HITS ON HOUSTON

- « Houston hits the road for the first time this season when it faces BYU in an ESPN nationally-televised showdown Thursday at 8 p.m. CT at LaVell Edwards Stadium in Provo, Utah. Houston (1-1) comes off its first win of the season, 47-0 over Grambling, while the meeting marks BYU's home opener after road wins over UConn (35-10) and Texas (41-7).
- « Houston opened its new on-campus facility, TDECU Stadium, on Aug. 29. The 40,755 at Houston's opener set a record for games played on the UH campus and was the largest Houston home crowd since 1991.
- « UH is 20-45-3 all-time in road openers and 1-1 under Tony Levine with a win at Temple in 2013 and a loss at UCLA in 2012.
- « Houston's depth chart sports 14 underclassmen vs. 30 upperclassmen, including 13 seniors. It's a change from 2013 when 23 underclassmen dotted the Houston depth chart in the season opener. The change in numbers are evidence of the talented depth built by Tony Levine's first three recruiting classes, billed by some as the best in UH history.
- « QB John O'Korn led all true freshmen nationally last season with 28 passing touchdowns.
- « The Third Ward Defense leads The American in scoring defense (13.5/game) and was the third most-improved defense in 2013 in scoring defense, moving from 107th nationally in 2012 to 20th in 2013.
- « The Cougars led the nation in 2013 with a +25 turnover margin and 43 turnovers gained.
- « Houston has forced multiple turnovers in 21 of its last 23 games and has a turnover in 25 straight games.
- « Trevon Stewart led the nation in 2013 with 10 turnovers - six fumble recoveries and four interceptions. His six fumble recoveries led the nation and set a Houston single-season record.

THE M.O. ON THE TACKLING MACHINES

- « Derrick Mathews (L) leads all players nationally with 371 career tackles while Efreem Oliphant (R) led Houston with 134 tackles in 2013.
- « Oliphant has 11 career games with double-digit tackles including both games this year. Mathews has 14 career games with 10 stops or more. (See more on page 11).

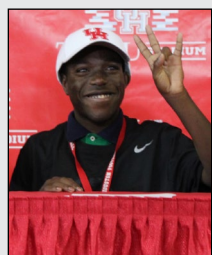

Jacolby was diagnosed with Renal Disease in 1999 at the age of one. He underwent a kidney transplant six months

later. Unfortunately, by the age of three his body had rejected the transplant, and he has been on dialysis since. Although his dialysis treatments are three times a week, every week, year round, he never complains and is a true fighter. His condition is chronic, and he is on a transplant list, waiting for a donor.

In signing his letter of intent to join UH, Jacolby agreed that his favorite football team is the Houston Cougars and that he will wear red on every Cougar Red Friday and every Houston gameday.

WEEKLY MEDIA LUNCHEON

Each Tuesday during the season Houston hosts a media luncheon at the Carl Lewis Auditorium at the Athletics/Alumni Center. The luncheon begins at 11:30 a.m., as Houston head coach Tony Levine steps to the podium. A limited number of players are on hand for interviews.

CREDENTIALS

Requests for credentials are accepted online. To receive the link to the web site, e-mail David Bassity at dbassity@central.uh.edu or Jeff Conrad at jaconrad@central.uh.edu. Requests must be submitted by a sports director/editor at least eight days prior to the contest. Media must show government issued photo identification upon entering the stadium. If the name on the credential and the photo ID do not match, the credential is void.

PRACTICE

The first 30 minutes of Sunday and Tuesday practices are open to the media while all other practice sessions are closed to media and public unless otherwise posted. On days when post-practice interviews are conducted, media should gather around the corner from the outdoor turf at the Houston Football practice facility 10-15 minutes before the workout is complete. Late requests for interviews will be accepted at that time and members of the athletics communications staff will escort players to the media present at the practice facility at the appropriate time.

INTERVIEWS

- Head Coach Tony Levine will do general interviews following practice on Sunday and Wednesday along with his weekly press conference on Tuesdays at 11:30 a.m. in the Carl Lewis Auditorium.
- Assistant Coaches: Assistant coaches are available after Sunday, Tuesday and Wednesday practices.
- Players: All interviews with players will take place at the media luncheon or after practices on Sunday and/or Tuesday. Media should request players at least 24 hours in advance.
- Post-Game: The Houston locker room is closed at all times. Head coach Tony Levine and selected student-athletes will be brought to designated postgame interview areas.

THE TONY LEVINE SHOW

The weekly one-hour call-in radio show will take place each Tuesday from 8-9 p.m. CT and airs live on KPRC 950 AM. Join Houston head coach Tony Levine and host Jeremy Branham each Tuesday at Ragin Cajun restaurant at 4302 Richmond Ave. for the show.

Houston Cougar Football Central, a weekly show centering on Tony Levine's Tuesday press conferences, airs every Wednesday at 4:30 p.m. on Comcast Sports Network Houston as does the Tony Levine Show every Wednesday at 11:30 p.m. Levine is joined by host Kevin Eschenfelder as they break down Houston's previous game and preview upcoming games.

POINTS OF PRIDE

- Each year, UH educates more than approximately **40,000 students** in more than **300** undergraduate and graduate academic programs, on campus and online. UH awards more than **8,000 degrees** annually, with more than **224,000 alumni**.
- Royalties from UH licenses have grown to the level where UH now ranks No. 14 among all public universities in the nation and **No. 1 in the nation** among all public universities without a medical school.

- 40 percent of UH's sponsored research—from basic and allied sciences to the social sciences and the humanities—is in the area of health. The university is a member of the Texas Medical Center, the world's largest medical center and home to some of the best hospitals and medical research facilities in the world.

TDECU STADIUM - HOUSTON'S NEW HOME

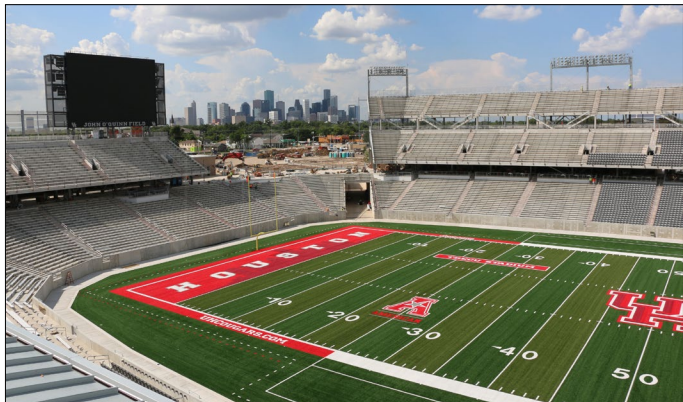


- The University of Houston and TDECU, the largest credit union in the Houston area, announced a naming rights gift on July 8, 2014, that rebranded the Houston Football Stadium as TDECU Stadium.
- A 10-year, \$15-million commitment from TDECU secures the naming rights with the University of Houston through June 16, 2024.
- The University of Houston broke ground on the state-of-the-art stadium that will sit on the location of Houston's former home, Robertson Stadium, on Feb. 8, 2013.
- The 70-year old Robertson Stadium was torn down in December 2012 just two weeks after Houston's final home game of the year.
- Designed by Page and DLR Group to showcase the Houston skyline in the northwest corner of the stadium to remind all visitors and television audiences that UH is the University of Houston, the stadium was constructed by Manhattan Construction, a well-known firm in Houston having constructed both Reliant Stadium, home of the NFL's Houston Texans, and BBVA Compass Stadium, home of MLS' Houston Dynamo.
- With seating available for at least 40,000, TDECU Stadium provides Houston fans an exciting gameday experience including 5,000 premium seating options and a stylish 12,400-square foot club space overlooking the field of play on the stadium's south side.
- Views exclusive to the club area give those fans an opportunity to watch team members travel from the locker room to the field.
- Twenty-six premium suites, each containing 12 outside padded arm chairs, four inside bar stools and an entertainment area, span from end zone to end zone on the south side with 42 loge boxes each containing four seats located throughout the stadium.
- Four open-air party decks and two open-air party suites at different locations throughout the stadium offer Houston Football fans spectacular views of the game while providing a comfortable and unique experience to entertain family and friends on game day.
- Houston's state-of-the-art 5,000-square foot home locker room is located at the southeast corner of the stadium next to the Bert F. Winston Band and Performance Center, a 39,089-square foot building on the east end of TDECU Stadium housing the Spirit of Houston Band Recital Halls and classroom spaces, gallery multi-purpose area and UH Athletics Ticket Office.
- Located 25 feet below the main stadium concourse, the field of TDECU Stadium is a state-of-the-art synthetic turf designed to host a multitude of events, including but not limited to, high school football games, band practice, specific UH intramural events, etc..
- A 360-degree concourse with an uninterrupted view of the field on 67 percent of the concourse include both audio and video broadcast systems throughout the concourse.
- An east-to-west orientation gives fans and television audiences a spectacular view of the downtown Houston skyline while also keeping in line with the University's grid system and creating a more efficient parking. Sun and shade studies were also conducted to improve the best level of comfort for Houston fans and not affect student-athletes.
- A state-of-the-art HD, LED, wide screen video board located on the west end of TDECU Stadium, just to the left of the stadium's pressbox, housed one level about suite level with seats for 70 working media along with a press dining area.

THE OPPONENT

- « In its 10th season under head coach Bronco Mendenhall, BYU enters Thursday night's matchup, its first home game of the season, at 2-0 after defeating UConn (35-10) and Texas (41-7) to open the season.
- « BYU is led offensively by junior quarterback Taysom Hill, who leads the nation with five rushing touchdowns while ranking eighth in the NCAA with a 73.0 completion percentage, leading to 489 yards and three TDs. Hill posted 99 yards and three touchdowns on the ground vs. Texas while Jamaal Williams added 89 yards on the ground vs. the Longhorns as well.
- « Defensively, senior linebacker Zac Stout leads BYU with 16 tackles and one sack. BYU has seven sacks through two games with six turnovers forced - four fumble recoveries and two interceptions. Junior linebacker Bronso Kaufusi leads BYU with three tackles for loss and two sacks while senior defensive back Robertson Daniel has two fumble recoveries.
- « BYU claimed a 47-46 win in 2013 in the first meeting between the two schools. Houston entered the game 5-0 as the two teams combined for 1,164 yards with only one drive lasting longer than three minutes. Hill hit Cameron Ridley for an 11-yard touchdown pass with 1:08 remaining in the game to capture the comeback win in Houston.

TIES WITH BYU

- « Houston's Director of Sports Performance, Brian Odom and BYU offensive coordinator Robert Anae were both members of the Arizona staff in 2011.
- « The BYU roster features 10 players from the state of Texas while the Houston roster sports no players from the state of Utah.

DEGREES IN HAND

- « Seven Houston seniors entered the season having already earned an undergraduate degree. Eric Braswell, Jeremiah Farley, Rowdy Harper, Bryce Redman, Shane Ros, Daniel Spencer and Jon Witten all completed degree requirements prior to this season.
- « Five additional Cougars will complete their degree requirements this December: Wayne Beadle, Randall Hollimon, Joey Mbu, Emeka Okafor and Efreem Oliphant.

