- WAKING UP IN VEGAS. From 2005-09, the Cougars went to five consecutive Las Vegas Bowls, going 3-2 over that span. With a sixth appearance in Las Vegas, it trails only BYU's 11 Holiday Bowls as the Cougars' favorite bowl destination. BYU has defeated Oregon, UCLA and Oregon State in Vegas.
- #100WINS. Head coach Bronco Mendenhall is sitting on 99 career wins. With a win, Mendenhall will finish his Cougar career as the second 100-game winner at BYU behind LaVell Edwards. Mendenhall would become the 17th active FBS coach to reach 100 wins and the 159th coach in history at any level of college football to reach the century mark of wins.
- UNCHARTED TERRITORY. BYU and Utah have never faced off in the postseason or at a neutral site. The two rivals are meeting for the 90th time in program history. Utah leads the series 54-31-4, but since 1972 when the LaVell Edwards era began, BYU is 26-16 against the Utes. Under Mendenhall, the Cougars are 3-6 and have dropped four straight.
- BYU IN BOWLS. BYU is playing in its 11th consecutive bowl game (every year under Mendenhall). BYU is one of 11 teams to play in its 11th consecutive bowl game this year and only Florida State has won more games (7) than BYU's six games in that span
- BLUE UTES/RED COUGARS. Several members of the Utah coaching staff have spent time at BYU either as a player or member of the Cougar staff. Head coach Kyle Whittingham played linebacker for the Cougars from 1978-81. Co-offensive coordinator Aaron Roderick played receiver for BYU and was a GA. Linebackers coach Justin Ena was also a starter for BYU. On the other side, BYU linebacker Harvey Langi started his career at running back at Utah. The last time he played in this game he was wearing red. Defensive line coach Steve Kaufusi was on the Utah coaching staff from 1994-2001.
- FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR. Tanner Mangum was Freshman of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus.

2015 BYU FOOTBALL LAST GAME/OPPONENT OUTLOOK-3



BYU BEATS UTAH STATE 51-28

LOGAN, Utah – BYU football scored 28 unanswered points to beat Utah State 51-28 on the road at Mayerik Stadium on Saturday.

Despite being outgained in total yards 358 to 445, BYU (9-3) recovered two fumbles and blocked two kicks to secure the win over Utah State (6-6, 5-3 Mountain West).

Tanner Mangum went 16 of 30 for 284 yards and four touchdowns—his third multi-touchdown game of the year. Mitch Mathews led the receivers with 158 yards and two touchdowns on six catches, including a 72-yard touchdown in the second quarter.

On the defensive side, Michael Wadsworth led the team with 10 total tackles. Fred Warner added nine total tackles along with one tackle for loss and one fumble recovery. Tomasi Laulile had a 37-yard fumble return for a touchdown.

BYU PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

• Tanner Mangum QB (Fr.)

Threw 16 of 30 for 284 passing yards and four touchdowns. It was his first game of four passing touchdowns and his third game with three or more this season.

• Bronson Kaufusi DL (Sr.)

Notched his third and fourth blocked kicks of the year and passed Kyle Van Noy for No. 2 in BYU career sacks since 2000 with 26.5 total.

Francis Bernard RB (Fr.)

It was his second-straight game with two touchdowns. He had two against Fresno State (rush) and Utah State (rush/run) for eight total TDs this year.

• Travis Tuiloma LB (Jr.)

The nose tackle had career highs in total tackles (9) and solo stops (5) while bringing his sack total to 2.5 on the season.

• Fred Warner DB (So.)

His 4th fumble recovery of the season is tied for No. 2 in a season at BYU since 2000. Shawn Doman had 4 in 2009. He also tied his career high with nine total tackles in the game.

• Mitch Mathews WR (Sr.)

Had six catches for 158 yards and two touchdowns, including a career-long 72-yard reception and his sixth 100-yard receiving game of his career. He is the 14th BYU player over 2,000 career receiving yards with 2,075.



UTAH CLIPS COLORADO 20-14

SALT LAKE CITY -- Utah football fended off a late rally and defeated Colorado, 20-14, in the regular-season finale for both teams on Saturday afternoon.

The Ute defense forced four turnovers, intercepting three passes and creating a fumble, while also producing six sacks, four from Viliseni Fauonuku.

Utah held Colorado to just 49 yards rushing, 28 through the first three quarters. The Buffaloes were 1-3 in the red zone and also had a field goal blocked by Ute defensive end Kylie Fitts.

Marcus Williams had his team-leading fifth interception in the first quarter while Cory Butler-Byrd added another later in the half. Gionni Paul had his fourth pick of the season in the third quarter and led Utah with 13 tackles.

UTAH PLAYER HIGHLIGHTS

• Travis Wilson WR (Sr.)

He surpassed the 2,000-yard passing mark for the season, going 10-for-26 for 108 yards (1 TD, 1 INT) and has 2,024 passing yards for the year.

• Joe Williams RB (Jr.)

Had a career-high 187 rushing yards (34 carries). He had a long rush of 64 yards and scored his first career touchdown in the third quarter on a 5-yard run.

Kenneth Scott WR (Sr.)

Scored his fourth receiving touchdown (tied for the team lead) of the season on 16-yard reception in the first quarter. He had three catches for a team-high 31 yards before leaving the game with an injury.

Viliseni Fauonuku DT (Sr.)

Tied the Utah record for sacks in a game with four and also forced a fumble on Colorado's final drive of the game to clinch the win for Utah. He had a career-high seven tackles.

• Gionni Paul LB (Sr.)

Had his fourth pick of the season in the third quarter. He led Utah with 13 tackles, his fifth game in double-figure tackles this season, and also had a pass breakup.

Andy Phillips K (Jr.)

Went 2-for-2 in field goals with makes of 37 and 27 yards. He has 23 field goals this year, tying his own school record for field goals in a season, which he set in 2014.

BYU has four games scheduled against current Power 5 teams and seven against teams from the Group of 5 conferences. The 12 teams on the schedule had a record of 92-53 in 2014, with eight teams coming off bowl games in 2014.

The Cougars will play six home games, five road contests and one neutral site game in 2015. The home schedule consists of Boise State, UConn, East Carolina, Cincinnati, Wagner and Fresno State. The teams on the home schedule put together a record of 44-23, with four teams reaching bowl games in 2014. The road swing includes a big September with Nebraska, UCLA and Michigan. The Cougars visit San Jose State and Utah State with a game against Missouri at the Kansas City Chief's stadium in Kansas City, Mo. The road and neutral opponents combined for a 48-30 record in 2014, with four bowl games.

FLAG BEARERS

BYU has a tradition of selecting a player before each game to run the team flag and alumni flag. The team selects a former Cougar to carry out the alumni flag, along with the chosen current player who runs out with the current team flag. The team flag has been signed by each member of the team, while the alumni flag has been signed by former BYU payers. In 2011, the team added a special teams flag, donned by a vintage BYU logo adopted by the special teams, following the same protocol as the team flag with an exemplary special

LAVELL EDWARDS STADIUM

LaVell Edwards Stadium with its 63,470-seat capacity is home to BYU football. Originally Cougar Stadium, it was built in 1964 and seated 30,000. It was expanded in 1982 to seat 65,000 permanent seats before official capacity became 64,045 after refurbishing the middle of the east section. The capacity now sits at 63,470 due to accomposations for wheelchair access. For the 2012 season the stadium featured new video walls and LED ribbons on the north and south end zone stands.

MISSIONS

Brigham Young University is owned and operated by The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. The missionary emphasis of the Church is perhaps one of its most recognized characteristics.

Since the organization of the Church in 1830, over one million missionaries have served. The Church operates missions around the world in 145 nations speaking 164 languages. More than 85,000 missionaries representing the Church are serving proselytizing missions in 417 missions around the world. Most of the Church's proselytizing missionaries are young men between the ages of 18 and 26. A substantial number of young women and older couples also serve proselytizing missions. Missionaries work long hours - seven days a week for two years (or 18 months for women and couples) - teaching the Gospel of Jesus Christ and participating in community service.

81 members of the 2015 team have served church missions. Members of the team have served in over 25 countries and six of the seven continents around the globe.

FIRESIDES

The BYU football team will participate in hour-long devotionals prior or team service activities the night before each game this season. The team will conduct devotionals before six games. These devotionals are referred to as "firesides" and are intended to help players, coaches and those who attend strengthen or gain a knowledge of our purpose here on earth. Firesides typically include a musical number from members of the team and talks from selected players, along with coach Bronco Mendenhall.

BYU OFFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

BYU has had four different players throw TD passes this season with Tanner Mangum (21), Taysom Hill (1), Beau Hoge (1) and Remington Peck (1). The last time BYU had four players throw TD passes in a season was 2004. That was also the last time a non-QB threw a TD pass when running back Curtis Brown threw a 40-yard TD to Austin Collie against Wyoming.

5-400

Five differenent Cougar receivers have at least 400 receiving yards. BYU has not had five players with at least 400 receiving yards in a season since 2006 (J. Harline 935, C. Brown 556, M. Jacobson 547, Z. Collie 437, M. Allen 420). The 2015 five are Mitch Mathews (729), Devon Blackmon (572), Nick Kurtz (522), Terenn Houk (422) and Mitchell Juergens (416)

BYU has the No. 4 blue-zone scoring offense in the nation. Inside the 20s, BYU is scoring 93.9 percent of the time. BYU is 46 of 49 in the blue zone. The three misfires include a fumble, blocked FG and victory formation. The Cougars' touchdown percentage of 71.4 ranks No. 11.

The Cougar offense has had 24 scoring drives of two minutes or less, including 22 touchdowns.

The 3,539 passing yards for BYU in the regular season are the most passing yards since 2008. The Cougars threw for 3,707 yards in the regular season.

THE BYU OFFENSE

- FOURTH QUARTER SCORING. BYU has outscored its opponents 127-68 in the fourth quarter this year. The Cougars scored 102 points in the fourth quarter for all of the 2014 season. BYU's 10.9 points per game in the fourth quarter ranks No. 6 nationally. BYU scored 20 or more points three times in the fourth quarter this year (Boise State, UConn and Cincinnati). The Cougars had never had 20-plus points in the fourth quarter in two games in any season under Mendenhall, let alone three. BYU has hit the 20-point mark in the fourth quarter in seven total games under Mendenhall. It marks the first time BYU has scored 20 or more fourth-quarter points in three games since the 1988 season, Ty Detmer's redshirt freshman year.
- BIG AND TALL. BYU's tall receiving combination of Mitch Mathews, Nick Kurtz and Terenn Houk stands at 6-foot-6, 6-foot-5 and 6-foot-4. The three big receivers have accounted for 118 receptions, 1,673 yards and 15 touchhdowns.
- FRESHMAN OF THE YEAR. Tanner Mangum was named the Freshman of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Columbus. Mangum now holds the BYU freshman season records for completions (242), attempts (390), passing yards (3,062), passing touchdowns (21), wins (8) and consecutive games with a TD pass (8).
- SPREADING THE BALL. BYU has had 19 players catch a pass this season. Six players have at least 20 receptions and five have at least 30. Only three other FBS teams have more players with 20 or more receptions. Five players have over 400 yards receiving and three have over 500 for the first time at BYU since 2008.
- **CHUNK PLAYS.** BYU has 38 plays froms scrimmage gaining 30 yards or more this season, tied No. 11 in the nation with TCU. The Cougars have had 29 passing plays of 30+ and nine rushing plays of 30+. The 29 passing plays mark ties for No. 12 nationally with Cincinnati and North Carolina. BYU has had 13 pass plays go for 40+ (tied No. 22) and five go for 50+ (tied No. 27). BYU is one of only nine teams with at least three passing plays go for 70 or more yards.

BYU DEFENSE BY THE NUMBERS

Bronson Kaufusi has 26.5 career sacks, ranking No. 3 among active FBS leaders behind Oklahoma State's Emmanuel Ogbah (28.0) and Shilique Calhoun of Michigan State (27.0). He is also No. 6 among FBS career leaders in total tackles for loss.

Kai Nacua has six interceptions this season to rank in a tie for No. 5 in the nation, becoming the first BYU player with six in a season since Jernaro Gilford in 2001. He is tied with Daniel Sorensen for No. 2 at BYU in a career with eight (Since 2000).

BYU is tied at No. 6 with Pittsburgh and Texas in average team sacks per game with 3.08. The Cougars sacked opposing quarterbacks 37 times this season for the most in school history since official defensive stats began in 2000 and the most since 1999's 38.

The defense recorded six tackles for loss against Utah State. BYU ranks No. 15 in the nation with 7.5 per game tied with Tulane, South Florida and Louisville.

BYU is ranked No. 17 in blue zone defense, giving up scores 75.6 percent of the time. The Cougars have improved in 2015 with opponents scoring TDs in the blue zone 56 percent of the time compared with 64 percent in 2014.

THE BYU DEFENSE

- **GETTING BEHIND THE LINE.** In 2014, the Cougars were 4-0 when notching at least three sacks in a game. In 2015, they are 8-0. Since 2005, BYU is 49-2 when recording three or more sacks in a single game. The Cougars have sacked the opposing QB 37 times this season, which is the most since the 1998 campaign's 38 which was prior to the NCAA's official keeping of defensive statistics.
- SACKS AND TFLS. Against Utah St., BYU's defense recorded two sacks and six tackles for loss. The Cougars have had at least five TFLs in every game this season, including double-digit efforts vs. Cincy & Fresno St.
- **STAYING POSITIVE.** BYU is 55-8 under Bronco Mendenhall with a positive turnover margin. The Cougars have recorded a positive turnover margin in seven games this season while recording the most INTs since 2010 with 15
- FBS ACTIVE CAREER LEADERS. Bronson Kaufusi is No. 3 in career sacks (26.5), No. 3 in Sack Yards, No. 6 in TFLs (41), No. 4 in TFL Yards, No. 2 in Solo Sacks and No. 9 in Total Sacks/Game among active career leaders in FBS football.
- PASS DEFENSE. BYU has improved upon its 2014 passing defense. After allowing 3,506 yards and 25 TDs through the air last year, the Cougars have held opponents to 2,553 yards and 12 TDs through 12 games this season. BYU held opponents to under 200 yards passing in three games last season while upping that number to six games in 2015. The 2,553 pass yards given up are the fewest through 12 games since 2012 when the team had allowed 2 185
- **Defensive TDs.** BYU's defense has scored three touchdowns this season. Kai Nacua returned interceptions for scores against Boise State and Fresno State while Tomasi Laulile returned a fumble at Utah State for a TD.
- LeBRONSON. The senior defensive end is in the top 5 in BYU history in several categories, including 26.5 sacks (2nd), 41 tackles for loss (4th), 17 quarterback hurries (3rd) and five forced fumbles (3rd).

BYU SPECIAL TEAMS BY THE NUMBERS

BYU's eight blocks this season are No. 1 in the nation. The Cougars have recorded seven blocks in the last six games: ECU's punt, Cincy's FG, Wagner's PAT, Fresno State's FG & punt, and two USU FGs. BYU has 15 blocks since 2013, ranking No. 1 in combined blocks over the past three seasons.

Bronson Kaufusi had two blocked kicks against Utah State for a total of four on the season. He has more blocks this year than 111 FBS teams.

Kicker Trevor Samson has converted 87.5 percent of his field goal attempts this season for No. 9 in the country. He is currently No. 1 in BYU history for career field goal conversion rate at 86.7 percent.

BYU's kickoff return game has averaged 26 yards per attempt over the past five games. The Cougars were only averaging 16.8 yards per return in the first seven games of the season.

Jonny Linehan's 77-yard punt against Nebraska ranks No. 3 in the nation in longest punts this season. The first-year punter Linehan is averaging 43 yards per punt for No. 38 in the country.

BRONCO MENDENHALL

BYU FOOTBALL HEAD COACH

11 YEARS AS HEAD COACH, 13 YEARS OVERALL AT BYU

n his 11 seasons as head coach at Brigham Young University, Bronco Mendenhall restored the great tradition of BYU football while helping the Cougars achieve marked success on and off the field. After taking over a BYU team in 2005 coming off three straight losing seasons, Mendenhall has guided his teams to 11 straight bowl seasons, two outright conference championships before football independence in 2011, and national rankings during nine of 11 seasons.

Under Mendenhall's leadership, BYU has won 99 games over his 11 seasons to rank 12th in that span for the most victories among all FBS programs. Mendenhall's 99-42 overall record also ranks 13th in winning percentage (.702) among all active FBS coaches with at least five years of FBS experience, while ranking No. 10 overall among active coaches with 10 or more years at the helm. He enters the Royal Purple Las Vegas Bowl looking to secure his 100th career victory at BYU before departing to take the head coaching position at the University of Virginia.

Mendenhall, 49, has helped guide the BYU program into elite company due to the consistency of the program's success. Since going independent in 2011, BYU is one of only 14 programs to achieve at least eight wins each season. Since 2005, the Cougars are one of only 10 programs that could finish 2015 with 100 or more wins over the past 11 years while also advancing to a bowl each season. Overall, BYU is one of only 11 programs to earn a bowl invitation each of the past 11 seasons. Among those 11 schools, only Florida State with seven posteason wins has achieved more than BYU's six bowl victories in that time period.

The Cougars set a program record with four consecutive bowl wins from 2009-12, helping Mendenhall become the first BYU head coach to win six bowls in a seven-year span. Mendenhall is the only coach in BYU football history to take his first 11 teams to a bowl game.

Mendenhall's .600 postseason winning percentage is tops in school history and his overall wins approaches that of Hall of Fame coach LaVell Edwards over the same time frame even with Mendenhall's teams facing double the number of Power 5-level opponents. Mendenhall's 99th win came in his 141st game while Edwards earned 103 victories in his first 141 games leading the Cougars. Thanks to the high level of success achieved by both coaches and their teams, BYU ranks No. 5 among all FBS programs in total victories over the last 40 seasons with 357, an average of 8.9 wins per season. Mendenhall's teams have helped the Cougars move up on that list while averaging 9.0 victories per year entering this year's bowl game.

The principles and structure of Mendenhall's program coupled with the efforts of his staff and players have helped BYU be consistently competitive whether in Provo or on the road. BYU entered 2015 ranked No. 9 nationally in home winning percentage at .820 (50-11 record) and No. 20 in road winning percentage at .529 (33-23 record) since 2005. BYU's 33 away victories under Mendenhall in that span ranked No. 9 nationally and his seven additional neutral site wins ranked No. 22.

BYU's success under Mendenhall is also evident in the national rankings and NCAA statistics. BYU has been recognized with top-25 rankings during nine of his 11 seasons and finished with five top-25 final rankings over the past 10 seasons. The Cougars have also finished in the top 25 of the various national statistical categories 145 times over the past 10 seasons (62 defense, 53 offense, 28 special teams, 2 misc.).

Mendenhall has served as the BYU's defensive coordinator for much of his tenure as the head coach and returned to a full-time role with the defense again in 2015. The Cougars have consistently fielded one of the nation's strongest defenses under Mendenhall's direction. Mendenhall's defense excels at keeping opponents out of the end zone, averaged a No. 20 national ranking in scoring defense while he oversees the defense, including three top-10 ratings.

BYU recruits have earned Freshman All-America recognition during eight of the past 10 seasons as Mendenhall and his staff continue to demonstrate they are strengthening the program with talented players and quality individuals. In 2015, quarterback Tanner Mangum could add to this legacy becoming the first BYU freshman to total more than 3,000 passing yards after taking over in relief of the injured Heisman Trophy hopeful Taysom Hill. More than 60 BYU players have signed with the NFL since Mendenhall arrived in Provo, including tight end Dennis Pitta, a starter on the 2013 Super Bowl Champion Baltimore Ravens, defensive end Ezekiel Ansah, the No. 5 overall pick by the Detroit Lions in the 2013 NFL Draft, and linebacker Kyle Van Noy, the 40th overall pick by the Lions in the 2014 draft.

Another hallmark of Mendenhall's program has been the emphasis on balance and priorities in the many other facets of life outside of football. Reflecting that emphasis, the Cougars are tied for seventh among all FBS programs for the most Academic All-America citations over the past 10 years and BYU tops all FBS programs for the most selections (39) to the National Football Foundation Hampshire Honor Society (recognizing starters and significant contributors finishing their eligibility with a 3.2 GPA or better over their college career) since the program began in 2007.

Among his honors, Mendenhall was named the American Football Coaches Association Region IV Coach of the Year in 2006, while the Football Writers Association of America named Mendenhall one of nine finalists for the prestigious Eddie Robinson Coach of the Year Award that same season.

Mendenhall was elected in 2013 to the American Football Coaches Association Board of Trustees as the District 8 Representative and also serves on the AFCA Ethics Committee.

- BYU is one of only 11 programs to earn a bowl invitation each of the last 11 years. Other teams include Florida State, Alabama, LSU, Boise State, Georgia, Oklahoma, Oregon, Clemson, Virginia Tech and Wisconsin.





2015 SEASON REVIEW

BYU football had one of the most intriguing seasons in school history in 2015. Entering the campaign with a Heisman hopeful senior quarterback in Taysom Hill, a senior running back in Jamaal Williams poised to break the all-time rushing record, a talented roster and veteran head coach Bronco Mendenhall, the 2015 squad faced the toughest schedule in program history locked and loaded.

Just days before fall camp, senior running back Jamaal Williams withdrew from school for personal reasons and in the first half of the season opener against Nebraska, quarterback Taysom Hill suffered a season-ending Lisfranc injury. Following the conclusion of the regular season, head coach Bronco Mendenhall announced he had accepted the head coaching position at the University of Virginia. In between these unlikely bookends of the season, BYU produced some of the most memorable and exciting moments in BYU football history.

After Hill went down at Nebraska, true freshman Tanner Mangum stepped in just three months removed from an LDS mission to Chile to try and lead the Cougars back from a 28-24 deficit. A field goal in the fourth quarter put BYU within one, and with 48 seconds to go, the Cougars had a final chance to end the Huskers' 29-year winning streak in home openers.

On the last play of the game, Mangum heaved a Hail Mary to Mitch Mathews into the wind. Mathews got in front of the Nebraska defense and came down with it, falling into the end zone to beat Nebraska 33-28, vaulting young Mangum into BYU folklore forever.

Mangum's heroics continued a week later when he connected with Mitchell Juergens for a 35-yard go-ahead touchdown with 45 seconds remaining on fourth down to lead Boise State 28-24. Safety Kai Nacua sealed the win with a pick-six on Boise State's next drive. Mangum finished with 365 passing yards against the Broncos, the most ever by a true freshman quarterback at BYU. He became just the second true freshman to win his first start at BYU, joining teammate Taysom Hill.

The Cougars continued their September-loaded schedule with trips to No. 10 UCLA and Michigan. Despite shutting down another freshman phenom in UCLA's quarterback Josh Rosen, Bruin running back Paul Perkins led UCLA to a fourth-quarter comeback of their own, downing BYU 24-23. Michigan's defense was dominant and blanked the Cougars for a 31-0 shutout, the first at BYU in 143 games.

BYU bounced back with five consecutive wins, topping UConn, East Carolina, Cincinnati, Wagner and San Jose State. The Cougars were tied or trailed in the fourth quarter against UConn, East Carolina and Cincinnati.

BYU scored 20-plus points in the fourth against UConn and Cincinnati, making it three times including Boise State that the Cougars topped the 20-point mark in the fourth quarter during the season. The team had never hit that mark under Mendenhall and did so for the first time since the 1988 season.

Against San Jose State, the Spartans gave the Cougars all they could handle. After scoring with 45 seconds to go, San Jose went for two, trailing 17-16, but BYU safety Michael Wadsworth broke up the pass to secure BYU's win.

Next up was a date with the SEC's Missouri at Arrowhead Stadium. Mizzou's offense re-emerged after an emotional week of off-campus issues, including the announcement of their head coach's retirement. After struggling for four-straight games, the Tigers capitalized on too many BYU mistakes to edge the Cougars 20-16.

Returning home for senior day, BYU got back on track with a dominating 52-10 victory over Fresno State. The game was highlighted by senior defensive end-turned-tight end Remington Peck tossing a touchdown pass to senior wide receiver Terenn Houk on a gadget play.

BYU then traveled to Logan for a cold and snowy matchup with in-state foe Utah State to close the season. Trailing early, a fumble by Chuckie Keaton, followed by a scoop and score by defensive lineman Tomasi Laulile as the first half closed, dramatically changed the momentum to give BYU a 24-21 halftime advantage. The Cougars got two blocked kicks at the hands of Bronson Kaufusi and scored two more touchdowns in the third quarter and controlled the game the rest of the way, winning it 51-28 to put a 10-win season in their grasp with winning No. 9 to close the regular season.

The Cougars played 29 freshmen in 2015, tied for No. 3 in the nation, including 16 true freshmen. Tanner Mangum set every freshman quarterback record at BYU and became the first 3,000-yard passer at BYU since Max Hall in 2009. The Cougars were one of the best in the nation at spreading the ball with 19 different players recording a reception and six players posting at least 20 receptions. Five different players had over 400 receiving yards, the first time since 2006 BYU had accomplished the feat.

On defense, BYU recorded 37 sacks as a team, the most since 38 in 1999 (including bowl game) and the most under head coach Bronco Mendenhall. Bronson Kaufusi led the group with 11 sacks and 17 tackles for loss. He also blocked four kicks to lead the nation, and the team blocked eight, to lead all FBS teams. Kai Nacua was a ball hawk, nabbing six interceptions to tie for No. 5 in the nation.

With a win in the Las Vegas Bowl, BYU would win its 10th game of the season for the sixth time under Mendenhall, giving the outgoing coach his 100th career win.

LINCOLN, Neb. - In miraculous fashion, freshman quarterback Tanner Mangum made his collegiate debut, connecting with receiver Mitch Mathews on a 42-yard Hail Mary touchdown as BYU stunned Nebraska 33-28 on the road at Memorial Stadium in Lin-

With the Cougars facing a 28-27 deficit on fourth down with one second left on the game clock, Mangum notched his first career touchdown on the Hail Mary to help the Cougars (1-0) to beat the Cornhuskers (0-1, 0-0 Big 10). It is the first time in 30 years that Nebraska has fallen in its season opener.

With 48 seconds to go and no timeouts, the BYU offense took over at the 24-yard line after Nebraska missed a 41-yarder.

On second down and 10, Mangum converted an 11-yard run for a first down prior to Adam Hine's 16-yard rush up the middle. Two plays later another Mangum run pushed the Cougars to the 42-yard line, setting the stage for the eventual last-second pass. Prior to leaving the game with an injury, senior quarterback Taysom Hill had 268 yards through the air on 21-of-34 passing with one touchdown in addition to 72 yards and two touchdowns on the ground. Mangum completed 7 for 11 for 111 yards along with five rushes for 26 vards.

Junior receiver Nick Kurtz led all receivers with 123 yards on five catches in his first career BYU game. Mathews had 69 yards on three receptions in addition to the Hail Mary score. Hine added 37 yards rushing on four carries for the offense.

Defensively, the Cougars had seven tackles for loss, three sacks four quarterback hurries and two turnovers, forcing an interception and fumble recovery. Senior linebacker Manoa Pikula led BYU with seven tackles while a host of Cougars chipped in on the defensive effort. Defensive lineman Logan Taele had six tackles, including 2.5 tackles for loss and one sack.

After Nebraska scored a touchdown on its first drive and a punt on its next possession, Hill led the Cougars downfield on a four-play, 99-yard scoring drive. He delivered two consecutive first-down completions with a 24-yarder to Terenn Houk followed by a 53yard completion for Kurtz's first catch of his career.

A pass interference call advanced the offense to the 3-yard line before Hill capped the

drive with his 23rd rushing touchdown of his career, tying the game 7-7 with 2:50 left

The Cornhuskers responded with a 65-yard scoring drive, culminating in a 19-yard touchdown catch from Tommy Armstrong to Alonzo Moore to break the tie, 14-7, for the eventual tally at the end of the first.

In the second quarter BYU took the lead with a 17-point output.

On third and 10, Houk came down with a 19-yard diving fingertip catch for another first down. Two plays later, Hill ran 21 yards to the endzone, tying the game at 14 apiece with

The next Cougar drive resulted in a field goal for Trevor Samson who converted on his first attempt from 41-yards away, helping BYU to take its first lead of the game, 17-14 with 5:42 left in the half.

The Cougar defense then forced a turnover as Fred Warner recovered a fumble at the Nebraska 22-yard line. Three plays later, a 15-yard touchdown pass from Hill to Mathews extended the lead to 24-14. The Huskers attempted a field goal from 44 yards out, but it missed wide left right before the end of the half.

In the third quarter, momentum swung back in the direction of Nebraska with touchdown the 10:39 mark to cut the margin to 24-21 in favor of the Cougars after a turnover. On the next Nebraska possession, the Huskers pushed their way down the field for an eightplay, 62-yard touchdown drive to take a 28-24 lead with 5:31 left in the third quarter.

After a three-and-out, BYU's defense was tasked with holding Nebraska. On third and 10 yards to go from the Nebraska 49, defensive back Micah Hannemann notched his first career interception.

The Cougars stopped the Huskers' next drive and BYU cashed in for three points to make the score 28-27 after Samson's second field goal attempt of the game was good from 35 yards with 7:51 left in the game.

After exchanging punts again, the Cornhuskers threatened to score on their next possession, but a tackle for loss from Fred Warner and Hannemann set up a 41-yard try for the Huskers. The miss gave the Cougars the ball back for the decisive possession.

PROVO, Utah - Late-game heroics won the game for BYU football for the second time in as many games with a late touchdown pass and pick-six to seal a 35-24 win over No. 20/22 Boise State on Saturday night at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

With 45 seconds left, down 24-21, freshman Tanner Mangum scrambled on fourth down from the Boise State (1-1, 0-0) 35-yard line and threw to a leaping Mitchell Juergens for the go-ahead touchdown for BYU (2-0).

Playing with a 28-24 lead inside of 40 seconds to go, Kai Nacua recorded his third interception of the night and returned it 50 yards for a touchdown, securing the 35-24

Mangum finished the game 17 of 28 for 309 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions. He became just the second BYU true freshman quarterback to win his first start. Taysom Hill is the only other player to win his first start as a true freshman (vs. Hawaii, 2012).

Senior running back Adam Hine rushed for 93 yards and one touchdown on 19 carries. Juergens had a career night with 172 receiving yards and two touchdowns on just four receptions. Devon Blackmon also eclipsed the 100-yard receiving mark with six catches and 105 yards.

Nacua had three interceptions, which ties a BYU record, and Michael Wadsworth had 11 total tackles. Harvey Langi recorded two sacks.

BYU trailed 24-14 in the fourth quarter before the run-game for the Cougars picked up and the defense pulled the reins back on the Broncos.

After Nacua's second pick, BYU pounded the ball inside and Mangum's quarterback keeper made it a three-point game with 10:22 remaining in the game. The Cougar defense forced back-to-back punts for set up another comeback.

The game started out fast when Mangum threw an 84-yard pass to Juergens for a touchdown on just the third play of the game, taking the early 7-0 lead with only 51 seconds off the clock. The touchdown was the fifth-longest pass play in BYU history.

With four minutes left in the first quarter, Boise State evened it up with a seven-play, 52yard drive, capped by a Jeremy McNichols three-yard touchdown run.

Each team traded interceptions again, but the second quarter remained scoreless until Boise State's Tyler Rausa kicked a 31-yard field goal to put the Broncos up 10-7 heading into the break

Boise State benifited from a personal foul miscue from BYU in the third quarter when a would-be third-down stop was negated. The Broncos took advantage and took a 17-7 lead with another rushing touchdown from McNichols with 11:01 left in the quarter.

On the next drive, facing a third-and-19, Mangum found Blackmon for a 70-yard reception to put the team on the 23-yard line. With 4:32 in the third quarter, Hine broke three tackles, rushing 21 yards for a touchdown, to cut Boise State's lead to 17-14.

McNichols answered right back for Boise State, scoring another touchdown on a 29yard catch-and-run to push the Bronco lead to 24-14. Boise State wouldn't get much on offense in the fourth quarter with drives ending in two interceptions and two punts before the game was over

PASADENA, Calif. – Despite leading for much of the game, No. 19 BYU fell 24-23 to No. 19 UCLA on the road at the Rose Bowl in Pasadena.

The Cougars (2-1) led for all but the final 3:21 of the game as the Bruins (3-0) found the end zone twice in the final quarter of the game.

Pacing the offense for BYU was senior running back Adam Hiné who carried the ball 23 times for a career-best 149 yards and one touchdown. Quarterback Tanner Mangum went 30 of 47 for 244 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Wide receiver Mitch Mathews led the team with 84 yards on nine catches and one score.

Junior linebacker Harvey Langi led the defensive effort for BYU with two interceptions, one pass breakup and eight tackles, including seven solo stops. His two picks were the first of his career. He also carried the ball two times for eight yards. Junior defensive back Kai Nacua contributed with one interception, two pass breakups and four tackles.

BYU extended its lead to 20-10 with 13:21 left in the game on Trevor Samson's second field goal, but the UCLA offense answered with a quick 65-yard drive that ended with a touchdown pass from Josh Rosen to Jordan Payton, cutting the margin to 20-17 with 12:16 on the clock.

Mangum then led the Cougars down the field, burning 6:37 off the clock with a 16-play, 61-yard scoring drive that culminated in Samson's third field goal of the game. He converted a 32-yarder to put BYU up 23-17 with 5:39 left in the game.

The Bruins took the lead late in the game after an 80-yard drive when Nate Starks found the end zone on a 3-yard run, putting the Bruins up 24-23.

After the kickoff, Mangum led the Cougars 43 yards from their own 15-yard line to the UCLA 42. Facing a fourth-and-seven situation with under one minute to go, Mangum was picked off at the 17-yard line, stopping BYU's hopes of a go-ahead score.

To begin the game, the BYU defense held UCLA to a three-and-out on the opening possession. The Cougars then strung together an 11-play scoring drive, going 71 yards for the first points of the game.

BRUINS

Langi converted a third-and-one for five yards from the UCLA 12-yard line prior to Adam Hine's second rushing touchdown of the year to put the Cougars on the board first with 10:54 left in the first.

On the ensuing kickoff, punter Jonny Linehan executed an onside kick which Michael Davis recovered down the right sideline at the UCLA 44. After the BYU offense was stalled, Linehan then pinned the Bruins deep in their territory on the 8-yard line after the punt.

UCLA countered behind running back Paul Perkins, changing field position on a 44-yard rush down to the BYU 25-yard line.

Three plays later, Langi intercepted Bruin quarterback Josh Rosen at the 5-yard line, stopping the threatening UCLA offense with 4:34 left in the first quarter.

UCLA began the second quarter in the midst of a 57-yard scoring drive, following a second 44-yard gain by Perkins. The Cougars held the Bruins to a 35-yard field goal for the 7-3 lead at the 13:38 mark in the half.

On the second play of the next Bruin drive, Langi came up with his second interception of the half, returning it to the UCLA 36-yard line with 11:12 left in the half.

With 9:18 left in the quarter, the Cougars capitalized on the turnover with Samson's 40-yard field goal, putting BYU back up by seven, 10-3.

Two possessions later, the Bruins countered with a drive inside the 20-yard line that was cut short. Kai Nacua picked off a pass in the end zone, ending the offensive threat before the half with a 10-3 BYU advantage.

After BYU's first drive of the second half stalled, UCLA returned a punt 56 yards to the 17-yard line with 11:22 on the clock.

The Bruins then scored five plays later, knotting the game at 10-10 at the 9:27 mark.

BYU responded on the following possession to take a 17-10 lead with 6:26 left in the third, assembling a 75-yard scoring drive aided in part by Hine's 28-yard run and capped by Mangum's 14-yard touchdown pass to Mathews.

ANN ARBOR, Mich. - No. 22 BYU football concluded its September schedule with a 31-0 loss against Michigan at Michigan Stadium Saturday afternoon.

The Cougars (2-2) had just 105 total yards compared to 448 by the Wolverines (3-1, 0-0 Big 10). It is the first time BYU has been shut out since a 3-0 loss to Utah in 2003, snapping a streak of 143 games of getting on the board.

BYU freshman quarterback Tanner Mangum completed 12 of 28 passes for 55 yards. Running back Francis Bernard saw his first action as a Cougar, rushing four times for 30 yards. Michigan's Jake Rudock threw 14 of 25 for 194 yards and one touchdown with

Defensive backs Micah Hanneman and Michael Wadsworth led the defense, each posting 10 tackles each. Defensive lineman Logan Taele added two tackles for loss while Remington Peck and Harvey Langi each posted sacks.

The first quarter of the game saw just one completed pass for the Cougars, a 14-yarder to Devon Blackmon that was tipped by a defender. With 6:52 left in the first quarter, Michigan scored the first points of the game on Rudock's 3-yard rushing touchdown to go up 7-0.

The Wolverine offense scored three touchdowns and kicked one field goal in the second quarter to lead 31-0 at the half, including a 60-yard touchdown run with 11:37 left.

The second half was scoreless for both sides as Michigan used its ground game to run the clock, pacing the game for the eventual final tally.

PROVO, Utah - Led by Tanner Mangum's record-breaking night, BYU football defeated Connecticut 30-13 at home on Friday night.

BYU (3-2) had 539 total yards in the win compared with 230 from UConn (3-2, 0-1 AAC). The Cougar defense had four sacks in the game and allowed just one touchdown.

Mangum completed 35 of 53 passes for 365 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions, breaking the record for passing yards in a single game by a freshman quarterback at BYU.

Terenn Houk led the receivers with career-high 129 yards and Mitchell Juergens led the team with a career-high 10 receptions. Mitch Mathews caught two touchdown passes in the fourth quarter, totaling 78 receiving yards in the game. Running backs Algernon Brown and Francis Bernard rushed for 95 and 69 yards, respectively. Bernard had one touchdown.

Defensively, linebacker Sae Tautu led the team with six total tackles to go along with three tackles for loss and a sack. Bronson Kaufusi had three tackles, one sack, two tackles for loss and one interception.

In BYU's first series of the game, a miscommunication caused the first lost fumble of the season for the Cougars. However, the defense held strong and a sack from Sae Tautu forced the Huskies to punt.

BYU marched down the field 87 yards on 12 plays to get into the end zone on its second drive of the game with 2:44 remaining in the first quarter. Houk grabbed a 34-yard reception for the longest play of the drive, and Bernard rushed the ball at the 1-yard line to score his first career touchdown to put BYU up 7-0.

The Cougar defense held strong in the second quarter, making up for a missed field goal and an interception. UConn's last drive of the half resulted in a touchdown after a targeting foul on the defense on quarterback Byron Shirreffs. Arkeel Newsome had a 30-yard reception to tie the game up 7-7 with 1:42 left in the half.

Trying to respond after the touchdown, BYU marched down the field. Houk caught another big pass for first down, this time for 28 yards. The drive ended with a field goal attempt, which was blocked by the Huskies.

Mangum threw another interception at the start of the third quarter, and UConn took a 10-7 lead with 7:11 left in the third.

A couple of big receptions from Houk and Nick Kurtz led BYU down the field. With 3:02 remaining in the third, Trevor Samson kicked a field goal for the Cougars to tie it up 10-1∩

Defense swung the momentum in BYU's favor in the fourth quarter. Kai Nacua's quarterback hurry forced the UConn quarterback to throw it up in the air, setting up Kaufusi's interception. The pick put the Cougars on the 21-yard line, paving the way for their second touchdown of the game. Mangum found Mathews in the end zone for a 21-yard pass, extending the lead to 20-10 with 12:03 left in the game.

At the 8:59 mark, the Huskies were held to a field goal again, making the score 20-13. An unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on UConn saved BYU's next drive after what would have been a third-down stop. Bernard then followed with a 19-yard run before Mathews caught another touchdown pass from Mangum with 7:26 left to push BYU's lead to 27-13.

Michael Shelton picked off Shirreffs with less than five minutes in the game to give the Cougars possession to run out the clock. Bernard ran 46 yards during BYU's last possession to set Samson up for a the final field goal with 0:26 left for the final score, 30-13.

PROVO, Utah - Algernon Brown's career performance, including the game-winning touchdown on the final drive, led BYU to a 45-38 win over East Carolina in the homecoming game Saturday night.

When BYU's offense went cold in the fourth quarter, the Pirates (3-3, 1-1 American Athletic Conference) rallied with 17 points to tie BYU (4-2), 38-38.

Quarterback Tanner Mangum left the game during the third quarter after hobbling following a run but returned on BYU's final drive. Mangum went 3 for 4 on the drive for 27 yards and Brown rushed nine yards for his fourth touchdown for the game-winner with

The Cougars had 508 yards of total offense, just shy of the Pirates' 518 total yards. Mangum completed 24 of 33 passes for 332 yards, his third game throwing over 300 vards. He threw three touchdowns and had no interceptions.

Brown rushed for 134 yards on 24 carries for three touchdowns, all career highs. He also had one receiving touchdown. Devon Blackmon had a game-high 142 yards on nine catches. Mitch Mathews and Terenn Houk both caught touchdowns in the win.

Michael Wadsworth led the team in tackles with 10, followed closely by Kai Nacua's nine. Sione Takitaki had five tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and recovered a fumble. Fred Warner recorded an interception and a fumble recovery.

ECU jumped out to a 14-0 lead in the first guarter after two costly turnovers by BYU. After a Pirate fumble recovery, ECU quarterback James Summers held the ball on fourth down and rushed for 34 yards to get the touchdown and an early 7-0 lead with 7:21 remaining in the quarter. Just two minutes later, ECU blocked a punt and recovered it in the end zone to extend the lead to 14-0.

The Cougars marched down the field to answer back. A couple of big receptions by Blackmon set up a 22-yard touchdown catch by Brown with 1:36 left in the first quarter.

BYU then answered with a punt block of its own as senior Bronson Kaufusi got a hand

on a Pirate kick. Trey Dye recovered the ball at the 1-yard line which allowed Brown to run the ball into the end zone for his second touchdown, tying the game up 14-14 with

The offensive onslaught continued for BYU in the second quarter. One scoring drive was kept alive after Jonny Linehan faked a punt and rushed seven yards for the first down. With 8:05 in the second quarter, Mathews caught a 13-yard reception to make it 21-14.

Three double-digit yard receptions led the Cougars down the field in their next possession. Mangum found Houk for a 9-yard touchdown, the senior's first of the year, to double the Pirates' score 28-14 with 2:14 in the half. ECU capped off the half by scoring a touchdown with six seconds left to cut the lead to 28-21.

The second half began with Brown rushing up the middle for a 53-yard touchdown, extending BYU's lead to 35-21 with 13:02 in the third quarter.

The Cougar defense forced three turnovers in a row, a fumble recovery by Takitaki and a fumble recovery and interception for Warner to give the offense more opportunities. Unfortunately, BYU was unable to convert any of those turnovers into touchdowns. With 2:25 left in the third quarter, Trevor Samson kicked a 37-yard field goal to push the lead to 38-21.

Taking advantage of Mangum on the sidelines, the Pirates fired back in the fourth quarter with two touchdowns and one field goal to tie the game at 38-38. Beau Hoge threw an interception to set up the ECU game-tying field goal with 4:01 left in the game.

Mangum came back in for BYU's last drive to take the offense down the field. With just 19 seconds left in the game, Brown rushed nine yards for his fourth touchdown of the game to take back the lead for the final time.

PROVO, Utah - Facing another deficit, Tanner Mangum led the offense to three touchdowns in the fourth quarter and BYU's defense put the clamps down to come back and defeat Cincinnati 38-24 on Friday night at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

After a rough first half of offense, BYU (5-2) finished the game with 449 total yards to Cincinnati's (3-3, 0-2 American Athletic Conference) 341 yards. Led by Bronson Kaufusi's three sacks, the Cougar defense had eight sacks in the game for the first time since 1997 as it stymied the Bearcat offense over the final three quarters. The defense also had 12 tackles for loss.

"It was really a gratifying win today," head coach Bronco Mendenhall said. "You might question it after one come-from-behind win, or two or three, but it just seems like our team comes alive in the fourth quarter and plays hard and wants to win. I've just been amazed and impressed by how they've played in the fourth quarter."

Sione Takitaki led the Cougars with a career high of nine tackles to go along with two tackles for loss while Fred Warner and Sae Tautu each had two stops behind the line

Mangum ended the game throwing 19 of 32 for two touchdowns and one interception. Nick Kurtz led the BYU receivers with 119 yards and two touchdowns on six catches. The running backs split up the load with Algernon Brown running for 88 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries. Freshman Francis Bernard scored one touchdown and rushed for 60 yards on just four carries.

BYU was unable to connect on offense in the first quarter, allowing Cincinnati to jump out to an early 10-0 lead. Kaufusi came up big with a blocked field goal attempt at the start of the second quarter to set up the offense, but despite a 38-yard reception from Mitch Mathews, the Cougars settled for a 29-yard field goal by Trevor Samson to make it 10-3 with 13:29 until the half.

An interception on the BYU 20-yard line put Cincinnati in a position to score. The defense almost held on with the stop on third down, but a holding penalty gave the Bearcats the first down. Mike Boone rushed five yards to score with 6:50 until the break to push their lead to 17-3.

Two pass interference penalties aided BYU in answering with a scoring drive. The first penalty came early in the drive, setting up big plays from Brown and Kurtz to get the Cougars into scoring position. When faced with a potential fourth down, another pass interference call put the team at first and goal. Brown rushed five yards to score BYU's first touchdown of the game, making it 17-10 with 4:30 left in the half.

Out of the locker room, BYU's offense marched down the field to start the third quarter. On fourth and five, Mangum found Colby Pearson for a 16-yard gain to continue the drive. With 9:31 left in the quarter, Kurtz caught his first touchdown of his BYU career on a 19-yard pass from Mangum to tie up the game at 17 apiece.

Penalties plagued the Cougars in the second half as well. A big first-down catch by Kurtz was negated after two separate penalties. The offense was forced to punt a few plays later. After a huge reception by Mathews, a chop block penalty was called, taking away that gain as well. BYU was once again forced to punt.

Cincinnati regained the lead, 24-17, toward the end of the third quarter, but the run game knotted the score again between the Cougars and Bearcats. Bernard ran for 40 yards with a defender on his hip to switch the field position. Then with 10:24 left in the game, Brown scored his second touchdown of the game on a 2-yard carry to tie the score at 24-24.

After stout defense led by another sack from Kaufusi, BYU forced Cincinnati to punt again. Starting on the BYU 47-yard line, Mangum found a wide-open Kurtz for 53 yards and his second touchdown of the night. The Cougars took the lead 31-24 for the first time in the game with 8:14 remaining in the contest.

Bernard rushed 11 yards for his second-career touchdown with 4:35 left to extend the Cougars' lead to 38-24. This was the third touchdown of the fourth quarter.

PROVO, Utah - BYU football scored the most points in Bronco Mendenhall's time as head coach in a 70-6 win over Wagner Saturday afternoon at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

BYU (6-2) totaled 741 yards of offense (330 rushing yards) in the win while holding Wagner (0-7, 0-3 Northeast Conference) to 129 yards. The Cougars tallied six rushing and four passing touchdowns.

Tanner Mangum went 12 of 13 for 237 yards and three touchdowns at quarterback before being relieved in the second quarter. Beau Hoge took over, going 8 of 11 for 117 yards and one touchdown. Koy Detmer Jr. also took a turn at quarterback for BYU, throwing 3 of 3 for 57 yards.

Two Cougars rushed for over 100 yards in the victory. Algernon Brown rushed for 109 yards and two touchdowns on just six attempts. Nate Carter notched 102 yards and one touchdown on 10 carries. The receiving yards were spread out among the team. Eight players totaled 20 or more receiving yards. David Kessler led the team with 78 yards and

Manoa Pikula led the team in tackles with six, while Fred Warner totaled four tackles, two sacks and one quarterback hurry. Trevor Samson was a perfect 7 for 7 on PATs

The Cougar offense got going right from the start, jumping out to a 28-0 lead after the first quarter. Colby Pearson scored his first touchdown of the season and the first touchdown of the game on a 16-yard reception from Mangum just 1:13 into the game.

With 11:28 left in the quarter, Mitch Mathews also caught a touchdown pass, a 20-yard reception, to extend the lead. The last two scores of the quarter for BYU were rushing



touchdowns from Brown, 42-yard and 37-yard rush. The defense held Wagner to just one first down in the quarter.

BYU tallied three more touchdowns in the second quarter to push the lead to 49-0. Terenn Houk had a 19-yard reception and a 46-yard reception to set up the first score of the quarter. Mathews caught his second touchdown of the game on a 19-yard pass from Mangum with 13:07 left in the second quarter.

Michael Shelton had a 40-yard punt return to set up the Francis Bernard rushing touchdown with 9:49 remaining until the break. In the Seahawks' next series, Jordan Preator intercepted the ball to get possession back for the Cougars. Hoge came in at quarterback for BYU, rushing the ball seven times. He ran two yards for his first career touchdown.

The defense held Wagner to just 37 yards of offense and two first downs in the first half compared to BYU's 457 yards and 21 first downs.

The Seahawks evaded the shutout with a rushing touchdown at the 6:52 mark in the third quarter. The PAT attempt by Wagner was blocked by Logan Taele, denying the extra $\,$ point and making it 49-6.

Kessler caught his first career touchdown after catching a short pass from Hoge and taking it 47 yards. On BYU's next possession, Carter ran 70 yards for another touchdown to make it 63-6 right before the end of the third quarter.

In the fourth quarter, Hoge rushed one yard for his second touchdownof the game with 8:07 left. That was the last score of the game, making the final score 70-6.

SAN JOSE, Calif. – Defensive back Michael Wadsworth prevented a two-point conversion to shut down a San Jose State comeback and give BYU football a 17-16 win on Friday night at Spartan Stadium.

With 0:45 seconds left in the game, SJSU quarterback Kenny Potter rushed six yards to the pylon for six to make it a one-point game. San Jose State went for the win and attempted the two-point conversion with a halfback pass. Wadsworth read the play and was able to get a hand up to disrupt the pass and the ball fell to the turf to preserve the lead.

The Spartans tried for the onside kick and 6-foot-6 BYU wide receiver Mitch Mathews out-jumped San Jose State's hands team and knocked the ball out of bounds, giving possession to the Cougars to seal the win.

BYU (7-2) tallied 329 total yards, outgaining San Jose's (4-5, 3-2 Mountain West Conference) 269 yards. The teams were equal in sacks and turnovers with three and one apiece on a night that saw its up's and down's. The Cougars dominated the pass game with 293 compared to the Spartans' 147.

Wadsworth led the defense with 10 total tackles in the win. Fred Warner had two sacks to go along with his eight tackles.

Tanner Mangum went 23 of 37 for 293 yards, one touchdown and one interception. Devon Blackmon notched 102 yards on six catches, his third 100-yard receiving game. Mitch Mathews caught the lone receiving touchdown in the game as one of four receptions totaling 62 yards.

San Jose marched down the field in its first possession to first and goal, but BYU's defense held them to a field goal after Bronson Kaufusi and Jherremya Leuta-Douyere sacked the quarterback for a loss of 12 yards.

The Cougars' answered with in a 4-yard touchdown pass to Mathews from Mangum

with 10:07 left in the first quarter to take the 7-3 lead after a 10-play, 75-yard drive. Mathews also had a 19-yard reception in the drive to set up the scoring play.

The second series for BYU's offense resulted in its second touchdown of the game. A couple of key receptions by Blackmon, one for 5 yards and the other for 16 yards, set up Algernon Brown to rush 5 yards for a score to extend the lead to 14-3 with 10:12 remaining in the second quarter.

Neither team's offense was able to stay on the field for the majority of the second quarter. The Spartans sacked Mangum in two different series on third down to force the Cougars to punt

When San Jose attempted to convert on fourth down inside of BYU territory, the ball was fumbled and recovered by Warner.

BYU's final drive of the first half took a turn when Mathews nearly had his second touchdown of the game jarred loose by SJSU's Cleveland Wallace III in the endzone. On the next play Mangum was intercepted by Wallace III, who then ran it 61 yards for a touchdown, leaving the halftime score at 14-10.

Neither team put together much offense in the third quarter and BYU's defense held SJSU off the board again after a missed 46-yard field goal.

To start the fourth quarter, Mangum found Nick Kurtz for a 16-yard gain. A huge catch by Blackmon for 24 yards set up Trevor Samson for the 31-yard field goal to extend the lead to 17-10 with 11:21 left in the game.

The field goal proved to be the difference after SJSU mounted a touchdown drive on its final possession. The Spartans capitalized on a 34-yard quarterback run on a 4th-and-1 when Kenny Potter rolled outside of the BYU defense and got loose. The play set up the Spartan score but Wadsworth had the final say with the pass breakup on the two-point try.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. - The fourth-quarter comeback fell short for BYU football, falling 20-16 to Missouri at Arrowhead Stadium on Saturday night.

Francis Bernard scored a touchdown with 7:19 left in the game to put the Cougars within striking distance. Despite one more chance on offense, BYU could not find the end zone again. The Cougar defense was unable to get a stop on the other end and time ran out on the Cougars

The loss snaps a five-game win streak for BYU (7-3) and ends a four-game losing streak for Mizzou (5-5, 1-5 SEC). The Tigers outgained the Cougars in yards 434 to 290. Penalties played a major role in this game as BYU had six for 42 yards while Mizzou had eight for 91 yards, with both sides benefitting from extended drives due to penalties.

Tanner Mangum went 23 of 41 for 244 yards and one touchdown. Mangum became the school's freshman record holder in passing yards and touchdown passes with 2,442 yards and 16 touchdown passes on the season.

Wide receiver Nick Kurtz led the Cougars with 67 yards on three catches. Freshman running back Bernard added 56 receiving yards and one touchdown. The other Cougar touchdown scored came from Algernon Brown, who led the team with 42 rushing yards.

Bronson Kaufusi led the defense in the game with a career-high 10 tackles, three tackles for loss, two forced fumbles and a fumble recovery. Harvey Langi also had a career-high 10 tackles in the game while Jherremya Leuta-Douyere tied a career high with nine.

Both teams came out of the gate playing stingy defense. Mizzou had a potential touchdown catch, but an offensive pass interference overturned the reception. On the following play, Kaufusi forced and recovered a fumble.

The Cougar offense was unable to convert points off the turnover and punted the ball away after three plays. Mizzou scored the only points in the first quarter with a 23-yard field goal with 0:56 remaining.

A 32-yard reception by Kurtz and 36 yards from Bernard sparked the offense into the

red zone. With 7:29 left in the second quarter, Trevor Samson kicked a 23-yard field goal to tie the score at 3-3.

Another field goal from the Tigers took back the lead, 6-3, with a 34-yard field goal with less than a minute until the break and took the lead into halftime.

The Cougars got the ball at the start of the second half. Despite a penalty keeping the drive alive, a fumble at the Mizzou 15-yard line stalled BYU's drive. Micah Hannemann returned the favor by creating a turnover of his own as he intercepted Missouri and returned it 29 yards three plays later.

Taking advantage of the opportunity, Mangum marched the offense down the field. BYU set up for a field goal, but a delay-of-game penalty on the Tigers gave the Cougars first and goal. With 6:21 left in the third, Brown rushed 11 yards to score the first touchdown of the game and help BYU take the lead for the first time, 10-6.

Later on, BYU penalties kept the Mizzou offense on the field, leading to an eventual touchdown late. The Tigers took back the lead 13-10 after a 4-yard reception in the end zone with 13:03 left in the game.

On the ensuing Cougar drive, a costly fumble by Mangum on the only sack given up by BYU gave the ball back to Mizzou in the red zone, setting the Tigers up for its second touchdown in as many possessions. The Tigers went up 20-10 with 10:03 to play.

After two receptions for 27 yards by Colby Pearson and a 19-yard catch from Remington Peck, BYU found itself in position to score. On third down, the pass was incomplete in the end zone, but a taunting penalty gave a first down to the Cougars. They capitalized as Mangum hit Bernard for a 6-yard touchdown reception to close the gap, 20-16, with 7:19 in the game.

BYU's defense forced a three-and-out to get the offense back on the field. However, the Cougars had just one first down in the drive and had to punt the ball back to the Tigers. Mizzou never gave the ball back and was able to run out the clock after converting two third downs. Missouri converted 13 of 20 third downs in the game.

PROVO, Utah - BYU football won its final home game of the season against Fresno State 52-10 on Senior Day to finish the season undefeated at LaVell Edwards Stadium.

BYU (8-3) outgained Fresno State (3-8, 2-5 Mountain West) 520 yards to 275. The Cougars were a perfect 5 for 5 on blue-zone attempts in the win and forced three turnovers leading to 21 points.

Tanner Mangum went 24 of 37 for 336 yards and one touchdown. Moroni Laulu-Pututau led the Cougars with 95 receiving yards and one touchdown. In rushing yards, Algernon Brown led the team with 97 yards and one touchdown. Francis Bernard had two touchdowns with 45 total yards.

For the defense, Bronson Kaufusi filled out the stat sheet. He had a team-high five total tackles, four tackles for loss, one pass breakup and three sacks. Kai Nacua had two interceptions, one of which was returned for a touchdown, his second pick-six of the season. Fred Warner also had an interception to go along with his four total tackles.

Offense started off sluggish for both teams in the first quarter with three and outs for both teams' first series. The Cougars attempted a fake punt on fourth down, but the Bulldogs stopped it and put themselves in good field position. The BYU defense held Fresno State to a 28-yard field goal to take the early 3-0 lead with 5:11 remaining in the quarter.

In the Cougars' next series, they answered back. Receptions by Mitchell Juergens, Colby Pearson and Bernard put BYU in position for Trevor Samson to kick a 40-yard field goal and tie it up with four minutes to go in the first quarter.

Mitch Mathews caught a 45-yard pass from Mangum in the first play of the second quarter to put the Cougars in the scoring position. With 13:25 on the clock, Bernard leaped over the defense into the end zone to score the first touchdown of the game and take the 10-3 lead.

For the second time this season, Nacua picked off the ball and returned it for a touchdown. The pick-six extended BYU's lead to 16-3 with 7:21 until the break.



In Fresno State's next series, Warner picked off the Bulldogs and returned it for 27 yards. With 6:11 left in the quarter, Mangum found Laulu-Pututau for the 18-yard touchdown, which was his first touchdown reception of his career. The Cougars successfully completed a two-point conversion with a pass to Terenn Houk in the corner of the end zone, pushing the lead to 24-3.

BYU scored two touchdowns in the third quarter while holding Fresno State scoreless. Two 14-yard gains by Brown and Nick Kurtz set up Bernard to rush in on the 1-yard line with 9:59 left in the third to score his second touchdown. Brown broke loose for 45-yards with 5:06 on the clock to score the other touchdown in the third quarter, making it 38-3.

A 54-yard reception by Laulu-Pututau at the end of the third quarter set up another Cougar touchdown to start the fourth. Former defensive lineman turned tight end Remington Peck took the ball on a reverse and threw the ball 15 yards to Houk for the touchdown on the trick play, extending the lead to 45-3 with 14:52 to play.

Another interception from Nacua set up Nate Carter to rush five yards for the touchdown, just over two minutes after the Cougars' last scoring drive. The Bulldogs responded by scoring their first touchdown on the game on a 29-yard rush, making it 52-10 with 8:42 remaining in the game.

LOGAN, Utah – BYU football scored 28 unanswered points to beat Utah State 51-28 on the road at Maverik Stadium on Saturday.

Despite being outgained in total yards 358 to 445, BYU (9-3) recovered two fumbles and blocked two kicks to secure the win over Utah State (6-6, 5-3 Mountain West).

Tanner Mangum went 16 of 30 for 284 yards and four touchdowns–his third multi-touchdown game of the year. Mitch Mathews led the receivers with 158 yards and two touchdowns on six catches, including a 72-yard touchdown in the second quarter. Algernon Brown rushed 68 yards for one touchdown in the win while Francis Bernard had on rushing and one receiving score.

On the defensive side, Michael Wadsworth led the team with 10 total tackles. Fred Warner added nine total tackles along with one tackle for loss and one fumble recovery. Travis Tuiloma also had a career-high nine tackles and one sack in the win while Tomasi Laulille had a 37-yard fumble return for a touchdown. On special teams, Riley Burt had four kick returns for 107 yards. Bronson Kaufusi added a sack and two blocked field goals. He now has four blocked kicks this season.

Utah State jumped out to the early 7-0 lead after its first series when senior quarterback Chuckie Keeton rushed 52 yards into the end zone. BYU answered back in its first posession by marching down the field into blue zone. Mathews caught a 32-yard reception to set up Brown to rush eight yards for the touchdown, tying it at 7-7 with 10:08 left in the first quarter.

The Cougar defense came up big when Bronson Kaufusi blocked the Aggies' field goal attempt, keeping the game tied. Kurt Henderson caught a 38-yard pass to put Trevor Samson in position to kick a 41-yard field goal, taking the 10-7 lead right before the end of the quarter.

A fake field goal allowed Utah State to convert on fourth down, which led to a 6-yard rushing touchdown. The Aggies then scored again on their next possession to extend their lead to 21-10 with three minutes to go until the half.

BYU answered back in a big way with a 72-yard reception by Mathews for the touchdown at the 2:42 mark to close in on Utah State's lead, 21-17.

After both teams took turns punting the ball away, the Aggies had the ball with less than a minute until the break on their own 42-yard line. Keeton fumbled the ball and Tomasi Laulile recovered and returned it 37 yards for the touchdown. The Cougars went into the locker room with a 24-21 lead

BYU started the second half right where it left off in the first. Mangum found Mathews again in the end zone, this time on a 35-yard reception caught over the Utah State defender. The quick score pushed the Cougars' lead to double-digits, 31-21, with 13:20 to go in the third quarter.

Another Aggie field goal attempt was blocked by Kaufusi, his second of the game and Micah Hannemann recovered and returned the ball 66 yards, setting up the offense for an easy touchdown. With 3:01 on the clock, Francis Bernard rushed 10 yards into the end zone, extending the lead to 38-21. The Cougars scored 28 unanswered points in this stretch

The Aggies scored early in the fourth quarter after converting on fourth down, making it a 10-point game, 38-28, with 14:48 left in the game.

The ensuing drive for the Cougars went 90 yards and consisted of three double-digit yard gains. Devon Blackmon caught a 35-yard pass to convert on a crucial third down, keeping the drive alive, and Brown and Harvey Langi added runs of 22 and 11 yards, respectively. With 12:06 left to play, Bernard rushed four yards for the touchdown, pushing the margin to 44-28.
