### BRONCO GAME NOTES

**THE GAME:** The Boise State football team (6-0, 3-0 MW), now ranked 14th in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls, will play host to BYU (4-3) in a Thursday-night tilt at Albertsons Stadium.

The Broncos and Cougars are scheduled to kick at 8:15 p.m. Oct. 20, and the game will be nationally televised by ESPN.

**THE SERIES:** Despite being just 380 miles apart, Thursday's match-up is just the seventh all-time between Boise State and BYU. The Broncos are 4-2 against the Cougars, the only losses coming on the road in both 2013 (37-20) and 2015 (35-24). Boise State is a perfect 3-0 at Albertsons Stadium, notching wins in 2004, 2012 and 2014.

This season's match-up is the fifth in a 12-year series that began in 2012 and will end in 2023.



The 2016 Boise State football campaign marks the 30th anniversary of the world-famous Blue Turf at Albertsons Stadium.

Boise State installed the first non-green field for the 1986 season, and since that time is a combined 168-36 on The Blue, a winning percentage of .824.

Since 2000, Boise State has gone 99-6 at home (.943), the nation's best home winning percentage during that time.

## BRONCO GAME NOTES

**ONE OF THE LAST UNBEATENS:** Boise State is one of only 11 schools in the country that has yet to lose a game in 2016, a list that also includes Alabama, Baylor, Clemson, Michigan, Nebraska, Ohio State, Texas A&M, Washington, West Virginia and Western Michigan.

**EXORCISING DEMONS:** Boise State lost four games last season, and all four teams are back on the schedule for 2016. The Road to Redemption began Oct. 1 against Utah State, and continued New Mexico, Oct. 7. The Broncos avenged both losses, knocking off the Aggies (21-10), and downing the Lobos (49-21).

Stringing together back-to-back wins is rare for Boise State’s opponents. Since the Broncos joined the Western Athletic Conference in 2001, only two opponents have notched back-to-back victories over Boise State – San Diego State (2012-13) and Air Force (2014-15). Only 10 conference opponents in school history have accomplished the feat against Boise State.

**NON-SATURDAY GAMES:** Thursday’s match-up is the second of five non-Saturday games in 2016, and the first Thursday game since opening the season against Ole Miss in the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Classic at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta, Aug. 28, 2014. The Broncos’ last home Thursday contest was also against BYU, a 7-6 Bronco victory, Sept. 20, 2012.

Boise State is 41-9 all-time in regular-season non-Saturday games, and 6-2 on Thursdays. Including bowl games, Boise State is 50-14 in non-Saturday games, and 7-2 in bowl games. The Broncos have not lost when playing on a Thursday at home (5-0).

**RED ZONE OFFENSE:** The Boise State offense is 19-for-20 in the red zone, ranking 11th nationally (.950). The team’s only “failed attempt” came against Oregon State, when the Broncos’ final drive reached the Beavers’ 13-yard line, and then Boise State took a knee. Of the 19 scores, 16 have been touchdowns – 10 via rush and six via pass.

## BRONCOS IN THE POLLS

**ONE OF THE VOTERS:** Boise State head coach Bryan Harsin is one of 64 voters in the 2016 Amway Coaches Poll.

### 15 YEARS IN THE RANKINGS:

When Boise State cracked the polls entering week five of the 2016 season, it marked the 15th-consecutive season (2002-16; AP) that Boise State had been ranked for at least one week. The streak is tied with USC for the eighth-longest in the country. The nation's 10-longest streaks can be found on page 18.

**MOVIN' ON UP:** The Broncos' ranking of No. 14 in both the Associated Press and Coaches Polls this week is the highest since concluding 2011 ranked eighth and sixth, respectively.

**IT'S COOL, GUYS:** Boise State did not open the 2016 season ranked in either the AP or Coaches Polls. However, historically, that seems to bode well for the Broncos. Over the course of the previous 14 seasons, Boise State did not open the season ranked in the preseason polls on six occasions. Each year - 2002, 2003, 2004, 2006, 2008 and 2014 - the Broncos finished ranked in the top 25. In two of those seasons (2006 and 2014), the Broncos capped their season with wins in the Fiesta Bowl.

**SUCCESS WHEN RANKED:** Boise State has an all-time record of 97-13 (.882) when ranked in the top 25 of the AP and/or Coaches Polls.

## MOUNT RUSHMORE

### WINS OVER BYU

The following is the Mount Rushmore of victories over BYU for Boise State:

#### Boise State 50, BYU 12

**Oct. 30, 2003**

The first meeting between Boise State and BYU got off to a wild start as Cam Hall opened the scoring by recovering a blocked punt in the end zone to give the Broncos a 7-0 lead. Boise State rolled to a 28-2 halftime lead, while BYU pulled the rare feat of recording two safeties in the game, resulting in the not-often-seen score of 28-4. Ryan Dinwiddie passed for 247 yards and a pair of touchdowns, and added a rushing touchdown, while David Mikell ran for 113 yards and a score in the win.

#### Boise State 7, BYU 6

**Sept. 20, 2012**

There weren't many fireworks in this one, but the ones there were were what mattered, as Mike Atkinson's 36-yard pick-six broke a scoreless tie in the third quarter, and the Bronco defense stopped a BYU two-point conversion attempt in the fourth quarter to preserve the 7-6 win. The teams combined for 461 yards of offense and 26 first downs, but could not break through for much of the contest. Atkinson's interception was one of three for the Bronco defense against BYU starter Riley Nelson, with the Cougars' only score coming from the legs of freshman quarterback Taysom Hill.

#### Boise State 55, BYU 30

**Oct. 24, 2014**

Boise State jumped out to a 20-0 lead on BYU and used a 31-point second quarter to roll to a 41-16 halftime lead. Bronco quarterback Grant Hedrick threw for 410 yards and accounted for five touchdowns (four passing, one rushing) while Jay Ajayi ran for 118 yards and two more scores. Thomas Sperbeck caught six passes for 148 yards and a touchdown, and on defense the Broncos held BYU to just 63 rushing yards and intercepted a pass.

#### Boise State 28, BYU 27

**Sept. 24, 2004**

Another quick lead helped key the Broncos to a win over BYU, as Boise State scored the first 16 points but had to comeback for the 28-27 victory. Andy Avalos opened the scoring with a safety, but it was a 44-yard touchdown pass from Jared Zabransky to T.J. Acree with 3:42 remaining that overcame a late five-point deficit. Zabransky threw for 302 yards and two touchdowns, both of those going to Acree, who finished the contest with seven catches for 133 yards.

## GAME NOTES

**NONCONFERENCE HOME GAMES:** Boise State has won 22-straight nonconference home games. The last home loss to a non-league school came in the 2005 MPC Computers Bowl, a 27-21 setback to Boston College, Dec. 28, 2005. Boise State hasn't lost such a game during the regular season since 2001 (Washington State, 41-20), a streak of 31-straight victories.

**THE HARSIN ERA:** The Broncos are in their third year under head coach Bryan Harsin, a former Bronco quarterback and assistant coach. Harsin led the Broncos to a record of 12-2 in his debut season, which included the school's first outright Mountain West Championship since joining the league in 2011 and the school's third victory in the Fiesta Bowl. For his efforts in year one, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear" Bryant National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Foundation. In year two, the Broncos went 9-4 and defeated Northern Illinois 55-7 in the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl. And for the second-straight season, Harsin was named a midseason finalist for the Dodd Trophy, the only one from a non-Resource Five school.

**COACHING CHANGES:** The Broncos have a different offensive coordinator for the fourth time in as many seasons, but this time around, multiple people will handle the responsibilities. Offensive line coach Scott Huff and quarterbacks coach Zak Hill will serve as co-offensive coordinators, and head coach Bryan Harsin will call the plays. The Broncos also have a new defensive coordinator, as linebackers coach Andy Avalos takes over the defense in 2016. Hill is entering his first season with the Broncos, as are defensive backs/cornerbacks coach Ashley Ambrose and safeties coach Gabe Franklin. Hill spent the last seven seasons at Eastern Washington, where he helped lead the Eagles to the 2010 FCS National Championship. Ambrose, a former All-Pro cornerback in the NFL, was at Texas State in 2015. Franklin, a three-time all-league honoree for Boise State, spent the last five seasons at UTEP.

**FEELS LIKE 2011:** Boise State's 6-0 start to 2016 matches the program's best through the first six games since 2011, when the Broncos finished 12-1. From 2006-11, the Broncos opened five of those six seasons (2007 being the exception) 6-0, and here's how Boise State finished each of those seasons:

- 2006 - 13-0 (Fiesta Bowl champions)
- 2008 - 12-1 (lost at Poinsettia Bowl)
- 2009 - 14-0 (Fiesta Bowl champions)
- 2010 - 12-1 (MAACO Bowl Las Vegas champions)
- 2011 - 12-1 (MAACO Bowl Las Vegas champions)

**ALL GOOD THINGS...:** This year's Boise State team set the program's FBS-era (1996-present) record for longest season-opening stretch without trailing, passing the 2009 team's previous mark of 306:35 in Saturday's game against Colorado State. However, Colorado State's game-opening field goal with 7:24 left in the opening quarter ended Boise State's status as the last FBS team to have not trailed in 2016, and ended the season-opening run at 307:36.

It was just the second time in school history that the Broncos had not trailed at any point through the season's first five games, and like the 2009 team, it was the sixth game of the season in which the run was snapped. The 2009 team's run was broken when Tulsa scored 6:35 into the sixth game of the season to go up 7-0.

As noted above, Boise State had been the last FBS team in 2016 to trail in a contest. The Broncos had been tied twice during that span (7-7 against both Oregon State and Utah State).

**HISTORY AGAINST BYU:** Boise State is 4-2 all-time against BYU since the teams' first meeting in 2003, and half of those games have been decided

late. Boise State has registered a pair of runaway wins in the series (50-12 in 2003, 55-30 in 2014) while BYU cruised to a 37-20 win in 2013, but the three other meetings have featured some late drama. In 2004, BYU came back from a 16-0 deficit to take a 27-22 fourth-quarter lead before Boise State's Jared Zabransky threw a 44-yard touchdown to T.J. Acree with 3:42 remaining to give the Broncos a 28-27 win. Eight years later, Mike Atkinson scored the only Bronco points on a 36-yard pick-six and the Boise State defense snuffed out a two-point conversion attempt after BYU's only touchdowns to capture a 7-6 win. Last year, it was BYU's turn to break hearts as Tanner Mangum heaved a 35-yard Hail Mary to Mitch Jeurgens with 45 seconds left to take the lead, and Kai Nacua sealed the win with a pick-six with 30 seconds left in the Cougars' 35-24 win.

This Thursday night is also the third time Boise State will be undefeated heading into its meeting with BYU. The Broncos were 3-0 in 2004 and 1-0 in 2015, and split those contests.

**CONFERENCE RECORD:** Since 2000, Boise State is a national-best 114-13 (.897) in conference play. Since joining the FBS in 1996, the Broncos have played in three leagues: the Big West (1996-2000), WAC (2001-10) and Mountain West (2011-Present). Over the campaigns in those three conferences, the Broncos have posted an all-time record of 124-23 (.844). Boise State went 5-3 in Mountain West play in 2015, just the second time since 1998 - when Boise State went 2-3 in the Big West - that the Broncos lost three conference contests in a season. It was also just the fourth time since 2001 - Boise State's first year in the WAC - that the Broncos lost multiple conference games (also went 6-2 in WAC play in 2001).

**CONFERENCE CHAMPIONSHIPS:** Boise State will be looking for its 19th conference title in 2016. The Broncos have played in four leagues all time, and have won multiple conference championships in each: six in the Big Sky (1970-95), two in the Big West (1996-2000), eight in the WAC (2001-10) and two in the MW (2011-Present).

**MW SUCCESS:** Since joining the Mountain West for the 2011 season, Boise State has lost just eight conference games, with only two of those eight losses being by more than seven points. Prior to a 28-14 loss to Air Force (Sept. 27) in 2014, the Broncos' four league losses were by a combined seven points: TCU in 2011 (36-35); San Diego State in 2012 (21-19); Fresno State (41-40) and SDSU (34-31, OT) in 2013. That 14-point loss at Air Force, along with a 52-26 loss at Utah State last season, are Boise State's only two Mountain West losses of more than seven points. No team in the Mountain West boasts a winning record over Boise State.

**AGAINST THE POWER FIVE:** Boise State went 2-0 in its matchups with the Power Five in 2016, defeating Washington State (31-28) and Oregon State (38-24) in consecutive games. The wins improve the Broncos to 14-5 against schools from the Power Five since the start of the 2006 season, and up the team's winning streak against such opposition to five. Boise State has also won 15 games against Power Five schools since 2003, third-best among all Group of Five teams over that span (Navy - 22, BYU - 21). It should be noted that all five of Boise State's losses to Power Five schools since 2006 have come on the road or at a neutral site. Since notching its first victory over a Power Five school, a 34-16 win over Iowa State in the 2002 Humanitarian Bowl, Boise State is 16-9 all-time in games against Power Five teams, and 16-21 overall.

**PAC-12 SUCCESS:** Boise State's 38-24 win at Oregon State Saturday, combined with Sept. 10's 31-28 win over Washington State, improved the Broncos to 2-0 against the Pac-12 this season, the most against the conference by any school through the season's opening four weeks. While Boise State is 11-13 overall against the Pac-12, the Broncos are 11-5 against the Power Five conference since 2004 and are currently on a four-game winning streak dating back to the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl victory over Arizona.

## GAME NOTES

**AMONG THE GREATEST:** Boise State is the third-best all-time winning percentage amongst the Football Bowl Subdivision. The Broncos' all-time record at the four-year level entering this Saturday is 424-159-2 (.727). Michigan is first on the all-time list (931-331-36; .7311) with Notre Dame is second (894-317-42; .7302). For the complete top 15, see page four.

**ESTABLISHING A LEGACY:** The Broncos are the winningest football program in the country since 2000, with an overall record of 182-32 (.851). Ohio State (175-37; .826), Oklahoma (175-43; .803), TCU (157-49; .762) and LSU (163-50; .765) round out the top five. For the complete top 15, see page four.

**OUT OF THE NORM:** The Broncos went 9-4 in 2015, missing double-digit victories for just the second time in the last decade. Boise State has won 10-or-more games in 13 of the last 17 seasons, including 12-or-more in six of the last 10.

**SENIOR SUCCESS:** Each of the last 14 Boise State senior classes have won at least 40 games during their careers, or an average of 10 victories per season. The 2016 class will need to win 11 games to make it 15-straight senior classes, having won eight games in 2013, 12 in 2014 and nine last season.

**BOWLING AGAIN:** Boise State made its 14th-straight bowl appearance and the 16th over the last 17 years in 2015, and with Oct. 15's victory over Colorado State is eligible for a 15th-straight bowl appearance. The current bowl-appearance streak is tied with Wisconsin for the sixth-longest in the country, trailing only Florida State (34), Virginia Tech (23), Georgia (19), Oklahoma (17) and LSU (16). Since the Broncos joined FBS in 1996, they have failed to make the postseason just four times (1996-98, 2001). In 2001, the last season in which the Broncos did not go bowling, Boise State was bowl-eligible with an 8-4 record but was not selected for a game.

**RETURNING ALL-MW:** Of the 13 Broncos named All-MW in 2015, seven return for the 2016 season. Quarterback Brett Rypien was named Mountain West Freshman of the Year in addition to being one of six Broncos named to the first team. He was joined on the first team by wide receiver Thomas Sperbeck and kicker Tyler Rausa. Tight end Jake Roh and running back Jeremy McNichols were each named second team, while linebacker Tanner Vallejo and offensive lineman Mario Yakoo were named honorable mention.

**ACADEMIC SUCCESS:** The Broncos were one of only five schools in the country to receive the NCAA's Public Recognition Award in football for ranking in the top-10 percent nationally in APR from 2010 through 2014. Joining the Broncos were Clemson, Duke, Northwestern and Rutgers. At the conclusion of the 2015-16 academic year, the Boise State football team posted a combined cumulative grade-point average of 3.12, the highest on record. Additionally, the Broncos boasted a league-high 30 members on the Fall Academic All-Mountain West Team. Boise State has led the MW in all-academic selections in each of its five seasons in the league.

### DEFENSE

**CONTROLLING THE SECOND LEVEL:** Boise State's starting linebacker trio of Tanner Vallejo, Ben Weaver and Darren Lee has played a pivotal role all season, contributing to Boise State's defensive rankings of 47th in rushing defense (142.3 ypg), 23rd in scoring defense (19.3 ppg) and 48th in total defense (371.0 ypg).

The three linebackers are also Boise State's top-three tacklers, as Weaver leads the Broncos with 46 tackles this season, with Vallejo and Lee tied for second at 36 apiece. The trio has also contribute 9.5 tackles-for-loss and 3.0 sacks.

Also making an impact is this group is newcomer Blake Whitlock, a junior-college transfer from Saddleback College. Whitlock made his first start Oct. 1 against Utah State, making four tackles (two solo) including one for loss.

**MEN ON MISSIONS:** With BYU coming to town, there is an LDS connection to the Broncos as the Boise State defense features four players who

**BREAKOUT SEASON FOR LEE:** Redshirt senior linebacker Darren Lee has always been one of the Broncos' most intense performers on the field, making his bones as the team's special-teams ace. This year, however, Lee has stepped into a starter's role at linebacker and has excelled, currently ranking tied for second on the team with 36 tackles (26 solo) while leading the Bronco linebackers' corps in sacks (2.5) and tackles-for-loss (6.0). Lee is also responsible for one of Boise State's two defensive touchdowns in 2016, stripping an Oregon State receiver of the ball and taking it 19 yards for the final points of the Broncos' 38-24 win in Corvallis on Sept. 24.

Prior to this year, Lee had made 49 tackles in his role on special teams and as a backup linebacker from 2013-15.

**SAFETIES IN THE ACTION:** Starting safeties Cameron Hartsfield and Chancellor James have been two of Boise State's most consistent tacklers and vital to the secondary's success in 2016. Hartsfield ranks fourth on the team with 35 tackles (23 solo), including 2.0 for loss, while James, despite missing Sept. 3's opener at Louisiana, is fifth on the team with 29 tackles (22 solo) and 2.0 tackles-for-loss. Saturday night against Colorado State, James shared the team lead with seven tackles (six solo) while Hartsfield recorded four solo tackles of his own.

**CHASING DOWN THOSE QBs:** Boise State got to Colorado State quarterback Nick Stevens once in Saturday night's win, with sophomore Durrant Miles recording the sack. Boise State's defense now ranks 10th in the country and leads the Mountain West in sacks per game (3.50), with the team total of 21.0 ranking tied for 12th in the FBS.

This effort is paced by the defensive line trio of nose tackle David Moa (5.5 sacks), McCaskill (5.0 sacks), and STUD end Jabril Frazier (4.0 sacks). Moa ranks third, McCaskill fourth and Frazier tied for fifth in the Mountain West in sacks. The Bronco defense has also made 48.0 tackles for loss, led by 9.5 from McCaskill and 6.0 from Moa.

**BUT THEY SAID THIS WASN'T LAST YEAR'S D-LINE:** Boise State's 2015 defensive line finished that season ranked fifth in the nation in rushing defense, allowing just 108.2 yards per game. After losing every starter from that unit to graduation or the NFL Draft, many had reservations about how well this year's unit would perform. The crew of Sam McCaskill, David Moa, Elliot Hoyte, Jabril Frazier and Gabe Perez have answered the call, helping the Boise State defense rank 10th in the nation with 3.50 sacks per game.

Leading the way has been McCaskill, a redshirt senior who started for the Broncos in 2014, and this year leads the unit with 26 tackles (18 solo) and 9.5 tackles-for-loss, along with 5.0 sacks. Redshirt sophomore David Moa leads the team with 5.5 sacks on the season, while Hoyte (eight tackles, 1.5 tackles-for-loss) and Frazier (21 tackles, 4.0 sacks) have also brought the heat up front.

**TWO GAMES, TWO DEFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS:** The Boise State defense came up with big, momentum-swinging touchdowns in consecutive games earlier this season. Sept. 10 against Washington State, it was cornerback Tyler Horton with the 85-yard pick-six on the opening drive of the game to put the Broncos up, 7-0, and on Sept. 24 at Oregon State it was middle linebacker Darren Lee stripping Beaver receiver Seth Collins and taking it 19 yards to the end zone in the fourth quarter. Lee's play helped ice the win for the Broncos, as the Beavers had cut the Boise State lead to 14 (31-17) and was looking to drive for a score to make it a one-possession game.

## GAME NOTES

**MONEY DOWN:** Through six games Boise State's defense has answered the call when it comes to third-down plays, as opponents have been successful on only 37-of-106 third-down conversions (34.9 percent). That figure ranks 38th in the country and third in the Mountain West.

Saturday night, Colorado State went just 3-for-14 on its third-down plays as the Bronco defense did its job in getting off the field.

**VALLEJO MAKING PLAYS:** Linebacker Tanner Vallejo is enjoying a productive senior season, racking up 36 tackles, tied for second on the team despite missing Oct. 1's contest against Utah State. Vallejo made 14 tackles in Sept. 10's win over Washington State, and followed up with four (two solo) and a shared tackle-for-loss in abbreviated action at Oregon State. Saturday night against Colorado State he made five solo tackles. For the season, Vallejo has also made 3.5 tackles-for-loss and shared a sack.

**SECONDARY STANDING OUT:** Boise State's secondary has performed well through the first six games of the season, led by first-time starter Cameron Hartsfield, who ranks fourth on the team with 35 tackles (23 solo). Fellow first-time starter Evan Tyler made four tackles (three solo) before suffering a season-ending knee injury Sept. 24 at Oregon State, while Chancellor James has contributed 29 tackles (22 solo) including 2.0 tackles-for-loss.

Cornerback Tyler Horton has contributed the play of the year so far for the secondary, recording an 85-yard pick-six Sept. 10 against Washington State, and earning Mountain West Defensive Player of the Week recognition for it. Raymond Ford made the unit's second interception of the season Oct. 7 at New Mexico.

**NOT AS MANY NEW FACES AS YOU'D THINK:** Boise State returns four starters from its 2015 defensive unit which ranked 12th in the FBS in total defense (318.3 yards per game) and fifth in rushing defense (108.2 yards per game). However, there is a stable of individuals returning with starting experience, including redshirt senior defensive lineman Sam McCaskill, redshirt senior defensive tackle Elliot Hoyte, redshirt junior linebacker Joey Martarano, cornerbacks Raymond Ford (redshirt senior) and Tyler Horton (sophomore), and safeties Dylan Sumner-Gardner (redshirt sophomore) and Kameron Miles (redshirt junior).

### OFFENSE

**McNICHOLS MAKING HIS CASE:** Junior running back Jeremy McNichols made yet another emphatic statement in his case for Mountain West Player of the Year honors and inclusion in the Doak Walker Award (nation's best RB) conversation Saturday night against Colorado State, setting career bests in carries (40), rushing yards (217) and all-purpose yards (264) in the 28-23 win. McNichols' 40 carries set a Boise State single-game record, eclipsing Cedric Minter's 38-year-old record of 38, and his 217 yards on the ground made for his second 200-yard performance of not only his career but also this season, having previously gone for 208 yards at Oregon State (Sept. 24).

McNichols also found the end zone twice Saturday night, bringing his season touchdown total to 14 (11 rush, three receiving), second in the country just one back of Louisville's Lamar Jordan, and his 11 rushing touchdowns rank tied for second nationally. Combined with last year's scoring output, McNichols total of 40 touchdowns since the start of the 2015 season is the most of any FBS player, and nine more than the second-highest performer (31 by San Diego State's Donnel Pumphrey).

**WAIT, HOW MANY QUARTERBACKS DO YOU GUYS HAVE?:** Despite the Bronco roster listing five players at quarterback, Boise State in fact retains the services of a couple of converted signal-callers in wide receivers Cedrick Wilson and Thomas Sperbeck. Sperbeck's throwing prowess was on display again Saturday night against Colorado State, as he took a direct snap out of the Wildcat and found A.J. Richardson for an 11-yard touchdown for Boise State's final points of the night.

## GAME NOTES

Sperbeck and Wilson are now each 2-for-2 passing on the season, with Sperbeck throwing for 59 yards and a pair of touchdowns, while Wilson has thrown for 84 yards and a score.

Former prep quarterbacks, the pair showed off their talents at their former positions Sept. 24 at Oregon State as Wilson completed a 23-yard pass to tight end Alec Dhaenens, and Sperbeck took a snap from the Wildcat and ran for nine yards. Wilson added to his numbers Oct. 1 against Utah State, completing a 61-yard touchdown pass to Jeremy McNichols.

**SPERBECK KEEPS MOVING UP IN THE RECORD BOOK:** Senior wide receiver Thomas Sperbeck, the only current Bronco voted by the fans to the 30-Year All-Blue Team, made five catches for 72 yards and a touchdown in Saturday's 28-23 win over Colorado State. The performance continued Sperbeck's ascent up multiple categories of the Boise State record book, as he now stands second all-time with 3,030 receiving yards (just 33 back of all-time leader Titus Young), and sixth all-time with 182 receptions (62 behind all-time leader Matt Miller). His 198 receiving yards Oct. 7 at New Mexico also marked the 12th 100-yard receiving game of his career, second all-time at Boise State and just one behind all-time leader Ryan Ikebe (1993-96).

With six games under his belt, Sperbeck leads the Mountain West with 701 receiving yards, is tied for first with six touchdown catches and second with 38 receptions, a season after leading the conference in receiving yardage with a Boise State single-season record 1,412 as well as with 88 receptions, which tied Miller's Boise State single-season record.

**#RYPITGOOD:** Boise State quarterback Brett Rypien remains the standard-bearer among Mountain West quarterbacks after throwing for 207 yards and a touchdown in Saturday's win over Colorado State. After seven weeks, Rypien leads the conference in passing yards (1,622), passing touchdowns (12) and total offense (1,629 yards, 271.5 ypg).

He had his best game of the season Oct. 7 at New Mexico, completing 21-of-28 passes for 391 yards and a career-best five touchdowns in the 49-21 win. Rypien put up these numbers in just over a half of action, as he threw for 368 yards and five scores by halftime, and on his only drive of the second half took the Broncos downfield for a touchdown to make it 49-7.

For Rypien it marked his seventh-career 300-yard passing game, tied for fourth all-time at Boise State, and the second time this season in which he had 300 passing yards by halftime (304 yards at Louisiana on Sept. 3).

**HOW ABOUT THAT WILSON KID:** Junior wide receiver Cedrick Wilson, already enjoying a fine debut season for Boise State, put up a career day Oct. 7 at New Mexico, posting career bests in catches (nine), receiving yards (167) and touchdown catches (three) in just over a half of action. Wilson caught all three of his touchdowns in the first half, putting him in a tie for the team lead with five on the year. So far this season, Wilson, despite limited action Saturday night against Colorado State, has caught 23 passes for 432 yards and five scores, with the touchdown mark tied for third in the Mountain West. Wilson also ranks sixth in the conference in receiving yards per game (72.0) and third in yards per reception (18.8).

**McNICHOLS KEEPS ONE STREAK GOING, STARTS ANOTHER ONE?:** Doak Walker Award candidate Jeremy McNichols rushed for two touchdowns in Saturday's win over Colorado State, bringing his streak of consecutive games with a touchdown scored up to 18.

Oct. 1 against Utah State, he has his Mountain West-record run of 15-straight games with a rushing touchdown snapped, but with two at New Mexico (Oct. 7) and two more against Colorado State, got back on track to begin a new run.

On the year, McNichols is second in the FBS with 14 touchdowns (11 rushing, three receiving), fourth in FBS with 181.7 all-purpose yards per game, and ranks third in the Mountain West with 775 rushing yards.

## GAME NOTES

**DOESN'T MATTER WHO THROWS IT, McNICHOLS WILL CATCH IT:** While Jeremy McNichols has made his bones at Boise State as a running back, he remains a dangerous option as a receiver. Oct. 1 against Utah State he led the Broncos with six catches for 73 yards and a touchdown, with the scoring catch going for a career-long 61 yards. Of note on that catch was that it came from wide receiver Cedrick Wilson, marking the third different passer from whom McNichols has caught a touchdown pass this season (Thomas Sperbeck at Louisiana, along with Rypien this season).

So far in 2016, McNichols is third on the team with 20 catches for 263 yards and three touchdowns.

**UP THERE WITH THE OFFENSE:** Boise State put up 444 yards of offense against Colorado State Saturday, and now ranks 34th in the nation with 466.7 yards per game. This figure is helped by a passing attack that ranks 23rd in the nation with 300.3 yards per game, and a rushing attack that cranks out 166.3 yards per contest, ranking 76th in the country.

Scoring-wise, the Broncos rank 36th in the country and first in the Mountain West with 35.3 points per game.

**RYPIEN-TO-SPERBECK:** When Brett Rypien took the reins as Boise State's starting quarterback in 2015, he formed a productive partnership with wide receiver Thomas Sperbeck. Since Rypien's first series behind center, coming on Boise State's second possession of the third quarter against Idaho State (Sept. 18, 2015), he and Sperbeck teamed up 82 times for 1,382 yards and nine touchdowns in 2015.

That connection picked right up in 2016, as Rypien has found Sperbeck 38 times for 701 yards and six touchdowns over the first six games.

**SHUTOUT STREAK:** Boise State has not been shutout in 244 consecutive games, the ninth-longest active streak in the country and the 16th-longest streak in NCAA history. The last shutout came on the road against No. 15 Washington State, Sept. 27, 1997 (58-0). The loss to the Cougars is one of only two shutouts the Broncos have suffered since becoming a four-year institution in 1968.

**O-LINE EXPERIENCE:** Although the Broncos lost two linemen to the National Football League, the team still counts four returning starters along the line. Archie Lewis started eight games, including the final five at left tackle; Travis Averill started 11 games at left guard; Steven Baggett started all 13 games at right guard; and Mario Yakoo started 12 games, 10 of which coming at right tackle. Last season Marcus Henry started all 13 games at center, and was picked up by the New Orleans Saints as a free agent, and Rees Odhiambo, a third-round selection by the Seattle Seahawks, started eight games at left tackle. According to Phil Steele, the Broncos' 95 returning starts along the offensive line ranks 14th nationally entering 2016.

 >> Leads the Mountain West in receiving yards (701), tied for first in touchdown catches (five) and second receptions (38) in 2016.  
 >> Former prep quarterback is 2-for-2 for 59 yards and two touchdowns this season. Threw a 48-yard touchdown to Jeremy McNichols at Louisiana (Sept. 3) then an 11-yard scoring toss to A.J. Richardson against Colorado State (Oct. 15). His career passing totals are 7-for-12 with four touchdowns and an interception.  
 >> Named All-Mountain West First Team after leading the conference in both receptions (88) and receiving yards (1,412), while tying for the lead in receiving touchdowns (eight)...ranked sixth nationally in receiving yards and 17th in the country in receptions...reception total tied the school record, while the yardage total set the Boise State standard.  
 >> Set a pair of Boise State single-game records last season, hauling in 20 passes for 281 yards against New Mexico on Nov. 14, 2015...totals were also the top single-game marks by an FBS receiver in 2015.  
 >> Named Offensive MVP of the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl, catching 12 passes for 199 yards.

### TANNER VALLEJO // SLB

>> Through seven weeks, is tied for second on the team with 36 tackles despite missing Oct. 1's game against Utah State.  
 >> Made 14 tackles in victory over Washington State (Sept. 10), matching his career high from the VIZIO Fiesta Bowl against No. 10 Arizona.  
 >> Twice earned All-Mountain West honors, being named honorable mention in 2015 after earning a spot on the second team in 2014.  
 >> Ranked third on the team with 57 tackles (32 solo) in 2015, and tied for second with a pair of forced fumbles and tied for fourth with 8.0 tackles-for-loss over 12 games (10 starts).  
 >> Blocked a punt and a field goal, earning himself Mountain West Special Teams Player of the Week, against Idaho State.  
 >> Named Defensive MVP of both the 2014 Sports Authority Mountain West Football Championship and the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

### SEAN WALE // P

Bryan Harsin, a former Boise State quarterback, assistant coach and offensive coordinator, is in his third season as the head coach at his alma mater.

In his debut season Harsin led his alma mater back to where it rose to national prominence. Boise State went 12-2 in Harsin's inaugural season, winning its first outright Mountain West Championship, and capping the campaign with a 38-30 victory over Arizona in the 2014 VIZIO Fiesta Bowl.

The victory in the Fiesta Bowl was the third such win for the Broncos in the previous nine seasons. Harsin, serving as offensive coordinator in the first two Fiesta Bowl victories, has been a part of each of the school's three appearances in the game.

The team's victory in the 2014 Sports Authority Mountain West Football Championship marked the team's first outright league title since joining the league in 2011, and the first overall since 2009. The only alumnus to lead the Broncos as head coach in the history of Boise State, Harsin has now won a conference championship as a student-athlete, assistant coach and head coach.

In 2015, the Broncos went 9-4, climbing as high as No. 20 in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches Polls. The Broncos concluded the 2014 season ranked No. 16 each poll.

Boise State capped the 2015 campaign with a 55-7 victory over Northern Illinois in the San Diego County Credit Union Poinsettia Bowl, the fifth-largest margin of victory the history of bowl games.

For his efforts in 2014, Harsin was named a finalist for the Paul "Bear Bryant" National Coach of the Year Award, the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award and the Dodd Trophy, given annually by the Bobby Dodd National Coach of the Year Foundation. He was also named the nation's top first-year head coach by the Football Writers Association of America.

In addition to rejoining the national rankings - Boise State ranked 20th nationally in the final College Football Playoff Top 25 - the Broncos' offense also returned the nation's elite. Boise State concluded the 2014 season ranked ninth nationally in scoring offense (39.7) and 14th nationally in total offense (494.3). The team concluded the 2015 season ranked 15th nationally in both scoring offense (39.1) and total offense (501.5). The Broncos also concluded the 2015 season ranked 16th nationally in passing offense (310.2). For his efforts, Rypien was named first-team All-Mountain West, in addition to garnering MW Freshman of the Year honors.

Harsin was named head coach, Dec. 11, 2013. A graduate of Capital High School in Boise, he played quarterback for the Broncos from 1995-99.

Harsin and his wife Kes have two daughters, Devyn Lynn and Dayn Mykena, and a son, Davis.

## ONCE A BRONCO...

The Boise State coaching staff boasts a combined 96 years of previous experience with the Broncos, including 46 years in the program as student-athletes and 50 years as assistant coaches. ## GAMES AGAINST THE POWER FIVE

The Broncos are 14-5 against schools from conferences that comprise the Resource Five since the start of the 2006 season, including a current streak of five-straight wins: Arizona in the VIZIO Fiesta Bowl (Dec. 31, 2014; 38-30), Washington (16-13; Sept. 4, 2015), Virginia (56-14; Sept. 25, 2015), Washington State (31-28; Sept. 10, 2016) and Oregon State (38-24; Sept. 24, 2016). Also included was a streak of six-consecutive victories, which was snapped in the 2012 season opener against Michigan State.

Since notching its first such victory, a 34-16 win over Iowa State in the 2002 Humanitarian Bowl, the Broncos have gone 16-9. Boise State is 16-21 all-time in such games.

## ALBERTSONS STADIUM / THE BLUE



Albertsons Stadium - and Lyle Smith Field - is the home of Boise State football and the annual Famous Idaho Potato Bowl.

Smith is the undisputed father of Bronco football, who from 1946-67 built one of the top junior college programs in the country. When he retired from his head coaching position to become the athletic director, Smith had a record of 156-25-6 (.850).

Completed during the summer of 1970 at a cost of \$2.2 million, what was originally known as Bronco Stadium had a seating capacity of 14,500. Since that time the stadium has expanded four times to its current capacity of 36,387.

Boise State established a first in 1986 by installing the first blue AstroTurf in the country. The second blue AstroTurf field was installed in 1995, with the third going in prior to the 2002 season. The first Blue FieldTurf surface was installed in 2008. A second Blue FieldTurf field was installed prior to the 2010 season, making a total of five different blue fields at the stadium.

Boise State's was the first collegiate stadium to have the entire field produced in a special color.



Since 1986, Boise State is a combined 168-36 on The Blue, a winning percentage of .824. And since 2000, Boise State has gone 99-6 at home (.943), the highest winning percentage in the country during that time.

Overall, since the construction of Albertsons Stadium in 1970, Boise State is 251-53 (.826), the highest winning percentage of any stadium in the country built before 1980.