ABOUT THE 2014 COUGARS

- « Twenty-eight full or part-time starters return in 2014 for Houston. The 2013 leader in every major stat category, outside of punting and field goals (Richie Leone), returns for the Cougars as well.
- « The program welcomed an incoming class of 27 that is comprised of 23 high school student-athletes, one junior college transfer and three four-year transfers. Two of the 27 newcomers enrolled in the program in January for spring workouts - QB Bear Fenimore and OL Carter Wall.
- « Houston's roster sports 54 upperclassmen and 58 underclassmen. Fourteen players redshirted in 2013.
- « Fifty-seven players saw action in Houston's opening game of the season including 17 making their UH debut.

SILVER ANNIVERSARY OF ANDRE WARE'S HEISMAN

- « This season marks the silver anniversary of Houston's Andre Ware capturing the 1989 Heisman Trophy.
- « The Houston legend, who spends his weekends as a color analyst for ESPN College Football and the Houston Texans radio team, was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2004.
- « Ware is being honored this year on the field with his jersey number, 11, marked on the 11-yard line in the southeast corner of John O'Quinn Field at TDECU Stadium.

COUNTING DOWN TO 400...

- « Houston needs just two more wins to reach the 400-win threshold. Houston passed the 300-win mark on Sept. 4, 1999 with a 28-3 win over crosstown rival Rice.

REMEMBERING SAM HAIRSTON

« University of Houston Football letterman and Sgt. 1st Class Sam Hairston was killed on Aug. 12 in Ghazni, Afghanistan when his unit took small-arms fire from the enemy.

« Hairston, 35, competed as a linebacker and defensive lineman with Houston Football from 1997 to 2000. He competed in 42 games during that time, posting 55 tackles with four sacks, an interception and fumble recovery.

« Hairston was a paratrooper and platoon sergeant with A Company, 1st Battalion, 504th Parachute Infantry Regiment, 1st Brigade Combat Team, 82nd Airborne Division of Fort Bragg, N.C.

« His awards included the Bronze Star Medal, Purple Heart Medal, Meritorious Service Medal, Army Commendation Medal with three oak leaf clusters, Army Achievement Medal, Meritorious Unit Citation with two oak leaf clusters, Army Good Conduct Medal with two oak leaf clusters, the National Defense Service Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal with two Campaign Stars, the Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal and the Global War on Terrorism Service Medal.

« Hairston is survived by his wife, Staff Sgt. Tawana Hairston, and his son, Hayden.

« Houston will wear decals to honor both Hairston and former All-American Robert Newhouse who passed away in late July. The black circular decals feature the jersey numbers of Hairston (34) and Newhouse (46) in red font.



TOUGHEST SCHEDULE IN PROGRAM HISTORY IN 2013

« With the move to The American Athletic Conference, the 2013 season featured Houston's toughest schedule to date.

« Houston's opponents combined for 94 total wins and a winning percentage of 57.0 percent. The 94 wins eclipsed the previous best by Houston opponents, 85 in 2005.

« The 57.0 winning percent is fourth behind the opponent winning percentage of 63.1 percent in 1995, 61.2 percent in 2001 and the 59.8 percent in 1987.

« Against its next five toughest schedules, Houston was a combined 20-37, or a winning percentage of 35.1 percent, while the 2013 team finished 8-5, good for 61.5 percent.

« UH topped two conference champions in Rice (Conference USA) and Southern (SWAC).

- « Houston has scored in 173 straight games dating back to Sept. 30, 2000.
- « Houston scored in 41 of 52 quarters (78.8 percent) last season with TDs in 36 quarters and double digits in 19.
- « UH opened the year by scoring in the first 32 quarters of the season and was the nation’s last team to be held scoreless in a quarter before UCF posted a first-quarter shutout on Nov. 9.
- « Just 57 of Houston’s 193 offensive drives in 2013 resulted in a three-and-out (29.5 percent).
- « Of Houston’s 65 offensive scoring drives last season, 32 came in under two minutes. Sixteen of those 32 came in under a minute. Its quickest lasted just four seconds against SMU. Houston also had two 12-second scoring drives at Rutgers.
- « Twenty-four drives lasted five plays or less.
- « Five of Houston’s eight scoring drives vs. Grambling were less than 1:05 with four lasting three plays or less.

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS

- « From 2010-12, Houston trailed just Oklahoma State in explosive plays of 20 yards or longer with 254 to OSU’s 261.
- « UH ended 2013 with 106 explosive plays on the season including 20 touchdowns.
- « Demarcus Ayers led the team with 27 explosive plays including two touchdowns. Ayers had 23 kick returns and four receptions over 20 yards. Deontay Greenberry was second with 19 receptions of 20 yards or more. Daniel Spencer had 17 explosive plays, 15 receiving and two rushing.
- « Greenberry led Houston with five touchdowns of 20 yards or longer each while Spencer was second with four long TDs.
- « Houston’s 18 offensive plays of 40 yards or longer and seven plays of 60 yards or longer led the American.
- « Through two weeks, Houston is second nationally with four plays of 50 or more yards.
- « Greenberry leads Houston with three explosive plays, all receptions, including the longest play from scrimmage, a 67-yard reception against Grambling.

OFFENSIVE COACHING CHANGES

- « Entering his third season at Houston, Travis Bush was elevated to assistant head coach and offensive coordinator and shifted back to leading the program’s quarterbacks in January. Bush, whoc coached the running backs in 2013, served as the program’s interim play caller and quarterbacks coach for the final 11 games of 2012 and also called Houston’s plays in the 2014 BBVA Compass Bowl.
- « Houston added three offensive assistants this offseason in Dan Hammerschmidt (running backs), Tony Jeffery (outside

receivers) and Gordy Shaw (offensive line). The three have a combined 70 years of coaching experience.

OPENING UP A CAN OF O'KORN

« When David Piland's career ended due to multiple concussions in 2013, John O'Korn received his first career start against Rice. He finished the day with 281 yards and three touchdowns on 15-of-33 passing, becoming just the third player in UH history to throw for at least three TDs in his first start.

« In his first road start, O'Korn led UH to a 59-28 win at UTSA with 312 yards on 24-of-36 passing with four TDs.

« O'Korn led all true freshmen nationally with 28 passing touchdowns, a number that ranked second in The American Athletic Conference behind the 31 from Louisville's Teddy Bridgewater.

« The first-year player threw for at least three touchdowns in six games and over 300 yards in three games.

« O'Korn completed 80 percent of his passes (24-of-30) at Rutgers with a career-high 364 yards and five TDs.

« He followed his 80 percent performance with a completion rate of 81.5 percent (22-of-27) vs. USF.

« He finished just 14 yards from the Houston record for passing yards by a freshman and captured the UH freshman records for passing touchdowns (28) and completions (259).

« O'Korn, who has added over 25 pounds this offseason, was selected to serve as a counselor at the Manning Passing Academy in July.

« A second true freshman, Greg Ward Jr., provided relief for O'Korn in eight games, throwing for 310 yards and one touchdown on 19-of-28 passing while rushing for 176 yards and two touchdowns on 45 attempts.

« Ward also saw time at receiver in the final four games of the season, recording 10 receptions for 95

yards and a touchdown.

A LITTLE SLICE OF GREENBERRY PIE

« In his second collegiate season, Deontay Greenberry easily surpassed his 2012 numbers. The American's leading receiver with 1,202 yards, he ranked 17th nationally, despite leaving the Louisville game on the first drive of the game with a head injury and missing the SMU game. Greenberry was third in the league and 20th nationally with an average of 6.8 receptions per game. Take away the Louisville game and Greenberry averaged 109.3 yards and 7.5 receptions per game, which would have ranked among the nation's leaders - ninth and 15th, respectively.

« Greenberry was second in The American Athletic Conference with 11 receiving touchdowns, a number that ranked 10th nationally

« The Fresno, Calif., native was fifth in The American in all-purpose yards at 100.7 yards per game.

« Greenberry pulled in at least six receptions in nine of his 12 games.

« Greenberry became the 17th player in UH history to record 1,000 receiving yards in a season and the first since Patrick Edwards and Justin Johnson in 2011.

« His 1,202 yards were the 10th best single-season total and he needs just 156 yards to break the top 10 for yards in a career at Houston.

« Greenberry has gotten off to a quick start in 2014 with his sixth career 100-yard game against Grambling (110) after coming up just short vs. UTSA (96).

« The junior needs just 23 yards to become the 11th player in UH history to pull in over 2,000 yards receiving in a career and needs 37 yards to move into the top 10 on the Houston career receiving yards chart.

DOWNFIELD OPTIONS

« Greenberry is one of 12 players returning with receptions in 2013 including nine who had touchdown receptions - Greenberry (11), Daniel Spencer (6), Ryan Jackson (2), Markeith Ambles (1), Greg Ward Jr. (1), Wayne Beadle (1), Kenneth Farrow (1), Demarcus Ayers (1) and John Leday (1) - pulling in touchdowns.

« Greenberry was second in The American with five 100-yard games while Spencer was tied for third with four 100-yard games last season. Ambles joined the list as well with 105 yards against Vanderbilt in the BBVA Compass Bowl.

« Two sophomores in the starting lineup who came on strong at the end of 2013 are Ayers and Ward. The 2013 American Co-Special Teams Player of the Year, Ayers pulled in all of his receptions in the season’s final seven games while Ward, who started the season at quarterback, began playing receiver in the season’s final four games.

« Houston also welcomes back to its receiving group senior Shane Ros who sat out the 2013 season after suffering a torn ACL in the 2013 spring session. Ros pulled in 23 receptions for 337 yards and three touchdowns in 2012.

THUNDER & LIGHTNING

« Houston’s backfield features a thunder-and-lightning combination in junior RBs Kenneth Farrow and Ryan Jackson.

« Jackson led the way for Houston in 2013 with 661 yards on 139 carries (4.8 average) and six touchdowns. Farrow matched his touchdowns, playing in two fewer games, and finished the year with 514 yards on 103 carries (4.8 average).

« Farrow notched his first career 100-yard rushing game against Grambling, finishing with 130 yards, including a career-long 55-yard run on the game’s first play, and one touchdown. The junior was named to The American’s weekly honor roll as he averaged 10 yards a carry on the night.

« Farrow recorded his first career game with a rushing and a receiving touchdown with his two-TD game vs. USF last season.

« Against Rutgers, USF and UCF last season, Farrow was effective, averaging 9.1 yards a carry with 182 yards on 20 attempts.

« Jackson owns three career 100-yard games, including back-to-back games over the century mark to open 2013.

« Redshirt-freshman Javin Webb made his debut vs. Grambling, finishing with 72 yards on eight carries.

THE LINE ON THE LINE

« Two of Houston’s most experienced players return in 2014 to anchor the line in RG Rowdy Harper and C Bryce Redman, both seniors. Harper has started 41 consecutive games, every game of his career. The 41-game streak ties for the nation’s longest among offensive linemen. Redman has started the last 21 games at center, taking the position over early in the 2012 season and never looking back.

« Houston welcomes three new starters to its offensive line in LT Travis Cross, RG Ben Dew and RT Alex Cooper, all juniors. Cross (Oklahoma State) and Dew (Hawaii) both transferred to Houston this season while Cooper enters his fourth season with the Cougars. Cooper has provided depth along the line for the last two seasons, recording one start in 2013 as a jumbo tight end.

« The starting line sports an average height of 6-4 with an average weight of 300 pounds.

« The group took a major hit in the spring when junior LT Zach Johnson suffered a torn ACL and was lost for the year.

« The group added seven newcomers in the form of two four-year transfers, Dew and Cross, one junior college transfer, Carter Wall, and four freshmen in Darius Joiner, Colton Freeman, Marcus Oliver and Emerald Faletuipapai.

TAKE IT AWAY, DON’T GIVE IT AWAY

« Houston led the nation in 2013 with a +25 turnover margin.

« The Houston defense led the nation with 43 forced turnovers - 18 fumbles (NCAA best) and 25 interceptions (second nationally).

« Offensively, Houston committed just 18 turnovers: eight fumbles and 10 interceptions. The 18 turnovers were second in The American behind Louisville (10).

« Ten players had interceptions for the Houston defense with Adrian McDonald leading The American with six interceptions, a number that ranked seventh nationally.

« Eleven had fumble recoveries, led by Trevon Stewart with six recoveries, a number that led the nation. Eleven players forced fumbles including five players with two apiece.

« If you haven’t picked up on it yet, Stewart is a turnover machine. The sophomore led the nation with a combined 10 turnovers - interceptions (4) and fumble recoveries (6).

« Houston forced multiple turnovers in 12 games and at least three turnovers in 10 games last season.

« The 43 turnovers resulted in 141 points including 25 scored directly by defenders off three touchdowns (William Jackson, Brandon Wilson, Stewart) and two points from a Derrick Mathews’ safety.

« The Cougar defensive line collected three interceptions as Tyus Bowser, Tomme Mark and B.J. Singleton each had one pick.

« Players routinely credited the ability to create turnovers on the emphasis paid on turnovers in practice, especially on Turnover Tuesdays.

« UH got off to a rough start losing the turnover battle to UTSA, 6-1, before claiming a 6-2 turnover edge vs. Grambling.

« Three players have interceptions this season with three accounting for four fumble recoveries.

WELCOME BACK DEFENSIVE STAFF

« For the first time since the 2009 season, there was no change on the Houston Football defensive staff. Defensive coordinator David Gibbs and linebackers coach Vernon Hargreaves enter their second seasons while defensive backs coach Zach Spavital enters his seventh season and defensive line coach Ricky Logo his third.

THE THIRD WARD D

« Houston ranked third nationally among most improved scoring defenses in 2013. In giving up 21.8 points per game, Houston allowed 14.2 points less per game than 2012.

« The scoring defense output was the lowest in 14 years since the 1999 defense held opponents to 19 points per game.

« On average, the Houston defense forced 5.3 three-and-outs per game, a number that led The American and was 11th nationally. On 69 of Houston opponents' 191 drives, or 36.1 percent, the Houston defense got off the field in three plays or less.

« UH allowed just two rushing attempts of 30 yards or more, a number that was second nationally.

« The defense was ninth nationally in allowing just eight plays of 40 yards or longer.

« Houston recorded its first conference shutout since 1989 with its 34-0 win over SMU to close out the regular season. It was the program's first overall shutout since Sept. 24, 2011, vs. Georgia State and marked the first time in June Jones' career to be shutout.

« The defense held UCF (19), Louisville (20) and SMU (0) to their lowest scoring outputs of the season, with both teams scoring 16 points less than their season average.

« Three times in the season, the Houston defense shut out its opponent in the second half. After spotting Temple 13 points in the first half, the Third Ward Defense held the Owls to no points and just 105 total yards in the second half. The Third Ward D did it at Rutgers as the Scarlet Knights were held scoreless after scoring their second touchdown of the game with 7:03 remaining in the second quarter. Houston forced three interceptions and a punt before stopping Rutgers to run out the clock in the second half. Take away the two first half scoring drives and the Houston defense limited Rutgers to 68 yards off 19 plays in the first half. The third game came vs. the previously mentioned SMU win.

ANYTHING BUT SECONDARY

« The secondary group made a name for itself in the takeaway department last season, recording 29 of the team's 43 turnovers or 67 percent. The group has four of the season's first seven turnovers with interceptions from Adrian McDonald, William Jackson and Earl Foster while McDonald also has a fumble recovery.

« At free safety, junior Trevon Stewart has started the last 24 games of his career, earning FWAA Freshman All-America honors in 2012. The Patterson, La., native led the nation in 2013 with six fumble recoveries and four interceptions. Stewart also forced two fumbles along with his 109 tackles.

« A high school quarterback, McDonald started at strong safety in 2013 and led The American with six interceptions to go along with 99 tackles, three pass breakups and a fumble recovery.

« Jackson has taken over one starting corner role full time after recording four starts in 2013. He made his second career interception last week vs. Grambling.

« The group also welcomes Boise State transfer Lee Hightower who recorded his first UH start vs. UTSA after starting 11 games at Boise. Hightower has started the first two games opposite of Jackson.

TACKLING MACHINES

« The 2013 season saw six Cougars account for 27 games with 10 or more tackles.

« Derrick Mathews leads the team with 14 career double-digit tackle games.

« Mathews leads the nation with 371 career tackles and 40.5 career tackles for loss. He ranks eighth on Houston's career tackles chart and is sixth on the UH career list with 183 assisted tackles. He also led all linebackers in The American and UH in 2013 with seven sacks.

