WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- BYU and Hawai'i are meeting for the 28th time in school history and the first time since 2002. The last time the Cougars traveled to Honolulu, Hawai'i, the Warriors ended BYU's hopes of an undefeated season with a 72-45 win in 2001. BYU played at Aloha Stadium seven-consecutive years from 1984-90.
- BYU and Hawaii have scheduled a multi-year series between the two schools that was announced earlier this year.
- BYU boasts nine players from Hawai'i, including regulars Travis Uale (Sr., DB), Graham Rowley (So., DL) and Simote Vea (Sr., DL).
- Under head coach Bronco Mendenhall, BYU has a 5-2 record in the month of December including 1-0 in non-bowl games (48-27 win at SDSU in 2007). Overall, BYU has a 7-5 record in regular season December games.
- The Cougars are 4-0 against WAC teams this year after defeating Utah State, San Jose State, Idaho and New Mexico State.

SENIORS SHINE IN WIN OVER NEW MEXICO ST

PROVO, Utah - On Senior Night, the BYU football team overpowered the New Mexico State Aggies for a 42-7 win at LaVell Edwards Stadium on Saturday.

Quarterback Jake Heaps completed 21 of 36 passes for 238 yards and tied a career-high with four touchdowns. Three seniors, Matt Marshall, Matthew Edwards and Bryan Kariya, scored touchdowns and BYU (8-3) held New Mexico State (4-7, 2-3) to just 249 total yards, a season low for the Aggies.

"I think it was the team's strongest performance, collectively," head coach Bronco Mendenhall said. "The offense has been very explosive. Jake managed the game well and it was just another strong showing. My team continues to improve."

Senior linebacker Jadon Wagner forced a fumble and recovered another fumble in addition to four tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and one sack. Defensive back Preston Hadley tied for a team-high with seven tackles to go along with two pass breakups. Linebacker Brandon Ogletree also had seven tackles.

"I think we're improving and I think we have a very good football team," Mendenhall said. "I'm anxious to play whoever is left on our schedule and who ever we can play at the highest level. We continue to gain momentum and play better football."

On the Aggies first drive of the game, Wagner got a big hit on New Mexico State's quarterback and forced a fumble that was recovered by senior linebacker Jameson Frazier at the BYU 48-yard line. The Cougars capitalized on the takeaway with a 4-yard touchdown run from Kariya at the end of the drive to take a 7-0 lead with 5:38 left in the first quarter.

After Heaps threw an interception, the Aggies were able to find the end zone on a 3-yard pass to even up the score at 7-7 with 9:40 left in the second quarter.

BYU went ahead 14-7 with a 15-play, 90-yard touchdown drive. Heaps hit Apo on a short pass in the flat and Apo did the rest, taking it 20 yards into the end zone for the score with 3:25 left in the second quarter.

Apo caught his second touchdown pass three minutes later. JD Falslev returned a punt 17 yards to set the Cougars up with a short 46-yard field. To complete the drive, Heaps connected with Apo for a 9-yard gain and the freshman receiver stretched for the goal line and got the touchdown. BYU took the 21-7 lead into the break.

Apo's two-touchdown game was the first of his career. The redshirt freshman finished with 66 yards receiving on five receptions. Falslev added a career-high 42 yards receiving.

Two Cougar seniors with limited playing time were able to score touchdowns down the stretch for the Cougars. Matt Marshall, primarily the holder on field goals took over at quarterback in the wildcat formation and ran for a 2-yard touchdown. Tight end Matthew Edwards, the grandson of legendary BYU coach LaVell Edwards, caught a 9-yard touchdown pass from Heaps to give BYU a 35-7 lead with 3:14 left in the third quarter.

Heaps picked up his fourth touchdown pass of the game when he hooked up with Falslev on a 27-yard strike over the middle of the field. The Cougars took a 42-7 lead with 7:30 remaining and held New Mexico State scoreless the rest of the way.

NEW MEXICO STATE GAME NOTES

SENIOR MATTS GET TOUCHDOWNS

Senior tight end Matthew Edwards scored the first touchdown of his career on the first reception of his career off a 9-yard pass late in the third quarter. Senior Matt Marshall also scored the first TD of his career on the first rush of his career – a 2-yard run off a direct snap in the same quarter.

FIRST TIME'S A CHARM

Along with New Mexico State, BYU has played two other opponents (Ole Miss & UCF) for the first time ever this year and has a record of 3-0 against those teams.

JAKE DELIVERS

Sophomore quarterback Jake Heaps threw four touchdowns against the Aggies to tie a career high. Heaps also had four TD throws last season against Colorado State and UTEP. It is the first game Heaps has thrown a touchdown to three different receivers.

DOUBLE TAKE

Freshman Ross Apo scored two touchdowns in the first half giving him the first multi-TD game of his career. Apo leads BYU with seven receiving touchdowns and has caught at least one TD in six games this year.

KICKOFF CODY

With 60 yards on two kickoff returns, Cody Hoffman passed Austin Collie for third on the BYU season kickoff return yardage list and John Betham for third on the BYU season kick return list.

WIN FOR THE SENIORS

BYU has won its last six home season finales, three of which have come against a school from the state of New Mexico.

KEEP 'EM COMING

BYU has won 28 of its last 29 games at LaVell Edwards Stadium when scoring 24 points or more.

PASSED BY

New Mexico State's first quarter TD was only the second blue zone passing touchdown allowed by the Cougar defense this season

SENIOR FUMBLE

Senior linebacker Jameson Frazier's fumble recovery was the Cougars' eighth of the season after senior linebacker Jadon Wagner forced the ball loose. Frazier also recovered a fumble against UCF earlier this year while Wagner's forced fumble was the first of his career. A third senior, Bryan Kariya, scored a touchdown on BYU's ensuing drive.

HONOR YOUR ELDERS

BYU sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy wore jersey #1 in honor of senior linebacker Jordan Pendleton who suffered a careerending injury against TCU earlier this season. Van Noy totaled six tackles (all solo) with three quarterback hurries and two TFL.

THE BYU VS. HAWAII SERIES

This is the 28th meeting between BYU and Hawaii. The Cougars hold a 19-8 advantage over the Warriors. The last time BYU and Hawaii met was in 2002 when the Cougars defeated the Warriors 35-32 in 2002. Despite being outgained 455 to 394, BYU picked off Hawaii four times and came away with the victory. The last time the Cougars travelled to Hawaii, the Warriors handled BYU 72-45 in an offensive shootout. Hawaii amassed 646 offense while BYU had 612. The Warriors won the turnover battle 7-5 and took control for the win, snapping BYU's 14-game win streak and undefeated season in the last regular season game.

HAWAII LAST TIME

HONOLULU - The University of Hawai'i Warrior football team picked up a 35-23 victory over Tulane, Saturday night in a non-conference game at Aloha Stadium.

Freshman David Graves making his first career start, finished 21-of-38 for 260 yards and two touchdowns while rushing for 57 yards and another score. He gave way to Shane Austin at the end of the third quarter and the senior completed 9-of-10 passes for 98 yards and led the Warriors to the game-sealing touchdown drive.

Freshman wide receiver Trevor Davis was the recipient of both of Graves' touchdown passes while running back Joey losefa rushed for 59 yards and two scores.

Midway through the first quarter, the Green Wave (2-11) tied the score at 7 with an 11-yard touchdown run by Albert Williams. But the Warriors wasted no time with the help of a 43-yard circus catch by Billy Ray Stutzmann. One play later, on a quarterback draw play, Graves scrambled 15 yards to put UH ahead 14-7.

The Green Wave answered right back driving 68 yards on 13 plays, capped by a one-yard run by Orleans Darkwa, to tie the score. But Graves and the Warriors responded with a 12-play drive of their own, covering 74 yards and culminating with losefa's first of two TDs.

UH opened the second half with another touchdown drive. Graves accounted for all 66 yards, including a 29yard scamper during the drive, which ended on Graves' 12-yard pass to Davis.

With the ball at the UH 2-yard line, losefa fumbled in the end zone and recovered by lineman Brett Leonard for a safety.

After UH's free kick went out of bounds, the Green Wave took over at midfield and drove the field capped by Darkwa's second rushing touchdown of the game, pulling Tulane to within 28-23.

RIVALRY RENEWED

Throughout the 1980s and '90s, BYU and Hawaii had a fierce rivalry that was often one of the highlights of the season for both teams. The Cougars won 10 in a row from 1978 to 1988, including 1984's classic 18-13 win. The game was highlighted by BYU's Kyle Morrell leaping over both BYU's defensive line and Warriors' offensive line to stop Hawaii's quarterback Raphel Cherry on a sneak at the goal line preventing a touchdown in the fourth quarter. The Warriors took three of the next four but BYU came back to win six-straight before Hawaii stomped the Cougars 72-45 in 2001 at Aloha Stadium.

ALOHA COMFORTABLE

Most teams play better at home than they do on the road, it is just a fact. Hawaii is an extreme case of this over the last few years. Due to extensive travel it is understandable but the Warriors are clearly a better team in the comforts of Aloha Stadium. This year, Hawaii is 4-2 at home and 2-4 on the road. More telling is the scoring difference between home and the road. At home the Warriors are outscoring their opponents 37.0 to 24.5 as opposed to the road where opponents outscore them 31.7 to 27.8. Over the last 10 years, Hawaii has averaged 6 wins at home and just over 2 on the road. The Warriors have outscored opponents 39-28 at home over the last decade and been outscored on the road 33-28.

BRONCO AND BOWLS

Head coach Bronco Mendenhall has BYU to at least six wins again for the seventh consecutive year. He is currently one of only four FBS coaches to have his team bowl eligible in his first seven seasons along with Oklahoma's Bob Stoops, Georgia's Mark Richt and Utah's Kyle Whittingham. During Mendenhall's tenure, BYU is 4-2 with five trips to the Las Vegas Bowl and last year's trip to the New Mexico Bowl and a 52-24 victory over UTFP

BYU VS. BCS AQS

With the victories over Ole Miss of the SEC and Oregon State of the Pac-12, BYU has defeated at least one team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference six-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 15 of the past 16 years dating back to 1996. BYU is 2-2 vs. BCS schools this season.

With its win against Oregon State, the Cougars have also defeated a Pac-12 team team each of the last six years.

HOME COOKIN'

Head coach Bronco Mendenhall has often emphasized the importance of winning at home. Since taking the reigns of the program, BYU is 35-7 at home. The Cougars are 6-1 this year at home and last season BYU was 5-1 at LaVell Edwards Stadium. Mendenhall and the Cougars won 18-straight games in Provo from 2006-09.

JUST TWO, NOT FIVE

The Cougars played two games in the month of November, with a bye week before the Idaho game and another one before this week's matchup with Hawaii. The last time BYU had just two games in a month (not including December and bowl games) was in October of 2007 when the Cougars had a bye week leading up to a game at UNLV, played Eastern Washington at home the week following and then took another week off before their next game. The Cougars went 2-0 in those games, defeating UNLV 24-14 and Eastern Washington 42-7. BYU also beat Idaho 42-7 after its first bye week.

Interestingly enough, another parallel of 2007 and 2011 and monthly game oddities - BYU played five games in the month of September in both seasons as well. In 2007 the Cougars went 3-2 to match 2011's September effort of 3-2.

BELL HELICOPTER ARMED FORCES BOWL

For the seventh-straight season, BYU is bowl eligible and has recently accepted an invitation to the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl. In fact, head coach Bronco Mendenball is one of only four Division I head coaches to this point to have his team bowl eligible in his first seven seasons as a head coach. Mendenhall is 4-2 in bowl games, most recently picking up a dominating 52-24 win over UTEP in the 2010 New Mexico Bowl. With this being the first year of independence for the football program, unique bowl scenarios had to be worked out, and this year the Cougars have struck a deal with the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl. Now that BYU is bowl eligible, the team will be headed to Dallas, Tex., for a matchup against a team selected from Conference USA. The game is scheduled for Dec. 30 at Ford Stadium in Dallas-Fort Worth. The game will be televised on ESPN. DON'T HASSLE THE HOFF

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman has become the playmaking receiver even though he got off a to a slow start. Hoffman caught just three passes for 20 yards in the first two games but for the season now has caught 45 passes for 698 yards and six touchdowns. He has made play after play recently and has averaged 134.5 all-purpose yards. He has set career game highs in receptions, yards, kick returns and all-purpose yards in various games this season. Hoffman has been especially dangerous as a kick returner. He has 778 kick return yards on the season, including a 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, the first by a BYU player since 1998.

OH, HE PLAYS FOOTBALL, TOO

Running back Bryan Kariya has been an asset or the BYU ground game for the last several years. He has also been an asset in the classroom. Kariya was just named to the Capital One All-Academic District 8 Team. With a 3.9 GPA and a major in Chinese with a minor in business, Kariya plans to head out to dental school after his BYU career is over. Last season, Kariya was the only Division I running back named Academic All-American by ESPN. Kariya leads the team in rushing touchdowns with five and has 64 carries for 247 yards. Kariya also has 12 catches for 84 yards and one touchdown.

ALWAYS IMPROVING

BYU has been steadily improving throughout the season. After a low point in the season and struggling against Utah, the Cougars have seen a jump in their offensive output. After Utah, BYU was ranked 118th nationally in rushing with 48 yards per game, and now sit at No. 52 with 165.7 yards per game. After the UCF game the Cougars had the 111th ranked total offense with 291.3 yards per game. six games later BYU is ranked 45th at 400.0 yards per game. Scoring has also improved as well, going from 18.2 points per game to 29.6 points per game. With two games to go, the Cougars will have plenty of opportunities to improve.

1,000/1,000 CLUB

BYU now has two members in its 1,000 career receiving yards and 1,000 career kickoff return yards. Cody Hoffman joins Austin Collie as the only two players to reach the mark. Hoffman now has 1,225 career receiving yards to go along with 1,158 career kickoff return yards. Hoffman has 45 catches for 698 yards and six touchdowns to go along with 778 kickoff return yards and one touchdown. Collie is BYU's career receiving yards leader with 3,255 yards and fourth in career kickoff return yards with 1,277 yards.

ONE OF EACH

JD Falslev's punt return for a touchdown gave BYU a kick and punt return touchdown in the same season for the first time since 1996. Cody Hoffman's returned a kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown vs. UCF earlier this season. During the '96 season returner James Dye did both, returned two different punts for touchdowns, one from 79 yards at Utah State and another from 67 yards out vs. Rice. Dye also took a kickoff 100 yards for a score against UTEP during the '96 season.

HE'S KIND OF A BIG DEAL

Senior captain and offensive tackle Matt Reynolds is amidst a successful senior season after deciding not to enter the NFL draft despite a first round projection. Reynolds has been rewarded with several preseason accolades, including being named a preseason All-American by by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, CBSCollegeSports.com, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others. Along with those honors, Reynolds has recognized as an Outland Trophy Candidate, a Lombardi Award Candidate and a Lowe's Senior Class Award Nominee.

MCKAY AND HIS QB'S

Wide receiver McKay Jacobson has had the luxury of having a top-notch quarterback be around him for almost all of his football career. While he currently has the promising sophomore Jake Heaps and gritty junior Riley Nelson, he has caught passes at BYU from NFL quarterbacks Max Hall and John Beck. Even at the high school level, Jacobson connected with future NFL talent. At Carroll High School in Southlake, Texas (an incredibly fruitful recruiting ground), former Alabama quarterback Greg McElroy who led the Crimson Tide to a 2009 National Championship tossed the pigskin to Jacobson befor entering the NFL. Another NFL quarterback, Chase Daniel was Jacobson's quarterback for two years in high school as well.

BAND OF BROTHERS

While BYU's motto is "Band of Brothers," there are four sets of brothers on the 2011 roster including Terence (Sr. OL) and Rhen (Jr. WR) Brown, Braden (Jr. OL) and Trevor Brown (Fr. TE), Matt (Sr. OL) and Houston (So. OL) Reynolds, and Iona (So. RB) and Baker (Fr. DL) Pritchard.

In addition, 13 different players, Kevan Bills, Gavin Fowler, Spencer Hafoka, Braden Hansen, Alex Kuresa, Marcus Mathews, Zed Mendenhall, Rex Morgan, Mike Muehlmann, Houston Reynolds, Matt Reynolds, Jordan Richardson and Jadon Wagner also boast brothers who have played for the Cougar football program in the past.

FATHER'S DAY

Currently seven BYU players are also fathers, led by senior wide receiver Spencer Hafoka, with two children. Other dads on the team include Matt Reynolds, Travis Uale, Alani Fua, Aveni Leung-Wai and newest dad, Brandon Ogletree. Nine players also had fathers who played football at BYU: Famika Anae (Robert), Dallin Cutler (Chuck), Gavin Fowler (Blaine), Jameson Frazier (Danny), Colby Hansen (Regan), Carter Mees (Mike), Jordan Pendleton (Kirk), Matt Reynolds (Lance) and Houston Reynolds (Lance).

Two BYU coaches - Brandon Doman and Kelly Poppinga - have also each welcomed a new addition to their family this season.

HOLY MATRIMONY

BYU has long held the distinction of having the most married players of any other school in the country. This year is no exception. BYU currently has 32 players who are married.

TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting offensive line is largely considered to be one of its major team strengths . . . literally. Measuring in at an average of 6-feet-6 inches and over 310 pounds, the offensive line is built to plow the road for a successful running attack and protect the quarterback.

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 44 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 17 different countries including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cambodia, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, El Salvador, Fiji, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Paraguay, Peru, South Korea, Thailand and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of seven different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Cambodian, French, Korean, Portuguese, Spanish and Thai.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga is one of 73 players (61 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 29 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Germany, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, Mongolia, Mozambique, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 14 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nevada, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas.

Overall, 50 current members (42 percent) of the BYU football team speak a combined total of 21 different foreign languages and dialects, including Cebuano, Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Italian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Swedish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

- * The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.
- * The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and Paul in the Bible).
- * More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.
- * Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.
- * Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions except for their transportation to and from their field of labor and are not paid for their services.
- * Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.
- * Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in 14 additional countries including Brazil, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico and Spain.
 - * Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."
- * A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.
- * In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.
- * Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

AND IT CAME TO PASS

The BYU offense has had at least three touchdown passes in five of its last six games and has had at least one TD pass in 10 of 11 games this season. Last season, the Cougars had just two games with three or more TD throws and had a TD throw in only 8 of 13 games.

BALANCED ATTACK

In its last seven games, BYU has seen great balance from its passing and running game. The Cougars have 1,551 rushing yards and 13 touchdowns to go along with 1,635 passing yards and 19 touchdowns. Last week, BYU threw for 238 passing yards and four touchdowns and rushed for 173 yards and two more touchdowns. In five of the seven games, BYU has gone for at least 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards. The Cougars had seven different players combine to rush for 243 yards and three touchdowns and Riley Nelson, Jake Heaps and James Lark combined to throw for 262 yards and three more touchdowns vs. Idaho. Against Idaho State, BYU ran for a season-high 290 yards and four touchdowns while adding 282 passing yards and three touchdowns. The week before against Oregon State BYU rolled up 282 yards on the ground and 217 in the air. Against San Jose State, BYU was even more balanced, rushing for 224 yards and throwing for 219 yards and vs. Utah State, the Cougars used 251 passing yards and 200 rushing yards to beat the Aggies.

HEAPS OF TOUCHDOWNS

Quarterback Jake Heaps has had his ups and downs in 2011 but since taking over for injured Riley Nelson, Heaps has been up more times than not. In one start last week and most of the game prior, Heaps has thrown 6 touchdown passes combined, including tieing a career-high with four touchdowns last week. In his last three appearances, Heaps has completed 44 of 66 passes for 490 yards and six touchdowns.

THIRD DOWNS ... NOW AND THEN

BYU is currently ranked No. 4 in the nation in third-down conversions, converting 53.25 percent. At the end of September, BYU was 78th in third-down coversions, converting 38.86 percent. In September, the Cougars converted 30 of 77 third downs, while in October and November BYU converted 52 of 77 third downs, good for the best mark in the nation over the last two months at 67.53 percent.

GROUND GAME GOING

After a slow start to the running game, BYU has rushed for 1,678 yards in its last eight games, an average of almost 210 yards per game. The Cougars rushed for just 145 yards total in the first three games combined. BYU churned out 173 rushing yards vs. New Mexico State and picked up 243 yards against Idaho. The Cougars had their lowest output in a while against TCU with 139 net rushing yards. The running game went four-straight games prior to TCU with at least 200 yards and improved each game. The running game picked up an even 200 yards against Utah State, 224 against San Jose State, 282 at Oregon State and a season-high 290 vs. Idaho State

BYU also didn't have a rushing touchdown in the first three games but have had 15 in the last eight games. JJ Di Luigi leads the way with 101 carries, 532 yards and three touchdowns. Newly discovered running back Michael Alisa is now third on the team with 404 yards on 72 carries and has three touchdowns, with 402 of those coming in the last six games. Quarterback Riley Nelson helps in the ground game as the Cougars second leading rusher despite seeing limited time the first four games and missing most of the last two games with 379 yards on 68 attempts with one touchdown.

HOFFMAN KEEPS IT GOING

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman continues his streak, catching at least one pass in 17-straight games. Hoffman caught three passes for 26 yards vs. New Mexico State. The redshirt sophomore snagged six passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns, all in the first half against Idaho. He had four receptions for 67 yards vs. TCU. Against Idaho State he had five catches for 71 yards and two touchdowns. Hoffman set career-highs at Oregon State with 9 receptions for 162 yards. The redshirt sophomore caught four passes for 68 yards and one touchdown against Utah State. He grabbed three receptions for 24 yards against UCF. Hoffman finished with a team-high eight catches and 138 yards vs. Utah. He extends his streak to 17 games with at least one reception and 23 of 24 career games.

STAYING ON THE FIELD

BYU currently holds on to the football for 31:04 minutes per game on average. That is more than half of the game and that time is good for the No. 30 in the nation. Through Riley Nelson's four starts at quarterback before leaving with injury vs. Idaho. BYU has had just two times where they didn't get a first down and went three and out. The first time was against Oregon State in the third quarter. Two penalties that pushed them back 20 yards cost the team when they managed to gain 18 but came up short of moving the chains. The second was in the second guarter at TCU. Nelson looked to have completed a 7-vard pass to JJ Di Luigi and get a first down but Di Luigi had stepped out of bounds before he caught the ball, resulting in an illegal touch and forced BYU to punt after a three-and-out. When Jake Heaps has been in at quarterback for the last two games, the team has only had to punt two times as well.

DI LUIGI DOES IT ALL

Senior running back JJ Di Luigi was named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List before the season began. The versatile back had 12 carries for 75 yards vs. New Mexico State to go along with three catches for 31 yards. Di Luigi has averaged 71.2 all-purpose yards per game in 2011, contributing all over the field in the run game and catching passes out of the back field. The California native moved into 17th all-time at BYU in all-purpose yards and is 11th in career rushing yards. He is in 10th in career-receiving yards by a running back* with 967. Here is how Di Luigi looks on the all-time lists and who he might pass in the coming weeks:

GOING FOR A DRIVE

BYU's 99-yard touchdown drive vs. Idaho State was the longest of the 2011 season. The long drive ties the longest since a 99-yard drive vs. Utah State in 2006. BYU had a 97-yard scoring drive at Texas. The Cougars' game-winning drive against the Utah State Aggies was 96 yards officially, although the team actually had to go 98 yards. Quarterback Riley Nelson lost two yards on his first rush of the drive, pushing BYU all the way back to inside its own two yard line. BYU has five touchdown drives in 2011 of 90 yards or more. Against New Mexico State, the Cougars a 15-play, 90 yard touchdown drive.

TIGHT ENDS STRONG

In 2011, the Cougar tight ends have accounted for 48 catches, 542 yards and four touchdowns. In 2010, the tight ends caught 34 passes for 452 yards and no touchdowns. The tight ends have had their work cut out for them, losing the topt three tight end targets for the season with injuries. Richard Wilson and Austin Holt are out with knee injuries and Devid Mahina was out before the season began with a neck injury. Marcus Mathews leads the way with 21 grabs for 185 yards and one touchdown. Now that Holt and Wilson are out, Kaneakua Friel has recently got into the action and has four catches for 38 yards and one touchdown while Matt Edwards caught his first career pass, a 9-yard touchdown against New Mexico State. With one regular-season game left and a bowl game, the young position group can continue to grow and build on to a stronger 2011.

WIDE RECEIVER TWINS

BYU has a unique combination of size and speed in the receiving corps with Cody Hoffman and Ross Apo. Hoffman and Apo both weigh in at over 200 pounds and are 6-foot-4 and 6-foot 3, respectively. Most recently against New Mexico State, Hoffman caught three passes for 26 yards while Apo was the star with 5 catches for 66 yards and two touchdowns. Against Idaho, all in the first half, Hoffman caught six passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns while Apo had two catches for 28 yards in the game, including an 18-yard touchdown grab. The week before vs. Idaho State both receivers ended up with a matching five catches for 71 yards. The difference was Hoffman caught two touchdowns while Apo caught one score. Apo did have the longer reception at 30 yards, however. Hoffman and Apo have caught touchdowns in the same game twice this year. Hoffman leads the way in season totals with 46 catches for 698 yards and six touchdowns but Apo is second on the team with 30 catches for 398 yards and teamhigh seven touchdown receptions.

In particular, the Cougars' 20.36 ppg scoring defense, already low, is skewed by the fact that 28 points this season have come on opponent defensive touchdowns. Without those points counted, the scoring defense would be 17.82 or No. 11 in the nation.

COG IN THE MIDDLE

Despite missing one game due to a concussion, junior linebacker Brandon Ogletree is currently leading the BYU defense in total tackles and assisted tackles and ranks second on the team with two forced fumbles. Ogletree has 56 total tackles on the season, giving him an average of just over 6.5 tackles per game. Ogletree also forced two fumbles and recorded an interception against Oregon State. For his efforts against the Beavers, Ogletree received Honorable Mention Linebacker of the Week honors from the College Football Performance Awards.

TURNOVERS 'R' US

In nine games so far this season the BYU defense has forced 20 total turnovers. BYU is on pace to top its total of 23 turnovers gained from 2010, which they accured over the course of 13 games. The top game for the Cougars this season came against Oregon State when they picked off two passes and recovered two fumbles for a total of four turnovers.

BEHIND ENEMY LINES

BYU has totaled 4.0 TFL or more in every game this season. Senior linebacker Jordan Pendleton, out for the season with a knee injury, leads the team with 8.5 TFL in just seven games played this season. Sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy has 8.0 while four other Cougars have at least 3.0 TFL this year.

BREAK IT UP

BYU defensive backs Corby Eason and Preston Hadley are one of the best pass breakup duos in the nation. Eason has 14 breakups and Hadley adds 12 on the season, good for No. 5 and No. 15, respectively, in the nation. Eason's total ties him with Brian Logan (2009-10) for the single-season BYU record. Eason has 17 pass breakups for his career, just four behind Logan's 21 for the BYU all-time record.

BOAD WARRIORS

The BYU defense ranks No. 3 in total defense in the NCAA when away from home despite playing on the road at such well-known venues as Vaught-Hemingway Stadium at Ole Miss, DKR-Memorial Stadium at Texas, Reser Stadium at Oregon State and Cowboys Stadium against TCU. The Cougars are allowing 286.3 yards per game when playing on the road and rank behind only Alabama and Virginia Tech. In addition, BYU has allowed opponents to score just 12 touchdowns on their home field, good for No. 6 in the country.

FUMBLE RECOVERIES

After forcing and recovering two fumbles against Ole Miss, UCF and Oregon State, the Cougars are 4-0 in the last two seasons when recovering multiple fumbles. The Cougars forced and recovered two fumbles just once last season, in a 44-7 win versus Colorado State and have 11 forced fumbles with seven recoveries this season.

VAN NOY RECORD

With a fumble recovery for a touchdown against Ole Miss, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy became the first BYU player in history to return two fumbles for touchdowns. Van Noy is also the last Cougar defender to score two touchdowns since Derwin Gray returned two interceptions for points in 1990-91.

SENIOR OUT

BYU senior linebacker Jordan Pendleton suffered a season and career-ending injury to his knee during the TCU game. At the time, Pendleton was among the team leaders in tackles, TFL and sacks. In spite of playing just seven games overall this year, Pendleton is still second on the team with 8.5 TFL and 4.0 sacks on the season. Now an inspiration for his teammates on the sideline (fellow linebacker Kyle Van Noy wore Pendleton's jersey on Senior Night against New Mexico State to honor Pendleton), the 6-3, 238-pound backer will look to heal in hopes of making an NFL roster next season.

POSTING POINTS

The BYU defense has scored two touchdowns this year, one in the season opener against Ole Miss and another late in the game vs. Idaho State. With just minutes remaining and the Cougars down by six, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy sacked the Rebel quarterback while jarring the ball loose. Nobody could gather the ball until Van Noy scooped it up and fell into the end zone for what would prove to be the game-winning touchdown.

Against the Bengals, safety Daniel Sorensen stepped in front of a pass in stride, taking the ball the other way for a 30-yard touchdown to give BYU a 49-3 lead in the third quarter. It was the first interception returned for a touchdown by a BYU player since David Nixon (now with the St. Louis Rams) had a 19-yard pick six vs. Wyoming during the 2008 season.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

FOR THE LONGEST TIME

Cody Hoffman's 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the third quarter was the first for a Cougar in more than 13 years, a streak that spanned 158 games. Mike Rigell was the last BYU returner to take a kickoff the distance with a 96-yard return in 1998 against Hawaii.

DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung came to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin

SPECIAL FLAG

In addition to the traditional team flag and alumni flag leading the team out of the tunnel before kick-off, BYU has also incorporated a special teams flag with an old school BYU logo this season.

Against TCU, sophomore JD Falslev carried out the special teams flag.



JD FOR A TD

Sophomore JD Falslev's 67-yard punt return for a touchdown late in the third quarter against TCU was the first punt return for a touchdown by a BYU player since 2006 when McKay Jacobson turned a punt into six points against Wyoming. It also gave BYU a kick and punt return touchdown in the same season for the first time since 1996. Cody Hoffman returned a kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown vs. UCF earlier this season.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

Cody Hoffman became the sixth player in BYU history to gain 1,000 kickoff return yards after running for a career-high 167 yards on seven returns against TCU. The sophomore now sits at 1,158 career yards, good for fifth all-time at BYU. His 778 return yards this season is currently the third-best in a season in BYU history.

BIG TIME BLOCK

Early in the first quarter against Idaho State, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy blocked and recovered an Idaho State punt. The punt block was the first blocked kick for the Cougars since Matt Marshall did so in 2009 against Colorado State. It is the first and only blocked kick for BYU this season. Van Noy is one of two Independent players to block a punt this year.

LEADING THE WAY

Sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen is 40-for-40 on PAT attempts this season, making him one of 15 kickers in the nation to be perfect on PATs with 40 or more attempts on the year. Overall, Sorensen is tied for No. 44 in the nation with his 40 overall conversions.

HOFFMAN HYPE

As a duel threat in both the kickoff and receiving games for BYU, sophomore Cody Hoffman is averaging 134.5 all-purpose yards for game, good for No. 35 in the country. Hoffman's average yards per play of 19.0 is No. 5 in the nation while his 1,479 yards is No. 39 overall. Hoffman leads the Cougars in receptions and receiving yards in addition to handling 31 of BYU's 42 kick returns on the year.

WHEN IT RAINS IT FALS

Only a sophomore, JD Falslev leads the Cougars in punt returning and coming onto the role last season. With one more return, Falslev will have 35 for his career and be eligible for the BYU career punt return average list. With a 9.2 career average, Falslev would be ranked No. 7 on the list just ahead of former NFL star Vai Sikahema's average of 8.6. For his efforts both on punt returns and as a receiver beginning this season, Falslev was awarded a scholarship just a short time ago.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL HEAD COACH BRONCO MENDENHALL



BRONCO MENDENHALL 7TH SEASON

During his six seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to six straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 56-21 (.727) record as he begins his seventh season to rank No. 16 in total wins among all teams in the nation during that span. The Cougars have received six straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first six teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in four of the last five seasons to become the first Cougar teams to win four bowls in a five-year span since LaVell Edwards teams did so from 1980-84. Nationally, BYU is one of only 11 programs to win four bowl games in the last five seasons.

In the last five years the Cougars have achieved a 50-15 record -- only eight teams

have more wins over that span. In fact, BYU is one of only seven FBS programs

(42 offense, 16 defense, 6 special teams, 1 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 39 top-15 statistical rankings, 29 top-10 rank- ings and 15 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during each of the past five seasons and finished ranked No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season and has totaled 185 selections during Mendenhall's tenure, along with 64 MWC Scholar-Athlete awards. BYU also ranks second nationally for Academic All-America recipients over the past three seasons. Six Cougar student-athletes have been named ESPN Academic All-Americans the past three years. Among all FBS schools only Penn State has had more during that period.

Going independent in 2011, BYU was consistently a top MWC contender under Mendenhall. BYU achieved a 39-9 (.813) conference record over the past six years to help the Cougars complete their 12-year tenure in the MWC with 64 conference wins — the most of any MWC school. Mendenhall also helped the Cougars bring bowl wins over Oregon, UCLA, Oregon State and UTEP as the program enters a new era as one of four independent schools, joining Notre Dame, Army and Navy.

Last year's BYU team achieved a 7-6 record and tied for third in the MWC at 5-3 while playing 19 freshmen and facing a schedule that featured eight bowl teams and four opponents that finished in final BCS Top 25 standings. Mendenhall took over defensive coordinator responsibilities after the teams 1-4 start and the team responded to become one of the top defensive teams over the final eight games.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.

to win 10 or more games during at least four of the last five seasons, and BYU and Boise State are the only programs in the West to achieve that consistent level of success. From 2006-2009 Mendenhall guided the Cougars to four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff has six members who have played professional football. Assistant Head Coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in 2002 and played three years for the 49er's, while defensive line coach Steve Kaufusi and outside linebacker coach Kelly Poppinga played in the NFL with the Arizona Cardinals. Graduate assistant Shaun Nua also spent some time with the Pittsburgh Steelers. In addition, receivers coach Ben Cahoon spent 13 years with the Candian Football League's Montreal Alouettes before retiring as the CFL's all-time receptions leader.

In addition, Poppinga and Nua are both Super Bowl champions; Poppinga won a ring with the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII while Nua earned his in the Steelers' Super Bowl XL victory. Cahoon also won the ultimate prize in the CFL by leading the Montreal to three Grey Cup championships in 2002, 2009 and 2010.

THE NEW GUYS

The BYU coaching staff welcomed two new members this past offseason in running backs coach Joe DuPaix and receivers coach Ben Cahoon.

DuPaix most recently coached at Navy for the past three seasons, helping led the Midshipmen to three bowl bids. In each of his three seasons, Navy was one of the top-6 rushing programs in the country, including an NCAA-best 293.4 ypg in 2008. A Salt Lake City native, DuPaix played under his father, Roger, a successful high school coach at Skyline who also coached current BYU offensive coordinator Brandon Doman in high school. DuPaix played quarterback at Snow College (Ephraim, UT) and Southern Utah where he set the FCS record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a season.

Cahoon retired in after the 2010 season as the all-time receptions leader in CFL history. Cahoon also set records for most receiving yards in a career in Grey Cup games and most touchdowns by an Alouette in addition to earning the CFL Most Outstanding Candian Award in 2002 and 2003. A native of Orem, Utah, Cahoon was an All-WAC performer in addition to being an Academic All-American. He is also the son-in-law of current Utah Governor Gary Herbert.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,470-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. With additional wheelchair access created in 2010-11, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63,470 beginning with the 2011 season.

"FAN"TASTIC FANS

The attendance at the BYU vs. Utah game was 63,742 - the first sellout for Edwards Stadium since last season's home opener against Washington. A sellout crowd of 63,513 also watched BYU's win over Utah State. In 2010, BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sellouts at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The prior time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWDS

In 2009. BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah in 2009 is currently 10th with 64,301 fans attending the game. In 2010, BYU averaged 61,380 fans per home game.



HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. Last season, BYU averaged 30.0 points per game at home. The Cougars have not had a negative points per game margin for the past seven seasons, including all seven years of head coach Bronco Mendenhall's tenure. In 2006, a 35.16-point differential was a BYU record in scoring margin in the stadium's 46year history and the program's 86-year history:
