WHAT TO WATCH FOR

- BYU and Utah are playing as non-conference opponents for the first time ever. The two teams began their series in 1922 as members of the Rocky Mountain Faculty Athletic Conference.
- Saturday, Sept. 17, marks the earliest date BYU and Utah have ever met. The only other time the two teams have met in September was on Sept. 27, 1958.
- Under head coach Bronco Mendenhall, BYU is 3-3 against Utah. Against the rest of the Pac-12, the Cougars are 7-4 under Mendenhall with wins over Arizona (2007), UCLA (2008), Washington (2008, 2010) and Oregon State (2009).
- Going into the game against Utah, BYU has the chance to beat teams from two different BCS conferences in the same season for the seventh time in program history. The Cougars also accomplished the feat in 1984, 1985, 1988, 1990, 2001 and 2009.
- BYU is currently on a four-game home win streak and has not lost to an in-state school in LaVell Edwards Stadium since overtime against Utah in 2005, Bronco Mendenhall's first season as head coach. Since then, the Cougars have gone 4-0 at home against Utah and Utah State.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL TIGHT END WEEKEND



With one of the strongest tradition of great tight ends of any school in the country, BYU welcomes back its tight end fraternity, including 10 All-Americans, this weekend. Activities over the course of the weekend include an auction dinner on Friday evening to help fund athletic scholarships along with a special halftime ceremony during the Utah game.

With BYU's tradition of wide-open offenses, the tight end position has thrived in its offensive scheme. Over the years, Cougar football has emerged as the home of some of the best pass-catching tight ends in NCAA history. Starting with "Miracle Bowl" hero Clay Brown in 1980, 10 BYU tight ends have earned All-American status. Since 1976, 12 Cougar tight ends have received 20 First Team All-Conference citations. In this decade alone nine different Cougar tight ends have made NFL rosters. Four former Cougars helped lead their teams to the Super Bowl—Doug Jolley (2003), Chad Lewis (2005), Itula Mili (2006), and Gabriel Reid (2007). Two former Cougars, Todd Christensen and Chad Lewis, have been named to several Pro Bowl teams during their successful pro careers. In five of the past seven seasons tight ends led the Cougars in receptions and a BYU tight end was named

First Team All-MWC (Jonny Harline in 2005 and 2006 and Dennis Pitta in 2007, 2008 and 2009) five of the past six years. In 2009, BYU swept the MWC tight end honors as Andrew George earned All-MWC Second Team accolades while Pitta earned All-MWC First Team honors on his way to being named a Consensus All-American.

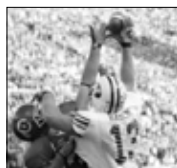

LAST TIME

BYU FALLS TO LONGHORNS ON THE ROAD

AUSTIN, Texas – Fueled by a strong second-half Texas performance, the BYU football team fell 17-16 on the road to the No. 21 Longhorns Saturday at Darrell K. Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium in front of 100,995 - the largest crowd ever to witness a BYU football game.

Texas converted its game-winning score after getting the passing game going midway through the fourth quarter. Receiver Jaxon Shipley caught two passes for 34 yards before the Longhorns reached the end zone on a 4-yard run from running back Cody Johnson. After the ensuing extra point, Texas took its first lead of the game at 17-16 with 8:46 remaining.

BYU had two chances to take the lead after the Texas score, but the drives ended in a punt and an interception, respectively, enabling the Longhorns to hold on.

“The difference in the game is making critical plays at the right time, which leads to execution,” head coach Bronco Mendenhall said. “I liked the way our team tried. Our execution didn’t hold at critical moments, so I’ve got to do a better job of helping them find the right execution and consistency at the critical times of the game.”

The Cougars led 13-3 at halftime and held Texas to 88 total yards in the first half, but surrendered 201 yards in the second half while slowing down on offense.

Quarterback Jake Heaps finished the day 22 of 38 for 192 yards and one touchdown. Heaps spread the ball around to 11 different receivers, but the ground game could never get going for the Cougars, as BYU picked up just 45 yards on the ground.

Linebacker Spencer Hadley led the defense with 12 tackles while safety Travis Uale had nine tackles and an interception. Safety Daniel Sorensen also helped with eight tackles and an interception of his own.

BYU scored on three different drives in the first half, with two ending in field goals by sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen, including a career-long conversion from 33 yards. Sorensen was 3 of 3 on field goals for the game.

After a three-and-out stop by the defense to start the game, the Cougars were able to get on the board on their first possession. Sorensen knocked a 30-yard field goal through the uprights to put BYU up 3-0 with 9:33 on the clock in the first quarter.

Sorensen would add another just a few minutes later after the BYU defense got another quick stop, this time from 33 yards out with 6:45 left in the first.

The BYU defense stopped another scoring drive when Sorensen tipped a pass, then dove for the interception. BYU failed to score on the ensuing drive, but the special teams pinned the Longhorns inside their own three-yard line with a 40-yard punt from Riley Stephenson.

Texas moved the football for a time, but the defense continued to make big plays, this time on a Travis Uale interception on a long passing attempt, coming down with the ball at the BYU 3-yard line.

The Cougars responded by driving the length of the field, capping the drive with a 6-yard touchdown pass from Heaps to freshman Ross Apo. The drive featured tight ends Marcus Mathews and Austin Holt combining for three catches for 55 yards.

Texas got on the board with 1:44 left in the first half on a 23-yard field goal after a Heaps interception.

After the half, Texas came out strong. The Longhorns pounded the ball on the ground, rushing six times for 62 yards on the drive, including a 1-yard touchdown run that cut the score to 13-10 with 10:46 left in the third.

TEXAS GAME NOTES

ATTENDANCE RECORD

Attendance for the game was 100,995 – the largest crowd to ever watch a BYU football game. The previous high mark was 96,304 at Penn State in 1991.

GOING FOR A DRIVE

BYU's 97-yard scoring drive, the Cougars' third drive of the game, was the team's longest since a 99-yard drive in the fourth quarter against Utah State in 2006. Since that time BYU has had nine drives of 90 yards or more.

30, 31, 32, 33

With field goals of 30, 33, and 32 yards, respectively, sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen added to the only field goal of his career, a 31-yarder against Wyoming in 2008.