« The team leader in tackles with 134, Efreem Oliphant, had double-digit tackles in five of Houston's six final games. Oliphant finished the year 12th nationally and second in The American with an average of 10.3 tackles per game.

« Three players hit double digits in the season opener against UTSA as Mathews tied a career best with 16 stops, followed by Oliphant at 14 and Trevon Stewart at 10. Oliphant followed that with 10 stops vs. Grambling.

LOOK AT THE LINEBACKERS

« Derrick Mathews is the defense's most experienced player with 41 career starts moved to the middle in 2013 after spending 2012 on the weakside. The junior has posted triple-digit tackles in his first three seasons including 116 stops in 2013.

« Mathews was named The American's Defensive Player of the Week with his work against BYU last season. Mathews picked off a pass midway through the first and returned it 29 yards for a TD. He had four tackles for loss in the game including a career-high three sacks. Mathews had back-to-back sacks late in the third quarter, the latter of which resulted in a safety.

« Efreem Oliphant, a veteran of 38 career games with 18 career starts - 13 in 2013, had 13 TFLs, leading The American and eclipsing the 3.5 TFLs he recorded in his first two seasons.

« Oliphant recorded a game-high 16 tackles vs. BYU, the most by a Houston defender in 2013.

UP FRONT

« The Houston defensive line was hands on all season as evident by the group's three interceptions - Tyus Bowser, Tomme Mark and B.J. Singleton - along with four blocked kicks - B.J. Singleton (3) and Trevor Harris (1). Singleton's three blocks ranked second nationally.

« Joey Mbu was paired with junior Tomme Mark, who had an interception in Houston's season opener, and the two were part of a rotation that included senior Jeremiah Farley and sophomore B.J. Singleton. Mbu led the defensive tackle group with 29 tackles. Farley led the group with nine tackles for loss including three sacks.

« Harris, a junior college transfer last season, performed admirably with nine games in the starting role, finishing the year with 49 tackles, including 8.5 for a loss, 3.5 sacks and one forced fumble.

« Then-true freshman Tyus Bowser exploded onto the scene in Houston's win over Rice as the end had seven tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, 1.5 sacks, an interception and four quarterback hurries.

« The talented rush defensive end group also includes junior Eric Eiland who started eight games last season and finished with 21 tackles including two tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.

« On the other side of the line, sophomores Cameron Malveaux and Chauntez Jackson will be asked to step up in their second year on the field. Malveaux had 12 tackles and one fumble recovery in 12 games last year while Jackson did not record any stats in 10 games last year.

« While senior defensive end Eric Braswell was lost for the season with a torn ACL in the spring, the group added a four-year transfer in Gavin Stansbury, who was Texas A&M's Defensive MVP in 2013.

THE BOOK ON BULLARD

« Junior Kyle Bullard took over as the team's placekicker in the seventh game of 2013 and will hold the position in 2014 after being placed on scholarship in April.

« Bullard saw action in seven games in 2013 and connected on all 20 extra-point attempts.

« Bullard was perfect on the year, hitting all six field goal attempts including a long of 46 yards at Louisville.

« Also an All-State soccer player, Bullard hit a career-long field goal of 49 yards in high school.

« The junior has been perfect on the year this season, hitting all four field goal attempts vs. Grambling and all six extra point attempts in the season's first two games.

THE OTHER FOOT

« Ty Cummings will take over the starting role as the team's kickoff specialist. As a freshman, Cummings had five kickoffs for an average of 60.8 yards per game including one touchback.

« Cummings has two touchbacks in his 12 kickoffs this season with an average of 60.3 yards per attempt.

RETURNS DEPARTMENT

« Houston had six players with multiple returns in 2013 with four returning for the 2014 season.

« At kick returner, Houston sophomore Demarcus Ayers was named The American Athletic Conference's Co-Special Teams Player of the Year in 2013 as a true freshman.

« Ayers had 37 kick returns for 1,021 yards and led The American with an average return of 27.6 yards per return, a number that ranked 12th nationally. He had a return of at least 40 yards in six games.

« With his 1,021 kick return yards, Ayers set the Houston freshman record and was just 153 yards away from the UH single season record.

« After coming close several times, Ayers finally broke a return for a touchdown against BYU, returning a first-quarter kick 95 yards for Houston's first score of the day.

« Ayers was second in the nation with 12 kickoff returns over 30 yards in 2013.

« Jack-of-all-trades Greg Ward Jr. took over as Houston's starting punt returner in the season's final two games, finishing with two returns for six yards.

« Markeith Ambles is the fourth UH player with multiple returns in 2013, finishing with two kickoff returns for 60 yards and one punt return for one yard.

PUNTER & PUNTER

« Houston will employ two punters in 2014 with juniors Dylan Seibert and Logan Piper sharing the duties.

« Seibert, an Oklahoma transfer, served as Houston's holder in 2013.

« Piper joined the program in 2013 after two years with the Houston Baseball program.

« Seibert handled all six of Houston's punt attempts vs. UTSA, with an average of 39.0 yards per attempt.

« Seibert bumped his average up vs. Grambling as he averaged 45.5 yards per kick on his two punts.

« Piper made his debut vs. Grambling with one punt for 30 yards that was fair caught inside the 20-yard line.

HEAD COACH

THIRD YEAR | MINNESOTA '96



• Tony Levine is in his third season as the head coach at the University of Houston.

• Introduced as the 12th head coach in Houston history on Dec. 22, 2011, Levine made an emphatic national statement in his opening game as the UH head coach, belting No. 22 Penn State, 30-14, in the 2012 TicketCity Bowl.

• Levine took over at UH two weeks before that Jan. 2 bowl contest in Dallas and unveiled a prepared squad that held Penn State to just two scores and produced a Cotton Bowl Stadium record 532 yards of passing vs. the nation's No. 4-ranked pass defense. The victory helped UH to a school-record 13th win (tops in the nation) and first January bowl victory since the 1979 campaign. Levine led the Cougars to an end-of-season national ranking for the first time since 1990 and was the first UH head coach to open his career with a win vs. a nationally-ranked opponent since Harold Lahar in 1957.

• The St. Paul, Minn., native directed Houston in its final season of play in Conference USA and led the team's transition into The American Athletic Conference in 2013. Levine led Houston to its 16th eight-win season in program history as it opened the season 5-0 for just the fifth time in program history, despite playing the toughest schedule in program history.

• Houston returned to the postseason for the 22nd time in program history in 2013 as Levine led the Cougars to the BBVA Compass Bowl in Birmingham, Ala. The game marked Houston's second January bowl with Levine at the helm.

• UH led the nation with a +25 turnover margin and 43 turnovers gained. Sophomore Trevon Stewart led the nation with 10 turnovers - a nation's best six fumble recoveries and four interceptions. Fellow sophomore Adrian McDonald led The American with six interceptions.

• The 2013 Houston defense ranked third nationally among most improved scoring defenses. In giving up 21.8 points per game, Houston allowed 14.2 points less per game than 2012. The scoring defense output was the lowest in 14 years since the 1999 defense held opponents to 19 points per game.

• Seven players received 2013 postseason honors from The American including freshman Demarcus Ayers being named the league's Co-Special Teams Player of the Year and John O'Korn being named Rookie of the Year.

• O'Korn led all true freshmen nationally with 28 touchdowns and set Houston freshman records with his 28 TDs and 259 completions. His 28 passing touchdowns were second in The American behind the 31 of Louisville's Teddy Bridgewater.

• Deontay Greenberry led The American with 1,202 receiving yards despite missing one full game and leaving after the first series of another. The sophomore's 11 touchdown receptions were second in the league and ranked 10th nationally.

• Ayers led The American and was 12th nationally with an average of 27.6 yards per kick return. He set a Houston freshman record with 1,021 kickoff return yards and finished second on the UH single-season chart regardless of class.

• Punter Richie Leone was named a second-team All-American by the FWAA and became the first punter in UH history to earn All-America honors. An NFL Combine invitee, Leone signed with the Baltimore Ravens after finishing his career ranked second on the UH career punting average chart at 43.1 yards per punt. Leone set the Houston career record with 54 punts over 50 yards.

• While 2012 was Levine's first full season as head coach, he was no stranger to Houston. The former collegiate wide receiver spent the four seasons before his promotion on the UH staff, including his final two as assistant head coach.

• The 41-year old has spent 19 years in the coaching ranks, including stints at all levels of football, from a high school stop in his home state of Minnesota, to a two-year stop with the Carolina Panthers of the NFL.

• The 2012 season saw 13 Houston players earn All-Conference USA honors and Trevon Stewart named to the FWAA Freshman All-American team. Three Houston players - D.J. Hayden (interceptions per game), Leone (punting average) and Phillip Stewart (sacks) led the Conference in their respective categories. Leone tied the Houston single-season record with an average of 45.5 yards per punt while Matt Hogan set the Conference USA career scoring record with 405 points.

• During Levine's tenure at UH, the special teams units has reached unprecedented heights, highlighted by 20 blocked kicks, nine kickoff returns for touchdowns and six forced turnovers. Those groups also have tied/broken seven NCAA records and set 11 school marks.

• From 2008-11, the eight kickoff returns for touchdowns were the second most by any FBS school over the time period, while the 16 blocked kicks ranked among the national leaders during that same period.

• Houston has been explosive as a return unit during Levine's tenure and had three returns for scores in 2011, including Tyron Carrier's seventh career kickoff return for a score (tied an NCAA record) and two punt return scores by two different returners in the road win at Tulane. Hogan also broke the NCAA record with 78 consecutive extra points made in a season.

• The 2010 season saw the Cougars return a punt, kickoff and a blocked field goal for touchdowns. Punt returner Patrick Edwards finished seventh in the nation and first in C-USA with a 15.4 yard per return average, while Houston finished ninth nationally with a 14.3 yard per return mark. Wesley Scourten finished the 2010 season with five blocked kicks and eight for his career -- both school records -- while Carrier brought his career kickoff return touchdown total to six before adding No. 7 in 2011.

• In November 2011, CBSSports.com's Bruce Feldman named Levine one of the nation's 10 fastest-rising assistant coaches.

• Offensively in 2010, the Cougars finished 11th in the nation in total offense (480.5 ypg), fifth in passing offense (327.3 ypg) and 13th in scoring offense (37.7 ppg). Inside receiver James Cleveland finished his two-year career with 161 catches for 2,014 yards and 20 touchdowns, all which rank in the school's top-10 all-time list

• In 2009, Cleveland (1,214 yards) and Carrier (1,029 yards) each surpassed the 1,000-yard receiving mark, while tight end Fendi Onobun became a sixth-round draft pick of the NFL's St. Louis Rams. Onobun also tied an NCAA single-game record with two blocked PATs against C-USA foe Southern Miss, one of which led to a key defensive conversion in a 50-43 win.

• Offensively, the Cougars ranked first nationally in total offense (563.4 ypg), passing offense (433.7 ypg) and scoring offense (42.2 ppg) in 2009.

• Levine tutored Hogan, who was named a Freshman All-American by Sporting News and was a C-USA All-Freshman Special Teams selection. The Cougars also tied an NCAA record by returning five kickoffs for touchdowns and tied a school single-season mark with six blocked kicks.

• In 2008, Levine coached tight end Mark Hafner to an All-Conference USA Second Team selection and career highs in catches (86), receiving yards (907) and touchdowns (11). Carrier was also named to the All-C-USA Second Team after catching 80 passes for 1,026 yards and nine touchdowns.

• Statistically, the Cougar offense finished second in the country in both total offense (562.8 ypg) and passing (401.6 ypg) and 10th in scoring (40.6 ppg). Also under Levine, punter Chase Turner earned a spot on the All-C-USA Honorable Mention list after averaging 45.5 yards per punt. Turner's mark was a single-season school record, while the team's net punting average of 36.5 yards was also the highest in school history. The Cougars finished the season ranked 34th in the country in net punting, up from 114th (31.2) in 2007, prior to Levine's arrival.

• Houston's kickoff coverage defense ranked 22nd nationally, yielding a mere 18.96 yards per return on 92 kickoffs, while the Cougars blocked five kicks (three field goals, two punts).

HOUSTON -- Playing in front of an attendance of 40,755, the largest on-campus crowd in school history in the inaugural game at TDECU Stadium, Houston Football wasn't able to overcome six turnovers, falling 27-7 to UTSA.

Despite allowing 27 points to the Roadrunners, the Cougars' (0-1) defense did extend its turnover streak to 24 straight games on an Adrian McDonald fumble recovery in the first quarter.

UTSA's David Glasco, who ran for 81 yards on 25 carries, scored on a three-yard run in the first quarter after a mishandled Houston punt gave the Roadrunners their first opportunity in the Houston red zone. Glasco then added a two-yard touchdown run in the second quarter to extend the Roadrunners' lead to 14-0.

UTSA's Jarveon Williams' 11-yard touchdown run capped a 13-play, 60-yard drive in the third quarter, and Sean Ianno kicked a 26-yard field goal after Bennett Okotcha intercepted John O'Korn's pass in Houston territory. Ianno added a 30-yard field goal in the fourth quarter to put UTSA ahead 27-0.

The Cougars posted a fourth-quarter touchdown, on what proved to be the last drive of the game for Houston, on an eight-yard run by junior Ryan Jackson when senior quarterback Billy Cosh made his Cougar debut on the scoring drive.

Junior wide receiver Deontay Greenberry led the Cougars with six receptions for 96 yards. O'Korn finished the night 21-of-43 for 204 passing yards.

Defensively, three Cougars tallied double-digit tackle games, led by senior Derrick Mathews, who tied his career best with 16 tackles and record his 14th career double-digit tackle effort.

Senior Efrom Oliphant finished with 14 tackles for the 10th double-digit tackle game of his career, while junior Trevon Stewart added 10 tackles for the 12th double-digit tackle game of his career.

HOUSTON -- Houston Football poured in 477 yards of offense, led by junior running back Kenneth Farrow, who ran for 130 yards and a touchdown, while the Cougars forced six turnovers en route to a 47-0 shutout win over Grambling State Saturday evening at TDECU Stadium.

The shutout win was the 38th in program history and the second in the last four games played under head coach Tony Levine. The 47 points on Saturday were the most scored since Oct. 26, 2013, at Rutgers. The total also marks the most points scored at home since Aug. 30, 2013, against Southern.

Five different Cougars jumped in the scoring action, notching five touchdowns, while kicker Kyle Bullard contributed with a career-high 17 points for Houston on four field goals and five extra points.

Contributing to the scoring was sophomore receiver Greg Ward Jr., who notched his first career game with multiple touchdowns, tallying a receiving and rushing score to lead the Cougars. Ward finished the night with 19 yards receiving and 22 yards rushing.

Farrow and fellow junior running back Ryan Jackson each added a rushing touchdown, while senior defensive end Vincent Hall recovered a fourth-quarter fumble for a touchdown to cap the 47 points for Houston.

Farrow's 130 rushing yards marked a career-high on 13 attempts. His 55-yard rush on the game's first play was a career long, surpassing his previous long of 48 yards, which happened twice, the last coming vs. Tulane on Nov. 24, 2012.

Junior receiver Deontay Greenberry finished the night with 110 yards on five receptions including a season-long 67-yard pass from sophomore quarterback John O'Korn serving as the key play in the Cougars' second touchdown for the Cougars. Greenberry's night marked his sixth career 100-yard receiving game of his career.

O'Korn wrapped up a 14-for-25 night for 200 yards and a passing touchdown to Ward. Houston jumped on top quickly, with Ward scoring just 48 seconds into the game on a 12-yard run - set up by a 55-yard run by Farrow.

A pair of Bullard field goals - 42 and 38 yards - made it 13-0. Farrow then scored from two yards out, Ryan Jackson had a 12-yard run and Ward hauled in a 10-yard scoring strike from O'Korn as Houston made it 34-0 at halftime.

Bullard fired off two field goals in the third quarter to put the Cougars ahead 40-0 before a final turnover led to Houston's fifth touchdown of the game to cap the 47 points.

Defensively, Houston forced six turnovers - the most since Rutgers a year ago on Oct. 26, 2013. Houston had three interceptions coming from juniors Adrian McDonald, William Jackson and Earl Foster, while Hall recovered two fumbles and senior Wayne Beadle added one on a kickoff return.

True freshman Matthew Adams joined Foster in forcing a fumble. Senior Efrom Oliphant led the Cougars with 10 tackles - notching his 11th career double-digit tackle game and second of the season.
