## COUGAR QUICK HITS

— Last season at the Kajikawa Classic, BYU lost its first three games by a combined total of four runs before bouncing back to end the weekend with wins over Ole Miss and No. 19 Texas A&M.

— BYU softball is a member of the Western Athletic Conference after spending its previous 12 seasons in the Mountain West Conference. Softball is the only program at BYU that is in the WAC.

— BYU head coach Gordon Eakin begins his 10th season with a 371-160 (.699) record, placing him No. 18 among active coaches in career win percentage and would be No. 19 all-time on the same list (all-time list requires minimum of 10 years coaching). Last season, Eakin won his third-straight MWC Coach of the Year last season.

— The Cougars return three All-Conference performers, including senior Jessica Dugas and sophomore Carly Duckworth in 2011 and 2010 honoree JC Clayton, a junior this season.

**OPPONENT NOTES**

**OREGON STATE**

The Beavers return 15 letterwinners from a year ago, the majority of its offensive production and its entire pitching staff, including junior Tina Andreana and junior Ally Kutz. Erin Guzy, Oregon State's top batter in 2011 with a .259 average, also returns. While OSU only batted .228 as a team last season, the Beavers held opponents to a .247 average partly due to pitching but also thanks to a team .967 fielding percentage.

**TEXAS A&M**

The Aggies return their top pitcher, junior Mel Dumezich, who posted a 1.92 ERA, 30-10 record and 262 strikeouts in 44 appearances. Last season, BYU faced Texas A&M's other starting pitcher, Lindsey Sisk, who is also returning this season after posting a 14-5 record. BYU beat the Aggies, 7-2, after Carly Duckworth hit a solo home run and Delaney Willard knocked a two-out, two-RBI double in the top of the seventh to seal the win.

**TEXAS STATE**

Texas State is coming off an NCAA Regional appearance after winning the Southland Conference Tournament last season. The Bobcats are led by three-time all-conference pitcher Chandler Hall, who was not only the ace in the circle but also led the team with a .359 average last season. This is BYU's third contest against Texas State after splitting a pair of games in 2006.

**OREGON**

BYU looks to avenge last season's 3-2 season-opening loss to Oregon last year. The Cougars led the first four innings before the Ducks stole the lead and the game. Pitcher Jessica Moore may have the chance to beat BYU a second straight year. Moore comes back after being named All-Pac-12, helping Oregon advance to the Super Regional last season. Top hitters include sophomore Courtney Ceo (.378 avg, 64 hits) and senior Kelsey Chambers (13 HR, 21 extra base hits) to a team that lost only two of last season's starters.

**UC SANTA BARBARA**

BYU has won its last five games against UCSB, including two in 2010. The Gauchos return Keilani Jennings who led the team with a .317 average, including 15 doubles and six home runs, along with its next three best hitters from 2010 who each had averages above the .300 mark. A young team, UCSB also returns its top pitchers, Andriana Collins and Krista Cobb from a team that went 27-26 last year.

**LAST TIME OUT**

SEATTLE - The BYU softball team ended its season in the championship game of the Seattle Regional on Saturday, falling 7-5 to No. 14 Washington.

After qualifying for the NCAA tournament for the seventh-consecutive season, the Cougars finish with a 40-18 record after losing earlier to Washington and defeating No. 21 Auburn twice during the weekend.

BYU took the lead twice at 1-0 and 4-2, but Washington rallied both times to snatch away a possible victory.

Senior third baseman Caschjen Davis-Atagi, an All-Tournament Team unanimous selection, completed a solid weekend by hitting a two-run single against Washington. Junior designated hitter Tiffany Messerschmidt went 3-for-3 with two runs.

Later in the inning with the bases loaded, Atagi roped a two-run single to right field, giving BYU a 4-2 lead.

But Washington scored five runs on four hits and two Cougar errors, using a collection of hits to left field to bring multiple runners around and retake the lead for the final time.

Pitching in her final game, senior Paige Affleck got the start, striking out five with four walks, four hits and two runs in a no decision. Affleck joined Atagi on the All-Tournament Team after starting all four games for BYU over the weekend, winning two.

**BYU TABBED 4TH IN WAC PRESEASON POLL**

DENVER – The Western Athletic Conference softball coaches have picked the BYU softball team to finish fourth and Fresno State to win the 2012 WAC regular-season crown.

In addition, senior Jessica Dugas and sophomore Carly Duckworth were named to the preseason All-WAC team. Both players earned All-Mountain West Conference honors following the 2011 season.

In its first season as members of the WAC, the Cougars earned one first-place vote and 35 points. Fresno State took the top spot in the preseason poll with 44 points and three first-place votes. Hawai'i came in second, picking up two first-place votes and 42 points, followed by New Mexico State in third place with 37 points and two first-place votes. Nevada was picked to finish fifth with 20 points, followed by San Jose State and Louisiana Tech tied for sixth with 17 points apiece. Utah State rounded out the poll in eighth place with 12 points.

BYU took the MWC championship each of the last three seasons and has played in the NCAA tournament every year since 2005.

**UNBEATABLE AT HOME**

The Cougars have the second-longest home win streak in the country, having won 21 straight games, at Miller Field, including a 14-0 record last season. BYU has won 11 straight at home against conference opponents and 34 straight against non-conference foes.

**HOME RUN HITTER**

Junior right fielder Delaney Willard hit five home runs in four games recently against Seattle, Loyola Marymount and a doubleheader vs. Southern Utah. Willard's four-game home run streak ties her for the third-longest streak in NCAA history and is the longest for a BYU player since Stephanie Hopkins hit one out in four straight in April 2008. Her five homers are the most in a four-game span since Angie Quiocho hit six out of the park in April 2008.

**WIN STREAKS**

The Cougars have compiled 30 win streaks of five games or more in program history, including their recent streaks of 12 and 11 games, the first time in school history a team has had two double-digit win streaks in the same season. In 2010, BYU matched a season high with five such streaks, tying the 2005 Cougars. BYU set a program-high streak of 16 consecutive wins in both 2007 and 2009.

**COUGARS EARN VOTES IN TOP 25 POLLS**

PROVO, Utah - The BYU softball team earned votes in both the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate and USA Today/NFCA Division I Top 25 preseason polls released today. The Cougars garnered eight votes and one vote, respectively, in the polls.

In addition, the Cougars' 2012 schedule includes nine schools ranked or receiving votes in the ESPN.com poll and 11 schools in the USA Today rankings. Top programs BYU will face this season include defending national champion and No. 1/1 Arizona St. (Mar. 15), No. 4/2 Florida (Feb. 24), No. 11/16 Oregon (Feb. 11), No. 15/17 Texas A&M (Feb. 10, Feb. 24) and No. 16/11 Oklahoma St. (Feb. 23).

With eight votes in the ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate poll, BYU would be tied for No. 29 if the poll were to be extended while its one vote in the USA Today/NFCA Division I poll would place the Cougars tied at No. 39.

BYU is coming off a 40-18 record in 2010. Head coach Gordon Eakin won Mountain West Conference Coach of the Year after leading the Cougars to their third-straight conference title and seventh-straight NCAA Regional.

Playing in the Western Athletic Conference this season, BYU returns three All-MWC honorees, including senior Jessica Dugas, junior JC Clayton and sophomore Carly Duckworth.

**BYU ANNOUNCES MOVE TO PCSC IN 2013**

PORTLAND, Ore. - Brigham Young University has accepted an invitation to join the Pacific Coast Softball Conference, PCSC Commissioner Ellen Moore announced Monday. The Cougars' first year in the PCSC will be the 2013 softball season. The addition of BYU will give the PCSC seven teams for the 2013 campaign.

"The Pacific Coast Softball Conference is excited to formally welcome Brigham Young University softball into the PCSC family," said Moore. "In BYU, we have added an institution with a strong academic reputation, a tradition of excellence in athletics -- specifically softball -- and a loyal and supportive community of fans. We are thrilled to have them on board and can't wait for them to join us on the field in 2013.

"On behalf of the PCSC and our member institutions, I extend a very warm welcome to Coach Gordon Eakin and the BYU Cougars!"

The PCSC will have 12 teams for the upcoming 2012 season. The Big Sky Conference will begin sponsoring softball in 2013, meaning the PCSC's Big Sky core-members Idaho State, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Weber State will leave the PCSC after this season. Seattle University will also be leaving the PCSC for the Western Athletic Conference following the 2012 campaign.

Brigham Young was an original member of the Mountain West Conference, when the conference formed in 1999. The Cougars left the MWC this past summer, playing as an NCAA FBS Independent in football with the majority of its other sports joining the West Coast Conference. While the WCC does not sponsor softball, the Cougars will play the 2012 season in the WAC before joining fellow WCC members Loyola Marymount, San Diego, Saint Mary's and Santa Clara in the PCSC.

"We are grateful to have found a conference home in the Pacific Coast Softball Conference for our excellent softball team," said BYU director of athletics Tom Holmoe. "The PCSC provides an opportunity for Coach Eakin and his team to strengthen the national status they have earned during his tenure. The PCSC membership includes West Coast Conference partners with whom we hope to build a great softball conference."

Under Eakin, the Cougars have been the preeminent program of the Mountain West Conference. Eakin has guided BYU to a 371-160 record in nine years as head coach, with five Mountain West Conference titles. The Cougars went 40-18 en route to claiming their third consecutive conference title and seventh straight 40-win season. BYU has also made seven consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and advanced to the NCAA Super Regional in 2010.

"Our coaching staff and team are excited to have a new home in the PCSC," Eakin said. "The PCSC has high quality coaching staffs and I have no doubt their programs will provide tough competition and push us to improve. We are also thrilled with the new venues and the great West Coast weather they provide. We look forward to being an active partner in strengthening and moving forward the PCSC."

The PCSC was founded in the fall of 2002 when six members from the WAC, Western Intercollegiate Softball League and the Big West came together. The conference officially came into existence when it was approved by the NCAA on Oct. 17, 2002. The original members were Loyola Marymount, Portland State, Sacramento State, Saint Mary's, Santa Clara and San Diego.

The PCSC expanded to 12 teams in October 2008 with the addition of CSU Bakersfield, Idaho State, Northern Colorado, Seattle, Utah Valley and Weber State.

**EAKIN, ALVEY NAMED TO USA COACHES POOL**

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 1, 2011) - BYU head coach Gordon Eakin and associate head coach Vaughn Alvey were both selected to the USA Softball Women's National Team Coaching pool.

Eakin and Alvey are two of 24 coaches who may be selected as assistant coaches for the Women's and Junior Women's National team events this summer. BYU is the only school to have two coaches in the pool.

"We are thrilled to have a great cross section of coaches for the Women's National team program for the next two years," said ASA and USA Softball Executive Director Ron Radigonda. "With the ISF change of World Championships every two years, we are excited to assist coaches in gaining international experience and opportunities."

The placement is a stamp of approval for Eakin, who was the USA National Team hitting coach last summer. In 2010, Eakin helped the USA win tournaments around the world, including the World Championship in Venezuela and the World Cup in Oklahoma.

A two-time Mountain West Coach of the Year, Eakin has led the Cougar softball program since 2003, compiling a 331-142 (.700) record and the highest winning percentage in MWC history.

Alvey, BYU's top assistant and pitching coach for the last eight seasons, was selected to the coaching pool for the first time. At BYU, Alvey has coached Paige Affleck and Christie Zinanti, two of the most accomplished pitchers in BYU history, helping the Cougars win four conference championships in the last six years.

Alvey is a member of the Utah Sports Hall of Fame and coached at Alta High in Utah for 17 seasons, leading the Hawks to eight state titles. He also coaches girls summer programs, winning the AFA National Championship in 1992.



**BYU HEAD COACH GORDON EAKIN**

BYU head coach Gordon Eakin is entering his 10th season as the Cougars' head coach and his 13th season at BYU overall.

Eakin was named head coach in July 2002 after working as an assistant coach since the softball program's inception in 2000. Since that time he has led the Cougars to five Mountain West Conference championships and seven NCAA tournament appearances.

The MWC Coach of the Year three-straight years (2009, 2010, 2011) Eakin has coached eight All-Americans, seven MWC Players of the Year, three MWC Freshmen of the Year and two MWC Pitchers of the

Year during his tenure.

In 2011, Eakin led BYU to its third-straight MWC championship and seventh-consecutive NCAA Regional berth as the Cougars finished with a 40-18 record. In 2010, Eakin guided the Cougars to 46 wins, the most in school history, as BYU advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time ever with wins over East Carolina and host Texas before ending its season at national runner-up Arizona.

Known as one of the best hitting coaches in the country, Eakin helped the Cougars finish 13th in scoring and 30th in batting average last season and second in the country in batting average, seventh in scoring and ninth in slugging percentage in 2010. Overall BYU has finished in the top-ten nationally in slugging percentage six times, home runs per game six times, batting average four times and scoring four times under Eakin.

In addition to his duties at BYU, Eakin has also been an assistant coach and the hitting coach for the USA National Team since 2009. In the summer of 2010, Eakin helped guide the National Team to a 17-2 record as USA won the World Championship in Venezuela, the World Cup in Oklahoma and the Japan Cup championship in Sendai, Japan.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Eakin was a successful baseball and softball player. After playing collegiate baseball at the University of Utah, Eakin signed with the Oakland Athletics organization where he played for three years.

Eakin went on to join the United States All-Star team, playing in three U.S. Olympic sports festivals in 1986, 1993 and 1994, winning bronze, silver and gold, respectively. While on the team, Eakin was honored on the ISC All-World First Team and was an ASA All-American.

He would later go on to play shortstop on the internationally ranked Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch team, eventually earning induction into the Utah Fast Pitch Hall of Fame in 1998.

Eakin is a native of Holladay, Utah, and graduated from Granite High. He currently resides in Sandy, Utah, and is married to Barbi. They are the parents of three children (Alicia, Ryan & Parker) and have four grandsons.
