Broadcast Coverage

All four games will be on livestats. Brent Norton calls the action of all the games on ESPN 960 AM radio which will also be streamed on its site and the site for BYU Radio. Friday's game will be streamed on theW.tv with George Devine and Alex Jensen calling the action. Saturday's final game of the BYU-Gonzaga series will be televised nationally at 7:30 p.m. PDT by ESPNU with Roxy Bernstein and Wes Chandler as the announcers.

Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU '93, played '85-'88) is in his fifth season as head coach at BYU, 32-21 (.604) in 2013; 22-31 (.415) in 2014; 28-25 in 2015; and 37-17 in 2016 for an 119-95 (.556) record with the Cougars. The 49-year-old coach had a 219-128 (.631) record in seven seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie '08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia '07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU '99), all in their fifth year at BYU.

Series vs. Gonzaga

Gonzaga leads the series 22-20 (see link at <http://byucougars.com/node/4193/m-baseball>). The series is tied 8-8 in Spokane and the Cougars are 11-7 vs. Gonzaga in Provo. Gonzaga won the last meeting between the two teams, handing BYU a 5-3 loss in the opening round of last year's WCC tourney.

Hitting Streaks

David Clawson leads the team with a current eight-game hitting streak. Tanner Chauncey's 12-game hitting streak ended at San Diego. Schneemann had a 14-game hitting streak and Larsen had a nine-game hitting streak both ended at LMU. Brock Hale had a 15-game hitting streak ended against UConn. Brennon Anderson had an 11-game hitting streak this season. Keaton Kringle's hitting streak ended at 13 games at Georgia State. Colton Shaver had a 12-game streak last season.

Ranking in National Polls for 2017

For the second week in a row, BYU remained at No. 18 in Collegiate Baseball, up from No. 22 three weeks ago when it was the first time this season the Cougars have been ranked and for the fourth week in a row they received votes in the USA Today/Coaches poll.

No K's in the spelling of Tanner Chauncey's name

Tanner Chauncey is No. 2 in the nation in the category of toughest to strike out after being No. 1 the previous two weeks. In the month of April, Chauncey did not strike out at all in 67 at bats with 28 hits (.418 batting average), five walks and twice was hit by pitches. This season Chauncey has only struck out nine times (8 swinging), the last being in game three vs. Utah Valley. His other strikeouts came vs. Kennesaw State, Georgia State, San Jose State, UC Santa Barbara, Portland, and at LMU as a pinch hitter on March 25 in the final at bat of a 2-0 loss when Cory Abbott threw his perfect game and at Santa Clara in game 3. Had he not struck out at LMU, Chauncey would have extended his 18-game streak by seven more games.

Kringlen National & WCC Player of Week vs. Utah, SMC

Keaton Kringlen was named National Player of the Week by three organizations (Collegiate Baseball, National Baseball Writers Association and College Sports Madness) and Rawlings WCC Player of the Week. In the four games he had a slugging percentage of 1.571 with a batting average of .571, while going 8-for-14 with a triple, four homers, 14 RBI and 22 total bases for the Cougars. Three of those homers came in a 14-1 victory to complete a three-game sweep over league-leading Saint Mary's. His triple at Utah and his two-run inside the park homer vs. SMC in a 7-6 win were the game-winning RBI.

Hale Rawlings WCC Player of Week vs. Utah, Portland

Hale homered in the first game of the week against Utah on a towering solo shot that bounced in the road beyond left field and had a three-run homer in the six-run fourth of the final game of the week against Portland. For the week he had nine RBI, two doubles and two home runs.

Top 25 Teams

BYU lost at No. 21 Georgia Tech in the season opener, 5-3 and the Cougars won 2 of 3 at No. 19 San Diego this season.

BYU won the first of three games in 2016 against No. 25 Creighton. In 2015 BYU played four nationally ranked teams: UC Santa Barbara, Nebraska, San Diego and upset No. 29 San Diego State.

In 2014, the Cougars played two nationally ranked teams, No. 19 TCU and No. 26 Texas Tech. In 2013, BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Also in 2013, BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1; and BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball).

In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after up-setting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.

Quick Look at BYU

BYU was picked to finish fourth in the West Coast Conference after placing being tri-champs its fourth year in the league and third under Coach Mike Littlewood. The Cougars return 22 lettermen for Littlewood's fifth season. Preseason WCC prognostications have BYU first by Baseball America, second (D1baseball.com) and fourth by Perfect Game.

Deseret First Duel

For the ninth of 10 times BYU won the baseball portion of the Deseret First Duel in games against Utah. BYU won the baseball portion of the Duel in 2008, 2009, 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016 and 2017. BYU won the 2014 competition due to a tiebreaker with a 38-21 run differential after the two teams split the four-game series. The 2008 series won by BYU and the 2011 series won by Utah were also by run differential.
