WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- BYU has won 15-straight games against Utah State at home, last losing to the Aggies in Provo in 1978. Since that time, BYU has outscored USU by an average of 39.8-15.7 at Edwards Stadium.
- Excepting three occasions, BYU has played Utah State on a Friday since 1987 in order to avoid conflict with The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints' General Conference held the first weekend of every October. BYU had two byes and played on a Thursday the other three Conference weekends.
- BYU kick returner Cody Hoffman was named the Independent Special Teams Player of the Week and the College Performance Awards Kick Returner of the Week for his efforts vs. UCF. The sophomore returned a kick 93 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter against the Knights, totaling 129 yards on two returns.

Sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy was named Independent Defensive Player of the Week after a career-high eight tackles with a quarterback hurry and late-game heroics including a sack and a pass breakup which led to a BYU interception.

- The winner between BYU and Utah State is traditionally awarded the Old Wagon Wheel, a wheel from a pioneer covered wagon that has traveled between the two schools since 1948.

SPECIAL TEAMS, DEFENSE LEAD TO 24-17 WIN

PROVO, Utah - Special teams, defense and the running game helped the BYU football team hang on to a 24-17 win against the UCF Knights at LaVell Edwards Stadium in front of 59,874 fans on Friday.

Defensive back Joe Sampson intercepted a pass tipped by linebacker Kyle Van Noy at the BYU three-yard line to save a potential game-tying touchdown with 3:10 left in the game. UCF got the ball back with just over one minute remaining but sacks by Van Noy and defensive end Mike Muehlmann sealed the victory for the Cougars.

The back-and-forth finish to the game also featured wide receiver Cody Hoffman taking a kickoff 93 yards to the house for a touchdown to tie the score at 17-17 in the third quarter. The touchdown return was the first by a BYU player since 1998 when Mike Rigell ran one back 96 yards against Hawaii.

"Special teams were critical for us," head coach Bronco Mendenhall said. "We also had timely turnovers forced by our defense and that kept the points where we had a chance."

The special teams unit struck again in the fourth quarter when Michael Alisa recovered a muffed punt at the Knights 8-yard line, setting up BYU's go-ahead score from running back Bryan Kariya on a 6-yard run with 10:29 left in the game.

Kariya had 14 carries for 52 yards and one touchdown and caught two passes for 11 yards. Running back JJ Di Luigi rushed seven times for 38 yards, including a 16-yard touchdown run to go along with a pair of receptions for 16 yards. Altogether, BYU's running backs had their highest output of the season with 127 yards on the ground.

UCF got on the board on its first possession. The Knights elected to receive the football first and drove 63 yards and connected on a 34-yard field goal to take the early 3-0 lead.

The Cougars matched UCF on their opening drive with a field goal. Kicker Justin Sorensen connected from 37 yards to tie the score at 3-3.

Defense was the story of the second quarter with both teams trading stops, holding each other scoreless for the second quarter. The Knights took their 10-3 advantage into the break.

The Cougars stopped UCF on a third down attempt, forcing a punt from the Knights own 3-yard line. BYU returned the ball to the UCF 38-yard line. With a short field, the Cougars finally got into the end zone on a 16-yard touchdown run from Di Luigi. Sorensen made the extra point to knot the score up 10-10 with 8:13 remaining in the third quarter.

UCF took the lead right back on the ensuing drive. Godfrey connected on a 54-yard pass as part of a seven-play 84-yard drive, capped off by a 1-yard touchdown run from Godfrey. UCF would go up 17-10 after the made extra point.

The lead wouldn't last long as Hoffman's 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown with 4:37 left in the third quarter got the Cougars right back in the game. Sorensen tied the score at 17-17 with the extra point.

After a muffed punt from UCF in the fourth quarter, BYU recovered the football on the eight-yard line but suffered a 15-yard penalty, setting the Cougars up on the Knights 23-yard line. It didn't phase the running game as three straight handoffs to Kariya proved to be lethal, the last coming in the form of a 6-yard touchdown run. BYU went up 24-17 with just over 10:29 to play and held on to win.

UCF GAME NOTES

FOR THE LONGEST TIME

Cody Hoffman's 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the third quarter was the first for Cougar in more than 13 years or 158 games. Mike Rigell was the last to do it on a 96-yard return in 1998 against Hawaii.

Hoffman's kickoff return was the first touchdown by a BYU special teams unit since McKay Jacobson's punt return as a freshman in 2006.

HOFFMAN HYPE

Hoffman had 153 all-purpose yards, including 24 receiving and 129 on kickoff returns, following up on last week's 277 all-purpose yards.

STREAK CONTINUES

Junior linebacker Uona Kaveinga forced his third fumble in the last four games. His three forced are tied for second-most in a season by a BYU player since 2000. As a team, BYU has forced nine turnovers in four games this season.

ABOVE AVERAGE

Tonight, BYU totaled 127 yards rushing, 133 yards passing and 260 yards of total offense, all season highs against the Knights.

GET ON THE BOARD

Justin Sorensen's 37-yard field goal capped off BYU's first drive of the game, the second time this season BYU has scored on its opening drive after doing so at Texas.

KEEP RUNNING

BYU scored its first rushing touchdown of the season on a 16-yard run by JJ Di Luigi in the third quarter. The senior finished with 38 yards on seven rushes.

AY KARIYA

Senior running back Bryan Kariya rushed all three plays of BYU's third offensive scoring drive culminating in a 6-yard TD run. It was Kariya's first TD since a 4-yard run last year vs. UTEP.

RUNNING OUT THE FLAG

BYU was led out of the tunnel by sophomore receiver Cody Hoffman carrying the team flag and sophomore Justin Sorensen with the special teams flag. Two-time All-American Jay Miller, the NCAA reception leader in 1973 who still holds the BYU single-game records for most receiving yards (263) and receptions (22), carried out the alumni flag.

THE BYU-UTAH STATE

BYU and Utah State are meeting for the 81st time. The Cougars lead the series 43-34-3 and have played the Aggies almost every season since 1922, taking a break during WWII from 1943-1945 and from 2003-2005. In last year's matchup Utah State won its first game against BYU in over 16 years with a 31-16 victory at Romney Stadium in Logan. The Aggies rushed for 242 yards while taking advantage of three BYU turnovers and never trailing in the game. The win was the largest margin of victory over the Cougars for Utah State since 1978's 24-7 win.

UTAH STATE LAST TIME

LOGAN, Utah - Junior running back Robert Turbin scored a career-high four rushing touchdowns, including a 25-yard burst in the second overtime to bring Utah State within one, but he was stopped on his two-point conversion and USU dropped a heartbreaker to Colorado State, 35-34 at home Saturday in front of 22,599 Homecoming fans.

USU appeared to be on its way to a fourth-quarter win as it lead 21-13 with just over two minutes remaining and Colorado State punting, but the Aggies muffed the punt and the Rams recovered the ball at Utah State's 15-yardline. Four plays later, CSU's Chris Nwoke scored on a 1-yard rush and quarterback Pete Thomas hit Crockett Gillmore for the two-point conversion with 36 seconds to play, sending the game into overtime.

Both teams registered touchdowns in the first overtime as Utah State scored first on a 9-yard run from Turbin, but Colorado State answered on a touchdown pass from Thomas to Crock.

In the second overtime, Colorado State had the ball first and scored on a 2-yard run from Nwoke. USU quickly answered as Turbin scored his fourth touchdown of the night on the first play of the drive from 25 yards out. Utah State then decided to go for the two-point conversion and the win as freshman quarterback Chuckie Keeton's pass to senior wide receiver Matt Austin was incomplete, but CSU was called for pass interference. With the ball moved from the three to the one-and-half following the penalty, Turbin rushed left but was stopped short of the goal.

Turbin finished the night with 115 yards on 24 carries for his 10th-career 100-yard rushing game and Utah State ended the game with 281 rushing yards on 52 carries. Senior running back Michael Smith added 77 rushing yards on nine carries, including a 51-yard scamper in the second quarter highlighting a 3-play, 68-yard drive that was capped off with a 14-yard run from junior running back Kerwynn Williams for the Aggies first score of the night.

NEW SHERIFF IN TOWN

The Utah State Aggies have a new quarterback, freshman Chuckie Keeton. Keeton has been a dynamic addition to the Aggie offense. He had his breakout performance in the season opener against Auburn. The true freshman wasn't phased by the SEC crowd on the road and completed 21 of 30 passes for 213 yards, rushed for 33 yards and two touchdowns, and had his team in a position to win the game until a late Auburn surge dealt the Aggies a 42-38 heartbreaking loss. The next week at home against Weber State, Keeton cruised over the Wildcats with another 166 passing yards and two touchdowns while adding 53 yards on the ground and one more score. Last week at home against Colorado State, Keeton was 9 of 15 passing for 86 yards but added 44 yards on the ground. Just a freshman, the future looks bright for the signal caller Utah State.

TOO MANY CATS

The Aggies are opening up their season with cats on the brain. After starting the season with a visit to Auburn to play the Tigers, Utah State came back home to take on the Weber State Wildcats and now face the Cougars. With three of their first four opponents part of the feline family, the Aggies will be excited to leave all hairballs and whiskers behind.

NOT FAR FROM HOME

Similar to BYU, the Aggies have a high percentage of Utah talent on their roster. Forty-four members of the 2011 Utah State squad are homegrown in the state with six coming from right inside the city of Logan. Three players come from Cougar country in Provo.



FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag onto the field. This year, the team has included a special teams flag, highlighted by an old school logo adopted by the special teams. In 2008, the team implemented a new tradition—an alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current

player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue "Y" logo. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU players. Their signatures reflect their commitment to uphold the tradition, spirit and honor of the BYU football program and to be a flag bearer of the University.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Selected by their peers, offensive tackle Matt Reynolds and running back Bryan Kariya will serve as offensive captains, while linebacker Jameson Frazier and safety Travis Uale will be defensive captains. All four captains are seniors in 2011. Reynolds will serve for the second time after being selected as a captain last season.

WATCH OUT HERE I COME

With a more experienced squad in 2011, the nation is taking notice with several players being named to watch list and preseason honors. Leading the way is senior captain Matt Reynolds on the offensive line. Reynolds, a preseason All-American by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others has also been named to Outland Trophy Watch List, Lombardi Award Watch and the Lowe's Senior Class Award list. Joining Reynolds with the preseason accolades is senior linebacker Jameson Frazier on the Lott Trophy Watch List and senior running back JJ Di Luigi on the Doak Walker Award Watch List. Offensive lineman Terence Brown is recognized as one of the best centers in college football on the Rimington Trophy Watch List. Fellow lineman Braden Hansen joins Reynolds on the Outland Trophy Watch List and quarterback Jake Heaps has also been named to the Davey O'Brien Watch List.

BYU VS. BCS AQS

With the victory over Ole Miss, BYU has defeated a team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference six-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation among non-AQ teams. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 15 of the past 16 years dating back to 1996.

HOME COOKIN'

Head coach Bronco Mendenhall has often emphasized the importance of winning at home. Since he has taken the reigns of the program, BYU is 31-7 at home. Last season BYU was 5-1 at LaVell Edwards Stadium. Mendenhall and the Cougars won 18-straight games in Provo from 2006-09.

NO RUNNING START

After holding Utah to to just 5 rushing yards in the first quarter, BYU continued a trend it started last year, now holding its last 10 opponents to slow starts on the ground. In its last sevem games of 2010 the BYU defense has held its opponents to first-quarter totals of minus-10 (SDSU), 20 (TCU), minus-31 (Wyoming), zero (UNLV), 8 (Colorado St.), 30 yards (New Mexico), 8 yards (Utah) and minus-26 yards (UTEP) rushing, respectively. BYU started 2011 holding opponents to 25 yards (Ole Miss), 29 yards (Texas), 5 yards (Utah) and 31 yards (UCF) in the first quarter.

TOUGH FLORIDA WINS

BYU's 24-17 win over UCF was just the program's second win over a team from the state of Florida in team history, improving the overall record against the state to 2-4. The only other win over a Florida team was 1990's contest against No. 1 Miami in Provo. Ty Detmer jumpstarted his Heisman campaign with three touchdowns and 406 passing yards in route to a 28-21 victory over the No. 1 ranked Hurricanes.

ABOVE AVERAGE

Coming into the last week's game, UCF was holding opponents to 72.3 ypg rushing, 93.7 ypg passing and 166.0 ypg total defense. BYU totaled 127 yards rushing, 133 yards passing and 260 yards of total offense, all season highs against the Knights.

MAKE YOURSELF COMFORTABLE

After starting with two games on the road, BYU is home for four-straight games. Facing Utah and UCF was just the first two games with the Cougars hosting Utah State and San Jose State in the coming weeks. The last time the Cougars had four home games in a row was in 1991 when BYU had Air Force, Utah State, UTEP and Hawaii all in Provo. The Cougars won all four games during the stretch by a margin of victory of almost 16 points.

HE'S KIND OF A BIG DEAL

Senior captain and offensive tackle Matt Reynolds returns for his senior season after deciding not to enter the NFL draft despite a first round projection. Reynolds has been rewarded with several preseason accolades, including being named a preseason All-American by by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, CBSCollegeSports. com, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others. Along with those honors, Reynolds has recognized as an Outland Trophy Candidate, a Lombardi Award Candidate and a Lowe's Senior Class Award Nominee.

BRING ON THE BCS

Since the start of the Bowl Championship Series in 1998, BYU has played at least two BCS-automatic qualifying teams every year. In 2011, the Cougars are playing four BCS schools this year in Ole Miss, Texas, Utah and Oregon State. Only two other seasons (2000 and 2003) has BYU played as many BCS teams. To start the 2011 season the Cougars play three of the four teams conecutively, opening with road games at Ole Miss and Texas before the home opener against Utah. Not since 1998 has BYU started a season against three BCS teams, when the Cougars lost to Alabama and Washington on the road and defeated Arizona State at home.

FRIDAY NIGHT LIGHTS

With BYU playing UCF on a Friday night, as well as Utah State and TCU, it is the most Friday night games the Cougars have played in the Bronco Mendenhall era. Under Coach Mendenhall, BYU is 3-1 on Friday night games, all coming against Utah State. This is also the first time under Mendenhall that the Cougars are playing back-to-back Friday night games, with UCF last week and Utah State this Friday night.

COMING FROM ALL OVER THE PLACE

With Utahns dominating the roster, the Cougars have representatives from 17 other states and two countries outside the Unite States, including Canada and Ghana. While some 50 players are from the state of Utah and some have literally traveled within walking distance to attend BYU, junior linebacker Ezekiel Ansah has made the longest journey. Ansah has made his way over 7,000 miles to join the Cougars all the way from Accra, Ghana, in the western part of Africa. Wide receiver McKay Jacobson has had the luxury of having a top-notch quarterback be around him for almost all of his football career. While he currently has the promising sophomore Jake Heaps, he has caught passes at BYU from NFL quarterbacks Max Hall and John Beck. Even at the high school level, Jacobson connected with more NFL talent. At Carroll High School in Southlake, Texas, Alabama quarterback Greg McElroy, who led the Crimson Tide to a 2009 National Championship, tossed the pigskin to Jacobson before entering the NFL. Another NFL quarterback and former Missouri Tiger, Chase Daniel, was Jacobson's quarterback for two years in high school as well.

BAND OF BROTHERS

While BYU's motto is "Band of Brothers," there are four sets of brothers on the 2011 roster including Terence (Sr. OL) and Rhen (Jr. WR) Brown, Braden (Jr. OL) and Trevor Brown (Fr. TE), Matt (Sr. OL) and Houston (So. OL) Reynolds, and Iona (So. RB) and Baker (Fr. DL) Pritchard.

In addition, 13 different players, Kevan Bills, Gavin Fowler, Spencer Hafoka, Braden Hansen, Alex Kuresa, Marcus Mathews, Zed Mendenhall, Rex Morgan, Mike Muehlmann, Houston Reynolds, Matt Reynolds, Jordan Richardson and Jadon Wagner also boast brothers who have played for the Cougar football program in the past.

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 44 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 17 different countries including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cambodia, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, El Salvador, Fiji, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Paraguay, Peru, South Korea, Thailand and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of seven different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Cambodian, French, Korean, Portuguese, Spanish and Thai.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga is one of 73 players (61 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 29 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Germany, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, Mongolia, Mozambique, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 14 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nevada, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas.

Overall, 50 current members (42 percent) of the BYU football team speak a combined total of 21 different foreign languages and dialects, including Cebuano, Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Italy, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Swedish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

- * The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.
- * The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and Paul in the Bible).
- * More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.
- * Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.
- * Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions except for their transportation to and from their field of labor and are not paid for their services.
- * Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.
- * Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in 14 additional countries including Brazil, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico and Spain.
 - * Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."
- * A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.
- * In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.
- * Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

GOING FOR A DRIVE

BYU's 97-yard scoring drive, the Cougars' third drive of the game at Texas, was the team's longest since a 99-yard drive in the fourth quarter against Utah State in 2006. Since that time, BYU has had nine drives of 90 yards or more.

QUARTER TIME

Quarterback Jake Heaps and wide receiver Ross Apo set new career-highs for one quarter of play against Utah this season. Heaps connected on 10 of 15 passes for a quarter career-high of 136 yards. Hoffman caught five passes for a quarter career-high of 98 yards.

STREAK SNAP

Quarterback Jake Heaps had a streak of at least one touchdown pass in nine-straight games snapped with no passes finding the end zone against UCF. Luckily the running game picked up the slack with two touchdowns on the day. Heaps' streak dated back to Wyoming of 2011.

Another streak that came to an end was wide receiver Ross Apo catching a touchdown pass in three-straight games. Apo has been the only player to catch a touchdown pass this season, catching one each of the first three games. The Texas product left the game early in the first quarter with a mild concussion and did not return. Apo has scoring receptions of 19, 6 and 32 yards on the season.

IT'S A REYNOLDS THING

BYU has had a tradition of sibling teammates for years. One of the most prominent has been the Reynolds brothers. In fact, the Cougars have had at least one Reynolds brother start on the offensive line every season dating back to 2004. Lance Jr. (2001-05), Dallas (2005-08), Matt (2007-Pres.) and Houston (2009-Pres.) have combined for 114 starts since 2004. Continuing further on the Reynolds' offensive line, BYU has actually had at least two of the brothers starting together three different seasons with Lance Jr. and Dallas starting 12 games together in 2005, Dallas and Matt starting 13 games in 2008, and with Houston getting the starting nod at Ole Miss, he joined Matt for another Reynolds tag team. As a sophomore this season, it looks like Houston will continue the Reynolds tradition for a few more years.

KARIYA MAKING AN APPEARANCE

Running back Bryan Kariya has been relatively quiet to start the season, with just 39 yards on 12 attempts on the year. That wasn't the case Friday night against UCF as Kariya led all ball carriers with 14 carries and 52 yards. The senior's night was highlighted by a series in the fourth quarter where he took three-straight handoffs on a short field, the last coming in the form of a six-yard touchdown. The six-yard scoring run proved to be the winning score of the game. Kariya also caught two passes for 11 yards.

JUST FELT LIKE RUNNING ... FINALLY

The Cougars have struggled to get any sort of run game going early in 2011. Last week against UCF the running backs combined for 127 yards, their biggest output of the season. Bryan Kariya led the way with 14 rushes and 52 yards. JJ Di Luigi added 38 yards on seven touches and Josh Quezada picked up 26 yards with nine carries. BYU also got a big gain from David Foote with a 21-yard gain on a fourth down option play.

TIGHT END OR WIDE RECEIVER?

Tight end Marcus Matthews is BYU's flex tight end, always splitting out as a receiver and never seeing much time attached as a true tight end. He is more like an big wide receiver at 6-4 and 208 pounds. With a unique skill set, Matthews has been an early-season weapon for the Cougars. Against UCF, Matthews had a team-high four receptions for 35 yards. Matthews has caught 10 passes for 101 yards in the first four games and has the third-most receiving yards on the team.

SECOND GO AROUND

Throughout history BYU's second-year full-time starters have really flourished. Here is a break down of notable Cougar second-year starters:

DON'T HASSLE THE HOFF

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman has finally gotten involved offensively after catching just three passes for 20 yards in the first two games. Against UCF, Hoffman had his biggest play on special teams, returning a kickoff 93-yards to the house to tie the score late in the third quarter. Hoffman also caught three passes for 24 yards in the game as part of his 153 all-purpose yards. The week before against Utah, Hoffman grabbed 8 balls for 138 yards to lead the team. He set a career mark for receptions and vards in a quarter, catching five balls for 98 yards in the first fifteen minutes of play. Hoffman's catch total and yards for the game were also a career-high mark to add to a new career-high in kick returns as well with 8 returns and 139 yards, giving 277 all-purpose yards, the sixth-best mark in BYU history. Hoffman is still looking for his first touchdown of 2011 after getting seven in 2010. With 1,381 all-purpose vards in his career, Hoffman passes Chad Lewis for 70th all-time at BYU. Just a sophomore, Hoffman will continue to move up the list.

THE WILD COUGAR

Backup quarterback Riley Nelson has made an appearance in every game this year, notably coming in a change of pace quarterback to add in a running element. Against UCF, Nelson orchestrated a fouthdown attempt option play, resulting in David Foote running for 21 yards and a first down. The prior game against Utah, Nelson was 3 of 6 passing for 38 yards and rushd three times. Nelson had one rush for four yards to pick up a first down for a third-down conversion at Texas. At Ole Miss he had a pitch on an option play and later picked up six yards on a rush of his own. Nelson not only helps out on offense but also appears on special teams.

TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting offensive line is largely considered to be one of its major team strengths . . . literally. Measuring in at an average of 6-feet-6 inches and over 310 pounds, the offensive line is built to plow the road for a successful running attack and protect the quarterback play of Jake Heaps.

TIGHT ENDS STRONG

With the tight end position seeing a drop off last year, a revamped tight end crew is bringing the tight end back to a force in BYU's offense. In the first fout games of the season, the tight ends have accounted for 257 yards on 22 catches. Last week against UCF the tight ends caught five passes for 49 yards. Against Utah, the tight ends combined for six catches and 76 yards. At Texas, the they caught seven passes for 88 yards. The tight ends are still waiting to pick up a touchdown pass but seem to be inching closer with every game.

DI LUIGI DOES IT ALL

Senior running back JJ Di Luigi was named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List before the season began. The versatile back had 38 yards on seven carries last week against UCF, including a season-high 18-yard run. Di Luigi also had two catches for 16 yards. He had 31 yards rushing against Utah and caught two passes for nine yards. He carried the ball 14 times for 44 yards against Texas while catching three passes for 24 yards, totaling 63 all-purpose yards against the Longhorns. Di Luigi moved into 26th all-time at BYU in all-purpose yards and is 17th in career rushing yards. Here is how Di Luigi looks on the all-time lists and who he might pass in the coming weeks:

Wide receiver Cody Hoffman continues his streak, catching at least one pass in 10-straight games. Hoffman caught three passes from 24 yards against UCF. Hoffman finished with a team-high eight catches and 138 yards. He also has at least one reception in 16 of 17 career games.

MOVING ON UP

Quarterback Jake Heaps got somewhat of a baptism by fire early in the 2010 season but progressed nicely to end up with 15 touchdowns in his freshman season to set a BYU freshman record. With four more games under his belt for 2011, Heaps is steadily moving up the ranks of the top quarterbacks to play at BYU. He has 855 passing yards in four games this year and 3,171 for his career. With his freshman headstart, by the end of his Cougar career Heaps has an opportunity to be in the company of some of the statistical best. DEFENSIVE STAND

The BYU defense gave up its first touchdown of the season with 10:46 remaining in the third quarter against Texas, breaking a streak of just over 104-straight minutes without a touchdown dating back to last season.

FIRST QUARTER SHUTOUTS

The BYU defense shutout its first three opponents this season in the first quarter before the UCF Knights hit a field goal on their opening drive to end the streak. The Cougars have eight first quarter shutouts in their last 10 games dating back to last season. UTEP and UCF are the only two teams to score in the opening 15 minutes against BYU in the last 10 games.

STREAK CONTINUES

Junior linebacker Uona Kaveinga forced his third fumble in the last four games. His three forced fumbles are tied for the second-most in a season by a BYU player since 2000. Kaveinga's three forced fumbles in four games currently ranks him fifth in the NCAA in that category. Andrew Rich had three forced fumbles in 2010 and Ryan Denney had four forced fumbles in 2001.

COUGH IT UP

After forcing three turnovers against UCF, BYU has extended its streak of forcing a turnover to nine-straight games. Junior Uona Kaveinga and senior Corby Eason each forced a fumble, while junior college transfer Joe Sampson snagged a red zone interception in the fourth quarter. Sampson's interception was UCF quarterback Jeff Godfrey's first interception throw of 2011.

SOMEONE FROM EVERYWHERE

The defensive two-deep hails from all corners of the country. Player home states include from Alaska, California, Georgia, Hawaii, Massachusetts, Nevada, Utah, Texas and Washington.

In addition, linebacker Jadon Wagner is from Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada.

RETURN FROM INJURY

After missing part of the Ole Miss game and the entire Texas game due to a concussion, senior linebacker Brandon Ogletree returned to the field against Utah. Ogletree led the Cougars in total tackles, with seven, including two solo and five assisted. In the following game against UCF, Ogletree finished second on the team with six total tackles.

VAN NOY RECORD

With a fumble recovery for a touchdown against Ole Miss, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy became the first BYU player in history to return two fumbles for touchdowns. Van Noy is also the last Cougar defender to score two touchdowns since Derwin Gray returned two interceptions in 1990-91. The BYU touchdown record for a defender is three by both Mike Russell (1973-74) and Todd Shell (1980-81). Van Noy becomes the ninth Cougar overall to score at least two touchdowns.

FIRST-YEAR STARTERS

In their first season as regular starters, sophomores Daniel Sorenson and Kyle Van Noy have been some of the biggest impact players on the Cougar defense. Against Texas, Van Noy totaled a career-best seven tackles and had one quarterback-hit. Against rival Utah, Van Noy snagged his first interception of the season. Sorenson finished second on the team with nine tackles and had his first INT of the season against Texas while tallying four tackles against Utah. In week one against Ole Miss, both Van Noy and Sorenson played pivotal roles. Van Noy was named FBS Independent Defensive Player of the Week for his fumble recovery and game-winning touchdown, while Sorenson recovered a fumble and had six tackles.

GETTING OFF THE FIELD

The Cougar defense dominated on third down against Utah. For the game, BYU held Utah to 3 for 13 on third down conversions, a 23% rate and the best rate for the Cougar defense in 2011. BYU also held Utah on its only fourth down conversion attempt.

The Cougars struggled getting the UCF off the field after allowing the Knights to convert 7 of 14 third downs. The 50% conversion rate was the worst allowed by a BYU defense this season.

FUMBLE RECOVERIES

After forcing and recovering two fumbles against Ole Miss and UCF, the Cougars are 3-0 in the last two seasons when recovering multiple fumbles. The Cougars forced and recovered two fumbles just once last season, in a 44-7 win versus Colorado State.

SECOND HALF SUCCESS

After dominating the first half of play during the first three regular season games, the Cougars waited until the second half to secure the victory over UCF. BYU allowed 10 offensive points in the first half, a season high, before limiting the Knights to seven points in the second half and no points in the fourth quarter.

BYU also forced three turnovers against the Knights in the second half. The Cougars had not forced a second half turnover since the opening game against Ole Miss. All three UCF turnovers came on consecutive drives in the fourth quarter. BYU recovered two UCF fumbles and forced Knight quarterback Jeff Godfrey into his first interception in 2011. BYU has forced nine turnovers on the season.

THEY SCORED HOW MUCH?

Utah scored 54 points against BYU, the highest total against a BYU team since September 19, 2009 when the Cougars lost 54-28 against Florida State. The 2009 Florida State game was also the third game of the regular season.

BYU followed up both defensive lapses with strong performances in home games. After losing to Florida State, BYU dominated Colorado State 42-23. Following the loss to Utah, the Cougar defense limited UCF to 17 points and forced three second half turnovers.

TURNOVER CITY

In four games so far this season the BYU defense has forced nine total turnovers. The Cougars are nearly halfway to their total of 23 turnovers in 2010, which took the team 13 games to accrue last season. The nine turnovers gained currently ranks 18th in the NCAA. Cincinnati is first in the nation with 16 turnovers gained.

CANADA CAN WAIT

After finishing his junior campaign with 37 tackles, including 6.5 for loss, senior Jadon Wagner was drafted by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats with the 44th overall pick of the 2011 Canadian Football League Draft.

A native of Cranbrook, British Columbia, Wagner chose to bypass the opportunity to play in the CFL in order to return to the Cougars for his senior season.

Wagner had the best game of his 2011 season against UCF when he recorded six total tackles, including four in the first quarter.

Previous to enrolling at BYU, Wagner spent time with the Calgary Colts and Okargan Sun in the Canadian Junior Football League. As a rookie in the CJFL, Wagner led the nation in tackles with an average of 10 per game. He was also one of three players nominated for the CJFL Rookie of the Year award and helped lead his team to the conference final in his second year.

BEND BUT DON'T BREAK

For the first time since an October 17, 2009 game against San Diego State, the BYU defense allowed 300 yards passing to an opponent. UCF quarterbacks combined for 318 total passing yards on Saturday but were limited to zero touchdowns and one red zone interception. The Cougar defense has not allowed a passing touchdown in three of the first four games, with the lone exception coming against Utah. BYU won the game against SDSU in 2009, making them 2-0 in the last two games when allowing 300+ yards passing.

SACKING THE COMPETITION

The BYU pass rush came alive for the first time this season against UCF, tallying three sacks in four quarters after recording none in the first three games of the season. Cornerback Joe Sampson recorded the first sack of the season for BYU in the first quarter and Kyle Van Noy ended the game with a sack on UCF's final play from scrimmage. Jameson Frazier and Graham Rowley also shared a sack in the third quarter.

FRAZIER ON LOTT TROPHY WATCH LIST

BYU senior linebaker Jameson Frazier has been named to the 2011 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List.

Named after Pro Football Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott, The Lott Trophy is awarded to college football's Defensive IMPACT Player of the Year for excellent performance both on and off the field.

A 6-foot-2, 225-pound outside linebacker, Frazier started his career as a walk-on before earning a starting role in 2010 while helping the BYU defense finish the year ranked No. 24 in the nation. Frazier contributed 34 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, on sack, three quarterback hurries and two interceptions last season despite missing three games due to injury. He was recently selected by his teammates to serve as a team captain for the 2011 season.

FORMER GHANIAN SPRINTER AT LINEBACKER

Two years ago, no one foresaw junior Ezekiel Ansah lining up for the BYU football team. A freshman at the time, Ansah was recruited to BYU as a sprinter for the track and field team.

A native of Accra, Ghana, Ansah related well to BYU sprint coach Leonard Myles-Mills, also a Ghana native. After arriving in Provo, however, Ansah was recruited all over again, this time from the track to the football field.

Despite never playing a down of football in his life, Ansah saw action in six games on special teams and defensive line in 2010. A naturally gifted athlete, Ansah recorded three total tackles and a pass breakup in the first ever football game action.

Heading into the 2011 season, Ansah has a chance to see significant playing time in his second-ever football season. Ansah also made the switch from defensive line to linebacker in the offseason, but his learning curve is not nearly as steep as it was one year ago.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

FOR THE LONGEST TIME

Cody Hoffman's 93-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in the third quarter was the first for a Cougar in more than 13 years, a streak that spanned 158 games. Mike Rigell was the last BYU returner to take a kickoff the distance with a 96-yard return in 1998 against Hawaii.

Hoffman's kickoff return was the first touchdown by a BYU special teams unit since McKay Jacobson took a punt return for a touchdown as a freshman in 2006.

For his performance, Hoffman was named Independent Special Teams Player of the Week and the College Football Performance Awards National Kickoff Returner of the Week.

DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung came to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

SPECIAL FLAG

In addition to the traditional team flag and alumni flag leading the team out of the tunnel before kick-off, BYU has also incorporated a special teams flag with an old school BYU logo this season.

Against UCF, sophomore Justin Sorenson carried out the special teams flag.



MAKING A DIFFERENCE

Special teams made a big difference in the win over UCF with a kickoff return touchdown and a clutch fumble recovery in the third quarter. After a long punt by punter Riley Stephenson, the BYU punt team hustled down the field and rattled the UCF punt returner, who muffed the punt at the 10-yard line and could not recover it before Cougar Michael Alisa snagged the ball. Following the fumble recovery, the BYU offense scored a touchdown to secure the victory for the Cougars.

ALL-PURPOSE

Sophomore wide receiver Cody Hoffman returned kickoffs for the second consecutive game against UCF, which resulted in the first kickoff return for a touchdown since 1998 for the Cougars. As an all-purpose threat, Hoffman finished the game against UCF with a team high 153 total yards.

Hoffman returned kicks regularly for the first time in 2011 against Utah, totaling 139 return yards to go along with his 138 receiving yards. His 277 total yards were the most for a BYU player against Utah.

LEADING THE WAY

BYU kicker Justin Sorenson has scored the first points for the Cougars in three consecutive games after hitting early field goals against Texas, Utah and UCF. Sorenson has nailed a field goal in every game this season excluding the opener against Ole Miss, which was his first game back from a two-year Mormon mission. Sorenson currently leads BYU with 23 points on the season.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK

For his efforts against No. 21 Texas two weeks ago, sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen was named the FBS Independent Special Teams Player of the Week and an honorable mention Placekicker Performer of the Week from the College Football Performance Awards. Sorensen went 3 for 3 on field goals and converted his only PAT attempt, scoring a career-high 10 points against the Longhorns.

BIG TIME PUNTS

After recording eight punts of 50+ yards in 2009 and 17 such boots in 2010, punter Riley Stephenson continued his trend by slamming one kick beyond 50 yards against Ole Miss and recorded a season long 67 yard punt against UCF.

Stephenson was a difference maker against UCF by averaging 45.3 yards per punt and by booming a 56-yard punt near the end of the first half to prevent UCF form having a chance to put more points on the board.

PINNING THEM BACK

Junior punter Riley Stephenson twice pinned the UCF Knights inside the 20-yard line, giving him 35 career punts downed inside the 20. Stephenson had a clutch punt in the third quarter that put the Knights inside the five-yard line.

Against Texas, Stephenson helped BYU win the field position battle with a punt that was downed on the Texas three-yard line. In the third game against Utah, Stephenson twice pinned Utah inside the 20.

BIG LEG IS BACK

After serving a two-year LDS mission, sophomore kicker Justin Sorenson has averaged just over 68 yards per kickoff and has recorded one touchback in each of the Cougars' first four games. Against UCF, Sorenson had the best kickoff game of the season, with an average of 70.0 yards per kickoff and four touchbacks on five kickoffs.

3 FG BAD LUCK?

Sophomore kicked Justin Sorenson nailed all three of his field goal attempts against Texas, the second time a BYU kicker has gone 3 for 3 on field goals since 2010. In both three field goal games, the Cougars lost 17-16, the first to Utah in 2010 and the second to Texas in 2011.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL HEAD COACH BRONCO MENDENHALL



BRONCO MENDENHALL 7TH SEASON

During his six seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to six straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 56-21 (.727) record as he begins his seventh season to rank No. 16 in total wins among all teams in the nation during that span. The Cougars have received six straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first six teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in four of the last five seasons to become the first Cougar teams to win four bowls in a five-year span since LaVell Edwards teams did so from 1980-84. Nationally, BYU is one of only 11 programs to win four bowl games in the last five seasons.

In the last five years the Cougars have achieved a 50-15 record -- only eight teams

have more wins over that span. In fact, BYU is one of only seven FBS programs

(42 offense, 16 defense, 6 special teams, 1 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 39 top-15 statistical rankings, 29 top-10 rank- ings and 15 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during each of the past five seasons and finished ranked No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season and has totaled 185 selections during Mendenhall's tenure, along with 64 MWC Scholar-Athlete awards. BYU also ranks second nationally for Academic All-America recipients over the past three seasons. Six Cougar student-athletes have been named ESPN Academic All-Americans the past three years. Among all FBS schools only Penn State has had more during that period.

Going independent in 2011, BYU was consistently a top MWC contender under Mendenhall. BYU achieved a 39-9 (.813) conference record over the past six years to help the Cougars complete their 12-year tenure in the MWC with 64 conference wins — the most of any MWC school. Mendenhall also helped the Cougars bring bowl wins over Oregon, UCLA, Oregon State and UTEP as the program enters a new era as one of four independent schools, joining Notre Dame, Army and Navy.

Last year's BYU team achieved a 7-6 record and tied for third in the MWC at 5-3 while playing 19 freshmen and facing a schedule that featured eight bowl teams and four opponents that finished in final BCS Top 25 standings. Mendenhall took over defensive coordinator responsibilities after the teams 1-4 start and the team responded to become one of the top defensive teams over the final eight games.

As a player, Mendenhall was a two-year starter at cornerback for Snow College from 1984-85, winning the NJCAA National Championship and earning first-team all-conference, all-region, second-team NJCAA All-America and JC Gridwire Academic All-America honors.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

Mendenhall, who resides in Alpine, Utah, is married to Holly Johnston of Missoula, Montana. The couple has three sons.

to win 10 or more games during at least four of the last five seasons, and BYU and Boise State are the only programs in the West to achieve that consistent level of success. From 2006-2009 Mendenhall guided the Cougars to four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

The BYU coaching staff has six members who have played professional football. Associate Head Coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in 2002 and played three years for the 49er's, while defensive line coach Steve Kaufusi and outside linebacker coach Kelly Poppinga played in the NFL with the Arizona Cardinals. Graduate assistant Shaun Nua also spent some time with the Pittsburgh Steelers. In addition, receivers coach Ben Cahoon spent 13 years with the Candian Football League's Montreal Alouettes before retiring as the CFL's all-time receptions leader.

In addition, Poppinga and Nua are both Super Bowl champions; Poppinga won a ring with the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII while Nua earned his in the Steelers' Super Bowl XL victory. Cahoon also won the ultimate prize in the CFL by leading the Montreal to three Grey Cup championships in 2002, 2009 and 2010.

THE NEW GUYS

The BYU coaching staff welcomed two new members this past offseason in running backs coach Joe DuPaix and receivers coach Ben Cahoon.

DuPaix most recently coached at Navy for the past three seasons, helping led the Midshipmen to three bowl bids. In each of his three seasons, Navy was one of the top-6 rushing programs in the country, including an NCAA-best 293.4 ypg in 2008. A Salt Lake City native, DuPaix played under his father, Roger, a successful high school coach at Skyline who also coached current BYU offensive coordinator Brandon Doman in high school. DuPaix played quarterback at Snow College (Ephraim, UT) and Southern Utah where he set the FCS record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a season.

Cahoon retired in after the 2010 season as the all-time receptions leader in CFL history. Cahoon also set records for most receiving yards in a career in Grey Cup games and most touchdowns by an Alouette in addition to earning the CFL Most Outstanding Candian Award in 2002 and 2003. A native of Orem, Utah, Cahoon was an All-WAC performer in addition to being an Academic All-American. He is also the son-in-law of current Utah Governor Gary Herbert.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,470-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. Beginning in 2010, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63,470 after seating was removed to allow for additional wheelchair access.

"FAN"TASTIC FANS

The attendance at the BYU vs. Utah game was 63,742 - the first sellout for Edwards Stadium since last season's home opener against Washington. In 2010, BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sellouts at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The prior time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance-231 short of a sellout.

TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWDS

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah in 2009 is currently 10th with 64,301 fans attending the game. In 2010, BYU averaged 61,380 fans per home game.



HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. Last season, BYU averaged 30.0 points per game at home. The Cougars have not had a negative points per game margin for the past seven seasons, including all six years of head coach Bronco Mendenhall's tenure. In 2006, a 35.16-point differential was a BYU record in scoring margin in the stadium's 46-year history and the program's 86-year history:
