BYU STORYLINES

- 1984. The last and only time BYU and Michigan squared off it was a magical season for the Cougars. BYU beat Michigan 24-17 in the Holiday Bowl to finish a perfect 13-0, winning the national championship. Robbie Bosco completed 30 of 42 passes for 343 yards and two touchdowns, both coming in the fourth quarter. Bosco hit Glen Kozlowski with just under 11 to play to tie the game at 17-17 and then found Kelly Smith with 1:23 left to go up 24-17 and BYU held on to win it. Michigan head coach Jim Harbaugh was a member of that 1984 Michigan team but did not play in the game due to a broken arm suffered earlier in the season.
- · WINNINGEST PROGRAMS. Both BYU and Michigan are two programs toward the top of college football in wins since 1975. Over the last 40 seasons, BYU has 356 wins to rank No. 5 overall while Michigan has 350 to rank No. 6. BYU defeated Nebraska earlier this season, who ranks No. 1 with 390 wins.
- FEELING 22. Despite the loss to UCLA, the Cougars remained in the Associated Press poll at No. 22. It is the first time BYU has been ranked in back-to-back weeks since weeks three and four of the 2014 season. BYU is 160-50 since 1922 when competing as a ranked team.
- AGAINST THE BIG TEN. BYU doesn't have a lot of experience against the Big Ten in its history, but knocked off Nebraska to start the year. The Cougars are 4-7-1 against current Big Ten teams in its history.
- STATE OF MICHIGAN. The Cougars haven't played in the state of Michigan since 1999's Motor City Bowl. The Cougars lost to Marshall 21-3. BYU has played three regular season games against Western Michigan in the state, going 1-2 in the state of Michigan.

NO. 19 BYU FALLS TO NO. 10 UCLA

PASADENA, Calif. – Despite leading for much of the game, No. 19 BYU fell 24-23 to No. 19 UCLA on the road at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena.

The Cougars (2-1) led for all but the final 3:21 of the game as the Bruins (3-0) found the end zone twice in the final quarter of the game.

Pacing the offense for BYU was senior running back Adam Hiné who carried the ball 23 times for a career-best 149 yards and one touchdown. Quarterback Tanner Mangum went 30 of 47 for 244 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Wide receiver Mitch Mathews led the team with 84 yards on nine catches and one score.

Junior linebacker Harvey Langi led the defensive effort for BYU with two interceptions, one pass breakup and eight tackles, including seven solo stops. His two picks were the first of his career. He also carried the ball two times for eight yards. Junior defensive back Kai Nacua contributed with one interception, two pass breakups and four tackles.

BYU PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

· Adam Hine RB (Sr.)

Hine carried the BYU run game with a career-best 149 rushing yards on 23 carries. He scored one touchdown and had a highllight-reel hurdle of a UCLA defender for extra yardage.

• Tanner Mangum QB (Fr.)

In his second career start, the freshman completed 30 of 47 passes for 244 yards, one touchdown and one interception. He set new career-bests in completions and attempts. He also had a pass deflected back into his hands for a 4-yard reception to himself.

Harvey Langi LB (Jr.)

Langi had a career day. He led the team with eight tackles including seven solo stops. He also nabbed two interceptions in the first half. Langi also saw action on offense, running the ball twice, converting two crucial third downs for the Cougars for eight yards.

• Mitch Mathews WR (Sr.)

Mathews led BYU with nine receptions for 87 yards and one touchdown. He extended his streak to 27 consecutive games with a reception.

• Kai Nacua DB (Jr.)

Nacua continued to be a ball hawk for the Cougars, picking up his fourth interception of the year in the end zone to stop a UCLA drive just before half. He also accounted for four tackles and two pass breakups.

Trevor Samson PK (Sr.)

Samson connected on all three field goals from distances of 40, 45 and 32. He has now made nine consecutive field goals. He also made all his PATs.



MICHIGAN WINS SECOND STRAIGHT

ANN ARBOR, Mich. -- For the second consecutive game, the University of Michigan football team used a strong rushing attack (254 yards, three touchdowns) and a stout defense and raced past UNLV, 28-7, on Saturday (Sept. 19) inside Michigan Stadium. Junior running back Ty Isaac led the ground game, totaling 114 yards on eight carries, including a 76-yard touchdown run in the second quarter.

The Michigan defense allowed only 235 yards of total offense -- 124 of which came in the fourth quarter after UNLV trailed 28-0 -- to go along with nine tackles-for-loss (including two sacks), five pass break-ups and two interceptions. Senior linebacker Joe Bolden led the team with six tackles.

Graduate student quarterback Jake Rudock went 14-of-22 for 123 yards and a touchdown. His favorite target on the afternoon was senior wide receiver Amara Darboh, who caught four passes for 34 yards.

MICHIGAN PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

• Ty Isaac RB (Jr.)

Isaac paced the Wolverines with 114 rushing yards on just eight carries against UNLV. He ran for one touchdown and had a long run of 76 yards.

DeVeon Smith RB (Jr.)

Smith had just 34 yards against UNLV but leads Michigan on the season with 206 rushing yards on 53 carries. He has three touchdowns. Smith has four receptions for 35 yards and receiving touchdown.

Jake Rudock QB (Sr.)

Rudock completed 14 of 22 passes for 123 yards and one touchdown with one interception. He also carried the ball three times for 15 yards.

· Joe Bolden LB (Sr.)

Bolden led the Wolverines with six total tackles against the rebels. He posted three solo tackles in the 28-7 win over UNLV.

· Jabrill Peppers S (So.)

The returner had kick return for 31 yards and one punt return for 24 yards. He is averaging 26.0 yards per kick return this season and 9.5 yards per punt return.

Amara Darboh WR (Sr.)

Darboh had four receptions for 34 yards to lead Michigan's receivers against UNLV. On the year he has 16 catches for 185 yards and one touchdown.

2015 BYU FOOTBALL TEAM NOTES-5

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR FIVE

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from 10 states and six conferences, including the American Athletic, Big Ten, Pac-12, Mountain West and SEC. BYU has four games scheduled against current Power 5 teams and seven against teams from the Group of 5 conferences. The 12 teams on the schedule had a record of 92-53 in 2014, with eight teams coming off bowl games in 2014.

The Cougars will play six home games, five road contests and one neutral site game in 2015. The home schedule consists of Boise State, UConn, East Carolina, Cincinnati, Wagner and Fresno State. The teams on the home schedule put together a record of 44-23, with four teams reaching bowl games in 2014. The road swing includes a big September with Nebraska, UCLA and Michigan. The Cougars visit San Jose State and Utah State with a game against Missouri at the Kansas City Chief's stadium in Kansas City, Mo. The road and neutral opponents combined for a 48-30 record in 2014, with four bowl games.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accomodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 85,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 417 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

81 members of the 2015 team have served church missions. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before six games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with coach Bronco Mendenhall.

BYU OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

The Cougar offense rolled up 26 first downs against UCLA. The 26 first downs are the most in the 2015 season. BYU is averaging 21 first downs per game.

Tanner Mangum completed a career-best 30 passes at UCLA. His 30 completions are the most by a BYU freshman quarterback.

BYU is ranked No. 20 in time of possession. Against UCLA, BYU held the ball for 40:37, the first time since 2010 that BYU has held the ball for over 40 minutes. North Carolina State leads the FBS in time of possession with 40:36.

The Cougars have gone for it on fourth down eight times this season, converting four of them. On two of the four conversions, BYU has scored game-winning touchdowns.

BYU's 405 yards against the Bruins defense was the most yardage UCLA has given up this season. BYU's 244 passing yards also totaled the most the Bruins have given up this year.

THE BYU OFFENSE

- SCORING IN EVERY QUARTER. BYU scored in every quarter of a game for the first time this year. BYU picked up 7 in the first quarter against UCLA, 3 in the second, 7 in the third and 6 in the fourth. On the season, BYU has scored 21 in the first, 20 in the second, 14 in the third and 36 in he fourth. BYU's average of 12.0 points per game in the fourth quarter is No. 19 nationally.
- RUN GAME. BYU got its running game going against the Bruins, rushing for 161 yards, 149 coming from senior running back Adam Hine. Hine's 149 set a career best along with his 23 carries. He also scored one rushing touchdown against UCLA. He is BYU's only running back to find the end zone this season. Other rushing touchdowns have come from quarterbacks Taysom Hill (2) and Tanner Mangum (1).
- MITCH AND MITCHELL BYU's pair of receivers both named Mitch have been go-to targets in the first three games. Mitch Mathews has 185 receiving yards on 17 receptions with three touchdowns. Mitchell Juergens leads with 244 receiving yards on 13 receptions and two touchdowns. Mathews has a long reception of 42 yards while Juergens doubled that with a long of 84 yards.
- TOUCHDOWN MITCH. BYU quarterbacks seem to favor some kind of Mitch when looking for the end zone. All five of BYU's touchdown receptions have gone to either Mitch Mathews (3) or Mitchell Juergens (2)
- THE BIG THREE. BYU's receiving combination of Mitch Mathews, Nick Kurtz and Terenn Houk stands at 6-foot-6, 6-foot-5 and 6-foot-4. The three big receivers accounted for 38 receptions, 525 yards and three touchdowns.
- **OFFENSIVE LINE.** BYU returns an experienced offensive line for 2015. The five projected starters for BYU have logged 79 starts between them and have played in 102 games. Offensive tackle Ryker Mathews has the most games under his belt with 25 starts in 36 games played.

THE BYU DEFENSE

• Third Down. BYU held UCLA to 1 of 9 on third-down conversions, including 0 for 5 in the first half. In two of three games in 2015, the Cougars have held opponents to a third-down conversion rate of under 20 percent. BYU held opposing offenses to under 20 percent in only two games in 2014 (vs. Savannah St. & Texas).

• 3 and out. The BYU defense has held opponents to three and out in 18 out of 41 tries this season, averaging 6.0 times per game holding opponents to four downs or less per possession. The Cougars are tied for No. 11 in the country along with Temple, TCU, Oklahoma State and Arizona.

• Top 25 rankings. In the past 10 seasons, BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in various national statistical categories 65 times on defense. In 2015, BYU is ranked in the top 25 in turnovers gained and opponent thirddown conversion percentage.

• Staying Positive. BYU is 51-8 under Bronco Mendenhall with a positive turnover margin. The Cougars forced three interceptions to UCLA's one.

• Picks. The Cougars have picked off opponents three times per game in the past three out of four games dating back to the bowl game in 2014. The last time BYU had consecutive games with least three interceptions was in 2010 when the defense intercepted at least three in three straight games against New Mexico, Utah

• Getting Behind the Line. BYU has recorded seven tackles for loss and at least three sacks in its first two games this season. In 2014, the Cougars were 4-0 when notching at least three sacks in a game. Since 2005, BYU is 43-2 when notching three or more sacks in a single game.

Entering his eleventh season as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored the Cougars' reputation as one of the nation's top college football programs. Taking over a BYU team that in 2005 was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to 10 straight bowl appearances, two outright conference championships before football independence in 2011, and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under Mendenhall's leadership, BYU has earned a 90-39 record to rank 13th in total wins among all FBS teams since 2005 prior

to the start of 2015. Mendenhall also ranks 13th in winning percentage at .698 among active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience in the same time period.

The Cougars finished the 2014 season with an 8-5 record that included a 3-0 mark against Power 5 conference schools. Fueled by Heisman hopeful Taysom Hill, BYU won its first four games including a 41-7 win over then-No. 25 Texas. BYU then overcame a rash of midseason injuries to key players to finish the season with a 10th consecutive bowl game. The Cougars set a program record with four consecutive bowl wins from 2009-12, helping Mendenhall become the first BYU head coach to win six bowls in a seven-year span. The Cougars received nine straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowl bids under Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first 10 teams to a bowl game, and is winning at the same pace as the legendary Edwards. Through his 129 games as BYU head coach, Mendenhall has a record of 90-39-similar to Edwards' 129-game mark of 93-35-1.

In 2006, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year following an 11-2 season. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

He has also served as the defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. BYU has consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses under Mendenhall's direction. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone, averaging a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense over the past eight of nine seasons, including three top-10 ratings. In 2012, the Cougars featured one of the greatest defenses in school history, allowing just 266.1 yards, including 86.9 rushing yards, and 14.0 points per game. Ranked No. 3 in total defense, No. 3 in scoring defense and No. 2 in rushing defense, the Mendenhall-coached unit held its first six opponents under 300 total yards (part of a streak of 12 consecutive such games dating back to 2011) and kept opposing offenses without a touchdown six times during the year. Adjusting to the team's up-tempo offense in 2013, BYU's defense ranked No. 12 in yards per play allowed despite defending more plays than all but four teams nationally. Only two teams that defended as many plays ranked better than the Cougars at defending their turf.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only four programs have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. In addition, BYU tops all FBS programs for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career) since

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the Ethics Committee. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State, then went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in 2003.
