# WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- BYU will go on the road for the first time since Sept. 10 after hosting four-straight home games. The Cougars have not traveled to the state of Oregon since 1990 when BYU lost at Oregon, 32-16. The last time BYU has traveled to Oregon State was in 1978, claiming a 10-6 victory.

- Oregon State marks the Cougars' second opponent against a Pac-12 school after facing Utah earlier this year. BYU has played four schools from three BCS automatic qualifying conferences (Pac-12, Big 12, SEC) and schools from five conferences total (also C-USA and WAC).

- BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall was a two-year starter with the Beavers from 1986-87 at safety and linebacker and was team captain his senior year. Mendenhall also began his coaching career at OSU as a grad assistant in 1989 before joining the Beavers' staff full-time in 1995 as first the defensive line coach and later defensive coordinator.

- After playing its latest game since 1999 last week in an 8:17 pm MT kickoff time, the Cougars will kickoff at 2 pm MT against Oregon State, their earliest kickoff of the season.

- BYU's Justin Sorensen was named Independent Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts against San Jose State. A sophomore from South Jordan, Utah, Sorensen had a perfect day from the placement spot as BYU extended its victory streak to three games with a 29-16 home win over San Jose State. Sorensen was 2-for-2 on field goal attempts (hitting from 42 and 45 yards) and made all three of his PATs. On the season, Sorensen is now 9-for-11 on FGs and 13-for-13 on PATs.

# 2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL LAST TIME - UTAH STATE

#### BYU GETS 29-16 HOMECOMING VICTORY

PROVO, Utah - Quarterback Riley Nelson threw three early touchdown passes and the BYU football team held off a pesky San Jose State team 29-16 at LaVell Edwards Stadium on Saturday night.

BYU (4-2) used a balanced attack with 224 rushing yards and 219 passing yards to overpower San Jose State (2-4) and win its third game in a row in front of 59,782 fans.

"It was a good football game especially from an offensive growth perspective," head coach Bronco Mendenhall said. "I think we made ourselves more difficult to defend. That running game was the key determinate in our win."

Nelson finished his fourth-career start 14 of 24 passing for 219 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. The junior set a new career high in completions, attempts, passing yards and touchdowns. Nelson also added 65 rushing yards on nine attempts.

Sophomore Michael Alisa provided a spark in the run game, picking up a career-high 91 yards on 16 carries to lead the team. Tight end Richard Wilson caught his first career touchdown pass, a 21-yarder in the first quarter and finished the game with a team-high 66 receiving yards on three receptions.

The Cougars got two big interceptions to end Spartan scoring threats, one by linebacker Kyle Van Noy and another by safety Travis Uale. Linebacker Brandon Ogletree also had a career-high 10 tackles to lead BYU.

Nelson was able to lead the team down the field on their first drive but fumbled on the 3-yard line. The Cougars were still able to get points on the board on the next play when San Jose State snapped the ball high and out the back of the end zone for a safety to give BYU a 2-0 lead with 9:06 left in the first quarter.

On their next possession, the Cougars found the end zone on an 21-yard touchdown pass from Nelson to Wilson. The drive featured Alisa breaking a tackle and staying on his feet for a gain of 12 yards to set up the score.

San Jose State answered back with a field goal with 17 seconds left in the first quarter. The Spartans hit from 24-yards out to cut the score to 9-3.

The Cougars continued to roll on offense, putting together a 9-play, 75-yard drive. Running back Bryan Kariya caught a 1-yard touchdown pass from Nelson to give BYU a 16-3 lead with 10:58 left in the half. Nelson connected with Wilson for a 35-yard gain earlier in the drive.

Van Noy intercepted a pass and returned it 31 yards to the Spartans 40-yard line. On the Cougars' first play of the possession Nelson hit a wide open McKay Jacobson for another touchdown, Nelson's third of the game, with 8:49 left in the half. BYU led 23-3 after the score.

The Spartans tacked on another field goal in the last few seconds of the half. San Jose State kicker Jens Alvernik drilled a 40-yarder through the uprights to make it 23-6 in favor of the Cougars at the half.

In the second half, the Spartans completed a 96-yard drive with a 1-yard touchdown run from Jason Simpson to cut the score to 23-13 with 6:09 remaining in the third quarter.

Kicker Justin Sorensen gave BYU three more points with a 42-yard field goal with 32 seconds left in the third quarter. Sorensen's first field goal of the night put the Cougars ahead 26-13 heading into the fourth quarter.

BYU and San Jose State traded field goals late in the fourth quarter but the Cougars held on for the 29-16 win.

#### SAN JOSE STATE GAME NOTES

#### BLOWING THE TOP OFF

Junior Riley Nelson surpassed his previous career high of 144 yards passing on a 40-yard touchdown pass to McKay Jacobson in the second quarter that gave him 145 yards on 8 of 9 passing for a rating of 334.2. Nelson finished with 219 yards on 14 of 24 passing with three touchdowns – all career highs. Nelson also fin ished second on the team with 65 yards rushing on nine carries.

#### GROUND GAME

BYU rushed 44 times for 224 yards. The Cougars finished with more rushing yards (224) than passing yards (219) for the first time this season.

#### CHANGING DIRECTION

Kyle Van Noy had his second interception of the season in the second quarter. This season, Van Noy has been part of four of BYU's nine forced turnovers, adding a forced fumble and a fumble recovery this season.

#### BREAKING UP IS HARD TO DO

With two pass breakups, senior Corby Eason has nine on the year, good for fifth place on the Cougar record book for most in a season (since 2000 when defensive records were officially kept by the NCAA).

#### A NEW EXPERIENCE

Running back Bryan Kariya's 1-yard touchdown reception was the senior's first TD catch since the SDSU game in 2009 and his first scoring reception at LaVell Edwards Stadium in his career.

#### TIGHT END SIGHTINGS

After getting the first touchdown by a tight end last week vs. Utah State (game-winner by Marcus Mathews), sophomore TE Richard Wilson caught a 21-yard scoring reception in the first quarter for his first-career touchdown. Wilson set a new career high with 66 receiving yards and three catches.

#### SAFETY FIRST

BYU scored its first points of the night on a safety, the first by a BYU opponent since Wyoming last season.

#### MORE CAREER HIGHS

Junior linebacker Brandon Ogletree totaled a new career best with 10 tackles. On the offensive side, sophomore running back Michael Alisa had a career night with 16 carries for 91 yards.

#### AND THE STREAK CONTINUES

Sophomore receiver Cody Hoffman has caught a pass in 12-straight games. Hoffman has caught at least one pass in 18 of 19 career games.

#### RUNNING OUT THE FLAG

BYU was led out of the tunnel today by senior Jordan Pendleton carrying the team flag and junior David Foote with the special teams flag. Tight end Gabe Reid (1999-02), who played four seasons in the NFL and participated in the 2007 Super Bowl carried out the alumni flag.

#### THE BYU-OREGON STATE SERIES

BYU and Oregon State have played nine times in program history with the Beavers holding a 5-4 edge in the series. The last time the two teams faced each other was in the 2009 Maaco Bowl Las Vegas, when both teams were ranked in the top 20 for the first time in the bowl's history. The Cougars handled Oregon State 44-20 on a December 23rd evening that featured cold and rainy conditions, as well as 55-mph gusts on occasion. A senior-laden BYU team dominated from start to finish, led by quarterback Max Hall tossing three touchdowns. Senior tight ends Dennis Pitta and Andrew George led BYU in receiving with 45 and 46 yards, respectively. Pitta caught a touchdown pass and senior running back Manase Tonga caught one touchdown and rushed for another. Senior linebacker Matt Bauman also recovered a fumble and returned it 34 yards for the first-ever fumble return for a touchdown in BYU bowl history. Senior safety Scott Johnson intercepted a pass and returned it 56 yards to set up the Cougars' final score of the game.

#### OREGON STATE LAST TIME

Corvallis, Ore. - Sean Mannion threw for 267 yards and two touchdowns and Oregon State defeated the mistake-prone Arizona Wildcats 37-27 on Saturday for the Beavers' first victory of the season.

Quarterback Nick Foles was intercepted twice and the Wildcats (1-5, 0-3 Pac-12) lost two fumbles in their fifth straight loss overall and eighth straight conference loss. Oregon State (1-4, 1-2) led 27-6 at halftime and nearly squandered it but held on to snap a six-game losing streak dating to last season.

With only a narrow 30-27 lead and 5:22 left, Oregon State went for it on fourth-and-2 -- succeeding when Mannion hit diving tight end Joe Halahuni for the touchdown.

The Beavers made a crucial stand on the other end when the Wildcats also took a chance on fourth down with two yards to go, and Dan Buckner couldn't catch Foles' pass in the end zone.

Foles completed 31 of 45 passes for 378 yards and a touchdown to Buckner, who caught eight passes for 144 yards.

Mannion, a redshirt freshman who didn't become the Beavers' official starter until the third game of the season, completed 32 of 41 passes.

The Wildcats were hurt early after starting wide receiver Juron Criner left with what appeared to be a right knee injury. Criner, ranked second in career touchdown catches for the Wildcats, has three this season.

Offensive lineman Terence Brown is recognized as one of the best centers in college football on the Rimington Trophy Watch List. Fellow lineman Braden Hansen joins Reynolds on the Outland Trophy Watch List and quarterback Jake Heaps has also been named to the Davey O'Brien Watch List.

#### BYU VS. BCS AQS

With the victory over Ole Miss, BYU has defeated a team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference six-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 15 of the past 16 years dating back to 1996.

#### HOME COOKIN'

Head coach Bronco Mendenhall has often emphasized the importance of winning at home. Since he has taken the reigns of the program, BYU is 33-7 at home. The Cougars are 3-1 to start the year at home and last season BYU was 5-1 at LaVell Edwards Stadium. Mendenhall and the Cougars won 18-straight games in Provo from 2006-09.

#### A WEIRD PATTERN

- Three of BYU's four wins in 2011 have come:
- 1) After trailing at halftime
- 2) When the opponent scores first
- 3) After losing the coin toss
- 4) Scoring the winning points in the fourth quarter5) while playing on ESPN.

### FOURTH-QUARTER COMEBACKS

Six games into the season, BYU has already had three fourth-quarter comebacks. The heroics over Utah State featued two late touchdown drives both coming in the fourth quarter to help the Cougars overcome a 24-13 lead and go on to win 27-24. BYU also came back in the fourth the week before to beat UCF 24-17 with a 6-yard touchdown run from Bryan Kariya after a muffed punt from UCF for the eventual game-winner. In the season opener at Ole Miss, late in the fourth quarter linebacker Kyle Van Noy stripped the ball from the Rebels' quarterback, scooped it up and took it three yards into the end zone for the score to help BYU win 14-13.

# **2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL** TEAM NOTES

#### MAKE YOURSELF COMFORTABLE

After starting with two games on the road, BYU had four-straight home games, going 3-1 for the homestretch. After dropping the rivalry game against Utah, BYU went on two win the next two over UCF and Utah State, both fourth-quarter comebacks. Last week, BYU got their third-straight home win over San Jose State. The last time the Cougars had four home games in a row was in 1991 when BYU had Air Force, Utah State, UTEP and Hawaii all in Provo. The Cougars won all four games during the stretch by a margin of victory of almost 16 points. BYU has seven home games this year.

### HE'S KIND OF A BIG DEAL

Senior captain and offensive tackle Matt Reynolds returns for his senior season after deciding not to enter the NFL draft despite a first round projection. Reynolds has been rewarded with several preseason accolades, including being named a preseason All-American by by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, CBSCollegeSports. com, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others. Along with those honors, Reynolds has recognized as an Outland Trophy Candidate, a Lombardi Award Candidate and a Lowe's Senior Class Award Nominee.

### BRING ON THE BCS

Since the start of the Bowl Championship Series in 1998, BYU has played at least two BCS-automatic qualifying teams every year. In 2011, the Cougars are playing four BCS schools this year in Ole Miss, Texas, Utah and Oregon State. Only two other seasons (2000 and 2003) has BYU played as many BCS teams. To start the 2011 season the Cougars play three of the four teams conecutively, opening with road games at Ole Miss and Texas before the home opener against Utah. Not since 1998 has BYU started a season against three BCS teams, when the Cougars lost to Alabama and Washington on the road and defeated Arizona State at home.

### FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

With BYU playing UCF on a Friday night, as well as Utah State and TCU, it is the most Friday night games the Cougars have played in the Bronco Mendenhall era. Under Coach Mendenhall, BYU is 4-1 on Friday night games, with four of the games against Utah State. This is also the first time under Mendenhall that the Cougars played back-to-back Friday night games, with UCF and Utah State the past two weeks.

#### A HOMECOMING TRIP

The Cougars have four players from the state of Oregon and some saw significant recruting effors from the Beavers. Tight end Marcus Mathews is from Beaverton, along with freshman offensive lineman Devon Smith. Beaverton is 68 miles away from Oregon State's home of Corvallis, while linebacker Seth Probert is from Lebenon just 18 miles away. Running back Ryan Folsom comes from Medford, about 156 miles away. Though not from the the state of Oregon, Cody Hoffman is from Crescent City, Calif., a small city in the northern part of the state, just about 20 miles from the Oregon border, and around 200 miles from Corvallis.

### MCKAY AND HIS QBS

Wide receiver McKay Jacobson has had the luxury of having a top-notch quarterback be around him for almost all of his football career. While he currently has the promising sophomore Jake Heaps and gritty junior Riley Nelson, he has caught passes at BYU from NFL quarterbacks Max Hall and John Beck. Even at the high school level, Jacobson connected with future NFL talent. At Carroll High School in Southlake, Texas (an incredibly fruitful recruiting ground), Alabama quarterback Greg McElroy who led the Crimson Tide to a 2009 National Championship tossed the pigskin to Jacobson befor entering the NFL. Another NFL quarterback, Chase Daniel was Jacobson's quarterback for two years in high school as well.

### ON THE ROAD AGAIN

BYU's road trip to Corvallis is the third road trip of the season but the first after a four-game home series. BYU is 1-1 on the road in 2011 after playing at Ole Miss and at Texas to start the year. The Cougars have just four true road games this year, with a fifth contest away from LaVell Edwards Stadium but at a neutral site, Dallas Cowboys Stadium at the end of the month to take on TCU. The last time BYU had just five regular season games away from home was 2005. In 1996 and 1998, BYU played eight games away from home, including postseason play. Those seasons also included a WAC Championship game.

### BAND OF BROTHERS

While BYU's motto is "Band of Brothers," there are four sets of brothers on the 2011 roster including Terence (Sr. OL) and Rhen (Jr. WR) Brown, Braden (Jr. OL) and Trevor Brown (Fr. TE), Matt (Sr. OL) and Houston (So. OL) Reynolds, and Iona (So. RB) and Baker (Fr. DL) Pritchard.

In addition, 13 different players, Kevan Bills, Gavin Fowler, Spencer Hafoka, Braden Hansen, Alex Kuresa, Marcus Mathews, Zed Mendenhall, Rex Morgan, Mike Muehlmann, Houston Reynolds, Matt Reynolds, Jordan Richardson and Jadon Wagner also boast brothers who have played for the Cougar football program in the past.

### FATHER'S DAY

Currently seven BYU players are also fathers, led by senior wide receiver Spencer Hafoka, with two children. Other dads on the team include Matt Reynolds, Travis Uale, Alani Fua, Aveni Leung-Wai and the newest dad, Brandon Ogletree.

Nine players also had fathers who played football at BYU: Famika Anae (Robert), Dallin Cutler (Chuck), Gavin Fowler (Blaine), Jameson Frazier (Danny), Colby Hansen (Regan), Carter Mees (Mike), Jordan Pendleton (Kirk), Matt Reynolds (Lance) and Houston Reynolds (Lance).

### HOLY MATRIMONY

BYU has long held the distinction of having the most married players of any other school in the country. This year is no exception. BYU currently has 33 players who are married.

### TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting offensive line is largely considered to be one of its major team strengths . . . literally. Measuring in at an average of 6-feet-6 inches and over 310 pounds, the offensive line is built to plow the road for a successful running attack and protect the quarterback.

#### CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of seven different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Cambodian, French, Korean, Portuguese, Spanish and Thai.

#### SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga is one of 74 players (61 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 29 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Germany, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, Mongolia, Mozambique, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 14 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nevada, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas.

Overall, 51 current members (42 percent) of the BYU football team speak a combined total of 21 different foreign languages and dialects, including Cebuano, Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Italy, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Swedish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

#### WHAT IS A MISSION?

\* The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.

\* The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and Paul in the Bible).

\* More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.

\* Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.

\* Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions — except for their transportation to and from their field of labor — and are not paid for their services.

\* Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.

\* Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in 14 additional countries including Brazil, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico and Spain.

\* Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."

\* A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.

\* In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.

\* Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL **OFFENSIVE NOTES** 

### NOT A LONG LIST

BYU hasn't had many guarterbacks with Riley Nelson's skill set of running and passing. It's a short list but Nelson has a chance to make some noise on the career quarterback-rushing leaders for the Cougars. In fact, he is sneaking up on former BYU guarterback and current offensive coordinator Brandon Doman's mark on the list.

#### **GETTING OFFENSIVE**

For the second-straight week the BYU offense was able to rack up at least 400 yards of total offense. Against San Jose State the Cougars picked up 446 yards and vs. Utah State the team used 451 total yards to beat the Aggies. Each game featured at least 200 rushing yards. In the past three games the Cougars have slowly improved their scoring as well, scoring 24, 27 and 29 points.

#### GOING FOR A DRIVE

BYU's 97-yard scoring drive, the Cougars' third drive of the game at Texas, was the team's longest since a 99-yard drive in the fourth quarter against Utah State in 2006. Since that time, BYU has had 10 drives of 90 yards or more. The Cougars' gamewinning drive against the Utah State Aggies was 96 yards officially, although the team actually had to go 98 yards. Quarterback Riley Nelson lost two yards on his first rush of the drive, pushing BYU all the way back to inside its own two yard line. Against San Jose State, the Cougars didn't need too long of a drive, the longest coming in the form of a 9-play 75-yard drive for a touchdown. Actualy, BYU had three scoring drives of 50-yards or less.

#### CAREER HIGHS FOR A FULL NELSON

Quarterback Riley Nelson played his first career full game for BYU against San Jose State. The completed 14 of 24 passes for 219 yards, three touchdowns and two interceptions. Nelson set new career-highs last week against Utah State but after a four guarters of continuous play. Nelson broke those personal bests again, setting new career marks in passing completions, attempts, yards and touchdown passes. Nelson also added 65 rushing yards on nine attempts.

#### GETTING SOME AIR TIME

For the first time this year the Cougars aired it out into the end zone. BYU's three touchdowns through the air were the most in a single game for the 2011 season. Tight end Richard Wilson caught a 21-yard touchdown reception in the first quarter. Running back Bryan Kariya caught a 1-yard pass for a score and wide receiver McKay Jacobson caught a 40-yard touchdown pass in the second quarter.

#### BE LIKE MIKE

Running back Michael Alisa had only seen limited time before San Jose State but after weeks of solid practice the coaches decided to give him more opportunities. Alisa responded with 91 yards on 16 carries to emerge as the primary ball carrier vs. San Jose State. The sophomore consistently ran down hill for power and broke tackles to pick up yards. He averaged 5.7 yards per carry and had a long run of 14 yards. Alisa set career-highs in rushing yards and attempts. Before his two-year mission, Alisa played mostly linebacker along with some running back for the Cougars.

### BALANCED ATTACK

In BYU's 29-16 victory over San Jose State the Cougars used a very balanced attack to overpower the Spartans. Quarterback Riley Nelson threw for 219 yards while the running backs combined for 224 yards on the ground. In the week prior, a balanced game help defeat Utah State when BYU threw the ball for 251 yards and rushed for an even 200 yards to help beat the Aggies.

#### **RUNNING BY COMMITTEE**

With Michael Alisa emerging as a fouth running back, the Cougars were able to roll up a season high 224 yards rushing against San Jose State. Alisa led the team with 16 carries and 91 rushing yards. Quarterback Riley Nelson helped on the ground with 65 yards on nine attempts. Josh Quezada picked up 47 yards on nine carries, JJ DiLuigi carried the ball five times for 16 yards and Bryan Kariya chipped in with six yards on three carries.

### IT'S A REYNOLDS THING

BYU has had a tradition of sibling teammates for years. One of the most prominent has been the Reynolds brothers. In fact, the Cougars have had at least one Reynolds brother start on the offensive line every season dating back to 2004. Lance Jr. (2001-05), Dallas (2005-08), Matt (2007-Pres.) and Houston (2009-Pres.) have combined for 114 starts since 2004. Continuing further on the Reynolds' offensive line, BYU has actually had at least two of the brothers starting together three different seasons with Lance Jr. and Dallas starting 12 games together in 2005, Dallas and Matt starting 13 games in 2008, and with Houston getting the starting nod at Ole Miss, he joined Matt for another Reynolds tag team. As a sophomore this season, it looks like Houston will continue the Reynolds tradition for a few more years.

# **2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL** OFFENSIVE NOTES

DON'T HASSLE THE HOFF

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman has become the playmaking receiver, especially in the last three games. After catching just three passes for 20 yards in the first two games.

Hoffman had just one catch for eight yards against San Jose State but did return three kicks for 73 yards, including a long return of 27 yards. He made play after play against Utah State, catching four passes for 68 vards, including a 24-vard touchdown grab, his first of the year. Against UCF, Hoffman had his biggest play on special teams, returning a kickoff 93-yards to the house to tie the score late in the third guarter. Hoffman also caught three passes for 24 yards in the game as part of his 153 all-purpose vards. The week before against Utah. Hoffman grabbed 8 balls for 138 vards to lead the team. He set a career mark for receptions and yards in a quarter, catching five balls for 98 yards in the first fifteen minutes of play. Hoffman's catch total and yards for the game were also a career-high mark to add to a new career-high in kick returns as well with 8 returns and 139 yards, giving 277 all-purpose yards, the sixth-best mark in BYU history.

With 1,619 all-purpose yards in his career, Hoffman passed kick returner James Dye for 55th all-time at BYU. With 713 all-purpose yards in 2011 and just a sophomore, Hoffman will continue to move up the list.

#### ONE AND TWO

After Marcus Mathews caught the first touchdown pass by a tight end in the win over Utah State, tight end Richard Wilson decided to get into the action as well, catching a 21-yard touchdown pass for the next touchdown reception of the season. The tight ends hadn't caught a touchdown pass before Mathews since Dennis Pitta caught a 17-yard strike from Max Hall in the 2009 Las Vegas Bowl. After a 17-game scoreless streak, the tight ends have started a better streak with two in a row.

#### DI LUIGI DOES IT ALL

Senior running back JJ Di Luigi was named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List before the season began. The versatile back had had 16 yards rushing and 12 yards receiving against San Jose State. He had 50 yards on 11 carries in the Utah State game to go along with two catches for 26 yards. He had 38 yards on seven carries against UCF, including a season-high 18-yard run. Di Luigi also had two catches for 16 yards. He had 31 yards rushing against Utah and caught two passes for nine yards. He carried the ball 14 times for 39 yards against Texas while catching three passes for 24 yards, totaling 63 all-purpose yards against the Longhorns. Di Luigi moved into 23rd all-time at BYU in all-purpose yards and is 15th in career rushing yards. Here is how Di Luigi looks on the all-time lists and who he might pass in the coming weeks:

#### HOFFMAN KEEPS IT GOING

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman continues his streak, catching at least one pass in 12-straight games. Hoffman caught just one pass for eight yards against San Jose State. He caught four passes for 68 yards and one touchdown against Utah State. He grabbed three receptions for 24 yards against UCF. Hoffman finished with a team-high eight catches and 138 yards. He extends his streak to 11 games with at least one reception and 18 of 19 career games.

#### TIGHT ENDS STRONG

With the tight end position seeing a drop off last year, a revamped tight end crew is bringing the tight end back to a force in BYU's offense. After six games of the season, the tight ends have accounted for 407 yards on 34 catches and two touchdowns. Last week the tight ends caught 4 passes for 82 yards and one touchdown. The game-winner against Utah State was caught by flext tight end Marcus Mathews and the tight ends accounted for eight receptions for 68 yards. Against UCF the tight ends caught five passes for 49 yards. Against Utah, the tight ends combined for six catches and 76 yards. At Texas, the they caught seven passes for 88 yards. The tight ends are consistently performing for the Cougar offense and are off to a good start.

#### GROUND GAME GOING

After a slow start to the running game, BYU has rushed for 551 yards, including the last two games where the Cougars have rushed for 200 or more yards, including a season-high 224 yards against San Jose State. JJ Di Luigi leads the way with 230 yards on 56 carries and one touchdown on the year.

#### FIRST TIMERS

Running back Bryan Kariya got his first receiving touchdown in LaVell Edwards Stadium on Saturday night on a 1-yard grab. Tight end Richard Wilson caught his first-career touchdown on an 21-yard reception for a score against the Spartans. The week prior, tight end Marcus Mathews and BYU had a number of firsts in the game against Utah State. It was the first time Mathews caught a touchdown pass as a Cougar, coming in dramatic fashion with 11 seconds left and off a deflected ball. It was also the first tight end touchdown reception this year. It was also the first time BYU had two passing touchdowns this year and the first time wide receiver Cody Hoffman caught a touchdown pass this year.



# **2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL** DEFENSIVE NOTES

#### SPREADING THE WEALTH

Team defense has been the key to BYU's success so far this season as only two players have recorded double digit tackles in any game. Spencer Hadley did against Texas with a team-high 12 tackles and Brandon Ogletree finished with 10 against San Jose State. Eight Cougars currently have 20 or more tackles on the season, with Ogletree leading the way with 37 total tackles despite missing one game due to a concussion. Three BYU defenders (Kyle Van Noy, Daniel Sorenson, Uona Kaveinga) are tied for second on the team with 28 tackles.

### FIRST PLAY THEATRICS

In the three of the last four games BYU has played at LaVell Edwards Stadium, one of the teams has scored on their first offensive play of the game. Against SJSU, the Cougars scored two points on SJSU's first offensive play after SJSU center snapped the ball past the quarterback for a safety. In the game against Utah State, Aggie running back Robert Turbin took the opening handoff against the BYU defense 80 yards for touchdown. Against Utah, BYU quarterback Jake Heaps fumbled the opening snap and the Utes recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown.

### FORCING FUMBLES

Junior linebacker Uona Kaveinga has forced three fumbles in BYU's last six games. His three forced fumbles are tied for the second-most in a season by a BYU player since 2000. Kaveinga's three forced fumbles in six games currently ranks him 12th in the NCAA in that category. Andrew Rich had three forced fumbles in 2010 and Ryan Denney had four forced fumbles in 2001.

#### BEHIND ENEMY LINES

After recording the first team sacks of the season against UCF, the BYU front seven again spent a lot of time in the opponents' backfield against San Jose State and Utah State. The Cougars recorded 5.0 TFL against the Spartans, the second most for the Cougars in a game this season. The team did not record a sack against Utah State but the Cougar defense finished with a season best 6.0 tackles-for-loss and three quarterback hurries. Senior Hebron Fangupo led the team with 1.5 TFL and also recorded a QBH.

### VAN NOY RECORD

With a fumble recovery for a touchdown against Ole Miss, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy became the first BYU player in history to return two fumbles for touchdowns. Van Noy is also the last Cougar defender to score two touchdowns since Derwin Gray returned two interceptions in 1990-91. The BYU touchdown record for a defender is three by both Mike Russell (1973-74) and Todd Shell (1980-81). Van Noy becomes the ninth Cougar overall to score at least two touchdowns.

### FIRST-YEAR STARTERS

In their first season as regular starters, sophomores Daniel Sorenson and Kyle Van Noy have been some of the biggest impact players on the Cougar defense. Against Texas, Van Noy totaled a career-best seven tackles and had one quarterback hit. Against rival Utah, Van Noy snagged his first interception of the season. Sorenson finished second on the team with nine tackles and had his first INT of the season against Texas while tallying four tackles against Utah. In week one against Ole Miss, both Van Noy and Sorenson played pivotal roles. Van Noy was named FBS Independent Defensive Player of the Week for his fumble recovery and game-winning touchdown, while Sorenson recovered a fumble and had six tackles.

### TURNOVER STREAK

The Cougar defense has forced a turnover in 10 of their last 11 games dating back to the 2010 season. The only game in 2011 that BYU has failed to produce a turnover came against Utah State. In the battle against San Jose State, the Cougars picked off two passes for the second time this season.

#### PREVENTING THE PASS

BYU has allowd a passing touchdown in just 1 of 6 games this season and held three of its six opponents under 150 yards passing in 2011. Utah State quarterback Chuckie Keeton to just 122 yards on 26 passing attempts. The Cougars held Ole Miss to 145 yards passing and Texas to 123 yards through the air. The Cougars currently rank 28th in the NCAA in passing defense, allowing an average of 189.20 yards per game. BYU also ranks 36th in passing efficiency defense.

### FUMBLE RECOVERIES

After forcing and recovering two fumbles against Ole Miss and UCF, the Cougars are 3-0 in the last two seasons when recovering multiple fumbles. The Cougars forced and recovered two fumbles just once last season, in a 44-7 win versus Colorado State.

#### RUNNING IN PLACE

In one of its best performances of the season, the BYU defense held the San Jose State running attack to just eight yards on seven carries in the first quarter and 13 yards on 12 carries in the first half. The 1.1 yards-percarry average for SJSU is the lowest per-carry average for a BYU opponent in a first half this season. The 13 yards rushing gained is also the lowest total for an opponent in a first half this season against the Cougars. The performance helped the BYU rushing defense move up 15 places in the NCAA rankings, from 78th to 63rd.

### TURNOVER CITY

In six games so far this season the BYU defense has forced 11 total turnovers. The Cougars are nearly halfway to their total of 23 turnovers in 2010, which took the team 13 games to accrue last season. The 11 turnovers gained currently ranks 36th in the NCAA. Rutgers and South Carolina rank first in the category with 22 turnovers gained.

# **2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL** DEFENSIVE NOTES

#### ALL OVER THE FIELD

Sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy has tallied at least one statistic in every major defensive category in 2011, making him one of four players in the NCAA to do so this season. He continued his versatile streak against San Jose State in the BYU homecoming game when he contributed four tackles, an interception and a pass breakup.

On the season, Van Nov has 16 unassisted tackles, 12 assisted tackles, 28 total tackles, two TFL, one sack. one forced fumble, one fumble recovery, two interceptions, one QBH and three pass breakups. He has recorded a pass breakup in three consecutive games and has at least four tackles in five of six games in 2011.

### LOOKING FOR SAFETY

On the first San Jose State offensive play of the game, the Cougar defense helped force the offense into a center-quarterback miscue that led to a safety and a 2-0 BYU lead in the first guarter. The safety is the first recorded safety by the Cougars since facing off against Wyoming on October 23, 2010. BYU is 3-0 in the past three games in which they record a safety.

#### CANADA CAN WAIT

After finishing his junior campaign with 37 tackles, including 6.5 for loss, senior Jadon Wagner was drafted by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats with the 44th overall pick of the 2011 Canadian Football League Draft. A native of Cranbrook, British Columbia, Wagner chose to bypass the opportunity to play in the CFL in order to return to the Cougars for his senior season.

Wagner had the best game of his 2011 season against UCF when he recorded six total tackles, including four in the first quarter.

Previous to enrolling at BYU, Wagner spent time with the Calgary Colts and Okargan Sun in the Canadian Junior Football League. As a rookie in the CJFL, Wagner led the nation in tackles with an average of 10 per game. He was also one of three players nominated for the CJFL Rookie of the Year award and helped lead his team to the conference final in his second year.

#### BEND BUT DON'T BREAK

In two of the last three games, the BYU passing defense has allowed guarterbacks to throw for 250 or more yards. Against San Jose State, SJSU quarterback Matt Faulkner completed 25 of 35 passes for 255 yards but was picked off twice by BYU in BYU territory. Against UCF, the Knight quarterbacks combined to throw for 318 yards, the first time the Cougars had allowed a 300 yard passer since playing San Diego State in October of 2010. In each game the Cougars have allowed 250 yards or more passing this season, the Cougars have also picked off two passes and won both games.

### BREAK IT UP

Senior defensive back Corby Eason has totaled nine pass breakups so far this year, including one in each of the last five games. Against Utah. Eason tied a BYU modern record with three breakups. Eason's season and career marks are climbing the BYU records (kept since 2000 when the NCAA officially began tracking defensive statistics):

named to the 2011 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List.

Named after Pro Football Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott, The Lott Trophy is awarded to college football's Defensive IMPACT Player of the Year for excellent performance both on and off the field.

Frazier contributed 34 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, on sack, three guarterback hurries and two interceptions last season despite missing three games due to injury.

#### FORMER GHANIAN SPRINTER AT LINEBACKER

Two years ago, no one foresaw junior Ezekiel Ansah lining up for the BYU football team. A freshman at the time. Ansah was recruited to BYU as a sprinter for the track and field team.

A native of Accra, Ghana, Ansah related well to BYU sprint coach Leonard Myles-Mills, also a Ghana native. Despite never playing a down of football in his life, Ansah saw action in six games on special teams and defensive line in 2010. A naturally gifted athlete, Ansah recorded three total tackles and a pass breakup in the first ever football game action.

#### SOMEONE FROM EVERYWHERE

The defensive two-deep hails from all corners of the country. Player home states include from Alaska, California, Georgia, Hawaii, Massachusetts, Nevada, Utah, Texas and Washington.

In addition, linebacker Jadon Wagner is from Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada.

# **2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL** SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

### FOR THE LONGEST TIME

Cody Hoffman's 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the third guarter was the first for a Cougar in more than 13 years, a streak that spanned 158 games. Mike Rigell was the last BYU returner to take a kickoff the distance with a 96-yard return in 1998 against Hawaii.

Hoffman's kickoff return was the first touchdown by a BYU special teams unit since McKav Jacobson took a punt return for a touchdown as a freshman in 2006.

For his performance, Hoffman was named the National Kickoff Returner of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards.

### DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung came to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

### SPECIAL FLAG

In addition to the traditional team flag and alumni flag leading the team out of the tunnel before kickoff, BYU has also incorporated a special teams flag with an old school BYU logo this season. Against San Jose State, sophomore David Foote carried out the special teams flag.



### NO PUNTING ALLOWED

For the first time in the 2011 season, the BYU special teams unit was not forced to punt for the duration of the game against San Jose State. The Cougars either scored or turned the ball over on each possession of the game. The Cougars had just one game in 2010 with zero punts, which came in a 49-10 win at Colorado State on November 13.

### MOVING ON UP

After the fifth game of the season againt Utah State, the BYU special teams unit improved in nearly every statistical category. The BYU kickoff teams have led the Cougars so far this season, as the return defense ranks 16th in the NCAA and the return team ranks 24th in the nation. Punter Riley Stephenson currently ranks 31st in the NCAA in punt average (42.42) and Cody Hoffman ranks 28th in yards per kickoff return (25.47).

### ALL-PURPOSE

Sophomore wide receiver Cody Hoffman returned kickoffs for the second consecutive game against UCF, which resulted in the first kickoff return for a touchdown since 1998 for the Cougars. As an all-purpose threat, Hoffman has led BYU in total yards in three of the last four games. Against SJSU, Hoffman finished with 81 total yards, second on the team. Hoffman finished the game against UCF with a team high 153 total yards. Hoffman again led the Cougars in total yards against Utah State, with 158 total yards. The USU game marked the third consecutive game that Hoffman has led BYU in total yards. Against Utah, Hoffman had a career high 277 total yards to lead the team.

### PENALTY FREE

The top statistical category the BYU so far this season has come thanks in large part to discipline. The Cougars currently rank 14th in fewest yards penalized per game and 17th in fewest penalties per game. The national leaders in each category are Kentucky and Navy, respectively.

### **BIG TIME PUNTS**

After recording eight punts of 50+ yards in 2009 and 17 such boots in 2010, punter Riley Stephenson continued his trend by slamming one kick beyond 50 yards against Ole Miss and recorded a season long 67 yard punt against UCF.

Stephenson was a difference maker against UCF by averaging 45.3 yards per punt and by booming a 56yard punt near the end of the first half to prevent UCF form having a chance to put more points on the board. After averaging 44.8 yards per punt against Utah State, Stephenson now ranks 33rd in the NCAA in yards per punt with a 42.42 average.

### **PINNING THEM BACK**

Junior punter Riley Stephenson twice pinned the UCF Knights inside the 20-yard line, giving him 35 career punts downed inside the 20. Stephenson had a clutch punt in the third guarter that put the Knights inside the five-yard line.

Against Texas, Stephenson helped BYU win the field position battle with a punt that was downed on the Texas three-yard line. In the third game against Utah, Stephenson twice pinned Utah inside the 20.

### LEADING THE WAY

Sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen currently ranks 23rd in the NCAA in field goals per game with 1.50. He has nailed a field goal in the first half in four of six games this season and nailed two field goals in the second half against San Jose State. Sorensen is currently 17-21 on field goals this season, with a long of 48 yards. Sorensen has missed only one field goal inside of 40 yards this season and that came on his first attempt against Ole Miss, which was his first game after returning from a two-year LDS mission.

#### BRONCO MENDENHALL 7TH SEASON

During his six seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to six straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 56-21 (.727) record as he begins his seventh season to rank No. 16 in total wins among all teams in the nation during that span. The Cougars have received six straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first six teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in four of the last five seasons to become the first Cougar teams to win four bowls in a five-year span since LaVell Edwards teams did so from 1980-84. Nationally, BYU is one of only 11 programs to win four bowl games in the last five seasons.

In the last five years the Cougars have achieved a 50-15 record -- only eight teams have more wins over that span. In fact, BYU is one of only seven FBS programs to win 10 or more games during at least four of the last five seasons, and BYU and Boise State are the only programs in the West to achieve that consistent level of success. From 2006-2009 Mendenhall guided the Cougars to four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

BYU's success under Mendenhall is also evident

in

the national rankings and NCAA statistics. BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in the various national statistical categories 65 times in the past six seasons (42 offense, 16 defense, 6 special teams, 1 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 39 top-15 statistical rankings, 29 top-10 rank- ings and 15 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during each of the past five seasons and finished ranked No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season and has totaled 185 selections during Mendenhall's tenure, along with 64 MWC Scholar-Athlete awards. BYU also ranks second nationally for Academic All-America recipients over the past three seasons. Six Cougar student-athletes have been named ESPN Academic All-Americans the past three years. Among all FBS schools only Penn State has had more during that period.

Going independent in 2011, BYU was consistently a top MWC contender under Mendenhall. BYU achieved a 39-9 (.813) conference record over the past six years to help the Cougars complete their 12-year tenure in the MWC with 64 conference wins -- the most of any MWC school. Mendenhall also helped the Cougars bring bowl wins over Oregon, UCLA, Oregon State and UTEP as the program enters a new era as one of four independent schools, joining Notre Dame, Army and Navy.

> Last year's BYU team achieved a 7-6 record and tied for third in the MWC at 5-3 while playing 19 freshmen and facing a schedule that featured eight bowl teams and four opponents that finished in final BCS Top 25 standings. Mendenhall took over defensive coordinator responsibilities after the teams 1-4 start and the team responded to become one of the top defensive teams over the final eight games.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.

### PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff has six members who have played professional football. Assistant Head Coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in 2002 and played three years for the 49er's, while defensive line coach Steve Kaufusi and outside linebacker coach Kelly Poppinga played in the NFL with the Arizona Cardinals. Graduate assistant Shaun Nua also spent some time with the Pittsburgh Steelers. In addition, receivers coach Ben Cahoon spent 13 years with the Candian Football League's Montreal Alouettes before retiring as the CFL's all-time receptions leader.

In addition, Poppinga and Nua are both Super Bowl champions; Poppinga won a ring with the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII while Nua earned his in the Steelers' Super Bowl XL victory. Cahoon also won the ultimate prize in the CFL by leading the Montreal to three Grey Cup championships in 2002, 2009 and 2010.

### THE NEW GUYS

The BYU coaching staff welcomed two new members this past offseason in running backs coach Joe DuPaix and receivers coach Ben Cahoon.

DuPaix most recently coached at Navy for the past three seasons, helping led the Midshipmen to three bowl bids. In each of his three seasons, Navy was one of the top-6 rushing programs in the country, including an NCAA-best 293.4 ypg in 2008. A Salt Lake City native, DuPaix played under his father, Roger, a successful high school coach at Skyline who also coached current BYU offensive coordinator Brandon Doman in high school. DuPaix played quarterback at Snow College (Ephraim, UT) and Southern Utah where he set the FCS record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a season.

Cahoon retired in after the 2010 season as the all-time receptions leader in CFL history. Cahoon also set records for most receiving yards in a career in Grey Cup games and most touchdowns by an Alouette in addition to earning the CFL Most Outstanding Candian Award in 2002 and 2003. A native of Orem, Utah, Cahoon was an All-WAC performer in addition to being an Academic All-American. He is also the son-in-law of current Utah Governor Gary Herbert.

#### LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,470-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. With additional wheelchair access created in 2010-11, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63,470 beginning with the 2011 season.

#### **"FAN"TASTIC FANS**

The attendance at the BYU vs. Utah game was 63,742 - the first sellout for Edwards Stadium since last season's home opener against Washington. A sellout crowd of 63,513 also watched BYU's win over Utah State. In 2010, BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sellouts at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The prior time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance-231 short of a sellout.

## **TOP 10 EDWARDS**

#### STADIUM CROWDS

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64.749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah in 2009 is currently 10th with 64,301 fans attending the game. In 2010, BYU averaged 61,380 fans per home game.



#### HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. Last season, BYU averaged 30.0 points per game at home. The Cougars have not had a negative points per game margin for the past seven seasons, including all six years of head coach Bronco Mendenhall's tenure. In 2006, a 35.16-point differential was a BYU record in scoring margin in the stadium's 46-year history and the program's 86-year history:


