WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- BYU's first trip to Cowboys Stadium in 2009 saw the Cougars knock off No. 3 Oklahoma, 14-13, in the first collegiate football game to be played in the stadium. BYU is 24-20-1 all-time at neutral sites and 5-2 under Bronco Mendenhall.
- For their performances against Idaho State, Riley Nelson and Kyle Van Noy were each awarded an FBS Independent Player of the Week award. Nelson led six touchdown drives in seven series before leaving the game early in the third quarter. He completed 11 of 17 passes for 215 yards and three touchdowns, adding 62 yards and a touchdown on seven carries; his pass efficiency rating of 229.2 is the 12th-best single-game mark in BYU history.

Van Noy had four solo tackles, including three tackles for loss and two sacks. Van Noy's defensive stat line also included three quarterback hurries and a blocked punt he returned for six yards, setting up BYU's first touchdown of the day.

- BYU has totaled more than 200 yards rushing and 200 yards passing in each of its last four games, including a season high 572 total yards (290 rush, 282 pass) last week against Idaho State.
- BYU has not allowed a passing touchdown in five of its eight games this season. Only Utah (2), Utah State (2) and Oregon State (1) have scored through the air against the Cougars. TCU has 17 passing touchdowns on the year, an average of 2.4 per game.
- BYU is looking for its sixth-straight win. The Cougars have not won six straight or more since winning 13 in a row from 2007-08, the third-longest win streak in BYU history. That 13-game win streak was broken by none other than TCU in Oct. 2008.
- Since coming in at quarterback against Utah State, junior Riley Nelson has thrown for 11 touchdowns, including three TD tosses in each of his three starts this season and two in just over a quarter's worth of work against USU.

BYU TOPS IDAHO STATE 56-3

PROVO, Utah – Quarterback Riley Nelson scored a career high four touchdowns while throwing for 215 yards and running for 62 more in 56-3 BYU rout over FCS foe Idaho State.

"I believe we played consistently for four quarters," BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall said. "We had a great chance for young players to play and they handled their assignments well. They executed at a high level. It's a unique challenge to play an FCS team this time of the season. It showed maturity from our team and is a real step forward."

Nelson finished 11 of 17 passing for 215 yards and three touchdowns and ran for another to lead BYU (6-2) to its fifth straight win. Idaho State (2-6) was unable to stop the Cougar offensive attack throughout the game as BYU recorded season highs in total yards (572), rushing yards (290) and points (56).

BYU used a balanced game plan to rack up 290 rushing yards and 282 passing yards in the game. Sophomore Cody Hoffman led the BYU receiving corps with five catches for 71 yards and two touchdowns. Sophomore Michael Alisa led the Cougars in rushing with 66 yards and a touchdown on eight carries.

The BYU defense recorded three interceptions, including one by Daniel Sorensen that was returned for a touch-down in third quarter, and held the Bengals to 20 yards rushing. Outside linebackers Kyle Van Noy and Jordan Pendleton recorded a combined 10 tackles, five tackles-for-loss, four sacks and three guarterback hurries.

Van Noy helped BYU get on the board quickly by blocking the first ISU punt of the game. The punt block was the first blocked kick of the season for the Cougars and first since 2009. Following the block, the BYU offense scored on its first play of the game when Nelson threw a 15-yard strike to Ross Apo for a touchdown. Apo finished the game with five catches for 71 yards and one touchdown.

ISU responded with a 63-yard drive that led to a field goal but gave up a 42-yard run to Alisa on the fourth play of the following BYU drive. BYU led 14-3 at the end of the first quarter despite holding the ball for just 1:59.

Running back J.J. Di Luigi pushed the BYU lead to 21-3 with a touchdown scamper with 8:23 remaining in the half. The Cougars scored again after a Travis Uale interception when Nelson ran in from 13-yards out for his first rushing touchdown of the season.

BYU finished the half with a Nelson-orchestrated 99-yard touchdown drive in 1:54. Nelson finished the drive with his second touchdown pass of the game, a seven-yard fade to Hoffman to put BYU 35-3 heading into the half.

Nelson led a 91-yard touchdown drive coming out of the locker room that put the Cougars up 42-3. Hoffman caught an 18-yard touchdown pass from Nelson to finish the drive.

"(Cody Hoffman) is so consistent," Mendenhall said. "He has such size and range and uses his body so well. If Riley puts it anywhere close to him he has a knack for getting the football. Cody has become the 'go-to-guy because he's making big plays in critical situations."

BYU played the remainder of the game with a consistent rotation of players. Sophomore quarterback Jake Heaps saw his first action since playing against Utah State and led the Cougars on one touchdown drive.

IDAHO STATE GAME NOTES

RACKING UP YARDS AND POINTS

BYU set new season-highs in total yards, rushing yards and points against Idaho State. The Cougars rolled up 572 total yards with 290 coming on the ground. BYU's 56 points were the most scored by the Cougars since a 59-21 victory over UNLV in 2009.

STAT MAN

Linebacker Kyle Van Noy blocked Idaho State's first punt attempt, the first time a Cougar has blocked a punt since the Colorado State game of 2009. Van Noy now adds a blocked punt stat to his collection of at least one of the following: interception, forced fumble, fumble recovery, quarterback hurry, pass breakup, sack, tackle for loss, tackle and touchdown.

TIME DIFFERENCE

BYU's first scoring drive lasted just 7 seconds when Riley Nelson threw a 15-yard touchdown pass to Ross Apo. The Bengals kicked a field goal on their second drive of the game and drained 7:07 from the clock on the drive. BYU's first three scoring drives were completed in less time, totaling 5:05 for 21 points.

JUST KEEP RUNNING

Running back Michael Alisa broke loose for BYU's longest run play of the season, a 42-yarder for a touchdown with 3:35 left in the first quarter. The touchdown run was also the longest scoring play of the season (excluding field goals). Alisa's run was the longest of his career and was the third-longest offensive play for BYU this year.

THE NEXT PRIMETIME?

Mike Muehlmann played both offense and defense against the Bengals. Muehlmann spent some time playing tight end, the position he played as a freshman last season. The sophomore also played on defense at defensive end, where he was switched to before the 2011 season. Due to injuries, Muehlmann will continue to be a versatile player for the Cougars.

A LONG, LONG WAY

BYU's 9-play, 99-yard touchdown drive was the longest touchdown scoring drive of the season. It ties the longest drive since 2006, another 99-yarder against Utah State.

HOFFMAN KEEPS IT GOING

Cody Hoffman caught his first pass of the game in the second quarter for 9 yards. With the catch, Hoffman extends his streak with at least one reception to 14-straight games and 20 of 21 career games. Hoffman finished the game with 5 catches for 71 yards and 2 touchdowns.

PICKING MACHINE

Safety Daniel Sorensen returned an interception 30 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter to give BYU a 49-3 lead. It was the second interception of the season for Sorensen. In the fourth quarter, defensive back Jordan Johnson intercepted a pass that he returned 42 yards. Earlier in the game safety Travis Uale recorded his third interception of the season in the second quarter.

THE BYU-TCU SERIES

This will be the 11th time BYU has played TCU. The series is currently tied 5-5 with the last meeting coming on Oct. 16 of last year when the Horned Frogs defeated the Cougars 31-3 in Fort Worth, Tex. BYU trailed the No. 4-ranked team just 3-0 with under two minutes remaining in the first half but two quick touchdown passes from senior Andy Dalton on short fields gave the home team a 17-0 edge heading into the break and BYU couldn't recover. The Cougars limited the Horned Frogs to just 37 rushing yards in the first half but were no match for TCU's No.1 ranked defense, holding BYU to just three points and 147 total yards of offense for the entire game.

TCU LAST TIME

FORT WORTH - TCU scored two touchdowns in the opening six minutes and held the opponent scoreless for the first time this season to seal a 69-0 victory over the New Mexico Lobos Saturday in front of 33,833 fans at Amon G. Carter Stadium.

TCU had its quickest start of the season, leading to a school-record 69 points. The Horned Frogs jumped out to a 20-0 first quarter lead sparked by a pair of Lobos fumbles. It was the first home game of the season that TCU led after the first quarter.

The Frogs were a perfect 6-for-6 on red zone chances in the first half before finishing the game with 22 first downs and 515 total yards of offense.

New Mexico couldn't decipher the Frogs' defense, mustering only 85 yards of offense, five first downs and giving away three fumbles.

TCU once again had a balanced offensive attack, rushing for 264 yards and passing for 251. The Frogs set school records with 10 touchdowns and nine different players finding the end zone. Deryck Gildon's blocked punt recovered for a score by Antonio Graves was TCU's first blocked punt since 2008.

Casey Pachall led the Frogs', going 13-for-17 for 175 yards and two touchdowns.

On the ground, Ed Wesley had six carries for 74 yards and a touchdown. Brown and Waymon James added 52 yards each and three combined touchdowns. Wesley's 4-yard scoring scamper at the start of the third quarter gave the Frogs a 48-0 lead.

Rick Settle, TCU's third quarterback of the day, rushed in the final score with 52 seconds left and Ross Evans' extra point gave the Frogs a school record 69 points in a game. Evans' PAT on TCU's first score gave him the Mountain West all-time scoring record.

BYU VS. BCS AQS

With the victories over Ole Miss of the SEC and Oregon State of the Pac-12, BYU has defeated at least one team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference six-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 15 of the past 16 years dating back to 1996. BYU is 2-2 vs. BCS schools this season.

With its win against Oregon State, the Cougars have also defeated a Pac-12 team team each of the last six years.

HOME COOKIN'

Head coach Bronco Mendenhall has often emphasized the importance of winning at home. Since taking the reigns of the program, BYU is 34-7 at home. The Cougars are 4-1 this year at home and last season BYU was 5-1 at LaVell Edwards Stadium. Mendenhall and the Cougars won 18-straight games in Provo from 2006-09.

MULTI-TD STREAK

Since taking over at quarterback vs. Utah State, Riley Nelson has thrown at least two touchdown passes in four-straight games. The last time that happened was when Max Hall connected for at least two touchdowns for the last four regular season games of 2009. Hall extended his streak to five in his final game as a Cougar, in BYU's 44-20 victory over Oregon State in the Las Vegas Bowl. Hall threw 16 touchdown passes over those five final five games. Nelson has 11 over the last four.

FOURTH QUARTER COMEBACKS

BYU has had three fourth quarter comebacks in 2011. The heroics over Utah State featued two late touchdown drives both coming in the fourth quarter to help the Cougars overcome a 24-13 lead and go on to win 27-24. BYU also came back in the fourth the week before to beat UCF 24-17 with a 6-yard touchdown run from Bryan Kariya after a muffed punt from UCF for the eventual game-winner. In the season opener at Ole Miss, late in the fourth quarter linebacker Kyle Van Noy stripped the ball from the Rebels' quarterback and scooped up and took it three yards into the end zone for the score to help BYU win 14-13.

MAKE YOURSELF COMFORTABLE

After starting with two games on the road, BYU had four-straight home games, going 3-1 for the homestretch. After dropping the rivalry game against Utah, BYU went on to win the next two over UCF and Utah State, both fourth-quarter comebacks. The last time the Cougars had four home games in a row was in 1991 when BYU had Air Force, Utah State, UTEP and Hawaii all in Provo. The Cougars won all four games during the stretch by a margin of victory of almost 16 points. BYU has seven home games this year.

HE'S KIND OF A BIG DEAL

Senior captain and offensive tackle Matt Reynolds is amidst a successful senior season after deciding not to enter the NFL draft despite a first round projection. Reynolds has been rewarded with several preseason accolades, including being named a preseason All-American by by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, CBSCollegeSports.com, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others. Along with those honors, Reynolds has recognized as an Outland Trophy Candidate, a Lombardi Award Candidate and a Lowe's Senior Class Award Nominee.

BRING ON THE BCS

Since the start of the Bowl Championship Series in 1998, BYU has played at least two BCS-automatic qualifying teams every year. In 2011, the Cougars have played four BCS schools in Ole Miss, Texas, Utah and Oregon State. Only two other seasons (2000 and 2003) has BYU played as many BCS teams. To start the 2011 season the Cougars played three of the four teams conecutively, opening with road games at Ole Miss and Texas before the home opener against Utah. Not since 1998 has BYU started a season against three BCS teams, when the Cougars lost to Alabama and Washington on the road and defeated Arizona State at home.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

With BYU playing UCF on a Friday night, as well as Utah State and TCU, it is the most Friday night games the Cougars have played in the Bronco Mendenhall era. Under Coach Mendenhall, BYU is 4-1 on Friday night games, with four of the games against Utah State. This is also the first time under Mendenhall that the Cougars played back-to-back Friday night games, with UCF and Utah State the past two weeks.

DON'T HASSLE THE HOFF

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman has become the playmaking receiver even though he got off a to a slow start. Hoffman caught just three passes for 20 yards in the first two games but since then has gone on to catch 30 passes for 471 yards and four touchdowns.He has made play after play recently and has averaged 125.9 all-purpose yards. He has set career game-highs in receptions, yards, kick returns and all-purpose yards in various games this season. Hoffman has been especially dangerous as a kick returner. He has 513 kick return yards on the season, including a 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, the first by a BYU player since 1998.

FOND MEMORIES

BYU is returning to Dallas Cowboys Stadium this week for TCU and it is a place the Cougars have a lot of fond memories, playing in the stadium's inagural college football game in 2009. The No. 20 BYU football team took on the No. 3 Oklahoma Sooners. The Cougars entered an atmosphere of 75,000 fans and played one of their best games in recent history, beating one of the preseason favorites for the national title, 14-13. Led by seniors Max Hall and Dennis Pitta, the Cougars outgained the Sooners 357 to 265 yards and BYU's hardhitting defense knocked Heisman Trophy winner Sam Bradford out of the game just before halftime. Backup running back Bryan Kariya came in for all-time leading rusher Harvey Unga and gave the Cougars a huge lift, catching four passes for 76 yards and adding 42 yards on the ground. Wide receiver McKay Jacobson caught the go-ahead touchdown with 3:03 left to play and BYU's defense shut the door in the final minutes to preserve the 14-13 win.

BAND OF BROTHERS

While BYU's motto is "Band of Brothers," there are four sets of brothers on the 2011 roster including Terence (Sr. OL) and Rhen (Jr. WR) Brown, Braden (Jr. OL) and Trevor Brown (Fr. TE), Matt (Sr. OL) and Houston (So. OL) Reynolds, and Iona (So. RB) and Baker (Fr. DL) Pritchard.

In addition, 13 different players, Kevan Bills, Gavin Fowler, Spencer Hafoka, Braden Hansen, Alex Kuresa, Marcus Mathews, Zed Mendenhall, Rex Morgan, Mike Muehlmann, Houston Reynolds, Matt Reynolds, Jordan Richardson and Jadon Wagner also boast brothers who have played for the Cougar football program in the past.

FATHER'S DAY

Currently seven BYU players are also fathers, led by senior wide receiver Spencer Hafoka, with two children. Other dads on the team include Matt Reynolds, Travis Uale, Alani Fua, Aveni Leung-Wai and newest dad, Brandon Ogletree. Nine players also had fathers who played football at BYU: Famika Anae (Robert), Dallin Cutler (Chuck), Gavin Fowler (Blaine), Jameson Frazier (Danny), Colby Hansen (Regan), Carter Mees (Mike), Jordan Pendleton (Kirk), Matt Reynolds (Lance) and Houston Reynolds (Lance).

HOLY MATRIMONY

BYU has long held the distinction of having the most married players of any other school in the country. This year is no exception. BYU currently has 32 players who are married.

GROUND GAME GOING

After a slow start to the running game, BYU has rushed for 1123 yards in its last five games. The Cougars rushed for a measly 145 yards in the first three games. For the fourth-straight game, BYU has rushed for at least 200 yards and improved each game. The running game picked up an even 200 yards against Utah State, 224 against San Jose State, 282 at Oregon State and a seasonhigh 290 vs. Idaho State. BYU also didn't have a rushing touchdown in the first three games but have had nine in the last five games. JJ Di Luigi leads the way with 70 carries, 346 yards and three touchdowns. Quarterback Riley Nelson helps in the ground game as the Cougars second leading rusher despite seeing limited time the first four games with 284 yards on 44 attempts with one touchdown. Newly discovered running back Michael Alisa is now third on the team with 243 yards on 47 carries and has two touchdowns, with 241 of those coming in the last three games.

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 44 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 17 different countries including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cambodia, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, El Salvador, Fiji, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Paraguay, Peru, South Korea, Thailand and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of seven different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Cambodian, French, Korean, Portuguese, Spanish and Thai.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga is one of 73 players (61 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 29 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Germany, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, Mongolia, Mozambique, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 14 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nevada, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas.

Overall, 50 current members (42 percent) of the BYU football team speak a combined total of 21 different foreign languages and dialects, including Cebuano, Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Italian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Swedish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

- * The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.
- * The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and Paul in the Bible).
- * More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.
- * Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.
- * Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions except for their transportation to and from their field of labor and are not paid for their services.
- * Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.
- * Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in 14 additional countries including Brazil, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico and Spain.
 - * Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."
- * A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.
- * In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.
- * Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Wide receiver McKay Jacobson has had the luxury of having a top-notch quarterback be around him for almost all of his football career. While he currently has the promising sophomore Jake Heaps and gritty junior Riley Nelson, he has caught passes at BYU from NFL quarterbacks Max Hall and John Beck. Even at the high school level, Jacobson connected with future NFL talent. At Carroll High School in Southlake, Texas (an incredibly fruitful recruiting ground), former Alabama quarterback Greg McElroy who led the Crimson Tide to a 2009 National Championship tossed the pigskin to Jacobson befor entering the NFL. Another NFL guarterback, Chase Daniel was Jacobson's quarterback for two years in high school as well.

TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting offensive line is largely considered to be one of its major team strengths . . . literally. Measuring in at an average of 6-feet-6 inches and over 310 pounds, the offensive line is built to plow the road for a successful running attack and protect the quarterback.

GOING LONG

BYU got some long plays going against the Bengals. The Cougars had six plays of 20 yards or more, including some of the longest plays of the year. JJ Di Luigi caught a 57-yard pass for BYU's longest play from scrimmage of the year. Running back Michael Alisa had a 42-yard touhchdown run, good for both the longest scoring play of the year and the longest run of the 2011 season.

THREE TIMES THREE

For the third-straight game BYU had three touchdown passes through the air. Riley Nelson connected with Cody Hoffman twice. Hoffman caught a 7-yard touchdown in the first half and followed it up with a 19-yard scoring reception in the second half. Wide receiver Ross Apo caught another touchdown, Nelson's first of the game on a 15-yard strike in the first guarter.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER

Running back Michael Alisa has been a late bloomer this season, most recently picking up 66 yards on the ground and one touchdown against Idaho State. After Alisa impressed with 91 yards against San Jose State, the sophomore running back proved it wasn't just a one time thing. Alisa led all running backs with 84 yards on the ground on 20 carries against Oregon State the next week and followed that up with his performance last week against the Bengals. In the last three games, Alisa has 241 yards on 44 carries, averaging 5.5 yards per carry since getting just three carries for two yards the previous five games.

BALANCED ATTACK

For the fourth-straight week BYU had a balanced attack, running the football for over 200 yards and passing for over 200 yards to beat Idaho State. The Cougars had eight different players combine to rush for a season-high 290 yards and four touchdowns and Riley Nelson and Jake Heaps combined to throw for 282 yards and three more touchdowns. The week before against Oregon State BYU rolled up 282 yards on the ground and 217 in the air. Against San Jose State, BYU was even more balanced, rushing for 224 yards and throwing for 219 yards and vs. Utah State, the Cougars used 251 passing yards and 200 rushing yards to beat the Aggies.

RUNNING BY COMMITTEE

It took eight different players to rack up the season-high 290 rushing yards vs. Idaho State. Michael Alisa led the way again with eight carries, 66 yards and one touchdown. He also had the team's longest run of the season of 42 yards. Quarterback Riley Nelson was next with seven rushes for 62 yards and a score while Josh Quezada added another rushing touchdown and 59 yards. JJ Di Luigi picked up 42 yards and one touchdown, David Foote had 30 yards and Bryan Kariya added 22. Running back Ryan Folsom chipped in five yards and quarterback Jake Heaps had four more yards on the ground.

ALWAYS IMPROVING

BYU has been steadily improving throughout the season. After a low point in the season and struggling against Utah, the Cougars have seen a jump in their offensive output. After Utah, BYU was ranked 118th nationally in rushing with 48 yards per game, and now sit at 58th with 159 yards per game. After the UCF game the Cougars had the 111th ranked total offense with 291.3 yards per game. Four games later BYU is ranked 64th at 391.3 yards per game. With four more regular-season games to go, the Cougars will have plenty of opportunities to improve.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE NOTES

GETTING OFFENSIVE

For the fourth-straight week the BYU offense improved its output. The Cougars churned out a season-high 572 yards of total offense. BYU rolled with 499 yards at Oregon State. Against San Jose State the Cougars picked up 446 yards and vs. Utah State the team used 451 total yards to beat the Aggies. Each game featured at least 200 rushing yards. In the past four games the Cougars have slowly improved their scoring as well, scoring 27, 29, 38 and 56 points.

GOING FOR A DRIVE

BYU's 99-yard touchdown drive vs. Idaho State was the longest of the 2011 season. The long drive ties the longest since a 99-yard drive vs. Utah State in 2006. BYU had a 97-yard scoring drive at Texas. The Cougars' game-winning drive against the Utah State Aggies was 96 yards officially, although the team actually had to go 98 yards. Quarterback Riley Nelson lost two yards on his first rush of the drive, pushing BYU all the way back to inside its own two yard line.

WIDE RECEIVER TWINS

BYU has a unique combination of size and speed in the receiving corps with Cody Hoffman and Ross Apo. Hoffman and Apo both weigh in at over 200 pounds and are 6-foot-4 and 6-foot 3, respectively. Against Idaho State both receivers ended up with a matching five catches for 71 yards. The difference was Hoffman caught two touchdowns while Apo caught one score. Apo did have the longer reception at 30 yards, however. Both receivers now have four touchdowns each for 2011. Hoffman leads the way in season totals with 33 catches for 491 yards but Apo is second on the team with 22 catches for 262 yards.

DI LUIGI DOES IT ALL

Senior running back JJ Di Luigi was named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List before the season began. The versatile back had 42 yards rushing on 6 carries and on touchdown vs. Idaho State. He also caught one pass for a season-long 57 yards. Di Luigi has averaged 65.6 total yards per game in 2011, contributing all over the field in the run game and catching passes out of the back field. The California native moved into 20th all-time at BYU in all-purpose yards and is 12th in career rushing yards. Here is how Di Luigi looks on the all-time lists and who he might pass in the coming weeks:

HOFFMAN KEEPS IT GOING

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman continues his streak, catching at least one pass in 14-straight games. The Crescent City, Calif. product had five catches for 71 yards and two touchdowns vs. Idaho State. Hoffman caught set career-highs at Oregon State with 9 receptions for 162 yards. He caught just one pass for eight yards against San Jose State. The redshirt sophomore caught four passes for 68 yards and one touchdown against Utah State. He grabbed three receptions for 24 yards against UCF. Hoffman finished with a team-high eight catches and 138 yards vs. Utah. He extends his streak to 14 games with at least one reception and 20 of 21 career games.

TIGHT ENDS STRONG

With the tight end position seeing a drop off last year, a revamped tight end crew is bringing the tight end back to a force in BYU's offense. After seven games of the season, the tight ends have accounted for 465 yards on 39 catches and three touchdowns.

The tight ends accounted for two catches and 28 yards vs. Idaho Stat. At Oregon State they had 30 yards on 3 catches including one touchdown. Against San Jose State the tight ends caught 4 passes for 82 yards and one touchdown. The game-winner against Utah State was caught by flext tight end Marcus Mathews and the tight ends accounted for eight receptions for 68 yards. Against UCF the tight ends caught five passes for 49 yards. Against Utah, the tight ends combined for six catches and 76 yards. At Texas, the they caught seven passes for 88 yards. The tight ends are consistently performing for the Cougar offense and are much more of a threat in 2011.

1,000 MILESTONES

Both of BYU's quarterbacks, Riley Nelson and Jake Heaps, reached milestones against Idaho State, Nelson for a career and Heaps for a season. Nelson's 215 passing yards put him over the 1,000 passing yard mark for his BYU career, totalling 1,137 yards now and 833 in 2011. Nelson became the 29th player in BYU history with 1,000 career passing yards.

Heaps entered the third quarter with 962 passing yards on the season, needing just 38 to push over the 1,000 mark for the season. Heaps completed 8 of 10 passes for 67 yards to give him 1,029 in 2011. Heaps has 3,345 passing yards in his BYU career.



2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL DEFENSIVE NOTES

SHUT DOWN D

The BYU defense played its best overall game of the season against Idaho State while holding the Bengals to three points and 20 yards rushing on 19 attempts. The 1.1 yard per carry average is the lowest for an entire game for the BYU defense this season and the 20 total rushing yards is the lowest total for a BYU opponent this season. The three points is also a best for the BYU defense this season and is the first time the Cougars have held an opponent to three points or less since defeating Wyoming 52-0 in 2009. The Cougars also held the Bengals to 232 passing yards on 60 attempts, a 3.8 yard-per-attempt average. The Bengals averaged 3.2 yards per play against the BYU defense.

PICKING MACHINE

Safety Daniel Sorensen returned an interception 30 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter against Idaho State. The pick was Sorensen's second interception of the season and the touchdown was the first of his career. Travis Uale and Jordan Johnson also each recorded an interception against the Bengals, giving the Cougars their first three interception game of 2011. The Cougars have now intercepted 11 passes this season.

STELLAR SOPHOMORE

Sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy blocked Idaho State's first punt attempt, marking the first time a Cougar has blocked a kick since the Colorado State game in 2009. Van Noy can now add a punt block to his long list of statistics collected in 2011. Van Noy currently has 36 total tackles, 24 unassisted tackles, 12 assisted tackles, 6.0 tackles-for-loss, 3.0 sacks, 1 forced fumble, 1 fumble recovery, 3 interceptions, 3 pass breakups and four quarterback hurries. Van Noy also recorded his second career touchdown this season after forcing and recovering a fumble against Ole Miss in the season opener.

