West at wide receiver for a second-straight season in 2014.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: Williams-Rhodes was Boise State's nominee for both the AFCA Good Works Team and the Wuerffel Trophy, which each recognizes character and community service off the field.

MANY, MANY RECEPTIONS: Williams-Rhodes led the Broncos with 68 catches last season, ranking fourth in the MW. His reception total is also the ninth-most in a single season all-time at Boise State.

The 2014 performance brought his career total to 170, the fifth-most in school history.

He had 77 receptions in 2013, the fourth-most in school history.



HEAD COACH BRYAN HARSIN



In his debut season as the head coach of the Boise State football team, Bryan Harsin, a former Bronco quarterback and assistant coach, led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence less than a decade ago. Boise State went 12-2 in Harsin's inaugural season, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship, and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

The victory in the Fiesta Bowl was the third such win for the Broncos in the last nine seasons. Harsin, serving as offensive coordinator in the first two Fiesta Bowl victories, has been a part of each of the school's three appearances in the game.

The team's victory in the 2014 Sports Authority Mountain West Football Championship marked the team's first outright league title since joining the league in 2011, and the first overall since 2009. The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has now won a conference championship as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

For his efforts this past year, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.

The Broncos concluded the 2014 season ranked No. 16 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Polls.

In addition to rejoining the national rankings – Boise State ranked 20th nationally in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 – the Broncos' offense also returned the nation's elite. Boise State concluded the season ranked ninth nationally in scoring offense (39.7) and 14th nationally in total offense (494.3).

Harsin was named head coach, Dec. 11, 2013. A graduate of Capital High School in Boise, he played quarterback for the Broncos from 1995-99. Following his graduation from Boise State with a degree in business management, Harsin coached running backs and receivers at Eastern Oregon in 2000.

The former Bronco letterwinner began his coaching career at Boise State as a graduate assistant in 2001, before taking over the tight ends as a full-time assistant coach from 2002-05. When Chris Petersen was hired as head coach in 2006, Harsin assumed the role of offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach.

Harsin was Petersen's offensive coordinator for five of his eight seasons as head coach (2006-10), and was named a finalist for the 2009 Broyles Award, awarded annually to the nation's top assistant coach. Boise State went 61-5 during his tenure as offensive coordinator.

The Broncos are in the midst of the seventh-longest active streak in the nation of consecutive bowl appearances (13), and Harsin has been a part of 10 of them – including each of the team's three Fiesta Bowl appearances.

With Harsin on staff, Boise State has also won nine conference championships.

Following the 2010 season, Harsin went to Texas, where he served as co-offensive coordinator from 2011-12. While with the Longhorns, Harsin helped guide the ascension of an offense that ranked 88th in scoring prior to his arrival, to No. 24 nationally in 2012 (36.1).

Harsin then earned his first head coaching opportunity at Arkansas State in 2013, which claimed a share of the Sun Belt Conference championship and a berth in the GoDaddy.com Bowl that season.

Harsin and his wife Kes have two daughters, Devyn Lynn and Dayn Mykena, and a son, Davis.

COACHING THE ALMA MATER: Bryan Harsin, a 2000 graduate of Boise State, is one of only 14 coaches in the country that played collegiate football for the school in which he is currently serving as head coach. Others include: Frank Beamer (Virginia Tech), John Bonamego (Central Michigan), Troy Calhoun (Air Force), Paul Chryst (Wisconsin), Pat Fitzgerald (Northwestern), Mike Gundy (Oklahoma State), Jim Harbaugh (Michigan), Paul Haynes (Kent State), Kliff Kingsbury (Texas Tech), Sean Kugler (UTEP), Ruffin McNeil (East Carolina), David Shaw (Stanford) and Matt Wells (Utah State).

YOUNG COACHES: Born on Nov. 1, 1976, Harsin is 38 years old entering the 2015 season – the fifth-youngest head coach in the country. Only PJ Fleck (Western Michigan; 34), Neal Brown (Troy; 35), Matt Campbell (Toledo; 35) and Kliff Kingsbury (Texas Tech; 36) are younger.

Since notching its first such victory, a 34-16 win over Iowa State in the 2002 Humanitarian Bowl, the Broncos have gone 13-9. Boise State is 13-21 all-time in such games.

Albertsons Stadium - and Lyle Smith Field - is the home of Boise State football and the annual Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Smith is the undisputed father of Bronco football, who from 1946-67 built one of the top junior college programs in the country. When he retired from his head coaching position to become the athletic director, Smith had a record of 156-26-6 (.846).

Completed during the summer of 1970 at a cost of \$2.2 million, what was originally known as Bronco Stadium had a seating capacity of 14,500. Since that time the stadium has expanded four times to its current capacity of 36,387.

Boise State established a first in 1986 by installing the first blue AstroTurf in the country. The second blue AstroTurf field was installed in 1995, with the third prior to the 2002 season.

The first Blue FieldTurf surface was installed in 2008. A second Blue FieldTurf field was installed prior to the 2010 season, making a total of five different blue fields at the stadium.

Boise State's was the first collegiate stadium to have the entire field produced in a special color.

McNichols was the star of the first half as Boise State built an early lead and rolled up 254 yards of offense. But Washington's defense fixed its issues at halftime and limited the Broncos' to 83 total yards in the second half. Boise State quarterback Ryan Finley was 16-of-26 passing for 129 yards and another 30 yards rushing.
