WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- BYU is facing Idaho State for the first time since 1951, a span of 60 years. It's the second-longest span between games against an opponent in BYU history after going 61 years between contests against Nevada in 1940 and 2001. The Cougars' will also set the third-longest span in two weeks when they face Idaho for the first time since 1956 - a span of 56 years.

BYU has not played five other current FCS teams (UC Davis, Northern Colorado, Montana State, Northern Arizona and South Dakota) since at least 1951. The FBS school BYU has currently gone the longest without playing is Texas Tech, a team the Cougars last played back in 1940 -- 71 years ago and counting.

- Multiple Cougars earned awards after last week vs. Oregon State. Riley Nelson earned Independent Offensive Player of the Week, Brandon Ogletree earned Independent Defensive Player of the Week and College Football Performance Awards linebacker honorable mention and Cody Hoffman earned CFP receiver honorable mention and Rivals.com Independent Player of the Week.

- The Cougars are 4-0 overall and 3-0 under Bronco Mendenhall when playing teams classified in the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS). BYU has wins over Northern Iowa (41-17 in 2008), Eastern Washington (42-7 in 2007), Eastern Illinois (45-10 in 2005) and Murray State (43-9 in 1998).

- BYU is looking for its fifth-straight win. The Cougars have not won more than four in a row since winning its last five games of 2009 and the 2010 season opener.

LAST TIME - OREGON STATE

BYU GETS 29-16 HOMECOMING VICTORY

CORVALLIS, Ore. – Wide receiver Cody Hoffman set career highs with nine receptions for 162 yards and one touchdown to lead the BYU football team to a 38-28 win over Oregon State at Reser Stadium on Saturday.

BYU (5-2) won its fourth-straight game behind a season-high 499 total yards. The Cougars rushed for 282 yards and held the Beavers (1-5) to just 59 yards on the ground.

Quarterback Riley Nelson completed 17 of 27 passes for 217 yards, three touchdowns and one interception. Nelson also led the team in rushing with 87 yards on 12 carries. Running back Michael Alisa helped out with 20 carries for 84 yards, including his first career touchdown run and running back JJ Di Luigi added 74 yards on eight attempts with one touchdown.

The Cougars forced four turnovers in the game. Linebacker Brandon Ogletree had an interception and forced a fumble while linebacker Kyle Van Noy also had an interception. Linebacker Uona Kaveinga and defensive end Matt Putnam each recovered fumbles.

BYU found the end zone on its first possession of the game. Alisa rushed four times for 26 yards on the drive, finishing it off with a 10 yard run for a touchdown to give BYU a 7-0 lead with 5:02 left in the first quarter.

Voy Noy intercepted a pass in BYU territory and returned it to the 50-yard line. The Cougars were able to capitalize on the play, cashing in with a touchdown on the ensuing drive. Hoffman went up high to catch a 20-yard pass to set up a 3-yard score on the ground from Di Luigi to make it 14-0 and 9:23 left until halftime.

Oregon State got even with an interception of their own, taking a pick 51-yards for a touchdown to tie the score at 14-14 with 1:18 left in the half.

After halftime, BYU came out firing, scoring on its opening drive. Nelson picked up a big gain of 20 yards on the ground to help set up a 12-yard touchdown pass to Hoffman. With the made extra point, the Cougars regained their one score advantage at 21-14 with 11:16 in the third quarter.

BYU forced three turnovers on the Beavers' first three possessions but only picked up three points total off the takeaways. Ogletree intercepted a pass that was deflected at the line of scrimmage on the BYU 24-yard line. On the next Oregon State possession Kavinga recovered a fumble and on the third drive Ogletree forced a fumble that was recovered by Putnam.

Finally after a third turnover, the Cougars were able to score points when kicker Justin Sorensen hit from 33 yards out to give BYU a 24-14 lead with 3:26 left in the third quarter.

The scoring continued for the Cougars, answering with a 12-play, 66-yard drive for a touchdown. Wide receiver JD Falslev caught his first career touchdown, a 2-yarder from Nelson to give BYU a 31-21 edge with 10:39 to play in the game.

Oregon State missed its second field goal of the game, this time from 48 yards, and Nelson made the Beavers pay with his third touchdown pass of the game with 3:37 left to go. Nelson hooked up with tight end Kaneakua Friel for an 8-yard touchdown pass to make the score 38-21. The catch was Friel's first career reception and first touchdown.

Scoring a touchdown with just 23 seconds left on the clock, Oregon State cut the lead to 10 but it wasn't enough and BYU went on to the 38-28 victory.

OREGON STATE GAME NOTES

33-YEAR REPEAT

BYU extends BYU's streak of six-straight seasons with a win over a Pac-12 team dating back to 2006 and defeated Oregon State in Corvallis for the first time since 1978 – the last time BYU played the Beavers on the road.

CHEWING UP YARDAGE

The Cougars' 499 yards of total offense are the highest of the season and the highest total since gaining 514 at UTEP last season.

COUGH IT UP

BYU's four turnovers caused against OSU are the most forced by the Cougars since last season's four against New Mexico.

HOFFMAN HIGH

Cody Hoffman's 162 yards and nine receptions both set new career highs for the sophomore and is his second 100+ yard game this season. His reception on his back for 46 yards is a season-long pass play for BYU this season. Hoffman totaled 205 all-purpose yards, his second game with 200 yards or more and fourth of 100 yards or more.

