## BYU STORYLINES

- BIG WINNERS.** Both BYU and Nebraska are amongst the top in college football when it comes to total wins in the last 40 seasons. Nebraska ranks No. 1 since 1975 with 389 wins and BYU is No. 5 at 354.
- SEASON OPENERS.** The Cougars are 56-32-2 in season openers since 1922. Opening in true road games, BYU has gone 22-20-1 on the road. Under Mendenhall, the Cougars are 2-2 playing their opener in someone else's house.
- MENDENHALL IN SEASON OPENERS.** BYU opens the 2015 season against a current Power 5 team for the ninth time in 11 years under Mendenhall. The Cougars have matched up against Boston College, Arizona, Oklahoma, Washington, Ole Miss, Washington State and Virginia. BYU is 5-3 in openers against Power 5 teams under Mendenhall and 7-3 overall in openers.
- BYU VS. BIG TEN.** BYU has played six teams from the current Big Ten in its history. The team has gone 3-7-1 in those games, with just three of them coming in the regular season and not in a bowl matchup. BYU has never played the Cornhuskers.
- UNFAMILIAR FAMILIARITY.** Despite this being the first meeting between BYU and Nebraska, the two head coaches are familiar with each other. Though they didn't work together, both spent significant time as coaches at Oregon State. The two have faced off as head coaches three times. BYU holds a 2-1 advantage over Riley while at OSU. The Cougars topped the Beavers 44-20 in the 2009 Las Vegas Bowl and again in 2011 in Corvallis 38-28. OSU won the last meeting 42-24 in Provo in 2012.

**POSTGAME MEDIA AVAILABILITY**

After home games, postgame press conference will be conducted in the LaVell Edwards Stadium press room, located on the southeast end of the stadium next to the BYU locker room. At the discretion of the visiting team, opponent interviews will be conducted in the Blue Zone, near the opponent's locker room located on northwest end of the stadium. Coach Mendenhall and select players will be available following the NCAA mandatory cooling off period. Members of the media are invited to move from the press box down to the field and to the press room four minutes prior to the ending of the game. A direct video feed will also be sent to the press box from the BYU postgame press conference. A basic transcript of Mendenhall's comments from the postgame press conference will be provided. For road games, BYU will conduct interviews outside the locker room or in a location designated by the host school.

**BYU IN 2014**

BYU football achieved a 3-0 record against Power 5 conference schools and overcame a rash of midseason injuries to key players to finish the regular season with four-straight wins and an 8-5 record after a 10th-straight bowl appearance. In doing so, BYU became one of only 12 programs to earn a bowl invitation each of the last 10 years.

The Cougars scored more points in 2014 than they had since 2001. BYU also finished No. 14 in the nation scoring offense (37.1 points/game), No. 26 in total offense (460.5 yards/game), No. 15 in first downs (325), No. 20 in rushing defense (121.8 yards allowed/game) and No. 10 in net punting (41.19).

BYU finished a third straight season at 8-5 and had 10 players selected to the All-Independent Team, including returning players Mitch Mathews, Tejan Koroma, Bronson Kaufusi, Trevor Samson and Adam Hine. Koroma also earned five Freshman All-America awards.

**BYU 2014 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS**

**• Christian Stewart QB (Graduated)**

Stewart stepped into the starting role after Hill's injury in the middle of game five. He threw for 2,621 yards and 25 touchdowns in his eight and a half games as BYU's signal caller. Stewart threw for at least three touchdowns in six of his eight starts. He threw for a career-best five in a thrilling 42-35 win at Cal to conclude the regular season.

**• Mitch Mathews WR (Sr.)**

Mathews came up just shy of 1,000 yards with 922 on 73 receptions and nine touchdowns. He had four 100-yard games and caught at least one touchdown in seven games. Mathews has caught a pass in 24 consecutive games.

**• Jordan Leslie WR (NFL Free Agency)**

Leslie was the No. 2 receiver for BYU in just his one year on the team, accounting for 779 receiving yards on 55 catches. He snagged six touchdowns and caught at least one pass in all 13 games. He went over 100 yards receiving twice, including a season-best 155 and two touchdowns at Cal.

**• Bronson Kaufusi DL (Sr.)**

Led BYU defense with 11.5 tackles for loss and 7.0 sacks in 2014. He posted multi-sack games against Connecticut and UNLV. Kaufusi also posted seven quarterback hurries and six pass breakups. He recovered a fumble in the season opener at Connecticut and forced another vs. Memphis in the bowl game.



**NEBRASKA IN 2014**

Nebraska won at least nine games for the seventh consecutive year in 2014 after going 9-4. The Huskers lost a 45-42 shootout battle to the USC Trojans in the Holiday Bowl.

Nebraska started the season hot, winning its first five games and finished 5-3 in conference play.

The Husker offense was one of the top units in the Big Ten and in the country, rolling up 37.8 points per game and 452.3 yards per game. Running back Ameer Abdullah ran for over 1,600 yards and 18 touchdowns en route to finishing his career as Nebraska's No. 2 rusher in school history. Abdullah was one of 10 winners of the Lowe's Senior Class Award.

Nebraska had 10 players named to the All-Big Ten Team and nine more honorable mentions. The Huskers also had 21 All-Academic Big Ten selections.

**NEB. 2014 PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS**

**• Ameer Abdullah RB (NFL Draft)**

Abdullah was named a Second Team All-American by Walter Camp, CBS, Scout, Athlon, AP and Sports Illustrated after rushing for 1,611 yards and 19 touchdowns. He completed his Nebraska career as the only player to record three consecutive 1,000 yard seasons. Abdullah was drafted by the Detroit Lions in the second round of the NFL Draft.

**• Tommy Armstrong QB (Jr.)**

Armstrong led the Husker offense with 3,400 yards of total offense. He threw 22 touchdowns, rushed for 705 yards and scored six rushing touchdowns. In the Holiday Bowl vs. USC, Armstrong posted career highs in passing yards (381), completions (32), attempts (51) and total offense (422) - all bowl records for Nebraska as well.

**• Jordan Westerkamp WR (Jr.)**

Westerkamp started nine games and was second on the team with 44 receptions for 747 yards and five touchdowns. He made at least three catches seven times and had 100-yard receiving games against Florida Atlantic and Michigan State. He was an academic All-Big Ten selection in 2013 and 2014.

**• Maliek Collins DT (Jr.)**

Collins started every game in 2014 and led the Huskers in tackles for loss with 14, while ranking second on the team with 4.5 sacks and 13 quarterback hurries. Collins made 12 of his 14 TFL in Big Ten play or the bowl game and was at his best in the latter stages of the season, posting five or more tackles four times in the final six games.

**INDEPENDENCE: YEAR SIX**

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from 10 states and six conferences, including the American Athletic, Big Ten, Pac-12, Mountain West and SEC. BYU has four games scheduled against current Power 5 teams and seven against teams from the Group of 5 conferences. The 12 teams on the schedule had a record of 92-53 in 2014, with eight teams coming off bowl games in 2014.

The Cougars will play six home games, five road contests and one neutral site game in 2015. The home schedule consists of Boise State, UConn, East Carolina, Cincinnati, Wagner and Fresno State. The teams on the home schedule put together a record of 44-23, with four teams reaching bowl games in 2014. The road swing includes a big September with Nebraska, UCLA and Michigan. The Cougars visit San Jose State and Utah State with a game against Missouri at the Kansas City Chief's stadium in Kansas City, Mo. The road and neutral opponents combined for a 48-30 record in 2014, with four bowl games.

**FLAG BEARERS**

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

**TEAM CAPTAINS**

Selected by their teammates, senior quarterback Taysom Hill and senior defensive end Bronson Kaufusi will serve as team captains for the 2015 season.

**LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM**

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accommodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

**MISSIONS**

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 85,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 406 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

91 members of the 2015 team have served church missions. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

**FIRESIDES**

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before six games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with coach Bronco Mendenhall.

**THE BYU OFFENSE**

• **PICKING UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF.** Coming off a season-ending injury, quarterback Taysom Hill is back under center for the Cougars. In the first four games for BYU of 2014, Hill was averaging 326 yards of total offense and responsible for 3.3 touchdowns per game. He was completing 66.7 percent of his passes before injury.

• **SCORING IN THE OPENER.** The Cougars have averaged 20.9 points in the season opener for the last 10 seasons under Bronco Mendenhall. In 8 out of the last 10 seasons, BYU has opened against a Power 5 team. The Cougars scored 35 in last year's opener against UConn.

• **MOVING THE CHAINS** BYU's offense averaged 25.0 first downs per game, tying for No. 12 in the nation.

• **TOTAL OFFENSE.** The offense averaged 460.5 yards per game in 2014, good for No. 28 nationally. BYU topped 500 total yards five times in the season, and posted 601 yards of total offense against Nevada for a season high.

• **TWIN TOWERS.** The wide receiver duo of Mitch Mathews and Nick Kurtz should be a force to be reckoned with. At 6-foot-6, Mathews was the top receiver in 2014 after accounting for 922 yards on 73 catches and nine touchdowns. Kurtz, at 6-foot-5, was one of the top junior college transfers is ready to go after sitting out last year with an injury. He grabbed 18 touchdowns and totaled 1,301 yards at Grossmont College. The two big wideouts are expected to be a matchup nightmare for opposing secondaries.

• **OFFENSIVE LINE EXPERIENCE.** BYU returns an experienced offensive line for 2015. The five projected starters for BYU have logged 68 starts between them and have played in 95 games. Offensive tackle Ryker Mathews has the most games under his belt with 22 starts in 33 games played.

• **ROAD WARRIORS.** BYU put up its best road scoring average since the 2009 season with 33.2 points per game in six road games in 2014. The 2009 squad put in 40.2 points per game.

**THE BYU DEFENSE**

- **BYU's run defense has been dominant.** At 121.8 rushing yards allowed per game, BYU ranked No. 20 in the country in 2014.
- **In the past 10 seasons, BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in various national statistical categories 65 times on defense.** BYU ranked in the top 25 in defensive rushing yards per game, opponent rushing yards per attempt, total opponent yards per play and total pass breakups.
- **Lengthening the field.** The Cougars allowed 40 rushing plays of 10 or more yards last season, ranking them in a tie at No. 2 in the nation with East Carolina and Oklahoma. For the 2013 season, BYU allowed opponents 54 run plays of 10 yards or more to rank No. 26 in the country.

**BRONCO MENDENHALL****HEAD COACH****YEARS AT BYU**

11th year as head coach, 13th at BYU

Entering his eleventh season as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored the Cougars' reputation as one of the nation's top college football programs. Taking over a BYU team that in 2005 was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to 10 straight bowl appearances, two outright conference championships before football independence in 2011, and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under Mendenhall's leadership, BYU has earned a 90-39 record to rank 13th in total wins among all FBS teams since 2005. Mendenhall also ranks 13th in winning percentage at .698 among active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience.

The Cougars finished the 2014 season with an 8-5 record that included a 3-0 mark against Power 5 conference schools. Fueled by Heisman hopeful Taysom Hill, BYU won its first four games including a 41-7 win over then-No. 25 Texas. BYU then overcame a rash of mid-season injuries to key players to finish the season with a 10th consecutive bowl game. In doing so, the Cougars became one of 12 programs to earn a bowl invitation in each of the last 10 years. Only Florida State (7) has achieved more than BYU's six bowl victories over that timeframe.

The Cougars set a program record with four consecutive bowl wins from 2009-12, helping Mendenhall become the first BYU head coach to win six bowls in a seven-year span. The Cougars received nine straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowl bids under Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first 10 teams to a bowl game, and is winning at the same pace as the legendary Edwards. Through his 129 games as BYU head coach, Mendenhall has a record of 90-39—similar to Edwards' 129-game mark of 93-35-1.

In 2006, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year following an 11-2 season. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

He has also served as the defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. BYU has consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses under Mendenhall's direction. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone, averaging a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense over the past eight of nine seasons, including three top-10 ratings. In 2012, the Cougars featured one of the greatest defenses in school history, allowing just 266.1 yards, including 86.9 rushing yards, and 14.0 points per game. Ranked No. 3 in total defense, No. 3 in scoring defense and No. 2 in rushing defense, the Mendenhall-coached unit held its first six opponents under 300 total yards (part of a streak of 12 consecutive such games dating back to 2011) and kept opposing offenses without a touchdown six times during the year. Adjusting to the team's up-tempo offense in 2013, BYU's defense ranked No. 12 in yards per play allowed despite defending more plays than all but four teams nationally. Only two teams that defended as many plays ranked better than the Cougars at defending their turf.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only four programs have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. In addition, BYU tops all FBS programs for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career) since the program began in 2007.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the Ethics Committee. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State, then went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in 2003.