DEFENSIVE STAND

The BYU defense gave up its first touchdown of the season with 10:46 left in the third quarter, breaking a streak of just over 104-straight minutes without allowing a touchdown dating back to last season.

COUGH IT UP

Sophomore safety Daniel Sorensen's interception in the first quarter extended BYU's streak of forcing a turnover to seven-straight games. The INT was Sorensen's first since his freshman year in 2008.

FIRST QUARTER SHUTOUTS

With no points allowed in the first quarter, the Cougars have seven first quarter shutouts in their last eight games dating back to last season. UTEP scored three points in last year's bowl game, the only points scored during that time.

NO RUNNING START

BYU has held its last 10 opponents to 30 yards rushing or less in the first quarter. Texas totaled 29 yards rushing to begin today's game.

RUNNING OUT THE FLAG

BYU was led out of the tunnel today by senior linebacker Hebron Fangupo carrying the team flag and sophomore running back Michael Alisa with the special teams flag. The special teams flag, highlighted by an old school BYU logo adopted by the special teams, is a new addition this season. College Park native David Nixon (2003, 06-08), an All-MWC linebacker who finished his career as the career conference leader in tackles-for-loss and has played in the NFL for the last two years, carried the alumni flag.

THE BYU-UTAH SERIES

This will be the 87th game in the rivalry between the Utes and Cougars, now known as the Deseret First Duel. In the latest chapter of the rivalry, head coach of Utah Kyle Whittingham and BYU head coach Bronco Mendenhall each have three wins apiece heading into the seventh year of their respective head coaching careers. Five of the previous six games have been decided by a touchdown a less, with two of them going to overtime. Last year the Cougars dominated for three quarters, holding Utah scoreless until the fourth. The Utes managed to score 17 points in the final 15 minutes to lead 17-16 and blocked BYU's 42-yard attempt at a game-winning field goal as time expired.

UTAH LAST TIME

LOS ANGELES - Matt Kalil blocked Utah's 41-yard field goal attempt on the final play and Torin Harris returned it for a touchdown in USC's 23-14 win Saturday.

Matt Barkley passed for 264 yards for the Trojans (2-0, 1-0), but the Utes drove into field-goal range from their 33 in the final 1:01, helped by two favorable rulings that put them in position for a tying field goal.

That's when Kalil easily swatted down Coleman Petersen's low kick. Harris returned it 68 yards, all the way into the Utah end zone.

Marc Tyler rushed for 113 yards and a touchdown in his return from suspension, and Robert Woods had eight catches for 102 yards for the Trojans.

The Pac-12's debut game matched the conference's newest member against the winningest program in league history. Once the biggest BCS-busters outside Boise State, Utah and its raucous fans didn't look at all out of place in the venerable Coliseum.

A week after USC was shut out in the second half by lowly Minnesota, Utah forced three key turnovers and shut out the Trojans for the final 24 minutes -- other than the crazy return on the final play.

Neither team was particularly impressive offensively in the second half, with nobody scoring at all in the final 21 minutes. Barkley threw a 9-yard scoring pass to Xavier Grimble, but the Trojans also committed two turnovers deep in Utah territory in the first half.

After Wynn threw three incompletions on Utah's final drive, USC thought it had won when Harris tackled DeVonte Christopher inches shy of the first-down marker with 20 seconds left. But after video review, officials changed the spot and gave a first down to Utah.

Tony Burnett then committed pass interference with 11 seconds left, moving Utah to the Trojans 24. The Utes immediately got their field-goal team on the field.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag onto the field. This year, the team has included a special teams flag, highlighted by an old school logo adopted by the special teams. In 2008, the team implemented a new tradition—an alumni flag.

The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. Both flags are white with a blue "Y" logo. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU players. Their signatures reflect their commitment to uphold the tradition, spirit and honor of the BYU football program and to be a flag bearer of the University.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Selected by their peers, offensive tackle Matt Reynolds and running back Bryan Kariya will serve as offensive captains, while linebacker Jameson Frazier and safety Travis Uale will be defensive captains. All four captains are seniors in 2011. Reynolds will serve for the second time after being selected as a captain last season.

WATCH OUT HERE I COME

With a more experienced squad in 2011, the nation is taking notice with several players being named to watch list and preseason honors. Leading the way is senior captain Matt Reynolds on the offensive line. Reynolds, a preseason All-American by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others has also been named to Outland Trophy Watch List, Lombardi Award Watch and the Lowe's Senior Class Award list. Joining Reynolds with the preseason accolades is senior linebacker Jameson Frazier on the Lott Trophy Watch List and senior running back JJ Di Luigi on the Doak Walker Award Watch List. Offensive lineman Terence Brown is recognized as one of the best centers in college football on the Rimington Trophy Watch List. Fellow lineman Braden Hansen joins Reynolds on the Outland Trophy Watch List and quarterback Jake Heaps has also been named to the Davey O'Brien Watch List.

BYU VS. BCS AQS

With the victory over Ole Miss, BYU has defeated a team from a BCS automatic-qualifying conference six-straight years, the third-longest streak in the nation. The Cougars have defeated at least one AQ school 15 of the past 16 years dating back to 1996.

HOME COOKIN'

Head coach Bronco Mendenhall has often emphasized the importance of winning at home. Since he has taken the reigns of the program, BYU is 30-6 at home. Last season BYU was 5-1 at LaVell Edwards Stadium and currently have a four-game win streak. Mendenhall and the Cougars won 18-straight games in Provo from 2006-09.

NO RUNNING START

After holding Texas to just 29 rushing yards in the first quarter, BYU continued a trend it started last year. In its last seven games of 2010 the BYU defense has held its opponents to first-quarter totals of minus-10 (SDSU), 20 (TCU), minus-31 (Wyoming), zero (UNLV), 8 (Colorado St.), 30 yards (New Mexico), 8 yards (Utah) and minus-26 yards (UTEP) rushing, respectively. BYU started 2011 holding Ole Miss to 25 rushing yards in the first quarter.

THIRD TIME'S THE CHARM

The 2011 offense has shown flashes of brilliance at times but has struggled to get the execution and consistency it needs. The third game has been a successful one in recent years in putting points on the board. In the last six years BYU has scored an average of 36.2 points in the third game of the season, compared to an average of 22.9 in the first two games.

LUCKY SEVENS

This will be the seventh game against Utah for head coach Bronco Mendenhall. He currently has a 3-3 record against the Utes. Five of the six games have been decided by seven points or less.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL TEAM NOTES

INTO THE GREAT WIDE OPEN

Competing in its first season as an independent for the 2011 season, BYU will be traveling outside the state of Utah five different times and will cover nearly 14,000 miles of distance going back and forth to games in Mississippi, Texas, Oregon and Hawaii. Last year, the Cougars traveled less than half of that total at just under 7,000 total miles. The trip to Hawaii will be the longest with the team traveling to the southwest about 3,000 miles one way. In future independent seasons, as of now BYU will make various treks to Idaho, Texas, Hawaii, Mississippi, Indiana, Florida, Georgia and Washington D.C.

BOUNCE BACK

Starting the season 1-1 is nothing new for head coach Bronco Mendenhall. In 2006 and 2007 Mendenhall and the Cougars started 1-1 in the first two games and went on to 11-2 seasons each year.

ALWAYS ON THE BOARD

Not since Sept. 27, 1975, has BYU been shut out away from home (including neutral site games and bowl games). The Cougars failed to score against Arizona State, falling 20-0 in Tempe, Ariz. With the Cougars first score on Saturday at Texas with a Justin Sorensen 30-yard field goal, BYU extends that streak to 244 games over 37 seasons now.

COMING HOME

After starting the 2011 season on the road, the Cougars finally get to come home to LaVell Edwards stadium to the delight of over 64,000 Cougar faithful. During Bronco Mendenhall's coaching tenure, BYU is 4-2 in home openers, while going 25-14 since 1972 in the first home game.

HE'S KIND OF A BIG DEAL

Senior captain and offensive tackle Matt Reynolds returns for his senior season after deciding not to enter the NFL draft despite a first round projection. Reynolds has been rewarded with several preseason accolades, including being named a preseason All-American by ESPN.com, USA Today, Athlon, CBSCollegeSports.com, Lindy's, Sporting News and Phil Steele, among others. Along with those honors, Reynolds has recognized as an Outland Trophy Candidate, a Lombardi Award Candidate and a Lowe's Senior Class Award Nominee.

END OF AN ERA

For the first time in history, BYU will face Utah for a non-conference game. BYU is now an independent and Utah joined the newly expanded Pac-12. Since 1922, the pair has met 86 times as members of five different conferences including the Rocky Mountain Conference, Mountain States Conference, Skyline Conference, Western Athletic Conference and most recently the Mountain West Conference. The game is also being played at its earliest date ever. In fact, this is only the second game in the series that has been played in the month of September, with the only other game a 14-7 BYU win in 1958. In most recent years the game has typically been the last regular season game.

COMING FROM ALL OVER THE PLACE

With Utahns dominating the roster, the Cougars have representatives from 17 other states and two countries outside the United States, including Canada and Ghana. While some 50 players are from the state of Utah and some have literally traveled within walking distance to attend BYU, junior linebacker Ezekiel Ansah has made the longest journey. Ansah has made his way over 7,000 miles to join the Cougars all the way from Accra, Ghana, in the western part of Africa. Through two games, BYU has not lost a fumble. There has been one fumble of record but the Cougars were able to recover and keep possession. Meanwhile, BYU has managed to force three fumbles and recover two of them. In addition to intercepting two passes at Texas, the Cougars have a +1 turnover margin.

BAND OF BROTHERS

While BYU's motto is "Band of Brothers," there are four sets of brothers on the 2011 roster including Terence (Sr. OL) and Rhen (Jr. WR) Brown, Braden (Jr. OL) and Trevor Brown (Fr. TE), Matt (Sr. OL) and Houston (So. OL) Reynolds, and Iona (So. RB) and Baker (Fr. DL) Pritchard.

In addition, 13 different players, Kevan Bills, Gavin Fowler, Spencer Hafoka, Braden Hansen, Alex Kuresa, Marcus Mathews, Zed Mendenhall, Rex Morgan, Mike Muehlmann, Houston Reynolds, Matt Reynolds, Jordan Richardson and Jadon Wagner also boast brothers who have played for the Cougar football program in the past.

FATHER'S DAY

Currently six BYU players are also fathers, led by senior wide receiver Spencer Hafoka, with two children. Other dads on the team include Matt Reynolds, Travis Uale, Alani Fua and Aveni Leung-Wai.

CURRENTLY SERVING MISSIONS...

There are 44 members of the BYU football program currently serving two-year church missions in 17 different countries including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Bulgaria, Cambodia, Chile, Democratic Republic of Congo, El Salvador, Fiji, Guatemala, Mexico, New Zealand, Paraguay, Peru, South Korea, Thailand and the United States. Members of the BYU football program who are currently serving missions cover six of the globe's seven continents and speak a total of seven different foreign languages, including Bulgarian, Cambodian, French, Korean, Portuguese, Spanish and Thai.

SERVED MISSIONS...

Junior defensive lineman Romney Fuga is one of 73 players (61 percent) on the team roster who has served a church mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. Fuga returned home from a mission to Madagascar in the summer of 2009.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in a total of 29 countries and one territory, including Argentina, Australia, Brazil, Canada, Chile, Colombia, Costa Rica, Dominican Republic, El Salvador, Germany, Italy, Jamaica, Japan, Madagascar, the Marshall Islands, Mexico, Mongolia, Mozambique, New Zealand, Panama, Philippines, Puerto Rico, Russia, Samoa, South Africa, South Korea, Spain, Sweden, Taiwan, and the United States.

Current members of the BYU football team have served missions in 14 different states, including Alabama, California, Colorado, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Nevada, New York, Oklahoma, Pennsylvania, Tennessee and Texas.

Overall, 50 current members (42 percent) of the BYU football team speak a combined total of 21 different foreign languages and dialects, including Cebuano, Fante, French, Haitian Creole, German, Hawaiian, Italian, Jamaican Patois, Japanese, Korean, Malagasy, Mandarin Chinese, Marshallese, Portuguese, Russian, Samoan, Spanish, Swedish, Tagalog, Tongan and Twi.

WHAT IS A MISSION?

- * The Church's missionary program is one of its most recognized characteristics. Mormon missionaries can be seen on the streets of hundreds of major cities in the world as well as in thousands of smaller communities.
- * The missionary effort is based on the New Testament pattern of missionaries serving in pairs, teaching the gospel and baptizing believers in the name of Jesus Christ (see, for example, the work of Peter and Paul in the Bible).
- * More than 50,000 missionaries are serving missions for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints at any one time. Most are young people under the age of 25, serving in nearly 350 missions throughout the world.
- * Missionaries can be single men between the ages of 19 and 25, single women over the age of 21 or retired couples. Missionaries work with a companion of the same gender during their mission, with the exception of couples, who work with their spouse. Single men serve missions for two years and single women serve missions for 18 months.
- * Missionary work is voluntary. Missionaries fund their own missions — except for their transportation to and from their field of labor — and are not paid for their services.
- * Missionaries receive their assignment from Church headquarters and are sent only to countries where governments allow the Church to operate. Missionaries do not request their area of assignment and do not know beforehand whether they will be required to learn a language.
- * Prior to going to their assigned area, missionaries spend a short period of time at one of 15 missionary training centers throughout the world. There they learn how to teach the gospel in an orderly and clear way and, if necessary, they begin to learn the language of the people they will be teaching. The largest training center is in Provo, Utah, with additional centers in 14 additional countries including Brazil, England, Ghana, Guatemala, Mexico and Spain.
- * Male missionaries are addressed with the title "Elder" and women are addressed with the title "Sister."
- * A typical missionary day begins by waking at 6:30 a.m. for personal study. The day is spent proselytizing by following up on appointments, visiting homes or meeting people in the street or other public places. Missionaries end their day by 10:30 p.m.
- * In some parts of the world, missionaries are sent only to serve humanitarian or other specialized missions. Those missionaries do not proselytize.
- * Contacts with family and friends during this time of service are limited to letters and occasional phone calls to family at special times. Missionaries avoid entertainment, parties or other activities common to this age-group as long as they are on their missions, so they can focus entirely on the work of serving and of teaching others the gospel of Jesus Christ.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE NOTES

TALE OF THE TAPE

BYU's starting offensive line is largely considered to be one of its major team strengths . . . literally. Measuring in at an average of 6-foot-6 inches and over 310 pounds, the offensive line is built to plow the road for a successful running attack and protect the quarterback play of Jake Heaps.

GOING FOR A DRIVE

BYU's 97-yard scoring drive, the Cougars' third drive of the game at Texas, was the team's longest since a 99-yard drive in the fourth quarter against Utah State in 2006. Since that time BYU has had nine drives of 90 yards or more.

MORE THAN JUST A RUNNER

BYU's offense has featured the passing game for decades, including the running backs getting into the action. Often times the running backs can be seen spreading out into the slot receiver position or catching passes out of the backfield. Four different running backs have caught passes for the Cougars in the 2011 season, including JJ Di Luigi (eight catches for 56 yards), Michael Alisa (four catches for 33 yards), Bryan Kariya (three catches for 20 yards) and Josh Quezada (two catches for 8 yards).

TIME IS ON OUR SIDE

Being able to control the ball has been a valuable asset for the BYU offense to start the season. Through two games, BYU has held the football for an average of almost 32 minutes (31:47), or more than half of the game.

IT'S A REYNOLDS THING

BYU has had a tradition of sibling teammates for years. One of the most prominent has been the Reynolds brothers. In fact, the Cougars have had at least one Reynolds brother start on the offensive line every season dating back to 2004. Lance Jr. (2001-05), Dallas (2005-08), Matt (2007-Pres.) and Houston (2009-Pres.) have combined for 114 starts since 2004. Continuing further on the Reynolds' offensive line, BYU has actually had at least two of the brothers starting together three different seasons with Lance Jr. and Dallas starting 12 games together in 2005, Dallas and Matt starting 13 games in 2008, and with Houston getting the starting nod at Ole Miss, he joined Matt for another Reynolds tag team. As a sophomore this season, it looks like Houston will continue the Reynolds tradition for a few more years.

HEAPS OF TOUCHDOWNS

With at least one touchdown pass in each of his first two games of 2011, Jake Heaps has thrown one or more touchdowns in eight-straight games, dating back to Wyoming of 2010. Heaps connected with Ross Apo for a 6-yard touchdown in the first quarter at Texas. The sophomore finished the day 22-of-38 for 192 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions.

"HOLT"ING YOUR ATTENTION

Tight end Austin Holt has been quietly becoming the premier tight end for the young 2011 season. The 6-foot-5, 247-pounder caught two passes for a team-high 41 yards against the Longhorns. Holt has caught four passes through the first two games, all four going for first downs.

TOUCHDOWN CONNECTION

For the second-straight game, the only offensive touchdowns have come from Jake Heaps and Ross Apo hook-ups. Heaps hit Apo at Texas for a 6-yard score and in game one at Ole Miss the duo connected for a 19-yarder.

SECOND GO AROUND

Throughout history BYU's second-year full-time starters have really flourished. Here is a break down of notable Cougar second-year starters:

Jake Heaps has completed 46 of 76 passes through two games of the 2011 season for a completion percentage of 60.5 percent. All-American BYU quarterbacks have always been accurate and Heaps will be in good company if he keeps his percentage above 60. Ty Detmer, Steve Young, Jim McMahon, Steve Sarkisian and Robbie Bosco all had completion percentages above 60 for their BYU careers.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL OFFENSIVE NOTES

HE'LL PUT ONE TOGETHER

Quarterback Jake Heaps put on a solid first half performance at Texas, but leveled off in the second. In the first half, Heaps completed 14 of 24 passes for 153 yards, one touchdown and one interception. He clearly came on strong in the second half at Ole Miss. Through the first half, Heaps was just 11 of 22 passing for 74 yards and no touchdowns. After the break, Heaps found his groove, connecting on 13 of 16 passes for 151 yards and one touchdown. His one interception returned for a touchdown didn't phase him too much in the fourth quarter when he was 5 of 5 for 49 yards, including a 19-yard strike to Ross Apo for the touchdown.

THE WILD COUGAR

Backup quarterback Riley Nelson made a couple of appearances for BYU again at Texas, notably coming in a change of pace quarterback to add in a running element. Nelson has one rush for four yards to pick up a first down for a third-down conversion. At Ole Miss He had a pitch on an option play and later picked up six yards on a rush of his own. Nelson not only helps out on offense but also appears on special teams.

NO "APO"LOGIES

After redshirting in 2010, wide receiver Ross Apo is out to make up for lost time. Through two games he has the only two touchdown receptions of the season. Apo caught a 19-yard score at Ole Miss and a six-yard touchdown at Texas. He has a team-leading 88 yards on seven receptions to go with the pair of touchdowns so far.

HOFFMAN KEEPS IT GOING

As a top target and leading receiver in 2010, sophomore Cody Hoffman continues to make an impact, catching at least one pass in eight-straight games. Hoffman caught his first pass for six yards with 44 seconds left in the first quarter at Texas. Hoffman finished the day with two catches for 11 yards. He extends his streak to eight games with at least one reception and 14 of 15 career games.

TIGHT ENDS STRONG

With the tight end position seeing a bit of a drop off last year, a revamped tight end crew is focused on bringing the tight end back to a driving force in BYU's offense. At Texas, the tight ends combined to catch seven passes for 88 yards. The tight ends are still waiting to pick up a touchdown pass but seem to be inching closer.

DI LUIGI DOES IT ALL

Senior running back JJ Di Luigi was named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List before the season began. The versatile back carried the ball 14 times for 44 yards against Texas while catching three passes for 24 yards, totaling 63 all-purpose yards against the Longhorns. Di Luigi moved into 28th all-time at BYU in all-purpose yards and 17th in career rushing yards. Here is how Di Luigi looks on the all-time lists and who he might pass in the coming weeks:

KEEPING IT TOGETHER

Staying healthy is always a big concern for offensive linemen. The same five starters of Matt Reynolds, Houston Reynolds, Terence Brown, Braden Hansen and Braden Brown have started the first two games on the offensive line for BYU. In 2010, the starting lineup for the o-line also remained the same all year, with four of the starters coming back for 2011. If all five current starters can stay healthy its a good sign for the BYU offensive attack.

GETTING OPEN FOR THE SCORE

The wide receivers have been able to find the end zone for BYU and quarterback Jake Heaps at least once a game for eight-straight football games. Heaps has two touchdown throws in the first two games, both going to wide receiver Ross Apo. All 15 touchdown passes for Heaps in 2010 went to wide receivers. Heaps' favorite target was Cody Hoffman who grabbed seven touchdowns.

MOVING ON UP

Quarterback Jake Heaps got somewhat of a baptism by fire early in the 2010 season but progressed nicely to end up with 15 touchdowns in his freshman season to set a freshman record. With two more under his belt for 2011, Heaps is steadily moving up the ranks of the top quarterbacks to play at BYU. He has 417 passing yards in two games this year and 2,733 for his career. With his freshman head start, by the end of his Cougar career Heaps has an opportunity to be in the company of some of the statistical best. 2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL DEFENSIVE NOTES

NO POINTS

BYU has given up just 30 points in its first two games of the season, the third time in seven seasons under Bronco Mendenhall the Cougar scoring defense has held opponents to that mark through a season's first two games.

DEFENSIVE STAND

The BYU defense gave up its first touchdown of the season with 10:46 remaining in the third quarter against Texas, breaking a streak of just over 104-straight minutes without a touchdown dating back to last season.

FIRST QUARTER SHUTOUTS

BYU shutout Texas in the first quarter, giving the Cougars seven first-quarter shutouts in their last eight games dating back to last season. UTEP scored three points in the first 15 minutes in the 2010 New Mexico Bowl.

NO RUNNING START

BYU has held its last 10 opponents to 30 yards rushing or less in the first quarter. Texas totaled just 29 yards rushing on four drives in the first quarter.

COUGH IT UP

Sophomore safety Daniel Sorenson's interception in the first quarter extended BYU's streak of forcing a turnover to seven-straight games. The INT was Sorenson's first since his freshman year in 2008.

SOMEONE FROM EVERYWHERE

The defensive two-deep hails from all corners of the country. Player home states include from Alaska, California, Georgia, Hawaii, Massachusetts, Nevada, Utah, Texas and Washington.

In addition, linebacker Jadon Wagner hails from Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada.

SUPER SUB

In the first start of his career, in place of the injured Brandon Ogletree, sophomore Spencer Hadley led the BYU defense with 12 total tackles, including seven solo and five assisted.

The action was the first significant game time Hadley has seen since his freshman season in 2008. That year, Hadley totaled 13 tackles, a number he nearly surpassed against Texas. Hadley had more tackles than any other player, for BYU or Texas, that saw action on Saturday.

2+ INTERCEPTIONS

The BYU defense recorded two interceptions off Texas quarterback Garrett Gilbert in the first half on Saturday, marking the sixth time in the last two seasons that the Cougars have picked off two or more passes. BYU is 4-2 in those games, with the two losses coming against Utah and Texas, both by the score of 17-16.

SUB-100 YD STREAK BROKEN

For the first time since October 16, 2010, the BYU defense allowed an opponent over 100 yards rushing as Texas totaled 166 yards on 43 attempts. The last time a BYU defense allowed 100 yards rushing also came in the state of Texas as the TCU Horned Frogs ran for 108 yard on that day in October.

During the sub-100 yard streak, the Cougars were 6-1, with the lone loss coming against Utah in the 2010 regular season finale.

VAN NOY RECORD

With a fumble recovery for a touchdown against Ole Miss, sophomore linebacker Kyle Van Noy became the first BYU player in history to return two fumbles for touchdowns. Van Noy is also the last Cougar defender to score two touchdowns since Derwin Gray returned two interceptions in 1990-91. The BYU touchdown record for a defender is three by both Mike Russell (1973-74) and Todd Shell (1980-81). Van Noy becomes the ninth Cougar overall to score at least two touchdowns.

In week one, Van Noy caused an Ole Miss fumble, then picked it up and scored on a three-yard touchdown run to give BYU a 14-13 lead. It was the second fumble return for a touchdown by the sophomore after scoring the BYU defense's last points on a 44-yarder last season at Colorado State.

GETTING OFF THE FIELD

The Cougar defense dominated the first half of play as they forced Texas into 1-7 on third down conversions. Four of Texas' first six possessions resulted in punts, while the other two possessions ended with BYU interceptions.

In the game, BYU held Texas to just 4 of 12 on third down conversions, a 33.3% rate of conversion. The Cougars also held Texas on a 4th and 1 on the 13-yard line with 13:32 remaining left in the fourth quarter.

FUMBLE RECOVERIES

After forcing and recovering two fumbles against Ole Miss, the Cougars are 2-0 in the last two seasons when recovering multiple fumbles. The Cougars forced and recovered two fumbles just once last season in a 44-7 win at Colorado State.

FIRST-YEAR STARTERS

In their first season as regular starters, sophomores Daniel Sorenson and Kyle Van Noy have been some of the biggest impact players on the Cougar defense. Against Texas, Van Noy totaled a career-best seven tackles and had one quarterback-hit. Sorenson finished second on the team with nine tackles and had his first INT of the season.

In week one against Ole Miss, both Van Noy and Sorenson played pivotal roles. Van Noy was named FBS Independent Defensive Player of the Week for his fumble recovery and game-winning touchdown, while Sorenson recovered a fumble and had six tackles.

NO SOUP FOR YOU

In its last seven games, BYU has outscored its opponents 143-16 in the first half. UTEP scored 10 of those points in the New Mexico Bowl.

DOING IT AGAIN

BYU is ranked in the top-30 in nine different defensive categories after the first two weeks of the season, including a No. 22 ranking in total defense. Last season, the Cougars posted the 24th-best total defensive mark in the country.

PREVENTING THE PASS

BYU limited the Texas quarterbacks to 123 yards passing, marking the second straight game they have limited the opposing quarterbacks to less than 150 yards passing after holding Ole Miss to 144 total passing yards in week one.

The success of the BYU defensive backfield has come despite a lack of experience among the four starters. Corners Corby Eason and Preston Hadley had one

combined start between them coming into the season, while KAT Daniel Sorenson had never started a game before 2011 and had not played since 2008.

Free safety Travis Uale brings the most experience to the group, with eight career starts heading into 2011. Uale and Sorenson also helped lead the Cougars in tackles against Texas, with nine and eight, respectively.

TROJANS BECOME COUGARS

Two new additions to the Bronco Mendenhall-led defense in 2011 are former USC standouts. Junior Uona Kaveinga and senior Hebron Fangupo made the trek from Los Angeles to Provo and have seen significant playing time in the first two games of the season.

Kaveinga was a reserve linebacker for the Trojans and in 2008 and 2009. After sitting out the 2010 season due to NCAA transfer rules, Kaveinga played a prominent role in the BYU games against Ole Miss and Texas, with eight total tackles and one forced fumble.

Fangupo, a defensive lineman, attended USC in 2009 and 2010. At Texas, Fangupo finished with three total tackles, including two TFL.

CANADA CAN WAIT

After finishing his junior campaign with 37 tackles, including 6.5 for loss, senior Jadon Wagner was drafted by the Hamilton Tiger-Cats with the 44th overall pick of the 2011 Canadian Football League Draft.

A native of Cranbrook, British Columbia, Wagner chose to bypass the opportunity to play in the CFL in order to return to the Cougars for his senior season.

FRAZIER ON LOTT TROPHY WATCH LIST

BYU senior linebaker Jameson Frazier has been named to the 2011 Lott IMPACT Trophy Watch List.

Named after Pro Football Hall of Fame member Ronnie Lott, The Lott Trophy is awarded to college football's Defensive IMPACT Player of the Year for excellent performance both on and off the field.

A 6-foot-2, 225-pound outside linebacker, Frazier started his career as a walk-on before earning a starting role in 2010 while helping the BYU defense finish the year ranked No. 24 in the nation. Frazier contributed 34 tackles, 4.5 tackles for loss, on sack, three quarterback hurries and two interceptions last season despite missing three games due to injury.

FORMER GHANIAN SPRINTER AT LINEBACKER

Two years ago, no one foresaw junior Ezekiel Anisah lining up for the BYU football team. A freshman at the time, Anisah was recruited to BYU as a sprinter for the track and field team.

A native of Accra, Ghana, Anisah related well to BYU sprint coach Leonard Myles-Mills, also a Ghana native. After arriving in Provo, however, Anisah was recruited all over again, this time from the track to the football field.

Despite never playing a down of football in his life, Anisah saw action in six games on special teams and defensive line in 2010. A naturally gifted athlete, Anisah recorded three total tackles and a pass breakup in the first ever football game action.

Heading into the 2011 season, Anisah has made the switch from defensive line to linebacker in the offseason while seeing special teams work, but his learning curve is not nearly as steep as it was one year ago.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

IT'S BEEN A WHILE

BYU has been unable to return a kickoff for a touchdown for 157 consecutive games. Mike Rigell was the last Cougar to accomplish the feat, turning in a 96-yard touchdown in a 31-9 victory at Hawaii on October 17, 1998.

The last time BYU returned a punt for a touchdown was back on Nov. 9, 2006 when current senior McKay Jacobson ran one back 77 yards against Wyoming at Edwards Stadium as a freshman. Fifty-seven games have passed since then.

DISTANT COUSIN

Deep snapper Reed Hornung came to BYU with a familiar family name. Paul Hornung, a former Notre Dame great, won the Heisman Trophy in 1956 and was known as one of the best all-around players in history, playing quarterback while also running, passing, blocking and tackling. Reed and Paul are related -- Paul is Reed's father's second cousin.

SPECIAL FLAG

In addition to the traditional team flag and alumni flag leading the team out of the tunnel before kick-off, BYU has also incorporated a special teams flag with an old school BYU logo this season. At Texas, sophomore Michael Alisa carried out the special teams flag.



PLAYER OF THE WEEK

For his efforts against No. 21 Texas last week, sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen was named the FBS Independent Special Teams Player of the Week and an honorable mention Placekicker Performer of the Week from the College Football Performance Awards. Sorensen went 3 for 3 on field goals and converted his only PAT attempt, scoring a career-high 10 points against the Longhorns.

KICKOFF TEAMS

The BYU kickoff and kickoff return teams performed their jobs admirably against Ole Miss, as the Cougars averaged 26.0 yards per kickoff return and held the Rebels to 13.5 yards per return.

Both BYU kickoff teams both currently rank in the top-50 in the nation, with the kickoff defense ranking 37th and the kickoff return team ranking 41st. BYU also ranks in the top-50 in punt return yardage.

30, 31, 32, 33

With field goals of 30, 33, and 32 yards, respectively, sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen added to the only field goal of his career, a 31-yarder against Wyoming in 2008.

BIG TIME PUNTS

After recording eight punts of 50+ yards in 2009 and 17 such boots in 2010, punter Riley Stephenson continued his trend by slamming one kick beyond 50 yards against Ole Miss and one for 49 yards against Texas.

PINNING THEM BACK

Junior punter Riley Stephenson twice pinned the Ole Miss Rebels inside the 20-yard line, giving him 30 career punts downed inside the 20. Stephenson also placed one kick just inside the 10-yard line against the Rebels. Against Texas, Stephenson helped BYU win the field position battle with a punt that was downed on the Texas three-yard line.

BIG LEG IS BACK

After serving a two-year LDS mission, sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen has averaged just over 68 yards per kickoff and has recorded one touchback in each of the Cougars' first two games.

3 FG BAD LUCK?

Sophomore kicker Justin Sorensen nailed all three of his field goal attempts against Texas, the second time a BYU kicker has gone 3 of 3 on field goals since Mitch Payne did it against Utah - both games resulted in a 17-16 loss.

CATCHING PASSES, CATCHING KICKS

Filling in an opening as a kickoff returner, redshirt freshman Cody Hoffman returned the first four kickoffs of his career against Wyoming, racking up a total of 104 yards while also fulfilling his duties at wide receiver. Hoffman is the first Cougar to pass the 100-yard kickoff return mark since Austin Collie totaled 134 yards against Utah in 2008. For his efforts, Hoffman was named the MWC Special Teams Player of the Week, the first conference award of his career.

Hoffman followed up his newfound special teams excellence with a 50-yard kickoff return against UNLV, the longest for BYU this season and the longest kickoff return by a Cougar since Austin Collie's 70-yard return against Utah in 2008. He also caught his second touchdown pass of the season against the Rebels.

On the season, Hoffman has 255 kickoff return yards on nine attempts, an average of 28.3 yards per return. He also returned his first kick of the 2011 season against Texas for 24 yards.

ALL-PURPOSE

Redshirt freshman cornerback Jordan Johnson, led BYU in all-purpose yards in the second game of the season against Texas with 71 total yards all on kick returns.

2011 COUGAR FOOTBALL HEAD COACH BRONCO MENDENHALL



BRONCO MENDENHALL 7TH SEASON

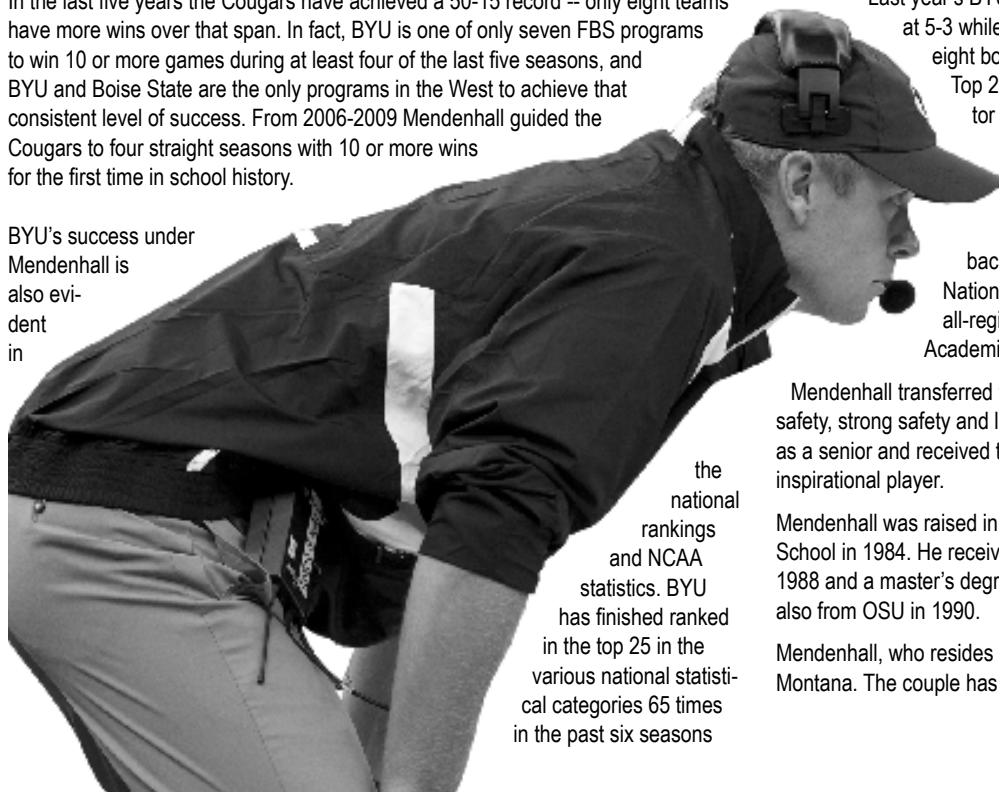
During his six seasons as the head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has returned the Cougars to the ranks of the nation's top teams. Taking over a BYU program in 2005 that was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to six straight bowl invitations, two outright Mountain West Conference championships and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under his leadership, BYU has earned a 57-21 (.731) record as he begins his seventh season to rank No. 16 in total wins among all teams in the nation during that span. The Cougars have received six straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowls invitations from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first six teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall has led BYU to bowl wins in four of the last five seasons to become the first Cougar teams to win four bowls in a five-year span since LaVell Edwards teams did so from 1980-84. Nationally, BYU is one of only 11 programs to win four bowl games in the last five seasons.

In the last five years the Cougars have achieved a 50-15 record -- only eight teams have more wins over that span. In fact, BYU is one of only seven FBS programs to win 10 or more games during at least four of the last five seasons, and BYU and Boise State are the only programs in the West to achieve that consistent level of success. From 2006-2009 Mendenhall guided the Cougars to four straight seasons with 10 or more wins for the first time in school history.

BYU's success under Mendenhall is also evident in



the national rankings and NCAA statistics. BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in the various national statistical categories 65 times in the past six seasons

(42 offense, 16 defense, 6 special teams, 1 misc.). The Cougars have achieved 39 top-15 statistical rankings, 29 top-10 rankings and 15 top-5 rankings in that span. The Cougars have also been ranked in the top-25 polls during each of the past five seasons and finished ranked No. 12 following the 2009 season -- the program's highest final ranking since finishing No. 5 in 1996.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season and has totaled 185 selections during Mendenhall's tenure, along with 64 MWC Scholar-Athlete awards. BYU also ranks second nationally for Academic All-America recipients over the past three seasons. Six Cougar student-athletes have been named ESPN Academic All-Americans the past three years. Among all FBS schools only Penn State has had more during that period.

Going independent in 2011, BYU was consistently a top MWC contender under Mendenhall. BYU achieved a 39-9 (.813) conference record over the past six years to help the Cougars complete their 12-year tenure in the MWC with 64 conference wins -- the most of any MWC school. Mendenhall also helped the Cougars bring bowl wins over Oregon, UCLA, Oregon State and UTEP as the program enters a new era as one of four independent schools, joining Notre Dame, Army and Navy.

Last year's BYU team achieved a 7-6 record and tied for third in the MWC at 5-3 while playing 19 freshmen and facing a schedule that featured eight bowl teams and four opponents that finished in final BCS Top 25 standings. Mendenhall took over defensive coordinator responsibilities after the teams 1-4 start and the team responded to become one of the top defensive teams over the final eight games.

Mendenhall transferred to Oregon State and was a two-year starter, playing free safety, strong safety and linebacker for the Beavers. Mendenhall was a team captain as a senior and received the Leo Gribkoff Memorial Award, given to the team's most inspirational player.

Mendenhall was raised in Alpine, Utah, and graduated from American Fork High School in 1984. He received a bachelor's degree in education from Oregon State in 1988 and a master's degree in education with an emphasis in exercise physiology also from OSU in 1990.

PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE

The BYU coaching staff has six members who have played professional football. Associate Head Coach Lance Reynolds was drafted by the Pittsburgh Steelers in 1978 and also played at Philadelphia. Offensive coordinator Brandon Doman was drafted by the San Francisco 49ers in 2002 and played three years for the 49er's, while defensive line coach Steve Kaufusi and outside linebacker coach Kelly Poppinga played in the NFL with the Arizona Cardinals. Graduate assistant Shaun Nua also spent some time with the Pittsburgh Steelers. In addition, receivers coach Ben Cahoon spent 13 years with the Canadian Football League's Montreal Alouettes before retiring as the CFL's all-time receptions leader.

In addition, Poppinga and Nua are both Super Bowl champions; Poppinga won a ring with the Cardinals in Super Bowl XLIII while Nua earned his in the Steelers' Super Bowl XL victory. Cahoon also won the ultimate prize in the CFL by leading the Montreal to three Grey Cup championships in 2002, 2009 and 2010.

THE NEW GUYS

The BYU coaching staff welcomed two new members this past offseason in running backs coach Joe DuPaix and receivers coach Ben Cahoon.

DuPaix most recently coached at Navy for the past three seasons, helping led the Midshipmen to three bowl bids. In each of his three seasons, Navy was one of the top-6 rushing programs in the country, including an NCAA-best 293.4 ypg in 2008. A Salt Lake City native, DuPaix played under his father, Roger, a successful high school coach at Skyline who also coached current BYU offensive coordinator Brandon Doman in high school. DuPaix played quarterback at Snow College (Ephraim, UT) and Southern Utah where he set the FCS record for most rushing yards by a quarterback in a season.

Cahoon retired in after the 2010 season as the all-time receptions leader in CFL history. Cahoon also set records for most receiving yards in a career in Grey Cup games and most touchdowns by an Alouette in addition to earning the CFL Most Outstanding Canadian Award in 2002 and 2003. A native of Orem, Utah, Cahoon was an All-WAC performer in addition to being an Academic All-American. He is also the son-in-law of current Utah Governor Gary Herbert.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium, with its 63,725-seat capacity, is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 45,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 in permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. Beginning in 2010, Edwards Stadium official capacity became 63,275 after seating was removed to allow for additional wheelchair access.

"FAN" TASTIC FANS

The attendance in BYU's 27-13 loss to Nevada in 2010 was 61,471, ending a streak of 19-straight sellouts at LaVell Edwards Stadium over the course of more than three complete seasons. The prior time the stadium was not sold out was against New Mexico on Nov. 18, 2006 when 63,814 fans were in attendance—231 short of a sellout.

TOP 10 EDWARDS STADIUM CROWDS

In 2009, BYU hosted two of the top-ten crowds since LaVell Edwards Stadium was modified in 2003. The crowd of 64,641 at the TCU game ranks third, ranking behind the crowd of 65,251 for the 2004 game against Notre Dame and the 64,749 in attendance for the 2007 Utah game. The Cougars' overtime contest against Utah in 2009 is currently 10th with 64,301 fans attending the game. In 2010, BYU averaged 61,380 fans per home game.



HOME FIELD DOMINANCE

Since it was built in 1964, the Cougars have fielded several dominating teams. Last season, BYU averaged 30.0 points per game at home. The Cougars have not had a negative points per game margin for the past seven seasons, including all six years of head coach Bronco Mendenhall's tenure. In 2006, a 35.16-point differential was a BYU record in scoring margin in the stadium's 46-year history and the program's 86-year history:
