COUGAR QUICK HITS

— BYU is 120-23 (.839) all-time against in-state opponents, including a 22-1 record vs. UVU and a 25-2 record against Utah State. At Miller Field, BYU is 16-0 vs. the Wolverines and 12-1 vs. the Aggies, with the lone loss occurring in 2006.

— BYU head coach Gordon Eakin is five wins away from 400 career victories with a record of 395-172 in his 10th year at head coach.

— With the newest RPI rankings released on Monday, BYU was ranked 30th, second-highest in the WAC. The Cougars have wins over two current top-10 teams, including Oregon at 9th and Hawai'i at 10th. All but one of BYU's 12 losses have been to teams ranked 56th or better.

— BYU's regular season, non-conference home win streak of 39 consecutive games is still intact. The Cougars have not lost since Southern Utah earned a 10-5 victory on Apr. 11, 2006. BYU had a 29-game home win streak, the longest in program history, snapped last weekend in a 1-0 loss against No. 15 Hawai'i.

UTAH VALLEY

- Utah Valley had a four-game win streak snapped on Tuesday in a 8-7 loss in Logan to Utah State in the third game of an eight-game road trip.
- Amanda Robinson leads UVU with a .343 average and 37 hits, eight home runs and a .639 slugging percentage.
- In the circle, Tiffany Mills has a 2.39 ERA to lead the Wolverines. Cassie Herrera is the other pitcher with a 3.63 ERA and 7-4 record.
- UVU has an RPI of 113, second-best in the Pacific Coast Softball Conference where BYU will play beginning next season.

UTAH STATE

- The Aggies have an RPI of 187, last among Western Athletic Conference teams.
- Utah State is 2-7 in the WAC, winning one of two in series against Louisiana Tech and Nevada and being swept at Fresno State last week.
- BYU has won five-straight against Utah State, outscoring the Aggies 35-6 over that time.
- This is the first time in 27 games that the two teams will meet as conference opponents.
- Christine Thomsen has had a great year for USU, hitting .396 with 42 hits on the year while also drawing a team-high 16 walks.
- Three Aggie pitchers have thrown at least 40.0 innings or more, including Mandy Harmon who leads Utah State with a 6-13 record and a 4.56 ERA.

UNBEATABLE AT HOME

The Cougars had the second-longest home win streak in the nation snapped by No. 15 Hawai'i last week. BYU won 29 in a row, a program record.

GETTING OUT EARLY...OR NOT

Of BYU's 24 wins this season, the Cougars have won eight in less than seven innings so far this season due to the mercy rule. However, in the Cougars' 16 other victories, seven have come by just a single run.

HOME RUN HITTER

BYU's Delaney Willard hit a home run in seven of the Cougars' first 10 games, including a streak of four-straight games from Feb. 11-17. Willard also hit a home run in four straight in early April last year. The two marks tie the senior for the third-longest such streak in NCAA history and make her the only person in NCAA history to have two streaks of four games or more in a career.

A two-time WAC Hitter of the Week, Willard has emerged as an All-America candidate. The right fielder is ranked in the NCAA top-20 in six different categories, including RBI per game (5th, 1.40), slugging percentage (8th, .920), home runs per game (13th, 0.37), batting average (14th, .440), home runs (14th, 13) and on base percentage (19th, .537).

GRAND OLE TIME

BYU players have hit four grand slams this season, including two by senior Delaney Willard (Cal State Northridge, Purdue) and one each by senior Stacie Toney (No. 14 Texas A&M) and freshman Megan Arnold (UMKC). The four grand slams is tied for third-most by a BYU team in a season behind five from the 2010 squad and six by the 2003 team.

SCORING ALL AT ONCE

Playing Cal State Northridge on Feb. 17, the Cougars scored all of their 11 runs in the fourth inning, giving them their second-highest run total in team history for a single inning. Earlier in April, the Cougars scored nine in an inning against UMKC, tied for the sixth-highest total. The BYU record for most runs in an inning is 12 at Southern Utah on March 25, 2008.

WIN STREAKS

The Cougars have compiled 33 win streaks of five games or more in program history, including three this season. Last year, streaks of 12 and 11 games were the first time in school history a team has had two double-digit win streaks in the same season. In 2010, BYU matched a season high with five such streaks, tying the 2005 Cougars. BYU set a program-high streak of 16 consecutive wins in both 2007 and 2009.

PORTLAND, Ore. – Brigham Young University has accepted an invitation to join the Pacific Coast Softball Conference, PCSC Commissioner Ellen Moore announced Monday. The Cougars' first year in the PCSC will be the 2013 softball season. The addition of BYU will give the PCSC seven teams for the 2013 campaign.

"The Pacific Coast Softball Conference is excited to formally welcome Brigham Young University softball into the PCSC family," said Moore. "In BYU, we have added an institution with a strong academic reputation, a tradition of excellence in athletics -- specifically softball -- and a loyal and supportive community of fans. We are thrilled to have them on board and can't wait for them to join us on the field in 2013.

"On behalf of the PCSC and our member institutions, I extend a very warm welcome to Coach Gordon Eakin and the BYU Cougars!"

The PCSC will have 12 teams for the upcoming 2012 season. The Big Sky Conference will begin sponsoring softball in 2013, meaning the PCSC's Big Sky core-members Idaho State, Northern Colorado, Portland State, Sacramento State and Weber State will leave the PCSC after this season. Seattle University will also be leaving the PCSC for the Western Athletic Conference following the 2012 campaign.

Brigham Young was an original member of the Mountain West Conference, when the conference formed in 1999. The Cougars left the MWC this past summer, playing as an NCAA FBS Independent in football with the majority of its other sports joining the West Coast Conference. While the WCC does not sponsor softball, the Cougars will play the 2012 season in the WAC before joining fellow WCC members Loyola Marymount, San Diego, Saint Mary's and Santa Clara in the PCSC.

"We are grateful to have found a conference home in the Pacific Coast Softball Conference for our excellent softball team," said BYU director of athletics Tom Holmoe. "The PCSC provides an opportunity for Coach Eakin and his team to strengthen the national status they have earned during his tenure. The PCSC membership includes West Coast Conference partners with whom we hope to build a great softball conference."

"Our coaching staff and team are excited to have a new home in the PCSC," Eakin said. "The PCSC has high quality coaching staffs and I have no doubt their programs will provide tough competition and push us to improve. We are also thrilled with the new venues and the great West Coast weather they provide. We look forward to being an active partner in strengthening and moving forward the PCSC."

EAKIN, ALVEY NAMED TO USA COACHES POOL

PROVO, Utah (Feb. 1, 2011) - BYU head coach Gordon Eakin and associate head coach Vaughn Alvey were both selected to the USA Softball Women's National Team Coaching pool.

Eakin and Alvey are two of 24 coaches who may be selected as assistant coaches for the Women's and Junior Women's National team events this summer. BYU is the only school to have two coaches in the pool.

"We are thrilled to have a great cross section of coaches for the Women's National team program for the next two years," said ASA and USA Softball Executive Director Ron Radigonda. "With the ISF change of World Championships every two years, we are excited to assist coaches in gaining international experience and opportunities."

The placement is a stamp of approval for Eakin, who was the USA National Team hitting coach last summer. In 2010, Eakin helped the USA win tournaments around the world, including the World Championship in Venezuela and the World Cup in Oklahoma.

A two-time Mountain West Coach of the Year, Eakin has led the Cougar softball program since 2003, compiling a 331-142 (.700) record and the highest winning percentage in MWC history.

Alvey, BYU's top assistant and pitching coach for the last eight seasons, was selected to the coaching pool for the first time. At BYU, Alvey has coached Paige Affleck and Christie Zinanti, two of the most accomplished pitchers in BYU history, helping the Cougars win four conference championships in the last six years.

Alvey is a member of the Utah Sports Hall of Fame and coached at Alta High in Utah for 17 seasons, leading the Hawks to eight state titles. He also coaches girls summer programs, winning the AFA National Championship in 1992.



BYU HEAD COACH GORDON EAKIN

BYU head coach Gordon Eakin is entering his 10th season as the Cougars' head coach and his 13th season at BYU overall.

Eakin was named head coach in July 2002 after working as an assistant coach since the softball program's inception in 2000. Since that time he has led the Cougars to five Mountain West Conference championships and seven NCAA tournament appearances.

The MWC Coach of the Year three-straight years (2009, 2010, 2011) Eakin has coached eight All-Americans, seven MWC Players of the Year, three MWC Freshmen of the Year and two MWC Pitchers of the Year during his tenure.

In 2011, Eakin led BYU to its third-straight MWC championship and seventh-consecutive NCAA Regional berth as the Cougars finished with a 40-18 record. In 2010, Eakin guided the Cougars to 46 wins, the most in school history, as BYU advanced to the NCAA Super Regionals for the first time ever with wins over East Carolina and host Texas before ending its season at national runner-up Arizona.

Known as one of the best hitting coaches in the country, Eakin helped the Cougars finish 13th in scoring and 30th in batting average last season and second in the country in batting average, seventh in scoring and ninth in slugging percentage in 2010. Overall BYU has finished in the top-ten nationally in slugging percentage six times, home runs per game six times, batting average four times and scoring four times under Eakin.

In addition to his duties at BYU, Eakin has also been an assistant coach and the hitting coach for the USA National Team since 2009. In the summer of 2010, Eakin helped guide the National Team to a 17-2 record as USA won the World Championship in Venezuela, the World Cup in Oklahoma and the Japan Cup championship in Sendai, Japan.

Before entering the coaching ranks, Eakin was a successful baseball and softball player. After playing collegiate baseball at the University of Utah, Eakin signed with the Oakland Athletics organization where he played for three years.

Eakin went on to join the United States All-Star team, playing in three U.S. Olympic sports festivals in 1986, 1993 and 1994, winning bronze, silver and gold, respectively. While on the team, Eakin was honored on the ISC All-World First Team and was an ASA All-American.

He would later go on to play shortstop on the internationally ranked Larry H. Miller Toyota Fast Pitch team, eventually earning induction into the Utah Fast Pitch Hall of Fame in 1998.

Eakin is a native of Holladay, Utah, and graduated from Granite High. He currently resides in Sandy, Utah, and is married to Barbi. They are the parents of three children (Alicia, Ryan & Parker) and have four grandsons.

WILLARD EARNS 2ND HITTER OF THE WEEK

DENVER – Brigham Young's Delaney Willard and Hawai'i's Stephanie Ricketts have been named the Verizon Western Athletic Conference Hitter and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for March 19-25. This is the second honor of the season for Willard and the fourth of the season and 11th overall for Ricketts.

Willard, a senior right fielder from Camarillo, Calif., hit .444 with a double, three home runs and seven RBI as the Cougars went 4-0 on the week, including a series sweep of New Mexico State. For the week, she posted a 1.556 slugging percentage and a .615 on-base percentage. In the series finale against the Aggies, she became the first Cougar this season to hit two home runs in a game, the second of which was a three-run, walk-off game-winner. She also had five RBI in the game, tying a season high. Willard has hit safely in seven of the last eight games and has reached base all eight games. With four walks last week, she moved into 10th place all-time at BYU in career walks (67) and her 11 home runs this season ties her total from last year in exactly half as many games played.

WILLARD NAMED WAC HITTER OF THE WEEK

DENVER – BYU softball's Delaney Willard and Hawai'i's Stephanie Ricketts have been named the Verizon Western Athletic Conference Hitter and Pitcher of the Week, respectively, for Feb. 6-12. This is the first-ever honor for Willard and the first of the season and eighth overall for Ricketts.

Willard, a senior right fielder from Camarillo, Calif., led the Cougars to a 3-2 record at the Kajikawa Classic last week, including wins over No. 15 Texas A&M and No. 11 Oregon. She was 9-for-17 (.529) with three home runs, two doubles, nine RBI, six runs scored and a 1.235 slugging percentage. Willard had a career-high four hits vs. Texas State and scored four runs against UC Santa Barbara, tying a BYU record. She also drove in all five of BYU's runs in Thursday's games and totaled 21 total bases on the week, an average of more than four per game.

BYU TABBED 4TH IN WAC PRESEASON POLL

DENVER – The Western Athletic Conference softball coaches have picked the BYU softball team to finish fourth and Fresno State to win the 2012 WAC regular-season crown.

In addition, senior Jessica Dugas and sophomore Carly Duckworth were named to the preseason All-WAC team. Both players earned All-Mountain West Conference honors following the 2011 season.

In its first season as members of the WAC, the Cougars earned one first-place vote and 35 points. Fresno State took the top spot in the preseason poll with 44 points and three first-place votes. Hawai'i came in second, picking up two first-place votes and 42 points, followed by New Mexico State in third place with 37 points and two first-place votes. Nevada was picked to finish fifth with 20 points, followed by San Jose State and Louisiana Tech tied for sixth with 17 points apiece. Utah State rounded out the poll in eighth place with 12 points. BYU took the MWC championship each of the last three seasons and has played in the NCAA tournament every year since 2005.
