## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- After 918 games and 86 seasons as a football program, BYU begins its first year as an independent program at Ole Miss on Saturday, Sept. 3, 2011.
- Dating back to 1972 when LaVell Edwards became head coach, BYU is 24-15 in season openers, including a 12-4 mark at home, 10-8 on the road and 2-3 at natural sites. Coach Bronco Mendenhall is 4-2 all-time in season openers
- BYU and Ole Miss have never played each other. The Cougars are 2-2 all-time against teams from Mississippi and 1-3 against SEC teams, earning their only win in 2001 at Mississippi State.
- The BYU offense has scored in 22-straight quarters dating back to the second quarter against Wyoming last season.
- Two members of the BYU coaching staff will be coaching their first games as Cougar assistants - running backs coach Joe DuPaix and receivers coach Ben Cahoon. DuPaix comes over after coaching at Navy while Cahoon will experience his first game ever as a coach. In addition, outside linebackers coach Kelly Poppinga will begin his first year on the staff after taking over as an interim coach midway through last season.
- Sophomore quarterback Jake Heaps will start a season opener for the first time in his career against the Rebels. Though he did not start, Heaps played in last year's opener against his hometown school of Washington in Provo, throwing for 131 yards in BYU's 23-17 victory.

## LAST TIME

### COUGARS CLAIM NEW MEXICO BOWL WIN

ALBUQUERQUE -- BYU opened the 2010 bowl season with its fourth bowl victory in the last five years with a 52-24 triumph over UTEP in the New Mexico Bowl on Saturday. The Cougars had a record-setting day to finish the season with a 7-6 record and wins in five of their last six games.

New Mexico Bowl Offensive MVP Jake Heaps went 25-of-34 for 264 yards and four touchdown passes, passing Ty Detmer's freshman record for most touchdown passes. Heaps also set the BYU bowl record for best completion percentage (.735) in a bowl game. Senior safety Andrew Rich was awarded the game's Defensive MVP in his final game as a Cougar, finishing with four solo tackles, two interceptions, one tackle-for-loss, one sack and a pass breakup.

BYU played well for the start at University Stadium, scoring on its first five possessions to take a 31-3 lead and set a new first-half New Mexico Bowl scoring record.

While BYU's offense was successfully moving the ball, the Cougar defense was equally successful keeping the Miners from gaining ground. BYU finished the first quarter with a 17-3 lead while totaling 143 yards and holding UTEP to minus-5 yards.

BYU finished the half with 286 yards of total offense with Heaps connecting on 18-of-25 passes for 185 yards and three touchdowns. The Cougar defense held the Miners to 80 yards, with 67 of that total coming on one play.

Hoffman set career highs across the board with eight receptions for 137 yards and three touchdowns, tying a BYU bowl game record for most touchdown receptions in a game.

Overall, BYU outgained the Miners, now 6-7 on the year, 514 total yards to 233. Quezada rushed for a game-high 101 yards on 15 carries to average 6.7 yards per carry while Di Luigi added 98 yards on 20 carries as the Cougars totaled 219 yards and three touchdowns on the ground. Through the air, Heaps and sophomore James Lark combined for 295 yards with Heaps finishing the game with four touchdowns.

**All-Time Scoring Leader:** With 9 points on seven PATs and one field goal, BYU senior kick Mitch Payne finishes his career with 334 points, breaking the previous BYU all-time career scoring record previously held by Owen Pochman with 333 career points.

**The Future Looks Bright:** BYU's freshmen shined in the Cougars' win over UTEP. True freshman quarterback Jake Heaps threw 25-of-34 passes for 264 yards and four touchdowns. Heaps became the first freshman to start for BYU at quarterback in a bowl game and thus the first freshman to start in a BYU bowl win. Heaps also broke Heisman Trophy winner Ty Detmer's record of 13 touchdown passes by a BYU freshman with 15 on the year. Another true freshman, running back Joshua Quezada, ran for 101 yards on 15 carries and one touchdown. Redshirt freshman wide receiver Cody Hoffman set new career highs across the board with eight receptions, 137 yards and three touchdowns.

**Deny the Run:** UTEP rushed for minus-26 yards in the first quarter. In its previous seven games before today, the BYU defense held its opponents to first-quarter totals of minus-10 (SDSU), 20 (TCU), minus-31 (Wyoming), zero (UNLV), 8 (Colorado St.), 30 yards (New Mexico) and 8 yards (Utah) rushing, respectively. All totaled, that's minus-1 yards rushing for BYU opponents in the last eight games during the opening quarter.

**First Half Shutout Streak:** UTEP's 53-yard field goal late in the first quarter were the first points scored by a BYU opponent in the first half since the Wyoming game on Oct. 23, a streak of four-straight games. BYU scored 106 unanswered first-half points until the field goal.

## BYU-OLE MISS SERIES

This will be the first time in history that BYU faces off against the Ole Miss Rebels.