BEHIND ENEMY LINES

BYU continued its streak of recording at least 5.0 TFL to four games against Idaho State. The Cougars spent the majority of the afternoon against the Bengals in the ISU backfield while recording a season best 9.0 TFL for a total loss of 44 yards. Kyle Van Noy led BYU with 3.0 TFL in the game. BYU recorded 7.0 TFL for a total loss of 22 yards against Oregon State one week prior to setting the season best mark against ISU. The Cougars recorded 5.0 TFL against the San Jose State and 6.0 against Utah State.

VAN NOY RECORD

With a fumble recovery for a touchdown against Ole Miss, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy became the first BYU player in history to return two fumbles for touchdowns. Van Noy is also the last Cougar defender to score two touchdowns since Derwin Gray returned two interceptions in 1990-91. The BYU touchdown record for a defender is three by both Mike Russell (1973-74) and Todd Shell (1980-81). Van Noy becomes the ninth Cougar overall to score at least two touchdowns.

TOP OF THE CLASS

The BYU defense currently ranks atop the FBS Independent standings in total defense, scoring defense, passing defense and rushing defense. BYU allows 340.5 yards per game, 33 yards less than the second place team, Notre Dame. The Cougars also rank atop the FBS Independent team rankings in tacklesfor-loss (45.0), interceptions (11), forced fumbles (9) and fumbles recovered (7). The top statistical ranking for the Cougars, however, is in the passes defended category. Thanks in large part to senior corner Corby Eason and his 11 pass breakups, the Cougars rank first in the category with 51 passes defended, 20 ahead of Notre Dame in second with 31.

TURNOVER STREAK

The Cougar defense has forced a turnover in 12 of their last 13 games dating back to the 2010 season. The only game in 2011 that BYU has failed to produce a turnover came against Utah State. The Cougars have forced a total of nine turnovers in the past three games against San Jose State, Oregon State and Idaho State.

DYNAMIC DUO

The outside linebacker duo of sophomore Kyle Van Noy and senior Jordan Pendleton accounted for 10 total tackles, five tackles-for-loss and four sacks against Idaho State. Each linebacker had two sacks and Van Noy had four tackles, three for loss, three guaterback hurries and a blocked punt. Pendleton led the Cougars with six total tackles.

FUMBLE RECOVERIES

After forcing and recovering two fumbles against Ole Miss, UCF and Oregon State, the Cougars are 4-0 in the last two seasons when recovering multiple fumbles. The Cougars forced and recovered two fumbles just once last season, in a 44-7 win versus Colorado State.

STUFFING THE RUN

BYU has held opposing offenses below 50 yards rushing in 10 halves so far this season, including both halves against Idaho State. The Cougars allowed only 20 yards rushing against the Bengals, a season low for the BYU defense. BYU also prevented Oregon State from gaining 50+ yards in either half, holding the Beavers to 33 and 26 yards, respectively. The performance against Oregon State came one week after the Cougars held San Jose State to 13 rushing yards on 12 carries in the first half, 1.1 yards per-carry average. The 1.1 average is the lowest for a BYU opponent in a half so far this season.

TURNOVER CITY

In eight games so far this season the BYU defense has forced 18 total turnovers. BYU is on pace to top its total of 23 turnovers gained from 2010, which they accured over the course of 13 games. The top game for the Cougars this season came against Oregon State when they picked off two passes and recovered two fumbles for a total of four turnovers. BYU forced three turnovers, all interceptions, in its most recent game against Idaho State.

COMING BACK STRONG

Senior linebacker Jordan Pendleton has missed significant parts of the past two seasons with major leg injuries. In 2011, Pendleton missed three straight games with ankle injuries before returning against San Jose State. Since coming back to the defense, BYU is 3-0 and Pendleton has recorded 7.0 tackles-for-loss and four sacks. Pendleton currently leads BYU in tackles-for-loss and sacks. He also has 26 tackles and two quarterback hurries this season.

CANADA CAN WAIT

After finishing his junior campaign with 37 tackles, including 6.5 for loss, senior Jadon Wagner was drafted by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats with the 44th overall pick of the 2011 Canadian Football League Draft.

A native of Cranbrook, British Columbia, Wagner chose to bypass the opportunity to play in the CFL in order to return to the Cougars for his senior season.

Wagner had the best game of his 2011 season against UCF when he recorded six total tackles, including four in the first quarter.

BEND BUT DON'T BREAK

In four of the last five games, the BYU passing defense has allowed quarterbacks to throw for 230 or more yards. BYU allowed Idaho State to throw for 232 yards but held the Bengals to 3.8 yards per attempt. The Cougars also picked off three passes against the Bengals. In the matchup against Oregon State, the Cougars allowed quarterback Sean Mannion to throw for 306 yards, the second time this season an opposing QB has gone for more than 300 yards against the Cougars. San Jose State finished with 255 yards against BYU and UCF threw for 318 yards. Desite the high yardage totals, each quarterback that has thrown for more than 230 yards against BYU this season has also thrown two interceptions. The Cougars are 4-0 in those games.

TROJANS BECOME COUGARS

Two new additions to the Bronco Mendenhall-led defense in 2011 are former USC standouts. Junior Uona Kaveinga and senior Hebron Fangupo made the trek from Los Angeles to Provo and have made an impact in each game this season.

Following the 2009 season, Kaveinga chose to transfer to BYU from USC. After sitting out the 2010 season due to NCAA transfer rules, Kaveinga has 34 tackles and three forced fumbles on the season. Fangupo has 5.5 tackles-for-loss in 2011, which ranks second on the team behind senior linebacker Jordan Pendleton.

COG IN THE MIDDLE

Despite missing one game due to injury, junior linebacker Brandon Ogletree is currently leading the BYU defense in total tackles, assisted tackles and unassisted tackles and ranks second on the team with two forced fumbles. Ogletree has 45 total tackles on the season, giving him an average of just over six tackles per game. As a sophomore, Ogletree saw significant action in 11 games and recorded 49 tackles on the season. Ogletree also forced two fumbles and recorded an interception against Oregon State. For his efforts against the Beavers, Ogletree received Honorable Metion Linebacker of the Week honors from the College Football Performance Awards.

DEFENSIVE SCORES

Safety Daniel Sorensen recorded his second interception of the season against Idaho State and took it 30 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter. The defensive touchdown was the second for BYU this season. Sophomore Kyle Van Noy also scored a defensive touchdown when he forced and recovered a fumble in the season opener against Ole Miss. The Cougars won both games in which the defense got in the end zone.

FRAZIER ON LOTT TROPHY WATCH LIST

BYU senior linebaker Jameson Frazier has been named to the 2011 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List.

Named after Pro Football Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott, The Lott Trophy is awarded to college football's Defensive IMPACT Player of the Year for excellent performance both on and off the field.

Frazier has 17 total tackles, 3.0 TFL, .5 sacks, two QBH and one fumble recovery so far this season.

FORMER GHANIAN SPRINTER AT LINEBACKER

Two years ago, no one foresaw junior Ezekiel Ansah lining up for the BYU football team. A freshman at the time, Ansah was recruited to BYU as a sprinter for the track and field team.

A native of Accra, Ghana, Ansah related well to BYU sprint coach Leonard Myles-Mills, also a Ghana native. Despite never playing a down of football in his life, Ansah saw action in six games on special teams and defensive line in 2010 and has played on special teams in every game of 2011. He has three tackles and one QBH this season.

SOMEONE FROM EVERYWHERE

The defensive two-deep hails from all corners of the country. Player home states include from Alaska, California, Georgia, Hawaii, Massachusetts, Nevada, Utah, Texas and Washington.

In addition, linebacker Jadon Wagner is from Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

FOR THE LONGEST TIME

Cody Hoffman's 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the third quarter was the first for a Cougar in more than 13 years, a streak that spanned 158 games. Mike Rigell was the last BYU returner to take a kickoff the distance with a 96-yard return in 1998 against Hawaii.

Hoffman's kickoff return was the first touchdown by a BYU special teams unit since McKay Jacobson took a punt return for a touchdown as a freshman in 2006.

For his performance, Hoffman was named the National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards.

DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung came to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

SPECIAL FLAG

In addition to the traditional team flag and alumni flag leading the team out of the tunnel before kick-off, BYU has also incorporated a special teams flag with an old school BYU logo this season.

Against Idaho State, junior Preston Hadley carried out the special teams flag.



LIMITED ACTION

The BYU punt team has not seen the field very often in the past three games, punting a total of three times in games against San Jose State, Oregon State and Idaho State. The punt team did not see the field against SJSU for the first time since BYU defeated Colorado State 49-10 in 2010. Riley Stephenson came on to punt just once against Oregon State and twice against Idaho State.

BIG TIME BLOCK

Early in the first quarter against Idaho State, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy blocked and recovered an Idaho State punt. The punt block was the first blocked kick for the Cougars so far this season. Van Noy charged off the right side of the line to get a hand on the kick and recovered the ball on the Idaho State 15-yard line. Quarterback Riley Nelson threw a touchdown pass to Ross Apo on the first BYU offensive play following the blocked punt.

ALL-PURPOSE

Sophomore wide receiver Cody Hoffman took a 93yard kickoff in for a touchdown against UCF, the first kickoff return for a touchdown since 1998 for the Cougars. As an all-purpose threat, Hoffman has led BYU in total yards in four of the last six games. Against Idaho State, Hoffman totaled 89 total yards, second to JJ Di Luigi for BYU, but recorded two touchdowns, Hoffman topped 200 total yards for the second time this season against Oregon State with 205 total yards. Against SJSU, Hoffman finished with 81 total yards, second on the team. Hoffman finished the game against UCF with a team high 153 total yards. Hoffman again led the Cougars in total yards against Utah State, with 158 total vards. The USU game marked the third consecutive game that Hoffman has led BYU in total yards. Against Utah, Hoffman had a career high 277 total vards to lead the team.

FIELD GOAL STREAK ENDS

Sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen hit field goals in six straight games for the Cougars before not attempting a field goal against Idaho State. The Idaho State game marked the first game this season in which Sorensen has not attempted a field goal and is only the second game, along with Ole Miss, in which he has not made a field goal. Sorensen has 10 field goals on the season and is 7-8 inside 40 yards. He is also 26-26 on PATs.

KICKING DOMINANCE

BYU currently ranks atop the FBS Independent team rankings in both punting and field goals. Punter Riley Stephenson averages 42.28 yards per punt, nearly three yards further than the second-place punter. Kicker Justin Sorensen leads all FBS Independent teams with 10 field goals and with his 71.4 success rate.

LEADING THE WAY

Sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen currently ranks 46th in the NCAA in field goals per game with 1.25. He has nailed a field goal in the first half in four of eight games this season and nailed two field goals in the second half against San Jose State. Sorensen is currently 10-14 on field goals this season, with a long of 48 yards. Sorensen has missed only one field goal inside of 40 yards this season and that came on his first attempt against Ole Miss, which was his first game as the regular field goal kicker for the Cougars. His only other game without a field goal came against Idaho State. He was 8 for 8 on PATs against the Bengals. Sorenson currently leads BYU with 56 points.

BRONCO MENDENHALL 7TH SEASON

During his six seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to six straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 56-21 (.727) record as he begins his seventh season to rank No. 16 in total wins among all teams in the nation during that span. The Cougars have received six straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first six teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in four of the last five seasons to become the first Cougar teams to win four bowls in a five-year span since LaVell Edwards teams did so from 1980-84. Nationally, BYU is one of only 11 programs to win four bowl games in the last five seasons.

In the last five years the Cougars have achieved a 50-15 record -- only eight teams

have more wins over that span. In fact, BYU is one of only seven FBS programs

to win 10 or more games during at least four of the last five seasons, and

BYU and Boise State are the only programs in the West to achieve that

(42 offense, 16 defense, 6 special teams, 1 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 39 top-15 statistical rankings, 29 top-10 rank- ings and 15 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during each of the past five seasons and finished ranked No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season and has totaled 185 selections during Mendenhall's tenure, along with 64 MWC Scholar-Athlete awards. BYU also ranks second nationally for Academic All-America recipients over the past three seasons. Six Cougar student-athletes have been named ESPN Academic All-Americans the past three years. Among all FBS schools only Penn State has had more during that period.

Going independent in 2011, BYU was consistently a top MWC contender under Mendenhall. BYU achieved a 39-9 (.813) conference record over the past six years to help the Cougars complete their 12-year tenure in the MWC with 64 conference wins — the most of any MWC school. Mendenhall also helped the Cougars bring bowl wins over Oregon, UCLA, Oregon State and UTEP as the program enters a new era as one of four independent schools, joining Notre Dame, Army and Navy.

Last year's BYU team achieved a 7-6 record and tied for third in the MWC at 5-3 while playing 19 freshmen and facing a schedule that featured eight bowl teams and four opponents that finished in final BCS Top 25 standings. Mendenhall took over defensive coordinator responsibilities after the teams 1-4 start and the team responded to become one of the top defensive teams over the final eight games.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff has six members who have played professional football. Assistant Head Coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in 2002 and played three years for the 49er's, while defensive line coach Steve Kaufusi and outside linebacker coach Kelly Poppinga played in the NFL with the Arizona Cardinals. Graduate assistant Shaun Nua also spent some time with the Pittsburgh Steelers. In addition, receivers coach Ben Cahoon spent 13 years with the Candian Football League's Montreal Alouettes before retiring as the CFL's all-time receptions leader.

In addition, Poppinga and Nua are both Super Bowl champions; Poppinga won a ring with the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII while Nua earned his in the Steelers' Super Bowl XL victory. Cahoon also won the ultimate prize in the CFL by leading the Montreal to three Grey Cup championships in 2002, 2009 and 2010.

THE NEW GUYS

The BYU coaching staff welcomed two new members this past offseason in running backs coach Joe DuPaix and receivers coach Ben Cahoon.

DuPaix most recently coached at Navy for the past three seasons, helping led the Midshipmen to three bowl bids. In each of his three seasons, Navy was one of the top-6 rushing programs in the country, including an NCAA-best 293.4 ypg in 2008. A Salt Lake City native, DuPaix played under his father, Roger, a successful high school coach at Skyline who also coached current BYU offensive coordinator Brandon Doman in high school. DuPaix played quarterback at Snow College (Ephraim, UT) and Southern Utah where he set the FCS record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a season.

Cahoon retired in after the 2010 season as the all-time receptions leader in CFL history. Cahoon also set records for most receiving yards in a career in Grey Cup games and most touchdowns by an Alouette in addition to earning the CFL Most Outstanding Candian Award in 2002 and 2003. A native of Orem, Utah, Cahoon was an All-WAC performer in addition to being an Academic All-American. He is also the son-in-law of current Utah Governor Gary Herbert.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,470-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. With additional wheelchair access created in 2010-11, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63,470 beginning with the 2011 season.

"FAN"TASTIC FANS

The attendance at the BYU vs. Utah game was 63,742 - the first sellout for Edwards Stadium since last season's home opener against Washington. A sellout crowd of 63,513 also watched BYU's win over Utah State. In 2010, BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sellouts at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The prior time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWDS

In 2009. BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah in 2009 is currently 10th with 64,301 fans attending the game. In 2010, BYU averaged 61,380 fans per home game.



HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. Last season, BYU averaged 30.0 points per game at home. The Cougars have not had a negative points per game margin for the past seven seasons, including all six years of head coach Bronco Mendenhall's tenure. In 2006, a 35.16-point differential was a BYU record in scoring margin in the stadium's 46-year history and the program's 86-year history:
