WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- BYU will honor 19 seniors this weekend at the game, including offensive lineman Terence Brown, running back JJ Di Luigi, defensive back Corby Eason, tight end Matt Edwards, defensive lineman Hebron Fangupo, linebacker Jameson Frazier, wide receiver Spencer Hafoka, wide receiver McKay Jacobson, running back Bryan Kariya, linebacker Aveni Leung-Wai, wide receiver/holder Matt Marshall, linebacker Jordan Pendleton, defensive lineman Matt Putnam, offensive lineman Matt Reynolds, defensive back Steven Thomas, offensive lineman Marco Thorson, safety Travis Uale, defensive lineman Simote Vea and linebacker Jadon Wagner.

- This is the first-ever matchup between the two schools and the third time this season BYU has played an opponent for the first time in program history after also facing Ole Miss and UCF earlier this year.

- Sophomore Jake Heaps will start at quarterback this weekend for the first time this season since Sept. 30 against Utah State after junior Riley Nelson was injured last week against Idaho. Heaps started the first five games of this season and last 10 games of the 2010 season as a true freshman.

- Under head coach Bronco Mendenhall, BYU has posted a 21-3 record in November with all three losses coming against Utah.

- The Cougars are 3-0 against WAC teams this year with contests against New Mexico State and Hawai'i still to be played. BYU has already defeated Utah State, San Jose State and Idaho.

- BYU has just two games this November, only the second season along with 2003 that BYU has played less than three November games since 1943. BYU has played just two games in November in only five of its previous 86 seasons (2003, 1942, 1931, 1928, 1925). The only time the Cougars won both games during those years was in 1925 with wins over Western State and Montana State.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL LAST TIME - IDAHO

COUGARS CRUISE PAST VANDALS, 42-7

PROVO, Utah - Strong defense and consistent offense led the BYU football team to a 42-7 win over the Idaho Vandals on Saturday at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

BYU (7-3) had a balanced attack of 262 passing yards, and 243 rushing yards to help beat Idaho (2-8,1-4). The Cougar defense held the Vandals to 241 total yards, including just 50 passing yards. BYU limited Idaho to minus-2 passing yards on four complete passes in the first half.

"I think our team was anxious to play," BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall said. "It certainly added to their excitement level to play another game. It was a cleanly played football game, a few penalties at the end, but overall a cleanly played game. Another solid football game and another chance to improve and I think we did and now we move forward."

Linebacker Kyle Van Noy recorded a career-high 10 tackles, including two tackles for loss, one sack and forced a fumble. Cornerback Jordan Johnson and linebacker Spencer Hadley each intercepted a pass for the Cougars.

Quarterback Jake Heaps came in for an injured Riley Nelson in the first quarter and completed 15 of 20 passes for 185 yards and two touchdowns. Nelson was 4 of 7 for 56 yards and one touchdown before leaving with a chest injury.

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman caught six passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns, all in the first half. Running back Michael Alisa had 10 carries for 99 yards, including a 38-yard touchdown run, and running back Bryan Kariya scored two touchdowns on the ground while picking up 35 yards.

The Cougars missed a field goal on their first possession but went on to score touchdowns on the next five possessions. Nelson completed a 32-yard touchdown pass to Hoffman and gave BYU a 7-0 lead with 8:26 left in the first quarter and then left the game for good.

Heaps came in relief on the next drive. The sophomore led a 9-play, 78-yard drive ending in a 17-yard rushing touchdown from Kariya. Heaps was 3 of 3 on the drive for 42 yards. BYU led 14-0 after the score with 1:18 left in the first quarter. On the Cougars next possession, Kariya punched in another touchdown from one yard out, giving BYU a 21-0 lead.

With just 1:23 left in the half, the Cougar offense took over and added one more touchdown before the break. Heaps completed four passes for 60 yards on the drive. Hoffman grabbed his second touchdown of the game, bringing down a 21-yarder to give BYU a 28-0 lead at the half.

BYU got another touchdown on its first possession of the second half. This time Alisa took a handoff 38 yards on the ground for six and Justin Sorensen's extra point made it 35-0 with 12:31 left in the third quarter.

Continuing to get a lot of help from the defense, BYU continued to pound away at Idaho. Jordan Johnson got his second interception of the season, setting the Cougars up with a short 22-yard field. Heaps connected with wide receiver Ross Apo for a 18-yard touchdown pass and stretched the lead to 42-0 with 5:37 on the clock in the third quarter.

The Vandals broke up the shutout on the ensuing drive. Idaho's running back got around the edge for 82 yards all the way into the end zone making it 42-7.

IDAHO GAME NOTES

RUNNING UP THE RANKS

JJ Di Luigi moved into 11th on the BYU career rushing yards list with 42 yards against Idaho. Di Luigi now has 1,670 career rushing yards, 284 behind Brian McKenzie's 1,954 yards.

SUPER SOPH

Sophomore Kyle Van Noy totaled a career-high 10 tackles, including a career-best 9 solo tackles. Van Noy also added 2 TFL, a sack and a forced fumble.

WERE YOU ALIVE WHEN ...?

BYU's win is its first over Idaho at home and its first over the Vandals since 1953, a span of 58 years. It's the second-longest time between two wins over a program in team history after a span of 62 years between wins over Nevada (1939 to 2001).