## SEC COUNTRY

The Cougars have played three SEC teams (Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi State). The lone victory came in a 41-38 last-second win over Mississippi State in 2001. Doak Walker Award winner Luke Staley rushed for 149 yards but suffered a devastating broken leg in the last minute of play. Kicker Matt Payne came to the rescue, kicking a game-winning 25-yard field goal with the score tied at 38 on the last play of the game.

## OLE MISS LAST TIME

Ole Miss Drops Egg Bowl 31-23  
OXFORD, Miss. - Senior Jeremiah Masoli threw for 261 yards and set the school record for rushing yards by a quarterback in a season, but Ole Miss dropped the Egg Bowl 31-23 to Mississippi State on Saturday night.

The Bulldogs (8-4, 4-4 SEC) led for most of the 107th meeting between the two teams, with a 498-326 advantage in total yards. But Ole Miss (4-8, 1-7) nearly rallied from a 31-9 fourth quarter deficit, scoring two touchdowns to pull within 31-23 with 4:21 remaining.

The Rebels' comeback ended when Jeremiah Masoli desperately scrambled for several seconds before being sacked on fourth-and-24 with 59.4 seconds remaining.

"Nobody gave up," Ole Miss running back Brandon Bolden said. "I'm proud of my teammates and everybody for that. We just kept pressing on. We almost came away with it."

Masoli, who ended a disappointing senior season in Oxford after transferring from Oregon over the summer, led Ole Miss with 261 yards passing, one touchdown and one interception.

"The only thing I know is to go back to work," Nutt said. "We expected it to be a tough year, but we didn't expect this."

## 2011 REBELS

Coming off a disappointing 4-8 season, Ole Miss has rejuvenated its coaching staff and returns several contributing players and is looking to make an impact in the SEC South again.

To allow himself more time to devote to other areas of the squad, head coach Houston Nutt added David Lee from the Miami Dolphins as offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach and Gunter Brewer from Oklahoma State as wide receivers coach/ passing game coordinator. Nutt also addressed a need area with the hire of Keith Burns from K-State to coach

the secondary.

Ole Miss returns nine of 11 starters from an offensive unit that ranked third in the SEC in rushing offense, led by All-SEC running back Brandon Bolden. The rising senior tied the school records for touchdowns scored (17) and rushing TDs (14) and finished fifth in the conference in rushing (81.3 ypg).

Also generating a great deal of excitement for the Rebel coaches is the offensive line. Returning are all five starters and five more linemen that earned starts from a group that topped the SEC in fewest sacks allowed and notched eight 100-yard rushing games between four different runners.

West Virginia sophomore transfer Barry Brunetti will be eligible immediately in 2011 and looks to take the reigns of a revamped offense. Another quarterback transfer, Zack Stoudt, who starred at Iowa Western Community College, looks to contribute as well.

Defensively, Ole miss received good news with senior Kentrell Lockett being granted a sixth year of eligibility. The defensive end, who was held out of spring rehabbing the ACL injury that cost him most of 2010, leads all returning SEC players in career TFLs with 23.5 and is sixth in sacks with 9.0.

One of the Rebels' biggest challenges is rebuilding a defensive interior that lost four senior tackles including two-time All-SEC honoree Jerrell Powe. The leading candidates are senior Justin Smith and redshirt freshman Carlton Martin at defensive tackle and redshirt freshman Bryon Bennett and JUCO transfer Gilbert Pena at nose.

Improving the pass defense is a high priority and coaches found a potential weapon in new cornerback Wesley Pendleton. One of the biggest surprises of the spring, the former JUCO track All-American impressed the staff with his speed and is tied atop the depth chart at left corner with senior leader Marcus Temple, who missed spring after undergoing sports hernia surgery.

Senior Damien Jackson, who showed more leadership in the spring despite missing days with ailments, returns as a starting safety, while sophomore Brishen Mathews enters preseason as the other starter.

Special teams play will be a strength of the Rebels again in 2011, led by NCAA punting champion and All-American junior Tyler Campbell. Junior Andrew Ritter continues to excel on kickoffs, while junior Bryson Rose is coming off a solid first season as the starting placekicker, finishing third in the SEC in field goals made. In the return game, sophomore Jeff Scott is back after ranking 20th in the nation in kickoff returns in just a half-season of fielding kicks.



# 2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL TEAM NOTES

## LEAVING A MARK: MOST WINS IN MWC HISTORY

BYU has a 64-26 record in MWC play since the inception of the league in 1999—the most conference wins over that 12-year span since the league was formed. The Cougars now join the ranks of the independents, with Notre Dame, Army and Navy.

## FLAG BEARER

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag onto the field. In 2008, the team implemented a new tradition—an alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue “Y” logo. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU players. Their signatures reflect their commitment to uphold the tradition, spirit and honor of the BYU football program and to be a flag bearer of the University.

## TEAM CAPTAINS

Selected by their peers, offensive tackle Matt Reynolds and running back Bryan Kariya will serve as offensive captains, while outside linebacker Jameson Frazier and free safety Travis Uale will be defensive captains. All four captains are seniors in 2011. Reynolds will serve for the second time after being selected as a captain last season. The four captains also represent their positions on the team's leadership council. Members of the team selected the following additional players from each position to serve on the team's leadership council: senior Terence Brown (offensive line), senior Matt Edwards (tight ends), seniors McKay Jacobson and Spencer Hafoka (receivers), juniors Romney Fuga and Eathyn Manumaleuna (defensive line) and junior Brandon Ogletree (inside linebackers).

## WATCH OUT HERE I COME

With the start of the 2011 season bringing fresh optimism to the squad, the nation is taking notice with several players being named to watch list and preseason honors. Leading the way is senior captain Matt Reynolds on the offensive line. Reynolds, a preseason All-American by ESPN.com, USA Today, CBSCollegeSports.com, Athlon, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others has also been named to Outland Trophy Watch List, Lombardi Award Watch and the Lowe's Senior Class Award list. Joining Reynolds with the preseason accolades is senior linebacker Jameson Frazier on the Lott Trophy Watch List and senior running back JJ Di Luigi on the Doak Walker Award Watch List. Offensive linemen Terence Brown is recognized as one of the best centers in college football on the Rimington Trophy Watch List and Braden Hansen joining Reynolds on the Outland Trophy Watch List. Quarterback Jake Heaps has also been named to the Davey O'Brien Watch List.

## JOINING THE RANKS

Joining Notre Dame, Army and Navy as an independent program, BYU has the opportunity to gain national exposure and bring excitement to college football fans across the world. ## BYU VS. BCS AQS

BYU has defeated a team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference five-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 14 of the past 15 years dating back to 1996. BYU will have a multiple chances to extend the streak this season with games against Ole Miss, Texas, Utah and Oregon State.

## DON'T LOOK BACK

In the Bronco Mendenhall era, BYU is 49-5 when leading at halftime and 49-2 when taking a lead into the fourth quarter. Mendenhall's teams have won 32-straight games when leading by at least 14 points at the halftime break, 79 overall as a team. The last time BYU lost a game after leading by at least 14 points at the half was on Oct. 10, 1987, when it lost 29-27 in its homecoming game against Wyoming.

## DIVIDE AND CONQUER

When BYU has passed for 300 yards and run for 200 yards, the Cougars are 39-0 since 1972 when LaVell Edwards took over as head coach and 5-0 under current head coach Bronco Mendenhall.

## NO RUNNING START

UTEP rushed for minus-26 yards in the first quarter. In its previous seven games before the bowl game, the BYU defense held its opponents to first-quarter totals of minus-10 (SDSU), 20 (TCU), minus-31 (Wyoming), zero (UNLV), 8 (Colorado St.), 30 yards (New Mexico) and 8 yards (Utah) rushing, respectively. All totaled, that's minus-1 yards rushing for BYU opponents in the last eight games during the opening quarter.

Several players made somewhat of a body transformation in the offseason. One of most notable was the dramatic change in running back turned safety Mike Hague. Hague managed to transform himself from a 230-pound brusing fullback, clearing the way for other tailbacks, into a lean and mean 185-pound speedy, hard-hitting defensive back. Hague was able to lose some 45 pounds since the New Mexico Bowl on a diet of chicken, vegetables and salad, while cutting out all of the fast food.

Others of note include several offensive lineman who trimmed down some 5 to 25 pounds in the offseason in hopes to be better conditioned and quicker on their feet.

On the weight gain side of things, after switching from tight end to defensive end, sophomore Mike Muehlmann has gone from the 240's to around 260, adding muscle and mass to make him a forceful pass rusher to help the defensive line.

## CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 42 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 17 different countries including Argentina, Australia, Bulgaria, Cambodia, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, El Salvador, Fiji, Guatemala, Japan, Mexico, New Zealand, Paraguay, Peru, South Korea, Thailand and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of six different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Cambodian, Japanese, Korean, Spanish and Thai.

## SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga is one of 73 players (61 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 29 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Germany, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, Mongolia, Mozambique, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 14 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nevada, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas.

Overall, 50 current members (42 percent) of the BYU football team speak a combined total of 22 different foreign languages and dialects, including Cebuano, Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Italian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Marshallese, Mongolian, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Swedish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

## WHAT IS A MISSION?

- \* The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.
- \* The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and Paul in the Bible).
- \* More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.
- \* Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.
- \* Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.
- \* Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in 14 additional countries including Brazil, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico and Spain.
- \* Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."
- \* A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.
- \* In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.
- \* Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions — except for their transportation to and from their field of labor — and are not paid for their services.
- \* Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

# 2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE NOTES

## WHO NEEDS MARIO?

Junior running back JJ Di Luigi has led BYU in rushing eight of the Cougars' 13 games while also gaining the most receiving yards in three games. The junior led the team in rushing yards, receptions and all-purpose yards for the 2010 season and was second in scoring, receiving yards and total offense.

## TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting offensive line is largely considered to be one of its major team strengths . . . literally. Measuring in at an average of 6-foot-6 inches and over 310 pounds, the offensive line is built to plow the road for a successful running attack and protect the quarterback play of Jake Heaps.

## GUESS WHO'S BACK

BYU starting offensive lineman Matt Reynolds forgoes the NFL draft to play his senior season, entering the year as a preseason All-American. The 6-foot-6, 305-pound senior has started every game for the Cougars in his career and is a two-time captain.

## HEAPS BREAKS OUT

After a slow start to the 2010 season, quarterback Jake Heaps broke out the latter half of the season, winning six of eight games and completing 138 of 224 passes for a 62 percent completion percentage to go along with 14 touchdowns during the stretch. His coming out party included a dominating 49-10 win over Colorado State, throwing four touchdown passes and completing 15 of 20 passes for 242 during the game. Heaps was named the Offensive MVP of the New Mexico Bowl after throwing four more touchdown passes and completing 25 of 34 passes for 264 yards.

## THE 300 GAME

Jake Heaps has all the potential to be a 300-yard passing threat week in and week out, yet the sophomore narrowly missed out on touching the mark his freshman season. He came the closest against UNLV, notching 294 yards through the air, completing 19 of 31 passes. The last time a Cougar averaged over 300 yards for the season was 2008 when Max Hall averaged 304.4 passing-yards per game.

## ALL BUT PERFECT

BYU finished the game at Colorado State in 2010 going 12-of-13 (.923) on third-down conversions, the first time BYU has had a third-down conversion of over 80-percent since going 12-of-14 (.857) at Washington in 2008. On the one failed third-down attempt, BYU still converted the ensuing fourth down. As part of the third-down proficiency, BYU did not punt the entire game, accomplishing the feat for the first time since playing at Tulane in 2009.

## DON'T HASSLE THE HOFF

Receiver Cody Hoffman closed out the 2010 campaign on a hot streak, catching eight balls for 138 yards and three touchdowns. Hoffman finished as the leading receiver for BYU with 42 receptions on the year for 527 yards. The Crescent City, Calif. native was also a menace for opposing special teams, finishing the season with a kick-return average of 27.1 yards.

## THE THREE-HEADED MONSTER

The stable of running backs JJ Di Luigi, Josh Quezada and Bryan Kariya return for 2011 after rolling up 1,972 rushing yards on the ground. The trio also caught 74 passes for 611 yards. Combining for 21 total touchdowns, the three ball carriers accounted for almost 56 percent of the Cougars total offense.



# 2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE NOTES

## SCORING STREAK

BYU has scored in 22 straight quarters, dating back to the second quarter of the 2010 Wyoming game. During that span the Cougars have outscored their opponents 221-68.

## THE BIG MEN ON CAMPUS

Traditionally, BYU's wide receivers have been wiry, tough and good route runners. This year features those qualities but brings some additional valuable commodities - speed and size. The popular receiver tandem of Cody Hoffman and Ross Apo, who both touch near 6-foot-4 inches and each over 205 pounds creates an imposing picture for opposing defenses. Add in sub-4.4-40 yard dash times and they are a receiver duo never before seen by Cougar fans.

## NOT THEIR FIRST RODEO

Seen as a big strength for 2011, the offense returns several starters. With 10 of 11 starters returning and seven other offensive returners with starting experience, the offensive unit seeks to benefit from a 2010 season that brought some growing pains but will hopefully pay off during the 2011 campaign.

## SEEN IT A HUNDRED TIMES

Among the 10 returning starters, four of them return to the offensive line. Seniors Terence Brown and Matt Reynolds lead the way and juniors Braden Brown and Braden Hansen also return to bring a talented and experienced line to highlight the offensive attack. Between the four returning starters there are 106 career starts (No. 6 among FBS schools), with Reynolds on top at 39 starts having started every game of his career.

## JUST FELT LIKE RUNNING

While breaking in a new quarterback last year the running game was relied on heavily. Not ones to disappoint, the stable of BYU running game got things going for a young Cougar team. In fact, BYU rushed for over 200 yards in seven games last season, topping 250 three times. The Cougars averaged 168.1 yards per game, good for 42nd in the nation.

## HE'S KIND OF A BIG DEAL

Senior captain and offensive tackle Matt Reynolds returns for his senior season after deciding not to enter the NFL draft despite a first round projection. Reynolds has been rewarded with several preseason accolades, including being named a preseason All-American by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others. Along with those honors, Reynolds has recognized as an Outland Trophy Candidate, a Lombardi Award Candidate and a Lowe's Senior Class Award Nominee.

## NOT MISSING MUCH

Many of the skill positions and contributors return for 2011, including 10 of 11 offensive starters. With so many back for the season, BYU returns a high percentage of the offense. The following is breakdown of the the returning percentages of various offensive statistical categories:

## WILL THE REAL TIGHT END PLEASE STAND UP?

The BYU tradition of successful tight ends, most recently, All-American Dennis Pitta who set the NCAA record for yards gained by a tight end with 2,901 career receiving yards had a bit of a hiccup in 2010. Last season, five different freshman tight ends, caught a combined 34 balls for 451 yards and no touchdowns. This year, with much more experience and a renewed focus, the tight end position looks to make a comeback.

## COME ON OVER BABY

Several players often switch in the offseason with 2011 being no different. Coming over from the defense is Michael Alisa who played linebacker before his mission, and joins the offense as a running back. Also switching positions to running back is Iona Pritchard, who played in all 13 games as a freshman on special teams and as a linebacker. Pritchard will redshirt the 2011 season after suffering a leg injury in fall camp.

## CENTER OF ATTENTION

The 6-foot-4, 318-pound center, Terence Brown has been named to the Rimington Trophy Watch List, awarded to the best center in college football. has started 26 games in a row going back to the start of his sophomore season. Last year he helped an offensive attack that ranked No. 42 nationally in rushing yards per game (168.1), No. 34 nationally with 283 first downs and allowed two sacks or less in 11 games. As a sophomore, Brown was part of a unit that ranked No. 17 nationally in passing yards per game (281.46) and No. 21 in total offense (427.15) in 2009.

## TEXAS TWO-STEP

Lining up to catch passes for the Cougars in 2011 will be two former Texas High School stars in McKay Jacobson and Ross Apo. Jacobson was the Texas 5A state player of the year and caught over 1,600 yards and 19 touchdowns his senior season of prep football. Apo was ranked as the No. 13 wide receiver in the country by Rivals.com his last high school season and averaged 19.1 yards per reception throughout his prep career.

## DEFENSIVE NOTES

### SOMEONE FROM EVERYWHERE

The defensive two-deep hails from all corners of the country. Player home states include from Alaska, California, Georgia, Hawaii, Massachusetts, Nevada, Utah, Texas and Washington.

In addition, linebacker Jadon Wagner hails from Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada.

### FROM OFFENSE TO DEFENSE

After spending the 2010 season on the offensive side of the ball, sophomore Mike Muehlmann and junior Mike Hague will spend 2011 tackling ball carriers instead of blocking for them.

Muehlmann earned letterman honors at tight end last season after seeing time in all 13 games while starting three. A MWC Scholar-Athlete, Muehlmann totaled 96 yards on six receptions on the season. In 2011, Muehlmann will be lining up along the defensive line, primarily at defensive end.

This is not Muehlmann's first experience at defensive end. As a senior at American Fork High School, Muehlmann recorded 73 tackles and 10.5 sacks.

Hague, a former running back, will now take snaps at defensive back. As a sophomore in 2010, Hague saw action in 10 games, catching a total of five passes for 43 yards.

Hague is also no stranger to his new position. As a senior at Brighton High School, Hague recorded 53 tackles and five interceptions.

### FRAZIER ON LOTT TROPHY WATCH LIST

BYU senior linebaker Jameson Frazier has been named to the 2011 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List.

Named after Pro Football Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott, The Lott Trophy is awarded to college football's Defensive IMPACT Player of the Year for excellent performance both on and off the field.

A 6-foot-2, 225-pound outside linebacker, Frazier started his career as a walk-on before earning a starting role in 2010 while helping the BYU defense finish the year ranked No. 24 in the nation. Frazier contributed 34 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, on sack, three quarterback hurries and two interceptions last season despite missing three games due to injury. He was recently selected by his teammates to serve as a team captain for the 2011 season.

### DOWN BUT NOT OUT

Three defensive contributors - Jordan Pendleton, Jordan Richardson and Romney Fuga - are returning from injuries that cost them a total of 19 games in 2010.

Pendleton, a senior, started the first five games of 2010 and recorded 38 total tackles. His highlight game came against Florida State when he totaled 12 tackles, including nine solo. A fierce outside linebacker with strength and speed, Pendleton has 93 career tackles.

As a defensive lineman, Richardson earned letterman honors in 2010 after appearing in the first 10 games and started five. Richardson had a career-high nine tackles vs. Air Force and totaled 17 on the season.

The lone BYU player that received a medical waiver from the NCAA, Fuga started the first four games in 2010 at nose guard before suffering a season-ending knee injury (ACL and LCL) against Nevada. An Academic All-MWC honoree, Fuga contributed 15 tackles in four games last season.

### RUN STUFFERS

Along the defensive line, the Cougars will not hurt for size. The five man rotation features Romney Fuga (321 lbs.), Eathyn Manumaleuna (294 lbs.), Graham Rowley (280 lbs.), Hebron Fangupo (331 lbs.) and Simote Vea (270 lbs.).

A total of 1,496 pounds will rotate at the defensive line to force offenses to think twice before running the ball. An average of 299.2 pounds per player, the defensive line will look to improve on the 138.58 yards per game the BYU rush defense surrendered in 2010 (ranked 45th in the NCAA).

Manumaleuna started the most games of the group in 2010, with eight total starts in 13 games. In those games he totaled 27 tackles and 2.5 sacks.

### BIG DEFENSIVE IMPROVEMENTS

After posting a 1-4 record after the first five games of 2010, head coach Bronco Mendenhall took over defensive coordinator duties. The results were immediate as the Cougars went on to win six of their next eight games, including a win in the New Mexico Bowl (national ranking in parenthesis).

# 2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL DEFENSIVE NOTES

## STRENGTH IN NUMBERS

A wealth of linebackers are at the disposal of head coach and defensive coordinator Bronco Mendenhall this fall. Seven capable, experienced athletes are at the ready to fill the four linebacker positions.

The group of Jameson Frazier, Jordan Pendleton, Uona Kaveinga, Kyle Van Noy, Brandon Ogletree, Jadon Wagner and Ezekiel Ansah appear ready to lead a defense that lacks experience in the defensive backfield.

Frazier and Wagner are the lone seniors in the group and had 18 combined starts in 2010. Ogletree, a junior, also started nine games last season while recording 68 total tackles.

Van Noy, a sophomore, made only two starts in 2010 but saw action in all 13 games. A former high school sprinter, Van Noy brings speed off the edge and will look to improve on the 7.5 tackles for loss and 2.0 sacks he recorded in 2010.

Ansah and Kaveinga are the only two in the group that did not see time at linebacker for BYU in 2010, but both bring unique attributes to the table. Ansah is a former sprinter with raw talent while Kaveinga played two seasons at perennial national powerhouse USC.

## CANADA CAN WAIT

After finishing his junior campaign with 37 tackles, including 6.5 for loss, senior Jadon Wagner was drafted by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats with the 44th overall pick of the 2011 Canadian Football League Draft.

A native of Cranbrook, British Columbia, Wagner chose to bypass the opportunity to play in the CFL in order to return to the Cougars for his senior season.

As a linebacker in 2010, Wagner saw action in all 12 games and started nine. His best game came against in-state rival Utah State when he recorded 10 tackles, including 2.0 for loss.

Previous to enrolling at BYU, Wagner spent time with the Calgary Colts and Okargan Sun in the Canadian Junior Football League. As a rookie in the CJFL, Wagner led the nation in tackles with an average of 10 per game. He was also one of three players nominated for the CJFL Rookie of the Year award and helped lead his team to the conference final in his second year.

## TROJANS BECOME COUGARS

Two new additions to the Bronco Mendenhall-led defense in 2011 are former USC standouts. Junior Uona Kaveinga and senior Hebron Fangupo made the trek from Los Angeles to Provo and expect to see time on the field this season.

Kaveinga was a top recruit in 2008 and chose to attend USC. He went on to appear in eight games in 2008 and recorded three total tackles. In 2009, Kaveinga was a reserve linebacker for the Trojans and again appeared in eight games.

Following the 2009 season, Kaveinga chose to transfer to BYU from USC. After sitting out the 2010 season due to NCAA transfer rules, Kaveinga will play a prominent role on the Cougar defense this year.

Fangupo, a defensive lineman, attended USC in 2009 and 2010. Prior to attending USC, Fangupo spent time at Mt. San Antonio Junior College and was named to the Super Prep JUCO 100 and All-Conference second team.

## FORMER GHANIAN SPRINTER AT LINEBACKER

Two years ago, no one foresaw junior Ezekiel Ansah lining up for the BYU football team. A freshman at the time, Ansah was recruited to BYU as a sprinter for the track and field team.

A native of Accra, Ghana, Ansah related well to BYU sprint coach Leonard Myles-Mills, also a Ghana native. After arriving in Provo, however, Ansah was recruited all over again, this time from the track to the football field.

Despite never playing a down of football in his life, Ansah saw action in six games on special teams and defensive line in 2010. A naturally gifted athlete, Ansah recorded three total tackles and a pass breakup in the first ever football game action.

Heading into the 2011 season, Ansah has a chance to see significant playing time in his second-ever football season. Ansah also made the switch from defensive line to linebacker in the offseason, but his learning curve is not nearly as steep as it was one year ago.

## NEW FACES

With three of the four regular starters in the defensive secondary graduated, the BYU defensive backfield has a new look. Departed seniors Andrew Rich, Brian Logan and Brandon Bradley started started a combined 38 of 39 games in 2010.

In 2011, the Cougar defensive backfield will feature Robbie Buckner and Corby Eason at the corners, both with one career start. Backing up Eason and Buckner will be transfers Preston Hadley (Snow College) and Joe Sampson (College of San Mateo).

Free safety Travis Uale will bring the most experience to the DB group after starting eight games in 2010. Sophomore Daniel Sorenson will line up at the KAT position after returning from his LDS Church mission in 2010. Sorenson saw action in all 12 games in 2008 but has no starts in his career.

# 2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

## DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung came to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

## IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BYU has been unable to return a kickoff for a touchdown for 156 consecutive games. Mike Rigell was the last Cougar to accomplish the feat, turning in a 96-yard touchdown in a 31-9 victory at Hawaii on October 17, 1998.

The last time BYU returned a punt for a touchdown was back on Nov. 9, 2006 when current senior McKay Jacobson ran one back 77 yards against Wyoming at Edwards Stadium as a freshman. Fifty-four games have passed since then.

## NEXT IN LINE

This season the Cougars will have to fill the shoes of departed kicker Mitch Payne who set the BYU record for most points in a career in his final game for BYU in the New Mexico Bowl last season. Payne finished his career with 334 points, scoring 10 points in the New Mexico Bowl for the record. Payne also finished as BYU's all-time leader in career PATs made with 193, 31 more than the next closest player.

Sophomore Justin Sorensen, a returned missionary after playing for BYU in 2008, will fill in at the position. Sorensen, known for an incredibly strong leg, will handle both field goal and kickoff duties this season. Sorensen kicked a Utah high school career-long 62-yard field goal as a high school All-American.

## CATCHING PASSES, CATCHING KICKS

Filling in an opening as a kickoff returner, redshirt freshman Cody Hoffman returned the first four kickoffs of his career in the eighth game of the 2010 season against Wyoming, racking up a total of 104 yards while also fulfilling his duties at wide receiver. Hoffman became the first Cougar to pass the 100-yard kickoff return mark since Austin Collie totaled 134 yards against Utah in 2008. For his efforts, the true freshman was named the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week, the first conference award of his career.

Hoffman followed up his newfound special teams excellence with a 50-yard kickoff return against UNLV, the longest for BYU this season and the longest kickoff return by a Cougar since Austin Collie's 70-yard return against Utah in 2008. He also caught his second touchdown pass of the season against the Rebels.

Hoffman finished off the year with 125 kickoff return yards in the New Mexico Bowl vs. UTEP. Combined with his 137 receiving yards, Hoffman totaled the 8th-most all-purpose yards in a game in BYU history with 262 -- the most since current Indianapolis Colt and former BYU receiver Austin Collie's 366 yards in 2007.

## FALSLEV TAKES OFF

As a true freshman in 2010, JD Falslev returned the first kickoff of his career 34 yards to the BYU 46-yard line, setting up the Cougars' first points of the game at Utah State. Falslev finished with three returns for 64 yards in his hometown of Logan. Falslev finished the season with a 43-yard punt return against UTEP in the New Mexico Bowl, finishing the season as the team leader with 15 punt returns for 136 total yards (9.1 avg) and returned eight kickoffs a total of 162 yards (20.2 avg).

Falslev comes into 2011 as the Cougars' primary punt returner in addition to having a strong offseason at wide receiver.

## LOVING THE BOWL GAMES

Riley Stephenson booted a 60-yard punt last season against UTEP in the New Mexico Bowl, tying a BYU bowl game record -- the same record he set the previous year against Oregon State in the Las Vegas Bowl in 2009. Stephenson went on to set another BYU bowl record in Albuquerque, kicking three punts a total of 160 yards for a 53.3 ypk average, the best average by a Cougar ever in the postseason.

# 2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL HEAD COACH BRONCO MENDENHALL



## BRONCO MENDENHALL 7TH SEASON

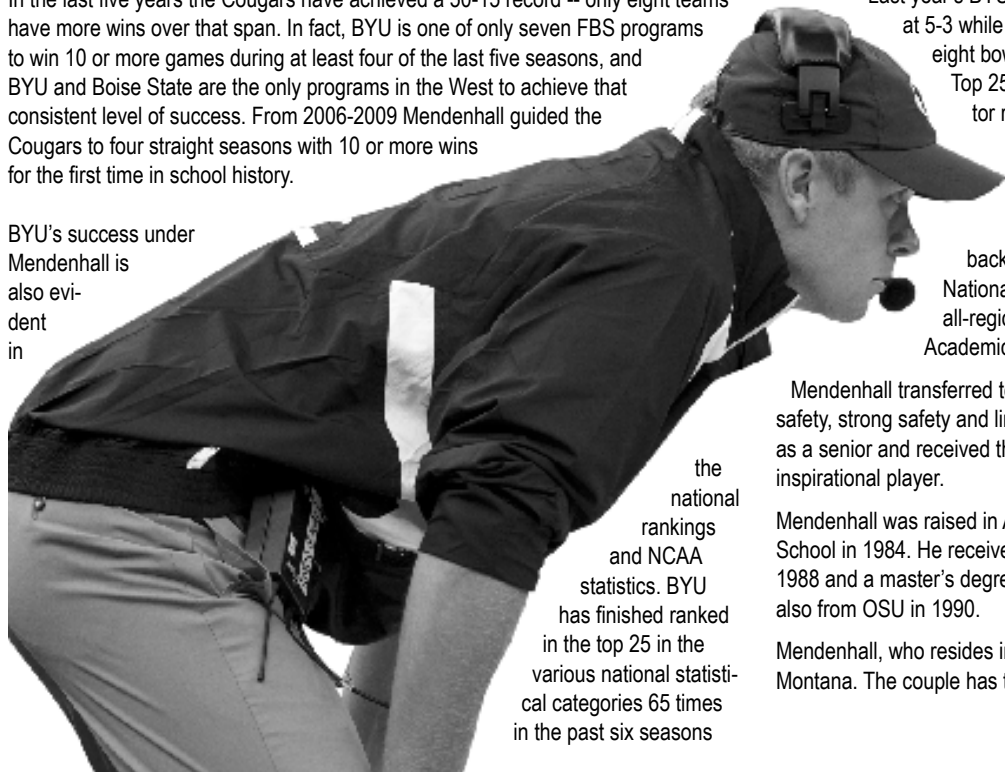
During his six seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to six straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 56-21 (.727) record over the past six seasons to rank No. 16 in total wins among all teams in the nation during that span. The Cougars have received six straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first six teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in four of the last five seasons to become the first Cougar teams to win four bowls in a five-year span since LaVell Edwards teams did so from 1980-84. Nationally, BYU is one of only 11 programs to win four bowl games in the last five seasons.

In the last five years the Cougars have achieved a 50-15 record -- only eight teams have more wins over that span. In fact, BYU is one of only seven FBS programs to win 10 or more games during at least four of the last five seasons, and BYU and Boise State are the only programs in the West to achieve that consistent level of success. From 2006-2009 Mendenhall guided the Cougars to four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

BYU's success under Mendenhall is also evident in



the national rankings and NCAA statistics. BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in the various national statistical categories 65 times in the past six seasons

(42 offense, 16 defense, 6 special teams, 1 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 39 top-15 statistical rankings, 29 top-10 rankings and 15 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during each of the past five seasons and finished ranked No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU has consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season and has totaled 185 selections during Mendenhall's tenure, along with 64 MWC Scholar-athlete awards. BYU also ranks second nationally for Academic All-America recipients over the past three seasons. Six Cougar student-athletes have been named ESPN Academic All-Americans the past three years. Among all FBS schools only Penn State has had more during that period.

Going independent in 2011, BYU was consistently a top MWC contender under Mendenhall. BYU achieved a 39-9 (.813) conference record over the past six years to help the Cougars complete their 12-year tenure in the MWC with 64 conference wins -- the most of any MWC school. Mendenhall also helped the Cougars bring bowl wins over Oregon, UCLA, Oregon State and UTEP as the program enters a new era as one of four independent schools, joining Notre Dame, Army and Navy.

Last year's BYU team achieved a 7-6 record and tied for third in the MWC at 5-3 while playing 19 freshmen and facing a schedule that featured eight bowl teams and four opponents that finished in final BCS Top 25 standings. Mendenhall took over defensive coordinator responsibilities after the team's 1-4 start and the team responded to become one of the top defensive teams over the final eight games.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.

### PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff has six members who have played professional football. Associate Head Coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in 2002, while defensive line coach Steve Kaufusi and outside linebacker coach Kelly Poppinga played in the NFL with the Arizona Cardinals. Graduate assistant Shaun Nua also spent some time with the Pittsburgh Steelers. In addition, receivers coach Ben Cahoon spent 13 years with the Canadian Football League's Montreal Alouettes.

In addition, Poppinga and Nua are both Super Bowl champions; Poppinga won a ring with the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII while Nua earned his in the Steelers' Super Bowl XL victory. Cahoon also won the ultimate prize in the CFL by leading the Montreal to three Grey Cup championships in 2002, 2009 and 2010.

### THE NEW GUYS

The BYU coaching staff welcomed two new members this past offseason in running backs coach Joe DuPaix and receivers coach Ben Cahoon.

DuPaix most recently coached at Navy for the past three seasons, helping led the Midshipmen to three bowl bids. In each of his three seasons, Navy was one of the top-6 rushing programs in the country, including an NCAA-best 293.4 ypg in 2008. A Salt Lake City native, DuPaix played under his father, Roger, a successful high school coach at Skyline who also coached current BYU offensive coordinator Brandon Doman in high school. DuPaix played quarterback at Snow College (Ephraim, UT) and Southern Utah where he set the FCS record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a season.

Cahoon retired in after the 2010 season as the all-time receptions leader in CFL history. Cahoon also set records for most receiving yards in a career in Grey Cup games and most touchdowns by an Alouette in addition to earning the CFL Most Outstanding Canadian Award in 2002 and 2003. A native of Orem, Utah, Cahoon was an All-WAC performer in addition to being an Academic All-American. He is also the son-in-law of current Utah Governor Gary Herbert.

# 2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL

## LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

### LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,725-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. Beginning in 2010, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63,275 after seating was removed to allow for additional wheelchair access.

### "FAN" TASTIC FANS

The attendance in BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada in 2010 was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sellouts at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The last time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

### TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWDS

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah last season is currently tenth with 64,301 fans attending the game. In 2010, BYU averaged 61,380 fans per home game.



### HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. Last season, BYU averaged 30.0 points per game at home. The Cougars have not had a negative points per game margin for the past seven seasons, including all six years of head coach Bronco Mendenhall's tenure. In 2006, a 35.16-point differential was a BYU record in scoring margin in the stadium's 46-year history and the program's 86-year history:
