The Dandy Dons

- Now 7-8 overall and 1-2 in the WCC after dropping a 57-56 decision Thursday to San Diego...have lost two straight and are 4-8 over the last 12 games after a 3-0 start.
- Were 9-6 at the 15-game mark last season...won the next two games to improve to 11-6 overall and 4-1 in the WCC.
- Dropped three games to BYU last season, including an overtime thriller in the semifinals of the WCC Championships...are 1-6 against the Cougars since BYU joined the WCC in 2011-12.
- Have four wins this season by 30-points or more and have won seven games this season by an average of 26.8 points.
- Have been outrebounded in two of its first three conference games after outboarding 10 of its first 12 opponents...rank third the WCC in rebound average at 38.5 and are fourth in rebound margin (+6.6)...rank second in offensive rebounds per game (12.3).
- Three players - **Kruize Pinkins** (6.1), **Matt Glover** (6.1) and **Mark Tollefsen** (5.5) - are averaging at least 5.0 rebounds per game while **Tim Derksen** is averaging 4.9.
- Shooting 46.8 percent from the floor, third-best in the WCC...have shot 50 percent or better in four games this season, including a season-high 64.9 effort vs. Montana...BYU ranks second in conference field goal percentage at 46.9.
- Allowed Saint Mary's to shoot 51.9 percent from the floor, the highest single-game field goal percentage turned in by an opponent this season...Dons are holding opponents to 40.4 percent shooting on the year, which is the second best mark in the WCC.
- Rank second in the WCC in three-point percentage at 39.2 percent (103-for-263)...rank seventh in three-pointers made per game at 6.9...junior **Tim Derksen** ranks second in the WCC in 3-point field goal percentage at .500 (24-for-48).
- Made just 8-of-16 free throws in a one-point loss to San Diego on Thursday...shooting just 57.4 (193-336) from the stripe on the season which ranks last among WCC teams and is the third lowest percentage in the nation among Division I teams.
- Employed its fifth starting lineup of the season Thursday vs. San Diego, with freshman **Devin Watson** getting the nod at point guard...used three starting lineups all of last season.
- Junior **Mark Tollefsen** has taken over the team lead in scoring with 15.3 ppg average, just ahead of **Kruize Pinkins** at 15.0...Tollefsen has scored in double-figures in 14 of 15 games this season and ranks as the conference's seventh leading scorer.
- Play its next three games on the road starting with Thursday night's contest at Gonzaga...road games follow at Portland (Jan. 10) and Santa Clara (Jan. 17) before Dons return home to face Pepperdine on Jan. 22.

Now in his seventh season as head coach at the University of San Francisco, Rex Walters (Kansas '93) continues to put his mark on one of college basketball's most storied programs.

In six seasons on the Hilltop, the former Kansas standout has guided the Dons to a 105-102 record, three postseason appearances and a pair of 20-win seasons. His career record, which includes two seasons at Florida Atlantic, stands at 136-135.

The 2013-14 season saw the Dons finish with a 21-12 record, tie for second in the West Coast Conference with a 13-5 mark and earn a bid to the National Invitation Tournament. The 21 victories marked the Dons' highest win total since the 1981-82 team posted a 25-6 record while their 13 conference victories were the most since the 1976-77 team went 14-0 in league play while spending most of the season ranked No. 1 in the nation.

For his efforts, Walters was named the WCC's Coach of the Year in a vote of his peers, becoming the first USF coach to win the award since Pete Barry in 1980-81.

USF has played in the postseason three of the last four seasons. The Dons reached the quarterfinals of the 2011 Collegen Insider.com Tournament, made an appearance in the College Basketball Invitational in 2011-12 and earned a spot in the NIT in 2013-14.

A total of 15 USF players have earned West Coast Conference honors over the last six seasons, including seven first-team selections.

Prior to taking over the coaching duties at USF, Walters served as the head coach at Florida Atlantic for two seasons, guiding the Owls to a 31-33 overall record and a 18-18 mark in the Sun Belt Conference. Walters' first collegiate coaching position was as an assistant coach on Homer Drew's staff at Valparaiso (2003-05), where he helped the Hornets reach the NCAA Tournament in 2003-04.

A former standout player under Roy Williams at Kansas, Walters led the Jayhawks in scoring as a junior and senior as KU won back-to-back Big Eight titles, capped off by a trip to the 1993 Final Four. He was twice named to the All-Big Eight team and was named the Big Eight's Male Athlete of the Year as a senior in 1993.

He began his collegiate career at Northwestern, leading the Wildcats in scoring as a sophomore.

A first round selection by the New Jersey Nets in the 1993 NBA Draft, Walters played seven seasons in the NBA, including stints in New Jersey, Philadelphia and Miami. He also played professionally for two seasons with the Kansas City Knights.

A Bay Area native, Walters attended Piedmont Hills and Independence High Schools in San Jose, Calif.

What's a Don

"Don" is an acronym for **De Origen Noble**, which translates to "of noble origin" and is a Spanish title given only to a noble person of political, social or official distinction. The name references the early history of California and San Francisco, which was marked by the exploits of the adventuresome and swashbuckling Spanish Dons. All USF students and alumni are of noble origin who share in the long passion for learning in order to better understand the past, clarify the present and anticipate the future. Thus, we are proud to call ourselves the Dons. USF's mascot is named **Don Francisco**, in honor of **Don Francisco de Haro**, the first mayor of San Francisco.

Opening Tip

USF (7-8, 1-2 WCC) looks to snap a two-game losing streak tonight when the Dons play host to the BYU Cougars (12-4, 2-1 WCC) in an 8:00 p.m. start in Memorial Gymnasium. The Dons have dropped consecutive games to Saint Mary's (69-56) and San Diego (57-56) to fall below .500 for the first time this season. The Cougars are coming off an 81-46 victory at Santa Clara on Thursday.

Series History with BYU

BYU leads the all-time series with USF, 11-6. The Cougars won all three games against the Dons last season, sweeping the regular season series with an 83-76 victory in San Francisco and a 68-63 win in Provo. BYU also downed the Dons, 79-77 in overtime in the semifinals of the WCC Championships. USF is 1-6 vs. BYU since the Cougars joined the WCC for the 2011-12 season. The Dons lone victory came on Feb. 9 in Provo, when USF nailed 14 three-pointers in a 99-87 victory. **However, six of the last seven games have been decided by fewer than 10 points.** The teams have met once in NCAA Tournament play, with the Dons scoring a 86-63 victory in a second round game played in Tucson, Ariz. in 1979.

The Matchup

Tonight's game features two of the top three shooting teams in the WCC. BYU ranks second in field goal percentage (46.9) while USF ranks third (46.8). USF is limiting opponents to just 40.4 percent shooting on the year, which is the second best mark in the WCC. The Cougars (1st; 39.9) and Dons (3rd; 38.5) are also two of the top rebounding teams in the WCC and are tied for first in offensive rebounds per game (12.3). The Cougars lead the WCC in three-pointers made per game (8.8) while the Dons are allowing opponents to shoot 35.2 percent from long distance this season.

Last Year's Games vs. BYU

In the first of three meeting with the Cougars in 2013-14, USF dropped a 83-76 decision to BYU on Jan. 16 inside Memorial Gymnasium. **Cole Dickerson** had 26 points and a season-high 14 rebounds to pace four Dons in double-figures. However, USF committed 16 turnovers that led to 19 BYU points and watched as the Cougars knocked down 28-of-37 free throws. A tightly-contested first half saw 10 lead changes before the Dons took a 37-34 decision into the break. BYU was nursing a 51-50 lead with 12:28 left before going on a 12-4 run to seize control of the game. **Kyle Collin-sworth** had 19 points to pace five Cougars in double-figures

The Dons dropped a 68-63 decision to BYU on Feb. 8 in Provo. The Dons rallied from a three-point halftime deficit to build a five-point, 52-47 lead with 10:13 left, only to see the Cougars use a 14-3 run to take a 61-55 advantage at the 4:27 mark. BYU extended its lead to seven at 67-60 before winning by the final score of 68-63. BYU outrebounded USF, 47-29 and took advantage of 20 offensive rebounds that led to 16 second chance points. **Tim Derksen** led USF in scoring with 17 points on 7-of-8 shooting from the floor. **Tyler Haws** and **Kyle Collin-sworth** paced the Cougars with 19 points each.

The teams met for a third time on March 10 at the WCC Championships in Las Vegas, with BYU scoring a 79-77 decision in overtime. **Cole Dickerson** led the

Dons with 20 points and 10 rebounds for his ninth double-double of the season. USF rallied from four, 10-point deficits in the first half to lead 37-35 at the break. The Dons held the Cougars scoreless for the last 6:13 of regulation to force overtime. However, BYU scored the first six points of OT and won the game when **Avry Holmes'** potential game-winning three-pointer and valiant put back effort by **Tim Derksen** missed their marks.

Last Time Out

USF fell to San Diego, 57-56 Thursday night in Memorial Gymnasium, dropping the Dons' record below the .500 mark for the first time this season. The Dons built a 33-28 lead at halftime, but managed to shoot just 28.6 percent in scoring 23 second half points. The Toreros took their first lead of the game at 44-43 with 12:11 remaining and led by four at 55-51 with 3:01 left. The Dons came up empty on their next five possessions, however had a chance to win the game in the final seconds before **Chris Anderson** stole the ball from **Matt Glover**, preserving the Toreros one-point victory. **Mark Tollefsen** led all scorers with 14 points while **Matt Glover** added 11 to go along with nine rebounds. No Torero player scored in double figures, including **Johnny Dee**, who managed just four points on the night. USF's leading scorer, **Kruize Pinkins**, was plagued by foul trouble and finished with just seven points and two rebounds.

The Record

At 7-8, USF is two games off its pace of last season when the Dons were 9-6 on the year at the 15-game mark. The Dons won their next two games to improve to 11-6 overall and 4-1 in the WCC. USF ultimately finished with a 21-11 overall mark and tied for second in the WCC with a 13-5 conference ledger.

The Wins

USF's seven wins this season have come by an average of 26.8 points (82.9 to 56.1). The Dons have posted four wins of 30 points or more against South Carolina State (91-52), Notre Dame de Namur (86-46), Houston Baptist (85-54) and Portland State (77-40) and also own decisive victories over Hawaii (88-73) and Montana (76-57).

The Defensive Numbers

USF ranks fourth in the WCC in points allowed per game (64.0) and second in field goal defense (.404). Only four teams have managed to shoot 50 percent from the floor against USF while the Dons have held eight opponents under the 70-point mark. The Dons also rank fourth in steals per game (6.3) and are seventh in blocks (2.5).

Board Work

The Dons have been outrebounded in two of its first three WCC games after outboarding 10 of 12 opponents. USF ranks third the WCC in rebound average at 38.5 per game and also ranks fourth among WCC teams in rebound margin (6.6). The Dons also rank second in the conference in offensive rebounds with a 12.3 per game mark. Three players - **Kruize Pinkins** (6.1), **Matt Glover** (6.1) and **Mark Tollefsen** (5.5) - are averaging at least 5.0 rebounds per game while **Tim Derksen** is averaging 4.9. All four players have pulled down 10 or more rebounds in a game this season.

From the Field

The Dons shot just 28.6 percent en route to scoring 23 second half points against San Diego on Thursday. USF is shooting 46.8 percent from the field this season which ranks third in the WCC. USF shot 55.6 percent from the field vs. Houston Baptist, marking the fourth time this season USF has shot 50 percent or better from the floor. **Mark Tollefsen** ranks fourth in the WCC in field goal percentage at 55.4 while **Kruize Pinkins** ranks ninth (52.1).

From the Line

After making 23-of-30 (.767) of its free throws vs. Pacific and Saint Mary's, the Dons made just 8-of-16 of their charity tries in a one-point loss to San Diego on Thursday. The Dons are shooting just 57.4 percent (193-336) from the line at the 15 game mark of the season, which ranks last in the WCC and is the third worst mark in the nation among 345 Division I teams. USF's 336 free throw attempts are tied for the 21st highest total in the nation.

Beyond the Arc

USF ranks second in the WCC and 28th nationally in three-point field goal percentage at .392 (103-for-263). Junior **Tim Derksen** (50.0 24-for-48) ranks second in the WCC while Mark Tollefsen ranks sixth (44.4; 24-for-54).

Lineups

USF employed its fifth lineup of the season vs. San Diego, with freshman **Devin Watson** getting his first starting assignment at the point guard position. The Dons used three starting lineups all of last season.

Dons in Overtime

USF lost its first overtime game of the season at Cleveland State and are now 2-3 in its last five overtime games dating back to last season. The Dons are 11-6 in overtime games under **Rex Walters**.

USF Basketball Under Rex Walters

USF is 105-102 in seven seasons under head coach **Rex Walters**, including 49-47 in WCC play. After going 23-37 over his first two seasons, Walters has guided the Dons to a 82-65 (.562) record and three postseason appearances over the last four-plus seasons (2010-11 College Insider.com; 2011-12 College Basketball Invitational; 2013-14 NIT). Last season, Walters was named the the WCC's Coach of the Year in a vote of his peers, becoming the first USF coach to win the award since **Pete Barry** in 1980-81.

Walters Joins 100-Win Club