BYEING TIME

BYU improves to 7-1 under Bronco Mendenhall and 11-2 in the last 10 years in games following a bye week. The Cougars have outscored their opponents 141-21 in the last three years in games following a bye.

A SMART SCORER

Senior running back Bryan Kariya scored two touchdowns, his third multi-TD game of his career after rushing for two last season against SDSU and scoring twice on a rush and a catch in 2009 at Tulane.

COUNT IT FOR CODY

Cody Hoffman finished the night with 114 yards (a career-high for a half) and two touchdowns in the first half alone along with 38 kickoff return yards. It's Hoffman's third 100-yard game and second multi-TD game of the season.

COME ON STRONG

Coming in for an injured Riley Nelson, sophomore Jake Heaps went 11 for 15 for 143 yards and a TD in the first half. Heaps finished with 185 yards on 15 of 20 passing with two touchdowns.

HARK, IT'S LARK

Junior quarterback James Lark played in his fifth career game, throwing 2 for 6 for 21 yards with two rushes for 12 yards. His completions, attempts and rushing yards are all career highs.

RUN LONG

Michael Alisa's 38-yard TD run in the third quarter is his and the Cougars' second-longest TD run of the year after the sophomore took one 42 yards to the house against Idaho State.

START OFF RIGHT

BYU allowed 1 pass completion for 2 yards, 1 first down, no points and no third-down conversions in the first quarter. In the second quarter, the Cougars allowed three completions, minus-4 yards passing, 3 first downs, no points and 2 third-down conversions. Idaho had minus-2 yards passing and 63 yards total at the half.

THE BYU-NEW MEXICO STATE SERIES

This is the first meeting betweent he BYU Cougars and the New Mexico State Aggies.

NEW MEXICO STATE LAST TIME

LAS CRUCES, N.M. - The New Mexico State football team defeated Fresno State for the first time in school history, 48-45, Saturday night at Aggie Memorial Stadium, behind Taveon Rogers' school record breaking 412 all-purpose yards. The Aggies move to 4-6 on the season and 2-3 in the WAC, while Fresno State falls to 3-7 on the year and 2-3 in conference play.

Fresno State took its opening kickoff of the second half and marched 76 yards in five plays to take a 24-23 lead with 12:28 remaining in the third quarter. The Aggies would have to punt in their first possession of the second half. The Bulldogs then struck quick with a 59-yard touchdown pass to give Fresno State a 31-23 lead with 10:34 left in the third.

NM State responded with a 68-yard drive, capped off by a Turner 10-yard touchdown run, his second of the game. The Aggies then went for two and converted on a pass from Christian to Turner, tying the game at 31 all with just under seven minutes left in the third quarter. The Bulldogs again hit a long pass to score on the first play of the drive to retake a 7-point lead at 38-31 with 6:22 to go in the third.

Turner then scored on a 6-yard run to tie the game at 38-38 with 3:50 to go in the third. The Aggies drove the ball 84 yards on 12 plays. Turner's touchdown run marked a personal-best for touchdowns in a game. The NM State defense then forced the Bulldogs to punt the ball back to the Aggies.

The Aggies took advantage of the opportunity, as Stampler hit a 25-yard field after an eight-play 59-yard drive, giving NM State 41-38 lead with 13:25 to go in the game. The Bulldogs came right back and scored to go up 45-41 with 8:05 left in the game, following a 10-play 84-yard drive, capped off by a 2-yard rushing touchdown.

The Aggies would take the lead back at 48-45 late in the game on a 37-yard touchdown pass from Christian to Rogers with 1:50 left in the game. The Aggie defense then stopped the Bulldogs, as Courtney Viney deflected a pass on fourth-and-10. The Aggies would then run out the clock to end the game and take the win, 48-45.

2011 NEW MEXICO STATE OUICK FACTS

WALKER KNOWS BYU

The Aggies head coach DeWayne Walker knows BYU as he worked under LaVell Edwards in 1994 as the Cougars' cornerbacks coach. He has also coached against BYU three times in his coaching career. Walker worked as UCLA's defensive coordinator from 2006-08. The Bruins played the Cougars three times during that stretch. UCLA defeated BYU in the 2007 regualar season 27-17 but BYU got back at them with a 17-16 win in the Las Vegas Bowl the same year. Walker's last trip to Provo wasn't a memorable one for him however, when the Cougars blasted UCLA 59-0 at LaVell Edwards Stadium in 2008.

WHAT IS AN AGGIE?

New Mexico State is the second set of Aggies that the Cougars will play in 2011. The nickname "Aggie" in college athletics often refers to a school where it currently is or its origin comes from being an "agricultural" school, with "aggie" becoming a nickname for the students of that school. Several schools that are "A&M" schools, (Agricultural and Mechanical) use the nickname "aggies" also, such as Texas A&M.

BRONCO AND BOWLS

Head coach Bronco Mendenhall has BYU to six wins again for the seventh consecutive year. He is currently one of only three FBS coaches to have his team bowl eligible in his first seven seasons along with Oklahoma's Bob Stoops and Georgia's Mark Richt. During Mendenhall's tenure, BYU is 4-2 with five trips to the Las Vegas Bowl and last year's trip to the New Mexico Bowl and a 52-24 victory over UTEP.

BYU VS. BCS AQS

With the victories over Ole Miss of the SEC and Oregon State of the Pac-12, BYU has defeated at least one team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference six-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 15 of the past 16 years dating back to 1996. BYU is 2-2 vs. BCS schools this season.

With its win against Oregon State, the Cougars have also defeated a Pac-12 team team each of the last six years.

HOME COOKIN'

Head coach Bronco Mendenhall has often emphasized the importance of winning at home. Since taking the reigns of the program, BYU is 34-7 at home. The Cougars are 5-1 this year at home and last season BYU was 5-1 at LaVell Edwards Stadium. Mendenhall and the Cougars won 18-straight games in Provo from 2006-09.

JUST TWO, NOT FIVE

The Cougars are playing just two games in the month of November, with a bye week before the Idaho game and another one following the New Mexico State game. The last time BYU had just two games in a month (not including December and bowl games) was in October of 2007 when the Cougars had a bye week leading up to a game at UNLV, played Eastern Washington at home the week following and then took another week off before their next game. The Cougars went 2-0 in those games, defeating UNLV 24-14 and Eastern Washington 42-7. BYU also just beat Idaho 42-7 last week.

Interestingly enough, another parallel of 2007 and 2011 and monthly game oddities - BYU played five games in the month of September in both seasons as well. In 2007 the Cougars went 3-2 to match 2011's September effort of 3-2.

BELL HELICOPTER ARMED FORCES BOWL

For the seventh-straight season, BYU is bowl eligible. In fact, head coach Bronco Mendenball is one of only three Division I head coaches to this point to have his team bowl eligible in his first seven seasons as a head coach. Mendenhall is 4-2 in bowl games, most recently picking up a dominating 52-24 win over UTEP in the 2010 New Mexico Bowl. With this being the first year of independence for the football program, unique bowl scenarios had to be worked out, and this year the Cougars have struck a deal with the Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl. Now that BYU is bowl eligible, it is possible the team will be headed to Dallas, Tex., for a matchup against a team selected from Conference USA. DON'T HASSLE THE HOFF

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman has become the playmaking receiver even though he got off a to a slow start. Hoffman caught just three passes for 20 yards in the first two games but for the season now has caught 43 passes for 672 yards and six touchdowns.He has made play after play recently and has averaged 139.3 all-purpose yards. He has set career game-highs in receptions, yards, kick returns and all-purpose yards in various games this season. Hoffman has been especially dangerous as a kick returner. He has 718 kick return yards on the season, including a 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown, the first by a BYU player since 1998.

SPECIAL THIRD QUARTERS

While BYU has been outscored 72-68 in the third quarter for 2011, the Cougars have managed to do some big things on special teams. Cody Hoffman's 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown took place in the third quarter vs. UCF. Against TCU, JD Falslev's 67-yard punt return for a touchdown also happened in the third quarter. In recent years, the third quarter has been a "special" one like this year. In 2004, linebacker Gary Lovely blocked a punt at Air Force in the third quarter and recovered it for an 8-yard touchdown. In 1998 Mike Rigell's 94-yard touchdown on a kickoff took place in the third quarter at Hawaii and in 1996 James Dye took two punts, one for 79 yards at Utah State and another for 67 yards vs. Rice in for touchdowns and a 100-yard kickoff reutrn for a touchdown against UTEP - all in the third guarter.

ALWAYS IMPROVING

BYU has been steadily improving throughout the season. After a low point in the season and struggling against Utah, the Cougars have seen a jump in their offensive output. After Utah, BYU was ranked 118th nationally in rushing with 48 yards per game, and now sit at 54th with 165.00 yards per game. After the UCF game the Cougars had the 111th ranked total offense with 291.3 yards per game. six games later BYU is ranked 54th at 398.9 yards per game. Scoring has also improved as well, going from 18.2 points per game to 28.4 points per game. With two more regular-season games to go, the Cougars will have plenty of opportunities to improve.

1,000/1,000 CLUB

BYU now has two members in its 1,000 career receiving yards and 1,000 career kickoff return yards. Cody Hoffman joins Austin Collie as the only two players to reach the mark. Hoffman now has 1,199 career receiving yards to go along with 1,098 career kickoff return yards. Hoffman caught six passes for 114 yards against Idaho (all in the first half). He caught four passes for 67 yards and returned seven kicks for a career-high 167 yards vs. TCU to cross over the 1,000 mark earlier in the year. Collie is BYU's career receiving yards leader with 3,255 yards and fourth in career kickoff return yards with 1,277 yards.

ONE OF EACH

JD Falslev's punt return for a touchdown gave BYU a kick and punt return touchdown in the same season for the first time since 1996. Cody Hoffman's returned a kickoff 93 yards for a touchdown vs. UCF earlier this season. During the '96 season returner James Dye did both, returned two different punts for touchdowns, one from 79 yards at Utah State and another from 67 yards out vs. Rice. Dye also took a kickoff 100 yards for a score against UTEP during the '96 season.

HE'S KIND OF A BIG DEAL

Senior captain and offensive tackle Matt Reynolds is amidst a successful senior season after deciding not to enter the NFL draft despite a first round projection. Reynolds has been rewarded with several preseason accolades, including being named a preseason All-American by by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, CBSCollegeSports.com, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others. Along with those honors, Reynolds has recognized as an Outland Trophy Candidate, a Lombardi Award Candidate and a Lowe's Senior Class Award Nominee.

BAND OF BROTHERS

While BYU's motto is "Band of Brothers," there are four sets of brothers on the 2011 roster including Terence (Sr. OL) and Rhen (Jr. WR) Brown, Braden (Jr. OL) and Trevor Brown (Fr. TE), Matt (Sr. OL) and Houston (So. OL) Reynolds, and Iona (So. RB) and Baker (Fr. DL) Pritchard.

In addition, 13 different players, Kevan Bills, Gavin Fowler, Spencer Hafoka, Braden Hansen, Alex Kuresa, Marcus Mathews, Zed Mendenhall, Rex Morgan, Mike Muehlmann, Houston Reynolds, Matt Reynolds, Jordan Richardson and Jadon Wagner also boast brothers who have played for the Cougar football program in the past.

FATHER'S DAY

Currently seven BYU players are also fathers, led by senior wide receiver Spencer Hafoka, with two children. Other dads on the team include Matt Reynolds, Travis Uale, Alani Fua, Aveni Leung-Wai and newest dad, Brandon Ogletree. Nine players also had fathers who played football at BYU: Famika Anae (Robert), Dallin Cutler (Chuck), Gavin Fowler (Blaine), Jameson Frazier (Danny), Colby Hansen (Regan), Carter Mees (Mike), Jordan Pendleton (Kirk), Matt Reynolds (Lance) and Houston Reynolds (Lance).

Two BYU coaches - Brandon Doman and Kelly Poppinga - have also each welcomed a new addition to their family this season.

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 44 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 17 different countries including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cambodia, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, El Salvador, Fiji, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Paraguay, Peru, South Korea, Thailand and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of seven different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Cambodian, French, Korean, Portuguese, Spanish and Thai.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga is one of 73 players (61 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 29 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Germany, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, Mongolia, Mozambique, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 14 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nevada, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas.

Overall, 50 current members (42 percent) of the BYU football team speak a combined total of 21 different foreign languages and dialects, including Cebuano, Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Italian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Swedish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

* The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.

* The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and Paul in the Bible).

* More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.

* Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.

* Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions — except for their transportation to and from their field of labor — and are not paid for their services.

* Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.

* Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in 14 additional countries including Brazil, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico and Spain.

* Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."

* A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.

* In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.

* Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

MCKAY AND HIS QB'S

Wide receiver McKay Jacobson has had the luxury of having a top-notch quarterback be around him for almost all of his football career. While he currently has the promising sophomore Jake Heaps and gritty junior Riley Nelson, he has caught passes at BYU from NFL guarterbacks Max Hall and John Beck. Even at the high school level, Jacobson connected with future NFL talent. At Carroll High School in Southlake, Texas (an incredibly fruitful recruiting ground), former Alabama guarterback Greg McElroy who led the Crimson Tide to a 2009 National Championship tossed the pigskin to Jacobson befor entering the NFL. Another NFL quarterback, Chase Daniel was Jacobson's guarterback for two years in high school as well.

BALANCED ATTACK

In its last six games, BYU has seen great balance from its passing and running game. The Cougars have 1,378 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns to go along with 1,397 passing yards and 15 touchdowns. In five of the six games, BYU has gone for at least 200 rushing yards and 200 passing yards. The Cougars had seven different players combine to rush for 243 yards and three touchdowns and Riley Nelson, Jake Heaps and James Lark combined to throw for 262 yards and three more touchdowns vs. Idaho. Against Idaho State, BYU ran for a season-high 290 yards and four touchdowns while adding 282 passing yards and three touchdowns. The week before against Oregon State BYU rolled up 282 yards on the ground and 217 in the air. Against San Jose State, BYU was even more balanced, rushing for 224 yards and throwing for 219 yards and vs. Utah State, the Cougars used 251 passing yards and 200 rushing yards to beat the Aggies.

AND IT CAME TO PASS

The BYU offense has had three touchdown passes in four of its last five games and has had at least one TD pass in 9 of 10 games this season. Last season, the Cougars had just two games with three or more TD throws and had a TD throw in only 8 of 13 games.

THIRD DOWNS ... NOW AND THEN

BYU is currently ranked No. 7 in the nation in third-down conversions, converting 51.52 percent. At the end of September, BYU was 78th in third-down coversions, converting 38.86 percent. In September, the Cougars converted 30 of 77 third downs, while in October BYU converted 33 of 50 third downs, good for the best mark in the nation for the month. Against Idaho last week, BYU was 9 of 13 on third down to improve their mark even more.

GROUND GAME GOING

After a slow start to the running game, BYU has rushed for 1,505 yards in its last seven games, an average of over 215 yards per game. The Cougars rushed for just 145 yards total in the first three games combined. BYU picked up 243 yards against Idaho but had its lowest output in a while against TCU with 139 net rushing yards. The running game went four-straight games prior to TCU with at least 200 yards and improved each game. The running game picked up an even 200 yards against Utah State, 224 against San Jose State, 282 at Oregon State and a season-high 290 vs. Idaho State.

BYU also didn't have a rushing touchdown in the first three games but have had 13 in the last seven games. JJ Di Luigi leads the way with 89 carries, 457 yards and three touchdowns. Quarterback Riley Nelson helps in the ground game as the Cougars second leading rusher despite seeing limited time the first four games with 379 yards on 78 attempts with one touchdown. Newly discovered running back Michael Alisa is now third on the team with 353 yards on 63 carries and has three touchdowns, with 351 of those coming in the last five games.

OH, HE PLAYS FOOTBALL, TOO

Running back Bryan Kariya has been an asset or the BYU ground game for the last several years. He has also been an asset in the classroom. Kariya was just named to the Capital One All-Academic District 8 Team. With a 3.9 GPA and a major in Chinese with a minor in business, Kariya plans to head out to dental school after his BYU career is over. Last season, Kariya was the only Division I running back named Academic All-American by ESPN. Kariya leads the team in rushing touchdowns with four.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE NOTES

HOFFMAN KEEPS IT GOING

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman continues his streak, catching at least one pass in 16-straight games. Hoffman snagged six passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns, all in the first half against Idaho. He had four receptions for 67 yards vs. TCU. Against Idaho State he had five catches for 71 yards and two touchdowns. Hoffman set career-highs at Oregon State with 9 receptions for 162 yards. The redshirt sophomore caught four passes for 68 yards and one touchdown against Utah State. He grabbed three receptions for 24 yards against UCF. Hoffman finished with a team-high eight catches and 138 yards vs. Utah. He extends his streak to 16 games with at least one reception and 22 of 23 career games.

STAYING ON THE FIELD

BYU currently holds on to the football for 31:22 minutes per game on average. That is more than half of the game and that time is good for the No. 32 in the nation. One of the Cougar's biggest assetts in helping maintain that time of possession is the fact in Riley Nelson four starts at quarterback before leaving with injury vs. Idaho. BYU has had just two times where they didn't get a first down and went three and out. The first time was against Oregon State in the third guarter. Two penalties that pushed them back 20 yards cost the team when they managed to gain 18 but came up short of moving the chains. The second was in the second guarter at TCU. Nelson looked to have completed a 7-yard pass to JJ Di Luigi and get a first down but Di Luigi had stepped out of bounds before he caught the ball, resulting in an illegal touch and forced BYU to punt after a three-and-out. In the past four games BYU has attempted (The Cougars had two snapping issues on punts vs. TCU and did not get those punts off) just six punts in the last four games, and four of those coming against the Horned Frogs.

DI LUIGI DOES IT ALL

Senior running back JJ Di Luigi was named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List before the season began. The versatile back had 8 carries for 42 yards vs. Idaho to go along with two catches for 16 yards. Di Luigi has averaged 67.7 all-purpose yards per game in 2011, contributing all over the field in the run game and catching passes out of the back field. The California native moved into 17th all-time at BYU in all-purpose yards and is 11th in career rushing yards. He is in 64th in career-receiving yards with 938. Here is how Di Luigi looks on the all-time lists and who he might pass in the coming weeks:

GOING FOR A DRIVE

BYU's 99-vard touchdown drive vs. Idaho State was the longest of the 2011 season. The long drive ties the longest since a 99-yard drive vs. Utah State in 2006. BYU had a 97-yard scoring drive at Texas. The Cougars' game-winning drive against the Utah State Aggies was 96 yards officially, although the team actually had to go 98 yards. Quarterback Riley Nelson lost two vards on his first rush of the drive, pushing BYU all the way back to inside its own two yard line.

TIGHT ENDS STRONG

In 2011, the Cougar tight ends have accounted for 45 catches, 513 yards and three touchdowns. In 2010, the tight ends caught 34 passes for 452 yards and no touchdowns. The tight ends will have their work cut out for them to keep up the pace, losing Richard Wilson for the season with a knee injury as well. Wilson had 11 receptions, 130 yards and one touchdown. Marcus Mathews leads the way with 21 grabs for 185 yards and one touchdown and Austin Holt has caught 11 more for a tight end high 180 yards. Kaneakua Friel has recently got into the action and has two catches for 18 yards and one touchdown.With two regular season games left and a possible bowl game, the young position group can continue to grow and build on to a stronger 2011.

WIDE RECEIVER TWINS

BYU has a unique combination of size and speed in the receiving corps with Cody Hoffman and Ross Apo. Hoffman and Apo both weigh in at over 200 pounds and are 6-foot-4 and 6-foot 3, respectively. Against Idaho, in the first half vs. Idaho, Hoffman caught six passes for 114 yards and two touchdowns while Apo had two catches for 28 yards, including an 18-yard touchdown grab. At TCU, Hoffman caught four passes for 67 yards and Apo caught a 42-yard strike. The week before vs. Idaho State both receivers ended up with a matching five catches for 71 yards. The difference was Hoffman caught two touchdowns while Apo caught one score. Apo did have the longer reception at 30 yards, however. Hoffman and Apo have caught touchdowns in the same game twice this year. Hoffman leads the way in season totals with 43 catches for 672 yards and six touchdowns but Apo is second on the team with 25 catches for 332 yards and five touchdowns.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL DEFENSIVE NOTES

HOLDING THEM BACK

Since playing their best overall game of the season against Idaho State, the BYU defense has held its opponent's offenses below their season averages each week. Against Idaho, the Cougars held the Vandals to 50 yards net passing, the lowest total for a BYU defense this season and 130 yards below their season average. BYU also held the Vandals to 241 yards of total offense, 45 below their season average.

The week previous, BYU held the TCU passing attack to 157 yards, 76 yards below their season average of 233 ypg. BYU also prevented the TCU rushing attack from reaching their season average of 217 yards-per-game by limiting them to 136 yards on the ground. Despite losing the game 38-28, the Cougars held the TCU offense averaging 453 yards-per-game to 283 total yards.

The performance against TCU was sparked by a dominant performance the week earlier against Idaho State when the Cougars held ISU to 20 rushing yards on 19 attempts. BYU also limited the Bengals to three points, the first time a BYU defense has held an opposing offense to three points or less since defeating Wyoming 52-0 in 2009.

STELLAR SOPHOMORE

Sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy recorded a career-high 10 tackles, including a career-best 9 solo tackles. Van Nov also added 2 tacklesfor-loss, a sack and a forced fumble. Two weeks earlier against Idaho State, Van Noy blocked Idaho State's first punt attempt, marking the first time a Cougar has blocked a kick since the Colorado State game in 2009. Van Nov currently has 49 total tackles. 34 unassisted tackles. 15 assisted tackles, 8.0 tackles-for-loss, 4.0 sacks, 2 forced fumbles, 1 fumble recovery, 3 interceptions, 3 pass breakups and four guarterback hurries. Van Noy also recorded his first career touchdown this season after forcing and recovering a fumble against Ole Miss in the season opener. He is currently the only player in the FBS with one of every major defensive statistic and a punt block.

BEHIND ENEMY LINES

BYU continued its streak of recording at least 4.0 TFL to six games against Idaho. Four different Cougars combined to record 5.0 TFL and Kyle Van Noy led the way with 2.0 TFL in the game.

VAN NOY RECORD

With a fumble recovery for a touchdown against Ole Miss, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy became the first BYU player in history to return two fumbles for touchdowns. Van Noy is also the last Cougar defender to score two touchdowns since Derwin Gray returned two interceptions in 1990-91. The BYU touchdown record for a defender is three by both Mike Russell (1973-74) and Todd Shell (1980-81). Van Noy becomes the ninth Cougar overall to score at least two touchdowns.

OCTOBER'S BEST

BYU led all FBS Independent teams in most major defensive categories in the month of October. The Cougars led all FBS Independent teams in scoring defense (21.3 ppg), rushing defense (71.4 ypg), total defense (306.0 ypg), sacks (9.0), TFL (25.0), interceptions (7) and opponent third down conversions (37.04%). The 71.4 rushing yards allowed per game was less than half of what second place Notre Dame allowed in October (174.75).

TURNOVER STREAK

The Cougar defense has forced a turnover in 13 of their last 15 games dating back to the 2010 season. BYU failed to produce a turnover against TCU and Utah State this season and are 1-1 in those games. BYU forced a fumble in both games but did not recover it. BYU forced two interceptions against Idaho and also forced a fumble but did not recover it.

ROAD WARRIORS

After playing four games on the road or at neutral sites, the BYU defense ranks seventh in total defense in the NCAA when away from home. The Cougars are allowing 286.3 yards per game when playing on the road and rank behind six teams that are currently ranked in the AP Top 25. BYU is also one of two non-BCS teams in road defense, along with No. 10 Boise State.

GREAT START TO THE MONTH

Two weeks into the month of November, the BYU defense continues to build on its success of October. In the month of Thanksgiving, the Cougars currently rank first in passing defense after holding Idaho to 50 net yards passing last week. In addition the the passing defense, the Cougars also rank second nationally in November scoring defense, fifth in total defense, and 15th in interceptions. BYU plays New Mexico State on November 19, its second and only remaining game in the month of November.

BREAK IT UP

BYU defensive back Corby Eason currently has 12 pass breakups in 2011, which is the second most by a BYU player in a single season since 2000. Eason is on pace to top the post-2000 mark set by cornerback Brian Logan in 2009 of 14 pass breakups. Eason is averaging 1.20 pass breakups per game. Fellow cornerback Preston Hadley is also on pace to top Logan's 14 pass breakups this season. Hadley currently has 10 pass breakups this season and is averaging 1.11 per game. This is the first season since 2000 that the Cougars have had two defensive players with double digit pass breakups. The Hadley-Eason combination has led the Cougars to 57 pass breakups on the season, which currently ranks 11th in the NCAA.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL DEFENSIVE NOTES

TURNOVERS 'R' US

In nine games so far this season the BYU defense has forced 20 total turnovers. BYU is on pace to top its total of 23 turnovers gained from 2010, which they accured over the course of 13 games. The top game for the Cougars this season came against Oregon State when they picked off two passes and recovered two fumbles for a total of four turnovers. BYU forced two interceptions against Idaho, no turnovers against TCU and three interceptions against Idaho State.

NO PASS TD

BYU has not allowed a passing touchdown in six games this season, including last weekend against Idaho. Opposing offenses have just one passing red zone touchdown against BYU this season

STARTING OFF RIGHT

BYU allowed one pass completion for two yards, one first down, no points and no third down conversions in the first quarter against Idaho. In the second quarter, the Cougars alowed three completions, minus-four yards passing, three first downs, no points and two third-down conversions. Idaho had minus-two yards passing and 63 total yards at the half. The Vandals accrued nearly half of their total 241 yards on one 82yard run in the third quarter.

COG IN THE MIDDLE

Despite missing one game due to injury, junior linebacker Brandon Ogletree is currently leading the BYU defense in total tackles, assisted tackles and unassisted tackles and ranks second on the team with two forced fumbles. Ogletree has 53 total tackles on the season, giving him an average of just over six and a half tackles per game. Ogletree also forced two fumbles and recorded an interception against Oregon State. For his efforts against the Beavers, Ogletree received Honorable Metion Linebacker of the Week honors from the College Football Performance Awards. Ogletree also ranked sixth in NCAA in the month of October with two forced fumbles.

RISING UP AGAINST THE BCS

Through nine games in 2011, BYU has faced off against four BCS teams (Ole Miss, Texas, Utah, Oregon State) and one future BCS opponent (TCU). In games against BCS teams, the BYU defense ranks 30th in total defense, 32nd in rushing defense and 32nd in passing defense. All three rankings are at the best among FBS Independent teams against BCS teams.

FUMBLE RECOVERIES

After forcing and recovering two fumbles against Ole Miss, UCF and Oregon State, the Cougars are 4-0 in the last two seasons when recovering multiple fumbles. The Cougars forced and recovered two fumbles just once last season, in a 44-7 win versus Colorado State.

FRAZIER ON LOTT TROPHY WATCH LIST

BYU senior linebaker Jameson Frazier has been named to the 2011 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List.

Named after Pro Football Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott, The Lott Trophy is awarded to college football's Defensive IMPACT Player of the Year for excellent performance both on and off the field.

Frazier has 17 total tackles, 3.0 TFL, .5 sacks, two QBH and one fumble recovery so far this season.

FORMER GHANIAN SPRINTER AT LINEBACKER

Two years ago, no one foresaw junior Ezekiel Ansah lining up for the BYU football team. A freshman at the time, Ansah was recruited to BYU as a sprinter for the track and field team.

A native of Accra, Ghana, Ansah related well to BYU sprint coach Leonard Myles-Mills, also a Ghana native. Despite never playing a down of football in his life, Ansah saw action in six games on special teams and defensive line in 2010 and has played on special teams in every game of 2011. He has three tackles and one QBH this season.

SOMEONE FROM EVERYWHERE

The defensive two-deep hails from all corners of the country. Player home states include from Alaska, California, Georgia, Hawaii, Massachusetts, Nevada, Utah, Texas and Washington.

In addition, linebacker Jadon Wagner is from Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

FOR THE LONGEST TIME

Cody Hoffman's 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the third quarter was the first for a Cougar in more than 13 years, a streak that spanned 158 games. Mike Rigell was the last BYU returner to take a kickoff the distance with a 96-yard return in 1998 against Hawaii.

Hoffman's kickoff return was the first touchdown by a BYU special teams unit since McKay Jacobson took a punt return for a touchdown as a freshman in 2006.

For his performance, Hoffman was named the National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards.

DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung came to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

SPECIAL FLAG

In addition to the traditional team flag and alumni flag leading the team out of the tunnel before kickoff, BYU has also incorporated a special teams flag with an old school BYU logo this season. Against TCU, sophomore JD Falslev carried out the special teams flag.



JD FOR A TD

Sophomore JD Falslev's 67-yard punt return for a touchdown late in the third quarter against TCU was the first punt return for a touchdown by a BYU player since 2006 when McKay Jacobson turned a punt into six points against Wyoming. The punt return marked Falslev's second career touchdown and his second TD in three games after he caught a TD pass against Oregon State. Falslev also set career-highs with 35 yards on five receptions against TCU, a team high. His 69 punt return yards is also a career best mark. Falslev earned FBS Independent Special Teams Player of the Week for his performance.

NOT SINCE '96

JD Falslev's punt return for a touchdown against TCU gives BYU a kick and punt return touchdown in the same season for the first time since 1996. Cody Hoffman returned a kickoff 96 yards for a touchdown vs. UCF earlier this season.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS

Cody Hoffman became the sixth player in BYU history to gain 1,000 kickoff return yards after running for a career-high 167 yards on seven returns against TCU. The sophomore now sits at 1,212 career yards, good for fifth all-time at BYU. His 718 return yards this season is currently the fourth-best in a season in BYU history. Hoffman's 52-yard kick return in the second quarter against TCU was the second-longest of his career and his fourth return of 50 or more yards in his career.

BIG TIME BLOCK

Early in the first quarter against Idaho State, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy blocked and recovered an Idaho State punt. The punt block was the first blocked kick for the Cougars so far this season. Van Noy charged off the right side of the line to get a hand on the kick and recovered the ball on the Idaho State 15-yard line. Quarterback Riley Nelson threw a touchdown pass to Ross Apo on the first BYU offensive play following the blocked punt.

KICKING THINGS OFF

BYU sophomore kicker Justin Sorenson is a difference maker when he walks on the field with the kickoff team. Sorensen, long known for his strong leg, currently has BYU ranked 11th in the nation with a 66.48 yards-perkickoff average. As an individual, Sorensen ranks 12th in the NCAA in kickoff average.

LEADING THE WAY

Sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen currently ranks 42nd in the NCAA in field goals per game with 1.20. He has nailed a field goal in the first half in five of nine games this season and hit two field goals of more than 40 yards against TCU. Sorensen is currently 12-19 on field goals this season, with a long of 48 yards. Sorensen has missed only two field goals inside of 40 yards this season, one against Idaho from 35 yards out and one in the season opener against Ole Miss. After not recording a field goal against Idaho, Sorensen now has three games this season without a field goal. He was 6 for 6 on PATs against the Vandals. Sorenson currently leads BYU with 70 points and is 34-34 on PATS this season. Sorensen is one of 35 kickers in the NCAA to not miss an extra point in the 2011 season.

HOFFMAN HYPE

Against Idaho, sophomore wide reciever Cody Hoffman recorded his sixth game of the season with over 100 all-purpose yards. Hoffman recorded 152 total yards against the Vandals, 114 through the air and 38 on kick returns. All of Hoffman's yards against Idaho came in the first half. Hoffman had 234 total yards against the Horned Frogs the week prior, 167 of which came on his seven kickoff returns. Hoffman previoulsy recorded a career best 277 total yards against Utah and 205 all purpose yards against Oregon State. Hoffman also led the Cougars in all purpose yards against UCF with 153 yards and Utah State with 158 total yards. Hoffman currently has 1241 total yards this season, a per game average of 137.9 ypg, and leads BYU in total yards by 622 yards. JJ Di Luigi is second to Hoffman in total yards with 619.

BRONCO MENDENHALL 7TH SEASON

During his six seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to six straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 56-21 (.727) record as he begins his seventh season to rank No. 16 in total wins among all teams in the nation during that span. The Cougars have received six straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first six teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in four of the last five seasons to become the first Cougar teams to win four bowls in a five-year span since LaVell Edwards teams did so from 1980-84. Nationally, BYU is one of only 11 programs to win four bowl games in the last five seasons.

In the last five years the Cougars have achieved a 50-15 record -- only eight teams have more wins over that span. In fact, BYU is one of only seven FBS programs to win 10 or more games during at least four of the last five seasons, and BYU and Boise State are the only programs in the West to achieve that consistent level of success. From 2006-2009 Mendenhall guided the Cougars to four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

BYU's success under Mendenhall is also evident

in

the national rankings and NCAA statistics. BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in the various national statistical categories 65 times in the past six seasons (42 offense, 16 defense, 6 special teams, 1 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 39 top-15 statistical rankings, 29 top-10 rank- ings and 15 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during each of the past five seasons and finished ranked No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season and has totaled 185 selections during Mendenhall's tenure, along with 64 MWC Scholar-Athlete awards. BYU also ranks second nationally for Academic All-America recipients over the past three seasons. Six Cougar student-athletes have been named ESPN Academic All-Americans the past three years. Among all FBS schools only Penn State has had more during that period.

Going independent in 2011, BYU was consistently a top MWC contender under Mendenhall. BYU achieved a 39-9 (.813) conference record over the past six years to help the Cougars complete their 12-year tenure in the MWC with 64 conference wins -- the most of any MWC school. Mendenhall also helped the Cougars bring bowl wins over Oregon, UCLA, Oregon State and UTEP as the program enters a new era as one of four independent schools, joining Notre Dame, Army and Navy.

> Last year's BYU team achieved a 7-6 record and tied for third in the MWC at 5-3 while playing 19 freshmen and facing a schedule that featured eight bowl teams and four opponents that finished in final BCS Top 25 standings. Mendenhall took over defensive coordinator responsibilities after the teams 1-4 start and the team responded to become one of the top defensive teams over the final eight games.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff has six members who have played professional football. Assistant Head Coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in 2002 and played three years for the 49er's, while defensive line coach Steve Kaufusi and outside linebacker coach Kelly Poppinga played in the NFL with the Arizona Cardinals. Graduate assistant Shaun Nua also spent some time with the Pittsburgh Steelers. In addition, receivers coach Ben Cahoon spent 13 years with the Candian Football League's Montreal Alouettes before retiring as the CFL's all-time receptions leader.

In addition, Poppinga and Nua are both Super Bowl champions; Poppinga won a ring with the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII while Nua earned his in the Steelers' Super Bowl XL victory. Cahoon also won the ultimate prize in the CFL by leading the Montreal to three Grey Cup championships in 2002, 2009 and 2010.

THE NEW GUYS

The BYU coaching staff welcomed two new members this past offseason in running backs coach Joe DuPaix and receivers coach Ben Cahoon.

DuPaix most recently coached at Navy for the past three seasons, helping led the Midshipmen to three bowl bids. In each of his three seasons, Navy was one of the top-6 rushing programs in the country, including an NCAA-best 293.4 ypg in 2008. A Salt Lake City native, DuPaix played under his father, Roger, a successful high school coach at Skyline who also coached current BYU offensive coordinator Brandon Doman in high school. DuPaix played quarterback at Snow College (Ephraim, UT) and Southern Utah where he set the FCS record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a season.

Cahoon retired in after the 2010 season as the all-time receptions leader in CFL history. Cahoon also set records for most receiving yards in a career in Grey Cup games and most touchdowns by an Alouette in addition to earning the CFL Most Outstanding Candian Award in 2002 and 2003. A native of Orem, Utah, Cahoon was an All-WAC performer in addition to being an Academic All-American. He is also the son-in-law of current Utah Governor Gary Herbert.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,470-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. With additional wheelchair access created in 2010-11, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63,470 beginning with the 2011 season.

"FAN"TASTIC FANS

The attendance at the BYU vs. Utah game was 63,742 - the first sellout for Edwards Stadium since last season's home opener against Washington. A sellout crowd of 63,513 also watched BYU's win over Utah State. In 2010, BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sellouts at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The prior time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance-231 short of a sellout.

TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWDS

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah in 2009 is currently 10th with 64,301 fans attending the game. In 2010, BYU averaged 61,380 fans per home game.



HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. Last season, BYU averaged 30.0 points per game at home. The Cougars have not had a negative points per game margin for the past seven seasons, including all six years of head coach Bronco Mendenhall's tenure. In 2006, a 35.16-point differential was a BYU record in scoring margin in the stadium's 46-year history and the program's 86-year history:




