Coach Mike Littlewood

Coach Mike Littlewood (BYU '93, played '85-'88) is in his fourth season as head coach at BYU, 32-21 (.604) in 2013; 22-31 (.415) in 2014 and 28-25 in 2015 for an 82-77 (.516) record with the Cougars. The 49-year-old coach had a 219-128 (.631) record in seven seasons at the four-year level at Dixie State College and had a 382-127 (.750) mark in 10 seasons when Dixie was a junior college. He is assisted by Trent Pratt (Dixie '08), Brent Haring (So. Virginia '07) and Jeremy Thomas (BYU '99), all in their fourth year at BYU.

Series Record vs. Portland

BYU leads the series vs. Portland, 17-11. The Cougars swept the three games at Portland to close the 2014 season. BYU won two of three from the Pilots in 2015, 2013 and 2009 during Portland's only visits to Provo. Other than at Portland, the two teams have played in San Jose and Fresno, Calif., Seattle and Spokane, Wash., and Lewiston, Idaho.

Hitting Streaks

Brennon Lund leads BYU with a current six-game hitting streak, followed by Keaton Kringlen at five, respectively. Colton Shaver had a 12-game hitting streak last week. Brennon Anderson had a 10-game hitting streak ended two weeks ago. Tanner Chauncey's hitting streak was ended at 17-games five weeks ago.

BYU in 2016 NCAA statistics

BYU remains No. 1 in the NCAA in scoring (9.5) and No. 2 in runs (219) and batting average (.342). The Cougars are No. 4 in hits (288) and slugging (.530), No. 5 in on-base percentage (.422) and No. 7 in doubles (58) and in week six of the 2016 NCAA rankings. Colton Shaver is ranked No. 5 in doubles (12), No. 7 in slugging (.826), No. 10 in on-base percentage (.548), No. 11 in batting average (.453) and No. 18 in hits (39) and runs (29).

BYU vs. WCC in 2016

Here are a couple of interesting baseball facts on the WCC. Pepperdine won the College World Series in 1992. Of the 10 WCC teams, only St. Mary's has not participated in the NCAA post-season tournament. BYU's 1-1 tie against Pepperdine came in the second game of a doubleheader in 1963. BYU's win-loss baseball records and last action against the current WCC team is:

Quick Look at BYU

BYU was picked to finish sixth in the West Coast Conference after placing seventh its third year in the league and second under Coach Mike Littlewood. The Cougars return 20 lettermen and lost 12 letterman for Littlewood's third season. Preseason WCC prognostications have BYU third (D1baseball .com) and fifth by Perfect Game.

At Home in Miller Park

The Cougars finished the 2015 home season with a 189-108 (.636) record at Larry H. Miller Field which seats 2,204 fans in its 14th season since it was built. In the first nine years BYU drew 218,981 fans for an average of 1,177 and 142,248 at night for an average of 1,452. Currently in 2016, BYU has drawn 15,814 fans in 12 games at Miller Park for an average of 1,318.

Lund Rawlings WCC Player of Week vs. Saint Louis

Brennon Lund was named the Rawlings West Coast Conference Player of the Week by the league office and by College Sports Madness for his performance in the first three games against Saint Louis University. Starting the season with three wins over Saint Louis University, Lund was 10-for-16 (.625) with three RBI, two doubles, one walk, one strikeout, one stolen base and 11 putouts (eight came in the 5-0 shutout) in the deepest center-field (433 feet) in the country for a minor league park at AAA Cashman Field, home of the 51s in Las Vegas.

Rucker WCC Pitcher of Week vs. Samford, Niagara

Michael Rucker of BYU was named the Rawlings West Coast Conference Pitcher of the Week at Samford and against Niagara. The junior right-hander struck out a Samford batter in each of his seven innings (four swinging) of the series-opening 7-1 win at previously undefeated Samford. Rucker retired Samford in order in the first, fourth and seventh innings to improve BYU's team record to 5-0. He struck out a career-high 10 batters in a 14-1 victory and had only one base on balls. He set Niagara down in order in the first, second, fourth and eighth innings. He recorded three called strikeouts in the fifth inning. Six of his 10 strikeouts were called.

Urry Sports Madness WCC Player of Week vs. Kansas

Outfielder Eric Urry has been named Madness West Coast Baseball Player of the Week for his exceptional performance during the past week's action. Urry raised his batting average from .233 to .295. Top 25 Teams

BYU played four nationally ranked teams last season, UC Santa Barbara, Nebraska, San Diego and upset No. 29 San Diego State. In 2014, the Cougars played two nationally ranked teams, No. 19 TCU and No. 26 Texas Tech. In 2013, BYU upset then No. 2 LSU (NCBWA, also No. 3 Collegiate Baseball & No. 10 Baseball America/USA Today), 9-4. Also in 2013, BYU twice upset No. 21 UC Irvine (NCBWA, also No. 21 Baseball America/USA Today & No. 22 Collegiate Baseball), 6-3 and 3-1; and BYU upset No. 22 Gonzaga (Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball). In 1983 prior to the NCAA Regionals BYU was ranked No. 1 after upsetting then No. 1 San Diego State in the WAC Playoffs. In 2012 BYU lost at No. 4 Arkansas and No. 7 Stanford. In 2011 BYU split at No. 6 Arizona State and lost three times to No. 3 TCU. In 2010 BYU beat No. 4 TCU once in six games and lost twice at No. 2 Arizona State. In 2009 BYU lost at No. 6 Baylor and No. 10 Kansas State and No. 10 TCU.

Baseball-Softball Combos at Miller Park

There are five head-to-head contests at Miller Park's unique back-to-back fields this year when both baseball and softball played at the same time. On April 8, 9 when softball hosts LMU and baseball hosts San Diego and on April 22, 23, when softball hosts Saint Mary's while baseball hosts Creighton.
