OPPONENT NOTES

OKLAHOMA STATE

Oklahoma State is ranked in one poll despite a 4-4 overall record. The Cowgirls have three players batting .360 or above but have just four extra base hits as a team. Simone Freeman leads OK State with a 1.75 ERA and 2-2 record.

PACIFIC

Pacific is 2-5 this season with three losses coming against ranked opponents. Its last defeat against BYU's fellow WAC member Nevada came after the Tigers gave up six runs with two outs in the bottom of the seventh. Nikki Armagost easily leads Pacific in both hitting and pitching with a .409 batting average and a 1.56 ERA.

FLORIDA

W W W L Florida is ranked No. 1 and No. 3, respectively in the two major softball polls and is 9-0 to begin the season. Seven of Florida's wins have been by eight runs or more but the Gators have been largely untested until this weekend when they will face Texas A&M and No. 5 Washington before going up against BYU. The two schools have never met in softball. The Gators are hitting an outstanding .407 as a team and are led by Brittany Schutte, last week's National Player of the Week. Schutte is batting .560 with 14 hits, 14 runs, 12 RBI, seven walks, three doubles and two home runs on the season. Pitcher Hannah Rogers has not allowed an earned run in 23.2 innings pitched, racking up a 5-0 record. As a team, Florida has a 0.82 ERA with five shutouts.

TEXAS A&M

After defeating the Aggies in their second game of the season, the Cougars will look to beat a ranked Texas A&M team again and extend its win streak over the Aggies to five. In 2010, BYU defeated the Aggies twice to begin the current streak. They are currently on a five-game win streak after sweeping a tournament at home last weekend. The Aggies have defeated No. 9 Stanford and No. 8 Arizona already this year and are led by Lindsey Sisk who has a 1.26 ERA and 4-1 record, her only loss coming against the Cougars.

LONG ISLAND

BYU will play the Blackbirds for the second time and the first since 2005 in its final game of the Classic. Long Island has struggled this season and is 1-9 while batting just .160 as a team. Pitcher Sarah Reynolds has a respectable ERA of 2.89 but is 1-5 on the year. Two players on the Long Island roster lead the team with six hits on the year. Opponents have also stolen 26 bases in 26 tries against LIU while the Blackbirds have just a single stolen base in four attempts.

LAS VEGAS & HENDERSON, Nev. - The BYU softball team finished with a 4-1 record at the Louisville Slugger Desert Classic, winning its first four against Portland State, Cal State Northridge, Memphis and Indiana before falling to DePaul.

An eight-strikeout performance from junior Hannah Howell and a two-run homer by Delaney Willard helped the Cougars defeat Portland State, 4-1 on Thursday.

On Friday, BYU easily handled Cal State Northridge in six innings, winning 11-1 behind an 11-run fourth inning, the second most runs scored by a Cougar team in a single inning in program history. In the second game of the day, BYU again ran away from its opponent, leading Memphis by as many as 10 runs before winning 14-8.

Saturday's contests were much tougher, with BYU needing a thrilling comeback in the bottom of the seventh inning against Indiana to extend its win streak to six. With one on and two out for the Cougars, BYU batters drew two walks and a hit by pitch to bring in one run and load the bases before senior Jessica Dugas laced a single down the left field line to bring in the game-tying and game-winning runs.

The Cougars seemed to run out of gas in the final game of the week, getting outhit 12-4 against the Blue Demons. BYU tied the game at 2-2 in the top of the fifth inning, but DePaul answered with four runs in the bottom of the fifth to pull away.

HOME RUN HITTER

BYU's Delaney Willard hit has hit a home run in seven of the Cougars' first 10 games, including a streak of four-straight games from Feb. 11-17. Willard also hit a home run in four straight in early April last year. The two marks tie the senior for the third-longest such streak in NCAA history and make her the only person in NCAA history to have two streaks of four games or more in a career.

Former BYU outfield Stephanie Platt Hopkins is the only other Cougar with four consecutive games with a home run, accomplishing the feat in April 2008, her junior year.

SCORING ALL AT ONCE

Playing Cal State Northridge on Feb. 17, the Cougars scored all of their 11 runs in the fourth inning, giving them their second-highest run total in team history for a single inning. The BYU record for most runs in an inning is 12 at Southern Utah on March 25, 2008.

UNBEATABLE AT HOME

The Cougars have the second-longest home win streak in the country, having won 21 straight games, at Miller Field, including a 14-0 record last season. BYU has won 11 straight at home against conference opponents and 34 straight against non-conference foes.

GETTING OUT EARLY

The Cougars have won two games in less than seven innings so far this season due to the mercy rule, defeating UCSB 12-4 in six innings and Cal State Northridge 11-1 in six. In 2011, BYU had 11 such games but did not get its first until an 8-0 win against Cleveland State 25 games into the season.

WIN STREAKS

The Cougars have compiled 30 win streaks of five games or more in program history, including their streaks of 12 and 11 games in 2011, the first time in school history a team has had two double-digit win streaks in the same season. In 2010, BYU matched a season high with five such streaks, tying the 2005 Cougars. BYU set a program-high streak of 16 consecutive wins in both 2007 and 2009.

COUGARS EARN VOTES IN TOP 25 POLLS

PROVO, Utah - The BYU softball team earned votes in both the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate and USA Today/NFCA Division I Top 25 preseason polls released today. The Cougars garnered eight votes and one vote, respectively, in the polls.

In addition, the Cougars' 2012 schedule inclues nine schools ranked or receiving votes in the ESPN. com poll and 11 schools in the USA Today rankings. Top programs BYU will face this season include defending national champion and No. 1/1 Arizona St. (Mar. 15), No. 4/2 Florida (Feb. 24), No. 11/16 Oregon (Feb. 11), No. 15/17 Texas A&M (Feb. 10, Feb. 24) and No. 16/11 Oklahoma St. (Feb. 23).

With eight votes in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate poll, BYU would be tied for No. 29 if the poll were to be extended while its one vote in the USA Today/NFCA Division I poll would place the Cougars tied at No. 39.

BYU is coming off a 40-18 record in 2010. Head coach Gordon Eakin won Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Cougars to their third-straight conference title and seventh-straight NCAA Regional.

Playing in the Western Athletic Conference this season, BYU returns three All-MWC honorees, including senior Jessica Dugas, junior JC Clayton and sophomore Carly Duckworth.

BYU ANNOUNCES MOVE TO PCSC IN 2013

PORTLAND, Ore. – Brigham Young University has accepted an invitation to join the Pacific Coast Softball Conference, PCSC Commissioner Ellen Moore announced Monday. The Cougars' first year in the PCSC will be the 2013 softball season. The addition of BYU will give the PCSC seven teams for the 2013 campaign.

"The Pacific Coast Softball Conference is excited to formally welcome Brigham Young University softball into the PCSC family," said Moore. "In BYU, we have added an institution with a strong academic reputation, a tradition of excellence in athletics -- specifically softball -- and a loyal and supportive community of fans. We are thrilled to have them on board and can't wait for them to join us on the field in 2013.

"On behalf of the PCSC and our member institutions, I extend a very warm welcome to Coach Gordon Eakin and the BYU Cougars!"

The PCSC will have 12 teams for the upcoming 2012 season. The Big Sky Conference will begin sponsoring softball in 2013, meaning the PCSC's Big Sky core-members Idaho State, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Weber State will leave the PCSC after this season. Seattle University will also be leaving the PCSC for the Western Athletic Conference following the 2012 campaign.

Brigham Young was an original member of the Mountain West Conference, when the conference formed in 1999. The Cougars left the MWC this past summer, playing as an NCAA FBS Independent in football with the majority of its other sports joining the West Coast Conference. While the WCC does not sponsor softball, the Cougars will play the 2012 season in the WAC before joining fellow WCC members Loyola Marymount, San Diego, Saint Mary's and Santa Clara in the PCSC.

"We are grateful to have found a conference home in the Pacific Coast Softball Conference for our excellent softball team," said BYU director of athletics Tom Holmoe. "The PCSC provides an opportunity for Coach Eakin and his team to strengthen the national status they have earned during his tenure. The PCSC membership includes West Coast Conference partners with whom we hope to build a great softball conference."

Under Eakin, the Cougars have been the preeminent program of the Mountain West Conference. Eakin has guided BYU to a 371-160 record in nine years as head coach, with five Mountain West Conference titles. The Cougars went 40-18 en route to claiming their third consecutive conference title and seventh straight 40-win season. BYU has also made seven consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and advanced to the NCAA Super Regional in 2010.

"Our coaching staff and team are excited to have a new home in the PCSC," Eakin said. "The PCSC has high quality coaching staffs and I have no doubt their programs will provide tough competition and push us to improve. We are also thrilled with the new venues and the great West Coast weather they provide. We look forward to being an active partner in strengthening and moving forward the PCSC."

The PCSC was founded in the fall of 2002 when six members from the WAC, Western Intercollegiate Softball League and the Big West came together. The conference officially came into existence when it was approved by the NCAA on Oct. 17, 2002. The original members were Loyola Marymount, Portland State, Sacramento State, Saint Mary's, Santa Clara and San Diego.

The PCSC expanded to 12 teams in October 2008 with the addition of CSU Bakersfield, Idaho State, Northern Colorado, Seattle, Utah Valley and Weber State.

UNSUNG SENIOR

Senior Stacie Toney has quietly put up big numbers for the Cougars this year at the plate while also transitioning from first base where she played last season to catcher in BYU's last few games. Toney leads BYU with five multi-hit games, including four this past weekend at the Desert Classic, going 2 for 3, 2 for 2, 3 for 4 and 2 for 3, respectively, in the Cougars' first four games.

Against Memphis, Toney hit a single in her first at bat, then sent her second career home run over the fence in the third inning, a 3-run shot that opened up a 6-1 lead over the Tigers. In the fifth inning, Toney reached on a fielder's choice and eventually scored a run in the fifth inning, then hit an RBI single with the bases loaded for another RBI.

Toney, who is one of two players on the roster to get married this past summer, is second on the team with a .458 batting average and is second with three doubles, six RBI and 17 total bases with a .709 slugging percentage.

FRESHMAN PHENOM

Freshman pitcher Caroline Umphlett has begun her collegiate career on a hot streak by starting the season 4-0 with one save. The Elizabeth City, N.C., native has allowed one earned run or fewer in nine of 10 appearances and allowed just two earned runs in the other. Umphlett was also one pitch away from a possible perfect game against Cal State Northridge, allowing a home run on her only hit allowed in the win while giving up no walks.

Against UC Santa Barbara, Umphlett gave up just one earned run and one walk in 5.0 innings while collecting a career high eight strikeouts against the Gauchos. Finally, Umphlett was the pitcher of record in both of BYU's wins over ranked opponents this year, defeating No. 15 Texas A&M in the first start of her career before earning the win in relief against No. 11 Oregon the following day at the Kajikawa Classic.

CONSISTENT CLAYTON

Junior JC Clayton currently has the second-best career batting average in BYU history at .398 and has picked up where she left off last season. Clayton is currently on a five-game hit streak and recorded two hits in four of BYU's five games last weekend. In a win over Memphis, Clayton tied a career high with four runs scored while hitting the Cougars' first triple of the season, drawing two walks and stealing a base. In addition to her hitting, Clayton is currently No. 11 on the Cougar career stolen base list.

EAKIN, ALVEY NAMED TO USA COACHES POOL

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 1, 2011) - BYU head coach Gordon Eakin and associate head coach Vaughn Alvey were both selected to the USA Softball Women's National Team Coaching pool.

Eakin and Alvey are two of 24 coaches who may be selected as assistant coaches for the Women's and Junior Women's National team events this summer. BYU is the only school to have two coaches in the pool.

"We are thrilled to have a great cross section of coaches for the Women's National team program for the next two years," said ASA and USA Softball Executive Director Ron Radigonda. "With the ISF change of World Championships every two years, we are excited to assist coaches in gaining international experience and opportunities."

The placement is a stamp of approval for Eakin, who was the USA National Team hitting coach last summer. In 2010, Eakin helped the USA win tournaments around the world, including the World Championship in Venezuela and the World Cup in Oklahoma.

A two-time Mountain West Coach of the Year, Eakin has led the Cougar softball program since 2003, compiling a 331-142 (.700) record and the highest winning percentage in MWC history.

Alvey, BYU's top assistant and pitching coach for the last eight seasons, was selected to the coaching pool for the first time. At BYU, Alvey has coached Paige Affleck and Christie Zinanti, two of the most accomplished pitchers in BYU history, helping the Cougars win four conference championships in the last six years.

Alvey is a member of the Utah Sports Hall of Fame and coached at Alta High in Utah for 17 seasons, leading the Hawks to eight state titles. He also coaches girls summer programs, winning the AFA National Championship in 1992.





BYU HEAD COACH GORDON EAKIN

BYU head coach Gordon Eakin is entering his 10th season as the Cougars' head coach and his 13th season at BYU overall.

Eakin was named head coach in July 2002 after working as an assistant coach since the softball program's inception in 2000. Since that time he has led the Cougars to five Mountain West Conference championships and seven NCAA tournament appearances.

The MWC Coach of the Year three-straight years (2009, 2010, 2011) Eakin has coached eight All-Americans, seven MWC Players of the Year, three MWC Freshmen of the Year and two MWC Pitchers of the Year during his tenure.

In 2011, Eakin led BYU to its third-straight MWC championship and seventh-consecutive NCAA Regional berth as the Cougars finished with a 40-18 record. In 2010, Eakin guided the Cougars to 46 wins, the most in school history, as BYU advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time ever with wins over East Carolina and host Texas before ending its season at national runner-up Arizona.

Known as one of the best hitting coaches in the country, Eakin helped the Cougars finish 13th in scoring and 30th in batting average last season and second in the country in batting average, seventh in scoring and ninth in slugging percentage in 2010. Overall BYU has finished in the top-ten nationally in slugging percentage six times, home runs per game six times, batting average four times and scoring four times under Eakin.

In addition to his duties at BYU, Eakin has also been an assistant coach and the hitting coach for the USA National Team since 2009. In the summer of 2010, Eakin helped guide the National Team to a 17-2 record as USA won the World Championship in Venezuela, the World Cup in Oklahoma and the Japan Cup championship in Sendai, Japan.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Eakin was a successful baseball and softball player. After playing collegiate baseball at the University of Utah, Eakin signed with the Oakland Athletics organization where he played for three years.

Eakin went on to join the United States All-Star team, playing in three U.S. Olympic sports festivals in 1986, 1993 and 1994, winning bronze, silver and gold, respectively. While on the team, Eakin was honored on the ISC All-World First Team and was an ASA All-American.

He would later go on to play shortstop on the internationally ranked Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch team, eventually earning induction into the Utah Fast Pitch Hall of Fame in 1998.

Eakin is a native of Holladay, Utah, and graduated from Granite High. He currently resides in Sandy, Utah, and is married to Barbi. They are the parents of three children (Alicia, Ryan & Parker) and have four grandsons.

WILLARD NAMED WAC HITTER OF THE WEEK

DENVER – BYU softball's Delaney Willard and Hawai'i's Stephanie Ricketts have been named the Verizon Western Athletic Conference Hitter and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for Feb. 6-12. This is the first-ever honor for Willard and the first of the season and eighth overall for Ricketts.

Willard, a senior right fielder from Camarillo, Calif., led the Cougars to a 3-2 record at the Kajikawa Classic last week, including wins over No. 15 Texas A&M and No. 11 Oregon. She was 9-for-17 (.529) with three home runs, two doubles, nine RBI, six runs scored and a 1.235 slugging percentage. Willard had a career-high four hits vs. Texas State and scored four runs against UC Santa Barbara, tying a BYU record. She also drove in all five of BYU's runs in Thursday's games and totaled 21 total bases on the week, an average of more than four per game.

Ricketts, a senior from San Jose, Calif., picked up three complete-game wins during opening weekend en route to Most Valuable Pitcher honors at the Paradise Classic. She posted a 1.33 ERA, allowing four runs in 21.0 innings of work. She also had 24 strikeouts and only five walks on the week. Against DePaul, she fired a two-hit shutout and faced just two batters over the minimum, retiring 17 batters in a row from the first through the sixth innings. It marked the 24th shutout of her career and first of the season.

BYU TABBED 4TH IN WAC PRESEASON POLL

DENVER – The Western Athletic Conference softball coaches have picked the BYU softball team to finish fourth and Fresno State to win the 2012 WAC regular-season crown.

In addition, senior Jessica Dugas and sophomore Carly Duckworth were named to the preseason All-WAC team. Both players earned All-Mountain West Conference honors following the 2011 season.

In its first season as members of the WAC, the Cougars earned one first-place vote and 35 points. Fresno State took the top spot in the preseason poll with 44 points and three first-place votes. Hawai'i came in second, picking up two first-place votes and 42 points, followed by New Mexico State in third place with 37 points and two first-place votes. Nevada was picked to finish fifth with 20 points, followed by San Jose State and Louisiana Tech tied for sixth with 17 points apiece. Utah State rounded out the poll in eighth place with 12 points.

BYU took the MWC championship each of the last three seasons and has played in the NCAA tournament every year since 2005.
