BYU STORYLINES

- **SERIES HISTORY.** Last year, BYU defeated the Broncos 35-24 in Provo to give the Cougars a record of 2-4 in the series. Mitchell Juergens caught a touchdown pass from Tanner Mangum on fourth down with 45 seconds to play, putting BYU up 28-24. A Kai Nacua pick-six on BSU's last drive put an exclamation point on a 35-24 win. The Broncos won the last meeting in Boise 55-30 in 2014 when BSU went on to the Fiesta Bowl.
- **MOUNTAIN WEST.** BYU is facing an opponent from the Mountain West, marking the sixth different conference BYU has faced in 2016. The team has already played games against the Pac-12, Big 12, MAC, Big Ten and SEC. BYU was member of the conference from 1999 to 2010 and went 64-26 in the league, winning the title three times.
- **JAMAAL WILLIAMS.** Jamaal Williams became BYU's all-time leading rusher against Mississippi State with 3,468 career rushing yards. He passed Harvey Unga (3,455) for the top mark. He has 942 rushing yards this season after seven games, No. 2 nationally in total rushing yards.
- **IDAHO CONNECTION.** BYU has five Idaho players on the roster, including quarterbacks Taysom Hill (Pocatello), Tanner Mangum (Eagle) and Hayden Livingston (Rigby). Wideout Colby Pearson (Blackfoot) and defensive back Sam Baldwin (Rexburg) are also from the Gem State.

POSTGAME MEDIA AVAILABILITY

After home games, postgame press conference will be conducted in the LaVell Edwards Stadium press room, located on the southeast end of the stadium next to the BYU locker room. At the discretion of the visiting team, opponent interviews will be conducted in the Blue Zone, near the opponent's locker room located on northwest end of the stadium. Coach Sitake and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A direct video feed will also be sent to the press box from the BYU postgame press conference. A basic transcript of Sitake's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided with additional player quotes upon availability. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

BOISE STATE HOLDS OFF COLORADO STATE

BOISE, Idaho (AP) Jeremy McNichols rushed for 217 yards and two touchdowns and No. 15 Boise State withstood Colorado State's late rally for a 28-23 victory on Saturday night.

After the Broncos (6-0, 3-0 Mountain West) took a 28-3 lead early in the fourth quarter, Colorado State (3-4, 1-2) recovered two onside kicks in the final 6 minutes while scoring three straight TDs, cutting the deficit to five with 3:35 left.

The Broncos recovered Colorado State's third onside kick attempt and ran the clock down to 15 seconds before giving the Rams the ball at their own 27. Colorado State advanced the ball to the 40 on a play with multiple laterals, but a review ruled that a forward lateral was made, resulting in a 10-second runoff that ended the game.

The Rams became the first team to take a lead on Boise State this season when Wyatt Bryan kicked a 39-yard field goal with 7:24 remaining in the first quarter. The score snapped Boise State's FBS record of 306:36 without trailing.

Colorado State, seeking its first road win of the season, struggled against a stingy defense for most of the game.

However, the night belonged to McNichols, who also set career highs in 34 carries and 264 total yards.

With Boise State's offense sputtering, McNichols scored on runs of 5 and 80 yards to ignite the Broncos. McNichols now has three runs of 80 yards or more in his career.

Brett Rypien was 16-of-24 passing for 207 yards and one touchdown. Thomas Sperbeck led Boise State's receiving corps with five catches for 72 yards and added an 11-yard touchdown pass to A.J. Richardson.

Colorado State quarterback Nick Stevens was 17-of-31 passing for 184 yards and two touchdowns, while Dalyn Dawkins led the Rams on the ground with 66 yards.

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR SIX

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from eight different conferences and an independent team. Six games come against Power Five opponents, including teams from the Pac-12, Big 12, Big Ten and SEC. The schedule ranks No. 7 in Phil Steele's preseason schedule rankings. The opponents on the 2016 schedule posted a 97-57 record in 2015, with 10 bowl teams and an FCS playoff team.

The Cougars host six home games and have four true road contests with two neutral site games, both at NFL stadiums, in 2016. The home schedule consists of UCLA, Toledo, Mississippi State, Southern Utah, UMass and Utah State. Teams on the home schedule put together a 44-31 record in 2015, with four reaching bowl games and Southern Utah earned an FCS playoff berth. Road contests include Utah, Michigan State, Boise State and Cincinnati with neutral site games against Arizona (University of Phoenix Stadium - home of the Arizona Cardinals) and West Virginia (FedEx Field - home of the Washington Redskins). All six games away from home are against 2015 bowl teams with a combined record of 53-16 last year.

BOWLING OPPONENTS

Of BYU's 12 opponents in 2016, 10 played in a bowl game in 2015. Only USC has more bowl teams on its 2016 schedule with 11. BYU, along with just Ole Miss and Colorado are the only three teams with 10 bowl teams on the schedule this season.

TEAM CAPTAINS

BYU will have four captains for the 2016 season in senior quarterback Taysom Hill, senior running back Jamaal Williams, senior defensive back Kai Nacua and senior defensive lineman Harvey Langi. Hill is serving as a captain for the third time. BYU offensive coordinator Ty Detmer was also a three-time team captain (89, 90, 91).

FLAG BEARERS

BYU's tradition of carrying team flags out of the tunnel adds some new looks for 2016. A United States serviceman will carry an American flag for every game, with team flags carried by selected players and alumni flags carried by former BYU players for each game.

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 63,470 after various refurbishments. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. BYU's record at LaVell Edwards Stadium is ranked No. 12 among teams playing in their current stadium.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 150 nations speaking more than 160 languages. Over 74,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 418 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

The 2016 team has 84 players that served church missions and there are another 27 currently serving. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

POLYNESIAN PIPELINE

The Polynesian Islands have become a hotbed for recruiting in recent years, but BYU has been one of the pioneers in bringing these players from Tonga, Samoa, the Hawaiian Islands and all of Polynesia to the forefront of college football since the early 1950s. More than 40 members of the current roster are of Polynesian descent.

Some of BYU's most celebrated and decorated players have come from the Pacific islands, including All-Americans, national record holders, players who have gone on to compete in the NFL and now, several members of BYU's current coaching and support staff.

Kalani Sitake was named BYU's 14th head coach on Dec. 19, 2015, becoming the first Tongan head football coach in the NCAA. Sitake was raised in Laie, Hawaii and later moved to the mainland. His staff includes Polynesians Ilaia Tuiaki, Steve Kaufusi, Reno Mahe, Nu'u Tafisi, Russell Tialavea, Tevita Ofahengauae, Jack Damuni, Jasen Ah You, Sione Kinikini, Vince Feula and Harvey Unga.

LAST GAME RECAP: BYU BEATS MISSISSIPPI STATE IN 2OT; WILLIAMS BREAKS ALL-TIME RUSHING MARK

PROVO, Utah – Jamaal Williams became BYU's all-time career rusher as the Cougars beat Mississippi State 28-21 in two overtimes Friday night at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

Taysom Hill rolled right and found tight end Tanner Balderree who did most of the work after catch to give BYU a 28-21 lead after the Cougars' second overtime possession. BYU linebacker Fred Warner broke up a fourth-down pass in the end zone on the Bulldogs' possession to seal BYU's win.

Williams rushed for 76 yards in the game to increase his career rushing total to 3,468 yards, which broke Harvey Unga's career mark.

Mississippi State got on the board first with a 44-yard touchdown pass from Nick Fitzgerald to Keith Mixon. Fitzgerald was pressured outside a dumped it off to the sideline where Mixon went down the line for the score. The subsequent PAT put the Bulldogs' up 7-0 about six minutes into the game.

BYU responded by going on a 15-play, 75-yard drive for a touchdown. On fourth and goal from the one yardline, Hill found Hunter Marshall in the back left corner of the end zone with 48 seconds left in the quarter to even things up at 7-7.

Micah Hannemann's first interception of the season and third of his career gave the ball back to BYU early in the second quarter. That eventually led to a 42-yard field goal attempt but Rhett Almond missed wide right.

Fitzgerald punched in a touchdown on the ground to cap off a 15-play, 75-yard touchdown drive to put Mississippi State back on top, 14-7, with 3:54 left in the first half.

After penalties by both teams and the Cougars knocking on on the door for a score, Hill threw a laser through two defenders for a touchdown to Moroni Lauulu-Pututau, who made a diving catch between the defenders in the end zone. The PAT tied things up at 14-14 with 13:15 left to play.

Mississippi State's next drive came to a halt when Kai Nacua picked off Fitzgerald and returned it 10 yards to the BYU 28. That marked five interceptions on the year for Nacua, and 13 on his career. BYU couldn't turn it into points and the game went to overtime.

The Bulldogs started in overtime and scored a touchdown via a two-yard rushing touchdown. The Cougars trailed 21-14 as they took over on offense.

On BYU's first play, Williams carried the ball for nine yards to break Unga's record. Several plays later, Hill punched in a quarterback sneak for a touchdown. Andrew Mikkelsen made the PAT to send the game to a second overtime.

The Cougars needed just one play to score a touchdown in the second extra period with the connection between Hill and Balderree for the touchdown. It was Balderree's first career touchdown reception and capped off a night of 165 passing yards and three touchdown passes for Hill.

THE BYU OFFENSE

• **TAG TEAM, BACK AGAIN.** In 2013 when both played a full season, Taysom Hill (1,344) and Jamaal Williams (1,233) combined for 2,577 rushing yards. Through seven games, the pair has combined for 1,266 yards (942 for Williams and 324 for Hill). They both rushed for 100 yards in the same game (West Virginia-Williams 169, Hill 105) for the first time since Sept. 11, 2014 against Houston. Hill ran for 160 and Williams ran for 139 in a 33-25 win. BYU is 4-1 when the two go for at least 100 each.

• **SCORING BY QUARTER.** BYU has scored 41 points in the first quarter, 25 in the second, 34 in the third and 83 in the fourth quarter this season. Averaging 11.9 points in the 4th quarter ranks 8th in the FBS. Last year, BYU was one of the best 4th-quarter teams nationally (4) scoring an average of 10.8 points in the 4th quarter.

• **BALANCED ATTACK.** The Cougars have run a nearly perfect balanced attack. Through seven games, BYU has 1,406 rushing yards and 1,429 passing yards. With 158 total first downs, 73 have come rushing and 72 have come via the pass. The Cougars average 200.9 per game on the ground and 204.1 in the air.

• **TIGHT END TOUCHDOWNS.** BYU had two different tight ends catch a touchdown pass against Mississippi State with Hunter Marshall and Tanner Balderree both getting in for six. The last time the team had two different tight ends catch a touchdown in a season was 2013 (Kaneakua Friel, Richard Wilson). The last time two different tight ends caught one in the same game was in 2009 when Andrew George and Dennis Pitta each grabbed at least one score against Air Force in a 38-21 win.

BYU DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

- 1 Kai Nacua is tied for first in the NCAA in total interceptions with five. Nacua has 13 career interceptions, the most by a BYU player since 2000 (official defensive statistics recorded by NCAA)
- 206 BYU gave up just 206 total yards against Michigan State, which was the fewest the Spartans had totaled since tallying 187 against No. 13 Nebraska in 2011. The 206 given up by BYU are the fewest the Cougars have allowed in 2016.
- 3 The Cougars are ranked third in the nation in passes intercepted (12). BYU has 16 total turnovers gained so far in 2016.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- SCORING DEFENSE.** The BYU defense has held four opponents to 20 points or less (16, 20, 17, 14). The last time a BYU team kept its first three opponents under 20 was in 1984 (14, 13, 15). The 1984 team held its first five opponents to 20 points or less. In 2015, the Cougars were able to hold teams to 20 or less five times.
- TFL.** The Cougars notched at least six tackles for a loss in 12 out of 13 games in 2015 and have 45 total so far in the 2016 season, including a season-high of nine against Mississippi State. BYU has not had less than four tackles for a loss in a game so far this season. Last season, the Cougars ranked No. 9 nationally with 7.5 tackles for loss per game.
- STAYING POSITIVE.** BYU is 58-9 since 2005 with a positive turnover margin. BYU was plus-2 with two picks against Arizona and Toledo and plus-3 with three picks and three fumble recoveries against Utah. The Cougars recorded a positive turnover margin in seven games in 2015.
- NEW FACES, NEW PLACES.** A number of players have shuffled positions with the coaching change to Kalani Sitake. Notable changes include several linebackers transitioning to defensive line positions with more 4-3 elements in the defensive scheme including Harvey Langi moving from mostly playing middle linebacker to defensive end. Two offensive players of note jumped to defense, including Francis Bernard moving from running back to linebacker and Akile Davis moving from receiver to cornerback. Micah Hannemann, the starting field corner in 2015 also moved into the middle at one of the safety positions.

Kalani Sitake (pronounced kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay) was named head coach overseeing the BYU football program on December 19, 2015, by director of athletics Tom Holmoe.

Sitake is the 14th head coach in BYU history. He comes to BYU from Oregon State, where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator.

A former Cougar running back (1994, 1997-2000), Sitake returns to his alma mater with 15 years of coaching experience, including seven years as defensive coordinator and four seasons as an assistant head coach.

Prior to serving as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Oregon State in 2015, Sitake spent 10 seasons at the University of Utah. He started at Utah in 2005 as the linebackers coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2009 before also being named assistant head coach in 2012.

Sitake has coached several Pac-12 and Mountain West Conference honorees, including Morris Trophy winners Star Lotulelei (2011) and Nate Orchard (2014). He also helped mentor 14 NFL Draft picks during his time at Utah, including 12 all-league players and three freshmen All-Americans. He helped the Utes win seven of eight bowl games during his tenure.

Sitake began his coaching career in 2001 as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Arizona before becoming a defensive graduate assistant at BYU in 2002. Sitake then joined the staff at Southern Utah where he coached running backs, tight ends and offensive line during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

Born in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, and raised in Laie, Hawai'i and Provo, Utah, Sitake becomes the first FBS head football coach of Tongan descent. He is the 14th head coach in BYU history, and just the fourth since 1972, when Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards took over the program.

Sitake began his BYU playing career in 1994 prior to serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Oakland, California. After returning and redshirting in 1997, Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000 under Edwards.

He was named BYU's Football Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1998, Impact Player of the Year in 1999, along with team captain and the most valuable running back in 2000. He signed a free agent contract with the Cincinnati Bengals in 2001, but was forced to retire due to an injury.

Sitake graduated from BYU in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in English. He and his wife Timberly have three children, Skye, Sadie and Kelaokalani (KK).
