COUGAR QUICK HITS

— BYU has a record of 12-16 in its previous eight NCAA Tournaments and is 5-6 over the last two seasons, including an appearance in its first and only Super Regional in 2010.

— BYU is currently on a 14-game win streak, including a three-game run through the WAC Tournament. The streak is the third longest in program history behind two other streaks of 16 games apiece.

— Senior outfielder Delaney Willard was voted the WAC Player of the Year and All-WAC First Team by league coaches. Senior Jessica Dugas and junior JC Clayton were also named to the First Team while sophomores Tori Almond and Katie Manuma were among the Second Team honorees.

— Delaney Willard currently has 88 RBI, a new WAC single-season record and three away from the BYU record of 90 set by Angie Quiocho in 2010. She is ranked second in the nation just behind ULL's Christi Orgeron (91 RBI).

Willard is an All-America candidate and is currently ranked in the NCAA top-25 in nine different categories, including total RBI (2nd, 88), RBI per game (2nd, 1.57), slugging percentage (11th, .880), hits (14th, 71), home runs (14th, 18), doubles (15th, 17), batting average (20th, .428), home runs per game (20th, 0.32) and doubles per game (23rd, 0.30).

— Ranked 20th in the nation with a .428 batting average and fourth in the country with 77 hits, junior shortstop JC Clayton is on a 14-game hit streak with 30 total hits in the process. Clayton is also 21st in the country in runs scored and 27th in the nation in triples.

ONE OF A FEW

BYU is one of just 20 teams in the country to have played in each of the last eight NCAA Tournaments, tied with Arizona State and Texas for the 18th-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars and Louisiana-Lafayette are the only teams from mid-major conferences to have gone to eight straight.

NCAA TOURNEY UNDER EAKIN

Under Coach Gordon Eakin, the Cougars are 11-14 in NCAA Tournaments. BYU has reached the final day in five out of the eight Regionals Eakin has been the head coach.

DELANEY DELIGHT

Senior right fielder Delaney Willard has proven to be one of the best hitters in the country this season. Some of her highlights include:

- Collegiate Softball National Player of the Year Top 25 Finalist
- WAC Player of the Year, All-WAC 1st Team
- Ranked in the top 25 in the nation in nine categories, total RBI, RBI per game, slugging percentage, hits, home runs, doubles, batting average, home runs per game and doubles per game
- Second-most RBI in the nation with 88
- Broke the 14-year-old WAC record for RBI in a season (formerly 77 RBI)
- Hit a home run in four-straight games earlier this season, the third-longest such streak in NCAA history and making her the only person in NCAA history to have two streaks of four games or more in a career.
- Featured on ESPN.com as a potential Player of the Year candidate
- Earned three Verizon WAC Player of the Week honors, the most of any WAC player
- 28 multiple RBI games, including two with 5 RBI (CS Northridge, New Mexico State)
- Leads the WAC in eight different categories, including batting average, slugging & on base percentage, RBI, home runs and total bases
- Her 146 total bases are 37 more than the next



- nearest WAC player
- Listed in the top-10 in seven different career record categories at BYU
- Hit two grand slams this season, giving her four in her career, the second-most all-time at BYU
- Had 13-game and 11-game hit streaks this year
- Hit 7 home runs in the first 10 games of the season
- Had a streak of 9 straight games with an RBI from April 14-28.
- Hit a walk-off homer vs. New Mexico State, her second home run of the game

ON BASE OFTEN

Hits, walks, hit by pitch -- it doesn't matter how the Cougars have reached base this season, but they've done it more often than almost any other team in BYU history this season. Two players, JC Clayton and Delaney Willard, have on base percentages that rank in the top-10 in the BYU individual rankings.

JC AT THE BAT

All-WAC First Team honoree JC Clayton has been on fire from the plate recently, batting .638 on a current 14-game hit streak, also the length of BYU's current win streak. Clayton has 30 hits in



her last 47 at bats and has improved her batting average from .353 to a robust .428 during the streak, putting her average in a tie for first in the WAC and 20th in the nation.

Clayton is on pace to smash the BYU record for hits in a career as she is already No. 6 all-time, 42 behind the top spot. Her career .411 batting average and .470 on base percentage are both second-highest in program history.

HOMERS

The Cougars have compiled a 17-1 record at home this season and are 58-3 at Gail Miller Field since the middle of the 2008 season. Since 2009, BYU has not lost more than a single game at home in the last four seasons. This season, No. 15 Hawaii pulled out a 1-0 win in the Cougars' lone home loss, snapping a program-best 27-game home win streak.

HOWELLIN' GOOD

Becoming just the fourth pitcher in BYU history to win 20 games with a victory in the WAC Tournament Championship, junior Hannah Howell has carried BYU with a 20-7 record this year.



Despite time mostly as a relief pitcher her first two seasons, Howell is in the top-10 at BYU in career wins, strikeouts and innings pitched in addition to being tied for the career saves record with seven.

ALMOND JOY

Almond recently won four straight decisions during BYU's six-game win streak. Last time a streak at least that long occurred was when Paige Affleck earned six straight wins from April 2-10, 2010 to start an eventual nine-game BYU win streak.



The sophomore also finished with the best regular season win percentage of any BYU pitcher in a single season, helping her be honored on the All-WAC Second Team:

SCORING ALL AT ONCE

Playing Cal State Northridge on Feb. 17, the Cougars scored all of their 11 runs in the fourth inning, giving them their second-highest run total in team history for a single inning. Earlier in April, the Cougars scored nine in an inning against UMKC, tied for the sixth-highest total. The BYU record for most runs in an inning is 12 at Southern Utah on March 25, 2008.

ALL-CONFERENCE ALL-STARS

BYU had five players named 2012 All-WAC, including JC Clayton, Jessica Dugas and Delaney Willard on the First Team and Tori Almond and Katie Manuma on the Second Team. Dating back to 2005, BYU has had at least five players named all-conference, a streak of eight-straight seasons.

Delaney Willard also picked up WAC Player of the Year honors, becoming the sixth player and second outfielder (Oli Keohohou, 2003) in BYU history to earn the conference Player of the Year. Cougars have won eight Player of the Year awards in the last 10 seasons (2003, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2007, 2009, 2010, 2012) as members of the MWC and the WAC.

The Cougars also had three players named to the All-WAC Tournament Team, including the MVP of the tournament, Stacie Toney. Willard and Almond were also named to the team.

CONFERENCE SUPREMACY

In each of the past eight seasons, including this year, BYU has never finished lower than second in the regular season conference standings.

BYU has won five conference championships in the last seven seasons, including each of the last three years as members of the Mountain West Conference.

CLUTCH COUGARS

BYU has seven walk-off wins this season and nine wins overall when the score was tied in the seventh inning, including last weekend in game two against San Jose State when JC Clayton scored under a tag at home plate after a single by Katie Manuma to give BYU a 5-4 victory. FRIENDLY CONFINES

With a win last week against Utah Valley to close out the home schedule, BYU has won 41-straight regular season, non-conference games dating back more than six years to 2006. The Cougars are 61-3 all-time at Gail Miller Field against non-conference foes in the regular season.

GETTING OUT EARLY...OR NOT

Of BYU's 43 wins this season, the Cougars have won 13 in less than seven innings so far this season due to the mercy rule. However, in the Cougars' 30 other victories, nine have come by just a single run.

GRAND OLE TIME

BYU players have hit four grand slams this season, including two by senior Delaney Willard (Cal State Northridge, Purdue) and one each by senior Stacie Toney (No. 14 Texas A&M) and freshman Megan Arnold (UMKC). The four grand slams is tied for third-most by a BYU team in a season behind five from the 2010 squad and six by the 2003 team.

WIN STREAKS

The Cougars have compiled 34 win streaks of five games or more in program history, including five this season, tied for the most in a season in team history. Their 14-game win streak is third-longest in program history and the third double-digit win streak in the last two seasons.

PORTLAND, Ore. – Brigham Young University has accepted an invitation to join the Pacific Coast Softball Conference, PCSC Commissioner Ellen Moore announced Monday. The Cougars' first year in the PCSC will be the 2013 softball season. The addition of BYU will give the PCSC seven teams for the 2013 campaign.

"The Pacific Coast Softball Conference is excited to formally welcome Brigham Young University softball into the PCSC family," said Moore. "In BYU, we have added an institution with a strong academic reputation, a tradition of excellence in athletics -- specifically softball -- and a loyal and supportive community of fans. We are thrilled to have them on board and can't wait for them to join us on the field in 2013.

"On behalf of the PCSC and our member institutions, I extend a very warm welcome to Coach Gordon Eakin and the BYU Cougars!"

The PCSC will have 12 teams for the upcoming 2012 season. The Big Sky Conference will begin sponsoring softball in 2013, meaning the PCSC's Big Sky core-members Idaho State, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Weber State will leave the PCSC after this season. Seattle University will also be leaving the PCSC for the Western Athletic Conference following the 2012 campaign.

Brigham Young was an original member of the Mountain West Conference, when the conference formed in 1999. The Cougars left the MWC this past summer, playing as an NCAA FBS Independent in football with the majority of its other sports joining the West Coast Conference. While the WCC does not sponsor softball, the Cougars will play the 2012 season in the WAC before joining fellow WCC members Loyola Marymount, San Diego, Saint Mary's and Santa Clara in the PCSC.

"We are grateful to have found a conference home in the Pacific Coast Softball Conference for our excellent softball team," said BYU director of athletics Tom Holmoe. "The PCSC provides an opportunity for Coach Eakin and his team to strengthen the national status they have earned during his tenure. The PCSC membership includes West Coast Conference partners with whom we hope to build a great softball conference."

"Our coaching staff and team are excited to have a new home in the PCSC," Eakin said. "The PCSC has high quality coaching staffs and I have no doubt their programs will provide tough competition and push us to improve. We are also thrilled with the new venues and the great West Coast weather they provide. We look forward to being an active partner in strengthening and moving forward the PCSC."

EAKIN, ALVEY NAMED TO USA COACHES POOL

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 1, 2011) - BYU head coach Gordon Eakin and associate head coach Vaughn Alvey were both selected to the USA Softball Women's National Team Coaching pool.

Eakin and Alvey are two of 24 coaches who may be selected as assistant coaches for the Women's and Junior Women's National team events this summer. BYU is the only school to have two coaches in the pool.

"We are thrilled to have a great cross section of coaches for the Women's National team program for the next two years," said ASA and USA Softball Executive Director Ron Radigonda. "With the ISF change of World Championships every two years, we are excited to assist coaches in gaining international experience and opportunities."

The placement is a stamp of approval for Eakin, who was the USA National Team hitting coach last summer. In 2010, Eakin helped the USA win tournaments around the world, including the World Championship in Venezuela and the World Cup in Oklahoma.

A two-time Mountain West Coach of the Year, Eakin has led the Cougar softball program since 2003, compiling a 331-142 (.700) record and the highest winning percentage in MWC history.

Alvey, BYU's top assistant and pitching coach for the last eight seasons, was selected to the coaching pool for the first time. At BYU, Alvey has coached Paige Affleck and Christie Zinanti, two of the most accomplished pitchers in BYU history, helping the Cougars win four conference championships in the last six years.

Alvey is a member of the Utah Sports Hall of Fame and coached at Alta High in Utah for 17 seasons, leading the Hawks to eight state titles. He also coaches girls summer programs, winning the AFA National Championship in 1992.



BYU HEAD COACH GORDON EAKIN

BYU head coach Gordon Eakin is entering his 10th season as the Cougars' head coach and his 13th season at BYU overall.

Eakin was named head coach in July 2002 after working as an assistant coach since the softball program's inception in 2000. Since that time he has led the Cougars to five Mountain West Conference championships and eight NCAA tournament appearances.

The MWC Coach of the Year three-straight years (2009, 2010, 2011) Eakin has coached eight All-Americans, eight Conference Players of the Year, three Conference Freshmen of the Year and two Conference Pitchers of the Year during his 10-year tenure.

In 2011, Eakin led BYU to its third-straight MWC championship and seventh-consecutive NCAA Regional berth as the Cougars finished with a 40-18 record. In 2010, Eakin guided the Cougars to 46 wins, the most in school history, as BYU advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time ever with wins over East Carolina and host Texas before ending its season at national runner-up Arizona.

Known as one of the best hitting coaches in the country, Eakin helped the Cougars finish 13th in scoring and 30th in batting average last season and second in the country in batting average, seventh in scoring and ninth in slugging percentage in 2010. Overall BYU has finished in the top-ten nationally in slugging percentage six times, home runs per game six times, batting average four times and scoring four times under Eakin.

In addition to his duties at BYU, Eakin has also been an assistant coach and the hitting coach for the USA National Team since 2009. In the summer of 2010, Eakin helped guide the National Team to a 17-2 record as USA won the World Championship in Venezuela, the World Cup in Oklahoma and the Japan Cup championship in Sendai, Japan.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Eakin was a successful baseball and softball player. After playing collegiate baseball at the University of Utah, Eakin signed with the Oakland Athletics organization where he played for three years.

Eakin went on to join the United States All-Star team, playing in three U.S. Olympic sports festivals in 1986, 1993 and 1994, winning bronze, silver and gold, respectively. While on the team, Eakin was honored on the ISC All-World First Team and was an ASA All-American.

He would later go on to play shortstop on the internationally ranked Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch team, eventually earning induction into the Utah Fast Pitch Hall of Fame in 1998.

Eakin is a native of Holladay, Utah, and graduated from Granite High. He currently resides in Sandy, Utah, and is married to Barbi. They are the parents of three children (Alicia, Ryan & Parker) and have four grandsons.

WILLARD PLAYER OF THE YEAR, 5 COUGARS ALL-WAC

LAS CRUCES, N.M. - Brigham Young's Delaney Willard was named Western Athletic Conference Player of the Year and five Cougars were named all-WAC as selected by the league's head coaches the conference announced on Wednesday.

Senior centerfielder Jessica Dugas and junior shortstop JC Clayton joined Willard on the First Team while sophomore pitcher Tori Almond and sophomore first baseman Katie Manuma were selected to the Second Team.

Willard, a senior rightfielder from Camarillo, Calif. (Adolfo Camarillo), earns WAC Player of the Year after leading all players in WAC games with 33 RBI, 51 total bases and a .911 slugging percentage. She also ranked second in batting average (.429), home runs (7) and on-base percentage (.514), and fourth in doubles (6). Willard also broke the WAC single-season record and currently ranks second nationally with 83 RBI.

Willard is the sixth player in BYU history to earn a conference play of the year award. A Cougar has won the league's top honor every year but two over the last 10 seasons.

Dugas batted .349 in conference play and scored 16 runs to earn all-conference honors for the second-straight year. Clayton, an all-conference selection as a freshman in 2010, led all players with 30 hits in WAC play in addition to leading the conference in triples (3) and placing second in total runs scored (18).

Almond and Manuma each earned their first all-conference awards. Almond had the second-most wins (10) and the second-best ERA (1.31) in conference competition. Batting .352 in WAC games, Manuma had 19 hits, 18 RBI, seven runs and three homers for the Cougars.

LAS CRUCES, N.M. - LAS CRUCES, N.M. - The BYU softball team won the Western Athletic Conference Tournament title in a clean sweep, defeating No. 3-seed Fresno State 8-3 on Saturday.

BYU (43-13) did not lose a game over the last three days in the double elimination tournament, defeating Louisiana Tech and No. 11 Hawai'i in addition to the Bulldogs to take home its fourth-straight conference title, a first in program history.

The Cougars out-hit Fresno State, 13-5, as five players each had two or more. BYU had six singles in the decisive fifth inning when the Cougars scored five runs to pull away from the Bulldogs by turning a two-run lead into an 8-1 margin.

Tori Almond pitched one inning for BYU before Hannah Howell went the final six, becoming the fourth pitcher in program history to win 20 games in a season.

The Cougars scored the first three runs of the game, the first on an RBI-single by Delaney Willard in the top of the first inning to bring in Jessica Dugas. Two more runs came in the third inning after Katie Manuma hit a high shot to left field for a 2-run home run, her eighth of the year, giving BYU a 3-0 lead.

BYU has won 19 of its last 20 games and will take its hot streak to the NCAA Regional at a site to be announced Sunday. The Regional will begin Thursday, May 17.

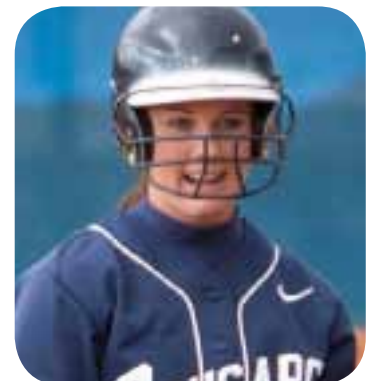