STUFFING THE RUN

BYU has held opposing defenses below 50 yards rushing in 8 of 14 halves of play this season, including both halves against Oregon State when the Cougars' allowed just 33 and 26 yards, respectively.

STELLAR SOPHOMORE

Sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy recorded his third interception and fourth forced turnover of the season in the second quarter, returning the ball 43 yards from the OSU 7-yard line to the 50-yard line. The ensuing offensive drive led to a 3-yard TD run by JJ Di Luigi, his second score on the year.

START OFF RIGHT

BYU marched down the field on its opening drive, as Riley Nelson went 4 for 4 for 35 yards while the Cougars added 57 yards on eight rushing attempts, capped by Alisa's 10-yard run. BYU had just one third down the entire 82-yard drive.

FIRST-TIME TDS

Sophomore running back Michael Alisa scored the first touchdown of his career with five minutes remaining in the first quarter on a 10-yard run around the left end. Sophomore receiver JD Falslev also scored his first TD in the third quarter on a 2-yard reception and sophomore tight end Kaneakua Friel score his first career touchdown on his first-ever reception late in the fourth quarter.

RUNNING OUT THE FLAG

BYU was led out of the tunnel today by senior tight end Matthew Edwards carrying the team flag and junior safety Mike Hague with the special teams flag. The special teams flag, highlighted by an old-school BYU logo adopted by the special teams, is a new addition this season. Keith Rivera (1971-74), a two-time All-WAC first team defensive lineman, carried out the alumni flag.

THE BYU-IDAHO STATE SERIES

This will be the fourth time BYU and Idaho State have played. The Cougars are undefeated against the Bengals, holding a 3-0 advantage, with two meetings in the early 1950's and another in 1932. It has been 60 years since the two teams faced off, the last time coming in 1951 when BYU won in Provo 27-7.

IDAHO STATE LAST TIME

OGDEN, Utah - The Idaho State football team lost 39-12 to Weber State on Saturday at Stewart Stadium in front of a crowd of 11,297 fans. The Bengals drop to 2-5 and 1-4 in Big Sky Conference play while Weber State improved to 3-3 and 3-1 in league play.

Idaho State had 283 total yards led by Rodrick Rumble's 14 catches for 166 yards and one touchowns. Kevin Yost threw the ball for 284 yards on 30 completions for 52 attempts.

A.J. Storms led Idaho State defensively with 12 tackles while Greg Melendez had nine tackles and Jordan Monga seven.

ISU got off to a good start as the team took its opening drive 98 yards and scored on an Aaron Prier one-yard run to take a 6-0 lead with 6:32 left in the first quarter. The drive was aided by Weber State getting called for four off side calls. The 98-yard drive was also the team's longest of the season.

Idaho State led 6-2 after the first quarter but trailed 15-6 at halftime. Trailing 22-6 in the third quarter, Rumble scored on an eight-yard reception. The scoring drive was a 12 play-68 yard drive. But the Wildcats then scored three straight touchdowns to put the game out of reach.

David Harrington had a career-long put of 70 yards. For the game he had six punts for an average of 54 yards a kick. His previous career-long at Idaho State was 67 yards. Rodrick Rumble caught 14 passes for the second time this season for 166 yards and one touchdown.

A.J. Storms had 12 tackles and now only needs 32 tackles to pass Mike Calley has the program's all-time leading tackler.

Andrew Zamora caught a career-high six passes for 47 yards on Saturday. His previous career-high was three catches for 30 yards.

RIGELL RETURNS

Former BYU kick returner and wide receiver Mike Rigell will be returning to LaVell Edwards Stadium as a member of the Idaho State coaching staff. Rigell currently is in his first year as the running backs coach after serving as a graduate assistant for the Bengals last year. Rigell found most of his success in a Cougar uniform as a kick returner. Before current kick returner Cody Hoffman returned a kick 93 yards for a touchdown earlier this year, Rigell was the last player to accomplish that feat when he took one 96 yards to the house against Hawaii his freshman season in 1998. Rigell was an all-conference honorable mention twice in his BYU career and racked up 3,005 all-purpose yards for the Cougars, good for 14th all-time at BYU. His 1,625 kickoff return yards are tops in Cougar history.

The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue “Y” logo. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU players. Leading the way with various honors is senior captain Matt Reynolds on the offensive line. Reynolds, a pre-season All-American by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, Lindy’s, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others has also been named to Outland Trophy Watch List, Lombardi Award Watch and the Lowe’s Senior Class Award list and was recently named to Phil Steele’s Midseason All-Independent First Team. Joining Reynolds with the preseason accolades is senior linebacker Jameson Frazier on the Lott Trophy Watch List and senior running back JJ Di Luigi on the Doak Walker Award Watch List. Offensive lineman Terence Brown is recognized as one of the best centers in college football on the Rimington Trophy Watch List. BYU VS. BCS AQS

With the victories over Ole Miss of the SEC and Oregon State of the Pac-12, BYU has defeated at least one team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference six-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 15 of the past 16 years dating back to 1996. BYU is 2-2 vs. BCS schools this season.

With its win last week, the Cougars have also defeated a Pac-12 team team each of the last six years.

HOME COOKIN’

Head coach Bronco Mendenhall has often emphasized the importance of winning at home. Since he has taken the reigns of the program, BYU is 33-7 at home. The Cougars are 3-1 to start the year at home and last season BYU was 5-1 at LaVell Edwards Stadium. Mendenhall and the Cougars won 18-straight games in Provo from 2006-09.

A WEIRD PATTERN

Three of BYU’s five wins in 2011 have come:

- 1) After trailing at halftime
- 2) When the opponent scores first
- 3) After losing the coin toss
- 4) Scoring the winning points in the fourth quarter
- 5) while playing on ESPN.

FOURTH QUARTER COMEBACKS

Seven games into the season, BYU has had three fourth quarter comebacks. The heroics over Utah State featured two late touchdown drives both coming in the fourth quarter to help the Cougars overcome a 24-13 lead and go on to win 27-24. BYU also came back in the fourth the week before to beat UCF 24-17 with a 6-yard touchdown run from Bryan Kariya after a muffed punt from UCF for the eventual game-winner. In the season opener at Ole Miss, late in the fourth quarter linebacker Kyle Van Noy stripped the ball from the Rebels’ quarterback and scooped up and took it three yards into the end zone for the score to help BYU win 14-13.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL TEAM NOTES

MAKE YOURSELF COMFORTABLE

After starting with two games on the road, BYU had four-straight home games, going 3-1 for the home-stretch. After dropping the rivalry game against Utah, BYU went on to win the next two over UCF and Utah State, both fourth-quarter comebacks. BYU got their third-straight home win over San Jose State and goes for a fourth-straight against the Bengals. The last time the Cougars had four home games in a row was in 1991 when BYU had Air Force, Utah State, UTEP and Hawaii all in Provo. The Cougars won all four games during the stretch by a margin of victory of almost 16 points. BYU has seven home games this year.

HE'S KIND OF A BIG DEAL

Senior captain and offensive tackle Matt Reynolds is amidst a successful senior season after deciding not to enter the NFL draft despite a first round projection. Reynolds has been rewarded with several preseason accolades, including being named a preseason All-American by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, CBSCollegeSports.com, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others. Along with those honors, Reynolds has recognized as an Outland Trophy Candidate, a Lombardi Award Candidate and a Lowe's Senior Class Award Nominee.

BRING ON THE BCS

Since the start of the Bowl Championship Series in 1998, BYU has played at least two BCS-automatic qualifying teams every year. In 2011, the Cougars are playing four BCS schools this year in Ole Miss, Texas, Utah and Oregon State. Only two other seasons (2000 and 2003) has BYU played as many BCS teams. To start the 2011 season the Cougars play three of the four teams consecutively, opening with road games at Ole Miss and Texas before the home opener against Utah. Not since 1998 has BYU started a season against three BCS teams, when the Cougars lost to Alabama and Washington on the road and defeated Arizona State at home.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

With BYU playing UCF on a Friday night, as well as Utah State and TCU, it is the most Friday night games the Cougars have played in the Bronco Mendenhall era. Under Coach Mendenhall, BYU is 4-1 on Friday night games, with four of the games against Utah State. This is also the first time under Mendenhall that the Cougars played back-to-back Friday night games, with UCF and Utah State the past two weeks.

MCKAY AND HIS QB'S

Wide receiver McKay Jacobson has had the luxury of having a top-notch quarterback be around him for almost all of his football career. While he currently has the promising sophomore Jake Heaps and gritty junior Riley Nelson, he has caught passes at BYU from NFL quarterbacks Max Hall and John Beck. Even at the high school level, Jacobson connected with future NFL talent. At Carroll High School in Southlake, Texas (an incredibly fruitful recruiting ground), Alabama quarterback Greg McElroy who led the Crimson Tide to a 2009 National Championship tossed the pigskin to Jacobson before entering the NFL. Another NFL quarterback, Chase Daniel was Jacobson's quarterback for two years in high school as well.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN

BYU's road trip to Corvallis was the third road trip of the season but the first after a four-game home series. BYU improved to 2-1 on the road in 2011 after playing at Ole Miss and at Texas to start the year. The Cougars have just four true road games this year, with a fifth contest away from LaVell Edwards Stadium but at a neutral site, Dallas Cowboys Stadium at the end of the month to take on TCU. The last time BYU had just five regular season games away from home was 2005. In 1996 and 1998, BYU played eight games away from home, including postseason play. Those seasons also included a WAC Championship game.

GROUND GAME GOING

After a slow start to the running game, BYU has rushed for 833 yards in its last four games. The Cougars rushed for a measly 145 yards in the first three games. For the third-straight game, BYU has rushed for at least 200 yards and improved each game. The running game picked up an even 200 yards against Utah State, 224 against San Jose State and a season-high 282 at Oregon State. BYU also didn't have a rushing touchdown in the first three games but have had five in the last four games. JJ Di Luigi leads the way with 64 carries, 304 yards and two touchdowns. Quarterback Riley Nelson helps in the ground game as the Cougars second leading rusher despite seeing limited time the first four games with 222 yards on 37 attempts. Newly discovered running back Michael Alisa is now third on the team with 177 yards on 39 carries and has one touchdown, with 175 of those coming in the last two games.

BAND OF BROTHERS

While BYU's motto is "Band of Brothers," there are four sets of brothers on the 2011 roster including Terence (Sr. OL) and Rhen (Jr. WR) Brown, Braden (Jr. OL) and Trevor Brown (Fr. TE), Matt (Sr. OL) and Houston (So. OL) Reynolds, and Iona (So. RB) and Baker (Fr. DL) Pritchard.

In addition, 13 different players, Kevan Bills, Gavin Fowler, Spencer Hafoka, Braden Hansen, Alex Kuresa, Marcus Mathews, Zed Mendenhall, Rex Morgan, Mike Muehlmann, Houston Reynolds, Matt Reynolds, Jordan Richardson and Jadon Wagner also boast brothers who have played for the Cougar football program in the past.

FATHER'S DAY

Currently seven BYU players are also fathers, led by senior wide receiver Spencer Hafoka, with two children. Other dads on the team include Matt Reynolds, Travis Uale, Alani Fua, Aveni Leung-Wai and newest dad, Brandon Ogletree.

Nine players also had fathers who played football at BYU: Famika Anae (Robert), Dallin Cutler (Chuck), Gavin Fowler (Blaine), Jameson Frazier (Danny), Colby Hansen (Regan), Carter Mees (Mike), Jordan Pendleton (Kirk), Matt Reynolds (Lance) and Houston Reynolds (Lance).

HOLY MATRIMONY

BYU has long held the distinction of having the most married players of any other school in the country. This year is no exception. BYU currently has 32 players who are married.

TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting offensive line is largely considered to be one of its major team strengths . . . literally. Measuring in at an average of 6-foot-6 inches and over 310 pounds, the offensive line is built to plow the road for a successful running attack and protect the quarterback.

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 44 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 17 different countries including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cambodia, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, El Salvador, Fiji, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Paraguay, Peru, South Korea, Thailand and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of seven different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Cambodian, French, Korean, Portuguese, Spanish and Thai.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga is one of 73 players (61 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 29 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Germany, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, Mongolia, Mozambique, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 14 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nevada, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas.

Overall, 50 current members (42 percent) of the BYU football team speak a combined total of 21 different foreign languages and dialects, including Cebuano, Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Italian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Swedish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

- * The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.
- * The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and Paul in the Bible).
- * More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.
- * Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.
- * Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions — except for their transportation to and from their field of labor — and are not paid for their services.
- * Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.
- * Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in 14 additional countries including Brazil, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico and Spain.
- * Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."
- * A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.
- * In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.
- * Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE NOTES

NOT A LONG LIST

BYU hasn't had many quarterbacks with Riley Nelson's skill set of running and passing. It's a short list but Nelson has a chance to make some noise on the career quarterback-rushing leaders for the Cougars. In fact, he is sneaking up on former BYU quarterback and current offensive coordinator Brandon Doman's mark on the list.

GETTING OFFENSIVE

For the third-straight week the BYU offense was able to rack up at least 400 yards of total offense. The Cougars rolled with 499 yards at Oregon State. Against San Jose State the Cougars picked up 446 yards and vs. Utah State the team used 451 total yards to beat the Aggies. Each game featured at least 200 rushing yards. In the past four games the Cougars have slowly improved their scoring as well, scoring 24, 27, 29 and 38 points.

GOING FOR A DRIVE

BYU's 97-yard scoring drive, the Cougars' third drive of the game at Texas, was the team's longest since a 99-yard drive in the fourth quarter against Utah State in 2006. Since that time, BYU has had 10 drives of 90 yards or more. The Cougars' game-winning drive against the Utah State Aggies was 96 yards officially, although the team actually had to go 98 yards. Quarterback Riley Nelson lost two yards on his first rush of the drive, pushing BYU all the way back to inside its own two yard line. Against Oregon State the Cougars didn't need as long of a drive to score. The longest of the game was a 12-play 82-yard drive, capped off by a 10-yard rushing touchdown from Michael Alisa.

ANOTHER FULL NELSON ATTACK

Quarterback Riley Nelson played his second-career full game for BYU against Oregon State. After setting a career-high in total yards with 284 the week prior against San Jose State, Nelson attacked the Beavers for a career-best 301 total yards, along with career highs in passing completions and attempts. Nelson threw for 217 yards and three touchdowns (ties a career high) and added 87 yards on the ground.

COMING IN THREES

For the second-straight game BYU had three touchdown passes through the air. Each touchdown reception came in the second half as well. Wide receiver Cody Hoffman caught the first one, a 12-yarder in the third quarter. JD Falslev caught the second one, a 2-yard toss, and tight end Kaneakua Friel caught the third touchdown from 8 yards out in the fourth quarter.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER

After Michael Alisa impressed with 91 yards against San Jose State, the sophomore running back proved it wasn't just a one time thing. Alisa led all running backs with 84 yards on the ground on 20 carries against Oregon State. Alisa also picked up his first career rushing touchdown on a 10-yard run in the first quarter, BYU's first of the game. In the last two games, Alisa has 175 yards on 36 carries, averaging 4.9 yards per carry after getting just three carries for two yards the previous five games.

BALANCED ATTACK

For the third-straight week BYU had a balanced attack, running the football for over 200 yards and passing for over 200 yards to beat Oregon State 38-28. The Cougars had six different players combine to rush for a season-high 282 yards and two touchdowns and Riley Nelson threw for 217 yards and three more touchdowns. The week before against San Jose State, BYU was even more balanced, rushing for 224 yards and throwing for 219 yards. Against Utah State, the Cougars used 251 passing yards and 200 rushing yards to beat the Aggies.

RUNNING BY COMMITTEE

It took six different players to rack up the season-high 284 rushing yards vs. Oregon State. Quarterback Riley Nelson led the way with 87 yards on 12 carries. Running backs Michael Alisa carried the ball 20 times for 84 yards and JJ Di Luigi picked up 74 on 8 attempts and had a long rush of 41 yards. Josh Quezada added 26 yards, Bryan Kariya chipped in 9 and wide receiver Cody Hoffman actually caught a pass that was ruled a lateral, resulting in a 3-yard gain.

IT'S A REYNOLDS THING

BYU has had a tradition of sibling teammates for years. One of the most prominent has been the Reynolds brothers. In fact, the Cougars have had at least one Reynolds brother start on the offensive line every season dating back to 2004. Lance Jr. (2001-05), Dallas (2005-08), Matt (2007-Pres.) and Houston (2009-Pres.) have combined for 114 starts since 2004. Continuing further on the Reynolds' offensive line, BYU has actually had at least two of the brothers starting together three different seasons with Lance Jr. and Dallas starting 12 games together in 2005, Dallas and Matt starting 13 games in 2008, and with Houston getting the starting nod at Ole Miss, he joined Matt for another Reynolds tag team. As a sophomore this season, it looks like Houston will continue the Reynolds tradition for a few more years.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE NOTES

DON'T HASSLE THE HOFF

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman has become the playmaking receiver even though he got off to a slow start.

Hoffman caught just three passes for 20 yards in the first two games but since then has gone on to catch 25 passes for 400 yards and two touchdowns.

He made play after play recently and has averaged 131.1 all-purpose yards this year. He set career marks in receptions and yards against Oregon State with 9 catches for 162 yards. He played terrific vs. Utah, reaching new career-highs for receptions and yards in a quarter, catching five balls for 98 yards in the first fifteen minutes of play. Hoffman also set a new career-high in kick returns against Utah as well with 8 returns and 139 yards, giving 277 all-purpose yards, the sixth-best mark in BYU history.

With 1,824 all-purpose yards in his career, Hoffman passed moves in to 44th all-time at BYU. With 918 all-purpose yards in 2011 and just a sophomore, Hoffman will continue to move up the list.

A BETTER STREAK

The BYU tight ends have extended their streak to three games with a touchdown reception. After Marcus Mathews caught the first touchdown pass by a tight end in the win over Utah State, tight end Richard Wilson decided to get into the action as well, catching a 21-yard touchdown pass for the next touchdown reception of the season. Last week vs. Oregon State, seldom used tight end Kaneaku Friel caught an 8-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter to help seal the Cougar victory. The tight ends hadn't caught a touchdown pass before Mathews since Dennis Pitta caught a 17-yard strike from Max Hall in the 2009 Las Vegas Bowl. After a 17-game scoreless streak, the tight ends have started a better streak with three games in a row getting in to the end zone.

DI LUIGI DOES IT ALL

Senior running back JJ Di Luigi was named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List before the season began. The versatile back had 74 yards rushing on 8 carries against Oregon State and caught one ball for 3 yards. Di Luigi has averaged 60.9 total yards per game in 2011, contributing all over the field in the run game and catching passes out of the back field. The California native moved into 21st all-time at BYU in all-purpose yards and is 13th in career rushing yards. Here is how Di Luigi looks on the all-time lists and who he might pass in the coming weeks:

HOFFMAN KEEPS IT GOING

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman continues his streak, catching at least one pass in 13-straight games. Hoffman caught set career-highs at Oregon State with 9 receptions for 162 yards. He caught just one pass for eight yards against San Jose State. The redshirt sophomore caught four passes for 68 yards and one touchdown against Utah State. He grabbed three receptions for 24 yards against UCF. Hoffman finished with a team-high eight catches and 138 yards vs. Utah. He extends his streak to 13 games with at least one reception and 19 of 20 career games.

TIGHT ENDS STRONG

With the tight end position seeing a drop off last year, a revamped tight end crew is bringing the tight end back to a force in BYU's offense. After seven games of the season, the tight ends have accounted for 437 yards on 37 catches and three touchdowns.

The tight ends accounted for 30 yards on 3 catches including one touchdown against Oregon State. Against San Jose State the tight ends caught 4 passes for 82 yards and one touchdown. The game-winner against Utah State was caught by flex tight end Marcus Mathews and the tight ends accounted for eight receptions for 68 yards. Against UCF the tight ends caught five passes for 49 yards. Against Utah, the tight ends combined for six catches and 76 yards. At Texas, they caught seven passes for 88 yards. The tight ends are consistently performing for the Cougar offense and are much more of a threat in 2011.

FIRST TIMERS

Three different offensive players scored for the first time while visiting Oregon State. Running back Michael Alisa got his first touchdown as a Cougar in the first quarter, taking the ball 10 yards on the ground for a score. Wide receiver and punt returner JD Falslev caught his first touchdown pass, grabbing a 2-yard pass in the fourth quarter against the Beavers. Tight end Kaneaku Friel was probably the most unlikely player to snag a first touchdown, usually playing only on goal line packages and field goals. He stepped up however when some of the other tight ends were banged up, catching an 8-yarder for a touchdown to seal the 38-28 win. Friel's reception was the first career reception of any kind, let alone a touchdown.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL DEFENSIVE NOTES

COG IN THE MIDDLE

Despite missing one game due to injury, junior linebacker Brandon Ogletree is currently leading the BYU defense in total tackles, assisted tackles and unassisted tackles and ranks second on the team with two forced fumbles. Ogletree has 43 total tackles on the season, giving him an average of just over seven tackles per game. As a sophomore, Ogletree saw significant action in 11 games and recorded 49 tackles on the season. Ogletree also forced two fumbles and recorded an interception against Oregon State. For his efforts against the Beavers, Ogletree received Honorable Mention Linebacker of the Week honors from the College Football Performance Awards.

FORCING FUMBLES

BYU has forced nine fumbles in seven games this season, a total that currently ranks atop the standings for FBS Independent teams. The Cougars are averaging 1.29 forced fumbles per game this season. The linebackers have led the way in the forced fumble department. Junior Uona Kaveinga has three forced fumbles this season while fellow junior Brandon Ogletree recorded two against Oregon State. The Cougars have recovered seven of the nine forced fumbles, which also ranks first among FBS Independent teams.

STELLAR SOPHOMORE

Sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy recorded his third interception and fourth forced turnover of the season in the second quarter against Oregon State, returning the ball 43 yards from the OSU 7-yard line to the 50-yard line. The ensuing offensive drive ended with J.J. Di Luigi's second touchdown of the 2011 season. Van Noy also had a long interception return against San Jose State when he took a pick 31 yards down the field. Van Noy has returned his three interceptions on the season for a total of 79 yards, a team high.

BEHIND ENEMY LINES

BYU continued its streak of recording at least 5.0 TFL to three games against Oregon State. BYU recorded a season-best 7.0 TFL for a total loss of 22 yards against the Beavers. Senior linebacker Jordan Pendleton, in his second game back from injury, led BYU with a career high 3.0 TFL. Pendleton also recorded a sack in the game. The Cougars recorded 5.0 TFL against the San Jose State and 6.0 against Utah State.

VAN NOY RECORD

With a fumble recovery for a touchdown against Ole Miss, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy became the first BYU player in history to return two fumbles for touchdowns. In a career Van Noy is also the last Cougar defender to score two touchdowns since Derwin Gray returned two interceptions in 1990-91. The BYU touchdown record for a defender is three by both Mike Russell (1973-74) and Todd Shell (1980-81). Van Noy becomes the ninth Cougar overall to score at least two touchdowns.

TOP OF THE CLASS

The BYU defense currently ranks atop the FBS Independent standings in total defense. BYU allows 353.3 yards per game, nine yards less than the second place team, Notre Dame. The Cougars also rank atop the FBS Independent team rankings in interceptions (8), forced fumbles (9) and fumbles recovered (7). The top statistical ranking for the Cougars, however, is in the passes defended category. Thanks in large part to senior corner Corby Eason and his 11 pass breakups, the Cougars rank first in the category with 41 passes defended, 12 ahead of Notre Dame in second with 29.

TURNOVER STREAK

The Cougar defense has forced a turnover in 11 of their last 12 games dating back to the 2010 season. The only game in 2011 that BYU has failed to produce a turnover came against Utah State. The Cougars have forced a total of six turnovers in the past two games against San Jose State and Oregon State.

CORNER TACKLING

Junior corner Preston Hadley led the Cougars with 11 total tackles and three pass breakups against Oregon State. The 11 tackles recorded by Hadley are the second most for an individual Cougar this season, just behind the 12 tackles recorded by Spencer Hadley against Texas. The 11 tackles by Hadley nearly doubled his season total of 16 and marked the first time a corner has led BYU in tackles so far this season. His three pass breakups also tied the individual high for a BYU player this season. Corby Eason recorded three pass breakups earlier this year against Utah.

FUMBLE RECOVERIES

After forcing and recovering two fumbles against Ole Miss, UCF and Oregon State, the Cougars are 4-0 in the last two seasons when recovering multiple fumbles. The Cougars forced and recovered two fumbles just once last season, in a 44-7 win versus Colorado State.

STUFFING THE RUN

BYU has held opposing offenses below 50 yards rushing in 8 of 14 halves so far this season, including both halves against Oregon State in which they allowed 33 and 26 yards, respectively. The performance against Oregon State came one week after the Cougars held San Jose State to 13 rushing yards on 12 carries in the first half, 1.1 yards per-carry average. The 1.1 average is the lowest for a BYU opponent in a half so far this season. The 13 yards gained by SJSU is also the lowest rushing total for a BYU opponent this season.

TURNOVER CITY

In seven games so far this season the BYU defense has forced 15 total turnovers. BYU is on pace to top its total of 23 turnovers gained from 2010, which they accrued over the course of 13 games. The top game for the Cougars this season came against Oregon State when they picked off two passes and recovered two fumbles for a total of four turnovers.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL DEFENSIVE NOTES

TREE TOS

With two forced fumbles at Oregon State, junior linebacker Brandon Ogletree became just the second player in BYU history to force two fumbles in a game since official records were kept in 2000. Andrew Rich also recorded two against No. 3 Oklahoma in 2009. Ogletree also had an interception vs. the Beavers.

ALL OVER THE FIELD

Sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy has tallied at least one statistic in every major defensive category in 2011, making him one of four players in the NCAA to do so this season. He continued his versatile streak against Oregon State with four unassisted tackles, an interception and a tackle-for-loss.

On the season, Van Noy has 20 unassisted tackles, 12 assisted tackles, 32 total tackles, three TFL, one sack, one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, three interceptions, one QBH and three pass breakups. He has an interception in three of the past four BYU games.

CANADA CAN WAIT

After finishing his junior campaign with 37 tackles, including 6.5 for loss, senior Jadon Wagner was drafted by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats with the 44th overall pick of the 2011 Canadian Football League Draft.

A native of Cranbrook, British Columbia, Wagner chose to bypass the opportunity to play in the CFL in order to return to the Cougars for his senior season.

Wagner had the best game of his 2011 season against UCF when he recorded six total tackles, including four in the first quarter.

Previous to enrolling at BYU, Wagner spent time with the Calgary Colts and Okargan Sun in the Canadian Junior Football League. As a rookie in the CJFL, Wagner led the nation in tackles with an average of 10 per game. He was also one of three players nominated for the CJFL Rookie of the Year award and helped lead his team to the conference final in his second year.

BREAKING UP IS HARD TO DO

Senior defensive back Corby Eason has recorded two or more pass breakups in four of the last five games and now has 11 on the season and 14 in his career and was recently named to Phil Steele's Midseason All-Independent First Team. Eason's season mark ties for second-most in a season at BYU (since official stats were kept in 2000) behind Brian Logan's 14 while his career mark is good for a tie for fourth-most. Logan also holds that record with 21 career breakups.

BEND BUT DON'T BREAK

In three of the last four games, the BYU passing defense has allowed quarterbacks to throw for 250 or more yards. In the matchup against Oregon State, the Cougars allowed freshman quarterback Sean Mannion to throw for 306 yards, the second time this season an opposing QB has gone for more than 300 yards against the Cougars. San Jose State finished with 255 yards against BYU and UCF threw for 318 yards. Despite the high yardage totals, each quarterback that has thrown for more than 250 yards against BYU this season has also thrown two interceptions. The Cougars are 3-0 in those games.

COMING BACK STRONG

Senior linebacker Jordan Pendleton has missed significant parts of the past two seasons with major leg injuries. In 2011, Pendleton missed three straight games with ankle injuries before returning against San Jose State. Since coming back to the defense, BYU is 2-0 and Pendleton has recorded 5.0 tackles-for loss and two sacks. Pendleton currently leads the Cougars in sacks, with two, and tackles-for-loss, with seven. He also has 20 tackles and two quarterback hurries so far this year.

FRAZIER ON LOTT TROPHY WATCH LIST

BYU senior linebaker Jameson Frazier has been named to the 2011 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List.

Named after Pro Football Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott, The Lott Trophy is awarded to college football's Defensive IMPACT Player of the Year for excellent performance both on and off the field.

Frazier has 17 total tackles, 3.0 TFL, .5 sacks, two QBH and one fumble recovery so far this season.

FORMER GHANIAN SPRINTER AT LINEBACKER

Two years ago, no one foresaw junior Ezekiel Ansah lining up for the BYU football team. A freshman at the time, Ansah was recruited to BYU as a sprinter for the track and field team.

A native of Accra, Ghana, Ansah related well to BYU sprint coach Leonard Myles-Mills, also a Ghana native. Despite never playing a down of football in his life, Ansah saw action in six games on special teams and defensive line in 2010 and has played on special teams in every game of 2011. He has three tackles and one QBH this season.

SOMEONE FROM EVERYWHERE

The defensive two-deep hails from all corners of the country. Player home states include from Alaska, California, Georgia, Hawaii, Massachusetts, Nevada, Utah, Texas and Washington.

In addition, linebacker Jadon Wagner is from Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada.

FOR THE LONGEST TIME

Cody Hoffman's 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the third quarter was the first for a Cougar in more than 13 years, a streak that spanned 158 games. Mike Rigell was the last BYU returner to take a kickoff the distance with a 96-yard return in 1998 against Hawaii.

Hoffman's kickoff return was the first touchdown by a BYU special teams unit since McKay Jacobson took a punt return for a touchdown as a freshman in 2006. For his performance, Hoffman was named the National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards.

DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung came to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

SPECIAL FLAG

In addition to the traditional team flag and alumni flag leading the team out of the tunnel before kick-off, BYU has also incorporated a special teams flag with an old school BYU logo this season. Against Oregon State, junior Mike Hague carried out the special teams flag.



KICK RETURN KING

Cody Hoffman is quickly moving up the career kickoff return list at BYU with 34 returns, 875 yards and a 25.7 average per return.

NO PUNTING ALLOWED

For the first time in the 2011 season, the BYU special teams unit was not forced to punt for the duration of the game against San Jose State. The Cougars either scored or turned the ball over on each possession of the game. The Cougars had just one game in 2010 with zero punts, which came in a 49-10 win at Colorado State on November 13. The Cougars nearly matched that feat against Oregon State on Saturday, as Riley Stephenson only punted once against the Beavers.

STRUGGLING FROM DEEP

For the first time this season and the first time in his career, BYU place kicker Justin Sorensen missed two field goals against Oregon State. Both field goals came from beyond 50 yards and were the two longest attempts of Sorensen's career. His first attempt from 50 yards was blocked while his second attempt from 53 yards sailed wide right. Sorensen made his third attempt of the game, a 33-yarder in the third quarter.

STAYING DISCIPLINED

The top statistical category the BYU so far this season has come thanks in large part to discipline. The Cougars currently rank 31st in fewest yards penalized per game and 36th in fewest penalties per game. Navy currently leads the nation in each category.

ALL-PURPOSE

Sophomore wide receiver Cody Hoffman returned kickoffs for the second consecutive game against UCF, which resulted in the first kickoff return for a touchdown since 1998 for the Cougars. As an all-purpose threat, Hoffman has led BYU in total yards in four of the last five games. Hoffman topped 200 total yards for the second time this season against Oregon State with 205 total yards. Against SJSU, Hoffman finished with 81 total yards, second on the team. Hoffman finished the game against UCF with a team high 153 total yards. Hoffman again led the Cougars in total yards against Utah State, with 158 total yards. The USU game marked the third consecutive game that Hoffman has led BYU in total yards. Against Utah, Hoffman had a career high 277 total yards to lead the team.

LEADING THE WAY

Sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen currently ranks 32nd in the NCAA in field goals per game with 1.43. He has nailed a field goal in the first half in four of six games this season and nailed two field goals in the second half against San Jose State. Sorensen is currently 10-14 on field goals this season, with a long of 48 yards. Sorensen has missed only one field goal inside of 40 yards this season and that came on his first attempt against Ole Miss, which was his first game as the regular field goal kicker for the Cougars. Sorensen leads BYU with 48 points this season.

MAKING THEM MISS

The BYU special teams unit contributed to the BYU in by helping force Oregon State kicked Trevor Romaine into two missed field goals, one in the fourth quarter. While the unit did not block either kick, the pressure caused by the rushers helped force each missed field goal. This game marks the first time this season that the Cougars have forced a team into two missed field goals.

BRONCO MENDENHALL 7TH SEASON

During his six seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to six straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 56-21 (.727) record as he begins his seventh season to rank No. 16 in total wins among all teams in the nation during that span. The Cougars have received six straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first six teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in four of the last five seasons to become the first Cougar teams to win four bowls in a five-year span since LaVell Edwards teams did so from 1980-84. Nationally, BYU is one of only 11 programs to win four bowl games in the last five seasons.

In the last five years the Cougars have achieved a 50-15 record -- only eight teams have more wins over that span. In fact, BYU is one of only seven FBS programs to win 10 or more games during at least four of the last five seasons, and BYU and Boise State are the only programs in the West to achieve that consistent level of success. From 2006-2009 Mendenhall guided the Cougars to four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

BYU's success under Mendenhall is also evident in



the national rankings and NCAA statistics. BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in the various national statistical categories 65 times in the past six seasons

(42 offense, 16 defense, 6 special teams, 1 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 39 top-15 statistical rankings, 29 top-10 rankings and 15 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during each of the past five seasons and finished ranked No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season and has totaled 185 selections during Mendenhall's tenure, along with 64 MWC Scholar-Athlete awards. BYU also ranks second nationally for Academic All-America recipients over the past three seasons. Six Cougar student-athletes have been named ESPN Academic All-Americans the past three years. Among all FBS schools only Penn State has had more during that period.

Going independent in 2011, BYU was consistently a top MWC contender under Mendenhall. BYU achieved a 39-9 (.813) conference record over the past six years to help the Cougars complete their 12-year tenure in the MWC with 64 conference wins -- the most of any MWC school. Mendenhall also helped the Cougars bring bowl wins over Oregon, UCLA, Oregon State and UTEP as the program enters a new era as one of four independent schools, joining Notre Dame, Army and Navy.

Last year's BYU team achieved a 7-6 record and tied for third in the MWC at 5-3 while playing 19 freshmen and facing a schedule that featured eight bowl teams and four opponents that finished in final BCS Top 25 standings. Mendenhall took over defensive coordinator responsibilities after the teams 1-4 start and the team responded to become one of the top defensive teams over the final eight games.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff has six members who have played professional football. Assistant Head Coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in 2002 and played three years for the 49er's, while defensive line coach Steve Kaufusi and outside linebacker coach Kelly Poppinga played in the NFL with the Arizona Cardinals. Graduate assistant Shaun Nua also spent some time with the Pittsburgh Steelers. In addition, receivers coach Ben Cahoon spent 13 years with the Canadian Football League's Montreal Alouettes before retiring as the CFL's all-time receptions leader.

In addition, Poppinga and Nua are both Super Bowl champions; Poppinga won a ring with the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII while Nua earned his in the Steelers' Super Bowl XL victory. Cahoon also won the ultimate prize in the CFL by leading the Montreal to three Grey Cup championships in 2002, 2009 and 2010.

THE NEW GUYS

The BYU coaching staff welcomed two new members this past offseason in running backs coach Joe DuPaix and receivers coach Ben Cahoon.

DuPaix most recently coached at Navy for the past three seasons, helping led the Midshipmen to three bowl bids. In each of his three seasons, Navy was one of the top-6 rushing programs in the country, including an NCAA-best 293.4 ypg in 2008. A Salt Lake City native, DuPaix played under his father, Roger, a successful high school coach at Skyline who also coached current BYU offensive coordinator Brandon Doman in high school. DuPaix played quarterback at Snow College (Ephraim, UT) and Southern Utah where he set the FCS record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a season.

Cahoon retired in after the 2010 season as the all-time receptions leader in CFL history. Cahoon also set records for most receiving yards in a career in Grey Cup games and most touchdowns by an Alouette in addition to earning the CFL Most Outstanding Canadian Award in 2002 and 2003. A native of Orem, Utah, Cahoon was an All-WAC performer in addition to being an Academic All-American. He is also the son-in-law of current Utah Governor Gary Herbert.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,470-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. With additional wheelchair access created in 2010-11, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63,470 beginning with the 2011 season.

"FAN" TASTIC FANS

The attendance at the BYU vs. Utah game was 63,742 - the first sellout for Edwards Stadium since last season's home opener against Washington. A sellout crowd of 63,513 also watched BYU's win over Utah State. In 2010, BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sellouts at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The prior time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWDS

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah in 2009 is currently 10th with 64,301 fans attending the game. In 2010, BYU averaged 61,380 fans per home game.



HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. Last season, BYU averaged 30.0 points per game at home. The Cougars have not had a negative points per game margin for the past seven seasons, including all six years of head coach Bronco Mendenhall's tenure. In 2006, a 35.16-point differential was a BYU record in scoring margin in the stadium's 46-year history and the program's 86-year history:
