BYU STORYLINES

- SERIES HISTORY. BYU and Michigan State are meeting for the first time in the history of the two programs.
- BIG TEN. BYU is facing an opponent from the Big Ten, marking the fourth different conference BYU has faced in 2016. The team has already played games against the Pac-12, Big 12 and MAC. The Cougars are currently 4-8-1 against the Big Ten. Last year BYU split two games with the league, defeating Nebraska in the season opener and losing to Michigan.
- DANTONIO AGAINST BYU. MSU head coach Mark Dantonio has never faced BYU as a head coach but was the defensive secondary coach of the Kansas team that defeated BYU 23-20 in the 1992 Aloha Bowl.
- SAGARIN RANKINGS. USA Today's Jeff Sagarin ranks BYU's 2016 schedule the 7th toughest to date. The six teams ahead of BYU and their respective records are (1) Oklahoma 2-2, (2) Stanford 3-2, (3) Florida State 3-2, (4) USC 2-3, (5) Ole Miss 3-2 and (6) Georgia 3-2.
- JAMAAL WILLIAMS. Jamaal Williams set the school single-game record with 286 rushing yards against Toledo and tied another with five touchdowns. His 286 yards are the most by any player in the NCAA this year. He was named the College Football Performance Awards National Performer of the Week along with the College Sports Madness Independent Player of the Week. His 703 total rushing yards are No. 2 nationally.

NO. 17 SPARTANS DROP OVERTIME CONTEST TO INDIANA, 24-21

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (AP) Tyler O'Connor threw for 263 yards and three touchdowns Saturday night as the Spartans fell to Indiana in overtime 24-21.

Indiana quarterback Richard Lagow caught a touchdown pass, threw for two more and took advantage of a second chance in overtime to set up Griffin Oakes for a 20-yard field goal.

The Hoosiers (3-1, 1-0 Big Ten) trailed 14-0 late in the third quarter before Lagow's 5-yard TD catch on third-and-goal finally helped the Hoosiers turn the corner.

Indiana ended a seven-game losing streak in the series, reclaimed the Old Brass Spittoon for the first time since 2006, beat a ranked team at home for the first time in a decade and earned their first overtime win since 2010.

"Great drive at the end of the game to tie it up, but not very good in overtime - that's for sure," coach Mark Dantonio said. "We were sacked twice, we jump over the pile. Very disappointed. Now we have to claw our way back into things."

Michigan State kicker Michael Geiger missed 49-yard field goal to start overtime, and Oakes missed a 33-yard field goal on the ensuing possession when Michigan State's Drake Martinez was called for leaping to give Indiana a first down.

Michigan State (2-2, 0-2) has lost back-to-back games for the first time since November 2012 despite holding the usually high-scoring Hoosiers scoreless until the final minute of the third guarter.

The Spartans controlled the game most of the night until receiver Mitchell Paige threw a perfect pass across the field to Lagow for a 5-yard score in the final minute of the third quarter.

Lagow tied it with a 22-yard TD pass to Ricky Jones midway through the fourth quarter. Indiana took the lead with Lagow's 15-yard TD pass to Paige with 4:38 to play.

O'Connor answered with a 2-yard TD pass to Josiah Price with 11 seconds left.

2016 BYU FOOTBALL **TEAM NOTES-4**

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR SIX

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from eight different conferences and an independent team. Six games come against Power Five opponents, including teams from the Pac-12, Big 12, Big Ten and SEC. The schedule ranks No. 7 in Phil Steele's preseason schedule rankings. The opponents on the 2016 schedule posted a 97-57 record in 2015, with 10 bowl teams and an FCS playoff team.

The Cougars host six home games and have four true road contests with two neutral site games, both at NFL stadiums, in 2016. The home schedule consists of UCLA, Toledo, Mississippi State, Southern Utah, UMass and Utah State. Teams on the home schedule put together a 44-31 record in 2015, with four reaching bowl games and Southern Utah earned an FCS playoff berth. Road contests include Utah, Michigan State, Boise State and Cincinnati with neutral site games against Arizona (University of Phoenix Stadium - home of the Arizona Cardinals) and West Virginia (FedEx Field - home of the Washington Redskins). All six games away from home are against 2015 bowl teams with a combined record of 53-16 last year.

BOWLING OPPONENTS

Of BYU's 12 opponents in 2016, 10 played in a bowl game in 2015. Only USC has more bowl teams on its 2016 schedule with 11. BYU, along with just Ole Miss and Colorado are the only three teams with 10 bowl teams on the schedule this season.

TEAM CAPTAINS

BYU will have four captains for the 2016 season in senior quarterback Taysom Hill, senior running back Jamaal Williams, senior defensive back Kai Nacua and senior defensive lineman Harvey Langi. Hill is serving as a captain for the third time. BYU offensive coordinator Ty Detmer was also a three-time team captain (89, 90, 91).

FLAG BEARERS

BYU's tradition of carrying team flags out of the tunnel adds some new looks for 2016. A United States serviceman will carry an American flag for every game, with team flags carried by selected players and alumni flags carried by former BYU players for each game.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 63,470 after various refurbishments. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands. BYU's record at LaVell Edwards Stadium is ranked No. 12 among teams playing in their current stadium.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 150 nations speaking more than 160 languages. Over 74,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 418 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours - seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples) - teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

The 2016 team has 84 players that served church missions and there are another 27 currently serving. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

ALUMNI FIRESIDES

Former members of the BYU football team will produce firesides, or devotionals at local LDS churches the night before select road games during the 2016 season. Firesides are open to the public. Additional firesides may be announced. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. POLYNESIAN PIPELINE

The Polynesian Islands have become a hotbed for recuiting in recent years, but BYU has been one of the pioneers in bringing these players from Tonga, Samoa, the Hawaiian Islands and all of Polynesia to the forefront of college football since the early 1950s. More than 40 members of the current roster are of Polynesian descent.

Some of BYU's most celebrated and decorated players have come from the Pacific islands, including All-Americans, national record holders, players who have gone on to compete in the NFL and now, several members of BYU's current coaching and support staff.

Kalani Sitake was named BYU's 14th head coach on Dec. 19, 2015, becoming the first Tongan head football coach in the NCAA. Sitake was raised in Laie, Hawaii and later moved to the mainland. His staff includes Polynesians Ilaisa Tuiaki, Steve Kaufusi, Reno Mahe, Nu'u Tafisi, Russell Tialavea, Tevita Ofahengaue, Jack Damuni, Jasen Ah You, Sione Kinikini, Vince Feula and Harvey Unga.

LAST GAME RECAP: ALMOND KICKS GAME-WINNER, WILLIAMS HAS RECORD NIGHT IN 55-53 WIN OVER TOLEDO

PROVO, Utah - Rhett Almond kicked a 19-yard field goal as time expired and Jamaal Williams had a career night to give BYU a 55-53 win over Toledo Friday night at LaVell

Williams broke the BYU (2-3) single-game rushing record with 286 yards on the ground and had five rushing touchdowns to tie a school record. The previous single-game rushing record, held by Eldon Fortie, was set in 1962

A Toledo (3-1) touchdown and two-point conversion with 1:11 on the game clock gave the Rockets a 53-52 lead and set up Taysom Hill, Williams and the Cougar offense up for its game-winning drive. Almond's kick went right down the middle to give BYU the win.

After a high scoring first guarter, BYU led 21-14 but Toledo tied it up at 21-21 before halftime.

The third quarter was similar to the first, as both teams scored multiple times. The Rockets connected on two touchdown passes and made a field goal. BYU found the end zone twice, as Williams rumbled for touchdowns from 48 and 62 yards out.

Three quarters through, Williams had his first career game with four rushing touchdowns. The Cougars trailed 38-35 heading into the fourth quarter.

Early in the fourth quarter, Squally Canada scored his first BYU touchdown on a 17-yard rush. That gave the Cougars a 42-38 lead with 13:20 on the clock.

Toledo responded with a 75-yard touchdown pass from Woodside to Cody Thompson. With 10:57 left, it put the Rockets up 45-42.

Rhett Almond squared the score at 45-45 with a 32-yard field goal for BYU with 5:21 left in the game.

On the following drive, Kai Nacua intercepted a pass from Woodside returned it 20 yards to the Rocket 21-yard line. It was Nacua's fourth interception on the season and the 12th of his career.

Williams punched in his fifth touchdown of the night and broke Fortie's record with three minutes left in the game. His 14-vard carry gave BYU a 52-45 lead.

That set up the Toledo drive, with Woodside connecting with Kareem Hunt for a seven-yard touchdown and Michael Roberts for the two-point conversion to make it 53-52 with just over a minute to go

On the Cougars' final drive Hill completed a 33-yard pass to Colby Pearson and ran for 11 yards as part of eight plays and 71 yards that set up Almond's game-winner.

BYU OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

BYU is one of just seven teams that are still perfect in the blue zone. BYU is 18 of 18 on scoring chances inside the 20s. Last year BYU finished 4th nationally at 94.34 percent.

BYU has six rushing plays of 30 or more yards this season, tied for 13th nationally. That number includes three runs of 40+, two of 50+ and one of 60+.

Jamaal Williams 286 rushing yards not only set a school record but they were the most by any player in the NCAA this season.

In the last two games BYU has averaged 553.5 yards of total offense and 43.5 points per game. The previous three games the Cougars managed just 339.7 yards and 17.0 points.

BYU is averaging 30:24 in its time of possession through five games. The Cougars have not averaged above 30 minutes of possession time since 2012.

- TAG TEAM, BACK AGAIN. In 2013 when both played a full season, Taysom Hill (1,344) and Jamaal Williams (1,233) combined for 2,577 rushing yards. Through four games, the pair has combined for 931 yards (703 for Williams and 228 for Hill). They both rushed for 100 yards in the same game (West Virginia-Williams 169, Hill 105) for the first time since Sept. 11, 2014 against Houston. Hill ran for 160 and Williams ran for 139 in a 33-25 win. BYU is 4-1 when the two go for at least 100 each.
- AT LEAST 100 FOR JAMAAL. Jamaal Williams notched his 13th game with at least 100 rushing yards against the Rockets. BYU is 10-3 when he goes for at least 100.
- SCORING BY QUARTER. BYU has scored 34 points in the first quarter, 22 in the second, 27 in the third and 55 in the fourth quarter this season. Averaging 11.0 points in the 4th quarter ranks 16th in the FBS. Last year, BYU was one of the best 4th-quarter teams nationally (4) scoring an average of 10.8 points in the 4th quarter.
- SPREADING IT AROUND. BYU has connected with 14 different receivers in 2016. Nick Kurtz is the only receiver to lead in receptions two different times with eight and six catches against UCLA and West Virginia, respectively. Jonah Trinnaman led with six against Arizona, Mitchell Juergens had eight at Utah and Tanner Balderree had three vs. Toledo.

DEFENSIVE NOTES-10 2016 BYU FOOTBALL

BYU DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

Kai Nacua is ranked first in the NCAA in total interceptions with four. Nacua has 12 career interceptions, the most by a BYU player since 2000 (official defensive statistics recorded by NCAA).

Butch Pau'u is ranked 13th in the nation in tackles per game with 10.5. He notched a career-high 19 tacles against UCLA.

The Cougars are ranked fourth in the nation in turnovers gained (13) and passes intercepted (9). Seven of BYU's turnovers gained have come from interceptions.

In the first three games this season, the BYU defense has held its opponents to 20 points or less (16, 20, 17). The last time a BYU team accomplished this was in 1984 (14, 13, 15). The 1984 team held its first five opponents to 20 points or less.

The defense held UCLA to just 50 rushing yards, the fewest of the season for a BYU opponent. The last time BYU held the opponents to less than 50 was against Mizzou last season when the Tigers had just 46 rushing yards.

THE BYU DEFENSE

• SCORING DEFENSE. BYU held its first three opponents to 20 points or less in each game (16, 20, 17). The last time a BYU team has accomplished this was in 1984 (14, 13, 15). The 1984 team held its first five opponents to 20 points or less. In 2015, the Cougars were able to hold teams to 20 or less five times.

- TFL. The Cougars notched at least six tackles for a loss in 12 out of 13 games in 2015 and have 31 total so far in the 2016 season, including a season-high of eight against UCLA. BYU has not had less than four tackles for a loss in a game so far this season. Last season, the Cougars ranked No. 9 nationally with 7.5 tackles for loss per
- STAYING POSITIVE. BYU is 57-9 since 2005 with a positive turnover margin. BYU was plus-2 with two picks against Arizona and Toledo and plus-3 with three picks and three fumble recoveries against Utah. The Cougars recorded a positive turnover margin in seven games in 2015.
- NEW FACES, NEW PLACES. A number of players have shuffled positions with the coaching change to Kalani Sitake. Notable changes include several linebackers transitioning to defensive line positions with more 4-3 elements in the defensive scheme including Harvey Langi moving from mostly playing middle linebacker to defensive end. Two offensive players of note jumped to defense, including Francis Bernard moving from running back to linebacker and Akile Davis moving from receiver to cornerback. Micah Hannemann, the starting field corner in 2015 also moved into the middle at one of the safety positions.

The BYU kickoff return defense held strong against Toledo. The Cougars held the Rockets to an average of 13.33 per return on seven total returns.

The distance of BYU kicker Rhett Almond's game-winner for BYU against Toledo. The sophomore is now 5 for 5 on field goals in 2016 along with 11 for 12 on PATs.

BYU punter Jonny Linehan kicked his furthest punt of the season against Toledo with a 58-yarder. Linehan's highest-volume punting game came against UCLA when he punted nine times for 411 yards with three inside the 20.

The Cougars made 82.4 percent of their field goals in 2015, tied for 25th in the nation. BYU is 8 of 9 on field goals so far in 2016.

Kalani Sitake (pronounced kah-lah-nee see-tah-kay) was named head coach overseeing the BYU football program on December 19, 2015, by director of athletics Tom Holmoe.

Sitake is the 14th head coach in BYU history. He comes to BYU from Oregon State, where he served as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator.

A former Cougar running back (1994, 1997-2000), Sitake returns to his alma mater with 15 years of coaching experience, including seven years a defensive coordinator and four seasons as an assistant head coach.

Prior to serving as assistant head coach and defensive coordinator at Oregon State in 2015, Sitake spent 10 seasons at the University of Utah. He started at Utah in 2005 as the linebackers coach and was promoted to defensive coordinator in 2009 before also being named assistant head coach in 2012.

Sitake has coached several Pac-12 and Mountain West Conference honorees, including Morris Trophy winners Star Lotulelei (2011) and Nate Orchard (2014). He also helped mentor 14 NFL Draft picks during his time at Utah, including 12 all-league players and three freshmen All-Americans. He helped the Utes win seven of eight bowl games during his tenure.

Sitake began his coaching career in 2001 as the defensive backs and special teams coach at Eastern Arizona before becoming a defensive graduate assistant at BYU in 2002. Sitake then joined the staff at Southern Utah where he coached running backs, tight ends and offensive line during the 2003 and 2004 seasons.

Born in Nuku'alofa, Tonga, and raised in Laie, Hawai'i and Provo, Utah, Sitake becomes the first FBS head football coach of Tongan descent. He is the 14th head coach in BYU history, and just the fourth since 1972, when Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards took over the program.

Sitake began his BYU playing career in 1994 prior to serving a two-year mission for The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints to Oakland, California. After returning and redshirting in 1997, Sitake was a three-year starter at fullback for the Cougars from 1998-2000 under Edwards.

He was named BYU's Football Scholar Athlete of the Year in 1998, Impact Player of the Year in 1999, along with team captain and the most valuable running back in 2000. He signed a free agent contract with the Cincinnati Bengals in 2001, but was forced to retire due to an injury.

Sitake graduated from BYU in 2000 with a bachelor's degree in English. He and his wife Timberly have three children, Skye, Sadie and Kelaokalani (KK).
