BYU STORYLINES

- 2-0. BYU is 2-0 for the fifth time under head coach Bronco Mendenhall. BYU's best start was 2008 when the Cougars started 6-0. BYU has won at least eight games every season under Mendenhall with a 2-0 start.
- UCLA SERIES. The last time the Cougars faced UCLA was a historic 59-0 win for BYU in Provo in 2008. The 59-point win would be the largest margin of victory for a non-Power 5 school over a Power-5 school. The Cougars are 3-7 against UCLA and most recently 2-1 under Mendenhall. In 2007 the teams faced off twice. During the regular season the Bruins beat the Cougars 27-17 in Pasadena and then BYU edged UCLA 17-16 in the Las Vegas Bowl.
- **TOP 10 TEAMS.** The last time BYU defeated a top-10 team was 2009 against No. 3 Oklahoma when the Cougars upset the Sooners 14-13 in Cowboys Stadium in Arlington. BYU is 1-5 against top-10 teams during the Mendenhall era.
- RANKED TEAMS. BYU is 160-49 since 1922 when competing as a ranked team. The last time BYU was ranked in the regular season was heading into game five of 2014 when the Cougars were ranked No. 18. Under Mendenhall, BYU is 7-14 against ranked teams after defeating No. 20/22 Boise State last week.
- NATIONAL AWARDS. Safety Kai Nacua was named the Jim Thorpe Player of the Week and National
 Defensive Player of the Week by the FWAA and College Sports Madness for his three interceptions against
 Boise State. Wide receiver Mitchell Juergens was named an honorable mention by the CFPA for Performance of the Week with 172 receiving yards and two touchdowns against the Broncos.

BYU COMES BACK AGAIN TO BEAT BSU

PROVO, Utah – Late-game heroics won the game for BYU football for the second time in as many games with a late touchdown pass and pick-six to seal a 35-24 win over No. 20/22 Boise State on Saturday night at LaVell Edwards Statelium

With 45 seconds left, down 24-21, freshman Tanner Mangum scrambled on fourth down from the Boise State (1-1, 0-0) 35-yard line and threw to a leaping Mitchell Juergens for the go-ahead touchdown for BYU (2-0).

Playing with a 28-24 lead inside of 40 seconds to go, Kai Nacua recorded his third interception of the night and returned it for a touchdown, securing the 35-24 victory over the Broncos.

Mangum finished the game 17 of 28 for 309 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. Senior running back Adam Hine rushed for 93 yards and one touchdown on 19 carries. Juergens had a career night with 172 receiving yards and two touchdowns on just four receptions. Devon Blackmon also eclipsed the 100yard receiving mark with six catches and 105 yards.

BYU PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

• Tanner Mangum QB (Fr.)

In his first career start, Mangum completed 17 of 28 passes for 309 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. On the third play of the game, Mangum tossed an 84-yard bomb to Mitchell Juergens for a touchdown. The play was the fifth longest pass play in BYU history.

Mitchell Juergens WR (Jr.)

Juergens had a career night with four receptions for 172 yards and two touchdowns. He grabbed the 84-yarder in stride for BYU's first score and then the 35-yard go-ahead score.

• Devon Blackmon WR (Sr.)

Blackmon also had a career-best game with six catches for 105 yards. He had a touchdown called back on a penalty that was a spectacular one-handed grab falling down to his back.

Adam Hine RB (Sr.)

Hine got BYU's running game going with 93 yards on 19 carries and one touchdown. He broke two tackles on his way to the outside, scampering for a 21-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter.

· Kai Nacua DB (Jr.)

Nacua tied the BYÚ record for interceptions in a game with three. His first saved a touchdown and his last he returned 50 yards for a touchdown to cap off BYU's comeback.

• Michael Wadsworth DB (Sr.)

Starting for the first time as a Cougar, Wadsworth didn't disappoint with a team-high 11 tackles, including seven solo stops and one tackle for loss.

UCLA DOWNS UNLV 37-3

LAS VEGAS - Paul Perkins rushed for 151 yards and a pair of touchdowns to lead No. 13 UCLA past UNLY, 37-3, in the Bruins' first road game of the season Saturday evening at Sam Boyd Stadium.

Under fourth-year head coach Jim Mora, the Bruins (2-0) registered their 11th consecutive win away from the Rose Bowl, snapping the previous school record which had been set in 1997-98.

Perkins, UCLA's junior running back who finished as the game's leading rusher, carried the ball 18 times and caught two passes for 24 yards against UNLV (0-2). He reached the 100-yard rushing plateau for the eighth time in his career.

Freshman quarterback Josh Rosen completed 22 of 42 passes for 223 yards and one touchdown, helping the Bruins earn their 10th consecutive non-conference victory. The Bruins' true freshman signal caller has thrown for 574 yards through his first two colleciate starts.

UCLA PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

• Paul Perkins RB (Jr.)

Perkins ran for 151 yards and a pair of touchdowns on his 18 carries. He also caught two passes for 24 yards. Perkins averaged 8.4 yards per carry against UNI V.

Josh Rosen QB (Fr.)

The true freshman threw for 223 yards and completed 22 of 42 passes. He connected for one touchdown and had one interception.

Jordan Payton WR (Sr.)

Payton led the Bruins with five receptions for 70 yards. He caught Rosen's one touchdown pass, a 29-yarder.

• Ka'imi Fairbarn K (Sr.)

Fairbairn connected on all three of his field goal attempts. He hit from distances of 35, 34 and 42 yards against the Rebels. He also made good on all four of his PAT attempts.

• Eli Ankou DL (Jr.)

Tied for a team-high five tackles, including two tackles for loss and accounted for four solo tackles. He also recovered a fumble.

Kenny Young LB (So.)

Young also posted a team-high five tackles and had four solo tackles. He snagged an interception and returned it 23 yards for a touchdown.

2015 BYU FOOTBALL TEAM NOTES-5

INDEPENDENCE: YEAR FIVE

The 12-game independent schedule features teams from 10 states and six conferences, including the American Athletic, Big Ten, Pac-12, Mountain West and SEC. BYU has four games scheduled against current Power 5 teams and seven against teams from the Group of 5 conferences. The 12 teams on the schedule had a record of 92-53 in 2014, with eight teams coming off bowl games in 2014.

The Cougars will play six home games, five road contests and one neutral site game in 2015. The home schedule consists of Boise State, UConn, East Carolina, Cincinnati, Wagner and Fresno State. The teams on the home schedule put together a record of 44-23, with four teams reaching bowl games in 2014. The road swing includes a big September with Nebraska, UCLA and Michigan. The Cougars visit San Jose State and Utah State with a game against Missouri at the Kansas City Chief's stadium in Kansas City, Mo. The road and neutral opponents combined for a 48-30 record in 2014, with four bowl games.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special teams player being chosen to carry it each week.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Selected by their teammates, senior quarterback Taysom Hill and senior defensive end Bronson Kaufusi will serve as team captains for the 2015 season.

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accomodations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 85,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 417 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours—seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples)—teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

91 members of the 2015 team have served church missions. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before six games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with coach Bronco Mendenhall.

OFFENSIVE NOTES-7 2015 BYU FOOTBALL

BYU OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

BYU has outscored opponents 30-0 in the fourth quarter. In two fourth quarters this year, BYU has totaled four touchdowns and one field goal. The Cougars scored nine at Nebraska and exploded for 21 against Boise State, both propelling the team to comeback wins.

The Cougar offense has had four touchdown drives of two minutes or less. BYU executed a 4-2:00 four-play, 99-yard touchdown at Nebraska in 1:31 and another touchdown on a 3-play, 22-yard drive in 1:13. The Cougars added one more, the game-winner at Nebraska in 48 seconds, a 7-play, 76-yarder. Against Boise State, BYU started with a 3-play, 75-yard drive to score.

BYU has scored 34 points per game in the first two games. Outputs of 33 and 35 against Nebraska and Boise State. The 34 points per game is tied for No. 4 in the first two games in Bronco Mendenhall's 11 seasons.

Tanner Mangum's 84-yard pass to Mitchell Juergens for a touchdown was the fifth-longest passing play in BYU history. The longest is a 97-yarder from Ty Detmer to Eric Drage against Utah in 1991.

The Cougar offense has been airing it out to average 344 passing yards in the first two games. It is the highest number through the first two games since 2008 when the offense averaged 412 in the first two games. The 344 yard average is No 15 nationally.

THE BYU OFFENSE

- SPREADING THE WEALTH. Ten different receivers have caught passes in the first two games, including seven with multiple grabs. BYU has had three different receivers record 100-yard receiving games with Nick Kurtz in game one (123) and Mitchell Juergens (172) and Devon Blackmon (105) in game two.
- GOING DEEP. BYU has three passing plays of at least 50 yards or more, the second most in the first two games of college football this year. BYU is one of five teams with two plays of 60 yards or more and the only team with two plays of 70 or more yards. The Cougars are one of seven teams with an 80+ yard pass.
- 30 OR MORE. BYU scored 33 points against Nebraska, the third-most of a Bronco Mendenhall coached team in its season opener and 35 against Boise State. This is the third time under Mendenhall the Cougars have topped 30 or more points in the first two games. In 2014, BYU topped the 30-point mark in each of the first four games, a team-best under Mendenhall.
- DOUBLE MITCH BYU's pair of receivers both named Mitch have been go-to targets in the first two games. Mitch Mathews has 101 receiving yards on eight receptions with two touchdowns. Mitchell Juergens has Mathews doubled up with 202 receiving yards and indentical eight receptions and two touchdowns. Mathews has a long reception of 42 yards while Juergens doubled that with a long of 84 yards.
- FRESHMAN WINNERS. There haven't been many true freshman starters in BYU history, with just four including Tanner Mangum. Mangum joins teammate Taysom Hill as the only two to win their first career starts as a true freshman. Hill defeated Hawaii 47-0 in 2012.
- THE BIG THREE. BYU's receiving combination of Mitch Mathews, Nick Kurtz and Terenn Houk stands at 6-foot-5, 6-foot-5 and 6-foot-4. The three big receivers have accounted for 17 receptions, 283 yards and two touchdowns.
- OFFENSIVE LINE EXPERIENCE. BYU returns an experienced offensive line for 2015. The five projected starters for BYU have logged 78 starts between them and have played in 97 games. Offensive tackle Ryker Mathews has the most games under his belt with 24 starts in 35 games played.

BYU DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

The BYU defense held Boise State to 2 of 12 on third downs in the 35-24 win, including a 0-for-3 mark in the fourth quarter. The defensive unit also shutout the Broncos in the final quarter of the game.

Junior defensive back Kai Nacua tied a BYU record for most interceptions in a game with three, reaching the mark set by 10 other Cougars, the last time by Tyson Smith against Wyomina in 2000.

BYU has begun the 2015 season with seven tackles for a loss and at least three team sacks per game in the victories over Nebraska and Boise State. In 2014, the defense notched seven or more TFL four times.

The BYU defense is allowing opponents an average of 95 rushing yards per game, ranking No. 26 in the nation following week two's performance against Boise State.

The Cougars held the Broncos to 361 total yards, including 12 passing yards and 0 rushing yards in the fourth quarter.



THE BYU DEFENSE

• BYU's run defense has been dominant. At 121.8 rushing yards allowed per game, BYU ranked No. 20 in the country in 2014. Through two games in 2015, BYU No. 26, allowing opponents 95 rushing yards per game after holding Boise State to 64 in the 35-24 win in Provo, Utah.

- In the past 10 seasons, BYU has finished ranked in the top 25 in various national statistical categories 65 times on defense. In 2015, BYU is ranked in the top 25 in opponent rushing yards per attempt, turnovers gained and team sacks per game.
- Staying Positive. BYU is 51-7 under Bronco Mendenhall with a positive turnover margin. The Cougars forced three interceptions to the Broncos' two.
- Getting Behind the Line. BYU has recorded seven tackles for loss and at least three sacks in both games this season. In 2014, the Cougars were 4-0 when notching at least three sacks in a game. Since 2005, BYU is 43-2 when notching three or more sacks in a single game.
- Fourth Quarter. The Cougar defense shutout the Broncos in the fourth quarter of the 35-24 win. BYU allowed only 12 passing yards and 0 rushing yards in the quarter.
- Third Down. BYU held the Boise State offense to a 2-of-12 mark on third down in the comeback win last Saturday.

Entering his eleventh season as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall has restored the Cougars' reputation as one of the nation's top college football programs. Taking over a BYU team that in 2005 was coming off three consecutive losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to 10 straight bowl appearances, two outright conference championships before football independence in 2011, and regular national top-25 rankings.

Under Mendenhall's leadership, BYU has earned a 90-39 record to rank 13th in total wins among all FBS teams since 2005 prior

to the start of 2015. Mendenhall also ranks 13th in winning percentage at .698 among active coaches with at least five years of FBS experience in the same time period.

The Cougars finished the 2014 season with an 8-5 record that included a 3-0 mark against Power 5 conference schools. Fueled by Heisman hopeful Taysom Hill, BYU won its first four games including a 41-7 win over then-No. 25 Texas. BYU then overcame a rash of midseason injuries to key players to finish the season with a 10th consecutive bowl game. The Cougars set a program record with four consecutive bowl wins from 2009-12, helping Mendenhall become the first BYU head coach to win six bowls in a seven-year span. The Cougars received nine straight bowl invitations for the first time since a string of 17 consecutive bowl bids under Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards from 1978 through 1994. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first 10 teams to a bowl game, and is winning at the same pace as the legendary Edwards. Through his 129 games as BYU head coach, Mendenhall has a record of 90-39-similar to Edwards' 129-game mark of 93-35-1.

In 2006, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year following an 11-2 season. In addition, the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award.

He has also served as the defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach. BYU has consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses under Mendenhall's direction. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone, averaging a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense over the past eight of nine seasons, including three top-10 ratings. In 2012, the Cougars featured one of the greatest defenses in school history, allowing just 266.1 yards, including 86.9 rushing yards, and 14.0 points per game. Ranked No. 3 in total defense, No. 3 in scoring defense and No. 2 in rushing defense, the Mendenhall-coached unit held its first six opponents under 300 total yards (part of a streak of 12 consecutive such games dating back to 2011) and kept opposing offenses without a touchdown six times during the year. Adjusting to the team's up-tempo offense in 2013, BYU's defense ranked No. 12 in yards per play allowed despite defending more plays than all but four teams nationally. Only two teams that defended as many plays ranked better than the Cougars at defending their turf.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, BYU consistently received the most academic all-conference honorees each season as a conference member, while six Cougar student-athletes have earned seven Academic All-America citations under Mendenhall. Only four programs have had more Academic All-America citations during Mendenhall's tenure. In addition, BYU tops all FBS programs for the most selections to the NFF Hampshire Honor Society (3.2 GPA over college career) since

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the Ethics Committee. He began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at his alma mater, Oregon State. He later coached at Snow College, Northern Arizona, became the youngest defensive coordinator in the Pac-10 at Oregon State, then went to Louisiana Tech and New Mexico before coming to BYU as a defensive coordinator in 2003.
